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This record of part of the Perry family in America is presented without apology for any errors or omissions which it may contain. So many similar attempts at publication have been frustrated by death that it is the author's aim to set forth such facts as are known to be reasonably certain without striving longer for completion or perfection.

The material has been put in temporary shape which forms a framework for expansion. Corrections and additions will be welcome, and a more pretentious volume may ensue. This one is issued in the hope that it will be helpful to some of the many who have sought in vain to link their Perry descent with the line of any of the early settlers of New England.

The first section is largely the work of George A. Perry whose scholarly manuscript was complete and ready for publication when it was accidently destroyed. The major part of the Wilton record is copied from the manuscript of Henry T. Perry which is now in the possession of his daughter, Mrs. Philip Cornwell, South Windsor, Connecticut. Both records have been supplemented by the research of the present author. Records in the Library of Congress, the D.A.R. Library and the Census Office, U.S. Department of Commerce have been searched. In addition, legal documents have been scanned throughout court houses and town clerk's offices in Massachusetts, Connecticut, Vermont and New York State as well as in Michigan and Wisconsin.

Grateful acknowledgement is given others who have helped in preparation of the material. Among these are Dr. George W. Pope, Mrs. Stewart Anderson (Grace Perry), Mrs. Stuart Lowe (Fay Perry), and Mrs. John R. Freeman and Mrs. Philip Dornwell who so graciously entrusted the papers of their father, Mr. Henry T. Perry, to my custody.

In the preceding Foreword - One Ruth V. Pope Werner Rosengarten names herself and Henry Tyler Perry authors of this manuscript.

However, approximately three years before publication Mrs. Rosengarten deceased. As a result it has been my privilege to bring the publication of the manuscript further to its fruition.

Additions, corrections, additional research, and proofreading have caused some delay.

My suggestion for the expansion of this framework is that corrections and additions to this manuscript be sent to the Library of the Daughters of the American Revolution, Washington, D.C., with the request that the material sent in be included in this particular Perry manuscript.

The D.A.R. Library will be the permanent nucleus. Human beings have a way of being impermanent. The D.A.R. Library is accessible to more persons interested in genealogy mainly as a result of its own make-up.

## Introduction:

The first record of Ezra Perry of Sandwich is the mention of his subscription to the Minister's salary June 7, 1644. He was then nineteen years old. He may have arrived earlier, but no record has been found to show an earlier date. He was born in 1625 and died October 16, 1689. It is supposed that he came from Devonshire, England, with others of his family. Sandwich was settled in 1637 by colonists from Lynn, and incorporated in 1639, the original grant having been made to Edmund Freeman, who afterward became Vice-Governor.

Besides Ezra there appeared in Sandwich the following Perrys: - (1) Edward Perry, (2) Margaret Perry, (3) Deborah Perry, (4) Hannah Perry, and (5) Sarah Perry. These Perrys, at least the first four, are regarded as the brother and sisters of Ezra. Mrs. Elizabeth Rodgers Smith, a daughter of Commodore Rodgers and niece of Commodore Perry, who devoted much time to the study of these Perrys, states that there is no doubt that that was the relationship. The following facts also point to this conclusion:

The Sandwich Perrys were among the most prominent people of the town and intermarried with the family of Vice-Governor Freeman. Thus, Edward Perry married Mary, daughter of Edmund Freeman, Sr.; Margaret Perry married Edmund Freeman, Jr., as his second wife; Ezra Perry, Jr., married Rebecca Freeman, daughter of Edmund Freeman, Jr., by his first wife, Rebecca, daughter of Governor Thomas Prence; Ezra Perry, Sr., married Elizabeth, daughter of Thomas terminal and the latter is the second s

Burgess, whom Dr. Savage calls "a chief man among them"; Deborah Perry married Robert Harper, May 9, 1654; Hannah Perry married Henry Dillingham, June 24, 1652.

Sarah Perry is thought to have been the mother of the five children, Ezra, Edward, Margaret, Deborah, and Hannah, and the wife of Edmund Perry, who was among the forty "undertakers" who came from Saugus (Lynn) to Sandwich, June 2, 1637. This is borne out further by the following record in the published records of Plymouth Colony, Vols. III and IV, p. 163: "Ezra Perry is allowed by the court to be exequitur of the estate of Sarah Perry, there being no other, although she hath many friends in the country, that claimeth any interest in the said estate, having put in cecuritie into the Court to be accountable for the estate in case it shall be required by any that hath better title thereto."

