














Turkey Trot

Aerospace Studies

Through the Air Force Reserve Officer Training Corps program, the Aerospace department develops future Air Force officers from talented motivated students. The program combines challenging academic courses, a rigorous physical fitness program and Leadership Laboratory. Through this program, our students can meet the challenges of tomorrow's Air Force.

The 1990-91 Detachment 715 cadet corps was 84 students strong. The cadets were very active. They started the school year with a freshman orientation with over 30 freshmen attending. Going through the "ropes" course and enlisting freshman scholarship students highlighted the orientation. In September, the corps sponsored a 24-hour Prisoner of War/Missing in Action freedom run. Opened to all members of the university and the local community, over 100 runners covered the two mile course throughout the vigil. On Veteran's Day, the cadets conducted a flag raising ceremony at the University Center flagpole.

On the social scene, the cadets sponsored several activities. They conducted several pizza and volleyball nights. In addition, they held a field day both semesters. For field day, the cadets ran a 1.5 mile run, completed a grueling fitness test, competed in organized sports with a picnic afterwards. Also, in October, the cadets visited Washington D.C. and Andrews AFB, MD. They also held receptions for both the freshmen and upperclassmen parents weekend. Biology

Unlike other majors, you won't find us clamoring for equation sheets before a test, or even bragging about our new building. Lehigh Biology provides students with many experiences such as, getting a good nap in Bio 31, having your hands smell like a dead shark in Bio 133 Lab. working until the wee hours of the morning on research projects, and trying to find out what science is at 7:00 at night while the world series is going on. Chemistry

The faculty in chemistry extend our congratulations to this year's graduates in Chemistry and Biochemistry. We know we've stressed you to the max sometimes (of course, always with warmth in our hearts) and see how well you've turned out. Thanks for being with us.

The biggest news in the department this year is the acquisition of the Scienta ESCA-300 instrument. This million dollar photoelectron spectrometer is the only one of its kind in the United States and only the second in the world. This is a good example of why the department has an international reputation in surface science. Obviously the state of the art, the spectrometer features the highest obtainable resolution and vastly improved x-ray intensity. This allows high resolution mapping of surfaces for both elemental composition and determination of chemical state. This technique has applications in corrosion, study of surface defects, adhesion, and many other fields.

History

Exciting things are happening in the History Department. Recently the department has expanded its undergraduate honors program and a number of juniors and seniors are actively engaged in year-long research projects, working closely with a faculty member. Topics this year include: the Italian-American Community in Easton, Pa.; The Image of Mexicans in Hollywood Movies; Cultural Exchanges Between Massachusetts Settlers and Indians in the mid-Seventeenth Century; Modernization of the Prussian Army; German Student Resistance of Nazism; Winston Churchill and General Wavell; Workers and their Families during the Bethlehem Steel Strike of 1959.

The department is affiliated with two important academic programs on campus: the Gipson Institute for Eighteenth Century Studies and the Science, Technology, and Society Program. The Gipson Institute sponsors an annual scholarly symposium; the topic for 1991 is "Love and Marriage in the Eighteenth Century." The STS program sponsors a weekly luncheon series on topics in the history of technology.

New and innovative courses in the department include its participation in an interdisciplinary course on Canada, dealing with history, politics, and economics. In the past few years the department has enlarged its program in the history of technology and offers a number of undergraduate courses in that field, dealing with both the United States and Japan.

In 1990 Professor Roger Simon succeeded Professor Joseph Dowling as chairman. The department also welcomed the addition of Professor Robert Phillips, of the

International Relations

Several I.R. courses taught by I.R. faculty are being offered every summer in Great Britain, France, and Switzerland.

Professor Rajan Menon has returned from a two-year leave of absence, having completed his first year as a fellow at the Kennan Institute for Advanced Russian Studies, and a second under a grant awarded by The New York Council on Foreign Relations, working with Congressman Stephen Solarz in Washington as national security assistant.

Last year Professor Bruce E. Moon had been awarded the Class of 1961 Professorship, which recognizes the teaching and scholarly activities of a newly-promoted associate professor.

Professor Henri J. Barkey spent six weeks in Argentina as part of a Fulbright Seminar Abroad where he was doing research on Argentina's economic stabilization plans.

