Liam aims for new cancer cash target

BRAVE Liam Fairhurst wants to raise another £50,000 to help young cancer sufferers and their families.

Being diagnosed with cancer for a second time has not stopped 12-yearold Liam raising £100,000 for CLIC Sargent – and he wants to carry on helping others.

The Soham Village College pupil, who is responding well to chemotherapy treatment after being diagnosed with cancer for a second time, was this week celebrating his remarkable achievement with some of the classmates who gave him such strong support along the way.

Liam's father, Mark, thinks his efforts have left him exhausted but eager to repeat the fundraising feat that saw his first £50,000 provide a holiday caravan for the families of children with cancer.

Mr Fairhurst said: "He needs to have a little rest. He is finding it hard work mentally and physically.

"He wants to try to raise enough money for another caravan. Whether or not there would be another one, I'm not sure – but he wants to raise enough so it would be feasible. "That would probably need

around £55,000." Liam, who is currently spend-

ing three hours each day at school, will look to return to Soham Village College full-time in September – all the while continuing with chemotherapy for lung cancer.

The youngster, who was named Most Courageous Child last week at the community awards organised by our sister paper the *Cambridge Evening News*, faces a hectic few days before that. On Saturday, he will meet Princes William and Harry at a lunch in the Royal Suite at Wembley Stadium ahead of the Concert for Diana – Liam picked up a Diana Award for courage from Gordon Brown in February.


Then, on Monday, he will be at the countywide SkillsTrain Young People of the Year awards in Huntingdon.

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Murder of sisters: Mum remanded in custody

Email: editorial@elyweeklynews.co.uk A MOTHER accused of stabbing her two teenage daughters to death has appeared in court charged with their murder.

Ms Rekha Kumari-Baker, 39, spoke only to confirm her name when she appeared before Mr Justice Bean at Cambridge Crown Court last Friday.

She did not enter a plea to the charge that she murdered her children Davina and Jasmine Baker, aged 16 and 13, who were found dead at her home in The Crofters, Stretham, on June 13. Kumari-Baker was handcuffed as she was led into court

wearing a pale grey tracksuit. She kept her gaze fixed on the judge as she spoke in a quiet voice to confirm her name and appeared to listen intently as



charged with murdering her daughters Davina and Jasmine, above.

Emma Dmitriev, from the Crown Prosecution Service, updated the judge on the position of the prosecution.

A post-mortem examination revealed that the devoted sisters died of multiple stab wounds to the chest.

Police found their bodies in separate bedrooms at their mother's house just after 8am. Kumari-Baker Ms was

arrested at the scene on suspicion of murder.

Ms Kumari-Baker separated from her husband David Baker in 2004 and he had the task of formally identifying the bodies.

The 42-year-old, of Ravens-worth Gardens, Cambridge, was not in court but Ms Kumari-Baker's sister sat in the

public gallery.

In an emotional tribute to his

daughters, Mr Baker previously said: "I loved my girls, Davina and Jasmine. They meant everything to me and I loved them with all my heart.

"They have been taken from me and my whole family is in pain. They are irreplaceable."

Davina was finishing her GCSEs at Cambridge Regional College (CRC) and Jasmine was a pupil at Cottenham Village College.

A private memorial service was held at CRC on Monday, June 18, to allow students to pay tribute to Davina, and both girls were mentioned in assembly at Cottenham Village College.

Ms Kumari-Baker was remanded in custody and sent back to Peterborough Prison.

The judge ordered her to appear before the court again on October 12.

Court fines sacked man for damage

A SACKED maintenance man took out his anger on an ex colleague's door. Andrew Ratcliffe, 34, who lives in Victoria Street, Littleport, smashed glass in a patio door belonging to Hannah Helliwell and shouted abuse outside her home late at night. Magistrates in Ely heard Ms Helliwell, who lives near Ratcliffe, worked for a company that had dismissed him. Ratcliffe admitted a charge of criminal damage, saying he was drunk at the time of the incident and that he struggles with alcohol problems when he becomes depressed. He was ordered to pay a fine of £200, compensation of £50, costs of £60 and a victim surcharge of £15.

A PRINCESS from the distant past came back to life to remind residents how she founded their city.

A modern day Etheldreda was part of a procession through Ely to commemorate the Saxon princess

and her founding of the city in 673. The procession, led by Canon Alan Hargrave, saw the Ely Cathedral Octagon Singers join actors and clergy in medieval dress.

