ARMY AND NAVY.

(FROM OUR CORRESPONDENT.)
Egypt-Col. G. D. Hunter, D.S.O., R.A.M.C.,
the new P. M. O. of the Khedive's Army,
is an experienced Egyptian campaigner and
a good bit of his twenty years and over
service has been spent in that country and
the Sudan. Beginning with the Nile Expedition
1884-85 (mediating with the English and
French successively through the operations on
the Sudan frontier 1885-86 and 1888-86, in-
cluding the action of Gemazal (clasp), the
Dongola Expedition as senior medical officer
of Kitchener's forces, and was present at
Firket and Kafir, where he earned his D.S.O.,
clasp and the Khedive's medal with two
clasps and warm mention in despatches, and
in Kitchener's final smashing of the Mahdi
his services earned him another mention and
clasp for Omdurman, and the 4th class Osmar-
nid. Old friends will be glad to welcome
back the genial medical, and new ones will
be glad to meet him.

Captain H. McClean, East Lancashire Regiment, Lieutenant L. F. Reeves, Lincolnshire Regiment, and Lieutenant G. M. Shipway, Gloucester Regiment, have been promoted to the W.A.F.F. for duty. Captain Clarke, R.F.A., has been posted to the Gold Coast Artillery detachment.

It has been definitely decided that the King will personally open the new dock which bears his name at Gibraltar.

The fourteen submarine mining companies of Royal Engineers are to be reduced, as the Admiralty will shortly take over the control of the mines at home and abroad. The Admiralty can do this more economically than the War Office, which expects to effect a saving of £100,000 per annum by the change.

THE SUZZ CANAL.

Sir Howard Vincent, M.P., who has recently returned to London from Egypt, delivered an address last week on the origin, construction, and administration of the Suez Canal, at a meeting of the London Chamber of Commerce. Referring to the purchase by Lord Beaconsfield from the Egyptian Government of 176,500 tons of the 400,000 canal shares, the market value of these shares, which were bought at 55sfr. a piece, or only about 6sfr. more than would have had to be paid at the time of issue in 1858, exceeded £12,000,000, and the English received £12,000,000 in dividends and interest. The whole purchase price had been reimbursed, almost to the British public by the dues paid by British ships, he contended that after allowing say, 10 per cent. per annum on the outlay the balance should be applied either for the benefit of British shipping as a whole by the remission of light dues or for some other object, or else for the benefit of British ships providing this source of national income, by a reimbursement of say, two francs a ton. Alluding to the difficulties which have arisen about the Suez Canal rules and the complaints emanating from the Chamber of Shipping of the United Kingdom, he remarked that some better remedies had been suggested by competent authorities. It was stated, for instance, that a capital of sixteen six and seven millions was ready for the construction of a new British canal. The British Government being trustee for Egypt and the Egyptian people a very strong case would have to be made out to induce it to consent to the construction of a second canal on Egyptian territory, and as the existing canal had cost upwards of thirty million pounds up to the present time the capital necessary for a new canal would be probably not far short of fifty millions. In these circumstances he asked whether it would not be better to consider how, by lowering the rates, by increasing the facilities, by assistance from the British Government out of its dividends, and by exercising the powers that we possess on the court of directors and among the shareholders, relief may be obtained in any direction rather than by competition.

NOTES FROM SUAKIN.

(FROM OUR CORRESPONDENT.)
Suakin, January 30.
The Sudan Government steamer "Tira" (Captain Brooke Smith) has arrived from Suze. She has been purchased by the Sudan Government to help the pearl fishery trade to come into Suakin as hitherto all the pearls have gone to Manowah and Jeddah.

The British steamer "Kilbride," from Glasgow, arrived here on the 18th inst. and took away the goods which were salvaged from the wrecked steamer "Afghanistan" for India. The British steamer "Islami," from Bombay, brought a cargo of 8,000 packages for Suakin. This vessel, unfortunately had to change her name from "Gulf of Trinidad" as the natives could not pronounce it.

The Khedivial mail steamer "Mahallah," which arrived from Suze, had the following passengers on board: Captain H. von Pfluger, agent of the Austrian Lloyd at Suakin, who is going as far as Khartoum shooting, and then returns via Berber, Halfa, and Cairo, to Alexandria; Messrs. Shockey and Morris, mining engineers; and the Hon. Anthony Pelham, nephew of the Earl of Chichester, who has returned from sick leave and taken over his duties on the Suakin-Antakya Railway.

On the 26th inst. the Sudan Government steamer "Mukhbir" went to Sheikh Barghout port with Kaimakam Drury Bay, R.N., in command, accompanied by Bambachi Cox, Hon. A. Jelliam, and Capt. H. von Pfluger, to inspect the port and harbour. Mr. W. H. Bailey has been transferred from his post of head telegraph officer to that of inspector of bridges, Suakin-Antakya Railway, on 1st January, 1905. Mulatin Awad Mohamed Effendi Iszet, Cavalry, formerly of H.H. Cavalry Guard, arrived here on the 22nd inst. via Berber to do duty with the Railway Battalion.

Reduced Rates on Sudan Government Railways and Steamers.

LABOURERS FOR AGRICULTURAL PURPOSES.
A reduction of 3rd class passenger fares will be granted to Landowners importing labourers for agricultural purposes under the following conditions:
(a) A rebate of 20 per cent. will be granted upon the Sudan Government Steamers and Railways to all parties of agricultural labourers of not less than 10 persons entering the Sudan from Egypt on their journey from Assuit to any destination in the Sudan.
(b) No rebate will be allowed upon the fare for any local journey within the Sudan or upon any fare for a journey from the Sudan to Egypt.
(c) No rebate will be allowed on any ticket other than 3rd class. Rebates on 4th class fares cannot be taken. A receipt for the tickets issued must be obtained at the time the tickets are taken.
(d) The rebate must be claimed at the end of each quarter from the Director of Railways for the railway fares, and from the Director of Steamers and Boats for the steamer fares.
All claims must be supported by the receipts mentioned in the preceding paragraph or they will not be entertained.
(e) All rebates will cease upon the opening of the Nile - Red Sea Railway to traffic.
(f) In order to obtain the rebate a certificate must be obtained from the Agent General to the Sudan Government, War Office, Cairo, stating the name of the person importing the labourers (Landowner), the number of labourers, and their destination, 25405-12-A-7
