NEW PASS TO BE MADE.

IMPORTANT UNDERTAKING.

A most important improvement in the port of Alexandria is to be undertaken immediately and to morrow the first dredger for the work is arriving at Alexandria. The Egyptian Govern ment has determined to construct anew pass fo entrance to the harbour as owing to the enormous and continuous increase in the size enormous and continuous increase in the size of modern vessels the present entry by way of the Boghaz pass is toosmall for the largest type of ships. For instance, when the White Star liner "Celtic" arrived here the season before last she had to lie outside the harbour.

The Boghaz pass is only [31 feet in depth and can only admit as an maximum vassels drawing from 29 to 30 feet of water, and then only in the smoothest seas. The new pass is to be dredged to the depth of 35 feet and will thus be able to admit the largest ships adoat. 
