Secularism claims that religion ought never to be anything but a private affair; it denies the right of any kind of church to be associated with the public life of a nation, and proposes to supersede the official influence which religious institutions still exercise in both hemispheres."</p></div> <div data-bbox="242 1547 1222 1641"><p>George Holyoake was an English freethinker and one of the last persons in England to be convicted and jailed for blasphemy.
