PREFACE.

I WAS led to issue some time ago a small volume of prayers for families, a number of which had been contributed by my friends of various evangelical denominations. These constitute the first-half of the present volume. The other half consists of selections—with occasional alterations and abbreviations—from a small and excellent volume, published many years ago without any author's name, and now out of print.

It is humbly trusted that this attempt to remove a hindrance to family religion, may, through God's blessing, have some success.

It is known that many who value family prayer are prevented from giving this privilege to their households, by the want of ability to express themselves in what they think becoming language.

This little book is intended to be a temporary help to them; and it is hoped that a beginning having been made by its use, heads of families will soon feel themselves able to forego the aid it is intended to furnish.

In the absence of fathers, family worship is sometimes omitted. It is believed that mothers will thus be helped to keep the fire burning on the family altar. The widowed and the fatherless surely need to call upon the Lord.

Young men who are just commencing married life, and who are forming the character of their "home," are entreated to consecrate it from the beginning by family prayer.

Petitions, suitable in some cases, and not in others, are marked with brackets; and the prayers for particular occasions at the close, will, by their very nature, suggest the place in the daily worship at which they should be used.

Brethren! to you, your wives and little ones, for whose souls' good this book has been prepared, to you it is dedicated, in respect and love. May the God of the families of all the earth bless you, help you in all your toils and cares, and bring you and yours, unbroken households, to His peaceful and eternal home, through Jesus Christ, and for His sake.

PRAYERS.

SABBATH MORNING.

A LMIGHTY and ever blessed God, help us to draw near to Thee through Jesus Christ, and to worship Thee in spirit and in truth. We thank Thee that Thou hast taken care of us during the night. We bless Thee for the life, and light, and mercies of this day. O fill our hearts with gratitude for Thy great goodness; and help us to spend the life which Thou preservest in Thy service.

We know that we are less than the least of all Thy mercies. We are unworthy of Thy great goodness. We are sinners exceedingly in Thy sight. But we thank Thee that Thou didst send Thy Son into the world to save sinners. We bless Thee that He died to make atonement for our sins, and that He ever liveth to make intercession for us. O have mercy on our souls, for Jesus' sake. Send Thy Holy Spirit into our hearts, and keep us ever sensible of our sinfulness and need of Christ. Help us to embrace Him as our Saviour, and rest on Him continually. May our life this day be a life of faith on Thy Son. Pardon all our sins for His sake. Ac-

cept of us in Him. Help us to live this day to His glory, and to show forth His praises. May we realize His presence, and walk as seeing Thee, who art invisible.

May Thy Holy Spirit dwell in our hearts, and make us holy, even as Thou art. Fit us for the discharge of every duty to which we may be called to-day, and help us to resist every temptation by which we may be assailed. Make Thy grace sufficient for us at all times, and perfect Thy strength in our weakness. Enable us to walk circumspectly, not as fools, but as wise, redeeming the time, because the days are evil, and to adorn the doctrine of God our Saviour in all things.

Bless all the members of this family, according to their various circumstances and wants. Thou knowest the spiritual condition of every one of us. Make those of us who are believers, living epistles of Christ. Help us to let our light so shine before men, that they may see our good works, and glorify Thee, our Father in heaven. Make us useful and happy in Christ. Enable us to commend our religion to all around us, by our diligence in duty, by our holy cheerfulness, and by our loving, kindly spirit. any of us here, bowed down before Thee, are still without Christ, O have mercy upon them. Pluck them as brands from the burning. Rouse them immediately from their carelessness. Convince them of the value of their souls. Lead them to flee at once to Jesus, and give them no rest till they have found peace in Him. Bless all our friends. Make them all the friends of Jesus, and cause all Thy dispensations to work together for their spiritual good. Bless the congregation to which we belong, and graciously revive Thy work among its members. Give a double portion of Thy Spirit to our pastor. Fill his heart with love to Christ and compassion for souls. Feed him with the hidden manna, that he may be able to give to each of us a portion in due season.

Bless Thine own cause in this neighborhood. May pure and undefiled religion prevail in it. May those who are Thy children walk more consistently, and be more diligent in Thy service, and more prayerful. Awaken the unconverted from their spiritual slumbers. Bless all the means of grace. Smile on every effort made to bring sinners to the Saviour, and pour out abundantly Thy Holy Spirit. O that Thou wouldest revive Thy work on every side of us!

Bless the whole church with which we are connected. Make all her ministers more faithful and self-denying, and prayerful, and successful. Strengthen their hands for the great work in which they are engaged, and cheer their hearts by permitting them to see abundantly of the fruit of their labors. Bless all the congregations of our church. May Thy children in them all be edified, and may the unconverted be saved. May their office-bearers be full of faith and of the Holy Ghost. May they

be ensamples to the flock, and faithful to their trust. Bless all our missions and missionaries. Crown their labors with success, and give them many souls for their hire. Have pity on those of our countrymen who are still in darkness, and enlighten them. Take away the veil of unbelief from the minds of the Jews, and turn the heathen from their idols to serve Thee, the only living and true God.

Bless all the churches of Thy Son. Purify every one of them, and send down upon them all showers of blessing. May grace and mercy and peace be multiplied to all who love the Lord Jesus Christ in sincerity. Bless every effort made to extend the kingdom of Thy Son. Fill the whole earth with Thy glory, and bring all the children of men into subjection to King Jesus.

And now, O Father, we commend us to Thy guidance and guardianship for this day. Show us the path of duty in the various circumstances in which we may be placed, and help us to walk in it. Keep us from all evil, and save us from every sin; and all the glory shall be Thine, through Jesus Christ, now and for ever. Amen.

SABBATH EVENING.

But we confess that we have been forgetful of Thee, and ungrateful for Thy goodness. Our hearts have wandered from Thee. Our thoughts have been too much occupied with the trifles of time. We have not loved nor served Thee as we ought. We have broken Thy holy law, and sinned against Thee.

day, and to serve Thee better. Make us like Christ. May every evening remind us of the night of death. Stir us up to meditate more on the eternal rest of Thy people. Fix our affections more and more on things above. Prepare us every one for death, and judgment, and immortality. Sanctify to us every dispensation of Thy holy providence. When Thou givest us prosperity, and health, and peace, and happiness, may we receive them as coming from Thy gracious hand, and give Thee all the praise. In all our enjoyments may we remember, and love, and glorify Thee. When Thou sendest any trial, may we receive it as a token of Thy love, and seek that it may yield in us the peaceable fruit of righteousness. Oh, may our light afflictions, which are but for a moment, work for us a far more exceeding and eternal weight of glory. Draw us nearer and nearer to Thee. Grant that we may enjoy communion with Thee every day, and that we may know from blessed experience what it is to walk with God. Help us to live above the world, and let our hearts and our conversation be in Heaven. Bless every effort we have made this day to promote Thy glory. Oh, make us instrumental in winning souls to Christ.

[Bless the children in this family. Incline their hearts, O Lord, to seek Thee early, and make them the lambs of Christ's fold. Give to each of them a new heart. May they strive to be like the holy

child Jesus, and love Him with all their hearts. Keep them from sin, and preserve them from all evil. Bless those who are servants in this house. May they love and serve the Lord Jesus Christ, and be the objects of His redeeming love. Be gracious to all whom we love. May the members of all the families with which we are connected be members of Thy redeemed family, and heirs of Thy glory.]

Bless, Lord, all ranks and classes of men. May the poor be rich in faith; and do Thou graciously supply all their wants. Teach the rich to be humble, and to fear Thee; and let them not trust in uncertain riches, but in Thee the living God. very merciful to the sick and infirm. Sanctify their trials; and when Thou makest their sufferings to abound, make their consolations much more to abound. Be a husband to every widow, and a father to every orphan. Break the voke of the oppressed. Sustain and deliver all who are persecuted for righteousness' sake. Keep all who are on the deep waters as in the hollow of Thine hand. Watch over every traveller; and be the stay, and the portion, and the shield of those who are strangers in strange lands. Bestow Thy Holy Spirit richly upon the President, and all those who have authority. Endue our counsellors with celestial wisdom; and put Thy fear into the hearts of all our legislators, and rulers, and judges, and magistrates. Bless all the people of this land with the blessings of Thy salvation. Have mercy upon all lands. Oh, hasten the time when all the kingdoms of the world shall become the kingdoms of our God and of His Christ. Bless all Christian missions. Bless the circulation of Thy holy word, and of Thy truth in every form. Stay the progress of error and sin; and let knowledge, and righteousness, and peace, prevail throughout the whole world.

And now, O Lord, we commit us to Thy special care for this night. Let no evil come nigh our dwelling. Give us the sleep of Thy beloved. If it be Thy holy will, raise us in health to-morrow, fitted for its duties. Be our sun, and shield, and guide us all our days and nights, and at last receive us to Thy glory. All we ask is for Christ's sake; and to Father, Son, and Holy Ghost be all glory and praise, now and for ever. Amen.

MONDAY MORNING.

O LORD, we approach Thy mercy-seat this morning in the name of our Great High Priest, in whose name alone we plead for access and acceptance while we worship before Thee.

We thank Thee for the safety and rest of the past night; for our safety cometh only from the Lord, who made the heavens and the earth. We thank Thee that we are all living before Thee this day, to enjoy together Thy goodness and Thy mercy. We thank Thee for one another, for our

home, for our love and fellowship, and for all the comforts of life which we enjoy together.

We bless Thee, O Lord, for our fellowship in the truth, for the knowledge of Thy dear Son, our all-sufficient Saviour, and for the light and consolation of Thy word. We bless Thee for our relation to Thy Church, for our fellowship with Thy people, and for all the means of instruction and godly edifying so richly provided for us. gratefully acknowledge Thee, O our God, to be the unfailing Source of these, and all our other mercies, from day to day. We have nothing which we have not received; and we bless Thee that we are dependent upon Thee, and that all our need is supplied by Thee, according to Thy riches in glory, by Jesus Christ. We adore Thee that Thou hast made all our supplies sure to us, by Thy covenant with Thy Son, our faithful Surety, with whom Thou dost freely give us all things.

O Lord, let Thy Holy Spirit take away the bondage of our own spirit,—the self-seeking, so offensive and dishonouring to Thee. Thou hast the rightful claim to our love, to our submission, and our obedience. Oh, help us by Thy all-sufficient grace, to render unto Thee all Thou claimest,—to love Thee with all our heart, and with all our mind, and with all our soul, and with all our strength. Let us ever feel that loving Thee is our chief joy; and let us never doubt Thy love,—that love of which Thou hast given such proof in that

Thou hast not withheld from us Thy Son, but hast delivered Him up to the death for us all. Truly, Thy faithfulness hast Thou established in the very heavens. O Lord our God, we will praise Thee with all our heart; we will glorify Thy name for evermore, for great is Thy mercy toward us, and Thou hast delivered our souls from the lowest hell. In Thy name shall we rejoice all the day, and in Thy favour shall our horn be exalted. For the Lord is our defence, and the Holy One of Israel is our King.

O Lord, grant, that in loving Jesus, our love to one another may abound. May our hearts be knit together in love, that we may be helpful one to another, that we may grow up into Christ Jesus together, taking sweet counsel together, and walking in the fear of the Lord. Let us ever be tenderhearted and kind, forbearing one another in love; in all faithfulness and truth living together as becometh the gospel. Let us not bring shame or sorrow upon one another; and let not any be ashamed for our sakes, O Lord. Keep us from being moved away from the hope of the gospel. Let us be strengthened with might by Thy Spirit in the inner man, that Christ may dwell in our hearts by faith.

[O Lord our God, bless, we beseech Thee, the young of this family. Bless them with health and strength of body and of mind, that they may be fitted to serve Thee in the activities of life. Bless

to them parental love and care, that they may render a ready and loving obedience. May Thy grace purify their hearts, that they may be beautified with Thy salvation. Make them gentle of spirit, tender of conscience, loving and true. May they understand the fear of the Lord, and find the knowledge of God. Oh, keep them from the evil that is in the world; from the companionship of the ungodly; from all fellowship with the unfruitful works of darkness. Open up their way before them to safe and useful occupations in life; and enable them in their several callings, to exercise themselves to maintain consciences void of offence toward God and toward man.]

O Lord, lead as forth to the duties and engagements of this day in Thy fear. Enable us to do whatsoever we do as to the Lord, and not as unto men; and do Thou bless and prosper to ourselves and others the work of our hands. May the path of duty be plain to us. May our understanding and judgment be clear, that no perplexities may distract us, and that no snare may entangle us. Oh. let us not forget Thee in the occupations and intercourse of life this day. May we ever have the blessed confidence that Thou art near,—our help, our shield, light of our countenance, and our God. Keep us from all willful offence, from all unkind words, from all guile, and from all unjust deeds. And as we have opportunity, may we, as the children of our Father, do good unto all men,

especially to them who are of the household of faith.

Our heavenly Father, we commit ourselves with all our interests into Thy hands. Undertake for us. Glorify Thyself in us. May the Holy Spirit abide with us, and carry on His good work within us, that, walking in fellowship with Jesus, we may this day overcome the world, and grow in meetness for the inheritance of the saints in light.

And all we ask is for the sake of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ. And to the Father, and the Son, and the Holy Ghost, be all praise and glory for evermore. Amen.

MONDAY EVENING.

Correction our God, by Thy good hand upon us, we meet together at the close of another peaceful day. By Thy renewed kindness unto us, Thou hast put a new song into our mouth, even praise unto our God. We thank thee for our daily bread, for our safety and preservation, for strength for our daily labor, and for the measure of success which Thou hast granted to the works of our hands.

We bless Thee for all we have seen to-day of Thy works and ways; for everything which has reminded us of Thee, of Thy greatness and majesty, of Thy wisdom and power, of Thy grace and truth. We have been dependent upon Thee all the day; and, blessed be Thy name, we have not wanted any good thing. And Thou art crowning the day with Thy goodness, in granting us the quiet of the evening, the refreshing of the holy word, and the solemn exercise of prayer.

O Lord, Thou hast bestowed upon us many comforts; oh, that we were more thankful! But we have been more prone to repine at our privations and crosses, than to rejoice in our comforts. We have been impatient under trial, and have been tempted to envy the more prosperous condition of others. We have allowed the world to occupy an undue place in our desires, as if our life consisted in the abundance of the things which we possess. We have opened our minds to the entrance of covetousness, and have suffered ourselves to be fretted with cares, and anxieties, and troubles of this life. Alas! the most precious gifts and blessings in our possession have been lightly regarded, because of our sinful longing after things which Thou hast in Thy sovereign wisdom withheld. We have been oppressed with fears and apprehensions of the future. We have forgotten to look forward in the light of the promises, and we have mistrusted Thy We have looked so much to the faithfulness. things which are seen and temporal, as to mar our enjoyment of the things which are unseen and cternal.

O our Father, we would humble ourselves for these things. We have dishonored Thee, by seeking that satisfaction in the creature, which is only to be found in Thyself. Oh, forgive these our offences against Thee for Jesus' sake: create within us clean hearts, and let the spirit of offence be cast out. Teach us to submit ourselves to Thy chastenings, believing Thy love in them all. Thou hast given us Christ, and in Him eternal life. Oh, how can we think Thou wouldst withhold from us anything else if it were good for us! Lord, let us not choose for ourselves. Choose Thou for us in Thy wisdom and love, and let our hearts approve Thy choice. Be Thou our portion, our light, and our joy in Christ Jesus. Help us ever watchfully to cherish a meck and quiet spirit, ever looking unto Him who was meek and lowly of heart, that we may find rest unto our souls.

