### Introduction

Welcome to the Junior Eurovision Song Contest 2021, the 19th edition of the competition that has run annually since 2003. 19 countries - 7 more than competed last year, will be taking to the stage on Sunday December 19th for a spectacular show of song.

This is not a Junior Eurovision without its challenges. Junior Eurovision 2021 has a strict health and safety protocol to hopefully keep the show on the road despite the COVID-19 pandemic. While behind the scenes the atmosphere in Paris the programme is much less - with no cultural program, Opening Ceremony or EuroClub for delegations to attend - the show that will be broadcast from the stage in Paris should look no different than any other year.

And yes, Paris. Valentina's victory with '*J'imagine*' last year secured a victory for the French delegation and the French capital has the most stunning host venue, La Seine Musicale. With a capacity of 6,000 (3,500 for Junior Eurovision due to pandemic-based decisions) it is one of the most architecturally stunning concert venues in the country and located in the middle of the romantic river Seine. No doubt there will be plenty of drone footage of another architectural delight or two from Paris either.

This year's artists, from 9-year-old Beknur to 14-year-old Maléna, are coming with songs that mean more than just love and peace. The themes of the 2021 edition range from escapism, to telling yourself you can be you want to be, environmental issues, youth empowerment and missing family members, to name just a few. Once again we at ESC Insight appreciate that Junior Eurovision shows us that young people can not only grasp tough issues but they can take them on with genuine performances, and we note here that five of the songs include the artists themselves as a songwriter.

This guide book gives you the key facts and figures and the introduction to the songs you need before the show. Listing former winners, the track records of the different countries and short biographies of each artist if you are looking for all the information in one easy place - we hope this helps you out.

### **Differences between JESC and ESC:**

The contest has been through many changes in its eighteen years, and while there are similarities between the Eurovision Song Contest and Junior Eurovision Song Contest, there are some very distinct differences too:

- Junior Eurovision host nations are selected via a bidding system, rather than automatically awarding hosting duties to the previous year's winner. France though was given first refusal to host the 2021 edition following its victory in 2020.
- The song must be sung in any of the national languages of the country it is representing, although up to 40% of the lyrics are allowed in another language. Artists should have a citizenship or residency of the country they represent.
- The song must last a minimum of 2 minutes 30 seconds, while there is no minimum length at the Eurovision Song Contest. Both contests set a maximum song length of three minutes.
- Junior Eurovision's score is tabulated by a combination of national juries and an online public vote open to viewers from around the globe.

### **Participation**

Active member broadcasters of the European Broadcasting Union are permitted to take part in the contest, though the show has been screened in several non-participating countries, and contest participation may be extended to Associate Members on an invitation-only basis, as in the cases of Kazakhstan.

Out of the thirty-eight countries that have participated at least once, only one country – The Netherlands – has competed in every Junior Eurovision so far. As of 2021, Georgia is the most successful nation at the Junior Eurovision Song Contest with three wins and two 2nd place finishes. Russia has won twice with two runner-up placements, Belarus, which no longer participates in the Contest, had two victories and one 2nd place during their years of participation, and Malta and Poland each have two wins in the bank as well.

### 2021 Host Venue: La Seine Musicale, Paris, France

With a seating capacity of up to 6,000 spectators in its largest hall, La Seine Musicale is a relatively new addition to Paris's storied list of performing arts spaces. Opened in 2017, it is located on Île Seguin, which until 2005 was the home of a Renault factory. It is the showpiece of what will become a new hub of art and culture on the island, which is technically located in the first-ring Parisian suburb of Boulogne-Billancourt. The first artist to hold a concert in the space was Nobel laureate Bob Dylan, and the venue also hosted the final draw of the 2019 FIFA Women's World Cup.

### 2021 Hosts

### Carla

Sixteen-year-old Carla Lazzari is best known to Junior Eurovision fans as the singer of 2019's "Bim Bam Toi", finishing in fifth place. Since then, "Bim Bam Toi" has become a viral hit, thanks to TikTok and Fortnite. The song topped the Spotify Top 50 Viral chart in France, and Carla's star has continued to rise. She released her first full album, *L'autre moi*, in 2020 and she delivered France's points at the 2021 Eurovision Song Contest.

### Élodie Gossuin

The winner of the Miss France and Miss Europe crowns in 2001, Élodie has been a popular presenter and host on French television since 2005. Between 2016 and 2018, Élodie presented France's jury points at Eurovision, where she became a bit of a sensation after her imitation of Amir's 2016 song, "J'ai cherché", went viral. She has also dabbled in politics, serving as a Regional Councillor for Picardy between 2004 and 2015.

### **Olivier Minne**

Best known to French audiences as the host of the long-running popular game show *Fort Boyard* since 2003, Belgian-French presenter Olivier Minne does have some Eurovision experience in his CV, having presented the French votes in 1992 and 1993, as well as providing commentary from 1995 through 1997.
