know how utterly impregnable the King was to the opinion of others till his last not a few days ago brazenly flouted what we may assume to be the good intentions of his Government. We confess that what he has done has greatly increased the complexity of the already complex problem of annexation. If it does not make annexation impossible, it at least makes it much less likely to be beneficial. It is difficult to say what ought to be done next to counteract the King's cynical stroke.

King Leopold's Latest Move.

"But we must describe briefly what the King's move is. He has just announced in the 'Journal Officiel' that within four months from July 2, a company will be formed to develop for an unlimited time the Congo 'Domaine' in the Congo. Two things are to be observed here. First, that the Convention by which the company is authorized has been kept secret since July 21, and must have been made behind the back of the Government while Parliament was trying to solve the financial difficulties of annexation. Second, that the company is to exist for an unlimited time, and is therefore intended to survive annexation. If there were any doubt about this, it would be removed by the existence of the stipulation that the persons to whom concessions are granted—mostly intimate friends of the King—have a right to transfer them to third persons.

"Mr. E. D. Morel, in a penetrating article on the subject in the 'Manchester Guardian,' mentions the curious coincidence that the King's decree follows close on the announcement in a financial paper of the formation of another Congo company with a large capital, presided over by the late Premier, M. de Smet de Naeyer. In the new company invented by the King, the King himself is said to be the chief shareholder. This is quite probable; indeed, it is almost certain. The 'Domaine' is virtually the King's private property, and as nothing we know of the King would make us suppose that he would give away a rich property, the logical conclusion is that he is simply making over his property as King to himself under another name. He also reserves the right to pass it on to himself under yet a third alias. If this means that he wishes to hide himself, it may perhaps be taken as a sign of some small responsiveness to public opinion, and hence as a sign of grace. We hope so, but are not sanguine."

Respect Vested Interests.

"The King, so far as one can judge, means to say, when the Congo is about to be annexed to Belgium: 'certainly you can annex the whole Congo without exception, but you must respect vested interests, and what used to be the 'Domaine de la Couronne'—my own property—now belongs to a company, and it must be taken over under the company's conditions.' It is as well to be clear as to what the 'Domaine' really is. It is a territory which includes the basin of Lake Leopold II., and is ten times as large as Belgium. The richest rubber region is here. Till 1902 it was not known publicly that this territory was treated in any special way; even the title 'Domaine de la Couronne' was not known. It was stated and repeated that all the revenues of the Congo without exception were paid into the Treasury and spent on administration and on the interests of the natives. Mr. Morel's assertion that a large part of the revenue of the 'Domaine' was disposed of mysteriously outside the Congo was called a calumny. But it was eventually admitted that the King's 'Domaine' had existed since 1896, that its revenues were controlled by three persons in close touch with the King, and that they were not accounted for in any way. Some of the revenue was spent, apparently, in buying properties in the Rivières, some on decorating the Laeken Palace.

Alias No New Adam.

"King Leopold is indifferent alike to the opinion of foreigners and to that of his own people. The Belgian papers speak in very plain terms of the King's conduct. Even a triumphant arch and the advancement of 'the arts and sciences' do not dazzle people so far as to make them blind to the fact that, great as the cruelty has been in most parts of the Congo, it has been greatest in the Royal 'Domaine' when the Belgian Parliament meets in the autumn the King's cynical action, of course, will be discussed. We shall be surprised if public opinion does not make itself heard then. But what effect will it have on the King? After this can one hope that it will have any? In any case, it is only right to wait and see. The signatories to the Berlin Act cannot consent to a continuance of the irresponsible control of the 'Domaine' by whatever new name it be called. An alias does not make a new Adam."

DUKE OF CONNAUGHT IN AUSTRIA.

VIENNA, September 27. The Duke of Connaught dined at the Hofburg. The King of Romania, after interviewing Baron Ashmeath, left for Bukarest.

KING LEOPOLD'S INSUSCEPTIBILITY.

"King Leopold is absolutely insusceptible to public opinion. His latest move in his tenacious struggle to keep for himself the inglorious profits of the Royal preserves of forced labour in the Congo make that quite clear. No one can estimate precisely the pressure exerted by public opinion in procuring a solution of all political questions which are ethical in character, yet public opinion is always an invisible party to their discussion," so writes the "Spectator."