An exciting feature is the Cohen International Lecture Series which brings distinguished speakers to the campus each year. Arranged by Professor Z. Slouka, the series included former National Security Advisor

Journalism

The Lehigh Journalism Department not only has a new face brightening up the office, it has a resident international reporting specialist — Jack Lule. Jack, as he likes the students to call him, came to Lehigh all the way from Tulsa, Oklahoma, this past fall and has added an international dimension to the journalism program by teaching an international reporting course.

As the students were getting to know Jack, they were missing Professor Wally Trimble, who was away for the year on sabbatical.

Department Chairperson Sharon Friedman and Ken Friedman highlighted international environmental reporting in the science writing program this year. Students had an opportunity to speak with international journalists from Germany, Switzerland, and many Southeast Asian countries.

All professors in the department worked to increase student involvement in journalism and the communication arts. Professor Frankie Hutton has been at Lehigh for only two years, but has brought a world of knowledge to her students. "She is a tough, but fair professor who turns her courses into professional journalism experiences," said journal

Modern Foreign Languages

The most exciting development this year was the award to the Department of a \$100,000 grant from the arthur Vining Davis Foundations to upgrade the Language Laboratory. A Language Laboratory Committee was formed to study the new video, satellite, and computer technology that will be incorporated in the new facility. The Committee made several fact finding trips to study state-of-the-art facilities in the Northeast in order to plan the acquisition and configuration of the new International Media Resource Center to be installed on the top floor of Maginnes Hall in conjunction with the Department's move there in the summer of 1991.

Japanese language was introduced on an experimental basis, and both the new video-based course and the instructor were well received. Two additional classrooms were equipped with video to accommodate the increasing demand for video-based courses in Chinese, French, Russian, and Spanish.

The three-year, \$180,000 NEH grant, designed to enhance instruction in Russian and Chinese allowed those programs to add new permanent faculty — Professor Mary Nicholas and Professor Connie Cook — and several new upper-level courses. The same grant provided support for Professor Anna Herz to lead a popular study tour to the Cl.S.S.R. in May and June. Professor David Pankenier, the recipient of a personal NEH research fellowship, was on study leave for the academic year 1989-90 to continue research and writing on a book about early China.

Philosophy

Smaller classes and increased faculty-student interaction were the mark of the year in philosophy. A restructured introduction class, providing discussion sections with full-time faculty of less than twenty students proved popular. The text used was The Great Conversation, written by Norman Melchert and published during the year.

The philosophy club met weekly under the leadership of Cheryl Osieki, a senior bound for graduate school. And the annual Reading Party — a sort of philosophy retreat for students and faculty — sparkled on a Pocono weekend.

The department welcomed Mark Bickhard, the holder of the new Henry R. Luce Professorship in Cognitive Robotics and the Philosophy of Knowledge. Professor Bickhard has a joint appointment with psychology.

A highlight of the year was the annual Selfridge Lectureship. W.V. Quine, one of the most influential philosophers of the century, was on campus for four days of searching talks about his work and several public lec-

tures. Philosophy, the search for widsom, is alive and well at Lehigh.

Physics

Physics is the search for the fundamental principles which allow us to think about the world of matter, energy, and their interactions in a clear and simple manner. It is the foundation for the understanding of all natural phenomena. Education in physics enables the student to appreciate and understand the scientific achievements of the recent past and to actively participate in current research. Such training also equips the student to apply physical laws and experimental techniques to a wide range of applications.

Lehigh offers four undergraduate and two graduate degrees in physics: the B.A. and B.S. in physics in the College of Arts and Science; the B.S. in engineering physics and a five-year, two B.S. degree program in electrical engineering - engineering physics in the College of Engineering and Applied Science; and the M.S. and Ph.D. in physics.

The physics department currently has 21 full-time faculty, 2 postdoctoral research scientists, 56 full-time graduate students, and 26 declared undergraduate majors in the two col-

leges. Normally 60% of the graduating seniors proceed directly to graduate study in physics. A few continue their studies in areas outside physics such as engineering, law and medicine. Students who seek employment with a bachelor's degree will often be employed in an

The physics department is committed to providing outstanding undergraduate and graduate programs, and our graduates have been very successful.

