### A GERMAN VIEW OF AMERICA

Two books on America have recently appeared in German : "Americana," by Karl Lamprecht, the distinguished jurist of the University of Leipzig, an unpretentious volume by Ludwig Fulda, the poet and novelist. This is "the sympathetic review of a witty and equally sharp-eyed critic, upon whom the friendly sum shone on the first day of his arrival in New York, and continued to shine, with rare exceptions, until his reluctant departure for Europe. Fulda," says the New York "Nation," "came to America with a free and receptive mind, and yielded himself completely to whatever impressions his environment should make ..... "That which most exceeds all expectations of the author, however, is the extent of popular education in America, and our systems of public and higher instruction. Every one here is hungry to learn, reading is more general than in any other country, and libraries surpass in number and practical organisation, as well as sometimes in magnificent buildings, anything known abroad. 'Every American, from millionaire to shoeblack, and from professor to schoolboy, is a fanatical newspaper reader," because of and notwithstanding the horrible headlines.' This fact may account for the importunate artists and women reporters, who more than once insisted on interviewing him at his morning toilet, 'in the name of the newspaper, of course'; and for the piracy of foreign literature, calling for revision of the American copyright laws. "Fulda observes with natural satisfaction the wide study of German by Americans He attends classes and chapel, lectures and dines at colleges for women, and is delighted with the opportunity afforded the girls in America for advanced study, regarding their way of living and preparing for the duties of life superior to that of the average young woman in Germany dancing away her existence. He is inclined to believe that Schiller's exhortation, "Ehret die Frauen I' is observed by Germans rather in theory than in practice, more in words than in deeds. He prefers coeducation to the habit abroad of separating the sexes so long, praises the free relations between American professors and their students, and has a good word generally for student life among our young men, with their concerts and student plays. He feels a satisfaction in the absence of scarred and bloated faces, and holds that even the excesses of athletics are better than duel and the 'Mensur.' "He finds no genuine American art, notwithstanding a popular artistic feeling, museums, and academies ; and he thinks that individual, creative art is wanting because the American, alive to decorate his house, has not yet learned to adorn his life with art. Hard work, elaborate stage settings, and the fairest array of feminine beauty on any stage, characterise the American theatre ; and yet the American has not perceived how great a force for good the theatre in right hands may become, and no American philanthropist has endowed the stage. In condemning the oft-repeated performance of the same play, Fulda errs in say-

#### Coal Imports.

Between January 1 and December 12 1.291.617 tons of coal were imported into Egypt, of which 711,207 tons were Welsh, 158,579 Newcastle, 186,149 Yorkshire, 100,080 Scotch and 135,602 other qualities. During the corresponding period of last year the imports totalled 1,217,384.

#### Native Criminal Court.

SUPREME COURT'S DECISIONS.

Judge Cator in the Supreme British Conular Court-delivered judgment this morning on the two appeals of the Bourse and Banking Company Ltd against the judgments of the Consular Court given on the 20th November last. The Appeal Court dismissed both appeals and ordered the Bourse and Banking Company to pay the costs in the Court below and on the appeals:

These decision of the Supreme Court to uphold the judgments of the lower Court, given treatment. One case has been discharged cured on the 20th ulto., are of great importance as all the numerous limited liabilities companies, registered under the companies Acts, whose sphere of operations are in Egypt, are now declared to be amenable to the jurisdiction of the British Consular Courts, whether their boards are composed of subjects of foreign Powers or not. In the one case an application was made by an English shareholder of the Bourse and Banking Company of Egypt Limited, A Council of Ministers will be held this week, represented by Mr. Gooding for the removal of the liquidator, appointed at the meeting of the shareholders and the appointment of a liquidator nominated by the Court. Mr. Devonshire, who represented the company contended that the court had (1) no jurisdiction under section 12 of the Order in Council, (2) no jurisdiction in that the circumstances do not admit of same under section 107 of the Order unless, under section 167, the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs should make an order covering a case where the circumstances do not permit.

The Court held that the question at issue fell within jurisdiction as the plaintiff is a British subject and the defendant company of the same nationality, whereby the Mixed Courts could have no jurisdiction. Council for the defence appealed to the Supreme Court, which has now decided that the Court had jurisdiction.

In the second case, the plaintiff, an English shareholder in the same company, represented by Mr. Reginald Silley, brought an action on the tollowing grounds. The plaintiff had been allotted 200 shares in the Company which he sold at a premium of 3. Subsequently, on the announcement that the bearer warrants were ready, plaintiff applied through the Anglo-Egyptian Bank for delivery of same. He was requested by the company to sign a form in ccordance with the regulations of the Alexandria Bourse, or otherwise the company would not make the delivery. The plaintiff filled up the form, expanging the words "according to the Alexandria Bourse requirements." Mr. Silley submitted that such condition in the form was unfair and interfered with the rights of private contract and, therefore, the company is improperly retaining the warrants. Mr. Devonshire, for the company contended that art. 47 of the company's statutes fully empowered the directors to determine the conditions upon which the bearer warrants should be issued and to settle the form of application for the same. The lower Court held that the directors were not justified in attaching such condition and gave judgment for the plaintiff for the delivery of the warrants or £200 and costs. The

GALES AND RAINS.

