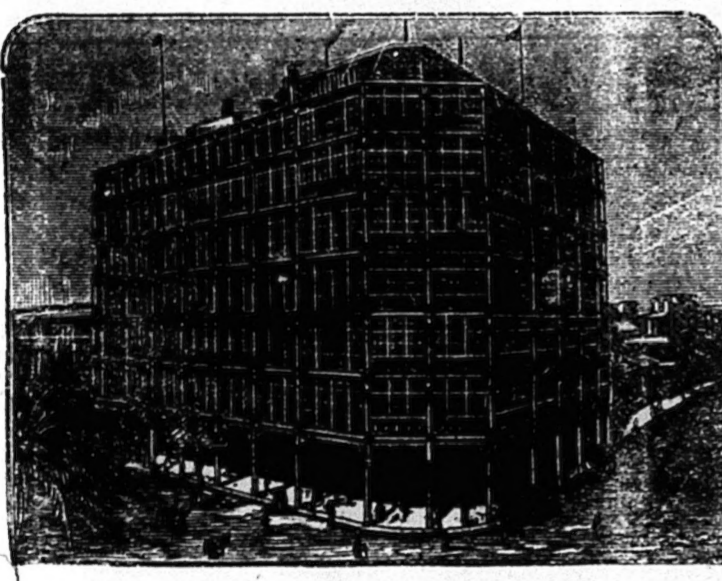

ing the concession, but before the Sheriff's death, which occurred last August, the question had again fallen into abeyance. The present ruler of the Holy City, Sherif Ali Pacha, is a man of enlightened views. The great Ataba tribe, of which he was a foster child, is entirely under his influence, and the Harbs and Arabs of the desert from Jeddah and Yambo to Mecca and Medina under his control. Blackmailing has ceased, and the pilgrim of the future, so the optimists declare, is never again to be the victim of this final incident of his journey. The tribes receive from Turkey a toll of grain, and grain and money from the Government of Egypt, on condition that the Hajj is not to be molested. This payment is the equivalent of the European Customs or octroi, and is fair to both parties when its terms are adhered to. But the theory that the pilgrim should pass upon his way, free of charge since his Government has already paid, is frequently very different from the practice; for pleasant as it is to think of a solution so simple and effective, it must be remembered that these contributions have to pass through a number of hands, and often are greatly diminished in quantity at their destination. The Persians also pay the tribes certain passage dues, known as 'rafik', from long-established custom. When from one reason or another the stipulated payment is not forthcoming the Arabs refuse to argue and help themselves from the pilgrims. Then, indeed, the truth of a man's faith, the sincerity of his creed, undergoes an ordeal which must have proved too hard a test for any but the most passionate conviction. A Hadji might come in peace from Java, a Bokhari might, and sometimes does, achieve his journey without changing his clothes until the ceremony of the Ibrahim, when at his journey's end the pilgrim dons his two white garments, but from that moment his hope of abolition risked shipwreck; the labour of his land or seafaring might be lost, for with the goal almost in sight the remission of sins had to be won across burning sands that held the prospect of attack and the possibility of death or nakedness in a strange country. One result of constructing a railway would be to end this state of things. At the present moment the Hedjaz line is advancing surely and not very slowly, and seems likely to reach completion within three or four years. Though engineered by foreigners, it is being constructed by the Turks, and will be a completely Ottoman railroad, and as such it must necessarily greatly facilitate the suppression of any revolt. It is more than possible that as an offset to the Turkish line from Akaba the Sherif may be anxious to build a railway to Jeddah, which shall be entirely his, and which, after all, is only anticipating what must come when the Holy City is a terminus. Constantinople would probably be the obstacle to such a scheme, since it would entail conditions that the Sultan's Government might not appreciate. Unless its construction is put into the hands of a German firm, its disadvantages and the possibility of its being even a danger will be urgently expounded to the Sultan by his European advisers. It will doubtless be impressed upon him that such a line must be another channel for foreign intrigue. But the other side of the question will or perhaps is being put before his Majesty. Those arguments which suggest that Stamboul would do well to anticipate Mecca, and that were the matter in the hands of the "honest broker," sure guarantees could be given, will not be forgotten.

CAIRO MARKERS' TOURNAMENT.

FINAL ROUND.