"When A meets B to discuss a problem and come to terms, the issue is not simply the result of A's desires modified by concessions to B's, or vice-versa; it is the result of A's desires fired or restrained by the (unknown) quantity of public opinion acting on B's desires which are influenced in the same way. Very often A is far more powerful than the total sum of A's and B's wishes or convictions, although in a report of the negotiations A is not mentioned as having been present. The opinion of his own countrymen is naturally a more powerful incentive or restraint to a statesman than the opinion of foreigners. The opinion of foreigners may set as challenge to him to do all the more what he is being condemned for doing—their hostility is so often only the reverse side of the applause of his friends. But in whatever way it acts, public opinion is an invisible member of every Cabinet—the unavowed consultant of most politicians. Where the progress of events is not guided definitely by Acts and Treaties, and men depend simply on the humane instincts of civilisation, public opinion is often supreme. Men say: 'That cannot happen because public opinion would not stand it.'"

Public Opinion and the Congo.

"In such a difficult case as the Powers find themselves in, in acknowledging and acting upon their responsibility for the Congo Free State, they look for the beneficent operation of public opinion above all things. They say to themselves:—'It is doubtful how we ought to act if pressure becomes necessary. The Belgians are an enlightened, gifted, and highly civilised people. Surely they have only to know the facts for public opinion to do its work. The terrible wrongs of the Congo natives will assuredly be set right. Belgium will not be willing to rest under the stigma of all Europe. Foreign opinion alone will cause her to do her duty, even if she does not see for herself, as we are sure she does, what that duty is.' Is this a misrepresentation of the attitude of the Great Powers, and particularly of Britain, towards Belgium? Is it an exaggeration of what is hoped of public opinion? We think not. "Unhappily the Administration of the Congo Free State is for all effectual purposes the King of the Belgians himself. And the King of the Belgians is, as we have said, absolutely insusceptible to public opinion. It is one of the greatest ironies of fate that in the very circumstances where so much depends upon the effect of civilised opinion on one man, that man should be one of the rare people who are uninfluenced by it. We did not

FLOODS IN FRANCE.

DEVASTATION OF VINEYARDS.

PARIS, September 27. Heavy rain-falls resulting in widespread floods have taken place around Montpellier; vineyards have been devastated: a number of fatalities have occurred: hundreds of sheep have perished: several villages are under water.

PARIS, September 27. Some great inundations, sufficiently large to cause disaster, have occurred in a part of Hainault. Half of the vineyards were destroyed.

DESTRUCTIVE FLOODS.

HEAVY LOSS OF LIFE.

MADRID, September 27. The Governor of Malaga has informed the Government that 72 persons have perished, and that 68 have been injured owing to the floods.

Vineyards have disappeared under mud. The vintage will be lost if the rain continues. If there is a further rise of the waters a terrible catastrophe is apprehended.

BOXERS IN KIANGSI.

SEVERAL CONVERTS MURDERED.

SHANGHAI, September 27. An outbreak of boxerialism has taken place in Southern Kiangsi. An Italian priest and several converts have been murdered. The Lazarist Mission at Kan-chow-fu has been burned; the missionaries escaped to Kian-fu and telegraphed for assistance.

EGYPTIAN FINANCIAL CRISIS.

LONDON, September 27. The "Standard" in an article states that it is satisfactory to gather that the recent financial embarrassments, in connection with over speculation in Egypt are likely to be fraught with less serious consequences than was apprehended.

PERSIAN FRONTIER COMMISSION.

CONSTANTINOPLE, September 27. Tahir Pasha, Vali of Bitlis, and Daniel Pasha, Matrossani of Kerkuk, have arrived at Mesogvoia. Other members of the Frontier Commission have reached Tabriz. The Porte has ordered every assistance to be given to the British and Russian Vice-Consuls who are attending the enquiry.

ITALY AND SWITZERLAND.

BERNE, September 27. Signor Tittoni, visiting the Federal Council, manifested his great satisfaction at the good relations between the two countries.

REVUE COMMERCIALE

Coton.

La semaine qui vient de finir a eu ceci de particulier, c'est qu'elle a théoriquement satisfait tout le monde, chacun à son tour. Nous disons théoriquement, parce que la part de la baisse, qui a eu la première manche pour lui, s'est contentée de son succès platonique et n'a pas su tirer profit des circonstances qui le servaient à souhait, tandis que les hausiers, au revirement, ont pratiquement et splendidement réussi dans leur exploitation d'une situation qu'ils connaissent et qu'ils visaient depuis quelque temps. Mais, n'anticipons pas sur notre relation habituelle de marchés et procédons par ordre.

