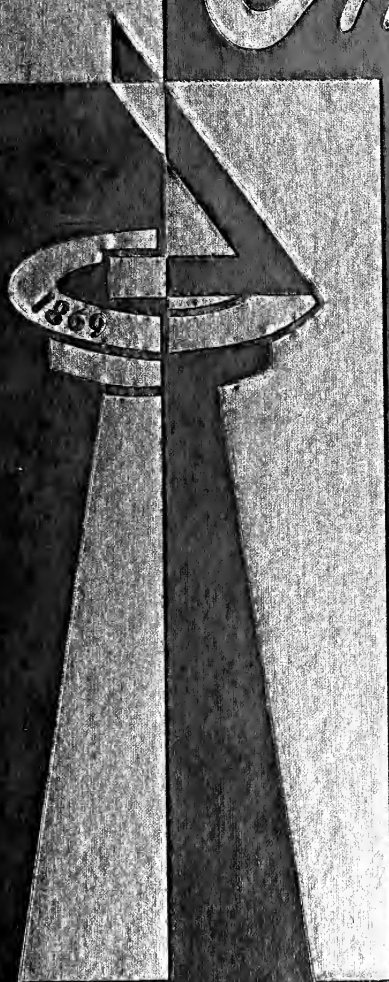

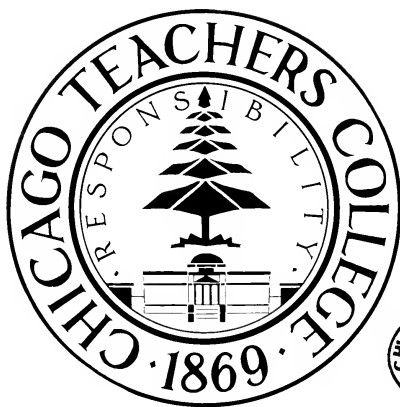

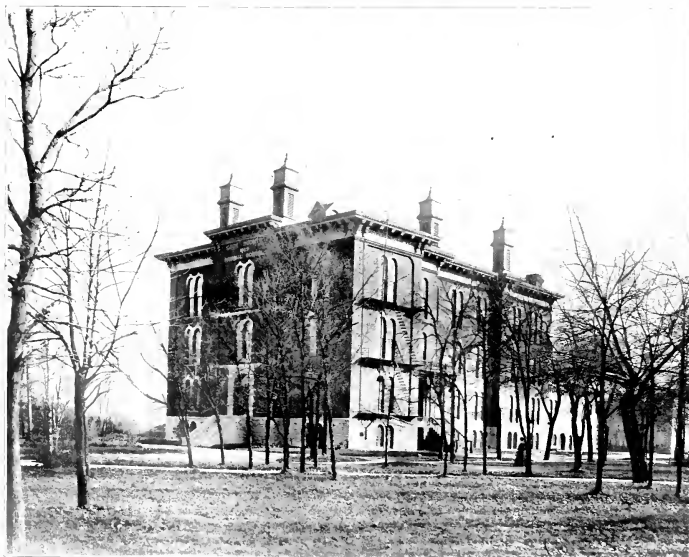

Beginning In 1869 . . .

Chicago Teachers College celebrated its eighty-fifth birthday on September 22, 1954. From its beginning in 1869, the name of the college has changed several times — Cook County Normal School, Chicago Normal School, Chicago Normal College, and finally Chicago Teachers College.

