The Far Eastern States, for example, cannot confine their emigration to families only, and families of the best character, while the white States cannot accept their uneducated populations into accepting their yellow competitors as friends and helpers. The movement, if it became general, must inevitably develop small industrial class wars; and diplomats may on that ground alone use all their energies to prevent by agreement what must otherwise prove a disturbing contact, in the absence of which peace between the races might ring for ages.

Yesterday's telegrams contained a significant announcement of the opinion of the American Press as to the inevitability of the war between Japan and the United States. The trouble has only just commenced, but as the "Spectator" remarks in an article on the subject, it may rapidly become serious. The yellow people are very peaceable and very sensitive. They do not acknowledge—as, for example, the negroes have hitherto done—that there is any inherent inequality between themselves and the white men; and, not acknowledging it, the weight of argument is entirely upon their side. They do not even understand why their "intrusion" is disliked, and they see their way to reprisals which might in certain contingencies—as, for instance, a great European war—develop into active hostilities. The subject should therefore be dealt with before the Governments have caught fire, and while the classes which are not affected in both sets of countries are prepared to listen to reasonable argument.

THE BRINDISI ROUTE.
 "Of late," says the "Times of India," "the delays in the transit of the mails across the Continent have become incessant, and the frequent complaints we receive show that they are causing considerable irritation in India. The Peninsula and Oriental Company is not in any way responsible. That Company does not contract to deliver the mails in Bombay on Friday morning, or at any other fixed time. It undertakes to deliver them in Bombay within a stipulated number of hours after receiving them at Brindisi, and it very rarely fails to fulfill its undertaking. Many people seem to regard it as a public grievance that the P. and O. Company does not drive its steamers faster when the mails are late. Every business man, at least, will perceive that that is not a business proposition. Why should the P. and O. Company incur increased expenditure and burn more coal to raise the speed of its ships, in order to atone for the shortcomings of the Continental railways? The Company does what it is asked to do, and what it contracts to do; and in point of fact, by far the larger number of its mail deliveries within the year are considerably within contract time.
 "The fault lies not with the steamship company, but with the railways, and more particularly with the Italian lines. In spite of the repeated promises of the Italian Ministry, the trunk line down the Adriatic is still in a condition unworthy of a great mail route."

so long as so much uncertainty exists about the passage of the mails over the Alps and through Italy, in winter we shall never be able to reckon upon a regular timing of the arrival of the mails at Bombay during the cold weather, when passengers are most numerous and business is brisker. It is a discreditable thing that while the transportation of the mails through the Mediterranean and the Red Sea and the Indian Ocean is punctually conducted, progressive Europe seems incapable of arranging for the regular running of its trains. This subject has been so long a matter for complaint, that the desirability of considering the ultimate abandonment of the Brindisi route is clearly indicated.

MOSLEMS AND THE SULTAN.
 A well-informed correspondent of the "Times of India" at Constantinople reports that the Sultan has recently had placed before him a letter from Bombay, which seems to have escaped the vigilance of his secret police. Copies of the letter, which is printed in Persia, have reached both the Grand Vizier and the Foreign Minister, and much consternation is the result, although there is not a word in the document which is not justified by actual facts. The correspondent has no doubt, from internal evidence, that the letter is what it professes to be, the work of some native of India who have recently visited Turkey and seen for themselves the misgovernment rife throughout the Empire. The letter says that as supreme head of Islam his Majesty is held in veneration by nearly 200,000,000 Moslems in all parts of the world, and remarks that, had his policy been different, it would have been easy for him to unite all Moslems under his leadership for the mutual benefit of those of their co-religionists who lack freedom and education. The misadministration of the Empire was the cause of foreign interference, and his Majesty's energies were concentrated in endeavours to sow discord amongst European Powers, and so prevent their working in common to carry out those reforms which he himself should be the very first to introduce. Wherever the writers travelled in the Sultan's dominions they saw officials vilified by extortion, and their hearts bled at the sight of the Turkish soldiers starving and in rage. In consequence of their ill-treatment the troops soon refused to fight throughout the world were saluted as the chief Moslem States should be so lost to all ideas of good government. Mention is made of Germans being paid large salaries to attend the weekly Selamlik in the train of the Sultan, and of the vast sums squandered in the purchase of war material at the bidding of the German Emperor. The Hedjaz Railway appears to the writers to be carried on at the present time, whatever its future benefits to pilgrims may be, for the sole purpose of putting money into the pockets of the committee, with whom the patronage for contracts rests. The writer compares the freedom enjoyed under British rule in India with the tyranny existent in Turkey, and it is remarked "that under the former the services of upright honest Moslems are readily obtainable. The correspondent doubts whether the letter will have any immediate good, as the members of his Majesty's entourage will not allow him to probe these ills and to see for himself how evil is the state of affairs. He believes that the letter scattered broadcast throughout the whole Moslem world there would be a general uprising of Islam to demand reform."

