This email is in response to your request received by the LA City Attorney's Office seeking records relating to Council District 2 emails pursuant to the California Public Records Act (CPRA).

Please be advised that this office finds that "unusual circumstances" exist with respect to the request, as that term is defined in California Government Code section 6253(c). Unusual circumstances exist because of the need to search for, collect, and appropriately examine a voluminous amount of separate and distinct records in order to respond to the request.

Pursuant to Government Code Section 6253(c), our office has determined that it is in possession of responsive documents, some of which may be exempted from disclosure. The results of our search show that your request will yield 2,660 number of documents. Therefore, we estimate that your documents will be available for inspection on December 16.