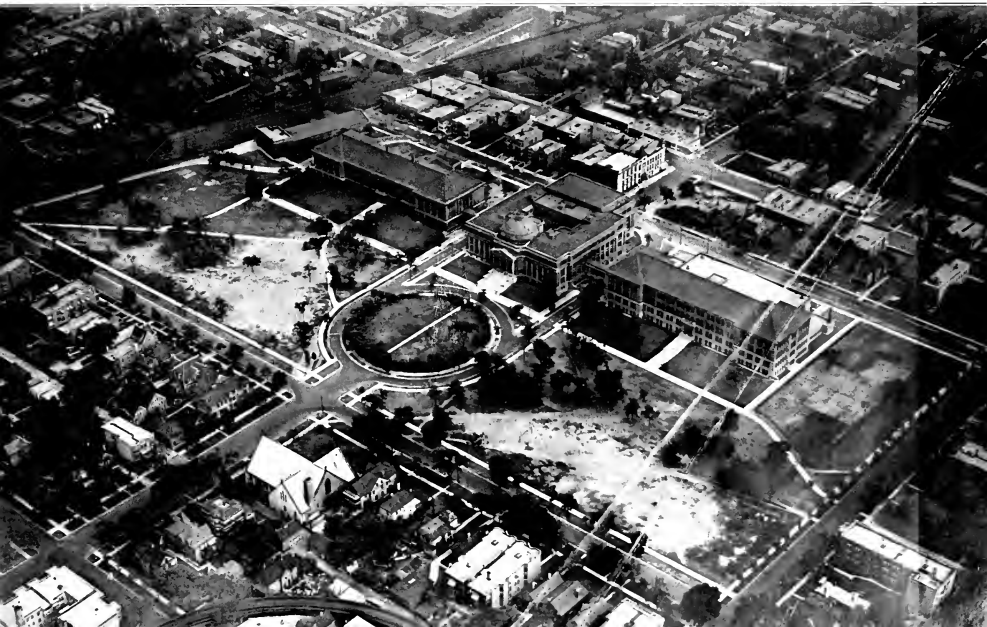
Twenty acres of land were given to the institution in 1869 with the condition that the teacher training institution never be moved.

Daniel Wentworth, for whom the neighboring street was named, guided the school from its inception until 1882. The following year Colonel Frances Wayland Parker, father of progressive education, took over and succeeded in making this training school superior among institutions of its type.

In 1905 the College moved into the present building with a new head, Ella Flagg Young. She later became Superintendent of Schools.

Many innovations have occurred on campus in the last few years. The addition of Business Education, Industrial Education, a Materials Center, and expanded graduate program, a North Side Campus, and a nature camp summer school, are but a few of the newer features.

All of this grew from an institution whose first eight weeks of activity were confined to the limits of a boxcar more than eighty-five years ago — what will the future hold?