The following are the chief items compiled from the published records of Plymouth Colony referring to Ezra Perry:

- 1644 In the 6 "month 7" 1644 A town meeting was held to consider the repair of the old meeting house, whereupon the several following persons promised to give corn as follows: Edmund Freeman, 10s.; Thomas Dexter, 10s.; Thomas Gibbs, 9s.; Ezra Perry, 9s.; Jacob Burgess, 9s.
- 1651/2 Ezra Perry married Elizabeth Burgess, daughter of Thomas Burgess, February 12, 1651/2.
- 1655 Ezra Perry subscribed for a meeting house.
- 1657 Subscribed for the minister's salary. Took the oath of Fidelity at Sandwich together with Thomas Burgess, John Burgess and Jacob Burgess.

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1661, June 4 Ezra Perry, Deputy to the "Grand Enquest"

- 1666, June 5 The Court granted unto Ezra Perry "A small quantity of land of about 30 acres in the neck of land where Mr. Edmund Freeman, Jr., hath his land that was granted unto him by the Court".
- .1671, June 5 Ezra and Edward Perry were appointed by the Court to view the damage done to the Indians by the Horses and Hogs of the English.

1674, June 3 Ezra Perry, Deputy to the "Grand Enquest"

1677, June 5 Ezra Perry, Deputy to the "Grand Enquest"

1679/80 Jan. 3 Ezra Perry, Constable

- 1682, June Ezra Perry, Sr., and Ezra Perry, Jr., were appointed a Committee to see that the Minister is paid.
- 1685/6 Feb. 13 Thomas Burgess died, aged 82. Thomas Burgess's wife, Dorothy, died February 27, 1685/6, fourteen days after her husband. <u>/</u>The Burgess Genealogy by E. Burgess gives her death as 1687<u>.</u>/

In Thomas Burgess's will we find the following: "I give to my son, Ezra Perry, all my other lands that lie above the said two lots, for him to enjoy forever, the which lands I bought of Edmund Freeman, Jr." Thomas Burgess also appointed Ezra Perry as executor, with his son, Jacob Burgess. 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1689, Oct. 16

Ezra Perry's will, dated Oct. 16, 1689, was made on his death bed; for his tombstone, still to be seen in the Old Sandwich graveyard, and said to be the first tombstone brought from England, gives his death as on Oct. 16, 1689, aged 64 years. The will was proved April 18, 1690. In it are given the names of all his children. [See Barstable Records Vol. I, page 33.]

Ezra Perry's tombstone is in excellent condition as is also that of his wife, Elizabeth, who died September 26, 1717, aged 88 years. She was born in 1629 and was four years younger than her husband. She was 22 years old and Ezra 26 when they were married February 12, 1651/2. It may be noted that he had assumed responsibility for years prior to his marriage, as he was but nineteen years of age, when, with much older men, he, in 1644 pledged a sum equal to theirs for the repair of the old meeting house.

Her mother, Dorothy, wife of Thomas Burgess was born ----? and died February 27, 1685/6, in Sandwich /or 1687, as noted above./

2. Ezra Perry (Ezra), son of Ezra and Elizabeth (Burgess) Perry was born in Sandwich February 11, 1652/3; died there January 31 (or January 3), 1729/30, aged 77 years. He was admitted to the First Church August 23, 1719; on Fessenden's list, January 3, 1729/30. [See New England Genealogical Register, XII - page 312.] His will was made September 21, 1728. It was proved February 10, 1729/30. [See Barnstable Probate Records, Vol. IV - page 515.] In it he names his wife, Rebecca, and his children: Ebenezer, Samuel, Hannah, Ezra, Mary, Rebecca (who married Jonathan Washburn, Jr.), Patience and Freelove. These children were born in Sandwich, Massachusetts.

