aity of Leipzig, an unpretentions sity of Leipzig, an unpretentions volume by
Ludwig Fulda, the poet and novelist. This is
"the sympathetic review of witty and equally sharp-eyed critic, upon whom the friendly sum
shone on the first day of his arrival in New shone on the first day of his arrival in New
York, and continued to shine, with rare exceptions, until his reluctant departure for Burope.
Fulda," says the New York "Nation," "came to America with a free and receptive mind,
and yielded himself completely to whatever impressions his environment should make..
That which most exceeds all expectations
of the author, however, is the extent of popnlar education in America, and our systems of pablic and higher instruction. Every one here than in any other country, and libraries surpass