The event began with a recreation of

Etheldreda's arrival in Ely by boat, when she reluctantly travelled to marry Tondberct, who gifted her the whole Isle of Ely.

Derailment damage may take six months to solve

IT could be six months before a rail line and the River Great Ouse are reopened after a train derailed.

An EWS freight train crashed south-east of Ely station at Hawks Bridge on Friday, leaving several wagons dangling over the Great Ouse.

Now Network Rail says a new bridge will have to be installed, causing further disruption to One services between Peterborough and Liverpool Street and between Bury St Edmunds and Ely.

Bosses also confirmed one option being considered is to build a road that would allow cranes to be manoeuvred into position and fixed on a secure footing on the marshy ground. The spokeswoman said: "If we do go ahead with that, it will take some time to build."

One local businessman, who asked not to be named, said Network Rail had told him the best case scenario was 14-16 weeks and the worst case was 24-26 weeks before the job was completed.

While the locomotive and upright wagons have been removed, 11 derailed wagons remain.

A spokeswoman for Network Rail said: "It is likely that the bridge will need to be replaced

so we have begun working up new designs. We still do not have a definite date for resumption of services.

"Over the weekend our teams worked around the clock to assess the site and we have now removed the locomotive and all the upright wagons from the track. We are working at how best we can remove the derailed wagons safely."

The Environment Agency estimates that between 20 and 40 tonnes of granite chippings were pitched into the river by the derailed wagons.

Network Rail said it could not give an estimate on the cost of replacing the bridge or that of the clean-up at this stage. Its spokeswoman said: "Our focus is on getting it sorted."

Officials from the Rail Accident Investigation Branch are continuing to look into the cause of the derailment.

Until the river crossing is restored, passengers are facing severe delays. One services between Liverpool Street and Peterborough will start and terminate at Bury St Edmunds. A bus replacement service will be in operation between Bury St Edmunds and Ely.

Passengers for through journeys via Peterborough are advised to use Ipswich to Cambridge services and Central Trains services on to Peterborough – adding an extra hour to journey times.

Ipswich to Cambridge trains are not affected.

The dangling wagons mean the river beneath is closed to boats and the Environment Agency has put up signs warning boaters to steer clear.

There are fears the granite could also make the river impassable.

However, Network Rail and EWS have said a full clean-up will take place to recover all material from the river.

A spokeswoman for the Environment Agency said floats were in place in the river to catch oil and hydraulic fluid that leaked from the train. Although the Ouse is still open

to the north, the closure of the popular route south to Cambridge is worrying the many Ely businesses that rely on the river.

Philip Wenn, co-owner of the Bridge Boatyard in Ely, said: "A lot of people are very concerned about trade in what should be our busiest time. It will affect our business. This is our best period of the year when all the boats should be out.

"There is a possibility that we can't get compensation from Network Rail for it, so anything we lose may have to come out of our own pockets."

Teen in court for ASBO breach Man granted bail

A TEENAGER with an ASBO has appeared in court charged with breaching her order.

A charge was put to her that she threatened to punch someone in the face if a debt was not paid and that she had breached the terms of an ASBO imposed on her in June 2006.



Public bid was 'not an option'

A PUBLIC bid for a wildlife haven that is now the site for a new marina was not an option, a council has said.

At a recent public meeting on develop-ment at Roswell Pits in Ely, many local resi-dents demanded to know why East Cam-bridgeshire District Council did not bid for the land when it was sold by the Thomas Parsons Charity to marina owner Jeremy Tyrrell in September 2006.

Now the council has said the charity did offer it the chance to bid for the land, but maintains it could not have raised the funds needed.

The depth of feeling in Ely over Roswell Pits was clear in the numbers that attended the meeting – estimated by the organisers, Local Campaigners for the Protection of Rural Ely (LCPRE), to be 300.

The LCPRE says development at Roswell Pits threatens vital

habitats for rare birds and animals and wants a nature reserve to be established.

But the council says previous unsuccessful application for Government funding for a country park at Roswell Pits showed a bid was not an option.

David Archer, the council's executive director of develop-ment, said: "In order to have bought the Roswell Pits, East Cambridge-bine District Council shire District Council would have required a large amount of external funding, not only to purchase the site but to pay for the essential ongoing maintenance which would have been required.

"A bid to Government in 2005 for a country park for Ely that included Roswell Pits was unsuccessful and there were no further opportunities to acquire funding for the site before it was sold in 2006

The council currently does not have any plans to buy Roswell Pits."

