



The First Egyptian Date.

Professor James H. Breasted, Egyptologist of the University of Chicago, has announced, in an article in the 'Biblical World" that the oldest fixed date in history is 4241 BC. The professor says the calendar was established in that year, and that the year began on what would now be July 19. He bases his assertion upon recent investigations in Egypt.

Cairo Cambling Dens.

A raid was made upon an Italian gaming house in the Esbekieh quarter of Cairo on Monday night. An Italian janissary waited outside the building and, on the dispute of the proprietor that the police were not entitled to enter his house without Consular authority, speedily convinced the man that the raid was folly authorised. The stakes and perquisites of the baccarat table were seized. .

Mudir's Motor Mishap.

The President of the Shoubra Summary Court yesterday sentenced the chauffeur of the motor car wherein the Mudir of Keneh came to griet recently, to four months' imprisonment. Reports from Keneh state that Yessin Bey Mustapha, the Mudir, is cancelling the leave which he has been granted owing to his recent accident. His health is improving rapidly and he will arrive at Keneh in a week to take over his duties.

The building. which cost about £9,000, is now nearly complete, and it is considered the best structure of its kind in Egypt. It is unique too in being erected upon the avenue of sphinxes leading from the sacred temple at Karnac to the temple at Luxor. Such a school should prove a great blessing to Upper Egypt, not princes and leaders is welcome. because it is training so many girls to become good wives and mothers. It is very fortunate in possessing such an excellent Head Mistress as Miss Buchanan, who is a coltivated and large-minded woman with her heart in the work, and is sided by a good staff of teachers. The School will open on Wednesday, September 5th, when the autumn term begins.

School of Medecine

BRITISH SOLDIERS ATTACKED.

It is reported that an attack was made or two British officers of the Army of Occupation in the Abdin district of Cairo on Monday night by three Greek subjects. A police officer, accompanied by shawishes, speedily arrived on the scene of the affray, but experienced considerable trouble in quelling the disturbance which was caused, and only succeeded in arresting two of the three men, who were intoxicated. In the course of the disturbance a gas pipe was broken and a fire broke out, but was speedily extinguished.

So runs the report. We do not intend, however, to state these as the exact details of the case, which we hold over for confirmation. We are informed by the Ministry of the Interior that two British soldiers were attacked on that night, but at the time of our inquiries they were unable to give us any particulars of the affray, or state whether the victims were officers or privates. We also made erquiries at the Cairo Headquarters or the Army of Occupation and received as a reply that we were the first to have given that office any information of an attack having

Occurred.

The following is the version of the "Journal

du Caire":

On Monday evening the police officer of Abdin district was informed that three natives, in a state of intoxication, had seriously assaulted two British officers in the midan of the Opers. On arrival on this square, he found three persons striking the shawishes who were holding them. After a lively resistance he took them to the caracol. While the officer was drawing up the proces verbal, one of the assailants Alexander Kodsi, snatched it from him and tore it up, and at the same time. G. Arakgi upset the writing table on the officer, and wounded him. The third attacked the shawishes and hit them repeatedly. The three ruffixes were overpowered, however, and con fined. Soon afterwards a fire broke out owing to the carrying away of the gas-pipe in the prison. The shawishes promptly put the fire out. The enquiry has found these roffians to be Greeks, of evil antecedents.

ALL SAINTS' CHURCH ALTERATION.

WALKER & MEIMARACHI, LTD.

MR. MEIMARACHI'S POSITION.

The rumour of Mr. Constantine Meimarachi's resignation of the Managing Directorship of Walker and Meimarachi Limited has created considerable stir locally, for that gentleman commanded the confidence of the shareholders, and was generally regarded as the moving spirit of the Company. All sorts and kinds of reports have been afloat as to whether he had or had not resigned, and many and various have been the reasons given for this step. On the other hand, the "Phare d'Alexandrie" on Monday stated that the differences between Mr. Meimarachi and the London Board had been settled and that consequently the resignation had been withdrawn. We regret to state that our contemporary's optimistic statements are inexact. Mr. Meimarachi is at present in France with his family, and will only go to London in the middle of this month, when the Board of Directors will hold a meeting. At this meeting Mr. Meimara. chi will present his report on the working of the Company during the past year. At this meeting the Board of Directors will discuss the question of the construction of the new Cairo stores. In case the Board refuses to sanction Mr. Meimarachi's plans and programme he will send in his resignation. It is sincerely to be hoped that the Board will approve all Mr. Meimarachi's plans and will give him a free hand to do his utmost for the development of the Company, whose welfare he has so sincerely at heart. But assuming that the contrary happens, and that Mr. Meimarachi finds that he is obliged to tender his resignation, we presume that a general meeting of the shareholders of the company will be convened in Egypt, for no less than seven-eighths of the total shares are held at Cairo and Alexandria and almost all the shares are in the hands of friends and acquaintances of Mr. Meimarachi. Possibly therefore the shareholders will demand that the London Board should be done away with. That board costs the shareholders about £2,000 a year and there does not appear to be any valid reason for its existence, as, in our opinion, the best site for the Board is at Cain. the London Board being really a superfluors