Ezra Perry (Ezra) married (date) Rebecca Freeman, daughter of Edmund Freeman, Jr. and His first wife, Rebecca Prence, who was daughter of Governor Thomas Prence and granddaughter of Elder Brewster. This Rebecca Freeman was 1 1 also stepdaughter to Margaret Perry (sister of Ezra and Edward Perry) and 2 second wife of Edmund Freeman, Jr. Rebecca Freeman, wife of Ezra Perry died April 16, 1738.

NOTE\* It has been thought by some that Ezra married a wife before he married Rebecca Freeman and the first three children (Ebenezer, Mary, and Bethia)<sub>2</sub>are of that earlier marriage. Those three are not mentioned in the list of Ezra's children furnished by<sub>2</sub>Mrs. Elizabeth Rodgers Smith (niece of Commodore Perry) which begins with "Ezra, born Feb. 2, 1679/80." She adds a note: "Mr. Thomas <u>/Genealogical Editor, Connecticut Quarterly</u> says that this Ezra had a wife before Rebecca Freeman and had children: Ebenezer, born Nov. 18, 1673; Mary, born Dec. 21, 1675; and Bethia, born Jan. 15, 1676/7. Then he married (2nd) Rebecca. This may be so. He would then have been 21 years old when his first child was born."

1, 1656/7, and died in Sandwich, October 31, 1732, aged 78 years. He married
Elizabeth Bourne, who died in Sandwich, April 21, 1727. He and his eldest 3
son, John, were both in Fessenden's list of members of the First Church of
Sandwich; his wife, Elizabeth Bourne, was admitted to the same church Nov.
25, 1694; and he was admitted to it July 24, 1720. Rev. Roland Cotton was 2
then Pastor of the Church. John was spoken of as "Cooper John" and his son, 3
John, was distinguished as "Weaver John."

The will of John Perry dated June 6, 1727,  $\overline{/S}$  Barnstable Probate Records 3 3 3 3 3 Vol. V, page 22/ names five sons: John, Timothy, Ezra, Elijah, and Jacob; 3 3 and two daughters: Joanna and Experience. On the town records of Sandwich the names of the sixth, eighth and tenth children are effaced by time.

are descended the Perry families of Wilton, Saratoga County, N.Y.7 His name appears in the list of members of the First Church of Sandwich prepared by Reverend Benjamin Fessenden March, 1730. He married about 1694 <sup>3</sup> Dinah Swift (daughter of William, Jr. and Ruth Swift, he being the son of <sup>1</sup> William and Joan Sisson Swift) of Sandwich. Prior to 1734 (when he first appears in the tax list in Stoughton) he removed from Sandwich to Stoughton - (now Sharon),- Massachusetts, with his sons, Josiah, Benjamin, and <sup>3</sup> Nathaniel; five or six years later his sons Eliakim and Abner followed him to Stoughton. His children were born in Sandwich.  $\sqrt{S}$  Sharon town records were not begun until 1765.7

#### FOURTH CENERATION (Partial)

From this point only the descendants of Benjamin Perry are listed in chronological order. However, much data are available concerning many others listed heretofore.

40. Benjamin Perry, son of Benjamin (Ezra), was born in Sandwich, Massachusetts, March 19, 1699/1700. He married there on May 27, 1723, Deborah Johnson of Bridgewater, Mass. She was probably the daughter of Isaac Johnson, Esq. of Hingham. /See Mitchell - History of Bridgewater./ They had seven children. The first four were born in Sandwich. Three other children were born, perhaps in Stoughton, Mass., where the family was known to have removed prior to 1734. It is held traditionally that the youngest was born in Dutchess County, New York in 1749. The place and date of his death and that of his wife are not known.

