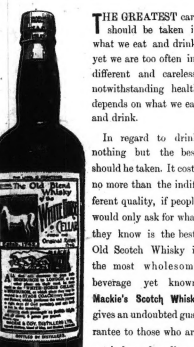

AMERICA AND JAPAN.

Commenting on the forthcoming tour of the American fleet through the waters of the world, the New York Herald says: President Roosevelt has by no means given final sanction to the plan of sending the battleship fleet to the Pacific via the Straits of Magellan.

It is expected that when the entire fleet is ready to move it will consist of twenty ships.

LOCAL AND GENERAL.

Arrests. 11 deaths, 22 misdemeanors and 52 minor offences occurred in Cairo yesterday.

British Consular Court. Notice of appeal has been given by the plaintiff in the case of Parkes v. His good old old company. The judgment was given in yesterday's issue.

Levy. Nineteen tons Egyptian, and eight tons Abyssinian ivory, have arrived in London for quarterly sales, which commence July 23. The total arrivals amount to 53 tons.

Quarantine. Consequent to the recurrence of bubonic plague in Egypt, quarantine of five days' quarantine is being demanded by the Egyptian authorities to be passed in one of the houses of the Empire, and 10 days' quarantine is notified for Malta.

Action against Newspapers. The libel action against the newspapers "Al Itikad," "Al Shark" and "El Watan" came off yesterday before the English Court. The representations of counsel for the defendants the further hearing was adjourned to the 7th proximo.

Rouge in Cairo. A party being in his carriage through the Darassa car on Tuesday last, Dr. Mohamed Bey Fakhat was attacked by a gang of native rascals, with only provocation being given, and was so severely injured that he will require some of the best medical treatment.

The Vivante Mystery. A Spaniard was arrested at Alexandria this morning on suspicion of having been concerned in the murder of Mr. Vivante. He bears a resemblance to the person who lived in an adjoining room. The thief of his lot had been summoned to the Spanish consulate to confront the man. The arrested man has not been definitely identified, though he bears a resemblance to the person who occupied the room near Vivante's and left the hotel early in the morning.

Cattle Plague. 186 fatal cases of cattle plague occurred during the month of July. On the 15th instant of which 5 were reported from the province of Charbia, 51 from Beni-Souef, 25 from the Fayoum, 13 from Ghiza, 4 from Kahlouba, 66 from Assiout and 19 from the province of Assiout.

Petitors at Khartoum. Residents in the eastern part of Khartoum complain of the presence of women pedlars in that quarter, who have installed themselves in streets and lanes, and make themselves something of a nuisance to decent people. The attention of the local authorities has been called to the matter, and it is hoped that shops of wooden stands might be built there and left to responsible persons who will sell their wares in the open air, and who will see to it that no cause for complaint is furnished.

Cotton at Gabbari. The Egyptian State Railways Administration will visit to facilitate the goods work at Gabbari station and in order to provide a convenient connection for the goods the new goods during the cotton season, has decided, after consultation with the Alexandria Chamber of Commerce, to make 12 trains a week, on Monday, October 1st, January 31st each year, the withdrawal of cotton bales Gabbari on Sundays will be obligatory, and on other ordinary days on which demurrage will be collected in cases of delay.

Subotic Plague. Yesterday's plague bulletin reports 5 admissions to hospital. All the admissions are a Greek young man, merchant of the Meshkiki-hon, and the remaining two natives, one from the village of Beni-Souef, and the other from Beni-Souef. Two Europeans died in hospital, of whom one was Miss Agathon, widow of the late proprietor, and the other of the late proprietor, and the other of the late proprietor. Cairo Fire. The fire which broke out at midday on Tuesday last in Shama, Boulevard el-Masara, did not extend to the property of the shop before 4 o'clock owing to the prompt attendance of four fire engines. Four rooms of the grand hotel in the quarter mentioned owing to fire being communicated from a confectioner's shop. Experiences has, however, shown that the Law of Tewfik Pasha, like those of the other Law of Pasha, offers certain specific advantages which induced many Government officials to elect to remain under it rather than to exercise the option which was given to them.
