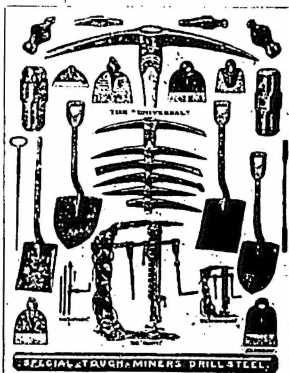

PLAGUE INVESTIGATION.

The Advisory Committee appointed by the
Lister Institute of Preventive Medicine, and
financed by the Indian Government, have
recently published the reports of their Work-
ing Commission, which has been conducting
operations in the Plague Research Labo-
ratory, Parel, Bombay. Up to the present, the
Commission has mainly concerned itself with
the epizootic spread of plague among rats,
and the means by which the disease may be
communicated from that animal to man. The
reports which have now been issued must be
regarded as of a more or less preliminary
nature, as it will be impossible for the Com-
mission to give their final conclusions until the
completion of their observations, which in
many cases must be extended over a period of
twelve months. The reports bring to light,
and the "Globe," several facts of great in-
terest; it has been ascertained that out-
breaks of plague in India are in the great
majority of cases preceded by an outbreak
of disease among rats, and as there is abun-
dant evidence to show that this is the
chief cause of plague epidemics, it will at once
be obvious that a knowledge of its causes and
history is of paramount importance to us. It
must be remembered that in India the rat
lives chiefly in dwelling houses, and that the
opportunities of the plague bacillus being trans-
ferred from the rat to man are, therefore, of
constant occurrence. There are several ways in
which the infection may be communicated, either
by the rats soiling human food, or by parasites
which infest the rats, and will also feed on
man, or through direct poisoning from rat
bites. Of these three causes the Commission
has come to the conclusion that by far the
greatest danger arises from the bites of para-
sites, and a series of experiments of a most
intricate nature have been made which tends
to uphold their opinion.

Aujourd'hui, dernier jour de la liquidation, une réaction partielle s'est produite à l'occasion des ventes forcées qui ont eu lieu; la baisse du coton américain dans lequel des égyptiens se trouvent intéressés a également influencé les vendeurs.

Le National Bank hausse de 27 1/16 à 27 3/8, la Cassa di Sconto de 242 à 243 1/4 et 243 1/4 à 243 1/2, la Banque d'Athènes de 147 1/4 à 147 3/4, tandis que le Comptoir réactions de 7 1/8 à 6 15/16 et 7 1/8 à 6 7/8 l'action de 53 à 52 1/2 la part de fondateur, l'Agricole de 9 25/32 à 9 3/4, l'obligation nouvelle Crédit Foncier de 273 à 271, le Crédit Franco-Egyptien de 5 5/8 à 5 9/16, la Banque d'Orient de 134 à 133 1/2.

De 17 9/16 la Delta Light à 17 5/16, la Delta Land de 4 7/32 à 4 3/32, la Building Lands de 4 31/32 à 4 15/16 et l'Union Péninsulaire de 6 9/16 à 6 1/2 pendant que l'Urbaine s'avance de 65/8 à 6 11/16.

Parmi les Sociétés qui vont être lancées en Egypte au cours de cette saison, se trouve une banque de report au capital de £200,000 en actions de £1 chaque. Le succès obtenu par le Comptoir Financier et Commercial d'Egypte a été tel et a répondu à de si grands besoins qu'il n'est pas étonnant de voir d'autres Sociétés embrasser la même voie d'opérations. La nouvelle banque sera lancée comme Compagnie égyptienne sous les auspices de capitalistes anglais. Le capital est déjà intégralement souscrit.

NOTES ET CRITIQUES

Le Caire, Novembre 3. Le taux de l'escompte libre à Londres a été élevé hier de 1/8 à 6%. Au Stock Exchange le Consolidé anglais n'en a pas moins haussé de 1/8 à 86 1/2. L'Unifiée a été cotée 109 1/2, ex-coupon. La National Bank a gagné 1/8 à 27 1/16, la Delta 1/4 à 17 3/8 et la Delta Light 1/8 à 12 1/8. L'Agricole est demeurée inchangée à 9 3/4.

A Paris, l'action Crédit Foncier Egyptien est renouveau en hausse de 3 francs à 785. La Banque d'Athènes a progressé à 147. L'Empire russe 1906 a passé de 85 10 à 85.60.

Ici, le marché ne s'est pas trop laissé influencer par la hausse du taux de l'escompte libre à Londres; il a compris que c'est là un effet transitoire de la cherté des reports à la liquidation du fin de mois. Aussi bien la tendance n'a pas été mauvaise et une certaine fermeté a prédominé, malgré tout, sur une bonne partie de la note.

TELEGRAMS.

NEW YORK GOVERNORSHIP.

EPITHETIC ELECTORAL CAMPAIGN.

ROOSEVELT STIGMATIZES HEARST.

NEW YORK, November 3. The electoral campaign for the Governorship of New York surpasses all previous elections in America for passion and vehemence. Epithets of "liar," "sneak," "blackguard," "rowdy," etc., etc., are constantly exchanged. President Roosevelt, who is unable to personally participate, has commissioned Mr. Root to declare publicly that Mr. Hearst's election would bring injury and discredit to honest labour and honest capital. Mr. Root denounced Mr. Hearst as a deliberate demagogue, an exploiter of sensationalism, an apologist for the murder of President Mac Kinley, an upstirrer of useless discontent. After Mr. Root's speech the betting in Wall Street in favour of Mr. Hughes advanced to 4 to 1. (Reuter)

NORTH POLE EXPEDITION.