### THE DESCENDANTS OF EZRA PERRY OF SANDWICH IN

### WILTON, SARATOGA COUNTY, NEW YORK

The foregoing records of the family of Benjamin Perry are (with minor exceptions) taken from the records of Sandwich, Massachusetts. Benjamin removed from Sandwich to Stoughton (that part which is now Sharon), Norfolk County, Massachusetts, with his father, Benjamin, and two of his brothers, Nathaniel and Eliakim, and undoubtedly his own wife and children, probably in 1734. In 1739 he was still in Stoughton since his name is there signed to the petition to set off the second precinct of Stoughton into the new town of Sharon which was done the next year, (1740). Before 1742 he moved (probably through Fairfield County and Danbury, Connecticut) into Dutchess County, New York, - the part now Putnam County which was then called Fredericksburgh Precinct - where at Patterson his daughter, B-1 Rebecca (then eighteen years of age), was married December 16, 1742, to a Baptist minister, the Rev. Simeon In addition to the four children whose births are noted in Sandwich Dakin. records, Benjamin and Deborah (Johnson) Perry had three other children whose dates are not recorded, born later, perhaps in Stoughton, Massachusetts, but one of them traditionally in Dutchess County, New York. It does not appear, and it is not likely, that Benjamin or his wife, Deborah, went to Wilton, although their four sons and one daughter did (as can be proved by census, deeds, and wills). It is probable that they lived and died in Dutchess County, presumably in the town of North East. Since B-1 Rebecca was married in Dutchess County in 1742, it would be reasonable to suppose that B-2 Ruth and B-3 Jerusha, aged 16 and 15, respectively, at that time would have been with the family in Northeast Precinct and would have married before 1769 when the first member of the family to migrate, i.e. B-5 Isaac, went to Hancock, (Western Massachusetts). With the removal of Benjamin to Stoughton in 1734 and his name on the petition to set off Sharon in 1739 we have the last

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Massachusetts record of him. What follows is from Federal, State, Town, and family records. Much of the detailed information was taken down from 6 5 the lips of R-31 Kellogg Perry, (born 1790), son of R-4 Absalom, son of B-4 Rowland. The relative reliability of his account is attested by the census records and the fact that he, at no time, introduced the names of another Perry family (descendants of John Perry of Watertown, Mass.) who had moved early into the community and who also settled in Wilton.

The first member of the family who is known to have left the "Oblong" was B-5 Issac who removed with his wife and children to Hancock, Mass., in 1769. Berkshire County, Massachusetts, had been organized in 1761 but the border between Massachusetts and New York at this point was not settled In the meantime, a large settlement had developed in Rensuntil selaerwyck, and Stephentown (a few miles from Hancock) was formed in 1784. Settlers from Rhode Island, Connecticut, and the Oblong came in large numbers and pushed farther into the wilderness both to the north and west. The 1790 census records of Dutchess County, N. Y., Hancock, Mass. and Stephentown, N. Y., reveal names of many families who married into the Perry family during the late 18th and early 19th Centuries, the most prominent being the Carrs. But the following are also marked: Clothier, Green, Stiles, Washburn, King, Phillips, Mosher, Schermerhorn, Scott, Viele, Willis, Crippen, and Calkins. Some of the Perrys pushed up into Vermont, among them were 44 Josiah and 46 Eliakim, brothers of 40 Benjamin, who had lived in Connecticut. B-4 Rowland sold his property in the Oblong to Josiah Wilcox and it was recorded Jan. 9, 1773. He is thought to have been in Albany County prior to this date. He crossed the Hudson River at Fort Miller and took land at the base of the mountains to the west. B-6 Seth Perry appears early in Rensselaerwyck, but in Saratoga Town by the

"And the second se and a second of the second the of the second of an one of the second provide and second the second se 1790 census. Land records might show when B-7 Josiah arrived. The various members of the family acquired so much land that the region was called Perry Country.

Another wave of migration took place immediately prior to the opening of the Erie Canal. For some reason, much of the original property was sold by B-4 A Rowland's brothers and his heirs about 1808. Soon thereafter, their names appear in the town rolls or Federal censuses in Seneca County, Otsego County, and in Genesee County, New York. By 1825 they were pushing farther west as more land was opened up.

B-1 Rebecca was born in Sandwich, Massachusetts, May 4, 1724, and married Reverend Simeon Dakin, December 16, 1742. He was born in Concord, Mass., in 1720/21 and came with his father to Franklin near Patterson, Putnam County, New York, 1737. /See North East Baptist Church Centennial Book, published 1861./ He signed the "Association" in the extreme east end of the precinct in 1775. He died Sept. 19, 1803, and was buried in the churchyard at Spencer Corners. They had nine children including a daughter, 5 Phebe, who lived in Wilton, N. Y. Rebecca died in Wilton, December 4, 1792, and was buried there, the stone being still legible in 1955.

