American Beheaded in Iraq

Terror group led by Zarqawi claims killing, vows another

BAGHDAD, IRAQ | Terror mastermind Abu Musab al-Zarqawi claimed he personally decapitated a man identified as one of two Americans kidnapped along with a Briton from their Baghdad home four days ago, according to a video and a statement posted on an Islamic Web site Monday.

The nine-minute tape, whose authenticity could not be verified, identified the hostage as Eugene Armstrong and showed

a sobbing man, blindfolded and wearing an orange jumpsuit kneeling in front of five militants. The banner of al-Zarqawi's Tawhid and Jihad group hung on the wall behind them.

The man in the center read out a statement, pulled a knife, rushed to the hostage from behind and sliced his head off. The group said another hostage — either an American or a Briton — would be killed in 24 hours.

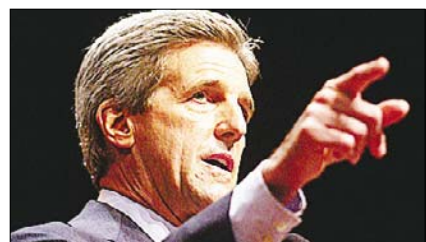
In a video released Saturday, Tawhid

and Jihad had threatened to kill Armstrong, fellow American Jack Hensley and Briton Kenneth Bigley, unless Iraqi women were released from two U.S.-controlled prisons here.

A U.S. official, speaking on condition of anonymity, said Armstrong's body had been recovered, but would not say when or where it was found. **BASSEM MROUE (AP)**

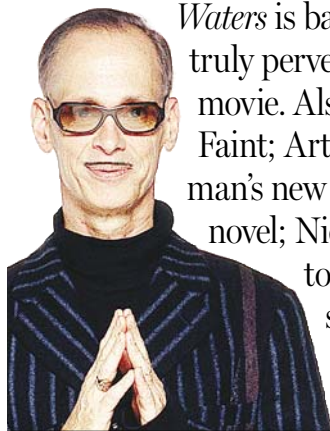

CBS, Rather: Bush Papers Were Bogus

NEW YORK | CBS News apologized Monday for a "mistake in judgment" in its story questioning President Bush's National Guard service, claiming it was misled by the source of documents that several experts have dismissed as fakes.

The network said it would appoint an independent panel to look at its reporting about the memos. The story has mushroomed into a scandal, threatening the reputations of CBS News and chief anchor Dan Rather.

It also became an issue in the presidential campaign. The White House said the affair raises questions about the connections between CBS's source, retired Texas National Guard officer Bill Burkett, and Democrat John Kerry's campaign.

After the story aired Sept. 8, experts questioned memos purportedly written by Bush's late squadron leader, Lt. Col. Jerry B. Killian, saying they appeared to have been created on a computer and not on the kind of typewriter in use during the 1970s. (AP)

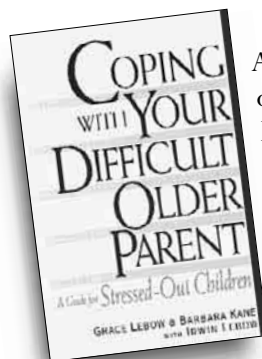

Kerry Blasts Bush for Iraq Missteps

Democrat outlines a 4-part postwar strategy

NEW YORK | Sen. John Kerry said Monday that mistakes by President Bush in invading Iraq could lead to unending war and that no responsible president would have begun the war knowing Saddam Hussein didn't possess weapons of mass destruction and wasn't an imminent threat to the United States.

"Yet today, President Bush tells us that he would do everything all over again, the same way. How can he possibly be serious?" Kerry said at New York University.

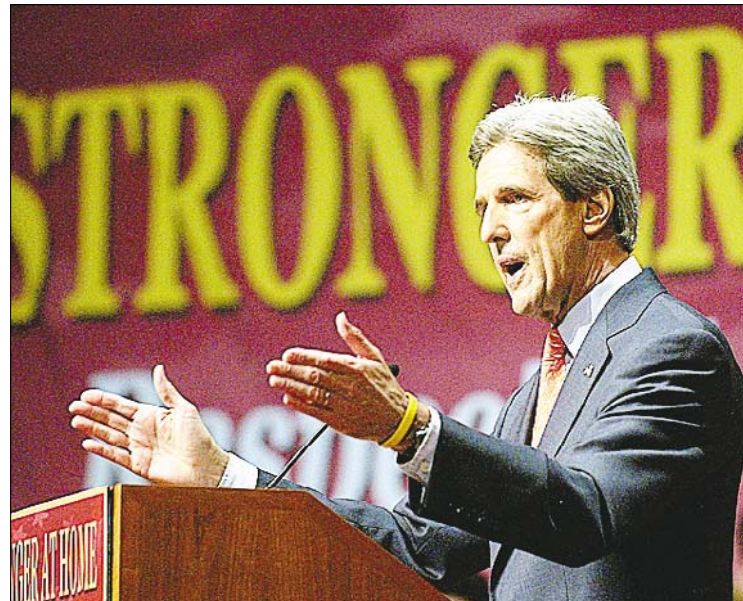
Kerry voted to give Bush authority to wage the war and said in August he still would have voted that way had he known there were no weapons of mass destruction in Iraq.