Psychology

Lehigh's Psychology Department, which has the greatest number of majors and minors n the Arts and Science College, also has one of the fastest growing graduate programs in he College. Eleven dedicated faculty keep at he leading edge of their particular fields by conducting research and presenting their work at major scientific conferences. A broad ange of courses is offered in basic psychology as well as in the areas of biopsychology, cognition and learning, developmental, personality, experimental, and abnormal psychology. Located in historical Chandler-Ullman Hall, we have ample space and state-of-the-art facilities for upperclass undergraduate students to acquire valuable firsthand experience in the Child Development Laboratory, the Cognitive Laboratory, the Biopsychology Research Facility, and the Phobia Research Program, etc. Also offered is a departmental honors program in which seniors can work on projects to allow in-depth study beyond that permitted by normal coursework.



Psychology Department

The B.A. in psychology provides preparation for a variety of different fields. In addition to serving as a preparational degree for further study in psychology, our program prepares graduates to go on to graduate studies in social work or special education, for exam-

ple, or to medical, dental or law school. The minor in psychology is often used in conjunction with degrees in marketing, international relations, and other fields. The Psychology Department faculty is committed to helping students achieve their full potential.

Science, Technology, and Society

The Science, Technology and Society Program, originally established in 1972, is the product of a continuing intercollege effort to create a common ground from which to explore the relations between science, technology and society; between ideas, machines and values. The STS Program serves as a focal point for a wide range of courses that study the natures of science and of technology, and analyze their social and personal implications. It lends coherence and visibility to offerings otherwise dispersed throughout the cataloa.

The STS Program offers both a major and a minor. The major in Science, Technology and Society Studies prepares students for graduate study or for a wide variety of career opportunities including policy analysis, planning, or community relations with public or private sector agencies concerned with the social relations of scientific research and technological innovation. The minor program is particularly attractive for students interested in complementing their more traditional disciplinary major with studies in some interdisciplinary aspect of the relationships between science, technology and society. Whether it is engineering students desirous of learning more about the social context within which they will be doing their work, liberal arts students interested in knowing about the technical background of political issues they might ultimately have to vote on some day, or business students anxious to understand more fully the value contect of technical decisionmaking processes in the managerial world, STS offers an opportunity to study these questions along with many more topical issues of the day. Donna Gaugler, a current STS major in the Class of 1992, will be pursuing a local area, STS-related internship this summer.

The STS Program sponsors numerous public lectures, colloquia, and seminars throughout the course of the academic year. This year STS co-sponsored a year-long weekly seminar with the History Department on history of technology and technology studies. In addition, STS sponsored a major academic conference entitled: "Leonardo da Vinci's Sforza Monument Horse: The Art and the Engineering." The conference brought together leading scholars from around the world to analyze the aesthetic, historic, and technical aspects of Leonardo's great Renaissance equestrian monument. The dynamics of interdepartmental and intercollege interaction for

both faculty and students alike make for a stimulating intellectual experience, and also provide a more realistic preparation for students entering into their professional adult careers where life is not arranged simply by academic disciplines.

Social Relations

Theatre

The blggest news this year for the department of the atre was our accreditation by the National Association of Schools of Theatre. Lehigh now has one of only three accredited theatre programs in Pennsylvania. The visiting team's report praised the "quality and morale" of the faculty and staff, the varlety of curricular options in theatre, the "devoted, capable, and energetic" students, and the "excellent teach/student ratio, opportunities for all students to participate in most elements of the production process, and an unusually high level of collegial contact with the faculty."

Recent sharp increases in enrollment led to the "department permission required" designation for several design/technical courses and advanced acting courses. Still, some 500 students from all three undergraduate colleges took a theatre class this year. We graduated seven theatre majors and nine theatre minors from all over the University.

During the fall semester, we hosted the first Jerome Minskoff Artist-in-Residence. Playwright/juggler Russel Davis worked with director Pam Pepper's production seminar class to produce the world premiere of his play APPOINTMENT WITH A HIGH WIRE LADY. Russell also taught a very popular course in playwrighting.

The 1990-1991 Lehigh University Theatre season opened with a sold-out run of WHAT THE BUTLER SAW, directed by department chairman Augustine Ripa, followed by the world premiere of APPOINTMENT WITH A HIGH WIRE LADY. The spring semester began with visiting assistant professor Mark Fearnow's energetic produc-



Accounting

Accounting at Lehigh has a reputation for being a challenging four-year grind, so why do about 100 students a year graduate as accounting majors?

Seniors Mike Nichols, president of the accounting honor society, and Julie Fisch, president of the accounting club, have been through three of four of the toughest years of their young lives. And they are loving it.

"You can't be an accounting major without motivation," Nichols says. "The first accounting class I took was very difficult. It really turned me on."