May Thy Holy Spirit ever abide within us, that He may keep us steadfast in faith, that we may not be moved away from the hope of the gospel which we have heard. May He ever show us more of the sufficiency and excellency of Christ our Saviour, that He may become evermore the satisfaction and joy of our hearts. We rest only upon Jesus for our acceptance with Thee, that we may be justified freely by Thy grace, through the redemption that is in Him. Oh, let us never be ashamed to confess Him before men. Let us not shun the reproach of Christ, nor fear to suffer shame for His name. Let us not prefer our own ease or wordly comfort, when he claims our service, and asks us to take

up any cross for His sake. Help us to cheer and encourage one another in every self-denying work for Him. Let none of our number hold back or turn aside; but let us all go hand in hand in our covenant of love, to be faithful witnesses for Him who hath given Himself for us. In the abounding of iniquity, let not our love wax cold. O Lord. quicken us after Thy loving-kindness, that we may keep the testimony of Thy mouth.

Heavenly Father, we commit ourselves to Thy kind and watchful care this night. Refresh us with rest and sleep, and let the light of a new morning shine upon us in peace. And to Thee shall be the praise and the glory for ever, through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

TUESDAY MORNING.

O LORD our God, we come to Thee this morning as children to a father, able and willing to help us. Do Thou enable us to come in an acceptable manner through Jesus Christ our Saviour, and teach us by Thy Spirit how we should pray to Thee aright.

We acknowledge that it is in Thee we live and move and have our being, and that we are indebted to Thee for every good thing. We thank Thee for the mercies of the past night; the quiet and peaceful rest we have enjoyed; the protection granted us from danger, accident, disease, and

death. We bless Thee for the favors of the morning, the light of another day, the health of our bodies, the renewed vigor and energy of our minds, the food of which we have partaken, and the riches

of domestic happiness.

We praise Thee for the numerous privileges, both temporal and spiritual, bestowed on us in this favored land, the civil liberty possessed by all classes, freedom to worship God according to our conscience, just and wise laws, able and upright rulers, abundance of peace enabling us to dwell undisturbed in quiet habitations, the benefits of education and knowledge; and, above all, the blessing of a pure gospel, that everlasting life is proclaimed to us in Thy word, and by Thy ministers, through faith in a crucified Saviour. Although we have many troubles, yet must we thankfully acknowledge that the lines have fallen to us in pleasant places, and we have a goodly heritage.

We are not worthy, O Lord, of the least of these mercies. We are sinful creatures, and our sins are very many and very great. We are by nature dead in trespasses and sins, and children of wrath as others. Instead of Thy favor we justly deserve Thy displeasure. But Thou art full of mercy: Thou dost not delight in the death of a sinner. Thou hast so loved us as to give Thine only-begotten Son, that whosoever believeth in Him might not perish. We praise Thee that He bore our sins and carried our sorrows; that He was wounded for our transgres-

sions, and bruised for our iniquities; and that He is able to save to the uttermost all that come to God by Him, seeing He ever liveth to make intercession for them. And now, O Lord, for His sake have mercy upon us. We pray for pardon because we need it so much; our iniquity is so very great. We trust we shall be forgiven through the merits of our Lord, and sprinkled with that blood that cleanseth from all sin.

Be pleased, also, O Lord, to sanctify us by Thy Spirit. We are corrupt as well as guilty. We are prone to do evil; when we would do good, evil is present with us. Oh, deliver us from this bondage of corruption. Purge us with hyssop, and we shall be clean; wash us and we shall be whiter than snow. Mortify our flesh, with its affections and lusts. And, specially, this day watch over us, and deliver us from temptation.

Lord, preserve us from covetousness, which is idolatry. May we lift our affections from things below, and set them on things above. May we count it more blessed to give than to receive. Give us our daily bread, and make us content with such things as we have. Set a watch before our mouths; keep the door of our lips. Incline not our heart to any evil thing, to practice wicked works with men that work iniquity. Preserve us from rioting and drunkenness, and being in any other way partakers of other men's sins. Keep us pure from slander, and malice, and fleshly lusts, that war against the

soul. May Satan this day in no way triumph over us; but, blessed Lord, make Thy grace sufficient for us, and perfect Thy strength in our weakness; so shall we be glad and rejoice before Thee all the day long.

All other things we stand in need of we humbly beg in the name of the Lord Jesus, to whom, with the Father and the Holy Spirit, we ascribe the kingdom, and the glory, for ever and ever. Amen.

TUESDAY EVENING.

OUR Father which art in heaven, at the close of another day we draw nigh to Thee in our evening family prayer. We desire to approach Thee with a true heart in full assurance of faith, having our hearts sprinkled from an evil conscience, and our bodies washed with pure water.

We have again to deplore our continued sinfulness. Notwithstanding frequent and repeated resolutions for good, we have often done this day, in thought, word, and deed, what we ought not to have done, and we have left undone what we ought to have done. We have not loved Thee with all our soul, and strength, and mind, nor have we loved our neighbor as ourselves. It is known to Thee only, O God, how far we have each one erred and strayed from Thy ways. How mereiful and long-suffering hast Thou been, not merely to spare our lives, but, notwithstanding our ingratitude and rebellion, to

crown us with loving-kindness and tender mercies, and to open Thine hand liberally to supply all our wants! Righteousness belongeth unto Thee, O Lord, but unto us confusion of face. Lay not, we beseech Thee, these sins to our charge, but, merciful Father, take them all away in the blood of the Lamb; and ere we lay down our heads on our pillows to-night, may we have a sweet sense of Thy favor, an assurance that our sins are really put away for ever, and that united to the Lord Jesus, our souls are saved with an everlasting salvation.

[Bless, we beseech Thee, our beloved children. Keep them in health of body; but, above all, may their souls prosper and be in health. Teach them to love the Saviour, who said, "Suffer little children to come unto Me." May they, from their earliest years, take Him to be their Master and Friend, and ever follow in His steps. Preserve them from the evil that is in the world. As they grow in years, may they grow in grace; and, finally, may they be Thine in that day when Thou makest up Thy jewels.]

[Bless those who help in this house. Teach us to deal justly towards them; and may they deal justly towards us. Let them not do their work with eyeservice, as men-pleasers; but as the servants of Christ, doing the will of God from the heart.]

Establish the work of our hands. May it prosper, as far as Thou seest it is for our good. Teach us in prosperity rightly to rejoice, and in adversity to

consider. Let us not be over-anxious about anything; but in every thing, by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving, help us to make our requests known to God. And may the peace of God that passeth all understanding keep our hearts and minds through Christ Jesus.

Bless our neighbors; promote among them and us a spirit of kindness and brotherly love. If any of them are at enmity with us, be pleased to remove that enmity. If we have done them wrong, enable us to confess it, and make restitution; if they have done us wrong, may we be ready to forgive, as God for Christ's sake has forgiven us.

Bless the Church universal, and all, in every place, that love the Lord Jesus in sincerity. May Thy ministers be men of earnestness and piety; Thine elders and other office-bearers, men that fear Thee and hate covetousness, filled with the Holy Ghost; and may Thy people shine as lights in the world, holding forth the world of life.

Remember in mercy our beloved country. Guide and bless the President, all judges, legislators and civil officers, that we may lead quiet and peaceable lives in all godliness and honesty. Restrain wicked and ungodly men among us. Put an end to drunkenness, Sabbath-breaking, swearing, and other vices, on account of which the land mourneth. Destroy superstition and ignorance; and may Thy word find an entrance into every family and every heart. Have pity upon the heathen world. Send forth

laborers unto this great harvest. And may the day soon come when all the kingdoms of the world shall become the kingdoms of our Lord and of His Christ.

When we wake, may our first thoughts be towards Thee, and may the clear light of Thy love in Christ Jesus be shining on our hearts.

O our gracious God, Thy tender mercies are over all Thy works. Thou art the God of all the families of the earth. Thou hast opened wide the stores of Thy wonderful mercy to sinners of mankind, and art calling them to come to Thy throne of grace and be filled from Thy fulness. We pray that Thou wilt bless others as well as ourselves. Bring our relations, our friends, our neighbors, yea, all persons in our country, and in the world, to know Thee,

and to rest in Thy love. Let Thy blessing come upon our President, his family, his counsellors, and all this Republic. Continue to us the blessing of peace at home, and give us safety abroad, and as much prosperity as is for Thy glory. And we beseech Thee to pity and relieve the sick and the suffering, the bereaved and the destitute, and those who are in any other trouble.

Lord, hear us when we thus call upon Thee, and accept us according to the riches of Thy glory, through our one Mediator and Advocate, Jesus Christ, Thy Son, and to Thee, in Him, shall be the praise for ever. Amen.

Keep us out of temptation by Thy adorable providence; or if we are exposed to it, may we find that God is faithful, and will not suffer us to be tempted above what we are able to bear.

Help us in every lawful undertaking, and prosper our labors. May we wisely and truly fill the place assigned to us; may we be blessed in it, and made a blessing. Help us to walk with God, and remember that we are pilgrims and strangers here. May we serve our day and generation by the will of God, and so, when we fall asleep in Jesus, may we be with the Lord. We beseech Thee to grant us these blessings for the sake of Christ our Saviour. Amen.

THURSDAY EVENING.

Bless the sick and afflicted: comfort and counsel them. Bless the widow and the orphan: protect and provide for them. Bless the dying, and ripen them for heavenly rest. Bless the ministers of Thy word, the missionaries of the Cross, and the teachers of the young, and the rulers of our own and other lands. Bless the President of the United States, the legislators and all the judges of the land. Bless all the people, and may they lead peaceable and quiet lives in all godliness and honesty. These and all other blessings we ask for Jesus' sake. Amen.

FRIDAY MORNING.

O ETERNAL, Almighty, and most gracious God, the Giver of every good and perfect gift, we

bless and thank Thee for Thy love, and that Thou hast kept us through the night, and refreshed us with sleep, that Thou hast sustained and awakened us, and brought us to the beginning of another day. May both master and servant remember that we serve a Master in heaven; that all service, the highest and the lowest, is alike to Thee; that in Thy household we are all members one of another. May children obey their parents in all things, and may no parents provoke their children to wrath. Bless our country and our President. Grant us wise and righteous laws. May our commerce and our polity manifest the fear of God and the love of His truth. May we be preserved from war, and may our rulers remember that we are all Thy stewards.

O God our Father, keep watch over us, and over our beloved kindred and our friends. Help them and help us to remember that we are pilgrims and strangers here; that Thy grace is sufficient for us; and that we walk not by sight, but by faith, and ever looking unto Jesus, in whose name we plead with Thee.

FRIDAY EVENING.

We are weak and helpless, and our trials and infirmities are many; but we look with all confidence to Thee, and pray that Thou wilt keep us in communion with Thee, that we may trust Thee, and love Thee as our Father.

We commit ourselves with all our house to Thy holy keeping, to lay us down in peace and sleep, for Thou only makest us to dwell safely. Watch over us, O God, in the night, and be Thou our light in its darkness, and take us under the shadow of Thy wings. Be merciful to the sick, comfort the sorrowful,

uphold the dying, and bestow Thy peace upon the bereaved. Deliver the anxious from the burden of care, and hear the cry of Thy children lifted up to Thee over all the earth. And when the night is gone, awake us, if it be Thy good and loving will; and if we wake not here, may we awake in Thy glory, and in the likeness of Jesus Christ, our Mediator and Redeemer. Amen.

SATURDAY MORNING.

Entering on the duties of another day, we commit us to Thy kind care. Preserve us, we pray Thee, from all dangers. Keep us in the hour of temptation. Give us grace diligently and faithfully to perform our duties, and to walk before Thee in holy fear, and with loving hearts, as Thy dear children.

We will now ascribe unto Thee, Father, Son, and Holy Ghost, all honor and glory for ever. Amen.

SATURDAY EVENING.

Comfort also the sorrowful and desolate. Save the dying. Make Thy way known upon earth, Thy saving health unto all generations. O God of the Sabbath, who only hearest prayer hear Thou us in these our requests; and what we fail to ask because of our ignorance, yet do Thou grant unto us according to the riches of Thy grace in Christ Jesus, our Redeemer. Amen.

Assured of our interest in Him, may we rise above the fear of death, and be delivered from the sin that doth most easily beset us, and run with perseverance the race that is set before us, looking unto Jesus as our pattern and our end. While in this world may the same mind be in us which was also in Christ.

O Lord our God, we are reminded this night that our life must soon come to an end. Teach us how to labor in Thy service, and let us have it said to us at last, Well done, good and faithful servants. We thank Thee that a rest remaineth for Thy people. Make us ready for its holy enjoyments. We praise Thee that Christ our Lord has been received into glory, and placed at Thy right hand. Let us feel that we too shall come, as members of His body, to the mansions He has prepared. Let us be enabled to walk as those who are risen with Christ. Set our affections on things above, where Christ sitteth at Thy right hand.

Gracious Father, we pray for those whom Thou hast joined unto us in bonds of nature or of Christtian love. Whatever good they have done us, or intended to do us, return Thou into their own bosom.

Enrich them with the gifts of Thy grace; and though they and we be separated on earth, let us, while we live, ever have a meeting-place at our Father's throne of grace; and may we be gathered together at last in Thy glorious presence to be forever with the Lord.

We are not worthy to approach Thec. We have no right to ask these blessings for ourselves or for others. But Jesus is worthy. We plead His finished work for us. We rely on Him for acceptance, and we shall give the glory to Father, Son, and Holy Ghost, one God for ever. Amen.

MONDAY MORNING.

Keep this, we beseech Thee, ever in the thoughts of our hearts, and let us live as becomes those who are looking to the Lord Jesus for eternal life. Thou, God, searchest the heart of each of us. Let no secret sin lurk within us to destroy our peace, and break out into open rebellion against Thee.

We pray Thee, O God the Lord, to bless our land with peace and true prosperity. Let there be employment and bread for the poor. Keep the rich from trusting in uncertain riches. Bless those who are in power and authority, and help them to rule in Thy fear. Pour out Thy Spirit on the churches, to revive them, and make us a blessing among the nations.

O God our Father, we join in offering these thanks and prayers to Thee in the holy name of Jesus, our only High Priest, to whom be glory for ever. Amen.

MONDAY EVENING.

Corrected Corrected Almighty, in whom we live, the Giver of every good gift, help us with one accord to come to Thee around our family altar. Let the rest of the night refresh us; and let us be strong in body and fixed in purpose on the morrow, to serve Thee more truly than we have done to-day. And as our days and nights are passing quickly away, grant that we may come nearer, everlasting Father, to Thee, in love, in childlike confidence, in knowledge and in holiness, being made meet by Thee for the inheritance of the saints in light.

Almighty Father, we have many relatives and friends whom we love and who love us. Hear their prayers for us. Hear us when we commend them unto Thee. Some of them have great trials: we beseech Thee, good Lord, to support them under them. Some of them have sore temptations: give grace to them and us to overcome through the strength of Christ Jesus. Grant unto each of them the saving knowledge of the Redeemer, that, trusting in Him, and walking in His ways, they may come with us, and with all the family that is named after Jesus, to Thy everlasting kingdom.

Lord God, there are many sick who shall wish through this night that it were morning. We pray Thee to be merciful to them in their sickness, to show them the Great Physician. Through Him do Thou heal all their diseases and forgive all their iniquities.

And many, O Lord, are in the night of ignorance

and sin. O merciful God, send forth Thy light unto them, and give them Thy salvation. Hear us, we earnestly beseech Thee, in these our petitions, and mercifully grant us an answer for the sake of our precious Saviour, Thy Son, to whom, with Thee and the Holy Ghost, one God, be the kingdom, power, and glory, for ever. Amen.

TUESDAY MORNING.

We pray for Thy blessing, O Lord, on our engagements for the day. Help us to satisfy every just expectation of Thy people. Let us be a blessing and not a curse. Oh, that we may feel that we are not our own, but that we are bought with a price, even the precious blood of Jesus.

Our Father, hear us when we thus call upon Thee, for Thy Son our Saviour's sake. Amen.

TUESDAY EVENING.