Kerry said Monday that Bush's invasion of Iraq has created a crisis that could lead to unending war.

The Democrat offered his own four-point plan for Iraq including pressing other nations for help, providing better training for Iraqi security forces, providing benefits to the Iraqi people and ensuring that democratic elections can be held next year as promised.

Bush responded at a New Hampshire rally. "He apparently woke up this morning and has now decided, No, we should not have invaded Iraq, after just last month saying he would have voted for force even knowing everything we know today," the president said.

Gunman Shoots Guard at Ill. Capitol

SPRINGFIELD, ILL. | A gunman walked into the state Capitol and shot an unarmed security guard to death Monday before stashing the weapon in the trunk of his car and driving away, authorities said.

The officer was killed with one gunshot to the chest, said Col. Larry Schmidt, chief deputy director of the Secretary of State Police. Authorities did not immediately know the motive for the attack.

Gov. Rod Blagojevich was not in the Capitol at the time, and the Legislature is not in session. The

Capitol has no metal detectors, and its security guards are not armed.

Police say the shooter matched the description of a man who was involved in an apparent robbery attempt about an hour earlier at a military surplus store 2 miles away. The store owner recognized the man as the same person suspected of stealing a shotgun from the business a week earlier, authorities said.

The suspect was described as white and about 20 years old. Police said they were searching for a silver or gray two-door car. RYAN KEITH (AP)

Ariz. Diocese Files For Bankruptcy

Tucson second to seek court protections due to cost of abuse cases

TUCSON, ARIZ. | The Roman Catholic Diocese of Tucson filed for bankruptcy Monday, becoming the second U.S. diocese to seek court protection because of the cost of clerical sex abuse cases.

Tucson Bishop Gerald F. Kicanas told parishioners in a letter that filing the voluntary petition for Chapter 11 bankruptcy reorganization offered "the best opportunity for healing and for the just and fair compensation of those who suffered sexual abuse by workers for the church in our diocese."

But a plaintiffs' attorney said the church was going into bankruptcy

partly as a public relations move aimed at making victims appear overly aggressive.

Financial operations of the Tucson Diocese will now be subject to court scrutiny for the first time, potentially opening the way for non-church interference.

The Tucson Diocese settled 11 abuse lawsuits filed by 16 plaintiffs for an undisclosed sum two years ago and, by the latest count, 22 more molestation claims with 34 plaintiffs have been brought against the diocese.

The Portland, Ore., Archdiocese became the first to file for bankruptcy on July 6. The Boston Archdiocese and Dallas Diocese both considered filing for bankruptcy because of abuse cases but avoided doing so. ARTHUR H. ROTSTEIN (AP)

Imam Sentenced for Hiding Alleged Ties to Terrorists

The leader of Ohio's largest mosque was sentenced Monday to two months in federal prison and four months of house arrest for lying about his connections to terrorist groups when he applied for U.S. citizenship. Palestinian-born Fawaz Damra, imam of the Islamic Center of Cleveland, could have received up to five years in prison on the charge of obtaining U.S. citizenship in 1994 by providing false information. (AP)

Judge Strikes Down Several Rules on Campaign Finance

A judge has struck down several government rules on campaign fund raising, ordering tougher restrictions on big political money in the long term while creating uncertainty about how candidates, parties and interest groups should proceed in the current election's final weeks. U.S. District Judge Colleen Kollar-Kotelly did not specifically address how political spenders in the heat of the 2004 campaign should act in the absence of the rules. (AP)

FDA Proposes Changes to Curb Salmonella Risk in Eggs

The Food and Drug Administration on Monday recommended changes aimed at reducing some 118,000 salmonella infections caused each year by tainted eggs. By bolstering safety at farms that do not already pasteurize their eggs, the agency hopes to trim yearly illness rates. (AP)

Trial Begins in Harvard Murder Case

CAMBRIDGE, MASS. | A lawyer for a Harvard graduate student accused of stabbing a teenager to death said Monday the scholar was defending himself from an "unrelenting" beating.

Opening statements were presented Monday in the murder trial

of Alexander Pring-Wilson, 26, in the April 2003 death of 18-year-old cook Michael Colono. The case has highlighted tensions between residents of Cambridge and students at the elite Ivy League school.

The Harvard student was walking home after a night of drinking

when he passed Colono sitting in a car with his cousin and a friend and a fight broke out that left Colono dead of stab wounds.