### SHIPPING DISASTERS.

LONDON, December 14. A furious gale has been blowing since yesterday evening. There have been many wrecks and loss of life on the South coast. A sevenmasted American schooner has been wrecked at Scilly and 18 people drowned A pinnace belonging to H.M.S. "Speedwell" was capsized at Sheerness and 8 men drowned. Gross-Channel traffic has been interrupted and telegraph wires are down. Torrential rains have caused the Thames and Severn to overflow and large tracts of land are inundated. Extraordinary scenes are witnessed all along the Thames valley. (Reuter

AMERICA AND JAPAN A SENSATIONAL STORY. SERVANTS AS SPIES.

NEW YORK, December 14. The newspapers publish sensational stories stating that all Japanese servants have been landed from the battleships of the Pacific fleet in the Hampton Roads because they were constantly taking notes. One was detected noting a new system of gun control. (Reuter)

#### TREASON IN RUSSIA.

DUMA EX-MEMBERS ON TRIAL.

ST. PETERSBURG, December 15. In the treason trial against the Social Deinocrats, 7 ex-members of the second Duma have been acquitted and 30 exiled to Siberia The Socialist group of the Duma tended violently towards a democratic republic. (Havas)

ST. PETERSBURG, December 15, The trial of Socialists, including 37 ex-members of the Duma, for treason here has resulted in most drastic sentences. 30 of the ex-Dumaites are to be permanently exiled in Siberia, 22 of them receiving, in addition, various terms of imprisonment. (Reuter)

## GERMANY AND HOLLAND

THE KAISER'S SENTIMEN'TS.

AMSTERDAM, December 14. The German Emperor, replying to Queen Wilhelmina's toast, said that he would stake his life on the maintenance, of peace between Germany and Holland. He referred to the Netherlands as the land where his ancestors had learned their duty to their country.

#### RESIGNATION OF CABINET

TEHERAN, December 15. The Cabinet resigned yesterday in consequence of incidents arising out of the murder of two shop keepers by soldiers, who were imprisoned but whose immediate execution was demanded by the relatives of the victims and the Anjumans. A great crowd, partly armed, assembled near the Parliament buildings. The bazaars were closed and ball cartridges were served out to the Palace quards and garrison The Shah summoned Nizam Sultaneh and

Nizam el Mulk. (Later). Parliament has been informed that the ex-Premier and ex-Minister of the Interior have been arrested by order of the Shah The House has demanded an explanation from the Sovereign, refusing to quit the building before a reply was received. The crowd is also waiting. It is believed that the Shah is acting on the advice of the reactionary members (Reuter)

### SOUTH AFRICAN SITUATION.

DURBAN, December 14. 1,200 troops made a demonstration in the Usutu Valley. The Zulus were surprised and offered no resistance. The search for fire arms has been without result. (Router) DURBAN, December 14.

Dini Zulu has started for Durban. Colonel Mackenzie's troops have returned to Nongoma after marching through the disaffected areas. They discovered a number of young Usutu tribesmen with rifles who were missing. (Reuter)

DURBAN, December 15. Ten of the principal natives accompanying Dini Zulu have been arrested on suspicion of (Reuter) sedition.

MARNIA, December 14. A large column has left to punish the Beni Snassens. (Havas)






## DEVELOPMENTS IN FINLAND.



### U. S. A. AND EGYPT.

A New York Commercial Newspaper says :-Our part in Egypt's import trade is lamentably small. In 1906, according to "Daily Consular and Trade Reports, that country's imports amounted to \$116,596,715, and our share was only \$3,042,275, though we bought \$7,660,900 worth of Egyptian goods. Our chief sales were : machinery, \$256,520 ; timber, \$134,050; wrought iron and steel, \$135,935, and a miscellaneous, list of smaller items. In the year our sales increased by \$609,400 over 1905, chiefly in coffee, petroleum and fertilisers. Egypt's exports in 1906 amounted to \$124,336,400.' For our \$7,660,900 we got cotton (\$7,376,870), cereals, dried roots, hides and skins, rags and paper, sugar and gum arabic. in small consignments.

In August, 1906, a Cairo dealer in American furniture ordered some articles from the United States and sent four-fifths cash with the order. universal save in the mountainous parts where but in April, 1907, he was still without the goods. Export trade cannot be built up in that way.