Gracious Father, we remember in our prayers those with whom we mingle in our daily life. Give them Thy good blessing. Show us how to do them good, for Christ's sake. Keep us from receiving evil from others. May the Lord Jesus be our example, and give us grace to commend His blessed service to all around us.

Bless, we beseech Thee, all our kindred, young and old, not only with the blessings of this life, but, above all, with the pardon of sin and the salvation that is in Christ. Lead the feet of the young in the way of peace. Keep the aged from the love of the world, and give them the hope that maketh not ashamed.

Bless, we beseech Thee, Thy people in these lands. Maintain the truth as it is in Jesus among us. Bless all Bible and tract societies, and all efforts for the salvation of souls. Bless the labors of ministers and Sunday-school teachers, for the sake of Christ Jesus.

Our Father which art in heaven, etc.

THURSDAY MORNING.

Create in every one of us a new heart—a heart that will believe in and love the Redeemer. Show to every one of us His fitness and His fulness, and make every one of us to rejoice in Him. Let all sorrows and trials endear Him to us the more. May we grow up into Him in all things, and do all our duties and bear all our trials in the strength He gives unto His people.

O God, our Lord, we cannot tell what Thou artpreparing for us this day. Our lives are in Thy hands. We are content that they should be in Thy holy keeping. Help us in all such duty and effort as Thou shalt call us to this day, and maintain in us, we pray Thee, a single eye to Thy glory. Grant us the discretion with which good men manage their affairs. Keep us from making mistakes. Oh, give us sound judgment, and hopeful spirits, that we may not grow weary in well-doing; and do Thou crown all our labors with Thy blessing.

Gracious Lord, who hast knit us together as the members of one family, help us to promote one another's good, to bear one another's burdens and to help one another. Provide for all our wants as a household. Let us not desire anything, our holy Father, of which we cannot tell Thee. Let us thus have happy fellowship with Thee, by Thy Spirit dwelling in us; and let us have true communion

with one another in Jesus Christ, our Lord and Redeemer. And unto Him that is able to keep us from falling, and to present us faultless before the presence of His glory with exceeding joy, to the only wise God our Saviour, be glory and majesty, dominion and power, both now and ever. Amen.

THURSDAY EVENING.

Thou hast set Him at Thy right hand. May each of us be of His body. Let not one of this family, O God, be lost. What should it profit us, O Lord, though we gained the world, and lost our souls? O save us, for Thy mercy's sake, in Christ Jesus; and let us be at last a whole family in heaven.

Another day has passed, O Lord; and we bless Thee at its close, and thank Thee for the peace, enjoyment, and power to labor it brought us. Whatever we have tried to do to Thee this day, O Lord, accept. And now we besecch Thee to take us under Thy divine care during the night. Let us remember, as we lie down, how soon the grave shall cover us; and let us be assured of our safety in Jesus Christ, that we may not fear death and the grave.

O Thou that hearest prayer, we thank Thee for the communion of saints, and that we are one with all them that in every place call upon Thee in Christ Jesus. We pray for all our brethren in Him—those whom we know, and those whom we shall only know in heaven. We especially beseech Thee to bless those with whom Thou hast united us on earth. Bless our own kindred, and let us have grace to help one another as one in Christ Jesus. Bless our pastor, and make him a blessing to all his flock. Give zeal and wisdom to all who bear office in the church of God. Enrich our fellow-worshippers with heavenly gifts, and revive true religion among us.

We pray for all Christians in sickness, that they may be healed and comforted, or carried safely through their last agony. We pray for all mourners, that they may be comforted of the Holy Ghost. We pray for all backsliders, that they may be recovered by Thy grace, and brought with us, and with all Thy true people, to heaven, through the merits of Jesus Christ, our only Lord and Saviour. Amen.

FRIDAY MORNING.

O THOU holy and eternal Father, whose creatures we are, and by whose gracious care we are preserved in being, help us once more to present to Thee our morning prayer. Not in our own name, but in the name of Jesus Christ, Thy well-beloved Son, do we come before Thy Throne of Grace. For His sake we beseech Thee to receive us gra-

With our hearts we thank Thee for our safe keeping and our refreshing sleep during the past night, and for the use of all our active powers this morning. We humbly look to Jesus, whom Thou hast set forth to be the propitiation for our sins, in whom believing, Thou hast assured us, the guilty obtain forgive-

Anxious as we are to be pardoned, we would be no less anxious for purification and cleansing.

Grant us all Thy grace to the discharge of the duties to which we are called this day. Make us diligent in business, fervent in spirit, serving the Lord. Whatever our hand findeth to do, may we do it with our might. Turn our hearts from that covetousness which is idolatry. In our intercourse with our fellow-men enable us to be meek, and forgiving, and kind, esteeming others better than ourselves. If at any time we are provoked by the selfishness of our neighbors, let us not yield to wrath or revenge, neither give place to the devil, but consider Him who endured such contradiction of sinners against Himself, lest we weary and faint in our minds. Under whatever ills we may be called to bear, let us possess our souls in patience, and endure as seeing Him who is invisible. If at any time we are in doubt what course to take, may our heart turn upward with the prayer "Lord, what wilt Thou have us to do?" Save us from the companionship of the wicked and from the counsel of the foolish. May we embrace every opportunity of doing good to the bodies and the souls of men, and abstain from whatever is fitted to give them pain or do them harm. And knowing that we cannot boast ourselves of the morrow, may the work assigned to this day be done in its season. Whensoever death shall overtake us, may it find us as faithful servants, waiting for the coming of our Lord.

We pray for all who are in affliction this morning. Consider their affliction and their pain, and forgive all their sins. When Thou hast tried them, may they come forth as gold. May Thy Holy Spirit so bring home to them the truths of the glorious Gospel, that their hearts, if hardened, may be broken into repentance, and, if broken, may be bound up and healed. Comfort the bereaved and the mourner. succor the poor and needy. In Thee let the widow and the fatherless find mercy. Prepare the diseased and dying for their great change. Show kindness and do good to Zion, Thine own hill. Make Thy church a praise in all the earth. Soon may all men know the joyful sound, and all nations whom Thou hast made come and worship before Thee, and glorify Thy name.

All we ask is in the name of Jesus Christ, our Lord and Redeemer. Amen.

FRIDAY EVENING.

O LORD, Thou art great, and doest wondrous things. Thou art God alone. Among the gods there is none like Thee, neither are there any works like unto Thy works. Thou doest all things according to Thy pleasure, and all that Thou doest is wise and good. Thy mercy is in the heavens, and Thy truth reacheth unto the clouds. Let not the needy be alway forgotten, nor the expectation of the poor perish for ever. Bring Thy sons from far, and Thy daughters from the ends of the earth. Oh, that the salvation of Israel were come out of Zion!

To thy watchful care, O God of our life, we commend us all through the silent hours of the night. Keep us all as the apple of Thine eye. Abiding in the secret place of the Most High, and lying down under the shadow of the Almighty, may ours be the sleep of Thy beloved. Thou who hast delivered us from the destruction that wasteth at noon-day, save us also, we beseech Thee, from the pestilence that walketh in darkness. May all whom we love be precious in

Thy sight, and wherever they are, Lord, let Thine angel encamp about them to defend from all ill. Have mercy on all who are racked with pain, and who will seek for rest but find none. Be kind to their frail and suffering bodies, and save their immortal souls. Be gracious to all those to whom this night is to be the last on earth. May they be in Christ as their Refuge and Saviour before they appear in His presence as their Judge.

If it please Thee, spare us to see the light of a new day, and raise us up strengthened both in body and mind for the duties of the morrow, to Thy glory and praise. But if it should be otherwise, may the angels who minister to the heirs of salvation, bear our souls home to the bosom of our Lord. As for us, may we behold Thy face in righteousness, may we be satisfied when we awake with Thy likeness. Whether we wake or sleep, we would make this our rejoicing, that Thou wilt show us the path of life, and that in Thy presence is fulness of joy, and at Thy right hand are pleasures for evermore.

Let these our prayers come before Thee as incense and the lifting up of our hands as the evening sacrifice, for Jesu's sake. Amen.

SATURDAY MORNING.

MERCIFUL and Blessed Father, whose preserving care has been over us through the past night, receive our thanks this morning. Give us

grace to offer the sacrifice of praise unto Thee. Help us as a family to cherish becoming gratitude to Thee for lives lengthened, for health spared, and for raiment, food, and shelter. We implore Thy blessing upon all men. Give patience to the poor, and enrich them with spiritual blessings. Succor all the distressed, and direct the ignorant into the way of peace. Lord, look in pity upon heathen lands. Pity those whose gods cannot hear and help them. Reveal Thyself unto them in Jesus Christ. Make Thy way known unto all men, and fill the earth with peace and righteousness. O God, our Father, hear us in these petitions, for the sake of Christ, our Redeemer. Amen.

SATURDAY EVENING.

Corp. Thou hast been the dwelling-place of Thy people through all generations. The poor have cried unto Thee, and have been delivered. Our fathers trusted in Thee, and were not put to shame. Do good in Thy good pleasure to all who do us good, or intend good unto us. Return their kindnesse sevnfold into their own bosoms. If any are enemies to us, help us to forgive them when we know it, and do Thou, Lord, forgive them and turn their hatred into goodwill, for all hearts are in Thy hand.

Heavenly Father, we have come now to the eve of the Sabbath. As we lay aside our daily toils, and take rest for our bodies, help us, Lord, also to lay aside all worldly cares, and all thoughts about our lawful business, that we may on the morrow worship and serve Thee with all our strength and all our minds. Make the day of rest a day of joy and gladness to us, and to all whom we love, and prepare us and them for the eternal Sabbath.

O Lord, who hast given the church and the ministry to us, be with Thy servant our minister, and with all true preachers of Christ's holy Gospel. Many of our fellow-sinners, O Lord, are in the midst of temptation. Lord, deliver them. Bless the societies that labor for the good of our race. Favor every society of this kind with which we are connected, either by giving or receiving, and make it the means of much and lasting good. Crown the efforts of every Christian worker with Thy blessing. O Lord, turn not away Thine ear from our prayer and intercession, and what we fail in asking, fail not Thou, good Lord, to grant, for Christ's sake. Amen.

SECOND FORTNIGHT.

SUNDAY MORNING.

ALMIGHTY God, the God of the Spirits of all flesh, in whom we live, and move, and have our being; who hast preserved us all our life long, and brought us to the beginning of this day in safety: we come into Thy presence, trusting to the multitude of Thy mercies, through the merits and mediation of Jesus, Thy beloved Son.

O our God! we acknowledge that we are unworthy even to speak unto Thee. We have provoked Thee to anger by our sins. We have grievously departed from Thee. We have neglected Thy word, rejected the Gospel of Thy Son, and profaned Thy holy Sabbaths. Yet now, O Lord, for the sake of Jesus, look upon us with compassion; and as Thou hast granted us the privilege of another Sabbath, grant us Thy Holy Spirit, that we may worship Thee, this day, in Spirit and in truth.

We grieve to think how often we have offered to Thee the sacrifice of fools, and drawn near to Thee with our lips, while our hearts were far from Thee. Teach us how to pray, we beseech Thee. O our Father, fulfil Thy promise, and give to us Thy Holy Spirit. Put life and energy into all the services of this day; that we may enjoy Thy presence, in all we do, or hear, or say. Meet us in Thy house of prayer; and so bless us, and sanctify to us every means of grace, that this day may be to us an earnest of the rest that remaineth for the people of God.

Accept our grateful thanks, O Lord, for unnumbered mercies which we have received—for health, while many are suffering from sickness—for food and raiment, while others are in need of both. But above all, would we bless and praise Thee, for the gift of Thy beloved Son, Jesus. Oh, that we may this day learn to love Him more. May the preaching of His Gospel be accompanied by the power of the Holy Ghost to our hearts, revealing Him to us, and showing us more of His loveliness and beauty, than we ever discovered before. Lord, we would see Jesus; we would feed on Jesus; we would enjoy the blessedness of spiritual union with Him, our risen Head.

We plead with Thee, O Lord, for those to whom Thou hast committed the ministry of Thy word, and who shall stand up in thy name this day, to preach the Gospel of Thy grace. Do Thou break the bread of life, and bless it, and give it in their hands, that they may deal it out to those precious souls over whom Thou hast placed them. Enable them to trust

Especially bless him to whom we this day look for instruction; and grant that a word in season may be conveyed to our souls, to quicken us to increased devotedness, and to higher enjoyment of the things of God. Open the treasury of Thy grace, O Lord, and satisfy us with Thy fulness. So remove every cloud of ignorance and unbelief, that we may see Thee in the fulness of Thy glory; and so delight ourselves in Thee, that every thing on earth may lose its glory, by reason of the glory that excelleth. So shall this Sabbath be to us a blessed foretaste of the joys to come.

In the name of Jesus we ask these blessings. For His sake give more than we desire or deserve. And to Him, with Thyself, and the eternal Spirit, be all honor and glory, for ever. Amen.

SUNDAY EVENING.

O EVER blessed Lord, who hast revealed Thyself in Jesus as a merciful God, able and willing to save them to the uttermost that come unto Thee by Him, we now draw near in His name.

We acknowledge and bewail our manifold sins and wickedness which we, from time to time, have committed, by thought, word, and deed, against Thy divine majesty, provoking most justly Thy wrath and indignation against us. We do earnestly repent, and are heartily sorry for these our misdoings. We

grieve that we have not loved Thee with all our heart, with all our mind, with all our soul, and with all our strength. Our worship of Thee has been marked by infirmity; and imperfection has appeared in our holiest acts of devotion. We betake ourselves to Jesus. We come to the cleansing fountain of His blood, to be washed from the defilement of the day. We come to lay hold upon His strength, renouncing all self-dependence; and, in the full conviction of our utter unworthiness, to receive that blessing from Thee, which, for His worthiness, Thou wilt bestow. Our Father, hear us. We would rejoice that the whole burden of our sin has been laid upon Jesus, who was made sin for us. We would now receive the blessing, which by His Gospel has been made known to us this day, that Jesus being our Advocate—Jesus our Mediator— Jesus our atoning Priest—our conscience may be eased of the burden of sin; so that we may lie down in peace, and in the assured hope, that if death should visit us before the morning's light, we should be found accepted in Jesus.

We beseech of Thee, O blessed Lord, to pour upon us of the Holy Spirit, to give effect to Thy word which we have this day heard. The seed has been sown in our hearts; but in vain shall we have received it, unless Thou follow it with Thy blessing. Do thou command the clouds that they so rain upon us, that our hard hearts may be softened; that the seed sowed may be nourished; and that an abundant increase be produced. Thou hast said, "Whoso-ever will, let him take of the water of life freely." Give it us, we pray Thee, for the sake of Jesus; that so Thy glory may be revealed to us, and our hearts may rejoice in the possession of Thy love. For Thee we wish to live; in Thee we wish to die; keep us ever near unto Thee, and allow us to walk in the light of Thy countenance. O precious Saviour, our risen and exalted Head, take us into more close and happy union with Thyself, and nourish our souls with thy Spirit from day to day.

And, O Lord, we would remember before Thee those who have been engaged this day in the ministry, or teaching of Thy holy word. Strengthen them with the food which they have prepared for others; and enable them to exhibit an example of those precepts, which they have labored to teach. Pardon those who have run, unsent, into the shepherd's office, and have taken on them to preach a Saviour, of whom they are ignorant. O Lord, awaken them; O Lord, convert them; and rescue Thy people from the curse of an unfaithful ministry.

And now, Lord, we commend ourselves to Thy care and keeping. Watch over us during the night. Preserve us from all dangers both of body and soul. Refresh our weary bodies with needful rest: and if a new day be added to our lives, enable us to show that we have not been forgetful hearers of Thy word, but, by Thy blessing, may we be doers of it.