Comme début, nous n'avons rien de brillant : la matinée de Samedi, moins mauvaise qu'on ne s'y attendait, a quand même été faible et a fini en baisse de 1/16 sur le cours de la veille.

La tendance n'était cependant pas encourageante et la preuve en est la tenue médiocre du marché pendant la séance de Lundi, qui a fini par se traduire par un recul de 3/16 de tallari et à laquelle a fait suite l'horrible ouverture de Mardi, caractérisée par la chute du Novembre à 18 3/4, soit du coup 11/32 de baisse.

Il est toutefois juste de reconnaître qu'au dit niveau une seule affaire a été traitée et que la rapidité du mouvement a stimulé les acheteurs qui, dès leur apparition, ont réussi à arrêter la débâcle. Par la suite il y a eu même reprise à 18 7/8, mais la dernière cote pour la journée a été de 18 1/16.

Il est cependant de fait que le découvert avait commencé à s'ébouriffer et son anxiété à se racheter s'est trouvée prouvée par le fait matériel de la hausse des cours à 19 tallari qui a été enregistrée le lendemain.

Mais en réalité ce n'est qu'hier, journée culminante de la semaine, que la frayeur s'en est mêlée, faisant perdre un peu la boussole aux vendeurs en blanc, et permettant de la sorte à leurs adversaires de pousser les prix avec la plus grande facilité. Au maximum nous avons fait, 19 5/16 avec affichage du cours au tableau à 19 9/32. Seulement, ce qui a été vraiment remarquable, c'est la façon dont toutes les quantités jetées sur le marché ont été absorbées et qui au dire de certaines personnes se prétendant bien renseignées, ne seraient pas inférieures à 80.000 cantars, provenant, pour la plus grande partie, des ventes du commerce. En tous cas, par les temps qui courent, un pareil chiffre signifie grande activité et c'est grâce à cette circonstance fortuite et inespérée que les vendeurs ont pu faire leur affaire aux dépens, bien entendu, de ceux qui ont tenu à liquider leurs positions.

Le cas est malheureux pour le clan baisier, mais comme rien ne justifiait sa précipitation à vouloir en finir, il n'a qu'à s'en prendre à lui-même : avant de se laisser influencer par les nouvelles plus ou moins véridiques qu'habituellement les hausiers faisaient propager au sujet de la récolte et de la question de l'eau pour l'année prochaine, ils auraient dû mieux se renseigner ; car il aurait trouvé qu'il y avait très grande exagération dans les assertions de dégâts par les brouillards et qu'à la suite des rapports officiels du Service des irrigations, il n'y avait rien à craindre pour ce qui concerne l'approvisionnement d'eau de la Basse-Egypte.

Enfin, il n'y a plus à revenir sur la boursasse qui est maintenant passée ; mais comme preuve de la faiblesse fondamentale de notre marché, nous ne pouvons faire à moins que de relever la promptitude avec laquelle la réaction à 19 tallari s'est produite aujourd'hui dès que l'on a constaté que les acheteurs brillaient par leur absence !

En somme, le résumé de nos fluctuations est représenté par 11/32 de perte pour la semaine et ce n'est pas nous qui dirons que cela est insignifiant.

Quant à la tendance, elle reste mauvaise, et ce ne seront certainement pas la réserve de la filature pour les futurs, le ralentissement de la demande même pour le disponible et le manque d'entrain du spot ainsi que le développement des recettes qui amélioreront la situation.

Les rapports de l'intérieur au sujet de la récolte sont toujours satisfaisants, quoique maintenant manquant de cette note enthousiaste des mois précédents : Certaines provinces ainsi que la Haute-Egypte continuent à nous promettre monts et merveilles, tandis que d'autres localités ont fini par signaler des plaintes, parlant de dégâts partiels par les brouillards. Il est toutefois de fait que même ceux qui ont eu à souffrir n'osent pas dire que leur propre récolte sera inférieure à celle de l'année dernière, mais comme la température d'octobre pourrait quand même réparer le mal au moins en partie, le dernier mot n'est pas encore dit sur les probabilités que l'on peut espérer.

Le rendement à l'égrenage est de 2%, en moyenne, supérieur à celui de l'année passée. La qualité semble toutefois laisser à désirer sous le rapport de la finesse et de la souplesse de la soie, mais au fond la Basse-Egypte n'a encore envoyé que trop peu de coton pour que l'on puisse se prononcer d'une façon réelle sur ce point.

En tous cas, en ce qui concerne la quantité et malgré l'augmentation de la production de Joannovich et Nubari, le coton pour les contrats sera abondant, surtout que la Haute-Egypte nous fournit pour cette année un fort appoint.