COMMANDER PEARY'S RETURN.

OTTAWA, November 3. According to advices received at Hopedale (Labrador) the explorer Commander Peary is returning after having reached 87.6 degrees, which is the farthest point yet attained. (Reuter)

OTTAWA, November 3.

Commander Peary's homeward voyage was an incessant battle against ice and storms. There were no deaths or illness, although sometimes the men were starving and compelled to eat their dogs. The expedition left New York on the 16th July, 1905. (Reuter)

FRENCH POLICY.

NEW MINISTRY'S DECLARATION.

PARIS, November 3. The Council of Ministers has approved the Ministerial Declaration, which will be read on Monday. This Declaration is more advanced than those of all previous Cabinets. It announces numerous projects in the interior; abroad, it intends to maintain the Franco-Russian Alliance and the previous friendships formed by France, which will continue to follow a policy of rectitude, resting on defensive forces. (Havas)

PARIS, November 4.

A declaration which M. Clemenceau will read in the Chamber of Deputies on Monday asserts that the Cabinet intends to maintain the Franco-Russian Alliance and all the previous friendships formed by France. France will continue to pursue with the Powers the straightforward policy which has enabled her to take one of the first places in the world, and which she will support with her defensive forces. The Separation Law is to be applied without persecution, but firmly. Numerous extensive reforms dealing with income tax and old-age pensions are foreshadowed. (Reuter)

AUSTRIA AND ITALY.

FRIENDLY DECLARATIONS.

ROME, November 3.

According to a semi-official statement, published simultaneously here and in Vienna, Baron Liza d'Aehrenthal and Signor Tittoni exchanged friendly declarations resulting in an agreement. They are acting in full accord in order to render ever more cordial and intimate the excellent relations between the two Governments. (Reuter)

JAPANESE SPY ARRESTED.

MADRID, November 3.

A Japanese has been arrested who is supposed to be an engineer. He was discovered making maps of the railways, rivers, and bridges. (Reuter)

RUSSIAN SAILORS' MUTINY.

VLADIMIR, November 4.

A number of sailors who were imprisoned in connection with the Sveaborg mutiny put their jailers in irons and liberated 200 of their comrades. Troops were called by telephone and suppressed the mutiny. (Havas)

"UNION OF RUSSIAN PEOPLE."

ST. PETERSBURG, November 4.

Certain members of the "Union of Russian People" have been arrested here. (Reuter)

MEDITERRANEAN TIDAL WAVE.

PARIS, November 3.

The damage done by the storm to the seven ports in the vicinity of Toulon was most extensive. The latest advices show that many families have been rendered destitute. The military and naval authorities are endeavouring to obtain Government aid for them. (Reuter)

TELEGRAMS.

ENGLAND'S MUNICIPAL ELECTIONS.

A WARNING TO GOVERNMENT.

MODERATES UNPARALLELED GAINS.

LONDON, November 3.

All the newspapers comment on the surprising results of the municipal elections, indicated by the fact that only two London boroughs returned Progressive candidates. The Liberal Press, while attributing the defeat to lavish expenditure in the past, says that the Moderates made use of Conservative political machinery in the attempt to re-capture London. They admit that the public dread of Socialism is induced by the truculent tone of the Labourite speakers.

The Conservative Press considers the result of the election indicative of growing dissatisfaction with the Government, and warns Unionists that the call to arms may come when least expected.

Mr. Balfour, speaking in the City, said that the results showed that the country was beginning to see through the platitudinous pretences, by means of which the Government obtained office.

Mr. Asquith, speaking at Manchester, said that the Government intended, without delay, to endow the Orange River Colony to the fullest extent with self-government. He criticised very strongly the reconstitution of the Education Bill by the House of Lords, and said that the Government would not yield if it could, and could not if it would. (Reuter)

GALWAY ELECTION.

FIGHTING WITH SHILLELAGHS.

DUBLIN, November 4.

Galway election.—Mr. Stephen Gwynn, Nationalist candidate, has been elected with 983 votes, in place of Mr. Devlin, retired. Mr. Shaw Taylor, the Devolutionist candidate, secured 577 votes. Fighting with shillelaghs continued all day. The police were powerless to restore order. (Reuter)

Six persons have been removed to hospital. Forty arrests have been made. (Feuter)

SPANISH SOVRREIGNS AT MALAGA.

VISIT TO BRITISH FLEET.

MALAGA, November 3.

The King and Queen have arrived here. They were enthusiastically received. Prince Louis of Battenberg welcomed them at the station. The town was dressed with British and Spanish flags. (Feuter)

The King and Queen of Spain have gone to Malaga on a visit to the British Fleet anchored there. It has been currently stated in Court circles that the King, in speaking of the approaching visit, exclaimed: "Since Philip II. no Spanish King visited England until I myself went there; and I not only visited England, but I married an English Princess, and I believe when I have done that I can also pay a visit to Gibraltar!"

WIRELESS TELEGRAPHY CONVENTION.

BERLIN, November 4.

The Wireless Telegraphy Convention has been signed.

It is understood that the British delegates are satisfied with the results, and believe that the naval interests have been fully safeguarded. (Reuter)

ANOTHER SPRINGBOK VICTORY.

LONDON, November 3.

Rugby Football. The South Africans beat Gloucester by 23 points to nil. (Feuter)