B-4 ROWLAND and BEULAH (KELLOGG) PERRY

B-4 Rowland was born in Sandwich, Massachusetts, May 23, 1729. He married about 1850 Beulah Kellogg, who was born Jan. 2, 1731/2 in either Lebanon, Conn., where her father owned property or in Hebron, Conn., since he purchased a house there the same year, (March 31, 1731). She was the sixth 5child and the third daughter of Thomas and Elizabeth (Lee) Kellogg.

Since Rowland sold his property in North East, Jan. 9, 1773, it is probable that he was in Wilton (then Palmer Town, Northumberland Township, Saratoga District, Albany County) shortly thereafter. When General Burgoyne pene-4 trated into the country, Rowland "did not move his family and effects," and later (April 16, 1778) was exonerated as not having had "the means wherewith to move" them. /Minutes of Commissioners for Detecting and Defeating Conspiracies in the State of New York, Albany County Sessions 1778-81, p. 85. Published by State of New York 1909./ This reference makes it clear that he was established with his family prior to 1777. There is no record of Beulah's death. Rowland died in Wilton, N. Y., Jan. 10, 1787, and his will was proved (filed in Albany), March 8, 1787. The will named eight sons and three daughters, Benjamin being named executor.

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left her the use of the property and willed his entire estate to his favorite nephew, R-35 William. The will was protested by his nephew, R-51 Hudson. William, as the executor, furnished the court with a list of all Artemas' living nieces and nephews and the heirs of deceased nieces and nephews in 1847. Since R-4 Absalom was still alive, his descendants were not listed but were known. A total number of seventy-five names of B-4 Rowland's descendants appear on the list. In many instances their addresses were included. Thus it serves to clarify many questions and would afford many leads for further search. (See Part-IV.)

Artemas and Rebecca were said to live "like hermits". She was called "Aunt Becky Teem" to distinguish her from the other Rebeccas. Their house was later occupied by Amanda Schermerhorn.

R-5 Roswell was born about 1770, undoubtedly in Dutchess County. He was an ensign in the regiment of Lt. Col. Thomas Rogers in 1810. He married first, his cousin, J-2 Adah, daughter of B-7 Josiah and Susannah (Washburn) Perry. They had seven children. In 1805 they sold property in Wilton to MacGregor. The deed was not recorded, however, until 1825, at which time he had remarried and was probably a resident of Covington, Livingston Co., N. Y. In the 1830 census he was listed as being between 60 and 70 years of age. At that time, his son, Numan, was living south of LeRoy at Union Corners; his son,  $\begin{pmatrix} 6\\ Ransom, had married and was living at York, Livingston Co., while his daugh$ ter, Lucinda, was in Castile, Wyoming Co., and his son, Clark, had moved onto Washtenaw Co., Michigan.

The name of the second wife was Dolly \_\_\_\_\_. They had five sons and one daughter. Nothing further is known of them, but the widow and six 5 children were listed as potential heirs to R-7 Artemas' property and were said (1847) to be residing in Niagara County.

Joseph was among the first of the family to remove from Wilton. **R-8** In 1806 Covington was a wilderness. It was formed January, 1817. Pavilion, the home of the Carrs, was set off from it later. Joseph's birth date and death are not known but he was twin of R-9 Mary who married Israel Craw. He married his second cousin, I-25 Sally Carr, daughter of Richmond and I-3 Mary (Perry) Carr. They sold their property in Wilton and were "settled on the Leicester Road" in 1814, thus preceding the Carrs and the Crowfoots by two years. His place can still be located and is not far from that of R-5 Roswell and within a few miles of R-46 Numan and R-47 Ransom. His name with that of Joseph, Jr., appears on the 1817 tax rolls of Covington. They had eight children and four of their sons, Joseph, Jr., Norman, Grant, and Merritt, pioneered farther west. It is probable that the entire family migrated there about 1827 when so many of the Perry and Carr families are known to have been in Washtenaw County, Michigan. The last New York State record of them is the census of 1820.