Prosecutors said Pring-Wilson gave at least five different accounts to police, including that he'd only witnessed a fight until acknowledging he had been involved and may have stabbed someone. (AP)

Blair Throws Weight Behind India's Security Council Bid

British Prime Minister Tony Blair said Monday he supported India's bid for a permanent seat on the United Nations Security Council. "India is a country of 1.2 billion people. For India not to be represented on the Security Council is, I think, something that is not in tune with the modern times," Blair said following talks with Indian Prime Minister Manmohan Singh. India has already won the backing of Britain, Japan, Germany and Brazil. (AP)

AUSTRIA

IAEA: 40 Additional Nations May Have Nuclear Know-How

Mohamed ElBaradei, head of the International Atomic Energy Agency, said in an address to the IAEA in Vienna Monday that more than 40 countries with peaceful nuclear programs could retool them to make weapons. Beyond the declared nuclear arms-holding countries, "some estimates indicate that 40 countries or more now have the know-how to produce nuclear weapons," he said, adding it was time to tighten policing of nuclear activities. (AP)

MIDEAST

Blast Kills 2 Hamas Militants

Two Hamas militants were killed Monday when an explosion ripped through their car in Gaza City in an Israeli airstrike, the second in as many days. Eight other people were injured, hospital officials said. Hamas threatened to retaliate with suicide bombings in Israel. (AP)

CONGO

14 Dead After Massacre In Lawless Ituri Province

Attackers overran a sleeping village in east Congo's lawless Ituri province Monday and slaughtered 14 residents, including seven children burned alive, a U.N. spokeswoman said. The attack occurred in Lengabu, a community outside Ituri's capital of Bunia. Ituri remains one of the most volatile provinces in Congo after a 1998-2002 war, with ethnic militias and other elements vying for control of the province's land and mineral wealth. (AP)

Clerics Assassinated in Iraq

Both were members of influential Sunni group

BAGHDAD | Gunmen killed a Muslim cleric who was entering a mosque in Baghdad to perform noon prayers Monday — the second attack on a cleric belonging to an influential association of Sunni clerics in as many days — the group said.

The two clerics belonged to the Association of Muslim Scholars, a grouping of conservative clerics that opposes the U.S. presence in Iraq and has emerged as a powerful representative of Iraq's Sunni minority.

Sheik Mohammed Jadoa al-Janabi was killed in Baghdad's predominantly Shiite al-Baya neighborhood. He was unarmed and had no security guards, said one official who spoke on condition of anonymity.

Late Sunday, another member of the association, Sheik Hazem al-Zeidi, was kidnapped and killed as he left a mosque in Baghdad's Sadr City district.

No one claimed responsibility for

the killings, and there have been no arrests. However, the fact that two influential Sunni clerics were assassinated in Shiite neighborhoods cast suspicion on Shiite groups.

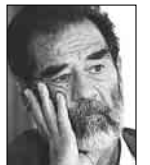
The Association of Muslim Scholars is believed to have contacts with Sunni insurgents, though it denies any links with them. It has interceded often in the past to win the release of foreign hostages, and militant groups have asked the association for a religious ruling on whether kidnappings and killing of hostages are permitted. (AP)

Iraqi P.M.: Saddam Is 'Depressed'

CAIRO, EGYPT | Interim Iraqi Prime Minister Ayad Allawi said in an interview published Monday that a "depressed and broken in spirit" Saddam Hussein had appealed to him for mercy, saying his regime had meant no harm during the years it was in power.

Allawi also told the London-based Al-Hayat newspaper that he's been the target of four assassination attempts — the most recent just five days ago — but he insisted his homeland's chaos would be controlled.

Since his capture in December, Saddam has been held in U.S. detention at an undisclosed location awaiting trial on broad charges of killing rivals, gassing Kurds, invading Kuwait and suppressing uprisings.

"Saddam sent me a verbal message asking for mercy," Allawi told Al-Hayat. He said the message was carried by a member of the current government. He didn't say by whom or when the message was relayed.

Although Allawi said he has not yet met Saddam in prison, he said the deposed president was "depressed and broken in spirit." (AP)

V.P. Survives Roadside Bombing in Afghanistan

KABUL, AFGHANISTAN | A deputy to President Hamid Karzai escaped a roadside bombing in northern Afghanistan on Monday, just four days after Karzai himself was targeted as he tried to hit the campaign trail for landmark Oct. 9 elections.

Nayiamatullah Shahrani, one of four Afghan vice presidents, was on his way to inspect a road project in Kunduz province when the explosion rocked his convoy, police said.

The remote-controlled bomb damaged a car in the 20-vehicle

convoy that was carrying Shahrani's bodyguards, slightly hurting one of them with flying glass, Police Chief Mutaleb Beg said.

Beg blamed "enemies" for the attack, but didn't elaborate. No one was immediately arrested. Meanwhile, two U.S. soldiers and several militants were killed in firefights in the volatile southeast Monday. STEPHEN GRHAM (AP)



WHO KNEW? Progress toward a target of halving the number of the world's hungry by 2015 is "disappointingly slow," the U.N. Food and Agriculture Organization said Monday. In a new report, it estimates that the number of undernourished in developing countries from 1999-2001 stood at 798 million — only 19 million below the 1990-1992 estimate of 817 million. (AP)

Turkey Chafes At EU Criticism of Adultery Measure

ISTANBUL, TURKEY | Turkey's government warned the European Union Monday that it had other options beyond membership in the bloc while refusing to say whether it would press ahead with a controversial proposal to criminalize adultery.