It is thought the purchase of land for the country park, which included Roswell Pits but covered a slightly larger area, would have cost £750,000 in 2005.

At the public meet-ing, a number of Ely residents expressed concern at hearing the council had declined the chance to bid. Michael Edwards

earned a huge round of applause when he asked: "Why on earth weren't we told?"

Mr Tyrrell raised eyebrows at the meeting when he appeared to indicate he would "possibly" consider selling the land. Dr Andrew Balmford,

of LCPRE, said he would put £1,000 on the table to mount a public bid.

However, Mr Tyrrell is expected to submit a planning application for permanent narrowboat moorings within the next week.

Boom pushes up price of 'affordable homes'

CAMBRIDGESHIRE'S property boom is pushing so-called affordable homes out of reach of people desperate to get on the housing ladder.

East Cambridgeshire District Council, which ensures around a quarter of new homes in its area are "affordable", is finding many cannot meet the typical £60,000-£80,000 price for a half-share of a housing association property.

With house prices in Ely now averaging more than £200,000, the council is looking to set aside 70 per cent of affordable homes to rent, for buyers who cannot afford a half-share in housing association properties, due to the knock-on effects of a bloated Cambridge market.

Ely CAB is finding growing numbers of owner-occupiers seeking advice because of mortgage arrears as the level of debt required to buy a house in the city soars. The bureau helped

clients with a combined £5.5 million in debt last year, attributing much of that to the high cost of private rents and mortgages

In 2006/07, 219 affordable

homes were built in East Cambridgeshire, out of about 800 new homes. The council estimates 240 affordable homes will be built in 2007/08, with 86 in Elv

Jane Hollingworth, principal housing officer, believes around 70 per cent will need to be set aside for rental due to massive demand from people unable to

Nick Abbey, chief executive of Hereward Housing, the Ely-based association that took on the council's stock of homes in 1993, said: "A share in an affordable home could cost £80,000 or £90,000. It is stressful for people who cannot afford a home and is bad for business. Businesses need to be able to bring in workers to live within a reasonable distance.

"Nursing homes and care homes are finding it very difficult to attract staff."

Sir, Being a relative newcomer to the area, I am anxious to learn all about the area which I now call home. Your weekly free newspaper offers some insight to what is happening in and around Ely, good or bad.

As yet, I had yet to read an article that incensed me to the point where I felt the need to make a response; however, your issue of June 14, has had the desired effect. Your front page article titled "Safety fears lead to tape on

headstones" has done just that. I must congratulate you on bringing this farce to the attention of your readers, but surely it needs more than the relatives concerned to be encouraged to respond to it. We all accept that the world is an ever

We all accept that the world is an ever changing place, new rules, regulations etcetera, but whatever happened to respect? What on earth was the council thinking of when they adopted this new policy on safety?

Everyone knows that settlement is expected once a coffin is interred and this is a gradual process over a number of years. Apart from the distress caused to living relatives with the defacing of the

memorials with yellow tape, what do they intend to do with ancient headstones? Do they intend to track down distant relatives in the hope of finding survivors to pay for the upkeep? If none are found, what then, remove the offending, unsafe structures, remove the memorials? I was brought up to respect a "place of rest". My father was killed at the age of 32. My mother would never allow us to run riot in the cemetery. We were there to "visit" my father. I believe most parents today would instil this in their children. As for the excuse that "if children go near them they could fall on them" is ludicrous. They will fall if encouraged, with force, to do so and if parents have control over their offspring, they will know if the grave they are attending is safe or not and advise accordingly. If a person is up to no good and they become injured, then that is their lookout. They will learn the hard way. I'm afraid, as with so many of the new health and safety regulation changes, it is down to the American culture we seem to have adopted. Sue, sue, sue! Make someone else responsible for their irresponsible actions. Genuine accidents

do happen, but do we really need to have someone to lay the blame on if completely innocent?

The council is supposed to represent its wards, I believe. Did we get the chance to have our say? Do we ever get our say in how our Council Tax is spent? How much did this "audit" cost us? What happened to notices displaying . . . "The council accepts no responsibility . . ." etcetera.

MP slams delay on badger cull decision

CAMBRIDGESHIRE South-East MP Jim Paice has accused the Government of unnecessary delay over its decision on whether to cull badgers to tackle TB in cattle.

