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ARABIC NUMIRALS

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"Since it is of nature of tradition to incorporate false statement we must examine the causes which produce them. They are:

- a) Attachment to certain opinions and schools of thought. Now if a man's mind is impartial in receiving tradition he examines it with all due care so that he can distinguish between the true and the false: but if he is provided by attachment to any particular opinion or sect he immediately accepts any tradition which supports it: and this tendency and attachment cloud his judgement so that he is unable to criticize and scrutinize what he hears, and straight away accepts what is false and hands it on to theirs:
- b) Over confidence in the probity of those who hand on the tradition:
- c) Ignorance of the real significance of events, for many traditions, now knowing the significance of what they saw and heard, record events together with their own interpretations or conjectures and so give false information:
- d) Belief that one has the truth. This is widespread and comes generally from over confidence in narrators of the past.
- e) Ignorance of the circumstances surrounding an event induced by antiquity or embellishment. The narrator hands on the story as he understands it with these misleading and false elements. – Is Idam p. 20, 21".