Speaking after a Cabinet meet-

ing, Justice Minister Cemil Cicek said Turkey would push to improve its democracy and human rights record, regardless of whether EU leaders decided in December to begin membership talks with Ankara.

When asked if a proposal to outlaw adultery was still on the table, Cicek said: "Time will show everything."

Turkey's stock market has fallen 6 percent since Friday amid tensions with the European Union sparked by the proposal on adultery, part of a larger package of reforms. (AP)

HOLY ROLLER: Mohan Das, an Indian holy man trying to promote peace by rolling on the ground all the way from India to Pakistan, was barred by Indian authorities from crossing the border Saturday because he had no passport, officials said Monday. He began his 1,560-mile journey on Jan. 28. (AP)

Challenger Leads in Indonesia

Former general poised to defeat incumbent Megawati in landslide

JAKARTA, INDONESIA | A U.S.-trained former general who led the fight against al Qaeda-linked extremists in Indonesia appeared headed for a landslide victory Monday in a presidential runoff heralded as a key step for democracy in the world's most populous Muslim nation.

Susilo Bambang Yudhoyono, who focused his campaign on fixing the economy and cracking down on corruption, had nearly 59 percent of the votes in early returns. Incumbent President Megawati Sukarnoputri had 41 percent.

The General Election Commission said about 20 million votes had been counted by late Monday, from a turnout estimated at 147 million to 152 million voters.

The election was held to choose Indonesia's fourth head of state since

street protests forced an end to the 32-year dictatorship of former military leader Suharto in 1998.

Yudhoyono declined to formally claim victory late Monday and Megawati did not concede, saying

she would await the announcement of official results in early October.

The daughter of the country's founding President Sukarno and Indonesia's first female president, Megawati was once seen as an icon of the reform movement. Her administration succeeded in stabilizing the economy and ending the chaos that followed Suharto's overthrow.

But her apparent lack of empathy for the problems of the poor led to charges that she had sold out to the business and military elite. Many also criticized the failure to rein in corruption, saying it was hampering development by scaring off investors.

The polls were free of violence and accusations of fraud in a further boost to an orderly succession, which is being held up as evidence that democracy can prosper in Muslim nations, most of which are ruled by authoritarian regimes. (AP)

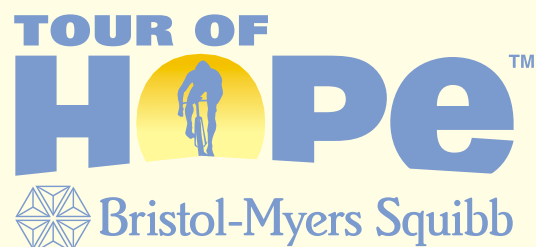

Haiti Beset by Flooding, Mudslides After Jeanne

Tropical storm kills at least 241 before heading to open seas

GONAIVES, HAITI | Raging floodwaters from Tropical Storm Jeanne killed more than 240 people in Haiti, where roads and fields were still inundated Monday and survivors were taking to rooftops and trees days after the storm passed.

The confirmed death toll, mostly in northwestern Haiti, rose to 241 Monday based on reports from government and aid workers. Officials expect the toll to rise further.

Two days after lashing Haiti, Jeanne was over the open Atlantic east of the Bahamas and was expected to strengthen over open seas this week, heading away from the mainland United States.

The storm came four months after devastating floods along the southern border of Haiti and the neighboring Dominican Republic, which killed some 1,700 people and left 1,600 missing.

Floods are particularly devastating in Haiti because it is almost completely deforested, leaving few roots to hold back rushing waters or mudslides. AMY BRACKEN (AP)

Bush Drops Libya Sanctions

Action paves the way for Pan Am 103 payments

WASHINGTON | President Bush on Monday removed a ban on commercial air service to Libya and released \$1.3 billion in frozen Libyan assets in recognition of "significant" steps to eliminate its weapons programs.

In response, Libya is expected to disburse \$1 billion to 269 families of the victims of the 1988

Pan Am 103 bombing.

Libya, which has acknowledged responsibility for the bombing, had conditioned release of the money on an end to the two sets of U.S. sanctions. It had established a Wednesday deadline for Bush to act.

White House press secretary Scott McClellan said Bush lifted the

sanctions by signing an executive order. He credited Libya with having taken significant actions over the past nine months to eliminate its chemical, biological and nuclear weapons programs.

Libya is still included on the State Department's list of state sponsors of terrorism, however, which substantially restricts commercial activities between the two countries. (AP)

WASHINGTON | The Arson Task Force was investigating whether the Washington region's serial arsonist struck again Monday. Residents of the city's Brentwood neighborhood expressed concern that this blaze occurred less than one block away from the site of a fatal arson.

"I woke up and saw bright light, and I looked out the window and the house was on fire," said James Thomas, 29, a resident of the small wood-framed Northeast Washington home. Thomas tried unsuccessfully to douse the flames with a garden hose, before returning inside to help his elderly grandmother and an uncle escape. (AP)

Md. Court Puts Nader On Ballot

ANNAPOLIS, MD. | Maryland's highest court ordered state elections officials Monday to accept 542 previously rejected voter signatures gathered by Ralph Nader supporters, a ruling that forces Nader onto the Nov. 2 presidential election ballot as a member of the new Populist Party.

