# THE PASSAGE OF THE FLEET.

Significant news reaches us to-day from Singapore. Two Japanese battleships, two first class and two second-class cruisers, and twelve destroyers are said to be near Singapore, steaming West. This is so to speak, the preliminary to the lifting of the curtain on the third act of the great Asiatic drama, and the interest therein will naturally be intensified. The first act succeeded in disturbing the equilibrium of the whole world, the second is still in process of enactment, as the Russian Admiral and his staffed ships advance across the Indian sea, to that vast disjuncted tract of land which, like the verities of some pre-dial monster, stretches across his further course into the Pacific. It is at this point that the curtain will ring up on the third and last act. And here also it is just possible that a certain obscurity may fall upon the movements of the Malacca Sea, which, if done so, may, it is thought, have planned to pass into what is virtually the field of battle by some game which it may be least expected. Now, there can be little doubt that the Japanese fleet, the object is not to "find and destroy" his enemy, but to evade him by hook or by crook, and get his ships and men into Vladivostok before striking everything on an encounter with the workings of the Mikado. If there were any possibility of preparing his ships for battle, after their long sea voyage, at any point west of the Straits, he might—as presumably his force is intended to fight—the Chinese sea with drums beating and banners deployed. But it is his fate to lack any such harbour of refuge nearer than the distant goal to which he is bound, and between which and himself lurk the warships of his redoubtable foe.  
The momentous question which thus arises is—How does Rodzestvensky hope to reach Vladivostok without fighting? And the solution of this problem gives birth to a situation of unparalleled interest. Whether he succeeds or not must first of all largely depend upon the passage by which he takes his ships into the Pacific, and the efficiency of the Japanese Intelligence. A reference to the map will show that to pass through the "Gates of the East," he must make choice of a series of difficulties through that great barrier of islands extending for 1,800 miles from the north-western point of Sumatra to Timor on the east, the last 500 miles from the North Australian coast. The two largest of these defiles, the Straits of Malacca, and the Straits of Sunda, the usual routes between East and West. The former is in length about 600 miles, with a breadth varying from about 400 to 25 miles, and it is here that the Japanese ships spoken of are at present found. There are several islands, the passage, however, is similarly endangered by the existence of a host of islands of various sizes. Further east the Straits of Sunda, between the great islands of Sumatra and Java, would afford a quick passage, as they are not more than 90 miles in length. This passage, however, is similarly endangered by the existence of a host of islands and islets. Moreover, both straits narrow considerably towards their eastern mouths, which must add greatly to their perils from a naval point of view. Further eastward may be noticed a series of minor passages through the long chain of islands, as far as Timor. But these narrow waters, as well as those beyond, swarming with countless archipelagos, are still very incompletely explored, and would be fraught with serious navigating dangers to such a fleet, which it might well hesitate to encounter.  
There is one other important consideration which will conceivably influence the Russian point of passage, namely, the radius of action possessed by the Japanese warships. The coal capacity of the latter has largely been sacrificed to armament. But it must be remembered that Japan now possesses in Formosa a valuable advanced base for any southward naval action, and thence will be able to work fast waters down to any of the numerous and important islands which may be safely regarded as a negligible quantity. We may take it, therefore, that there will be nothing to prevent Togo from operating, with his cruisers and destroyers, in the neighbourhood of the Straits, if he so chooses, and there is one possibility which may in view of recent happenings, the Japanese cannot afford to lose sight of. The chance that the Russians may attempt to force themselves upon the hospitality of the French at Saigon for any final watering is one that Saigou's Japanese surveillance of this port is a serious necessity. This port, indeed, is the great danger point in the China sea, as any such assault as afforded by the French at this stage similar to that at Cherbourg and Algiers, would be regarded by the Japanese as an act of war, compelling them to appeal to their allies in view, therefore, of Japanese vigilance at this point, it is highly probable that the Russians will choose one of the more easterly passages, and endeavour to reach Vladivostok by the Philippines, through the Straits of Manilla, or the Malacca passage.
