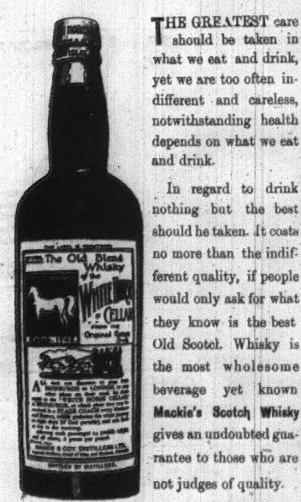

THE ORIENTAL RENAISSANCE

The recent Indian National Congress has evoked a great number of comments. "Whatever the outcome of the present situation, there is no doubt that the merely contemptuous style of Anglo-Indian criticism which was frequent, and to a large extent justified; a few years ago is no longer in place," writes the "Daily Telegraph." "One broad fact democracy in this country must force itself to realise. The Russo-Japanese conflict was one of the greatest, as well as bloodiest, struggles ever fought in the world, and nothing in the relations of East and West can ever be quite the same as it was before. These are grave words. We use them advisedly. We would fain beg for some attention to them. Upon the Manchurian plains and in the adjacent waters the armies, the fleets of a great white Power went down before, an Asiatic adversary. "At the sound of that amazing event a new epoch of history opened visibly. The Asiatic renaissance had begun—the awakening of those vast races, numbering eight hundred millions of mankind, who have peopled the Mother of Continents from a period immemorial; who were the equals or the superiors of the Western nations in medieval civilisation; and who have only been driven to acknowledge the scientific ascendancy of the European intellect since a moment that seems like yesterday by comparison with the antiquity of their annals. It is certain that the political and religious and social consequences of the Asiatic renaissance will be far slower in the process than we are apt to think, though probably not less tremendous in the ultimate issue than even the boldest minds anticipate."
 "The disorders at the Indian National Congress this year will doubtless be made the text for many solemn lectures on the folly of any and every Liberal movement in India, but thoughtful men will know how little store to lay by them," says the "Manchester Guardian."
 "The Indian Congress has met every year since Lord Ripon ended his famous Viceroyalty, and always, till this year, in perfect order. Its greatest enemy has been the indifference of English public opinion. But for this it would long ago have been recognised as one of the most important of our Imperial institutions."
 "Such a situation makes an appeal of peculiar cogency to the sympathy of English Liberals," adds the "Guardian." "In more than twenty years Indian reformers, in the face of obloquy and indifference, have gone on patiently and soberly trying to apply the political ideals of Englishmen to the solution of India's problems. One section, strong in numbers, though not in leaders, has now thrown over those ideals in despair; the other section not only retains its faith in our principles; but it is prepared to break up the party in support of them."
 "Such loyalty is a rebuke to the indifference of all but the comparatively small number of English Liberals who are interested in Indian affairs; but it is also a call for help to which we cannot imagine them turning a deaf ear. It would, indeed, be a bad day for Liberalism when loyalty to its principles in India failed to awaken an answering sense of duty amongst English Liberals. The situation in India is now unmistakably clear. For a few years longer the fort can be held for the cause of peaceful and constitutional Liberal reform; but unless English Liberals take energetic action for its assistance, the time is not very far distant when India will become, like Ireland, a permanent entanglement of English politics, perhaps actually incapable of being resolved by constitutional reform. There is no longer any excuse for failure to understand for what the Indian National Congress stands."