After the Government delayed a final decision yet again last week, when an expert report suggested massacring the animals was not the best way of tackling the disease, the Tory Farming spokesman launched a fierce attack.

He told Agriculture Minister Barry Gardiner during Commons Questions: "Ministers had a month in which to come up with conclusions, yet all that they have announced is further deliberation and delay.

"Moreover, it is four years since the Conservative party advocated the polymerase chain reaction test. It has taken four years – until next month – for research to begin.

"When will you make some real decisions and get a grip on this dreadful disease?"

Mr Gardiner replied: "I find it difficult to respond to that, because it was not really a question. It was a rant.

"We will consider the report carefully and will give it due importance in policy making."

Around 30 boys and girls at the school aged between five and 19 took part in the production.






Police appeal for help identifying group

PARENTS and children are celebrating after centres that help youngsters with special educational needs were saved.

The future of the Ely and Histon Assessment Units, which help children with communication and social difficulties, including autism, at the start of their school lives, has been guaranteed by Cambridgeshire County Council after a onemonth consultation.

Delighted parents were celebrating at both the Ely unit, which is part of Spring Meadow Infant School, and the Histon unit, based within Histon and Impington Infant School.

Fears the council would close the centres which provide specialist education for recep-

tion-aged children up to the end of Year 2, led campaigners to unite under the banner of Parents for Unit Resourced Education.

Jane Bridgland joined the campaign after seeing how the Ely unit helped her son Beau, who started school life there and recently gained three A* grades and five As at GCSE. She said: "We are absolutely delighted at the decision. The difference the unit makes to these children's lives is amazing.

"When my son went there, he could not talk. He was an angry boy. But within a few months, he became able to communicate – he has never looked back." Mrs Bridgland believes the boost to pupil's life chances more than justifies the cost of the unit.

She said: "These children will probably go on to be really decent earners. They will make tenfold what it costs to keep them there."

Many of the children at the unit have an autistic spectrum disorder, while others have a range of language and educational problems.

Lisa Green, a campaigner whose son Sam is a former pupil at the Ely unit, feels that its superb record must have swayed council officers.

She said: "The unit really speaks for itself. It is unique. "The council have made the right decision." Mrs Green has nothing but praise for the close attention the unit devotes to pupils.

She said: "My son did not speak or make eye contact when he went there. He left reading and writing, with great maths skills."

Gordon Jeyes, the council's head of children and young people's services, said: "There will be a quality review of the services, and the provision will continue to evolve in the context of local demand and the establishment of a children's centre.

"It will be important to be able to assess the needs of very young children who may require additional learning support."

Cigarette smuggler was a ringleader in £3m racket

CIGARETTE smuggler has been convicted after leading a multi-million pound racket smashed by customs officers.

David Turner, 51, was convicted after an eightweek trial at Ipswich Crown Court heard he was a ringleader in a smuggling operation that cost the Government £3 million in lost duty.

Turner, of Qua Fen Common, Soham, used forged gas bills to set up a fictitious company as a cover for importing goods into the UK.

Officers from HM Revenue and Customs (HMRC) found incriminating documents at his home.

Turner and five other men will be sentenced at a later date for running the racket, which was foiled after HMRC officers raided a storage barn near Braintree in October 2005. They recovered an estimated 12 million cigarettes.

John Phillips, acting head of criminal invest igation for the HMRC, said: "This was a sophisticated attempt to smuggle on a massive scale involving someone in a position of trust.

"Cigarette smuggling is serious, organised crime and often provides the funding for much larger criminal activities.

"For this reason alone we need to flush out the criminals involved in this activity and strip their proceeds from them.

"But, smuggling is also a crime against the honest taxpayer, as it takes away money from the public purse which could be used to help improve local communities and provide funding for vital public services."


Asbo teen in court

A TEENAGER with an Asbo has appeared in court charged with breaching her order. Faye Szulc, 18, went before magistrates in Ely charged with an offence under the Crime and Disorder Act. A charge was put to her that she threatened to punch someone in the face if a debt was not paid and that she had breached the terms of an Asbo imposed on her in June 2006. Ms Szulc, who lives in Clayway, Ely,

was already due to stand trial on another charge of breaching the order. The case was adjourned until July 12 for a pre-trial review. Ms Szulc was granted unconditional

bail.

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'Immigrants should not displace local workers'

IMMIGRATION Minister Liam Byrne has promised to investigate the "crazy" decision by a gangmaster to refuse a Cambridgeshire woman a job because she did not speak Polish.

