INTRODUCTION.

The Burial Ground in Watertown, one of the oldest in the country and second to none in interest, is situated not far from the present geographical centre of the town, on the corner of Mount Auburn and Arlington Streets.*

It was in use as early as the year 1642, and is generally supposed to have been, until the establishment of the one in the section now incorporated as the town of Waltham, the only one. Here, with their feet towards the east in conformity with the time honored custom, repose the ashes of the early settlers of the town, — ministers, deacons, and laymen, — the heads of long lines of descendants, now scattered broad-cast through the land. Their monuments are gradually falling away. The ravages of time are slowly but surely working out their effects on imperfect material. Excesses of climate, aided by the inexcusable neglect of town authorities in preserving what remains of these ancient memorials of the dead, are tending to the same end. Some of the older stones are now nearly illegible, — some that were standing ten years ago are now broken down and destroyed. Yet amid the ruin and neglect, there remains to us one consoling thought, — the fact that each

• A Tradition, favoring strongly of probability, tells us that the earliest burial place, soon abandoned, was on the opposite side of Mount Auburn Street, on the southerly corner of land now owned by Mr. Joseph Bird. There are still to be seen a number of depressions in the surface of the lot, partially filled with small field stones. It is a well established fact that it was the custom of our ancestors, in many localities, to fill up the grave after interment with stones that the remains might thus be protected from wolves.

It is possible that excavations, carefully made, might substantiate this tradition.

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monument, however indistinct its tracings, still stands where loving hands first placed it, and still covers the precious dust once deposited beneath it. The day of "Restoration", happily in this respect for Watertown, has not invaded the precincts of the old grave-yard, and the old stones have not yet been marshalled into straight lines and geometrical figures.

In the summer of 1852, when his failing health hardly sufficed for the task, my brother collected and arranged for publication the larger portion of the following epitaphs, not a few of them those of his own ancestors. Two years later he died. He had intended to add biographical notes of the more conspicuous of the early fathers, and to issue the whole as a companion volume to his "Cambridge Epitaphs" published in 1845. It has fallen to me, after a lapse of sixteen years, carefully to revise the transcript, add the epitaphs of the dates subsequent to 1800, and prepare the genealogical notes accompanying the text. This latter would have been impossible without the assistance of Dr. Bond's most excellent Town History, from which I have largely drawn ; and I am the more anxious to acknowledge this from the fact that my brother's manuscript after his death, was freely used by Dr. Bond in the preparation of his second volume.

I must also acknowledge here my indebtedness to Francis Bigelow, Esq. who placed at my disposal, for comparison, his own very beautifully executed copy of the epitaphs, made by him in 1867.

It will be seen that the general arrangement of the work is alphabetical. For strictly genealogical purposes this is undoubtedly more useful than the chronological plan adopted in the "Cambridge Epitaphs."

The oldest stone in the ground is that of SARAH HAMMOND, bearing date of 1674. This, with one or two others here, as many more in the old ground at Cambridge, and still more in Charlestown, Copp's Hill and Chapel Grounds in Boston, were without doubt cut in this country, and by one individual. Periods, in these cases, separate the words, and deeply cut horizontal marks separate the different lines of the epitaph. The letters are all capitals. The stone of HANNAH COULDEE, 1680, bears a winged skull, a fashion which almost universally prevailed from about this time to near the close of the last century. Nearly all the stones in this ground are so ornamented.

The grave-stone of HUGH MASON, 1678, is deserving of especial notice. Unlike the hard close slate of which the large majority of the others are com-

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posed, it is rather of a granitic character, and from the action of the weather is barely legible. The tops of both head and foot stones are in the shape of three equal semicircles, and the quaintness of expression and style of lettering of the epitaph all point to a different origin from that of its fellows. With scarcely another exception the perpendicular slabs ante-dating 1800 are of slate-stone, a material which, when properly selected, seems to be the best adapted for the purpose for which it is used.

BALLEY. THOMAS BARLEY was settled as colleague to his brother John, as minister of Watertown. The canasto W. Not . 2, 1687, and a son Thomas was bapt. Aug. 19, 1688, IF's widow Rebecca married William Brown fr. of Salem.

