M. LAMBERT'S LETTER.

The publication here of M. Lambert's letter on his resignation of the post of Director of the Khedivial School of Law says the Cairo correspondent of the "Times" has produced an unpleasant impression; for, though M. Lambert by his own confession appears in the very role of sacrificing his conscience to the necessities of the situation and adduces no evidence in support of his statements, his charges are sufficiently grave to cause considerable uneasiness in the public mind, and much concern is felt for the future of the Law School, the only genuine high school in Egypt. It is hoped that Mr. Dunlop will be able to dispense the more serious accusations. In the meantime it is important to note that no question of national rivalry is involved in the real ground of the conflict is the familiar question of the independence of competent experts in the higher faculties.

The Marquis of Bristol, who is our only naval peer since the death of the Earl of Cecil, has been appointed to the battleship "Renown" in command. The Marquis will command the "Renown" during her voyage to and from England with the King and Queen of Spain aboard.

Captain R. F. M. Sims, D.S.O., King's Royal Rifle Corps, who has just severed his connection with the Corps, commands a company in the 2nd Battalion, Jobaburgers, since January 1902. He is a Staff College man, and earned his decoration in the fighting from Colenso to Ladysmith, in the course of which he was wounded. Captain Sims was mentioned in despatches on two occasions, received the D.S.O., Queen's medal with five clasps and the King's medal with two clasps.

These "Christ in the Koran" are the same as those which were usually taught chiefly for the following two reasons—(1) Because they are merely the sayings of the Prophet of Islam, but are social revelations made through him by God Himself; and (2) Because they prove beyond doubt that the Prophet of Islam was not only the "Anti-Christ" as has generally been supposed to be, but is more respects a very, very orthodox Christian, much more orthodox, in fact, than a good many bishops and other ecclesiastical dignitaries of modern Christendom.

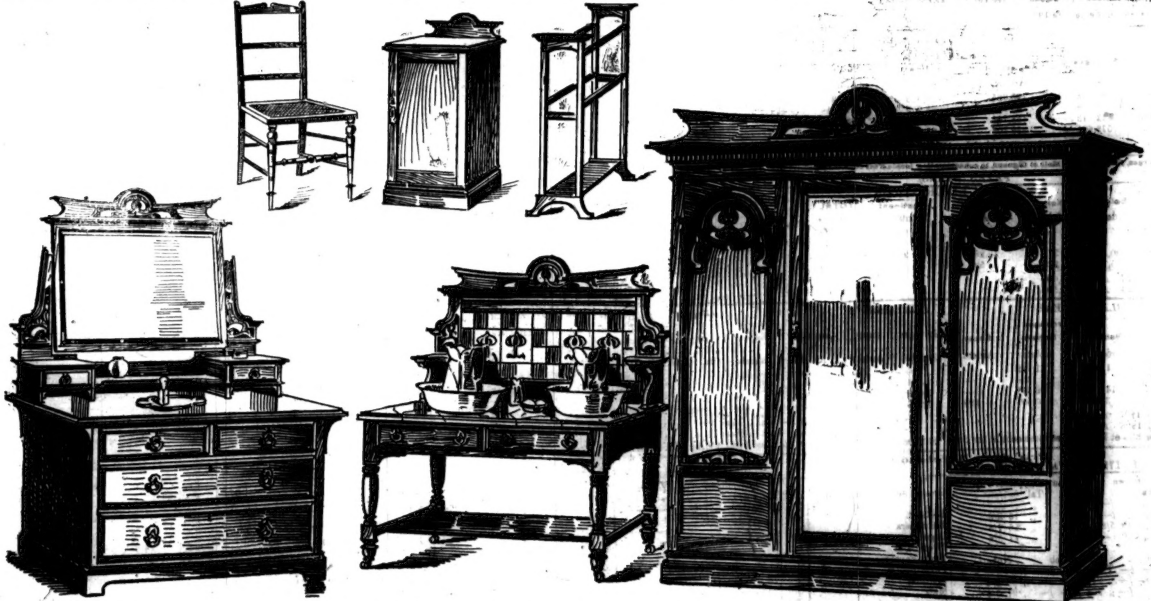