"Accounting prepared me to go in any direction. I feel confident I could work in a large accounting firm, industry, or banking," says Fisch.

"Students sometimes complain while they're doing the work," says assistant professor Robyn Lawrence, "but after they've accomplished something, they feel it was worth it."

"Students are motivated to tackle the work," says Ken Sinclair, department chairman, "because they get personal attention and stimulation in and out of class, and because they know that once they graduate, they will be ready to step into a job."

"Lehigh accounting majors traditionally do well with the 'Big Six' accounting firms, industry, banking, law and graduate education," Sinclair notes. "A big reason they do so well in job searches is that they know more than just how to complete a financial report. Our objective is to teach students how to think, and recruiters know Lehigh graduates have that ability," he says.

Each spring, sophomores and juniors attend Career Day, where they meet representatives of about 40 prospective employers. In courses, regular guest speakers from the business world are invited to help bring classroom material to life. Fall field trips to New York City or Philadelphia expose students to international accounting firms. In a new course, students practice making oral presentations in front of a video camera.

But perhaps the biggest advantage Lehigh accounting has over larger schools is class size. Professor Bob Mills says the department decided about 20 years ago to keep class size small for even introductory accounting courses, which at some universities include

hundreds of students crowded into large lecture halls. Lehigh beginning courses have not more than 35 students, with advanced courses having even fewer students. Further more, courses are taught primarily by full time faculty, not teaching assistants.

In addition to their formidable teaching commitment, the accounting faculty are busy doing research, developing textbooks or serving in professional societies.

"The research we do is important," says Manash Ray, assistant professor. "But it is particularly rewarding when professors use their research in the classroom, as we do here." Accounting at Lehigh is rewarding to students willing to do the work.

The field of finance is concerned with the transfer of funds from savers to users and the allocation of funds within an enterprise among competing demands for the funds. Attention is also focused on the institutions and instruments necessary to facilitate this transfer of funds. Hence, the Department of Finance offers courses and undertakes research in the areas of Business Finance, Investments, Security Analysis, Portfolio Management, Financial Flows and Markets, Bank Management, Financial Futures and Options, and International Financial Management. In this way it has been able to prepare students for attractive careers in the finance function of industrial firms, brokerage houses, banks and other financial intermediaries: investment banking, financial analysis, institutional investors, and national and international capital markets.

Brockway and Zirkel are senior faculty, both of whom are at the distinguished level of "university professor." Mosakowski and Nation are assistant professors, who add breadth and growth to the teaching, research, and service activities of the department.

The department provides a range of courses, from the popular university-wide offering in Introduction to Law to advanced graduate-level courses in Commercial, Tax, and International Law.

In the research area, the faculty continues to increase their production of publications in national journals.

Management

The entire faculty and staff of the Department of Management was accommodated for he first time in almost twenty years in a ingle building — the Rauch Business Center, which was dedicated on 11 Oct 90. Prior to he Fall '90 semester, various members of the epartment's faculty and staff were fractioned between four sites on and off campus. Trom this point onward, the entire department can begin to integrate its activities more asily into a cohesive focused thrust.

ALDEN BEAN and JOHN BONGE cohaired the department during the 1990-91 cademic year. BEAN, the Kenan professor of nanagement and technology, divided his eforts between: (a) departmental chair responibilities: (b) initiating and coordinating the lationwide satellite linkage for programs ofered through the National Technological Uniersity (NTU); (c) directing activities of the enter for Innovation Management Studies CIMS) — the unique industry/university coperative research center for studying relaionships between technological innovation, nanagement decision-making, industrial rowth, and productivity; plus (d) playing a entral role in developing cross-challenge R & career projects at the undergraduate level etween chemistry, chemical engineering, nd business administration. Professor 3ONGE, on the other hand, directed activities of the Musser Center for Entrepreneurship formerly the Small Business Development lenter), in addition to handling various deartmental chair responsibilities, plus generting and coordinating research proposals on lient needs and consultant responses to hose needs in the Lehigh Valley.

