accept. We must, of course, regard these "terms" merely as a tentative document designed to test opinion both in Japan and other countries. It is by no means clear as yet that that peace is, an immediate probability. What may be said is given a sweet reasonableness on the part of the Tsar and his advisers, it is in sight. And that is something on which a world horrified by the immensity of slaughter will sincerely congratulate itself and the combatants.

The terms suggested obviously are less than a victorious Japan will demand. What has been won by the sword is to be "ceded" to Japan, Vladivostok is to have the "open door"—a concession that has by now lost whatever glamour was once attached to it—the Eastern Chinese railway is to be placed under a neutral international administration, and Manchuria, as far north as Harbin, is to be restored to China. No mention is made of any indemnity save as a difficulty not thought to be insuperable. No mention at all is made of the Russian ships interned in neutral harbours, and another big battle has evidently been risked within the last few days.

Already, we imagine, Japan, with uninterrupted victory behind her, will consent to no peace that is not permanent and completely satisfactory. Her demands no doubt have grown with the progress of the war. This has been to her a life and death struggle which she has no intention of abandoning for the moment that it may be renewed when Russia has recovered, for internal and external purposes. She is strong enough and determined enough to impose her own will, and to leave her task unfinished would be too dear a price to pay even for the blessings of peace. These considerations have to be understood by the Government of Russia—the people only want the war to end—before their troubles abroad can be ended, and all energies devoted to the troubles at home. Meanwhile it is for us to welcome the signs of a reasonable frame of mind and to do all in our power to further the cause of peace that can be done in consonance with our obligations to our ally, with our own vital interests, and with those eternal principles of justice for which Japan drew the sword.