The campaign was required to compile at least 10,000 signatures to qualify Nader for the ballot, but fell short when the names were checked against counties' registration rolls. At least 542 registered voters' signatures had been disqualified when officials found they had signed under the wrong county.

An Anne Arundel County Circuit Court judge agreed with those rejections. On Monday, the Court of Appeals reversed the decision and declared that section of state election law "invalid as applied in this case." (AP)

Duncan Seeks Canadian Drug Waiver

ROCKVILLE, MD. | Montgomery County Executive Douglas Duncan asked Gov. Robert Ehrlich Monday to seek a federal waiver that would allow the county to buy prescription drugs from Canada, despite doubts that such a waiver is necessary or

even exists.

A day before the county council is expected to approve a resolution that could help make Montgomery the first jurisdiction in the state to buy Canadian drugs, Duncan said he wanted assurances from the

Food and Drug Administration that the program could be implemented legally.

The council vote, while not binding, is meant to provide guidance for schools and other segments of the county government that administer their own drug plans, said Councilman Tom Perez. (AP)

Report: Fannie Mae Manipulated Books

Regulators to fault accounting practices at mortgage giant

WASHINGTON | Federal regulators have found evidence suggesting that mortgage giant Fannie Mae manipulated earnings to facilitate bigger bonuses for executives, according to a lawmaker familiar with the findings.

In an eight-month investigation, the agency that supervises Fannie Mae found a pattern of manipulation aimed at smoothing out volatility in profits similar to that which occurred at rival Freddie Mac — whose understatement of billions in profits prompted a management shakeup and a \$125 million fine.

The agency, the Office of Federal Housing Enterprise Oversight, was

presenting its new report criticizing Fannie Mae's accounting practices to the board of the government-sponsored company on Monday.

The report provides "a strong indication that Fannie Mae manipulated earnings in a way that appears to be smoothing," said Michael DiResto, spokesman for Rep. Richard Baker, R-La., who has been briefed on the findings.

DiResto was confirming a report in Monday's Wall Street Journal. He said that Baker, who heads a House panel that oversees the two mortgage giants, had a "strong concern" that increasing executive bonuses may have been a factor behind the faulty accounting.

OFHEO spokeswoman Corinne Russell declined comment, as did Janice Daue, a spokeswoman for Fannie Mae. MARCY GORDON (AP)

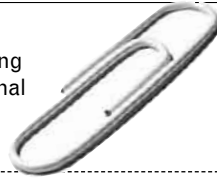

Director John Waters is back to his old self; his latest subject: sex

PERSONALITY | Cult film legend and proud Baltimorean John Waters returns to his deviant roots with an NC-17-rated sex comedy, "A Dirty Shame." Tracey Ullman stars as cranky housewife Sylvia, who becomes uncontrollably amorous after a conk on the head. Johnny Knoxville plays a sexual healer; Chris Isaak plays Sylvia's befuddled husband while Selma Blair appears as their unusually busty daughter.

Seriously, can people become sex addicts from a concussion?

It's true. One of the many side effects of a head injury is some people have a sudden carnal lust, so I took that kernel of truth and kind of embellished on it.

Is this a metaphor about the conservative movement in this country?

Maybe ... but it wasn't a conscious choice. Something Weird Video rescued all these exploitation films from the 1930s to '70s and put them out on video. I've never made a sexploitation movie but it was very much a part of my cinematic influence. In Baltimore,

[Ingmar] Bergman's "Monica" was sold as the "Summer With Monica," like a sex movie, because it revealed bare breasts, and it played in a dirty-movie theater.

Did you establish some boundaries for yourself?

Yes. I have to be responsible. If I'm making a movie that's pro-sexual addiction I have to think of safe things because many of my friends died of AIDS and it's not over. This movie could not have been made 10 years ago.

Why not?

Because of the fear of AIDS. I'm conscious of that. I don't think you can get AIDS from any of these [fetishes] the characters have in the movie. I didn't put things in here that advocated violence toward women or mean things. There's no S&M. I don't think any of those things are funny.

Were any of your cast members caught off guard?

No. You see, I always have a meeting beforehand and I bring up everything I think they can be uptight about. I know what the obvious things are.

There's little nudity in the film. Was the NC-17 rating for language?

No. There are no words that Lenny Bruce went to jail for in this movie. It's all innuendo. I doubt [the ratings board] knew what half of them meant. ANGELA DAWSON (ENTERTAINMENT NEWS WIRE)

Punktronica outfit the Faint creates a dance-rock fusion

MUSIC | There was a time when dance and rock 'n' roll didn't mix.

The former's programmed beats throbbed through discos, while stringy-haired purveyors of the latter fronted celebrations of testosterone in dingy rock clubs. The past 18 months have seen a revival of danceable rock 'n' roll, thanks to disco-trash acts such as Ima Robot, Electric Six and Scissor Sisters. "Wet

From Birth" (Saddle Creek) finds Omaha's the Faint reclaiming its hold on the resurgent trend.