BUILDING LANDS OF RGYPT.

An extraordinary general meeting of the above company was held at Alexandria yesterday, the 4th inst., at the Company's Office. There was a large gathering of shareholdes, 29,559 shares being represented.

The meeting, after having heard the Report

of the Board of Directors, and having been informed that Mr. Glymenopoulo had been persuaded to abandon the commission originally claimed by him, and also taking into consideration the protest of the Conpany's auditor concerning the previous meetings, declared that the resolutions voted on at the meetings of the 26th June and 18th July are of no effect and will now be voted as follows :-

The meeting approved of the amalganation of the Building Lands of Egypt with the Egyptian Trust and Investment Limited by the absorption of the latter Company, and on the conditions indicated in the agreement of the 2nd Jone, 1906, made between the beards of the two Companies.

The meeting decided to increase the capital of the Company by the issue of 60,000 shares of £4 to bear rank "pari passu" with those already issued. These 60,000 shares wil be delivered to the Shareholders of the Egypian Trust and Investment Limited in exchange for the 200,000 shares fully paid, at the rate 3 Buildings for 10 Trusts.

Every power is given to the Board to carry ont the amalgamation on the lines set forth in the preceding paragraphs.

Messrs Cumbo and Lombardo are appointed directors.

THE YEMEN.

The two transports bought by the Turkish Government in England have left Smyrna with 3,000 recruits on board for the Yemen. It appears that a disturbance broke out on board one of the vessels, the men objecting to going to the Yemen, but the movement was repressed without difficulty, and the vessels continued on their voyage. Two transports arrived at Kavak some days ago with recruits from Black Sea ports also bound for the Yemen, but they mutinied and seized and bound their officers refusing at all costs to go to the Yemen, whence they declared none of their comrades had ever returned. They were willing to die for the Sultan in any other part of the Empire bet not the Yemen. An aide-de-camp from the Sultan was sent on board and after some negotiation the men received assurances that they would not be required to continue their voyage. They immediately released their officers and were subsequently landed in Constantinople were they have been enrolled in the regiments of the garrison.

SUAKIN NOTES.

SUAKIN-ATBARA LINE.

TRAFFIC STOPPED BY WASHOUTS.

(FROM OUR CORRESPONDENT.)

Suakio, August 29. Terrible washouts have again occurred in several places, and the line has been interrapted now for over a month. Several bridges will have to be added to the Suakin-Atbara line so as to allow a free passage of the water, which come down in torrents over 1,000 feet wide and about 8 to 10 feet deep. The Khors span, so that now the rush of water with its tall force is bound to wash away the earthbanks adjoining the bridges. Of course these large washouts were not foreseen when the line was in construction as this year's washouts are the biggest seen for many years. The soldiers and Berbereen labourers are working very hard under the supervision of Bimbashis Newcombe and Lord to make new embankments where the lines have been washed out. The force of the water was so strong that it washed away heavy iron girders and huge rocks for a distance of a few kilometres.

The British steamer "Langdale" arrived here from England on the 25th inst., with a large consignment of railway material for the Sudan Government Railways, including 11,000 begs of coment and 10 bridges.

The Rev. THE TEACHING FACULTY.

The following are extracts from the report of the Commission appointed to examine fikihs (school masters) and ari/s (ushers) :-Out of 1,325 candidates, 327 fikihs and 241 arifs passed the examination; of these six were fikieh and six arifeh, or lady teachers, who were granted diplomas.

The normal schools for the preparation of teachers are that of Abdul Aziz, founded in 1904, that of the Payoum in 1905, and that of Boulac, for lady teachers, in 1903.

