WORLD SHOWCASE FELLOWSHIP STUDENTS ARRIVE



It was an exciting moment last Friday when the Eastern Air Lines' jet touched down and the eight American Field Service students participating in our World Showcase Fellowship pilot program came out to greet their host families!

These eight students have been living and studying in the United States for the past 10 months. After

leaving their American families, they spent a week traveling across the United States with other American Field Service students, all ultimately meeting in New York City. Once in the "big apple" our eight students were met by **David Kanally** and **Tom Eastman** of the Disney University who accompanied them to Orlando.

During their first week in Orlando, they've had a chance to get to know their host families and have gotten to know some of us here at Walt Disney World Company. After spending two days in Orientation, they've begun their work/study schedule which will give them a chance to learn a little about almost every aspect of our operation.

As you know, this World Showcase Fellowship pilot program is the forerunner of the program which is slated to begin with the opening of EPCOT Center in October 1982. The World Showcase section of EPCOT Center will be a living community of nations where students from all over the world will live, study, work, and play together.


SAVE FUEL AND MONEY ... EXPRESS YOURSELF

The Express Bus Service is operated by the Orange/Seminole/Osceola Transportation Authority for the convenience of Walt Disney World cast members, as well as to conserve energy. The cost of the bus service is just 90¢ one way or a total of \$9 each week if you ride five working days, round trip.

That's quite a savings if you're currently driving to and from work alone ... as much as \$5 each week in most cars! And that's for gasoline alone ... not maintenance!

So check the schedule and route here and plan on saving both energy and money.

And you must present your Walt Disney World ID card at the time of payment to receive your employee discount.

So don't forget your Walt Disney World ID, so you can keep saving on gasoline at the Center Gas Station.

SAFETY FIRST

When you work at Walt Disney World Company, it's easy to take it for granted that you're safe and secure ... but that's when you get lax on safety precautions, so it's a good idea to keep some of these tips in mind:

• Walk to your car after work in pairs

or groups, especially after dark. • Check the backseat and the floor

before entering your vehicle.

• While driving, do not stop to offer assistance if you see a disabled car. Drive, instead, to an emergency call box or telephone and call for assistance.

• Be alert in crowds; that's where pickpockets do their best work.

• If you will be away from home until after dark, have the porch light on, as well as an inside light.

• Attempt to have any pension, retirement, or social security checks posted to an account rather than to your mail box. There are those who know the regular date these type of checks are delivered and you may not find it there some month.



Keep Those Ideαs Coming In!

Are you keeping some great ideas to yourself? Do you think you have a better way to do something or to save energy or to improve a show or safety here at Walt Disney World Company?

Well, you should let the rest of us in on your idea! And of course, we have the perfect means for you to do it ... "I Have An Idea" program.

Throughout the property, in most cast cafeterias and major break areas, "I Have An Idea" boxes are located on the walls ready for you to put your great ideas into it! Also, on the bottom shelf of these "I Have An

I HAVE AN IDEA

Idea" boxes are special forms for you to complete to tell us your idea. But if someone else has beat you to the punch and the forms are gone, simply write your idea down on a blank sheet of paper, indicating what your idea is, what you think it will accomplish and any other pertinent information, and of course, don't forget to include your name, department name, and work extension so we can reach you if necessary. Additional forms are also available at Cast Activities, second floor of the Center Building, so drop by anytime for one!

Once you've submitted your idea, the I Have An Idea Committee will review it to determine the feasibility and originality of your idea and if accepted, insure that it will be implemented.

There Are Two Types of Accepted Ideas

There are two types of accepted ideas, a general request and an original idea.

A general request is an idea accepted as a result of a cast member bringing an "oversight" to the attention of the "I Have An Idea" committee, such as the need for additional signs in an area, or a cast member determining a faster way to accomplish a task already being done. For an accepted general request idea, the submitting cast members receive a letter of commendation in their personnel file and a copy sent to their director.

An accepted idea is one that is original, creative, and will improve efficiency, safety, or our guests enjoyment of Walt Disney World Company. For an accepted idea, cast members receive a framed certificate for the first idea accepted in a given year, dinner for two at a Walt Disney World restaurant as well as a letter of commendation. Once cast members receive three accepted ideas in a given year, they receive their choice of dinner for two at the Top of the World or a \$50 gift certificate. All accepted ideas must have been originated in the past six months for consideration.

Your Idea Could Be Deemed Outstanding

Of course, some ideas are so great that special recognition should be granted. For these ideas, the "I Have An Idea" committee votes to call them "Outstanding." Cast members whose ideas are deemed "Outstanding" receive a special wooden wall plaque, a parking place of their choice for one month, their choice of a Mickey Mouse telephone or a \$100 gift certificate at the Walt Disney World Village, and a letter of commendation. And at the end of each year, all Outstanding Idea winners are invited to the "I Have An Idea" awards dinner where one idea receives the recognition of being the "Outstanding Idea of the Year," and the submitting cast member receives a large wall plaque acknowledging this honor as well as an all-expense paid vacation for two! Last year's winner, Bill Walters, chose the seven-day Caribbean Cruise from the four choices he was given.

There's Still Time In 1980 To Get Your Idea In

As of this writing, there have been 562 ideas submitted in 1980. Of that number, 67 have been accepted as either a general request or an original idea and three have been deemed "Outstanding."

With five months remaining in 1980 there's still plenty of time for you to put your thinking cap on and be one of our next "Outstanding Idea" winners!



Conserving energy and fuel now means you'll save money as well, and with gasoline prices increasing we all need to do everything possible to save on gasoline. Here's a few tips:

• Plan your errands for one long trip rather than several short ones. Your car gets much better mileage on long trips than short ones!

• The most fuel-efficient way to cool your car on the open highway is to open air vents and vent windows. This doesn't drain any power from the engine, but air-conditioning can decrease your mileage as much as 20%. Open side windows will also drain your car of mileage.

• Use your trunk for luggage when traveling and avoid using the top luggage rack if possible. Luggage packed on top of your car increases wind resistance, cutting down on mileage.

• Avoid driving badly worn roads whenever possible. Potholes that cause you to constantly brake can cost you 20% of your mileage!

• Write your county commissioner to insure that traffic lights are synchronized! The less stops you have to make the more fuel you save! That also means you should maintain the posted speed limits in areas that are already synchronized to avoid hitting lights.

• Two hundred and fifty thousand barrels of oil could be saved each day if more people would car pool or van pool. The average rush hour vehicle occupancy is currently 1.3 persons. This savings would be realized if the average occupancy was raised to just 2 persons! Imagine what could be saved if **everyone** took public transportation when available!

• The most fuel efficient way to travel to and from work during rush hours is a 10-occupant van pool! Drop by your Division Transportation Coordinator's office today to see what you can do to join a van pool! (Contact Cast Activities for the name of your Division Transportation Coordinator.)

• Stop and go driving can cut your mileage in half. Slow and stop smoothly and avoid jackrabbit starts to save fuel.

SCUBA CLASS OPENS REGISTRATION

Our fourth in a series of **SCUBA classes** for 1980 is open. Instructor **Wayne Mitchell** (Loss Prevention), in cooperation with the Dive Club and Cast Activities, will again be teaching this highly popular class.

Successful completion of the course will lead to nationally recognized **Basic SCUBA Certification** through the National Association of Underwater Instructors (NAUI).


