CONSULS AND BRITISH TRADE.

Mr. Consul Waugh, reporting on the trade of Constantinople, mentions that last summer he visited, at the suggestion of the Board of Trade, the Chambers of Commerce of Sheffield, Bradford, and Manchester, with a view to finding what kind of information manufacturers and merchants look for in Consular trade reports, and in what other respects Consular assistance can promote British trade.

In his report, just published, Mr. Waugh shows his willinguess to forward British trade interests in many ways that other Consuls disdain. He states, for instance, that while it is outside any Consul's power to sue for a trader's debts, there are various ways in which unofficial persuasion or pressure can be brought to bear upon debtors, and whenever possible this is done. If this fails, he recommends a lawyer who can take legal proceedings, and by treaty the Consulate has the official right to watch lawsuits undertaken by British subjects before the Tarkish courts. Mr. Waugh, in fact, invites inquiries on such questions, as well as on the advisability of giving credit, and on the employment of competent agents. Moreover, he has sent during the year confidential communications to firms interested in special trades.

If other Consuls adopt this sympathetic attitude to British traders a revolution would gradually be wrought in the Consular service. It is clear that the Foreign Office places no obstacles in the way, but, on the other hand, Mr. Waugh's report shows that everything depends on the Consul himself. It is noticeable that Mr. Waugh again emphasises the importance of British manufacturers sending out efficient travellers, Of our total import trade into Turkey in 1904 no less than 64 per cent. consisted of cotton piece-goods and yarns, and in some measure this is due to the Armenian and Greek houses established in Manchesterwhich is testimony to the economic value of at least one section of our alien population. But German and Italian rivals are persevering, and a warning is given. Great Britain still does nearly twice as much trade with Turkey as any other country, but in the last quinquennium our exports increased only 33 per cent., while German exports increased 130 per cent.

The water supplied by the new wells is clear and free from all smell or colonr. It is absolutely sterile, no trace whatever of bacteria' life being found in it, and harder than Nile

During the flood season it is twice as hard but this difference decreases during the fall till in May the difference in the hydrotimetric figure of the two waters is reduced to the proportion of 7:5.

The well water contains a relatively large quantity of bicarbonate of chalk and magnesia but is far freer of sulphuric acid than Nile water. In quality it differs in no way from the water with which the chief cities of England, France, and Germany are supplied. The proportion of salt discovered in Nile water by chemical analysis at the season of low flood is about 2} times as great as that found to be present in the wells.

The water now supplied by the new installation has no doubt the same origin as the riverwater, i.e., is Nile water that has filtered through the soil. But this filtration has not taken place anywhere in the immediate neighbourhood of the wells, as is proved both by chemical analysis and by the constant temperature of the well water, which has clearly travelled for a great distance through the lower strata of the soil. Dr. Bitter, in a note to which we are indebte I for the above information, states his belief that the wells are fed by the underground Nile, that subterranean stream which below the surface accompanies the great river and has the same origin.

PREBENDARY CARLILE'S WORK.

INTERESTING MEETING IN CAIRO.

Unfortunately Prebandary Carlile's visit to Cairo has been such a short one that he had notime to give full prominence to the announcement of his very interesting though short meet ing at the Continental Hotel yesterday afternoon. It was also unfortunate that he had to fix this date irrespective of the other functions that were held that afternoon, whereby his audience was robbed of the presence of both Lord Cromer and Sir Reginald Wingate, both of whom wrote expressing their regret at not being able to be present, and enclosing at the same time donations to the good of the cause As was to be expected, the man, who has

given his life to the cause of the outcast and the needy, proves a very magnetic personality, and while listening to his simple direct statements one can form a very good idea of the reason of his success. He has spent but a week in Cairo, but one of his first actions was to pay a visit to the Reformatory for boys which is tneet, we should say, in connection with the situated at Ghizeh, and which is conducted on such admirable lines. His energetic mind saw stantinople. In quite a number of instances at once the drawback of an institution which the Grand Turk has gone out of his way to does its level best for its inmates and yet is unable to cope with the difficulties which surround them when they once leave its walls. has come to be suspected on the Continent His suggestion was practical enough, and one hopes that in time it will be possible to follow his idea and start in Cairo a Labour Home, where it is possible for men and youths to regain their characters and to make a fresh start in life. The description of the work done under the