Hear us, for the sake of Him, through whom alone

we can expect an answer to our prayers, or acceptance of our thanksgivings—the Lord Jesus Christ; to whom, with Thee and the Holy Ghost, be ascribed, as is most due, everlasting praise. Amen.

MONDAY MORNING.

BLESSED Lord, who hast renewed Thy mercies to us this morning, and hast raised us up to see the light of another day, unto Thee do we lift up our souls in prayer, while we bow ourselves before Thy throne of grace. Adored be Thy mercy which has provided a way of acceptance for us, miserable sinners, through Jesus, the Son of Thy love. Adored be that goodness which allows us to come to Thee, with boldness, and to enter into the holiest by the blood of Jesus. Through Him we come—through Him we pray; for His sake, hear and answer us.

O our God, we are ashamed, and blush to lift up our faces before Thee, for our iniquities have increased over our heads, and our trespass has grown up into the heavens. We are ungrateful children—rebellious children; and Thou art a longsuffering and most merciful Father. But, O Lord, we desire not to persist in ingratitude, or rebellion. We hate ourselves on account of them; but we are so tied and bound with the chain of our sins, that we cannot follow Thee as we desire. We therefore come to Thee this morning, pleading Thy promise, through

Jesus, that Thou wilt give the Holy Spirit to them that ask. Lord, we ask it. With all our heart and soul we ask it; for it is only as Thou dost endue us with power from on high, that we shall be enabled to resist the temptations of the world, the flesh, and the devil. We have labored in our own strength to conquer sin, and have failed. Our flesh cleaveth upon the earth. Though bound to Thee by every tie of gratitude, yet our affections will not dwell upon Thee. Though once warm in Thy service, we again grow cold and forsake Thee. O our Father-our loving Father—our compassionate Father,—have pity upon Thy poor weak children, who are struggling to love and serve Thee, in the midst of a world of sin and iniquity. We earnestly desire to overcome sin, yet have no power to do so. But we bless and praise Thee, that Thou hast made provision for our wants, and that Thou hast promised that Thy strength shall be made perfect in our weakness. Lord, endue us with the Holy Spirit, for all the purposes of holiness, and growth in grace, and subduing of the flesh, and mortifying carnal desires, and enjoyment of spiritual things, that we may abound in the work and enjoyment of the Lord.

We are now entering upon the new week, O Lord, and we desire to be more devoted to Thee—to come out from the world and to be separate—to war against every thing that may rob us of our peace, or provoke Thee to withdraw from us the light of Thy countenance. We wish to live to Thy

glory, and to walk with thee all the day long. But who is sufficient for these things? Lord, we are not, but Thy Spirit can enable us. Give us, then, the Holy Ghost in all the power which we are entitled to ask for, and which Thou seest right to bestow. Make us holy. Stamp thine image upon our hearts; and enable us to manifest the life of godliness. We bless Thee for any enjoyment we have had in spiritual things. We praise Thee even for the desire to serve Thee; and we be eech of Thee to strengthen us to follow, what Thou hast taught us to love.

But, O Lord, if there be any amongst us who are yet strangers to these precious truths; who are yet living in the indulgence of sin; for Jesus' sake have mercy upon them. Open their eyes to see their danger. Open their eyes to see the sacrifice for sin, in the blood of Jesus, and the remedy for the love of sin, in the regenerating and sanctifying power of the Holy Ghost,

From all the temptations to which we may this day be exposed, good Lord preserve us. Keep us humble; distrustful of ourselves, but confident of strength in Thee. Let us not run into forbidden ways, nor expect protection but in the path of duty. Grant these our petitions, O Lord, for the sake of Jesus Christ. Amen.

MONDAY EVENING.

WE come before Thee this Evening, O gracious Lord, under a consciousness of our sinfulness, and of thine exceeding holiness. Thou art the Holy One. Thou canst not bear iniquity. To the cleansing fountain of the Saviour's blood do we come. We would there wash, and be clean; and upon the altar of His merits, present this, our evening sacrifice of prayer and praise.

Thy goodness has spared us through another day. We come to Thee to render an account of our stewardship, and to tell Thee how we have this day been engaged in Thy service. Lord, Thou knowest all before we speak; yet would we tell Thee: we would conceal nothing—deny nothing. We are verily guilty before Thee. Our own consciences accuse us of having left undone what we might have done, and having done what we should not have done. Lord, we cry unto Thee for the Holy Spirit, that we may be kept close to Thee, and that we may have that continued spiritual mind which is joy and peace. May the Spirit be in us as a well of water, springing up into everlasting life, enriching us with the knowledge and love of Jesus; and taking of His glory, and showing it unto us. All our happiness, O blessed Jesus, is gone, if thou dost hide Thyself; and without the light of the Spirit we cannot see thee. We wish to see Thee—to live upon Thee—to feed upon Thee. Oh, may Thy love be shed

abroad in our hearts by the Holy Ghost, that our love to Thee may be perfect, engaging our best affections, and employing all our powers of mind and body in Thy service. Thou didst love us, when we cared not for Thee; yea, when by wicked works we were Thine enemies. Oh, break Thou these hard and flinty hearts, which refuse to melt at the remembrance of Thy love; and so take possession of us, that every thought, and word, and action, may be brought into captivity to Thine obedience.

Remove from us all envying, and strife, and divisions, and whatever belongs to that carnal mind, which is enmity against Thee; and grant that the fruit of the Spirit may abound in us to Thy glory, and to our great joy. Make us humble, lowly in our own eyes, esteeming others better than ourselves. Enable us to adorn the doctrine of God our Saviour in all things. Strengthen the faith of those amongst us to whom thou hast already bestowed it; and give it, for the sake of the Lord Jesus, to those who have it not. Oh, let none of us be deceived concerning our souls' salvation; nor allow us to hope well of ourselves, while that hope is not founded upon the sacrifice of Jesus. Show us our real state and character. Take away every false prop upon which we have leaned, and establish us upon Jesus, the rock of ages—the unfailing foundation of the sinner's hope.

We praise thee, O Lord, for unnumbered mercies, of which we are utterly unworthy. We praise thee,

if we have at all been enabled to live to Thy glory this day,—to resist temptation—to conquer sin—to confess Thee before the ungodly—and to warn sinners of the wrath to come. We bless Thee that thou hast not given us over to a reprobate mind, nor taken us away in the midst of our iniquities. Oh, that as we ought we may now praise Thee, and that all that is within us may bless Thy holy name.

Unto Thy care we now commend ourselves this night. We will lay us down in peace, if Thou speak peace to us through Jesus. May our last thoughts be of Thee; and when we wake, may Thy Spirit bring heavenly things to our mind. Pardon the imperfections of our prayers; supply what we have omitted to ask for, and do all for the sake of Jesus. Amen.

TUESDAY MORNING.

MOST blessed Lord, who delightest in showing mercy to those who honor Thy beloved Son; we, renouncing all self-dependence, and trusting to that complete atonement which He has made upon the cross, come into Thy presence this morning.

We humble ourselves before Thee on account of our sins. Goodness and mercy have followed us all the days of our lives. Thou hast commended Thy love to us, in that Thou hast given Thy Son for our sins; and yet we have requited Thy goodness and Thy love by ingratitude and rebellion. O Lord, we

hate ourselves on account of sin. We long to be delivered from it. We wish for that holiness which is happiness. We feel our utter inability to conquer a single sin. We therefore cry unto Thee, our Father. We knock at Thy door this morning, and implore of Thee to come forth, and to give us a Father's blessing. We do not ask for riches—for honors—for the good things of this world. But we pray of Thee to give us the mighty power of the Holy Spirit, to resist the temptation of the world, the flesh and the devil. Baptize us with the Holy Ghost. Condemn sin in our members; and as those members have too long been employed as instruments of unrighteousness, may they now, and ever, and unceasingly, be employed in Thy happy service. We desire, O Lord, that no darling sin be retained; but enable us, by the Spirit, with unsparing severity to erucify every unholy affection and lust.

We pray for the mind that was in Christ Jesus; and to that end, give us the Spirit that was in Jesus. Lord, confirm and strengthen in us whatever Thou thyself hast planted; and root out of us all things that offend against the holiness that becomes Thy faithful followers.

And, O Lord, look in mercy upon any now kneeling before Thee, who are yet unconverted by the Spirit of Christ—who love the world in preference to Jesus, and who follow its ways instead of the ways of holiness. Show them their danger, we beseech Thee, and show them their loss. Convince

them that they are in the road that leads to the ruin of their souls. Give them Thy Spirit to display before them the love and beauty of Jesus; that their affections may be withdrawn from unworthy objects, and centred upon Him. O adorable Redeemer, so manifest thy love to each of us, that we may esteem Thee the chief among ten thousand, and altogether lovely; and so be filled by Thy love, that our hearts and thoughts may dwell upon Thee all the day long.

And while we pray to Thee for those things which we stand in need of, we would praise Thee for what we have already received. Praise be to Thee for the blessings of the past night; that we laid us down to sleep, and were raised in safety. Praise be to Thee if we begin this day with any increased desire to live to Thy glory. Oh, if we have this not, give it us before we rise from our knees. Praise be to Thee for health, for food, for raiment. But above all, praise be to Thee for the unspeakable gift of Thy beloved Son, Jesus.

And now, Lord, we pray Thee to watch over us while we pass through the world this day. Lead us not into temptation—deliver us if tempted. Enable us to glorify Thee in our several callings in life. Let nothing so occupy us, as to drive Thee for a moment from our minds; but be Thou ever present, to regulate our tempers, our affections, and our pursuits. Hear these our prayers, O Lord, and when Thou dost hear, forgive. Pardon the imperfection of our solemn services, and accept us and them, for

the sake of Him in whom Thou art well pleased, the Lord Jesus Christ. Amen.

TUESDAY EVENING.

GOD, who, though Thou dwellest in the highest heavens, hast respect unto those who pray to Thee on earth in the name of Thy dear Son, Jesus, let Thine ear be attentive to the prayer which, in His name, we now offer unto Thee.

We come under a deep sense of our utter unworthiness of the least of Thy mercies. We are not worthy to gather up the crumbs that fall from Thy table; and yet dost Thou allow us to ask for the portion of children. Thou art very merciful, O Lord; Thy love in Christ is unsearchable. Yet give us the Spirit, that we may know more of that love. Though it be a love that passeth our full understanding, teach us to understand it more perfeetly. The Spirit searcheth all things, yea, the deep things that are revealed in Thy word. Give us the Spirit, we implore Thee, for Christ's sake; and may we, by it, be led to the understanding and enjoyment of all that Thou hast revealed. O give us the Spirit, to lead us into all Thy truth. We lay aside our own wisdom; we yield ourselves to Thee; and pray of Thee to teach us all that Thou wouldst have us to know.

Nor less do we pray to Thee, O Lord, for the spirit of holiness. Thou seest how much of world-

liness still cleaves to us-how our unholy desires seek to be gratified. We pray for strength against these our enemies. That the flesh may be subdued, we pray for the Spirit to resist it—to crucify it. We pray that, as Thou hast saved us from the punishment of sin, Thou wilt grant us the Spirit, that we may be wholly freed from the power of sin. We would realize more of the joy of heaven while we walk on earth—that joy which follows the conquest of sin. O our Father, we hate ourselves on account of sin-we grieve that our hearts should wander from Thee for a single moment. Take possession of us—occupy us—subdue us to the obedience of faith. Be Thou in us the conqueror of sin, the promoter of holiness. Purify us from the defilement that belongs to the flesh, and sanctify us by the indwelling of the Holy Ghost.

We are conscious that much imperfection has marked our service this day, and that we might have done more for Thy glory had we been stronger in the faith, and more impressed with a sense of Thy love. Oh, shed abroad that love in our hearts by the Holy Ghost, we beseech thee, that we may ever walk under the abiding influence and constraining power of the love of Jesus. Teach us not only to feel, but to act like those who are no longer their own, but are bought with a price—even with the price of the Saviour's blood.

But, O gracious Lord, we would not only pray to Thee for what we need, we would also praise Thee for what we have received. We praise Thee for having spared us from merited condemnation. We praise Thee that thou didst not give us over to a reprobate mind. We praise Thee that thou hast plucked us as brands from the burning. We praise Thee for whatever of sin we have been empowered to conquer. Praise be to Thee for the unspeakable gift of Thy Son Jesus, through whom all blessings flow to us. Oh that, as we ought, we may praise Thee now on earth more perfectly, and sing to the praise of Thy redceming love in the courts of Thy heavenly glory.

And do Thou, O Lord, the God of grace, who hast called us into thine eternal glory by Christ Jesus, after that we have suffered a while make us perfect, stablish, strengthen, settle us. Do Thou, the very God of peace, sanctify us wholly; and may our whole spirits, and souls, and bodies be preserved blameless unto the coming of the Lord Jesus Christ. To Him, with Thyself, and the Holy Ghost, be all honor and glory, for ever. Amen.

WEDNESDAY MORNING.

HOLY Lord God of Hosts! thou author of our being; thou Lord of heaven and earth! How could we have dared to speak to Thee, or to raise our eyes to the place where Thine honor dwelleth, hadst thou not opened a way of access through the Lord Jesus Christ! He is our only Saviour. Lord,

we disclaim all others, and cling to His cross as the only refuge of our guilty souls.

We grieve to think of our base ingratitude toward Thee, who art so worthy of the best of our hearts' affections. We are pained to think what trifles draw our hearts from Thee, and how they are prone to settle upon earthly things. O God, for Thy mercy's sake, give us the victory over ourselves. We acknowledge that we are insufficient, of ourselves, to control the passions of our minds. We ask deliverance from self. O our Father, hear us, and send the Holy Ghost into our hearts, to reign and rule over every thought within. We wish to be brought under the power of the Spirit. We long for the conquest of sin, for the subduing of self to the service of Jesus; and that the leaven of the Spirit may work itself into all we think, or do, or say. We wish that the life which we now live may be by the faith of the Son of God, who loved us, and gave Himself for us. We wish to have sin and the flesh crucified. We would not spare the most beloved earthly object that interferes with our devotedness to Thee. Lord, we desire to be wholly Thine. Take from us what Thou wilt, so that Thy love be left to us. Oh, hide not the light of Thy blessed countenance, our Father, and we shall be happy, though stripped of every earthly possession.—Whom have we in heaven to plead for us, but Thee, O adorable Jesus? Whom, then, upon earth should we desire in comparison of Thee?

Other lords have dominion over us; but from henceforth thou shalt be our ALL-IN-ALL. We make not this promise, O Lord, trusting to our own strength, for we have had painful experience of our helplessness. But we make it in reliance upon Thy promise, that thou wilt give the Holy Spirit to them that ask it; that Spirit which is able to keep the lamp of love alive. Dispel every cloud of unbelief, and warm our hearts with the beams of Thy love. Knit our hearts to Thee in a bond that no earthly power can sever, so that we may each be enabled to say—"To me to live is Christ—to die is gain."

We beseech Thee also, our Heavenly Father, for our country, that its rulers may be guided and governed by Thee, and that they who frame our laws may be directed from above. Make our judges a terror to evil doers, and restrain iniquity in our land. Establish Thy fear in the hearts of our fellow-citizens that they may be gathered with us finally into Thine everlasting kingdom through Jesus Christ.

And, O blessed Jesus, who art dishonored by the works of Thine own hands, and despised by a world which Thou hast made, teach us so to love Thee as to love the time of Thine appearing, and to pray, with all our hearts, that Thy kingdom may come, when Thy will shall be done on earth as it is in heaven; when Thou shalt bind the enemy, and rule the world in righteousness. From the power of

the enemy of our souls, do Thou this day deliver us, and enable us to maintain an unceasing conflict with whatever opposes our spiritual growth and enjoyment.

Now, unto Him that is able to keep us from falling, to the only wise God our Saviour, with the Father and the Holy Ghost, be glory, majesty, dominion, and power, both now and for ever. Amen.