Professor BENJAMIN LITT joined CIMS luring the year on community bridge building ctivities in the management of technolgy rea between the departments of Industrial Engineering and Management. He is also rediecting the focus of several of his seminars, particularly those connected with the Manuacturing System Engineering graduate projram, toward the newly emerging areas of regotiating strategy skills and the ethical dinensions of organization decision-making. Associate professor TED SCHLIE continues o shepherd theses of graduate students who ire involved in NTU's Master of Science in Technology Management program, in addiion to serving as associate director of CIMS n charge of screening and securing funds for enter-sponsored research projects. Schlie is ilso authoring an advanced textbook in manifacturing and competitive strategy, along vith assisting in developing a graduate level

Associate professor MICHAEL KOLCHIN continues intensive involvement in the National Association of Purchasing Management, serving on its board of trustees of the Center for Advanced Purchasing Studies and participating in NAPM's purchasing and materials management research symposium. Augmenting those activities are his interests in examining purchasing practices and performances in various sectors of the economy, along with conducting negotiating training seminars for multinational corporations as General Electric. JOHN STEVENS, associate professor and Colonel in the U.S. Army is conducting research during the 1990-91 academic year at the American War College at Carlisle, Pennsylvania on tactics for redeployment and reorganization of military unites.

SUSAN SHERER, assistant professor and member of the prestigious Society of Information Management, serves on one of its committees to foster interaction between academics, industrial, and public sector practitioners. Several of her papers on software risk management have been published during the past two years, in addition to papers presented at the Center for Management, Policy, Strategy, and Organization. Computer Science & Electrical Engineering

The Computer Science and Electrical Engieering Department is one of the largest acalemic departments at Lehigh with about 400 indergraduates (sophomore to senior) and 200 graduate students, of which 90 are full ime. The CSEE curriculum within the Colege of Engineering and Applied Sciences are accredited in Electrical Engineering, Computr Engineering and Computer Science. These lisciplines are central to the national effort to leal with the issues of international competiiveness. They range from the fundamental lesign and theoretical aspects of engineering o computer and informational systems rejuired to manage and transform major proluction or administratively oriented enterprises.

Active faculty review of the undergraduate program assures timely response to meet the lemands of the rapid progress in our disciplines. Equally important has been a recognition for the need to provide more opportunities for students to meet and work with aculty members in less formal settings. These include working with students organizations such as IEEE student branch and an

Artificial Intelligence student group. A faculty committee works actively to increase these interactions, with, for example, special orientation days for sophomores and with more activities of a similar nature.

Computer facilities have been expanded significantly by a recent AT & T award to

strengthen our UNIX environment through a second 3B15 superminicomputer and an N-Cube parallel processor, as well as sixteen graphics terminals. Beyond this are department Intel, Sun, Tektronix, Valid and Hewlett Packard work stations for both instructional and research use.

Industrial Engineering

The class of 1991 was the first industrial engineering class to take all of its IE courses in the Mohler Laboratory building. The department faculty completed the move to the Mohler building in January 1988, and we are finally getting accustomed to our new surroundings after many years of sharing Packard Lab with the Electrical and Mechanical Engineering Departments.

Several new pieces of laboratory equipment were acquired during the last year to confuse and complicate the lives of the class of 1991 (and its successors): new computers and software for the Computer Integrated Manufacturing Lab and Information Systems Lab, and two new production machines and an assembly line conveyor for the Manufacturing Technology Lab. The graduating class acquired a first-hand experience in planning the production of a product on an assembly line, and then working on the line using their plan. That's justice.

In Fall 1989, the department welcomed two new faculty members: Dr. Laura Burke (assistant professor) and Dr. Keith Gardiner (visit-

Materials Science And Engineering

The academic year 1990-1991 has been a milestone year for the Department of Materials Science and Engineering as it was our Centennial Year! Actually, the department can trace its beginning back to the founding of Lehigh University. When Lehigh was founded 125 years ago, there were five departments, or "schools" as they were then called, and one of these was the School of Mining and Metallurgy. In 1890, the Mining and Metallurgy School became two departments the Mining Department and the Metallurgy Department. This Metallurgy Department is known today as the Department of Materials Science and Engineering and is recognized as one of the top metallurgy/materials departments in the United States and Canada.