organisation of Prebendary Carlile in England is interesting to a degree. The enormous extent of his working is almost incredible, for not only has he his labour homes, King's Tents, and other institutions in London, but he is constantly finding fresh openings for Canada, and also is always ready to provide labour wherever it is required in England. The munificent donation of £1,000 which the Queen sent him this last winter had not been in his possession twenty-four hours before a wall-though-out scheme was in action for the relief of the reedy unemployed in Londonhose who had wife and children dependent on them. No believer in encouraging mendicity, the Prebendary has started a system whereby a man must give a certain amount of work in return for his relief, and though he acknowledges that his system is by no means a remedy for the fearful poverty of the submerged tenth, still it is a far more salutary way out of the difficulty than indescriminate charity. Prebendary Carlile spoke of his many difficulties and also enthusiastically of the many kind friends who furthered his projects and assisted him not only with bandsome donations, but also with very we'come personal assistance. He also spoke of his church, St. Mary's-at-Hill, and of his popalar services there, and the attractions he held out to his congregation. The orchestra of string and wind instruments is one of the great elements in his service. As one old gentleman remarked to him, 'It do make my ead'rche. but it do my 'eart good." Another old lady complimented him with the remark, Since me usband 'as been to your show church, -he don't want to go to no music 'alls,"-which was perhaps the highest appreciation she could

Time forbids any longer account of this most interesting subject, and it is to be much regretted that there will be no further opportunity of hearing more of the wonderful work which is the outcome of one man's sympathy for the poor and needy. That sympathy which is always ready to assist those who have had no chance in life, and which is ready again and again to help on the fallen and to place their feet once more in the right way. One is glad to think that the great ones of the world value Prebendary Carile's work as it should be valued, and one trusts that his short visit to Cairo will result in a furtherence of his great life task.

BRANCHES THROUGHOUT THE WORLD.

SHEPHEARD'S NIGHT FETE.

There are many signs that the greatest of all seasons which Cairo has ever experienced is drawing to a close. The number of social entertainments in the week is getting less, and almost each day sies the departure of large parties for Alexandria or Port Said en route to the Riviera and home. Those who still rem in Cairo, however, flocked to Shepheard's Friday evening to participate in the great fete de nuit, and their numbars were vary largely added to by the hundreds of American visitors who arrived on Thursday.

Of all the social functions of the season the annual Venetian fête and battle of confatti- given by the management of Shepheard's Hotel stands alone. It is attended chiefly by our English and American visitors and is the one occasion on which the spirit of abandon is allowed full sway. Young, middle-sged and old joined in the fun and pelted each other unmercifully with that dreadful confetti, for which every one asserts an extreme dislike, but which, nevertheless, they all fly to when the chance of a confetti fight comes. The gardens of the hotel had been most beautifully decorated with Chinese lanterns and the scene was most picturesque, but it was only at the first entrance to them that one could appreciate their beauty. As the writer stood on the steps of the broad terrace leading on to them, he was suddenly and almost painfully conscious of being deluged with showers of confetti from about half a dozen different quarters and so was constrained to throw admiration aside and assert his power of returning a Roland for an Oliver. Purchasing a rag of confetti he joined in the melse and for over an hour assumed alternately the rôles of chaser and chased. In the midst of all the fun a bang and a glare declared the commencement of a firework display, which was confined to set pieces as it was deemed unwise by the authorities to allow rockets to be sent up only to descend, perhaps, with injurious effect. The mejority of the guests being tired of the fight and choked with confetti, about half-past eleven the band struck up in the E.yotian Hall and dancing Day. commenced. The floor was certainly not improved by the confetti which gradually covered its surface, but the ball continued marrily for some time and it was in the early hours of the morning that the last guests departed.

CONCERT AT THE SAVOY HOTEL.

M. Paul Kochansky gave his second concert on Friday night at the Savoy Hotel and did much to strengthen the favourab'e impression made by his first appearance. The first portion of the programme was given over to one of Mendelssohn's Concertos, which he interpret ed with much facility and feeling, the audante being especially appreciated. Bach's Chacone, with its unwonted intervals and curious harmonies, was endowed with new charms by the delicacy of his treatment of it, and an aria by the same composer was rendered with delightful simplicity and breadth of tone. He played Ambrosio's beautiful Romanza with wonderful expression, and his facility in fingering and technique found full sorpe in the Fileuse by Lotto and also in a worderful Mazırka o wzaki which he played with a verve and finish delightful to follow. His execution is indeed most wonderful, at times bordering on the extravagant and florid, but yet subtle and thoroughly fascinating. He interpolated a cadence of his own into Paganini's 'Non pin mesta" which was extraordinary in its faci ity and freedom of touch. Years may yet add to his powers, but his youthful exuberance and spontaneity are all for his present success.
