

EGYPT'S ASIATIC NEIGHBOURS UNDER THE EARLIER DYNASTIES.

The discoveries of recent years in Egyptian archeology have greatly increased our know ledge of the geographical extent of Egyptian dominion and infleance in Western Axia under the earlier dynasties. This additional information has chiefly been derived from the closes attention paid to all remains of hisroglyphical influences of the property of the Sinkitip anniagh. inscriptions in the Sinaitic peninsula, as well as from a re-investigation of all known texts numents and papyri, referring to lands or peoples east of Egypt proper.
The reliefs of the Pharaohs Zosiri-Noutirkha

The reliefs of the Pharachia Zishir-Noutirkha and Sanakhir of the First Dynasty, near Sinai, carry back the date for Egyptian expeditions to that region far anterior to the ers of Sons-feron and the "pyramid kings"; whilst the fact that the Fifth Dynasty monarche conducted campaigns in Syria is proved by the inscription in the tomber Adu at Sakkrapah, and for the Sixth Dynasty by that of Onni. He calls the Asisier Amon and Hirasho, names they bore at times through all Egyptian history.

The new discoveries, however, to be parti-cularly alluded to concern 12th dynasty in-scriptions, one of them a memorial of a certain scriptions, one of them a memorial of a certain Khensenkon, found by Mr. Garstang in 1900, and two others of persons named Ptab-ouron, and Sinofrit, were discovered at Sarboutel-Khadim in the Sinaitic district, and which give further information of a hitherto unrecord-ed Asiatic expedition under Unitamen III, also of Expytian officials being at the Sarbout-al Whelies pieza under Amezombe III. el-Khadim mines under Amenemhat III.

But the new texts disclore a more interest But the new texts discover a more interesting fact than these, and that is that the Egyptians were well acquainted with three tribes mentioned in the geographical and ethnographical list in Genesis 36. These are

troos mentioned in the geographical and ethographical list in Genesis 36. These are the Jotan, or Jotanu, the Horites, and the Alah, and further, they connected them together geographically and racially as does the Old Teatament.

The first of these important inscriptions records a war wascel arasinst the country of the Sakinsim, and the tribe, or people, of the Lotanu who were encountered during an expedition to the land of Monition-Sati, which in early Expythai times signified near Asia, or rather South Syria. Immediately the text was deciphered it confirmed the supposition of Professor Max Muller that the people read as Tanon upon the celebrated Berlin papyrus of the XII. dynasty, containing the tavels, or advantance, of Saneha, should be read Lotano. He speaks of two districts eccepted by them

Whether he served as guide to their parties or was awarded a post among the staff of the Egyptian colony at Sarbont-el-Khdm in order to conciliate his countrymen, is unknown. Hori is son of this Lotae, and, like all nomadio patriarchal people, pushed out from the Lotae area into further fields and pastures, occupying according to Egyptian evidence the districts west of the Sinaitic ragion, towards Gars. It is evident that the Egyptians have in their Sinaitic inscriptions faithfully transcribed the local tribal names, sub-equently using these chinic titles as geographical ones. This is further confirmed by the fact that Saneta mentions Aliah in the Bible, the nephew of Lotae, (see Genesis 36.34), and also either Qeslem, or Adems Mont Sten the Canada of the Saneta speaks of Aliah as an oasis amous for its vineyards.

It is certainly remarkable that the two names of Asiatio neighbours to Egypt previous to the new Empire abould be found in Genesia 36, and that a little later these under the 12th dynasty should be associated in a papyrus with a third Biblical name; all these three being in the Old Testament records placed in the regions between Palestine and Egypt, and the proof of this should be forthcoming as soon as ever Egyptian touts niteated in the prooper region beyond their frontier where they might be anticipated are scientifically examined. Of course there are scores of the Biblical places and peoples also mentioned upon other later Egyptian records.

Summing up the position, we may broadly state that the prospects of a total supply from all sources sofficient for the requirements of the world are not discouraging, but in regard to American descriptions it will largely depend on the weather between now to Christmas as to whether the crop will be 10,600,000 bales or 11,600,000 bales.

AMERICAN COTTON DISTRIBUTION (1904-05)

At the last assession of Congress a joint reso-lation was adopted authorising the collection and compilation of statistics apon.—(1) cotton production as returned by the ginners; (2) consemption of cotton in the United States; (3) apoply of cotton sold by manufactorers; (4) quantity of cotton exported. This work is to be done yearly, and the first report, up to August 31 last, covering the various questions involved, has just been issued. Sentember 1 to be done yearly, and the inst report, up to August 31 last, covering the various questions involved, has just been issued. September 1 has been arbitrarily fixed as the beginning of the commercial year in cottoe. The only significance of this date is that it marks the time when the general movement of cottom begins to include some considerable portion of the new crop. As the mills do not discriminate strictly between old and new cotton taken by them for spinning, the Census plan is to take as the supply of the year, beginning Saptember 1, all that has been ginned between that date and August 31 of the following year, to which is added the stock of cotton left over from the previous year. When this plan has thoroughly adjusted itself to conditions, it is believed that it will farmish a much needed check upon the statistics compiled by the Agricultural Department, and that the two reports, while they will apparently disagree, each will really be the complement of the other.