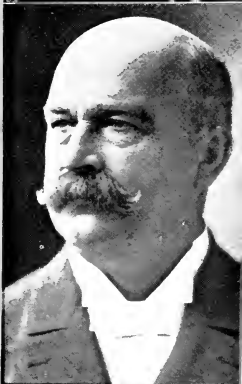


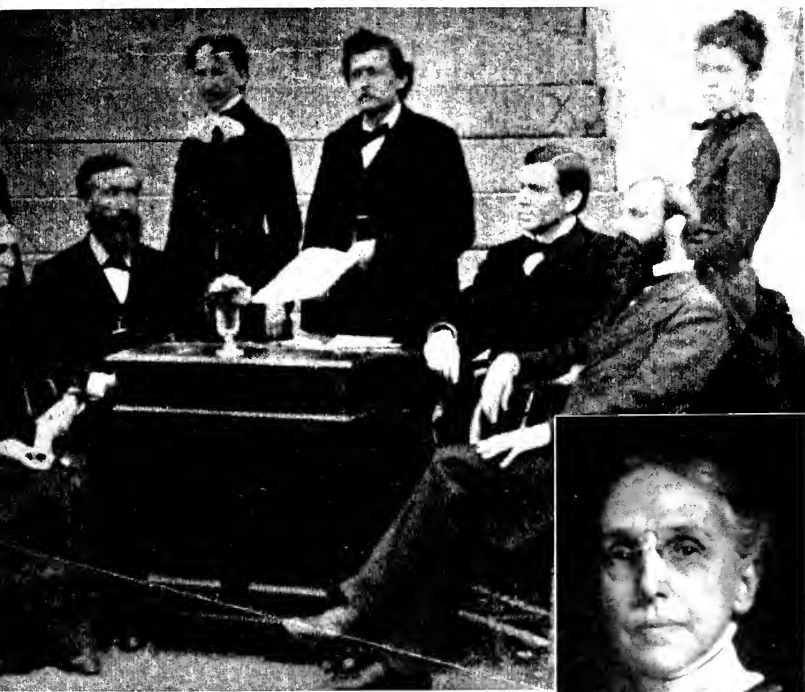

Message to the Graduates

He said, "You have united the forces which should make the Chicago Teachers College one of the really great institutions of this country."

It's our avowed purpose to make Dr. Hunt's prediction come true. We can have no hope of success without more wonderful students such as you have been. We can have no hope of gaining our rightful reputation without wonderful alumni such as I am sure you will be. Go forth and help gain for us the lofty reputation our school deserves.

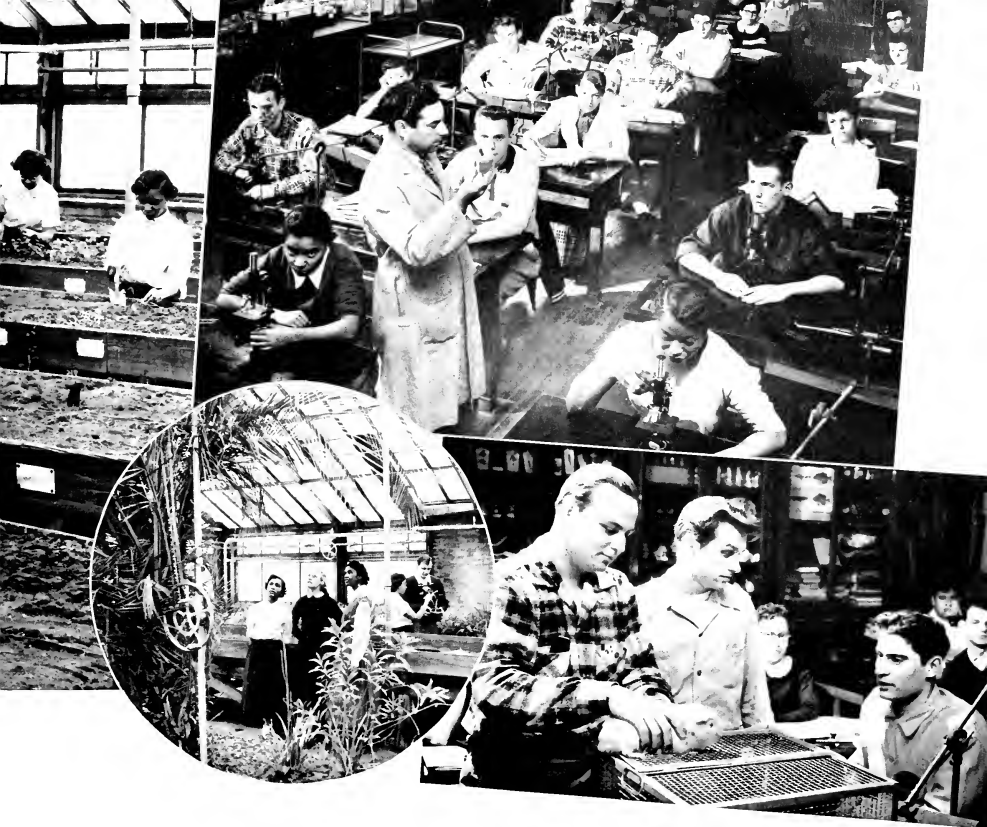

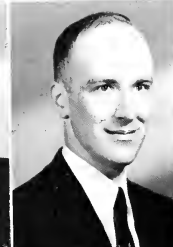

Office of Examinations

The Office of Examinations administers the freshman and junior guidance tests. Records of test results are filed in this office and made available to the students upon request for counseling purposes.