He will contact county MP Malcolm Moss who raised the issue in a debate at Westminster last week.

The North-East Cambridgeshire Tory told how a constituent had come to him after her daughter was turned down for work at a local food processing factory because she did not speak the same language as the rest of the staff on the production line.

The Weekly News approached Mr Byrne about the case as he launched a new advisory group to prepare the ground for a new points-based system to decide on immigration applications to the UK.

He said: "This is a crazy decision. I shall look into it. I will be in touch with Mr Moss to find out the details.

"I am concerned about this. This is immigrant workers displacing local people, and that should not happen.

"I am concerned that the reason for refusing to employ a local person might be an excuse and



that the gangmaster concerned might be breaking employment law or the national minimum wage and does not wish his Polish workers to find out."

Mr Moss said: "I am delighted that Mr Byrne is to look into this case, and I shall happily furnish him with the details he requires."

The new forum has been set up

to prepare for the new Australianstyle points system, where immigrants to the UK will have to show they have the necessary skills and qualifications, including English, to come into the country.

Mr Byrne said: "We want to make sure this new system works. This is a new group of front line practitioners to consider the social benefits of migration, identity and share good practice in managing transitional or adjustment requirements and bring together evidence about the impacts of migration and suggest areas of government research.

"Our countdown to a UK points 1 system for migrants has started, 1 and next year we will start counting people in and out of Britain."

Arrests in prostitution clampdown

FOUR men from Cambridgeshire have been caught in a police operation to get prostitutes off the streets.

The men, who have not been named by the police, are among 53 arrested in a campaign mounted in Ipswich following the murders of five prostitutes in December.

Suffolk police, supported by health organisations and councils, have adopted a policy to remove street prostitution from Ipswich.

Since March, kerb crawlers have been arrested and letters sent to owners of cars seen more than once in the London Road area of the town, which has been regarded as the town's "red light" district.

Most of the men arrested have been given police cautions and have signed up to an "acceptable behaviour contract". They have been warned they could face prosecution if they are caught in the area again.

Of those arrested 18 were from Ipswich, 12 from other areas of Suffolk, 10 from Essex and four from Cambridgeshire. Another nine were from outside East Anglia.

Chief Inspector Bruce Robinson said: "It is disappointing that despite media coverage of our aim to stamp out prostitution in Ipswich men still come here looking for prostitutes."

He said the campaign was intended to help women turn their backs on prostitution by giving them support, and to meet the needs of the wider community by restricting the antisocial aspects of street prostitution.

Porsche's ultimate challenge

HOW about something of a motoring challenge?

You are going to do between ten and 20 fast laps of the Brands Hatch circuit, a number of very fast and largely sideways miles of a rally circuit, compete on a wet tarmac surface in a handling competition and finally slog through mud and rivers up to half a metre deep.

So wheel on the latest version of the Porsche Cayenne, which believe it or not is able to give a very good account of itself in all these roles. A new dynamic chassis control system, which is only available as an extra on what is already a rather expensive car, is the secret behind the Cayenne's outstanding performance on the track.

No matter how hard you push the car into a corner is there is not the slightest hint of body roll. Two anti-roll bars with built in swivel motors replace traditional antiroll bars.

Head for the rally course and the intelligent traction management system divides the available power between all four wheels whilst a flick of a switch between the front seats can raise and lower the air suspension for either track work or river crossing.



Of course you need some power, so the V6 of the standard car has gone up from 3.2 to 3.6-litres providing an additional 40bhp while the 4.8-litre V8 unit of the Cayenne S has 45bhp more than before.

Finally the V8 of the Cayenne Turbo now has exactly 50bhp more raising its output to exactly 500bhp – a lot of power by any standards!

standards! If you are one of those fortunate people who can afford anything between £37,100 and £74, 650 for their Cayenne, then you might worry about someone trying to make off with it. Porsche has introduced its own satellite tracking system available in 27 different countries. The car constantly lets the system know where it is and the system is approved to Thatcham grade 5 standard, the highest in the UK.

Of course you get the full works when it comes to comfort and pleasure. Fourteen speakers oper-

"It was a good win to have. I think she is carrying an injury – but so am I," said the former European junior silver medallist.


She added: "I felt some added pressure being the captain, but I was determined to lead by example and to get the win was perfect. "I knew I had Spotakova to beat, but I