La première ancre de la saison a eu lieu aux Domaines et nos lecteurs en trouveront le résultat dans le petit tableau qu'ils trouveront à la suite de notre revue. Quoique comme les lots vendus aient été reconnus par tout le monde comme étant inférieurs à ceux de l'année passée, les prix payés par les amateurs sont merveilleux.

Pour notre part, nous ne saurions rien prévoir sur cette question de la finesse et de la

CHRONIQUE FINANCIERE

Alexandrie, le 27 Septembre.

Lundi, alors qu'on s'attendait à une dépression générale, à cause de l'importante vente aux enchères qui devait avoir lieu et dont nous donnons plus loin le résultat, ce fut tout le contraire qui se produisit. Grâce à l'excellente tenue des places européennes, la cote se releva sur toute la ligne et pour nombre de titres la plus-value fut considérable, d'importance sensationnelle en cet interminable état de marasme où nous nous débattions depuis la crise. Les affaires portèrent principalement sur l'Agricole, la National Bank, les Ritz Hotels, la Delta Land, le Comptoir, l'Urbain, la Daira et les Nungovich Hotels. Cette reprise quelque peu inattendue permit un gros paquet mis en vente de s'écouler sans difficulté, à la surprise générale, si bien que plusieurs agents exprimaient tout haut l'opinion qu'il était plus avantageux de se faire exécuter que de liquider de son plein gré.

Voici les prix auxquels les titres à l'encaissement furent adjugés : 65 Dividendes Tramways d'Alexandrie à 295, 30 National Bank à 20 25/32, 19 Privilegiées Menzah Canal à 1 13/16 et 75 Dividendes à P.T. 40, 5 Differed Wardan Estate à £5, 4 Obligations anciennes Crédit Foncier Egyptien à 301, 40 Dividendes Braserie du Caire à 37 et 10 à 35, 60 Privilegiées Delta Light à 9 27/32 - 7/8, 150 Investment (Abdy) à 1/2 - 17/32, 150 Estates à 21/82 - 11/16 et 75 Building Lands à 2 1/32.

L'allure du marché fut le lendemain sensiblement la même au point de vue de l'animation et du chiffre d'affaires ; mais, en ce qui concerne la hausse, il y eut un arrêt ; quelques titres seulement bénéficièrent d'une nouvelle avance, tandis que les autres accusèrent une réaction, les uns et les autres d'ailleurs peu importantes. On traita spécialement l'Agricole, la National Bank, la Daira, le Delta Light et les Ritz Hotels. 100 Estates furent vendus aux enchères à 43/4. Après les nombreuses séances inanimées de l'été, le volume d'affaires parut si encourageant aux agents de notre corbeille qu'ils firent circuler une pétition de prolongation de l'horaire.

Malheureuse pétition, elle fut le signal d'un ralentissement inquiétant des transactions, c'est-à-dire d'un retour à l'ancien état de choses. Il y eut bien du tapage le jour suivant, mais les échanges furent singulièrement raréfiés. "Manque de vendeurs, disaient les uns, d'acheteurs, disaient les autres." Quoiqu'il en soit, les valeurs dirigeantes furent totalement délaissées, au profit exclusif du Comptoir, de l'Urbain et de la Building.

Ce n'est pas non plus le volume d'échanges opérés hier qui nécessitait la prolongation de l'horaire des séances, au contraire. Tout le bruit mené par certains intéressés pouvait bien influencer les gens mal informés, mais non tromper les observateurs consciencieux. Des cris et s'éleva à peu près tout au milieu de l'indécision qui dominait, il n'était pas difficile de concentrer l'attention générale sur un petit groupe de titres favoris de la spéculation, l'Union Foncière, l'Urbain, la Salt and Soda, le Comptoir, la Cassa di Sconto et l'United. C'est ce qu'on ne manqua pas de faire ; mais ces derniers étaient plutôt offerts. 25 Gabbari Land furent adjugés à 3 11/32 et 150 Karam à 11/32. Quant aux valeurs dirigeantes, elles furent complètement négligées. On trouvera sans doute peu exigeants ceux qui voyaient dans la situation que nous venons de décrire un indice d'un mouvement haussier imminent et irrésistible !