R-18 John was born in Saratoga County and removed to Seneca County where he appears in the 1820 census with his father, R-3 John, and two brothers, 6 R-16 Rensselaer (V.E.) and R-24 Thomas. In his household, at that time, in addition to himself and his wife were four boys and two girls under 16 and one man and one woman, each over 45 years of age. Since R-1 Benjamin and his wife, REB-6 Phoebe (widow of Ebenezer King) and the mother of REB-12 Rebecca (King) Perry had removed to Seneca, it is probable that they were in advanced age and living in the home of John at the time of the 1820 census. REB-12 Rebecca was about ten years younger than her husband and outlived him, both dying in Seneca.



She was the daughter of Ephraim and Mary (Chamberlain) Bates of Cohasset and Plainfield, Mass., who had removed with their family to York, Genessee Co. In 1834 R-47 Ransom sold his property in Covington and moved to Wisconsin where he had a sawmill on Lake Geneva. In 1845 they purchased property in Elk Horn. In 1849 they purchased in Sugar Creek.

In September, 1852, they and their daughter, Helen died within a few hours of each other in the cholera epidemic at Delevan, Wisconsin. Wealthy's son, 7 Levi Gloyd, Jr., owned adjoining property. Their son, Bethuel, who had married Helen Marr Hammond of Bethany, Genesee Co., N. Y., and had been left a widower, had returned to the East two years prior to their death and had remarried.

R-49 Clark Perry, son of R-5 Roswell and J-2 Adah (Perry) Perry, was born in Wilton in 1802. He married, either in Covington, N. Y., or Dexter, Michigan, not later than 1829, Charlotte Carr, who was born in Vermont in 1810, daughter of I-16 Rogers and Hannah (Newman) Carr. (The Carr book says that she married Arvid Gardner but this is an error as a review of census records will clearly show.) He went to Michigan when it was first opened to settlement and acquired land in 1827. Their children were all born in Michigan. Charlotte's father and her two brothers, Enos N. and Elijah P. Carr went to the same area in 1829. Rogers Carr died there in In 1850 Hannah Carr was residing in Clark Perry's home. 1833. She was still living there in 1860, aged 82. She was born in New York State, probably the daughter of Enos Newman. Also residing in Clark's home was Solomon Peterson, termed a bachelor, who was the first settler in Putnam Township, Livingston Co., Mich. He was born in Vermont and commanded a regiment of militia in New York State. He may have lived on what was known as "the Peterson place" in Wilton.

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### R-58 JOSEPH, JR. and OLIVE (\_\_\_\_\_) PERRY

The name of Joseph Perry, Jr., appears on the tax list of Covington, N. Y., in 1817 so he must have been of legal age at that time. The Saratoga County census of 1810 shows his father's eldest son to have been under 16 years of 6age, so it may be concluded that Joseph, Jr. was born about 1794 or 1795.

In 1842, R-8 Joseph and I-20 Sally (Carr) Perry deeded property in Washtenaw County, Michigan, to Joseph and Olive Perry. The witnesses to the deed were George Perry and Orin Perry.

Among the early arrivals in the same township, in 1829, was a two-year old infant, Joseph H. Perry. He was born April 21, 1827, in Genesee County, N. Y. He married Jane \_\_\_\_\_\_ who was born in Michigan and who was ten years younger than he.

A detailed study of all records, now available, would probably provide considerable reliable data. Until this is possible, the following hypothesis is offered:

Apparently Olive and Jane are the same person, bearing a daughter, Jane in 1867. The census taker may have been in error, confusing the name of Ozen's wife with that of his mother. However, the question of Ozen's relationship to the other Perrys remains unanswered. Was he the son of 6R-58 Joseph Perry, Jr. $\overline{?}/$ 

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### R-59 NORMAN and SUSAN (SCOTT) PERRY

R-59 Norman Perry accompanied his father, R-8 Joseph, to Covington, N. Y., in 1814. This was part of Le Roy, Genesee Co. He lived there ten years and started to Michigan in the fall of 1824. He located 80 acres in Armada, Macomb County, Michigan, cleared four acres, built a cabin and returned to Genesee County, where, in March, 1825, he married Susan Scott, daughter of Capt. David Scott, who had gone to Covington in 1819 and who later became the first settler of Clinton, Mich. Norman Perry gave land for the first schoolhouse, was Supervisor of the Town, 1844-51, and was a member of the State Militia: Lieut., April, 1829; Capt., Sept., 1831; Major and made Lt. Col., Feb., 1832.