The Director compiles statistical data covering the student body as a whole and by classes. Periodic reports of these results are made available to the faculty.

HIGH SCHOOL CURRICULA

Recently two kinds of high school teacher training curricula were initiated at CTC — one in the field of shop teaching and one in commercial teaching. In both these fields a bachelors degree only is required for teaching in accredited metropolitan high schools.

Office of Publications

The Director of Publications edits the *General Catalog* and serves as managing editor of the *Chicago Schools Journal*. Raymond M. Cook, dean (not pictured) is Editor of the *Journal*.

Louis Jacobs (not pictured) was managing editor of the *Journal* for ten years. She left the position in January to return to teaching.

The Chicago Schools Journal, a periodical published primarily for the principals and teachers of the Chicago Public Schools by the Board of Education, is edited at the College. It is sent out to all teachers in the system free of charge during the school year. About 4,000 additional copies are sent to educators throughout the world.

Student Counseling

Clara Berghoefer, counselor, has a conference with a student. Individual conferences are an integral part of the general program of guidance. Information gained through appraisal of students' capacities and abilities as revealed by standardized psychological and subject matter tests is used at these conferences.





Individual booths are provided for students who wish to preview filmstrips or films.

Audio-Visual Center

All students, during their senior year, are required to devote one hour a week to learning the mechanics and operational techniques of these various machines.

CTC's Ancestry Goes Back To County Normal Days

It is an irony that colleges have their choice of one lot, but such is the case of Chicago Teachers College which celebrates its 85th birthday today.

A culmination of the ultimate merger of the Chicago Teachers Training School (founded in 1869), and the Cook County Normal School (founded in 1869) the College which today forms the teachers' mainstay for Chicago is hereby cited to name as its official parent the Cook County Normal School of 1869.

It is an irony that the first formal record of education set up in this territory is held in legal rights by the Cook County Normal School in 1869. The first normal school in this territory was a 19th-century point for county teachers where they would come to receive instruction as well as to receive their salaries.

During its two years of its existence the school provided eight weeks of a rough-cut wage house at its completion had proved conclusively that it paid to train teachers.

In 1869 the county legally and permanently established the normal school. Foremost on the part of business specialists who donated \$2,000 and twenty acres of land for the school, named the school's location in Highland Homes on the site of the present Teachers College.

During the school year 1869-70, classes were held in the old Lewis Christian school while the permanent office, located where the three building stories today, was being completed.