The beginning of the Centennial Celebration was marked by a three-day program on November 1-3. On November 1 tours of the newly painted and decorated Whitaker Laboratory, home of the department and the Materials Research Center, were given for alumni and friends before an evening banquet at the Mountaintop Campus. Nearly 250 undergraduates, graduate students, faculty, alumni, and friends attended the banquet where distinguished alumni and former department chairmen were honored. The department's chairmen, Professor Richard Hertzberg, served as master of ceremonies for this event. Distinquished Alumni Awards were presented to the three former students of the department; the recipients were: Peter R. Bridenbaugh, vice president of Alcoa Corp.; Frederick C. Langenberg, chairman and chief executive officer of the Interlake Corp.; and U.S. congressional representative Don Ritter. Doctors Robert D. Stout and Joseph F. Libsch, department chairmen emeriti, were honored and suprised by the unveiling of their portraits at the banquet. The oil paintings will be placed in the department's conference room in Whitaker Laboratory. Prof. Rustom Roy, Evan Pugh Professor of Solid State Science at Pennsylvania State University, was the evening's keynote speaker.

A technical symposium was held on Friday, November 2, to address the future challenges in the materials field. The session was chaired by Prof. Donald Smyth, director of the Materials Research Center. The Saturday morning program was given to discussions on "precollege students' interest in science and engineering" and was chaired by Prof. Himanshu Jain. A tailgate-lunch and football game ended the three-day celebration.

Other significant activities in this centennial year included among others i) the addition

of a new faculty member of polymeric materials, Prof. Raymond Pearson, ii) the approval of an entirely new curriculum for undergraduates in materials science and engineering, iii) invited speakers for the Karakash Lecture Series, and iv) the kickoff of a fund raising campaign for the department. Regarding the latter, the faculty officially introduced the Materials Science and Engineering Faculty Centennial Scholarship Fund which will be used to support future MS & E majors.

Mechanical Engineering

The department faculty underwent a numper of changes this year. Professor Fazil Erdoan became Interim Dean of the College of Engineering and Applied Sciences and was eplaced by Professor Robert P. Wei as Chairman of the Department. Professor Ken Sawvers became Associate Dean of the College of Engineering and Applied Sciences. Professor Dominic Edelen transferred to the Mathematics Department. On sabbatical are Professor Kyra D. Stephanoff, Alexander Von Humboldt Foundation Fellowship (Germany), Professor Terry J. Delph, NSF Grant (Germany), and Professor Robert R. Wei, Alexander Von Humboldt Foundation Award for Senior U.S. Scientists (Germany). Joining the department is Professor John Coulter who comes to Lehigh from industry and obtained his Ph.D. from the University of Delaware in 1988.





Next year Lehigh will be losing many of its star players including seniors: Eric Torain, Kevin Costello, and, Shon Harker, among others. The incoming freshman players will have a tough time filling the shoes of these athletes.



In relays he was on six victorious 400 medley teams and on six freestyle winners, four at 400 and one each at 200 and 800. He won the Patriot League championships in the 100 and 200 free, and was on two title-winning relay teams. He broke his own school marks in the 100 free (45.66), 200 free (1:38.72), and 200 IM (1:53.66). Littlefield is a true champion and one of Lehigh's finest athletes.

Bob Krizansky and Dozie Mbonu, juniors who are on target to rank with Lehigh University's greatest basketball stars of all time, paced the Engineers during the 1990-1991 action. They led 17 of 20 statistical categories while pacing their team to a great year.

Coach Dave Duke's squad had its all-time best home record in Stabler Center (10-2) with the losses to Patriot League champion Fordham at the buzzer, 76-73, and Ivy League champion Princeton 57-40. The Engineers 10 league wins were a school record as was the 50.6% shooting from the field.

Bob Krizansky is a 6'4" junior who weighs in at 225 pounds, and is a Charles Barkley type forward who led 10 statistical columns. He was the pace-setter in points (489) and points per game (16.9), field goals (187) and field goals attempted (323), 3-point field goal percentage (.460 making 17 out of 37 attempts), assists (129), steals (68), defensive rebounds (160), minutes played (984) and minutes played per game (33.9). Krizansky is from Hazleton, Pennsylvania and went to Hazleton High School.

Dozie Mbonu is 6'6'', 205 pound junior from Philadelphia, Pennsylvania where he went to the Church Farms School. Mbonu moved from his natural forward position to center and led seven categories. These categories include: field goal percentage (.586 making 171 out of 292 attempts), offensive (100) and total rebounds (232), rebounds per game (8.0), blocked shots (21), and free throws made (139) and attempted (183). He played 973 minutes averaging 33.6 a game.



Over two seasons, after overcoming a serious knee injury problem, she played 58 games scoring 983 points (17.2 pg) and hauling down 471 boards (8.3 pg). 
Dancin'