WEDNESDAY EVENING.

Thro Thee do we lift up our hearts, O Thou that dwellest in the heavens. In Thy great mercy hear us; and answer the prayers and accept the praises which we present unto Thee, in the name of Jesus.

O Lord, teach us how to pray. Solemnize our hearts. Enable us to withdraw our minds from worldly thoughts, and to worship Thee with spiritual minds. Forever blessed be Thy name, for the privilege of praying to Thee—of telling Thee all our wants, and griefs, and sadness; and for the assurance, that, for the worthiness of Jesus, Thou dost bestow upon us Thy heavenly blessings. We have much to grieve over, O Lord. Our coldness, and deadness, and slothfulness in Thy service, cause us grief and pain. We would love Thee more, and serve Thee better; but our hearts are still too fond of earthly things; and often have we to draw ourselves into Thy presence, when we should run with

the fullness of delight. For the sake of Thy dear Son, grant us more of the Spirit. Nourish the life which Thou hast given us. Keep up the power of religion in our souls. Lead us to enlarged views of the Redeemer's glory, and deeper views of the evil of our hearts. Show us more of the evil of sin, and the beauty of holiness. Strengthen us by the Spirit, to imitate the example of Jesus; and give us the mind that dwelt in Him.

We ask for great things, O our Father; but Thou hast encouraged us so to do; Thou lovest to bless Thy poor weak ones, who cry unto Thee, and who, mourning their deficiency, look to Thee for strength. Blessed Jesus, Thou art our strength. Be Thou strong in us. And may Thy Spirit be powerful in us this day. We have much to contend with,—the world, with all its seducing pomp and vanity—the flesh, with all its unholy desires—the devil, with all his art and power, are leagued against us. But give us the Spirit, O our God, and we shall be strengthened to resist.

Increase Thy gifts to all who know Thee, O Lord. Make Thy Church a glory in the earth. Call many more to be faithful preachers of Thy holy word. Teach those who minister in holy things to be less of this world, and more ensamples of holiness, and of deadness to the things of this passing life. Reveal by the Spirit the neglected truths that lead to personal holiness. Enable us to cease from man, and to follow the unerring rule of Thy word of truth.

For Thy care of us during the past day, we give Thee thanks, O Lord. Take us, and all whom we desire to remember in prayer before Thee, under Thy watchful providence this night. Preserve us through the remaining part of the day of life; and may we be blessed by Thee, to rejoice at the close of this day in the prospect of endless glory through Jesus. To Him, to Thyself, O heavenly Father, and to the Holy Ghost, be endless praise ascribed. Amen.

THURSDAY MORNING.

O THOU whose name is Jehovah—the self-existent God, whose creatures we are, we live upon Thy bounty; it is our duty to acknowledge our dependence on Thee, and worship at Thy footstool from day to day. We praise Thee that Thou hast permitted us to do so this morning; that Thou hast even provided a way of access to Thyself, through the Lord Jesus Christ; and that, by Him, we can not only come with acceptance, but with the expectation of being supplied, from Thy bounty, with whatever is needful for time and for eternity.

We know not, O Lord, what is for our good. We dare not, therefore, ask for any thing temporal, beyond the mere necessaries of life. Give us food and raiment, and make us therewith content. We beseech of Thee to bless us with plenty from Thy

spiritual store. Give us a deep sense of our own unworthiness. Show us more of the corruption of our own evil hearts, that we may trust them less, and cling to Thee the closer for strength to resist their unholy propensities. We confide in the blood of Jesus for the pardon of all that is past; and we implore the Holy Spirit, to shed abroad the love of Jesus in our hearts. Give to us then, the Holv Spirit, to make known that love to our souls—to make us holy—to make us faithful, zealous, and devoted witnesses for Jesus, in the midst of an ungodly world. O Lord, we wish to manifest in our lives the power of godliness; to be living epistles, read and known of all men; to exhibit the Spirit's work in subduing our flesh. Make us, Thy members, a temple of the Holy Ghost; and may our lives proclaim that God is in us of a truth.

Lord, we pray for greater light and enjoyment in the reading of Thy holy word. We wish to feed upon its precious truths—to love it as the record of our Father's will—to prefer it to every other study. May we find it profitable for doctrine, reproof, correction, instruction in righteousness; and may we, by it, be thoroughly furnished unto all good works. Grant, Lord, that we may not be carried about with every wind of doctrine, tossed to and fro in doubt and danger. But may the Spirit lead us to a sound interpretation of Thy holy word; so that we may grow up into Christ in all things, being nourished by the sincere milk of the word.

Enable us to walk in wisdom toward them that are without—to show all forbearance in all things—to reprove sin in the spirit of love—and to manifest, that while we hate the sin, we are moved by kindness towards those whom we are called to rebuke. Teach us, also, to correct those faults in ourselves which we discover in others.

Look in pity, we pray Thee, upon our native land. Heal all divisions and distractions; and pour the oil of the Spirit upon its troubled waters. May that righteousness which exalteth a nation be ours; and put away from us that sin which is a reproach to any people. Have mercy upon those its inhabitants who are sitting in darkness, and in the shadow of death. Raise up faithful men to declare to them the Gospel of Thy grace. Open a door for the effectual preaching of Thy holy word; and bless those that read it by the power of the Spirit; so that Thy truth may be known amongst men, Thy saving health to all this nation.

Accept our thanks for the blessings of the past night; for peace, protection, and health. Keep us this day in Thy faith and fear. May we walk as in Thy presence, assured that there is not a thought in our hearts but Thou knowest it altogether; and may we do all things to Thy glory.

May the very God of peace sanctify us wholly; and we pray that our whole spirits, souls, and bodies, may be preserved blameless, unto the day of the glorious appearing of the Lord Jesus Christ. May

we then appear with Him in glory. We ask all for the same Saviour's sake. Amen.

THURSDAY EVENING.

FATHER of all mercies, who hast watched over us during this day, and brought us to the close of it in safety; before we lay ourselves down to take our rest, we would commend our bodies and souls to Thy careful keeping.

Blessed Jesus, through Thee we now come to the throne of grace; and through Thee we look to be cleansed from the defilement which we have contracted in our walk through the world this day. Blot out as a cloud our transgressions, and as a thick cloud our sins; for we return unto Thee, because Thou hast redeemed us.

Enter not into judgment with Thy servants, O Lord, for in Thy sight shall no flesh living be justified. We do not say that we have no sin, for then should we deceive ourselves: but we confess our sin, and believe that Thou art faithful and just to forgive it us. Do so, precious Saviour, we beseech Thee, and remove from us the guilt of all that our consciences, this night, accuse us of.

But we would not only praise Thee for deliverance from the punishment of sin; we most earnestly pray to be delivered from its power. The law of sin that is in our members, is our misery. When we would do good, evil has been present with us;

and the evil that we would not, that we have too often done. We therefore come to Thee, this night, as well for the pardon of the sins of the day, as for strength for the future. If another day be added to our lives, show Thy power in enabling us to crucify sin. Send the Holy Ghost into our hearts, that we may be sanctified, body, soul, and spirit. Grant that all carnal affections may die in us; and that all things, belonging to the Spirit, may live and grow in us; and being fed by the manna of Thy word, and the water of the Spirit, may grow daily in grace, and in the knowledge and love of the Lord Jesus.

But Thou, Lord, who searchest all hearts, canst alone tell whether we all thus hate sin, and thirst for holiness. Oh, if there be any present, who use these words without feeling them; who join in an expression of hatred to sin, yet love it in their hearts, and cannot bear to part with it, in mercy visit them with Thy salvation. Create within them clean hearts, O Lord, and renew right spirits within them. Convince them that the wages of sin is death; and make known to them that eternal life, which is the gift of God, through Jesus. Oh, give us all one heart, and one mind, and one spirit, that none, now kneeling before Thee, may be wanting amongst the number of Thy people: but that our names may be written in the Lamb's book of life.

Bless us, O Lord, in our several stations. Bless those who rule—bless those who serve. May we,

in our respective callings, adorn the doctrine of God our Saviour, in all things; and while we support the name of Christian, may we not contradict it, by the practice of what is hateful to Christ.

Lord, we would be wholly Thine. We yield ourselves as clay into the hands of the potter. Make us holy vessels, meet for our master's use; and fill us with the Spirit, in all such power, as Thou seest it right we should possess. Come, Holy Spirit, come! Purify us—illuminate us—sanctify us—seal us—that we may perfect holiness in the fear of the Lord.

To the Father, the Son, and the Holy Ghost, be now ascribed all praise, majesty, and dominion, for ever. Amen.

FRIDAY MORNING.

A LMIGHTY GOD, who hast commended Thy love to us, in that, whilst we were yet sinners, Thou didst give Thy Son to die upon the cross for us all; be Thou mercifully pleased to show us the light of Thy countenance, and bless us, and comfort us, while we now draw near to worship Thee. We come through Jesus. We trust alone to the atoning blood of Jesus. We acknowledge no other Mediator but Jesus. All our dependence is in Him for time and eternity.

Thou art greatly to be praised, O Lord, for the love Thou hast shown to us guilty sinners. We

We desire that whatever others do we may serve the Lord. We therefore pray of Thee, O blessed Lord Jesus, who hast received the Spirit for the Church, to grant it us in all the power and measure that Thou seest we require. We pray Thee to cleanse this tabernacle of flesh by the Spirit. Mortify our carnal desires; lead us to the higher enjoyment of the spiritual things; increase our love to Thee. For this we need, we ask, the Spirit; and may we be raised above the world, to live in happy, peaceful waiting for Thy coming. Maintain

this happy frame in those to whom Thou hast given it, and bestow it upon those who have it not. Cut Thou those ties that bind our souls to earth. Enable us to walk through this world as Jesus did—as strangers in a barren land. Oh, we grieve to feel how much our hearts still cling to the things of earth. Strengthen us for the time that remains; and enable us to rejoice in the hope of the glory of God. Fill us with the Spirit, that the love of Christ may constrain us to speak thereof, one with the other; and to go forth, and tell to those who are in darkness what a precious Saviour we have found.

We thank Thee, O Lord, for the rest, protection, and preservation of the night past. We thank Thee that we have had whereon to lay our heads, while others were in want and wretchedness. Give us hearts to feel for their miseries, and to relieve them. Be thou near to us all the day long, and let not our hearts wander from Thee. Let Thy word be the rule of our lives, Thy Son our holy example, and Thy Spirit our heavenly teacher. Let thy glory be our aim in whatever we do or say; and teach us so to value the joy of Thy countenance, as to make any sacrifice rather than lose it for a moment. Oh, shine upon us, our gracious Lord, at this time; shine, and the clouds of unbelief shall be scattered. May each member of this family, being endued with the power of the Spirit, be brought under the influence of the gospel of Christ, that we may be a household fearing God and working righteousness, that all anger, and wrath, and clamor, and evil speaking, may be put away from us; and that the law and service of love may prevail over that of rigor or of fear. May the peace of God rule in all our hearts, and may we enjoy and exhibit the blessedness of them who dwell together in unity; so that walking in the faith of the Gospel, we may all be found in the household of faith.

To the Father, the Son, and the Holy Ghost, be everlasting praise, majesty, and dominion, now and for ever. Amen.

FRIDAY EVENING.

BLESSED Lord, who hast caused all holy Scriptures to be written for our learning, and in those Scriptures hast revealed to us Thy love, in sparing not Thy Son, but delivering Him up for us all; grant that by patience and comfort of Thy holy Word, we may embrace and ever hold fast that blessed hope of everlasting life. Make us to feel, O Lord, that it is indeed a blessed hope—a hope, for the enjoyment of which may we be ready to part with all we possess. May Jesus be precious to us—more precious than thousands of gold and silver. Oh, may our hearts rejoice in Thy salvation, that in sincerity we may say, Whom have we in heaven but Thee, and there is none upon earth that we desire beside Thee.

Gracious Lord, Thou hast added to our lives another day. More privileges, more blessings have been added to our store; and we are conscious of much ingratitude. What shall we render unto Thee for all the benefits that we have received from Thee; for life—for health—for food—for raiment —for preservation from a thousand evils to which others are exposed—for the means of grace—and, above all, for the hope of glory through Jesus? Lord, we have nothing to give which has not first been received from Thee. We can only add to our debt of gratitude, and draw a plea from all Thy bounties to ask Thee still for more. We do so, Lord. We pray Thee to add to all Thine other gifts the gift of the Holy Spirit, to enable us to enjoy them—to enjoy Jesus, to feast upon His love to be so united to Jesus as to lose our love for every unlawful earthly object, and for every lawful one which interferes with our devotedness to Thee. Enable us, by the mighty power of the Holy Spirit to mortify the flesh, with its affections and lusts, which rise in opposition to Jesus, to enter gladly into the humiliation of Jesus, to walk through the world as Jesus did, a stranger to all its joys, and pleasures, and pursuits. Deliver us from the love of the world. We have promised to renounce it, with its pomps and vanities. But, Lord, we cannot do so of ourselves. Give to each of us the Holy Ghost, enduing us with power from on high, planting the love of heavenly things within us, and mortifying our attachment to the things of the world. May our old nature be so buried that the new man may be raised up in us. May we have power and strength to have victory, and to triumph against the devil, the world, and the flesh; and may each day that brings us nearer to our eternal home, find us more weaned from the world, and more united to Christ.

Pardon, O Lord, whatever we have this day been guilty of, whether they be sins of commission or omission. Give us now such contrition of heart for offending against Thee, a God of love, as will make us more watchful over our hearts, should we be spared for another day. Give to us all that godly sorrow which worketh repentance not to be repented of, and a thorough hatred even of the appearance of evil. Make us a holy people, that Thy name may be sanctified in the midst of us.

For the blessings which we enjoy this night, accept our earnest expression of thankfulness. May we lie down at peace with Thee through Jesus; and may a sense of reconciliation through His blood give peace and joy to our hearts. Should death or sickness this night visit us, may every fear be removed in the confidence of acceptance through Jesus. Give us that confidence, if we have it not, so that they who, through fear of death, were all their lifetime subject to bondage, may know the glorious liberty, from danger and from fear, which is to be enjoyed through the Saviour of sinners.

Lord, hear us; Lord, answer us; and, Lord, abundantly bless us, for the sake of Thy Son, our Redeemer, Jesus Christ. Amen.

SATURDAY MORNING.

ALMIGHTY GOD, who givest liberally to all men, and upbraidest not, and dost not despise the meanest of Thy creatures who come unto Thee in the name of Jesus; hear us, and answer us, while, through Him, as the way, the truth, and the life, we come boldly to Thy throne of grace.

Thou hast encouraged us to ask for great things, and we desire now to do so; yet not for the things of this world—for its riches, its honors, or its goods. which might prove a curse instead of a blessing: but we ask for spiritual things—for the pardon of daily sin, through the blood of Jesus-for an assurance of that pardon, speaking peace to our souls for an abundant outpouring of the Holy Spirit, enabling us successfully to resist the temptation of the evil one, and to manifest in our lives the power of the grace of God. These, blessed Lord, are large petitions, but Thou hast encouraged us to expect great things. We acknowledge that we have not, because we asked not—that we have been straitened in ourselves, and not in Thee-that our conquest over sin might have been greater, had we waited upon Thee more for the Spirit. Oh, then, now that Thou hast put it into our hearts to ask, satisfy our

largest desires, and give us all that we stand in need of. Oh, make us holy, for the Saviour's sake, whatever else Thou art pleased to deny.

We give Thee thanks, O Lord, for Thy preservation of us during the night past. We might have perished by fire, or have been visited by the pestilence that walketh in darkness. Oh, how great is Thy goodness to us, when we reflect how many have spent the night in agony of body or of mind, while we have been kept in health and quietness. Lord, we would praise Thee for these things; and as every good gift cometh from Thee, we beseech Thee to enable us to show forth that praise, not only with our lips, but in our lives.