He also built a line of grain elevators from St. Paul, Minn., to Bismarck, North Dakota. Prior to this he had been in the South when war broke out between the States. He was not conscripted but had charge of iron mines and manufacturing plants. The iron mines, which occasion the existence of Birmingham, Alabama, were opened under his supervision. Ransom J. Perry, son of Roswell and Adah Perry (both descendants of Ezra Perry of Sandwich, Mass.) was born in Wilton, Saratoga Co., N. Y., in 1798. He was one of their seven children; the others were: Lucinda (Hurd), Newman, Aurelia, Hudson, Clark, and Miles. With several of his family he made his way westward, probably by way of the Erie Canal, and was among the earliest settlers of western New York. He married in 1820, Wealthy Bates Gloyd, the newly widowed daughter of Ephraim and Mary (Chamberlain) Bates and assumed the care of her two sons, Charles and Levi Gloyd. Five children were born to them: Adah Ann (Smith), Adeliza (Henry), Bethuel, Sally, and Helen. In 1835 they sold their property in New York State and moved further west. His brother, Clark, had been among the first to enter Michigan (1827) and had prospered as a fruit-grower, but they pressed on into Wisconsin where Ransom continued carpentering and operated a saw mill on Lake Geneva. In 1845 they purchased property on Sugar Creek, but it is believed that they resided in Delavan during the greater part of the time. Here Sally died November 10, 1850, and here the parents were stricken with Sporadic cholera September 11, 1852. Little Helen followed them within twenty-four hours. The graves and markers in a good state of preservation may be seen in one corner of the Old Settlers Graveyard where they are maintained by a granddaughter, Mabel Perry Pope, wife of Dr. George W. Pope of Washington, D. C. The part played by their only son, Bethuel, may be of interest to persons conversant with the later development of neighboring states.

Bethuel Perry, son of Ransom J. and Wealthy Bates Perry, was born in York, Livingston Co., N. Y., July 15, 1827. After the loss of his wife, Helen Marr (Hammond) Perry and infant son, Bethuel, Jr., in 1850, he went east

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and studied architecture and railroad construction. The passenger depots he built on the old Auburn Railroad were standing fifty years later as stable as when first erected. While engaged in Binghamton, N. Y., he met and married Phoebe Ann Kilmer of Carbondale, Pa. They made their home in Geneva, Illinois. By this marriage he had nine children: Florice, James Ransom, Elbert Carleton, Lewis Bethuel, Mabel M. (Pope), Herman, Eugene Edgar, Hattie A. (Crozier), and Grace G. (Anderson).

In 1860 he contracted to build a railroad from Birmingham, Alabama, to Atlanta, Georgia, and was in the South when the war broke out between the States. Although a States Rights Democrat Mr. Perry did not favor slavery and would not take arms against the North. He was not conscripted but had charge of iron mines and manufacturing plants. The iron mines which occasion the existence of Birmingham, Alabama, were opened under his supervision. Before the battle of Island Number Ten he resolved to take his wife and small children to a place of security, and they made their way by ox-cart and river packet to Memphis and up the river to Chicago, where he was well acquainted with such men as James and William Derby, and George Pullman. Here in 1867 he built bridges and locks on the Michigan Canal for J. Y. Sanger. Among his enterprises were the dredging of the Chicago River and the erection of residences on Michigan Avenue.

In 1873 a new enterprise opened up affording him an opportunity to show his versatility and ability to grasp any phase of mechanical contrivance. At that time he built a million bushel grain elevator for Murray Nelson & Company, sinking walnut logs, 80 feet in length into the deep muck alongside the Chicago River. This successful feat led to an alliance with Alexander Miller and they built "The Clinton" which was a cleaning station with machines for separating and cleaning wheat.

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The panic which occurred in '73 forced many of the unemployed of the East to seek outlet in the wheat growing sections and created an incentive for capital to move in that direction. As Minneapolis began to assume importance as a milling cneter, in 1878 Mr. Perry left Chicago and took up residence there. Meanwhile, he had fulfilled other large contracts which included (1872) the bridge connecting Council Bluffs and Omaha.