Aujourd'hui, en dépit de l'excellente tenue du Stock Exchange, on a compris dès l'ouverture que la tendance était mauvaise ; tout le monde voulait vendre à la fois et ceux même qui hier et avant-hier avaient chassé les prix par de petits achats cherchaient à réaliser. Voilà les faits. Et cette allure n'a fait que s'accroître jusqu'à clôture. L'attention, moins concentrée, s'est partagée, avec peu d'affaires sur chacune d'entre elles, en Urbain, Delta Light, Delta Land, Préférence Khedivial Mail, Comptoir, Estates, Agricole, Ritz Hotels et United. En Préf. Khedivial Mail il n'y a pas eu de transactions, mais de la demande seulement, de même que la National Bank était offerte sans contrepartie.

Malgré ce ralentissement de l'activité, le comité, sanctionnant la pétition de prolongation de l'horaire, a décidé qu'à partir de mardi 1er octobre, l'ouverture aurait lieu à 10 h. 30 comme d'habitude et la clôture à midi au lieu de 11 h. 30. Le samedi la corbeille restera fermée jusqu'à nouvel ordre.

On peut ainsi diviser la semaine en deux phases bien définies : lundi et mardi l'animation bat son plein et la hausse est générale ; durant les jours suivants, le calme reprend le dessus et après un engouement partiel, la clôture s'effectue en plein marasme. Malgré tout, cependant, une partie de l'avance gagnée lundi reste acquise ; sur une soixantaine de valeurs inscrites à la cote officielle de notre bourse, 27 sont en hausse et 7 seulement en baisse, les autres demeurant stationnaires aux cours antérieurs.

Les fluctuations les plus sensibles sont un gain de 7/16 sur le National Bank à 20 13/16, de 5/16 sur le Delta Light à 10, de 1/4 sur l'Alexandria Water à 11 1/2, de 5/16 sur la Daira à 12 15/16, de 1/4 sur la Béhira à 20 1/4, de 5 fr. sur les Lots Turcs à 166, de 1/4 sur les Nungovich Hotels à 14 1/8, de 4 fr. sur les Saceries à 32, de 3/16 sur la Land Bank à 7 7/16, de 13/32 sur l'Urbain à 3 13/16, de 11/32 et 3/8 sur le Comptoir à 2 3/4 l'ancienne et 2 13/16 la nouvelle, et de 3/8 sur l'Union Foncière à 4 3/4, et une perte de 1/4 sur la Ramleh à 4 1/2, de 3 fr. sur les Dividendes Bière du Caire à 37, et de 1/8 sur la fondateur Comptoir à 2.

Nous ne voulons pas entrer dans le détail des opérations du conseil d'administration, nous retiendrons seulement qu'elles ont été contraires aux stipulations des statuts et que de ce chef les administrateurs sont responsables et, étant solvables, devront rembourser le capital qui a disparu entre leurs mains. Pour cela, il suffit que quelques actionnaires se hâtent de demander la liquidation judiciaire pour faire

ALEXANDER'S GRANDMOTHER. Anything that throws any light on the grandmother of Alexander the Great will probably interest your readers. The author of the pseudo-Herodian treatise "Teripasion aggr." quotes (part at the end) an epigram which he attributes to a certain Eurydice, whom he describes as being Illyrian and thence barbarian. One supposes naturally that it must refer to one of the several Macedonian princesses of that name, but all scholars, including myself, have been misled by the beginning of the epigram, which is in the printed text: "Eurydice of Hierapolis." There is no town of that name in those parts, and the author of the treatise has been accused of being an idiot and ignorant of having confused some Eurydice from Hierapolis in Asia Minor with one of the members of the Macedonian royal family. I find that "Hierapolis" has no good authority, but that the right tradition is found in the text of the "Teripasion aggr." where it says "Teripasion of Hierapolis." Then I find that "Teripasion" is the name of the wife of Amyntas and Alexander's grandmother, mother of Philip. It is remarkable that Eurydice describes herself simply as a citizen, and gives no indication that she was a queen. I have not the historical basis for determining the possible date of her marriage, &c. It seems perfectly obvious from the context in the treatise, and from the words of the epigram, that it was actually written by this queen, Alexander's grandmother. I need not cite the Greek, but give a rather bad rendering (I am doubtful about the meaning of the second line, which is difficult and perhaps corrupt): "Unto the Moon hath Eurydice, a townswoman and Hierapolis daughter she, given thee; for by their gracious help she won the thing she long had but her husband's. A mother of great boys, she acquired with pain letters that make language flow again." It is evident that Eurydice was a woman of great parts and resolution, as one would naturally expect from the extraordinary performances of her son and grandson. W. R. PATON in the "Athenaeum."