This fourth album mixes the cold precision of electronica with heated punk-rock fury on 10 supercatchy songs, and the brash blend of synths and guitars masks cheeky lyrics about homeland security ("Paranoiattack") and empty rock-star poses ("Desperate Guys").

The terse phrasing of the Clash is an obvious influence on "Drop Kick the Punks" and Depeche Mode's detachment colors the moody vocal intonation on "Erection."

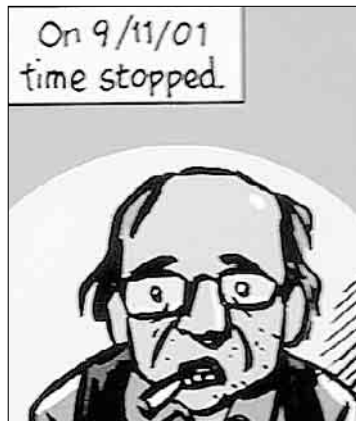
Comic-book artist
Art Spiegelman
grapples with tragedy

PAGES | Art Spiegelman introduces his new book this way: "I tend to be easily unhinged."

That's hard cheese, then, for the author and illustrator of *Maus*, the

Pulitzer Prize-winning nonfiction account of Spiegelman's father's time in Nazi concentration camps. Because Spiegelman and his family, along with thousands of others, faced a most unhinging event on Sept. 11, 2001.

It was this experience — the terrifying proximity, the painful crawl toward normality, the social

and cultural fallout — that as a New Yorker, a historian and a Jew, prompted Spiegelman to make "In the Shadow of No Towers," a provocative, outraged, grief-stricken oversized comic book that grapples with the event and its many aftermaths.

Spiegelman is most often identified as a cartoonist, which is literally half the story. Although a superstar in the hi-lo underground of graphic novels and the cachet-heavy work of New Yorker covers, Spiegelman is foremost a storyteller.

Nickelodeon depicts two ways of making a middle-school leap

TARGET DEMOS | There's no middle ground in Nickelodeon's two new sitcoms set in middle school.

Airing back-to-back on Sundays, "Ned's Declassified School Survival Guide" and "Unfabulous" each portray a kid making the jump from grade school — only each have diametrically opposed expectations.

Ned Bigby (Devon Werkheiser) knows he will ace this new environment, armed with a survival guide he's spent all summer preparing, while the "Unfabulous" Addie Singer (Emma Roberts) is as terminally klutzy and insecure as she is cute.

Although it's hard to imagine the poised and pretty actress tumbling face-first into a back-to-school party punchbowl, the 13-year-old

insists she really isn't all that much different from Addie.

"I can relate to how she goes through typical teen stuff... crushes and family and friends," she said recently on the set of the show.

And what 13-year-old Werkheiser particularly likes about his show is "it's so related to real-life school — except it's exaggerated maybe 15,000 times."

Addie, when not tumbling into punchbowl or setting off lawn sprinklers, releases her angst by slashing at her acoustic guitar and singing songs about the travails of teen life.

She's not that great at it (think of Phoebe in "Friends" singing "Smelly Cat"). And that's fine with Roberts, who's just learning the guitar.

"Actually, I kind of wanted to start taking lessons before, but my mom was always, 'When you're older,'" she said. "So this was a big plus." JOHN ROGERS (AP)

Redskins Hamstrung at Quarterback

Struggling Ramsey likely to start vs. Cowboys

REDSKINS | Struggling quarterback Patrick Ramsey will probably start next week in place of Mark Brunell, who has a strained hamstring. Defensive end Phillip Daniels is out at least two weeks with a strained groin.

And, by the way, Joe Gibbs has had enough of those questions about his value as a Hall of Fame coach.

The Washington Redskins were counting injuries and miscues Monday, a day after committing seven turnovers in a 20-14 loss to the New York Giants.

Brunell and Ramsey accounted for five turnovers Sunday, including three interceptions thrown by Ramsey. But Brunell's injury makes Ramsey the likely starter next Monday night against the Dallas Cowboys.

Gibbs said he would have to see Brunell "look real good in practice" this week to decide otherwise.

Despite Ramsey's struggles, Gibbs said he would not consid-

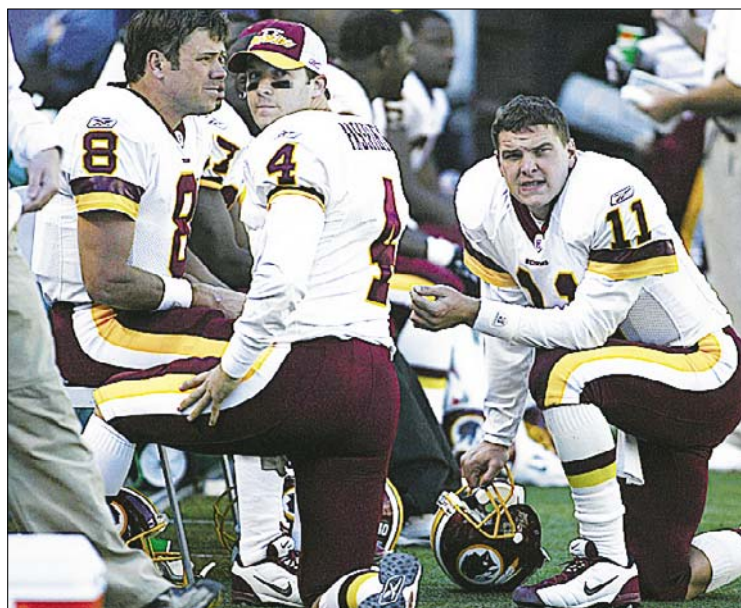
er starting third-stringer Tim Hasselbeck against the Cowboys.