And now that we enter upon the last day of the week, we would ask the spirit of self-examination, that we may review those days that are gone, and be humbled to confess, and strengthened to forsake, all that conscience accuses us of. May we remember that this is the preparation of the Sabbath. Make it so to us, we pray Thee. Enable us to set our house in order, and so to arrange our worldly business, that we may serve Thee without distraction on Thy holy day, should we be allowed to enjoy it.

But forasmuch as we know not what a day may bring forth, oh, teach us to live this day as though it were our last; as though we had a certainty of the call of death, or of the Saviour's coming, this night. Cut every tie which binds us to earth;

overcome our attachment to the things of the world; and enable us to sit completely loose to all but Thec. And oh, may the roots of our affections strike deeper into Jesus, that, being stablished, and grounded, and confirmed in Him, we may be proof against the storms of adversity, and the force of temptation. Correct, we beseech Thee, whatever Thou seest amiss in our tempers and dispositions. Subdue the risings of unholy passion; say to the ruffled waves, Be still; let meekness and humility prevail over harshness and pride; and may the loving spirit of the Saviour be manifest in all we say or do.

We pray of Thee to look this day upon Thy ministering servants, who are to stand up on the morrow to preach the Gospel of Thy grace. Be with them in their preparation for the holy work. May the Holy Ghost so fill them with the love of Jesus, and the love of souls for His sake, that they may speak that they do know, and testify that they have seen and felt of the riches of redeeming love. Feed their own souls while they prepare to feed their flocks, and cause that an abundant blessing may follow their labor in the Lord.

Grant these our petitions, O Lord, for Jesus Christ's sake, our only Saviour and Redeemer. Amen.

SATURDAY EVENING.

O GOD, whose nature and property is ever to have mercy and to forgive, receive our humble petitions, which we present to Thee in the name of Jesus.

We adore Thy holy name, that when Jesus offered not expiation for angels that sinned, we were visited by Him in mercy, and that for us reconciliation has been made. Forbid it, gracious Lord, that we should reject so great a benefit, or slight such wondrous love. Apply to each of us the full virtue of that Saviour's sacrifice. Cause us to rejoice that our sins are blotted out, and that, through Jesus, we stand complete in all the will of God.

But, Lord, we confess that we are bound with the chain of our sins; that sin has often dominion over us; and that we are too often led captive by Satan at his will. We implore Thee, of Thy great mercy, to loose us; to deliver us from the love of sin; to give us the Spirit to subdue the flesh; and to keep us in the obedience of Christ. The ways of sin are slavery; Thy service is perfect freedom. Make us free, then, blessed Lord, not only from the punishment of sin, by the blood of Jesus, but from the dominion of sin, by the power of the Holy Ghost; that we may sanctify the Lord God in our hearts; that we may be able to cease from sin, to walk in holiness and righteousness all the days of

our life, and to enjoy the holy liberty of the children of God.

We mourn to think how much the things of the world prevailed to draw our hearts from Thee; what toys and trifles pleased us, when we found but little pleasure in Jesus. Oh, deliver us from a worldly spirit. Let us feel that this world is not our rest; that it is polluted; and that all that is in the world—the lust of the flesh, the lust of the eye, and the pride of life—is not of the Father, but is of the world. Heavenly Father, may we be crucified to the world, and the world to us, so that we may serve Thee with a single eye, and live for Thee alone.

We bless Thee, at the remembrance of Thine unmerited mercies. We praise Thee, that we, who have provoked Thee so often to anger, who have grievously sinned and rebelled against Thy laws, have not been visited by sudden judgment, and doomed to suffer in the lake of fire. Oh, what a mercy that we have been spared, and not cut off in the midst of our iniquities! We call upon our souls to praise Thee, O Lord, and all that is within us to bless Thy holy name. Let us not spend that life which we have forfeited, and which Thou hast so mercifully spared, on sin or vanity, but take it all to Thyself. Take it, Lord, for we cannot give it Thee. Make us Thine. Make us, as Thy members, a temple of the Holy Ghost, and reign within us, lord over every thought, and word and action.

Look in mercy, we pray Thee, upon all who are

in trouble, sorrow, need, sickness, or any other adversity. Give them patience under their sufferings, and a happy issue out of all their afflictions. May Thy chastisement yield the peaceable fruits of right-eousness in those who are exercised by it.

Have pity on all prisoners and captives. Lead them to Jesus, who in His Gospel proclaims the opening of the prison to them that are bound. Reclaim the backsliders. May they grieve to have forsaken a loving Saviour, and to have preferred, before Him, the wages of iniquity. Put words into their mouths, that they may return and say, "Take away all iniquity, and receive us graciously."

Forgive, we beseech thee, O Lord, the sins of the day, the sins of the week, for Jesus' sake. We would lie down at peace with Thee this night through Jesus, so that if this night our souls should be required of us, we may be found in Jesus, accepted in Him, the Beloved.

Every prayer we present unto Thee, in his name. Grant to us needful rest this night; and if we awake in life to see the Sabbath, may the Spirit meet us with an early blessing, and tune our hearts to sing the praise of Jesus. Amen.

SUNDAY MORNING.

O ALMIGHTY AND ETERNAL GOD, who hast so loved a guilty world as to give Thy Son Jesus Christ to die upon the cross for its sin, we draw near

to Thee through Him, and implore acceptance for the Saviour's sake.

We give Thee thanks, O eternal Jehovah, for the blessing of another Sabbath; that we are called from earthly cares to spend this day with Thee. A day in Thy courts is better than a thousand. But, O Lord, we have spent many Sabbaths without any enjoyment of Thee. We have satisfied ourselves with the form, while destitute of the power of godliness. We have made confession of sins, for which we never mourned, and made promises of amendment, which we never kept. We desire that the time past of our lives may suffice us to have wrought such folly and deceit. We know, Lord, that we cannot enjoy an eternal Sabbath, unless Thy Sabbaths on earth be the joy of our heart. We therefore pray most earnestly that Thou wilt send into our hearts the Holy Spirit, that we may see Thee and enjoy Thee in all the ordinances of this day. Let all Thy goodness pass before us, that we may be led to admire the wonders of Thy love. Make us hate the sins that caused the sufferings of the Saviour, and adore the love which carried Him through them all. O blessed Jesus, as Thou didst die, cause sin to die in us; as Thou didst rise from death, so make us rise to newness of life; and as Thou dost employ Thy risen life to the glory of the Father, so make us feel that being bought with a price, we are no longer our own, but should glorify Thee with our bodies and our spirits, which are

Thine. We would make a solemn surrender of ourselves to Thee this day, to be and to do all that Thou dost wish.

Be with us while we attend Thy house of prayer. Solemnize our hearts with a sense of Thy presence, and gladden our hearts with the manifestation of Thy love. Remove from us all wandering of mind and levity of spirit. Let us not do our own ways, nor find our own pleasure, nor speak our own words, on this Thy holy day; but make it our care to imitate on earth what we hope to enjoy with Thee in heaven. Meet us in private prayer, and enable us to employ part of this day in self-examination and study of thy Holy Word. If we are employed for the benefit of others, may we remember that thy Spirit alone can bless our labors; and for that, let us be diligent in prayer. Prepare our hearts to receive the seed of heavenly truth; and may none of us harden those hearts against the convictions of conscience.

We beseech Thee to bless Thy servants who are eommissioned by Thee to preach Thy truth this day. Teach them, that they may teach others. May they not trust to the words which man's wisdom teacheth, but which the Holy Ghost teacheth, comparing spiritual things with spiritual. Cause many to know that Thy Gospel is the power of God unto salvation, by leading them to believe its precious truths. May the Holy Spirit so accompany the word preached, that this may be a day of rejoicing to

many, by loosing their spiritual bonds, enlightening their spiritual darkness, removing their unbelieving fears, and manifesting Jesus in the beauty of holiness.

Most gracious Lord, who hast bestowed upon us the unspeakable gift of the Gospel of Christ, we would remember before Thee those heathen nations who now sit in that darkness which once enveloped our land. O Lord, have mercy upon them. And whilst Thy Gospel is a witness among all nations, may it be the power of God to the salvation of many who hear it. Get glory to Thyself by the conversion of sinners; and add unto Thy Church daily from among the Gentiles such as should be saved.

Lord of the Sabbath, hear our prayers, and may this Sabbath be to us a foretaste of eternal rest, for Jesus Christ's sake. Amen.

SUNDAY EVENING.

MOST gracious Lord, who hast added to our many mercies the enjoyment of another Sabbath, and hast allowed us this day to hear the message of thy full and free salvation through the Lord Jesus Christ, bless us while we now worship Thee in his name.

Conscious that we are unable to retain the good seed of Thy Word, or to bring any fruit to perfec-

tion without the power of the Spirit in our hearts, we, Thine unworthy servants, beseech Thee now to give that Spirit to us. We have this day had life and death, blessing and cursing, laid before us. Empower us to refuse the evil and to choose the good. Increase whatever convictions may have been forced upon our minds by the truth, and strengthen whatever resolutions we may have formed of living more devotedly to Thee. Grant that the seed sown may not be plucked away by the enemy of our souls ere it take root. Break our stony hearts, that they may not resist that heavenly seed. Remove the weeds of worldly cares, which would choke the tender blade; and may our hearts be so wrought upon by the Spirit, that they may bring forth an hundred fold of spiritual fruit to Thy glory.

And while we feel humble before Thee under a sense of guilt, and of the imperfection that cleaves to our very best services, we would also praise Thee for whatever enjoyment Thou hast given us in the service and ordinances of the day. Wherein we have failed in this experience, give us still to enjoy it before we retire to rest; that our souls may not end this day of spiritual feasting in spiritual heaviness, nor suffer hunger while Thy table is spread for their spiritual repast. Lord, we are straightened in ourselves, and not in Thee. We have not, because we ask not aright. We ask with coldness and deadness, when we should cry unto Thee with fervent supplication and agonizing prayer.

Pour upon us the Spirit of grace and supplication, that we may pray as we should; that, praying in the Spirit, heaven may be opened to our prayers; and that our souls may be abundantly satisfied out of the store-house of Thy grace.

We desire this night, O Lord, to promise before Thee, with all solemnity, that, the Spirit being our helper, we will no longer endeavor to serve two masters, but that, renouncing the service of the world and sin, we will take Thee as our Master, our Father, and our God. Confirm this resolution. Record it by the Spirit upon the tablet of our hearts. Give us strength to adhere to it, and to renounce all that the world admires and esteems, which stands in the way of our entire surrender to Thee.

Again we pray Thee, O Lord, confirm our best resolutions, in Thy strength formed this night. And may the power of the Holy Ghost so work within us, that if spared to see another day, we may be enabled to resist and overcome the temptations by which we may be assailed, to return to the world and its ways. Oh, for grace to take up our cross and follow Jesus, though exposed to trial and persecution for His sake! Keep us mindful that it is they who suffer with Jesus here, who shall reign with Him in His kingdom; while they who refuse the cross and deny Him, shall be denied before the angels of God.

O Lord, hear us; O Lord, answer us; and O

Lord, abundantly bless us, for Jesus Christ's sake. Amen.

MONDAY MORNING.

MERCIFUL GOD, who hast promised that where two or three meet together in Thy name, there Thou wilt be in the midst of them, fulfil that promise to us, Thy waiting people, who come to worship Thee this morning, in the name of Jesus.

Another day Thou hast added to our lives, and dost call upon us to show whether we will be doers of the word which we heard upon the past Sabbath, or whether we have been but forgetful hearers. Lord, the desire of our hearts is to follow Thee fully. But we need more power than we can command. We are surrounded by temptations, and our own evil heart is the worst of our foes. We implore of Thee to take pity on us, and to send the Holy Ghost, to confirm us in the love and practice of godliness.

O blessed Lord, leave us not to walk alone this day through the dangers by which we are beset, but be Thou with us, that we may lean upon the arm of our beloved. Our business in life

Set a watch, O Lord, before our lips, that we offend not with our tongue. Put away from us, not only evil speaking, lying, and slandering, but remove all levity of speech, of manner, or of thought. Give to us that spiritual mind which is life and peace; and may our care this day be, to maintain communion with Thee at any sacrifice.

Make us not only true and just in all our dealings, but may we, after the command of Jesus, be willing to suffer wrong or take reproach, rather than break a bond of peace or charity. Enable us to improve every opportunity of usefulness that may occur, either by relieving the needy, though by doing so we need to deny ourselves; (or by speaking a word in season,) though we may be exposed to reproach for our zeal. Grant us, O blessed Jesus, so to live upon Thee, to feed upon Thee, to enjoy the prospect of being with Thee in glory, that we may not be anxious for the possession of those worldly things which are the objects of the world's ambition. Be Thou our portion, and we shall be therewith content, take what Thou mayest away.

Have pity, O Lord, upon all who are in want and wretchedness. While we are in the enjoyment of plenty, give us a heart to feel for those who suffer from hunger and nakedness; and never let us waste

on luxury or vanity, what might relieve the miseries of numbers in our land. Teach us to do to others what we would wish to have done to ourselves.

And now, gracious Lord, we pray Thee to be with us through the whole of this day. May we take nothing in hand but what is warranted by Thy will and word, and may all we undertake for Thy glory prosper. For Thee we would labor, for Thee we would suffer shame. Grant to us the light of Thy countenance, and all will be well. Now, to God only wise, be glory, through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

MONDAY EVENING.

O LORD GOD, who hast given Thy Son to die for sinners, and hast, through Him, proclaimed peace and good-will towards men; we enter into Thy presence, through His mediation, to enjoy the privilege of communion with Thee.

We accept it, O Lord, as an unspeakable favor, that we are allowed to speak unto Thee; and more, that we can be assured of Thy willingness to receive and bless us in Jesus. Grant us now the Spirit of prayer and of supplication. May the Spirit sanctify our hearts; and our thoughts being withdrawn from worldly things, may we have joy in communion with Thee.

We give Thee thanks, O blessed Lord, for Thy care and protection of us during the past day. We are unworthy of the least of Thy mercies; and yet Thou art merciful to our infirmities, and compassionate to our wants. Thou art, indeed, a God of love. Give us of Thy loving Spirit, O Lord. May we be changed into Thine image, from glory to . glory, even by the Spirit of the Lord. May all the evil tempers and passions that belong to our carnal nature be subdued by the Spirit. May love, joy, peace, long-suffering, gentleness, and meekness, the fruit of Thy Spirit, prevail over the works of the flesh. Conform us to the likeness of Jesus. Enable us to imitate the example of Jesus, who pleased not Himself, but lived and died even for His enemics. Give us the universal love of Jesus to the world, the peculiar love of Jesus to the Church. Crucify all selfish feelings within us; and may the subdued and chastened Spirit of Christ be ever manifest in us. Enlarge our hearts to love our enemies; and remove for ever all malice or revenge. As we believe Thou hast forgiven us, make us willing from the heart to forgive those who may have injured us.

O our Father, we pray Thee, that if any here present are yet uninfluenced by Thy Spirit, Thou wilt mercifully bestow it upon them for Christ's sake. Do Thou, Lord Jesus, who art the good Shepherd, lead them to Thy fold, and mark them as the sheep of Thy pasture. Teach us all to know

our hearts, that we may not deceive ourselves with the form of gotliness, nor expect salvation while we walk in indulged sin. Wash us all in the blood of Jesus. Purify us all by the Holy Spirit; and seal us with that Spirit unto the day of redemption.

As Thou hast been about our path this day, O Lord, so be Thou about our bed this night. Give us rest and refreshment for our weary bodies; and if a new day be added to our lives, may new supplies of Thy Spirit be vouchsafed, to enable us to spend that day in Thy service. Keep us from day to day, in prayer, in watchfulness, in activity, and in peace with Thee, through Jesus, till our day of life is spent, and our sun shall set in glory. Grant all, O heavenly Father, for Jesus Christ's sake. Amen.