In Minneapolis he was associated with James J. Hill and, as a construction engineer, played an important role in the development of the new country parallel with its railroad expansion. He built a line of grain elevators on the Northern Pacific Railroad from St. Paul to Bismarck, and constructed elevators and flour mills for the Washburn, Crosby Co., Pillsbury and Hulbert, Thomas Lowery, Cass Cheney & Howe, and for A. J. Sawyer of Duluth, Minnesota, in what was then the territory of Dakota.

## B-5 ISAAC and SARAH (\_\_\_\_) PERRY

B-5 Isaac was born probably in Sandwich or Stoughton not later than 1732. These assumptions may be made because (1) his father Benjamin removed from Sandwich to Stoughton between the time of B-4 Rowland's birth in 1729 and 1734 when his name appears on a tax list. And, (2) Isaac in all probability was twenty-one years old when he married and he is known to have had a child in 1754. His wife's name was Sarah. They lived on the "Oblong" and their son, Isaac was born in Fredericksburgh Precinct in 1759. From there they moved to Hancock, Massachusetts, about 1769.

He served in the Revolution as his son Isaac attested when applying for a pension in 1832.

It is not clear when he moved from Hancock to Saratoga County, New York. 5 His name occurs in Hancock in the 1790 census with that of his son, Abner, while his sons, Isaac and Elihu, are listed in Albany County. The census of 1800 lists Abner and Eli in Northumberland. Isaac owned property in Hancock and a sawmill in Wilton. He mentions his wife Sarah in his will and his twelve children, of whom Elihu and Eleanor were deceased at the writing, Sept. 21, 1799. He died soon thereafter as the will was admitted to probate Dec. 14, 1799, at Saratoga Springs. The sequence of the birth of the children is only partially determined but Isaac was named as the eldest of the eight sons. Their names were:

I-4 ISAAC and HANNAH (BULL or BUELL) PERRY

The application for pension made by Isaac Perry, Jr., on Aug. 19, 1832, gives detailed information concerning his own life and establishes the time that his father and family migrated to Hancock, Mass. He certified that he was born in Fredericksburgh, Dutchess Co., N. Y., Aug. 18, 1759; that he moved to Hancock, Mass., when he was about ten years of age, i.e., about 1769; that he lived there until 1783 when he moved to Granville, N. Y., resided there about seven years, then moved to Saratoga, lived there seven years, then removed to Lowville, Lewis Co., N. Y. He lived there thirty years, then moved to Morristown, St. Lawrence Co., N. Y. He claimed eight enlistments and three battles, namely, White Plains, Hubberton and Bennington. 

He appears in Albany County in the 1790 Census, having in his household, besides his wife and himself, three boys, two of whom were over 16 years of age, and two girls. The birth and death dates of only two of his eight children are definitely 5 5 known, i.e., Seth and Mary. It is probable that he moved into the Northumberland district soon after his brother, B-4 Rowland, so that the older children were born in Dutchess County and the younger children in the vicinity of Wilton. ### B-7 JOSIAH and SUSANNAH (WASHBURN) PERRY

B-7 Josiah Perry was thought by his descendants to have been born in Dutchess County, New York, in 1749. He was listed in Saratoga Town, Albany Co., N. Y., in 1790. Several grantor deeds at Ballston Spa indicate that he was a large property owner. By careful search the time of his arrival in Albany County might be determined. One deed recorded May 4, 1807, indicates that his property adjoined property owned by MacGregor. His home is still standing (1955) near a small body of water on the MacGregor Golf Course. Research might show that he served in the 5th Regiment Albany County Militia.

He married Susannah Washburn about 1770. Her ancestry has not been definitely determined by legal records but she was held to be his cousin, the daughter 3 2 1of Miles Washburn (Joseph, John, John) whose estate was settled by his son, Daniel, at Amenia, Dutchess Co., N. Y., in 1772, and Susannah Perry, daughter of Benjamin and Dinah (Swift) Perry of Sandwich, Mass. The persistence of the name Miles in his descendants bears out the family statement of her 4 identity. Both Josiah and his wife were living in 1820 and probably died in Wilton.