JOUN BALLTY, assistant minister at Old South Boston, was settled as fourth minister of W α_{0} , Oct. 6, 1056, but returned to Boston in (692, where he died Dec. 12, 1697). These two inscriptions are engraved on horizontal slabs resting on brick foundations, at this time much out of repair.

JOIN CHENERY, was b. Dec. 7, 1657, admitted freeman 1690; married June 4, 1684, Elizabeth Stratton and had eight children.

JOHN CHENERY JR, sixth child of JOHN and Elizabeth, was b. July 21, 1695; probably d. unmar.

JOHN CHENERY, son of Ebenezer and Ruth, was b. Nov. 11. 1730. His father was son of JOHN and Elizabeth above, b. Nov. 10, 1697, mar. Hannah Cutler, and then a second wife, Ruth. He had a son John, b. Oct. 4, 1739, whose son Ebenezer, b. Jan. 23, 1765, mar. Sally Hastings and was the father of tour children buried here, EBENEZER, JR., SARMI, JOHN and MARY.

CHILD. One Jonathan Child, son of Joseph and Mary of Watertown, was b. July 3, 1714, made his will May 4, and it was proved June 14, 1774. There seems to have been no settled minister in Needham or surrounding towns by this name, nor does it occur in the list of New England graduates. If the Jonathan of Wat, was the same as the one whose epitaph is here written, we are entirely at a loss to account for the implication that he was *minister* of Needham. He may have been a *lay preacher*, and thus earned "these stones for his labours of Love."

Sacred To the Memory of M! DAXIEL SAWIX, who died Feb. 11, 1800, . Et. 72. Sacred To the Memory of MRS. SUSANNAH SAWIN, Wife of MR. DANIEL SAWIN; who died March 23, 1794 Æt. 59.

Sacred To the Memory of MR. DANIEL SAWIN Son of MR. DANIEL SAWIN, who died March 24, 1834; .Et. 77. Friend nor physicians could not save, My mortal body from the grave, Nor can the grave confine me here, When Christ shall call me to appear.

DANIEL SAWIN, b. Oct. 26, 1727, seventh child of John and Elizabeth above, by wife SU-SANNA had twelve children.

DANIEL SAWIN, son of DANIEL and SUSANNA, was b. May 1, 1757. His wife LUCY, buried by his side, died June 24, 1844.

Mrs. Lucy, Wife of DANIEL SAWIN, Died June 24, 1844, Æt. 80. Blessed are the dead which die in the Lord.

SAMUEL SAWIN. A revolutionary Pensioner, Died at Cambridge, Jan. 12, 1849, aged 87. To the Memory of Miss. Susan Sawin, who died Aug. 22, 1848, Aged 82 yrs.

To perpetuate the memory of WILLIAM SHATTUCK who died in Watertown Aug. 14, 1672, aged 50. The progenitor of the race that have borne his name in America. And of his son John Shattuck who was drowned in Charlestown Ferry Sept. 14, 1675, aged 28. This simple memorial was erected in 1853 by Lemuel Shattuck who holds in grateful veneration the character of the puritan fathers of New England.

TOMBS.

On entering the Burial Ground by the gate on Arlington Street, several tombs are to be seen on the higher ground at the right. Some of them are without slabs, and were erected at a comparatively early date.

The first in the range, nearest the street, was built, it is said, by the VILA family, and is still used by descendants.

The second was the family tomb of CHARLES STONE, who was himself laid there.

The third is said to have been erected by the SANDERSONS, but eventually passed into the possession of ABIJAH STONE. He d. March 2, 1837 and his widow ABIGAIL, Jan. 28, 1839. Four daughters, viz., Lucy, d. Sept. 1816, Abigail, d. Jan. 1820. Catherine, d. Sept. 26, 1848, and Esther M., d. Sept. 17, 1863, were, with their parents buried there.

The fourth tomb is marked Amos LIVERMORE, 1818.

The fifth is without a name.

The sixth is surmounted by a free-stone tablet inscribed MosES COOLIDGE, 1802.

The seventh was erected by JONATHAN BIRD, and is now the property of his grandsons Joseph and Horace Bird.

The eighth is marked RICHARDSON AND BRIGHT, 1816.

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