TUESDAY MORNING.

Corrections Corrections and Everlasting God, who hast safely brought us to the beginning of this day, look with pity on those here assembled in Thy name, and in dependence upon the Lord Jesus, to worship at Thy throne of grace.

Thou hast mercifully answered the prayers which we offered up on the last evening; Thou hast preserved us from the perils and dangers of the night, and we are here to thank Thee for Thy mercy. But, gracious Lord, we need a continuance of that mercy

from day to day. We cannot walk this day in the strength of yesterday. We are dependent on Thee for everything; make us content to be so, that Thou mayest have all the glory. Hear us now, for the sake of Jesus, while we renew our petitions, and make our requests known unto Thee in prayer.

Blessed Lord, we need supplies both for our bodies and for our souls. We ask Thee, then, as regards the things of life, to give what is required to preserve our bodies in health for Thy service. We covet not luxury, to feed the cravings of an unlawful appetite; nor clothing, to adorn these tabernacles of clay. But give us food and raiment as Thou seest fit, and teach us to be therewith content. For our hungry souls we now desire spiritual food. O Almighty God, whom we love for the gift of the Son, and of the Spirit, accept our grateful but imperfect thanksgivings for Thine inestimable benefits. And teach us, we pray Thee, to love that Holy word which reveals Thy truth to us. We grieve to think how often we neglect it—how often we read it with carelessness—how often we prefer to it the words of man. Give us the Spirit to see its hidden treasures, that we may read it, not by constraint, but with the joy of those whose souls are enriched by its store. And cause, O Lord, we pray Thee, that it may be known and valued through the dark places of our land. Have mercy on those who would interfere to check the progress of Thy word. Give them to see the danger of fighting against God; and reveal to them the knowledge of that truth which will turn their enmity into zeal for Thy glory.

Now to Thee, the Almighty God, who art able to keep us from falling, with the adorable Redeemer, and the ever blessed Spirit, three persons in one God, be ascribed everlasting praise, by us on earth, as by all in heaven. Amen.

TUESDAY EVENING.

A LMIGHTY GOD, Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, and Father of all mercies, who hast shown Thy love to a guilty world by the best of gifts—a Saviour; look with pity, we pray Thee, upon Thy most unworthy servants, who, through that Saviour, present ourselves before Thee, to offer our evening sacrifice of prayer and praise.

Lord, we could not hope for acceptance, hadst thou not assured us of Thy willingness to receive us. Thou art a God of perfect holiness, and we are creatures of iniquity and rebellion. Yet hast Thou commended Thy love to us, in that while we were yet sinners, Christ died for us; He, the just one, for us, the unjust, that He might bring us to Thec. But, gracious Lord, our own rebellious hearts would have refused the favor of Thy love, hadst Thou not overcome their hatred to holiness. Draw them to the cleansing fountain of a Saviour's blood, for the removal of past guilt; and supply them with the Spirit's power, to sanctify them for the time to come.

We beseech Thee, O Lord, for this land, that it may be filled not with men only, but also with truth and righteousness. Bless those who are subduing the earth and make them Thy servants through Jesus Christ. Instruct our rulers, and bless our judges; make our country a joy and a praise in the earth, and let her people be all righteous. Whereever our language is spoken make it the means of spreading the good knowledge of our Lord Jesus Christ.

Again, O Lord, do we look for Thy protection during another night. Make us thankful that we are not exposed to the sufferings which many endure from cold and nakedness. Who are we, that

we should be protected, while others perish through want? Oh, give us hearts to feel for the miseries of others, and to deny ourselves, that we may contribute to their relief. Hear, and answer our prayers, O Lord, for Jesus Christ's sake. Amen.

WEDNESDAY MORNING.

O MOST MIGHTY GOD, who, though Thou humblest Thyself to receive the adoration of the heavenly host, art yet willing, for the sake of Jesus, to welcome even sinners, such as we are, who come to Thee in His name; hear us while through Him we draw near to Thee in prayer, and present this our morning sacrifice.

We thank Thee for the protection of the past night. We thank Thee that we were allowed to lie down in peace, and to awake in safety. Oh, what cause have we to praise Thee, when we consider the miseries to which others of our fellow-creatures have been exposed, and from which we have been preserved! May the Spirit enable us, from love to Thee, to conform to the precepts of Thy holy word. Lord, Thou hast given us many talents to employ in Thy service. Make us faithful stewards. Enable us to trust Thee for food and raiment, which Thou hast pledged Thyself to provide; and may we not distrust Thee, nor disobey Thee, by laying up treasures on the earth. Be Thou our treasure, from day to day; then, whereour treasure is will our hearts be also; and our *all* shall be devoted to Thy service.

Bless our relations and friends, who are yet wanderers from the fold of Jesus. Lord, we carry them in the arms of faith, and lay them before Thee and say, heal them for Thy mercy's sake. Pour out Thy Spirit upon them, O Lord. Turn them from darkness to light, from the love of the world to the love of Thee. Whatever Thou mayest take from them of the things of this life, oh take not away Thy loving-kindness, but save Thou their immortal souls. May all who are dear to us by the ties of nature, be made still more dear by the stronger bonds of grace.

All our prayers and praises we present unto Thee, O Lord, in the name of Him, through whom alone Thou canst accept us—the Lord Jesus Christ. Amen.

WEDNESDAY EVENING.

TATHER of all mercies, the author of our being, the source of our every hope and joy, and comfort, whose goodness has preserved us through another day, behold us here before Thee, this night, and enable us to worship Thee in Spirit and in truth.

We are conscious of manifold transgressions—of unnumbered sins. Thou art all love to us, and we are all ingratitude towards Thee. Look not at us, as we are stained with sin; but look at us in the face of Thine anointed. We shelter ourselves behind the Saviour; and putting on the Lord Jesus, we dare to come to Thee with boldness. We are now complete in Him. Hear us, speaking through the Saviour—our substitute; and give to us all the blessings which we are allowed to ask in His name.

We would make farther confession of our sins, O Lord. We have erred and strayed from Thee like lost sheep, having no will of our own to return. We have tried the pleasures of the world, and found them wanting; we acknowledge that we have never enjoyed an hour's peace in the way of sin. O Thou much offended and much insulted Father, we turn unto Thee. Thou mightest justly spurn us from Thy presence, to reap the fruit of our deserving. But Thou art God, and not man, therefore we are not consumed—therefore have we hope—therefore do we now return to Thee, and say, Enter not into

judgment with Thy servants, O Lord; pardon all iniquity, and receive us graciously, for the sake of Thy beloved Son. O our God, we disclaim every idea of acceptance now or ever, except through the blood of the Lord Jesus. No merits—no righteousness—no goodness have we to plead: we cling to the cross of Jesus, as our only refuge from the wrath to come.

And now, Lord, while we praise and bless Thee for what Thou hast done, we would say unto Thee, "What wouldst Thou have us to do? Make Thy way plain before our face. Open Thou our eyes that we may behold wondrous things out of Thy law. With our whole hearts do we seek Thee: oh, let us not wander from Thy commandments."

And, O our God, hear us, while we still farther implore of Thee to grant us the Holy Spirit, to subdue sin in our flesh. Sanctify us by the Spirit. Guide us by the Spirit. Fill us with the Spirit. May the Spirit lead us into all truth; and strengthen us to follow what we have been taught to approve. Oh, for the Spirit, in power, that we may have power over the world, the flesh, and the devil.

Rule our rulers, we pray Thee, O Lord; govern our governors, and give our senators that wisdom that cometh from Thee, that all their consultations may tend to the advancement of Thy glory and the good of Thy Church. May Thy Spirit rule in all their hearts; and may Thy word be the rule of all their actions. Oh, protect us ever from unholy

laws; and defend us from the evil of unfaithful governors.

To Thy protection we this night commend ourselves, O Lord. Keep us in safety both of body and soul, and seal us with the Holy Ghost, unto the day of redemption, for Jesus Christ's sake. Amen.

THURSDAY MORNING.

O EVER BLESSED LORD, who art good and gracious to unthankful sinners; who dost not measure Thy blessings by our deservings, but, according to the multitude of Thy mercies, dost give us all things that pertain to life and godliness: hear us, while in the name of Jesus we present ourselves before Thee, this morning, to draw out of the fulness that is treasured up in Him all needful strength for the wants of this day.

Lord, we are poor and miserable, and weak, and helpless creatures. We have no sufficiency of our own; no, not even to think a good thought. Our sufficiency is all of Christ. We praise Thee, blessed Saviour, that what we are not, Thou art for us; that what we have not, Thou hast for us; that while we are nothing, we are complete in Thee.

O our God, give us the Spirit to open to us the treasures of Thy holy word—to unfold to us the glories of the Saviour—to reveal to us that which the natural eye cannot see, and the natural mind cannot understand. Give us the Spirit to see Christ—

to know Christ—to enjoy Christ—to live upon Christ. Give us the fulness of the blessing of the Gospel of Christ. Our souls are athirst for Thee, the living God. Oh, satisfy us with Thyself, and make us feel, from happy experience, that Thou art a satisfying portion.

We know, blessed Lord, because Thou hast said it, that Thy ways are pleasantness, and all Thy paths are peace. But we wish to know it more from our own enjoyment. We wish to be so dead to the world, and crucified to the things of the world, that we may ever walk in those ways of pleasantness, and follow those paths of peace. Direct our steps, we pray Thee. May the Spirit's brightness dispel the darkness of our minds, and light our way to the fulness of the glory of Jesus. O Thou who hast said, "Come unto me, all ye that are heavy laden, and I will give you rest," receive us who throw ourselves upon that promise, and come unto Thee now for the Spirit to rest from sin, and to rest in Thee. Do Thou render us, and our services, acceptable unto the Father; and cause us to know that all power in heaven and earth is given unto Thee, by bestowing upon us the power of the Spirit which Thou hast received for the Church.

And, O Lord, have pity upon Thy Church; endow her with the Holy Ghost; and send forth the Spirit, to lead Thy servants into all truth. Oh, may Thy people again be of one mind, and one spirit, striving together for the faith of the Gospel. We acknowledge that too many seek their own things, and not the things which are Jesus Christ's. Revive the spirit of Christian love amongst us. Clothe Thy members with the garments of holiness; and cause them to hold forth the word of life—to shine as lights in the world.

Visit the dark places of the earth with Thy salvation. Direct the hearts of Thy faithful servants to preach Thy truth, in the love of it, to those who are sitting in the shadow of death. Gather in the number of Thine elect, and hasten Thy kingdom, O Lord, when Thy will shall be done on earth, as now it is done in heaven.

Accept our praises, O Lord, for unnumbered mercies. Praise be to Thee for food, for raiment, for health, and strength. Praise be to Thee for freedom from bodily suffering. Praise be to Thee, that we are not with those who are delivered to chains of darkness, reserved unto the judgment of the great day. Praise be to Thee for the unspeakable gift of thy Son, Jesus.

Crown all Thy mercies, we beseech Thee, with the gift of the Spirit, enabling us to value and enjoy the Saviour. And to Thyself, with the Son and the Holy Ghost, be all praise ascribed by us on earth, as by all in heaven, for ever.

THURSDAY EVENING.

RATHER of all mercies, our reconciled Father in Christ Jesus, teach us to pray unto Thee in the Spirit, and answer the prayers which Thou dost teach us to offer up. We come to Thee in the name of Jesus. For His worthiness' sake, hear us, and bless us.

Thy goodness has brought us to the close of another day in safety. We are here to praise Thee for Thy watchful providence over us, and for all the blessings of this life which we have so undeservedly received at Thy hands. But above all, would we adore and magnify Thy holy name, for the provision Thou hast made for our spiritual wants, in Jesus, the Son of Thy love. Praised be Thy name, that Thou hast accepted the sacrifice of Jesus in our behalf, that Thou art reconciled to us through the blood of His cross, that Thine anger is turned away from us, and that through Him we have access with boldness unto Thee. Praised be Thy name, that in Him all fulness dwells, and that we are called to receive out of that fulness, grace for grace.

We come to draw largely from that spiritual store this night. We come to entreat Thee, as our heavenly Father, to pity the weakness and infirmity of Thy poor children upon earth, and to give us of Thy Holy Spirit to raise our drooping souls to the blessedness of spiritual enjoyment. Let not the world, the flesh, or the devil, have place in our

hearts. Establish Thy throne within us. Subdue every thought to Thy willing obedience. Work Thou in us, by the mighty power of the Holy Ghost. Give us strength to resist and overcome all the sinful desires and lusts of our flesh. May Christ be formed within us the hope of glory. May the life which we now live be by the faith of the Son of God. May the Spirit mould us into the image of Jesus, that the mind that was in Jesus may also be in us. May the works of the Spirit be so manifest in our lives, that they who fear Thee not may be constrained to acknowledge, that God is in us of a truth.

Lord, Thou knowest all hearts. Thou seest whether we all have been taught by the Spirit to love the Lord Jesus, and to flee to Him for refuge from the wrath to come. If any here present are yet strangers to themselves, to Jesus, and to Thee, oh, send forth the Spirit into their hearts. Awaken them from the slumber of sin, from the death of sin, to walk with Thee in newness of life. Speak but the word, and they shall be healed, and may their renovated powers be wholly consecrated to Thee.

And now, blessed Lord, we commend ourselves to Thy care and keeping this night. Thou, the Shepherd of Israel, neither slumberest nor sleepest. Watch over us, and guard us from all harm, both of body and soul. Keep us in that continued enjoyment of Thy presence, and sense of Thy love, that

we shall fear the grave as little as our bed; that we may even rejoice in the prospect of the end of life, and of the coming day of the Redcemer's glory. Wean us more and more from the present evil world, and reveal to us more and more the glory of the world to come. So shall we live as strangers and pilgrims; so shall we enjoy that peace which passeth all understanding; so shall we walk with Thee through life; and so shall we gladly hail the advent of Jesus, or wake to rise and reign with Him on the morning of the resurrection.

Grant these our petitions, O Heavenly Father, for the sake of Jesus Christ, our only Saviour and Redcemer. Amen.

FRIDAY MORNING.

MOST blessed Father and God, whom to know is life eternal, and whom to serve is perfect freedom, give us the light of the knowledge of Thy glory in the face of Jesus Christ; and help us now, through Him, to offer to Thee a spiritual sacrifice.

Thy mercies are new every day; great is Thy faithfulness. Thou hast again preserved us in safety during the night, and dost allow us to worship Thee this morning in peace. For all the blessings of this life, accept our thanksgiving. Day unto day, and night unto night, declare Thy love and bountifulness to us. Thou fillest our hearts with joy and gladness—Thou protectest us as with a shield. But

O our God, renew the supplies of the Holy Spirit, to furnish our lamps with oil for the day, that we may shine as lights in the world. (We cannot live this day upon the strength of yesterday.) Give us a fresh supply—an increased supply, that we may be more holy, less worldly, more devoted, less slothful, than before.

We would go forth as witnesses for Jesus this day. We pray for strength to trample on the world and its toys. We pray Thee to remove the vail that hides Thy glory, and to allow us by the Spirit to taste the power of the world to come. Display before us the unseen realities of Thine eternal kingdom, that we may rise above the things of time and sense. O Lord, we grieve to think how much the world still prevails to draw our hearts from Thee. Crucify us to the world, and the world to us. May we be dead to its enjoyments; may we find no pleasure in any thing on earth, except as it leads us to Thee, or is connected with Thy service. Make us truly to be citizens of a heavenly city—strangers here in the land of our pilgrimage. May our conversation one with another be upon the glory that is to be brought to us at the revelation of the Lord Jesus Christ. May our hearts have no place for the trifling concerns of this passing scene.