An already thin defensive line was dealt a blow with another injury to Daniels. The free agent signing from Chicago played in only one exhibition game because of an abdominal strain, and now he is off to see a specialist because of the groin injury.

The news was better for kicker John Hall, who has the rare distinction of having two strained hamstrings at the same time. He hurt the hamstring in his non-kicking leg Sunday to match the injury in his other leg suffered in the opener against Tampa Bay, but Gibbs said probably neither injury would keep Hall from playing.

Gibbs grew testy when asked whether the loss offers a reality check from the high expectations that accompanied the Hall of Fame coach's return to football.

"I've got to tell you the truth — I'm kind of fed up with that,"

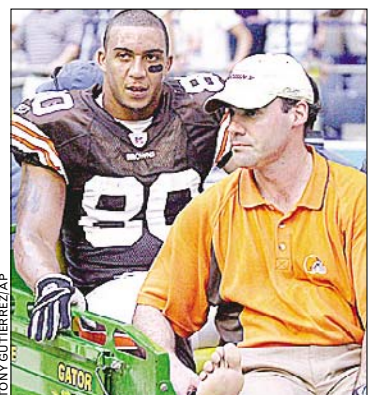
Injury Bug Hits Many NFL Teams

Winslow, McAllister among stars sidelined after Sunday's games

FOOTBALL | The rookie season of Cleveland Browns tight end Kellen Winslow Jr. may have ended after just two games.

The first-round draft pick is among several players who will be sidelined for a few weeks, or more, as a result of injuries in Sunday's games. Others include New Orleans Saints running back Deuce McAllister and Baltimore Ravens tight end Todd Heap, both of whom were knocked out of games with a sprained ankle.

The Browns said Winslow will miss at least two months with a broken right leg, and that they

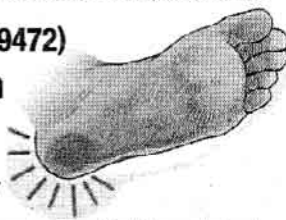

Fresh Field

More scientists are probing the claims of organic products

NUTRITION | Prompted by a quest for safer, healthier diets, more American consumers are buying organic. But scientists, policy analysts and some consumers have begun to ask for proof that organic foods are safer and more nutritious than those raised by conventional farming methods.

The short answer, food safety and nutrition scientists say, is that such proof does not exist.

Dr. Joseph D. Rosen, a Rutgers University food science professor, is one of the organic food industry's newest pests. Last month, at the American Chemical Society's annual meeting, Rosen presided over a daylong symposium that asked: Is organic food healthier? "There's certainly not sufficient science to prove that the claims of organic food advocates are true," he said.

In March, the First World Congress on Organic Food convened scientists, farmers and consumer analysts to consider the safety of organic food. It too found a dearth of evidence.

"This really, truly is a coming of age for the organic movement," said Alex Avery of the Hudson Institute's Center for Global Food Issues. "They have been legitimized to the point where they're no longer the kooky fringe, and they're now subject to the same intense, microscopic scrutiny that conventional farming has been."

The message of organic food's skeptics may discomfort consumers who have been paying premiums for products raised without synthetic pesticides, fertilizers, antibiotics and growth hormones. Buy it if you like it, they say, but not because it's better for you.

The message to those who raise, sell and promote organic products is a bit less friendly: You are being watched. MELISSA HEALY

FITNESS | Many inexperienced weightlifters don't come close to pumping enough iron to change the shape of their muscles, a new study showed.

The study, by exercise physiology professor Stephen Glass of Grand Valley State University in Michigan, was based in part on previous research that said people must lift no less than 60 percent of the maximum weight they can lift

to increase muscle size.

Most novice weightlifters didn't understand that slowly increasing the weight until they're lifting the most they possibly can is the way to get the most benefit.

The study, published in the *Journal of Strength and Conditioning Research*, suggested that beginners should ask trainers to help them figure out what they should be lifting. EDDIE PELLIS (AP)

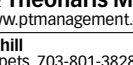

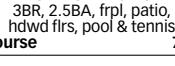

Maxim's publisher opens up his purse to fight free verse

Felix Dennis, the publisher of "Maxim" magazine, made his fortune by taking on the U.S. magazine establishment and giving young men what they wanted: sex, beer and frat-house humor.

Now he's taking on another institution: Free verse.