TELEGRAMS.

U. S. A. AND JAPAN.

STATEMENT BY PRESIDENT.

WASHINGTON, February 8. President Roosevelt, in the course of an interview, stated that the published reports of his speech before the California Congressmen were without foundation. He never suggested that Japan had presented an ultimatum nor that there was any danger of war. He rigorously depreciates as mischievous and wicked the war talk which was utterly unjustified by the facts of the case.

FRANCE AND RUSSIA.

PARIS, February 8. In the Chamber of Deputies, M. Jaurès criticised the manoeuvres on the Bourse aiming at procuring money for Russia. M. Caillaux replied that French investments abroad gave diplomatic force to France. The simple order of the day was voted.

FALL IN FRENCH RENTES.

PARIS, February 8. A sharp fall in French Rentes took place here owing to the ambiguity of the income tax bill regarding them.

RUSSIAN GOVERNOR KILLED.

ST. PETERSBURG, February 8. M. Alexandrovsky, the Governor of Posen and Commissioner of the Red Cross during the Japanese war, was assassinated whilst leaving the theatre. His assassin was severely wounded and has died in hospital.

PENNA, February 8. Alexandrovsky, Governor of the city, has been assassinated.

DUMA ELECTIONS.

ST. PETERSBURG, February 8. The primary elections have been proceeding during the past fortnight throughout Russia, but it is impossible to arrive at anything resembling a correct classification. The Government and the Liberals alike maintain that each has secured the majority.

THE THAW TRIAL.

PATHETIC SCENES IN COURT. New York, February 8. Most pathetic scenes were witnessed at the Thaw trial yesterday. The prisoner's wife, in giving evidence, told a terrible story of her betrayal by Stanford White. The prisoner, his wife, and nearly all the court wept. The evidence has changed the aspect of the case, affording a strong motive for the deed.

EXPLOSION ON TORPEDO-BOAT.

LOBENITZ, February 8. A boiler explosion on a torpedo boat caused the death of nine persons.

ROYAL VISIT TO PARIS.

PARIS, February 8. The King and Queen have had a quiet day and will return to England to-morrow.

TELEGRAMS.

LORDS AND COMMONS.

PREPARING FOR THE FRAY.

LONDON, February 8. The Attorney General, speaking at Leeds, said that the fight with the Lords would be a tough job because it meant one or two dissolutions and a combination of the Crown and the people against the aristocracy. The Unionist leaders challenge an appeal to the country against the Lords with the strictest confidence. The Cabinet sat at three days running, indicating special energy in preparing for the Session.

THE GERMAN ELECTIONS.

BERLIN, February 8. The Press comments on the result of the elections and the new grouping of parties in the Reichstag. Most of the newspapers recognize that the object of the dissolution has been attained and that Prince von Bismarck has succeeded in combining the Clerical and Socialist majority. The Clericals are no longer strong enough to form an opposition majority with the assistance of the Socialists. Although the number of Centre members has not diminished, they have no longer the same power since the check to the Socialists. The 'Vorwärts' even recognises that Prince von Bismarck is conqueror and has attained his object.

PRESS COMMENTS.

THE NEWSPAPERS reproduce the criticism of the foreign press on the subject of the Emperor's speech and unanimously refute the false commentaries which insist that His Majesty's words fret an aggressive policy towards foreign countries.

SOCIALISM IN GERMANY.

BERLIN, February 8. Alien students, mainly Russian, who assisted the Socialists at the elections, have been notified to quit the country within a fortnight.

THE KAISER AND SAXONY.

BERLIN, February 8. The Emperor has wired to the King of Saxony his lively satisfaction at the results of the elections. He was especially thankful that the people of Saxony had displayed a healthy patriotic sentiment.