Grant to Thy faithful people, O Lord, the enjoyment of all Thy spiritual gifts. Make the Church a temple of the Holy Ghost. Be Thou seen in the midst of her; and may each member of Thy body

here on earth be an epistle of the Spirit, read and known of all men. Oh, separate Thy Church from the world, and let it shine as a city set upon a hill. Strengthen the hands of those who labor in Thy word and doctrine. May the truths of Thy revealed word be taught them by the Spirit, that they may teach others. Lead us into all Thy truth O Lord; sanctify us by Thy truth—Thy word is truth.

We praise Thee, O our God, for the blessings of Thy providence and Thy grace; for freedom from merited sufferings, and for the hope of eternal glory through Jesus. We praise Thee for a crucified, risen, and ascended Saviour. Bestow Thine ascension gifts on us, O merciful Lord Jesus Christ, and endue us with power from on high. Give faith to those who have it not; increase that faith to those who possess it; and may our lives be those of faith, rejoicing in the hope of the glory of God.

Blessed Lord, Thou only knowest what trials and temptations may befall us this day. Keep us by Thine almighty power; preserve us from temptations, if it be Thy will; deliver us, if tempted. Enable us to keep in mind the hope of our calling; and neither to say nor to do what may be inconsistent with our profession. We would live this day as though it were our last: strengthen us so to do. Let the power of the Spirit be felt by us, subduing the desires of the flesh and of the mind, and bringing every thought, and word, and action, into captivity to Thee.

Father of mercies, hear our prayer, and let our crying come unto Thee. Be Thou our very present help this day, and in every time of need, for the sake of Thy beloved Son, our Lord Jesus Christ. Amen.

FRIDAY EVENING.

A LMIGHTY GOD, Father of all mercies, whose we are, and whom we ought to serve; whom to know is life eternal, and whom to obey is perfect freedom: we adore Thy majesty, as we are allowed to see Thee, in the face of Jesus Christ.

We are sinful and rebellious creatures, and Thou art a consuming fire for sin. But eternal praise be to Thy wisdom, which provided a way whereby Thou couldst be a just God, and yet a Saviour,just in Thine abhorrence of sin-a Saviour of sinners, through the satisfaction of Thy Son. We praise and bless Thee for the Gospel which reveals Thy love to us in Jesus—that Thou hast laid help upon One that is mighty—that Thou hast delivered us from going down to the pit, because Thou hast found a ransom. O Lord, accept us, this night, in Him-Thy Son-Thy beloved-the Lord our Righteousness. We take hold of His salvation; we appear before Thee as His members; we rejoice, that in Him we are justified from all things-that in Him Thou art a God of love. Oh, for the Holy Ghost, to shed abroad in our hearts the love of Thy name; to increase in us true religion; to nourish us with all goodness; and to keep us in Thy love!

O Lord, it is pain and grief to us that we do not serve Thee better. Our hearts are too often charged with the care and occupation of earthly things. Our flesh cleaveth to the earth, and our affections stray away from Thee, whom we have charged them to love. Pity us, O our God. Have compassion upon us while we are struggling against the temptations of the world, the flesh, and the devil. Leave us not in our own strength to contend with spiritual wickedness in high places; but let Thy strength be made perfect in our weakness. Put upon us Thy heavenly armor. Endue us with power from on high. Baptize us with the Holy Ghost, that we may be refined from the dross of earthly-mindedness, and purified to serve Thee in spirit and in truth. And O our ever precious Saviour--our great High Priest--our Advocate with the Father, plead Thou our cause; and supply all spiritual blessings, for the strengthening and refreshing of our souls. All that we can desire is treasured up in Thee. Give forth, without scarceness, whatever we need, for Thy service, and for the enjoyment of heavenly things; so that we shall be neither barren nor unfruitful in the work of our God.

O Lord our guide, make it plain how Thy servants should serve Thee. Leave us not in doubt, who, in sincerity of heart, look to Thee for direction; but let the pillar and the cloud go before us.

O Lord, rouse Thy slumbering servants amongst us and make them ready for the bridegroom's coming. Give us oil in our lamps, and oil in our vessels; and so wean our hearts, even from the lawful engagement of worldly things, that we may be ready at any moment to go forth when the cry shall be heard. "Behold the bridegroom cometh."

If there be any present, O Lord, who could not welcome the advent of Jesus, enable them so to do. Prepare their hearts to obey the Gospel of His grace. Give them faith in Jesus as a Saviour, and the spirit of adoption to call Thee Abba, Father. Oh, curse not the barren fig trees, but spare them yet a little longer, and supply that Spirit which will cause them to bring forth fruit to Thy glory.

Let these our petitions be heard and answered by Thee, O Lord, for Jesus Christ's sake. Amen.

SATURDAY MORNING.

O LORD GOD, our Creator and preserver, who hast brought us into being, and sustained us all our life long, though unworthy of the least of Thy mercies, we praise Thee for these the blessings of this life. But above all would we adore Thee for the manifestation of Thy love to a guilty world in the gift of Thy beloved Son, Jesus Christ.

We come before Thee, O Lord, to receive those spiritual gifts which Thy love has provided and which are treasured up in Jesus. We hunger and

thirst after righteousness; feed us, this morning, with the bread of life; satisfy our thirst from the stream of the Spirit; and in the strength of this heavenly portion will we go forth upon our journey this day.

Blessed Lord, we ask Thee thus to feed us, for no food for our souls is to be found upon earth. We travel through a wilderness; and yet we are too often contented here, as though this were our place of rest. Lord, suffer us not so to be. May we be weaned from this world that our affections may be turned to Jesus, and set on Him, the desire of our souls.

O our God, we are weary by reason of sin. All that is in us is unclean. Our evil hearts give us unceasing pain. Grant us, then, the Spirit to sustain us in the spiritual warfare—to keep eternal things in constant view before our minds—to display the love of Jesus, and to satisfy our hearts out of His fulness. We would adorn the doctrine of Christ in all things. We would display the power of the Holy Ghost in subduing sin, conquering our unruly and unholy tempers, and producing within us the meekness and gentleness of Jesus. Grant us that chastened temper which ever yields to the influence of love, and displays itself in the spirit of love, in all we think, or do, or say. We ask not for worldly things, O Lord. Feed us with food convenient for us; be Thou our portion, and we ask no more.

We pray Thee, Lord, to give us a perfect knowl-

edge of ourselves. Our hearts are deceitful, as well as desperately wicked. Leave us not in doubt or ignorance as to our real state in Thy sight. If the work of grace be not already begun—if any of us have thought too favourably of themselves—if they have been deceiving themselves with the name of Chistian, without the power of the Spirit of Christ.—oh, work in them, this very day, that needful change of heart which will make them meet for the inheritance of the saints in light. May we all be born again of the Spirit; and may we be made full partakers of the divine nature.

And enable those amongst us, O Lord, whom Thy Spirit has effectually called, to make full proof in our lives of an indwelling God. Teach us to walk after the example of Jesus; to live as strangers and pilgrims upon earth; to deny ourselves the enjoyment of earthly things, that we may have to give to those who are in need. Give us tender consciences awake to every danger that might disturb the peace of our souls. Manifest Thy glory to us, that being dead to the glory of this world, we may live upon the enjoyment of the hidden life of Jesus, and the assured hope of eternal life through His name. May our hearts be with our treasure in heaven, and may our conversation be of heavenly things.

Preserve us this day, we beseech Thee, from the evils of the world through which we pass. May we walk as separate from its pleasures and pursuits, and choose rather to suffer affliction with the people

of God, than to enjoy the pleasures of sin for a season. Keep us mindful that this day is the preparation of the Sabbath, so that no worldly care or business may be allowed to interfere with the day of sacred rest. Hear us, answer us, and bless us, for the sake of Him, through whom Thou canst receive us with acceptance—the Lord Jesus Christ. Amen.

SATURDAY EVENING.

MOST blessed Lord, by whose kind providence we have been brought in safety through another week, and are now permitted to worship Thee, through Jesus, meet us with thy favour, and manifest thyself to our souls, while we now approach Thy throne of grace.

We come with holy awe, and with filial confidence. We speak to Thee with humility, and yet with boldness. Thou lovest Thy Son Jesus, and thou lovest to bless sinners, through Him. Bless us, then, for through Him alone we come. But though thou bless us not, we will worship and praise Thee for Thine eternal excellence. We love to think of Thy holiness. We rejoice at Thy hatred of sin. Yet, Lord, we know that Thou wilt bless us, for thou delightest in showing mercy.

O God, we are just the objects for Thy compassion, for we are poor and needy sinners. Work upon us; subdue us to Thine obedience; exalt us to Thy holiness; get glory in us, and by us; make

us monuments of Thy grace and of Thy redceming love. Empty us completely of self; fill us with the fulness of Thy Spirit. Breathe a new and holy life into those amongst us who may yet be dead in sin. Let none of us now kneeling in Thy presence be wanting amongst the number of those who shall appear with Thy Son in His glory.

O heavenly Father, we confess that we are too much occupied with the things of time and sense; that we cannot shake off the world and its ties as Thy word directs and our consciences approve. Occupy us so with Thyself, that we shall have neither time nor taste for what does not directly tend to profit. O our Father, we are very weak. We are easily led to follow the devices and desires of our own hearts. We have a crafty enemy, who watches for our halting, and suits his temptations to our peculiar weakness. Do thou interfere in our behalf. Strengthen us with might by Thy Spirit in the inner man, that Christ may dwell in our hearts by faith; that we, being rooted and grounded in love, may be able to comprehend with all saints, what is the length and breadth, and depth and height, and to know the love of Christ which passeth knowledge, that we may be filled with all the fulness of God. Give us that fulness of Thyself, O God, and we shall be satisfied.

And grant to Thy Church at large, O Lord, the greater enjoyment of Thy heavenly gifts. Revive Thy work in power if it be Thy will. Manifest Thy-

self in the midst of Thy people; and make Thy people holy vessels to be inhabited of Thee. Give the Spirit abundantly to those who are to stand up on the morrow, to preach the Gospel of Thy grace. Remove their dependence on all human power, and teach them to trust alone to the accompanying power of the Holy Ghost. And do Thou bless their faithful testimony, and confirm it by signs following. Raise up many more to testify of Jesus, and raise the standard of ministerial devotedness. Oh, prepare the hearts of the thoughtless, the careless, the ungodly, and the worldly, to receive with meekness the ingrafted word, which is able to save their souls, that Satan may not prevail to choke the seed by the weeds of worldy cares. May the coming Sabbath be a blessing to the soul of each of each of us-a day in which the Lord may be magnified amongst us.

Bless the various institutions in our land, established to benefit the sick and needy, or to promote the knowledge of Thy holy word. Give to their governors a single eye to Thy glory; and may they be taught to wait upon Thee for that blessing of the Spirit, which alone can give success to their labors. Take charge of us this night, O Lord; and refresh our weary bodies with needful rest. To thy blessing, O heavenly Father, we commend ourselves in the name of Jesus Christ. Amen.

PETITIONS AND THANKSGIVINGS
FOR SPECIAL OCCASIONS.

NOTE.

The following petitions and thanksgivings are added for such occasions as arise in families, and are to be selected and used in connection with the prayers of the day. Those not accustomed to pray with others often feel some difficulty in offering such petitions, from inability to describe the case without any awkwardness. An attempt to meet this difficulty is here made. The explanatory clauses prefixed, had better be used at the beginning of the family worship, before the reading of Scripture; and the more simply and naturally they are spoken the better. Religion is to be part of our daily life, not an addition to it, or an interruption of it.

PETITIONS AND THANKSGIVINGS.

[One of our number is now sick and not with us. We must not forget him (or her) in our prayers.]

LORD, who sendest sickness or health according to Thy holy will, remember the suffering one of our number. If it be Thy will, restore to health again, and make this trial a blessing to him (or her) and to us all, that we may not proudly count upon constant health, but may walk before Thee in lowliness and meekness all the days of our lives, through our blessed Redeemer, Christ Jesus.

[One of our number is dangerously sick, and we need help from God, and must not fail to ask it.]

MERCIFUL Lord, who dost not willingly afflict the children of men, Thou dost lay care and trouble upon us, through the serious illness of one of our number. O Lord, we pray in humble submission to Thy will for life and health; but if this sickness is to be unto death, O Lord, give pardon of all his (or her) sins, and Thine own blessed peace. Grant unto him (or her) full trust in Him who hath conquered death, and risen from the grave,

and who ever liveth at Thy right hand. Hear us, O Lord, in this our earnest and united petition, for Jesus' sake.

[Our friends ——— (or neighbors) ——— are in sorrow, and we ought not to forget them in our prayers.]

GRACIOUS God, Thou hast sent sorrow into the dwelling of our friends (or neighbors), whose name we have just named. We beseech Thee for them. Give them patience under affliction. Let this chastening be in love, and for their profit. Give them the joy of Thy salvation; and when there is darkness in Thy providence, may they have much light from the promises of Thy holy word, through Jesus Christ, in whom all the promises are given. Sanctify this sorrow to us and to all around us for Jesus' sake.

[There is now one more under our roof, and we should pray that his (or her) coming may be a blessing to all.]

ORD God, in Thy providence, which orders all our ways, and directs the steps of all that wait on Thee, Thou hast brought another into our dwelling, and we pray Thee that his (or her) stay may be the means of increased happiness to all of us. Make us to know what we owe to one another in our several places and relations, and enable us to act towards one another, that we may each do good, both temporal and spiritual, all the days of our lives.

[We shall not have —— at our family worship again, for some time at least; and we ought particularly to commend him (or her) to the Divine protection.]

RACIOUS Father, we desire to join together with all our hearts in committing to Thy care him (or her) who now leaves our dwelling. Go Thou, O heavenly Father, who art everywhere present, with him (or her), to give safety and peace in all the ways of life, to bestow the peace that comes from knowing and serving Christ, and to give at last an entrance with us, and with all the family that is named after Jesus, into Thy heavenly kingdom, through Jesus Christ our Lord.

[We have to be thankful that one more is added to our family, and should ask the Lord to make this little one His own child.]

GOD, the God of the spirits of all flesh, we desire to thank Thee for the safety of Thy child in the time of weakness. We bless Thee for a living mother, and for the child Thou hast given. We pray that the life spared, and the new life now bestowed, may be both consecrated to Thy service and glory, through Jesus Christ our Lord and Saviour. And do Thou, for His sake, help us, and all parents, to train the children committed to our care for Thy service and glory.

[Our congregation is now without a pastor, and we are told to ask the Lord of the harvest for the laborers.]

BLESSED Father, we thank Thee for all the good we have ever received through the preaching of the gospel. Enable us to profit by all we are permitted to hear in Thy house. Be pleased to send among us a good man, full of the Holy Ghost and of faith, who shall be a true ambassador of Christ among us, and by Thy grace win many to the Lord, and comfort Thy people, for the sake of Jesus our Lord, who is also King and Head over His church.

[When we want employment, we should tell this and all our wants to the Lord, who knows what is best for us, and who has the hearts of all men in His hand.]

A LMIGHTY Father, who givest us strength to labor, and whose will it is that we should work with our hands the thing which is good, be pleased to point out to us in Thy providence what Thou wouldst have us to do. Give us full confidence in Thy care and faithfulness, and make all things to work together for our good, for the sake of our blessed Lord and Saviour.

[It has pleased God to take away from us one of our household, and we should not forget to ask Him to sanctify His providence to us all.]

O LORD, Thou hast seen it good to send Thy messenger Death into this dwelling. Thy will

be done. Keep us from murmuring or secretly repining. And be pleased, O God, to make this removal a blessing to all of us who survive May we have grace so to number our days that we may apply our hearts unto wisdom. Cause us to hear Thy voice saying to us, "Be ye therefore also ready." Prepare us, O Lord, for the duties of life, and the solemn hour of death, for Christ's sake.
