JOHN L. LINDSEY SCOGIN, born May 31, 1835; died July 14, 1865;
married October 2, 1860, at Newport, Kentucky, to
Helen Barlow (born October 19, 1837; died January
14, 1917) daughter of John H. Barlow and wife,
Eliza Clarke of Virginia. No issue.

John Lindsey Scogin, after the death of father, mother and
brother, all in year 1838, was placed under the guardianship
of his grandfather, John Brown Lindsey, at Newport, Ky., at
whose death in 1849, James Noble Lindsey was appointed his
guardian.

He attended the school of J.W. Monfort, September 1847-Feb
1848^a. In the year 1853 he is recorded as a cadet at the
Kentucky Military Institute, near Frankfort, Ky.

He was for a number of years an attache of the branch
Office of Aetna Insurance Company, in Cincinnati, Ohio. In
August 1862 his name appears as Captain of the Third Ward
Company of Home Guards. Sept. 25, 1861, he is sergeant in list
of Union Home Guards, Co. E, 5th. Reg; and first sergeant on the
Musters Roll of Union Home Guards, of Newport, Ky., while on
guard at the Kentucky Central Railroad in Covington, Kentucky.
March 1863-1865, he was Superintendent of Government Stables
at headquarters in Covington, Ky.

Obituary (Newspaper clipping)

"We regret to announce the demise of Mr. John L. Scogin, of our city. Although young, he was a most exemplary citizen, respected by all who knew him, and beloved by friends and relatives.

For many years Mr. Scogin was an attache of the branch office of the Aetna Insurance Company, in Cincinnati, where by his good conduct, he won the esteem and confidence of all his associates. He was a young man of excellent qualities, and his death will be deeply lamented by those who had an opportunity of knowing him.

He was a prominent member of the Order of Odd Fellows, which Society will participate in the funeral ceremonies tomorrow afternoon".