"We were clappy-happy, we were hippy-dippy — We were building Eden by the mighty Mississippi," Dennis intoned, reading into a microphone from the opening lines of one of his poems. He was doing a rehearsal in a basement theater in Greenwich Village to prepare for the launch of a national tour to promote his first book of poetry, "A Glass Half Full."

After many years of publishing magazines, Dennis now spends most of his time writing poetry.

It's not just any kind of poet-

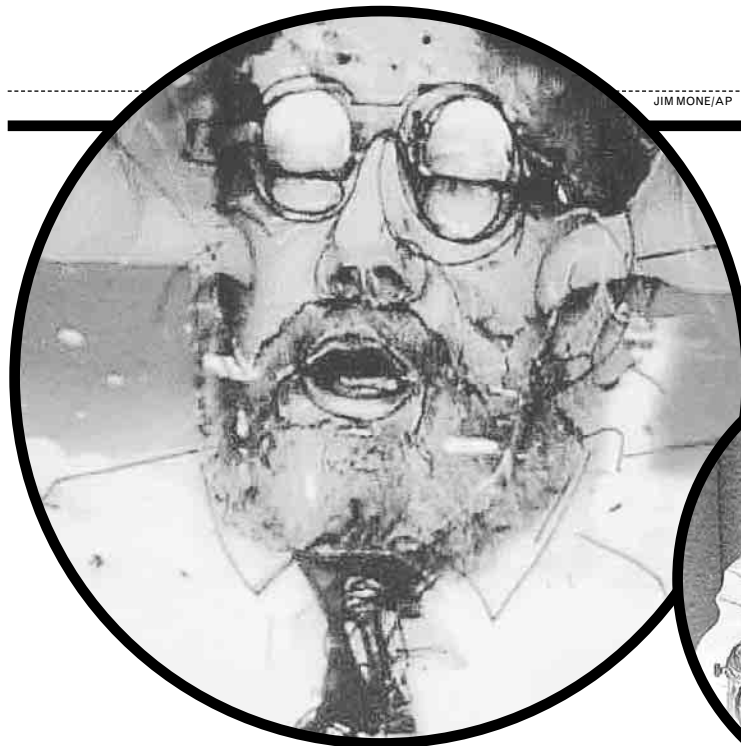
ry, but strictly traditional poetic forms like sonnets and sestinas — the kind that rhymes and has a formal meter. He is on a mission to make poetry popular again, and to undo what he says is the damage done by free verse, or poetry without regular patterns of rhyme, meter or stanzas.

"I consider poetry to be so down-trodden as to be, if not extinct,

then on the endangered species list," Dennis declared. "Free verse is a sea into which the submarine of poetry, burdened by the extra weight of the Beats, has submerged and never emerged."

While Dennis's work hasn't received much notice among literary critics, "A Glass Half Full" did well

in bookstores in his native England two years ago. It sold out an initial print run of 10,000, plus another 5,000 copies printed later — strong sales for a book of poetry.


The U.S. edition went on sale a week ago with an initial run of 25,000 copies, selling for \$12.95. To promote it, he launched a three-

week, 14-city tour, complete with mood-setting music and a full stage set with several large screens behind him that show films, images, live shots of his face and the full texts of the poems.

The poetry community, meanwhile, has taken scant notice of Dennis' efforts. Tree Swenson,

executive director of the Academy of American Poets in New York, called Dennis a "brilliant entrepreneur and publicist" but took exception to his claims that interest in poetry is on the decline.

In his poems, Dennis recalls his life experiences and reflects on current affairs. "Snakeskin Boots" tells of a sexual adventure with a woman whose name he can't remember; "Why Do They Do It?" rants against politicians; "Our Lady in White" is about using crack cocaine. **SETH SUTEL (AP)**

Native America

Post staff writer **JOEL ACHENBACH** was online Monday to discuss the opening of the new National Museum of the American Indian | washingtonpost.com/liveonline

Are any Indians upset at their treatment (or lack thereof) in the new museum?

I know of no Indians upset about their treatment in the museum, though, that would be interesting to find out this week as more than 15,000 natives come into town — the largest gathering of Native Americans in history so far as anyone knows (at least north of Mexico post-1492 in the historical record).

Does this museum delve into specific tribes or is it a more general look at Native American culture?

It's very specific to individual tribes. In fact, that's kind of the signature of the exhibits. They don't generalize. Instead, a tribe tells its own story. I was struck by a tribe from the Amazon that has put together an exhibit on its struggle to protect its forest from loggers.

The downside to the approach is that certain famous incidents or important events might not get included, and perhaps some tribes will feel like they should

have had played more of a role. I also think it's hard to treat older Indian cultures (moundbuilders) that existed a thousand years ago when the emphasis requires everything to be filtered through a current Indian tribe.

Do you think the sheer number of tribes has made the museum's job impossible?

The number of tribes is not a problem for the museum. Maybe a larger problem is that it has 800,000 objects and doesn't want to just set them out on tables and in display cases decontextualized, and the museum's own standards for how to present an object are so high. You have to understand that these objects are in many cases considered sacred and even alive, and thus the museum makes clear that it doesn't "store" objects.