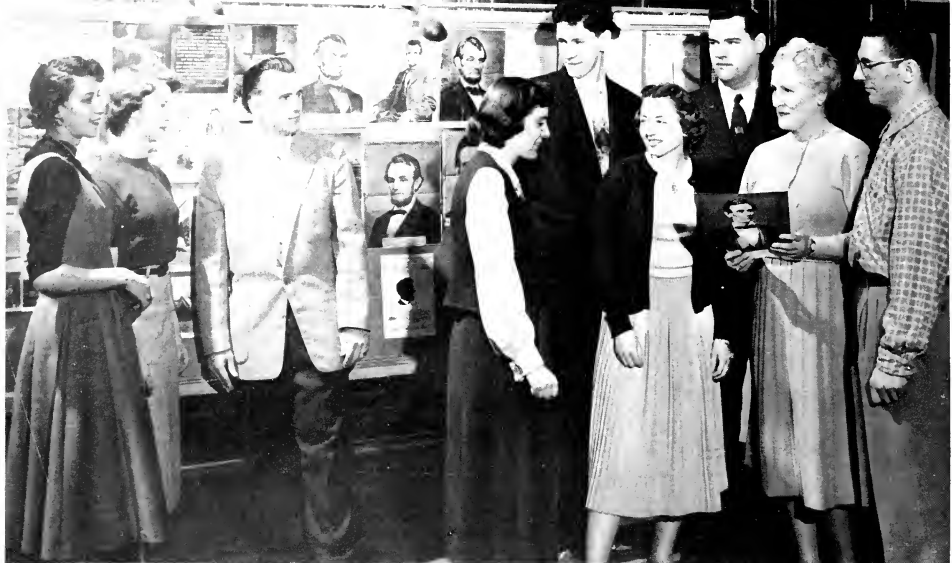
Student Organizations

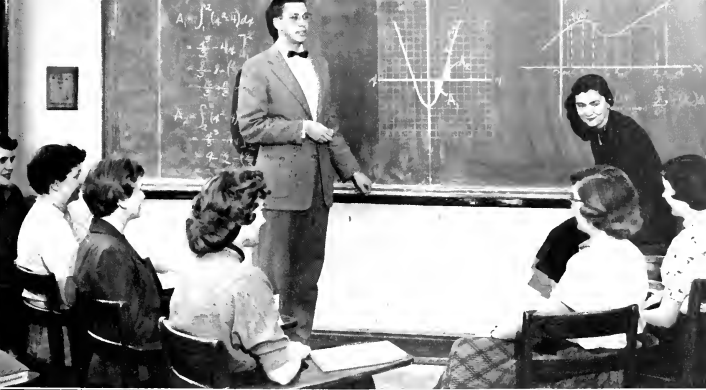

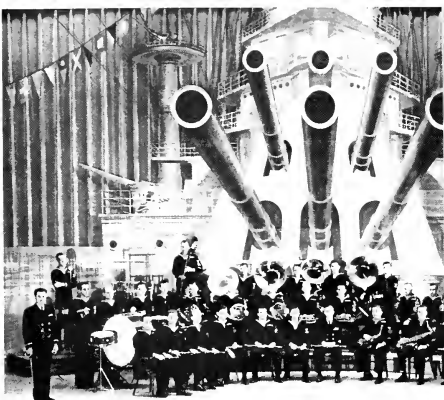

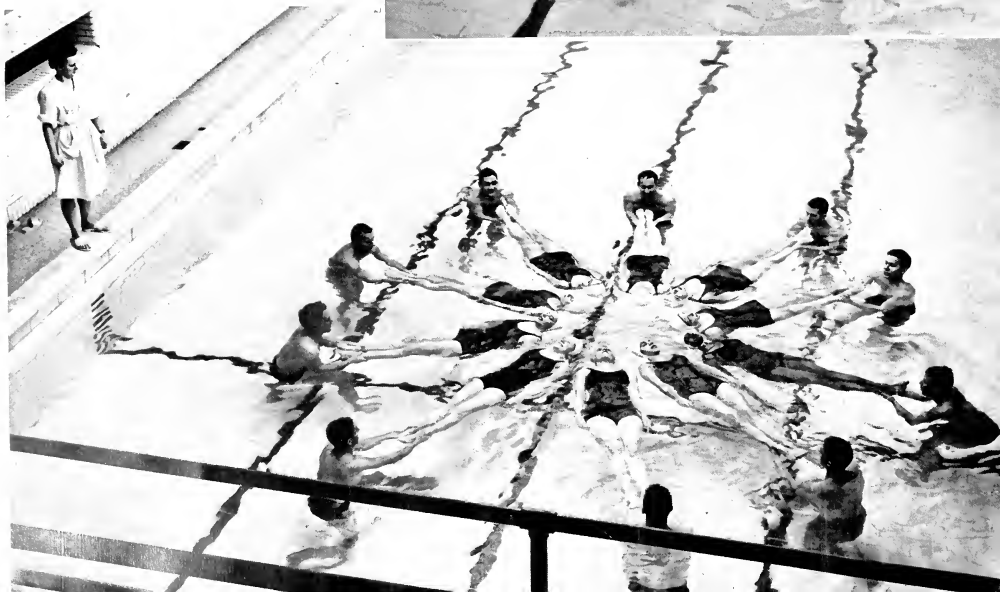
