**LAND RECLAMATION IN EGYPT.**  
An interesting account of a visit to an estate near Cairo with a description of the methods employed there for land reclamation, is contributed by a correspondent of the "Field."  
A short journey from Cairo, he writes, lands one at a wayside station on the bank of one of the principal branches of the Nile, that interesting river on which depends the whole question of agriculture in Egypt. Running more or less parallel with it and the railway is one of the numerous canals which carry its waters, under rules fixed by the Irrigation Department, into the various districts under cultivation and from which it is again dispersed by still smaller canals until finally spread over the land as required. The water from the river is conveyed into the canals by pumps on its banks, and in this locality may be seen a great variety, the engines being both oil and steam, mostly of English manufacture, though German and French makers seem to devote more thought to economy in working.

Opposite the station is the manager's (a hard working Scot) house, from which a broad road runs through a newly-planted avenue of trees into the heart of the estate, passing en route the offices, stores, and stables; in the latter stand the horse, mules, and donkeys used by the employes, while the cattle used for ploughing, levelling, etc., are grazing on bersim (a kind of clover) a short distance away. By the side of the road runs a light railway, with trucks drawn by mules. This forms a valuable and rapid transport for machinery, materials, and crops about the property, and largely reduces the cost of labour and cartage. To inspect the estate one can either ride on a small-seated car on this railway, or, better still get one of the excellent donkeys of the country, which can carry a heavy man all day at about five miles an hour, even over bad ground.

The land here is the property of a company run largely under English management, and the result of the work proves how much more economical and continuous this is than left to native or Levantine superintendents. This land within the last two years has to the extent of some 5000 acres, been canalised and drained, and washed free of salt, at the same time that villages have been erected for the peasants, and the cultivation carried on by them on the principle of half shares with the landlord.

As soon as the land is in thorough good heart it is sold in small plots to the peasants whose one idea of increasing prosperity is to become a landowner. It is often asked why the peasant does not reclaim land for himself, but it is obvious to those who have visited these properties that individuals could not start a system of canals and drainage unless all their neighbours agreed to join in. It is here that the companies are so useful, by buying large tracts of waste land and planning out a skilful scheme of levels, with the necessary pumps, canals, and drains; they can naturally approach the Irrigation Department for a water supply, which would be impossible in the case of a lot of small owners with different interests. The soil in this part of the Gharbiyah Province of the Delta, being so near sea-level, is impregnated with salt, but by constructing the canals above the level of the land and the drains below, the water which floods the land carries the brine down with it into the drains, from which it is pumped to the sea. The following year bersim crops may be grown, and if they do well the cotton follows and it is from this that the large profits come, some of the land letting at £7 to £8 an acre. When it is considered that the waste land has in some cases been bought at £10 to £15 an acre, and with an expenditure varying from £8 to £10, with careful management can be sold, when in good bearing condition, at from £80 to £100 an acre, according to position near rail or river, the value of such work is clear.

It is gratifying to see the friendly terms existing between the English officials and peasants, and the use of steam cultivators, diggers, levellers, &c., all of British manufacture, prove that some of our firms can adapt themselves to the needs of foreign countries. Compare the work of these machines with those of the country—a native with a wooden implement wrestling with a pair of bullocks, one stopping, the other trying to turn round, and the whole moving at the rate of a quarter of a mile an hour—and one wonders that any work was ever finished without them. It is only when land is deep in mud and water that the cattle are indispensable. Egyptian research shows us much in the way of scientific skill known to the ancients, but the methods of agriculture seem to have been always the same until the European, with his machinery, appeared to hustle matters on, that there is not much new under this beautiful sun may be instanced by an Egyptian incubator hatching eggs by the hundred; the eggs placed in layers with sand or chopped straw about them in a mud-brick hut, with only a human thermometer in the shape of an aged man, who regulates the warmth by his own feelings. Chickens a day old are sent about in crates by rail, a method not long since discovered in England. Even the small boys scavenging birds and armed with a long thonged whip used the double turn of the wrist that was formerly shown in English hunting fields as "the Beaufort crack."

SHIPPING DISASTERS.

A SERIES OF ACCIDENTS.

LONDON, March 4. A remarkable series of fog accidents have occurred in the Straits of Dover. Altogether seven steamships and five sailing vessels have been in collision. Two steamers have been sunk, including the German steamer Helene, of which 8 of the crew have been drowned. The Ostend mail steamer Princesse Henriette arrived at Dover having been stove in collision with a fishing smack. The Red Star liner Vaderland, with passengers on board, and two other steamers, and two sailing vessels are ashore on the Goodwin Sands. (Reuter)

MR. CHAMBERLAIN.

ALMOST A PHYSICAL WRECK.

LONDON, March 4. Mr. Chamberlain, embarking at Dover, was almost unrecognisable. He was wearing glasses and appeared to be quite unable to walk unaided. He leaned heavily on his daughter with one hand and was using a stick with the other. He bore the crossing well and proceeded to Saint Raphael, near Cannes. (Reuter)

LORD DAVEY'S SUCCESSOR.