The number of inspectors and assistant inspectors last year was 38. Gertificates were awarded to 1,356 teachers,

of whom 682 were fikihs, 674 arif, 19 fikihich and 18 arifeh. Seven were Christiane.

NOTES FROM BEYROUT.

NEW DRAINAGE SCHEME.

AN ELECTRIC TRAMWAY.

(FROM OUR CORRESPONDENT.)

The drainage scheme to which I referred in

Beyrout, August 27.

ny last notes is beginning to crystallize into palpable shape. The Municipality is now building at the end of the Damasons road, which opens into the Square, a few meters of subterranean vanited sewer of solid masonry, by way of trial, in order to determine the preare far too wide for a few bridges of 100 feet cise cost per meter, and thus be in a position to properly assess the properties on both sides of the roads through which the sewers are proposed to be made. I had mentioned that the rate of contribution, according to which the Municipality had called upon the proprietors to subscribe, was fixed at 100 plastres per meter ; I am now informed by the Mayor, who has the credit of being the initiator of this excellent scheme, that simultaneously with the construction of the sewers the laying of paved sidewalks will be undertaken, and the rate of contribution is estimated to amount then to L.T. 2 per meter of built property. This up to date system of covered sewerage will incalculably improve the sanitation of the town. The fact of Beyrout being built on a natural amphitheatre will, by the rather steep inclination of most of the roads, constitute in itself a great source of economy. The sidewalks prove another boon to the inhabitants. The promisouity of traffic in the streets of Beyrout is as ludicrous as it is revolting. Carriages, cars, trucks, uncouth camels with bulky and obstructive burdens, mules and donkeys with equally cumbersome loads, and riders of horses, mules, and donkeys, share with the poor pedes train the limited space of our streets. Indeed the human species has the worst part of the road, and to cap his miseries, lounging, idle. dirty dogs beset his path, and would resent with a growl or a snarl any summary request en the part of the passer-by to make way. But, great as is this nuisance of dogs, it has its good side, and I, for one, believe that without these energetic scavengers heaps of fermenting domestic refuse would fill the atmosphere of Loco Superintendent, Sudan Government Rail-the town with noxious exhalations. These ways, has also gone on leave to England, and scavengers perform their duty at least more conscientiously than their paid biped colleagues of the Municipality. Electric Tramway.

The people of Beyrout are awaiting with

great anxiety the beginnings of this important scheme, which is not only calculated to bring about a better condition of the roads, and develop the town in different ways, but will also deliver people of modest means from the unrestrained insolence and tyranny of carriagedrivers. It had been said that the Company's engineer was to return here in October next. to start the work forthwith. I have been informed by the President of the Municipality that he recently received a telegram from the engineer advising him of his arrival at Brussels, and adding that he was forwarding particulars by letter. Although things in the Bast are apt to evolve rather slowly, yet in this instance the fact of the Electric Tramway Company having already bought some land at the outskirts of the town for the erection of its depot station is an earnest of the accomplishmennt of the

An American Horse Collector.

The famous American cartoonist, Mr. Homer Davenport, arrived here lately with two wealthy Americans enamoured of sport and travel. Mr. Davenport has for his main object in this visit the purchase of the best Arab breds. He has unfortunately been forestalled by a party of Italians, who last week sailed by the Plorio Rubattino steamer with the finest specimens of Arab bred horses, destined for the Italian Royal studs. It is said, however, that a large tribe of about 1,400 Bedonine have migrated lately from the Northern re gions between the Tigris and Euphrates to the plains of Hama and Homs, with all their cattle and horses, and this may afford this American horse collector an exceptional opportanity to come across some fine specimens, without having to travel extensively in the interior and lose much time and money. In the meantime these three travellers are having extra fine sport in the bountiful regions around Alexandretta and Antioch, and they are said to be provided with rifles of the most perfected type, mounted with small telescopes for long distance shooting. I hear from the American Consul that Mr. Davenport is expected back here in about a fortnight, and that he intends giving a lecture on car'ooning, which he may be illustrating with extempore rough cartoons on a screen ad hoc. This would certainly be a rare occasion.

TINNED FOODS AT ALEXANDRIA

Coleridge) reported that during the three months ended July 31 the police, acting as inspectors under the Food and Drugs Act, took forty samples of timed, canned, and potted meats. He regretted to say that grave fault had been found with those of foreign brands, the county analyst having in some cases certified the contents of tins to be unfit for homan consumption. He suggested that the Committee, in the interest of the public, might think right to authorise him to issue some warning on the subject."
