SITUATION IN RUSSIA. LOCAL AND GENERAL.

The Russian fleet will close at the G.P.O. tomorrow at 4 p.m. on Monday.

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THE ROYAL VISIT. ARRIVAL IN CAIRO. THE RECEPTION AT THE STATION.

At 5.20 p.m. yesterday the vice-regal train, bearing their Royal Highnesses the Duke and Duchess of Connaught, steamed into Cairo station to the sound of salutes of 27 guns from the Citadel, the Khedive and the Royal Family, the British and Egyptian Armies, the British and Egyptian Armies, the British and Egyptian Armies.

The Khedive exchanged the most cordial greetings with the Duke and Duchess of Connaught, who both looked very well, and expressed his pleasure at once more meeting them in Cairo. After a similar interchange of courtesies between the Royal visitors and Lord Cromer, the British and Egyptian Armies, the British and Egyptian Armies.

The Khedive and the Duke of Connaught then entered a State carriage and drove towards the Palace, escorted by the Cavalry of the Holy Guard, and followed by the Duchess of Connaught, accompanied by Prince Mohamed Aly, and other carriages containing the chief participants in this interesting scene.

The street were lined by large crowds and kept clear by the police, whose arrangements were excellent. British and Egyptian and other national flags were flown everywhere, the white and pale blue of the Hellenic colours being very prominent. The hotel fronts of the city were crowded with residents and visitors anxious to see the Khedive and his Royal guests, who graciously responded to the salutations that greeted them.

H. H. the Khedive gave a banquet of 130 covers in honor of the Duke and Duchess of Connaught at Abdeen Palace yesterday evening. Among the guests were the Princes of the Bussalou family, H.R.H. Prince Gustav Adolf of Sweden and Norway, the Ministers, the various Counts of Cromer, the diplomatic agents, the ambassadors, the under-secretaries of State, Major General Slade, C.B., the heads of departments, the staff of the British Agency, etc.

The Royal party leaves Cairo for upriver the evening under the arrangements of the Suez Canal Company. A very large crowd is expected to attend the departure on the K. S. C. grounds this afternoon, which will be graced by the presence of H. H. the Khedive and his Royal guests.

We omitted to mention in our account of the arrival of the Duke and Duchess of Connaught at Alexandria yesterday that Mahmood Pasha Siki, Governor of Alexandria, presented a fine bouquet to her Royal Highness as she landed at the Arsenal wharf, and on reaching the hospitable Miss Murray, the pretty little daughter of Miss Murray, Inspector of Light-houses, presented a most artistic bouquet to the Duchess. It was composed of purple violets, white lilac, lilies of the valley, and very elegant pink roses. The Duchess was very pleased with these gifts and asked for the model of the gift to be presented to her.

The Khedive proceeded to Abdeen Palace yesterday morning and attended midday prayers at the Mosque of Saadiah Hassan. The receipts from the fetes on the occasion of the recent anniversary of the Khedive's accession amounted to L.E. 934,000, 710 and the expenditure to L.E. 811,000, which leaves a surplus of L.E. 123,000, which will be carried over for next year's fetes.

The following officers are to take part in a staff ride:—Major E. R. O. Ludlow, D.A.A.G., Major A. H. C. Kenney Herbert, D.A.Q.M.G., Captain E. E. Bayly, Staff Captain, D.A.Q.M.G., W. H. Robinson, R.E., Captain F. P. Duffin, A.S.T., and an officer, R.A.M.C. They will proceed by a train leaving Cairo at 6 a.m. on Tuesday, 31st inst., and each officer will be accompanied by his servant, his horse, and one ox-wagon.

The Messageries Maritimes S.S. "Salazio" arrived at Alexandria from Marseilles at 4 a.m. yesterday. The Cunard S.S. "Tyria" arrived at Liverpool yesterday morning and is due here on Sunday evening with passengers, mails, and general cargo.

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EGYPT'S BANKING DEVELOPMENTS. COMPTOIR D'ESCOMPTE. PERSONAL AND SOCIAL. COMMISSION MUNICIPALE.

The ex-Empress Eugénie, travelling incognito as the Comtesse de Pierrfond, arrived at the Savoy Hotel, Cairo, last night from Port Said. The suite of the ex-Empress is composed of ten persons.

The ex-Empress Eugénie before she left Paris for Egypt declared in an interview: "Life is hard, but the great thing is courage I once used the phrase, 'Il n'y a rien comme l'audeur,' under very trying circumstances, and I gave up my courage. The Countess of Lovelock and Sir Edmund Verney arrived at Port Said yesterday from Malta by the S.S. "City of Corinth," and left by the evening train for Cairo.

Earl and Countess Howe, with Sir Edward and Lady Colebrooke, have left London for Egypt and a trip up the Nile as the guests of Sir Ernest Cassel.

The Hon. John Ward will accompany Sir Ernest Cassel's party to Egypt. Mr. Ward, who is now on the Riviera, will join the party at Marseilles to-day.

AN ALEXANDRIA SCANDAL.