LONDON, March 4. Sir Richard Henry Collins has been appointed Lord Justice of Appeal in succession to Lord Davey. (Reuter)

GOVERNOR OF JAMAICA RESIGNS.

LONDON, March 4. Sir Alexander Swettenham has resigned from the Governorship of Jamaica. (Reuter)

NEW BISHOP FOR ALEXANDRIA.

ROME, March 4. Rev. Rojanna, Rector of the American College here, has been appointed Bishop of Alexandria. (Reuter)

BANK OF MOROCCO.

PARIS, March 4. The Chamber has passed the Bill relative to the registration of the constitutive acts of the Bank of Morocco. (Havas)

RUSSIAN TERRORISM.

ST. PETERSBURG, March 4. 1,500 police searched the students' quarters of the Polytechnic Institute here yesterday morning and discovered a number of infernal machines, bombs, repeating rifles, and dynamite. Fifteen arrests were made. (Reuter)

LODZ, March 4. Three Terrorists have killed Captain Dlugoff, ex-member of the Council of War. (Havas)

COUNTY COUNCIL ELECTIONS.

WARNING TO GOVERNMENT.

LONDON, March 4. The Liberal papers describe the result of the elections as a triumph of T. M. Hall and a victory of trusts due to flood money, to unparalleled mendacity and calumny, and to conspiracy of all unclean interests. They nevertheless admit that the participation of women, a general apprehension of Socialistic schemes, and the disapproval of past, extravagant expenditure greatly influenced the elections. The Unionist papers rejoice that the career of the Wastre is finished, and that London has been spared a municipal electoral scheme involving a cost of £20,000,000. It is affirmed in several quarters that the elections will serve as a warning to the Government. (Reuter)

THE KING IN PARIS.

LONDON, March 4. The King has started for Paris and Biarritz. (Reuter)

PARIS, March 4. King Edward arrived in the evening. (H.)

"C.-B." ACCUSED OF MACHIAVELISM.

LONDON, March 4. Sir H. Campbell Bannerman's article in "The Nation" has been received in a very unfriendly manner by the foreign Press. The Germans accuse him of Machiavelism. The French papers emphasize the facility of his suggestions with regard to the limitation of armaments in the present condition of the continent of Europe. (Reuter)

ALGERIAN v. EGYPTIAN COTTON.

A note from France is to the effect that a group of Algerian landed proprietors have met in Algiers and formed themselves into a syndicate for encouraging the cultivation of cotton in that Colony, and they have issued a statement on the subject, which contains, inter alia, the following considerations—namely, that it is impossible to foresee when the low prices for cotton, which existed ten years ago, will return; that there are limits to the producing power of those countries hitherto known as great cotton furnishers; that it is essential that manufacturing countries such as France should be emancipated from the American monopoly; and that the last methodical efforts to cultivate cotton on a substantial scale in Algiers have been so successful as to prove that the Colony can produce the same qualities and in some places the same relative quantities as Egypt.

EGYPT AND CUBA.

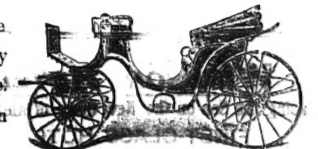

THE PRISONS DEPARTMENT. This department has rather deviated from its usual custom and exhibits simply a collection of articles selected from the stores of each prison; the object being, we understand, to give a general idea of what may be supplied by each provincial central prison to its district or municipalities.

Though shows samples of cutting and foundry work a native cart, strong and well made, a small engine, brass fire hose couplings, and a substantial water cart, all made within its walls, besides some excellent woodwork, boots, weaving wood models, iron tools, very comfortable easy chairs, the production entirely of convict labour.

The Refractory shows woodwork, ironwork, and tin-mithing, all excellent work from the hands of these boys. The chief features of this exhibit are the boots, which compare most favorably with any out-side work and book-binding of a first-class description.

Tantab, Z. g. zig, Shebin el Khar, and Sonef all show samples of easy chairs, brushes, brooms, weaving, tasses, plough-bars, and blades, of a description which certainly are a great improvement on the local article.

Sing has a splendid display of weaving representing every article in household use. The workmanship from the looms is a good specimen of what can be got from native labour.

Assistants show its speciality in turning, viz., walking sticks in ivory, ebony and rhino, fly-whisks and fancy articles from the same material, easy chairs, weaving, etc., door mats, earth baskets, blankets.

Cairo has a really good display of "Turkish" rugs and carpets, some excellent basket work in chairs, tables, etc., also sets of harness for carriage, dogcart, and mule, well worthy of the attention of those likely to need leather work.

There are bags, portfolios, and other articles the product of the saddle-makers' art. Easy chairs are a great feature in this prison's exhibit. Brushes, too, are good. Door mats are artistically made.

Alexandria has a display of harness. Two specimen sets of brown leather, one dogcart, and a specially designed set of cart harness attracted considerable attention. Travelling bags and portfolios are well and strongly made. Cocos matting seems to be a staple trade in Alexandria prison. Door mats were evidently of a good and substantial description.