At 9.21 the first match of the third and last round played between Syer and Percy began, the latter opening with a safety miss in hank. After a miss by his opponent Percy scored 2 but failed at an easy winning hazard off the red. Syer responded with a nine break, ending by "shopping" his opponent and giving a double miss in bank. Play continued quietly for a time, both being rather nervous and no important break was noted till the score was at 84-82 in favour of Syer, who overtook his opponent with a well-compiled 17. With Percy 14 behind Syer passed the 100 with a sixteen break, to which Percy replied with a good twenty and led again by five. Shortly afterwards Syer scored a neat 26, Percy responding with 12. Score: 127-117, Percy ahead. A safety miss from Percy resulted in a splendid losing hazard off the white into the middle pocket by Syer, who continued till nineteen. Both went to the table several times without notable result till Syer gave a break of 26, Percy only scoring nine. Scores: 138-174 in favour of Syer. Shortly afterwards Syer passed 200 with a break of 18, followed by 23, 39, and 17, while Percy could only muster 14. With the scores at 296-169 Syer made two cannon and ran out an easy winner by 131 points.

SYER v. FLOWERS.

After the usual safety misses Flowers was first to score with a brace. No break of any note occurred till the same player scored a very neat 84, which he followed up with eleven and 19, Syer meantime only scoring 2. Flowers passed the hundred well in advance of the handicap and with subsequent breaks of 20, 12, 8, and 8 seemed to have a good winning chance. Syer, however, then compiled a remarkable 76 full of capital strokes and so came within two of his rival, scores being 222-220. Play continued to be even till Syer got away with a break of 28; after two resultless visits to the table Flowers compiled 13, to which Syer replied with 12 and then left Flowers 23 behind. Scores: 233-260. With seventeen to make Syer ran out winner with breaks of 5 and 13. Final scores: 300-267. At the conclusion of the match, Mr. Mansfield, on behalf of Raouf Bey Sabit, presented Syer, as winner of the tournament, with an enamelled silver cigarette case and Percy, as runner up, with a stop watch.

FOOTBALL.

VICTORIA COLLEGE F.C. v. ST. ANDREW F.C.

Played on Saturday afternoon on the College ground. The Saints won the toss, and elected to kick with the sun behind them. The game from the outset was of a fast nature and both back divisions had their work out to keep the opposing forwards from getting through. The College were the first to appear dangerous, but the forwards were a little off in their shooting. Mace, however, was in pretty safe mood between the sticks and when the College men did at last find their shooting boots they learned that the Saints' custodian was not to be found napping. The visitors were not long in settling down, and thanks to sound support from the half-back line, which had been materially strengthened by the inclusion of Sheppard and Henley, the forwards were enabled to get moving toward Saba. Mustard, however, who always seems to have the happy knack of getting in the way of well-meant passes, didn't give the visitors much opportunity for testing Saba, and when a chance for shooting did present itself the forwards were not allowed any time to steady. Goal kicks were numerous at both ends, a fact which indicates pretty fairly the fast nature of the game throughout. At half-time neither side had managed to score. On resuming, the play became even faster than before. Yaken was prominent again and again in taking the ball into the Saints' territory. His centres were well-timed and well-judged but Henley kept a careful eye on Morrison, giving him very little chance to get at Mace. Sheppard initiated a smart run on the left, which brought the visitors down upon Saba. Rofa put smartly into centre, and Keill had the ball past Saba, thus scoring the first and only goal of the match. This reverse roused the College, and they tried harder than ever to get through Mace's charge, and although several stiff shots were sent his way the visitors' custodian handled well and cleared cleverly. A high dropping shot looked like setting the teams again level but it fell just behind the bar. Play was for a time confined to one side of the field, the ball repeatedly going into touch. From a mis-kick by Mustard Jones got through and tested Saba with a rocket but Saba saved smartly. Time arrived with the score unaltered, the Saints thus running out victors by the odd goal.

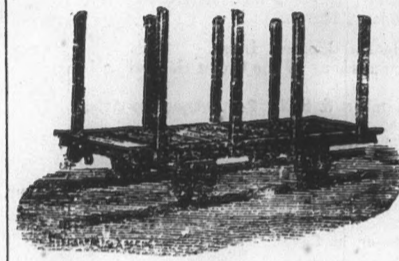
