IT'S FUN TO FOOL your folks and your friends, and one of the best ways is by card tricks. Here are two tricks that are easy to do, but which will really puzzle everybody. They were prepared by the Association of American Playing Card Manufacturers, so they must be good! The first one is:-

## SPELLEM!

Prepare the cards for this trick where nobody can see how you do so. Take all 13 cards of any one suit (Clubs, Hearts, etc.) Put the rest of the deck aside - you won't need it for this trick.

Next, arrange your 13 cards in the exaet order shown in the drawing, and when you are finished hold them in your left hand, face down. (The Three will be on the top, and the Five on the bottom.)

The Trick: - Tell your audience you are going to locate every card in the suit Ace, Two, Three, and all the way to King - just by spelling out its name or number!

How It Works: - Begin by spelling A-C-E. As you say the letter A, take the top card and slip it to the bottom, still face down. For the letter C, take the second card (now on top), and slip it to the bottom. For the letter E, the third card goes to the bottom. Then turn up the next card on the table. It will be the ACE, as you can see from the drawing. Leave the ACE on the table.

Next, spell out T-W-O in the same manner, slipping a card to the bottom of your pack with each letter. Then turn up the next card, which will be the TWO. Leave it on the table and go on spelling out T-H-R-E-E, for which you'll slip five cards to the bottom, then the FOUR, FIVE, etc. Remember always to leave the located cara on the table.

When you have finished, you'll have spelled out the location of every card from ACE to KING!

How To Prepare The Deck: - Do this where nobody can see you. Using a regular 52 card deck, take out all four cards of any denomination - $7^{\prime}$ 's, or Jacks, or Aces, etc. Place these four cards aside - you won't use them in this trick.

That leaves you with 48 cards. Take out all the Clubs - you'll have 12 of them. Place 6 of the Clubs at one end of the deck, and 6 at the other end. Now you're ready to do the trick!

Deal out the deck in six piles, face down, like this: the first 6 cards from the top of the deck (they're all Clubs) each go to make the bottom card of a separate pile. The rest of the cards are added to each pile in turn until you have 6 separate piles, 8 cards in each. As you can see, the bottom card and the top card in each pile will be Clubs.

Next, ask somebody to slip a card out from the middle of any pile, without showing you what it is. Then turn your back, and tell him to place his card on top of any of the piles. Turn around again, and ask him which pile he wants you to pick up first, which second, and so on. (This is just to fool him.) In picking up the piles, place one on top of the other without disturbing their order.

The Trick:-Give the pack to the person, and tell him to turn over the cards one by one, calling out the name of each one. Tell him you'll be able to tell which card is his, just by the sound of his voice!

How It Works: - As you have probably guessed, his card will be between two Clubs, and you can't fail to see it. You can keep talking and teasing him as he turns the cards, and you only have to watch when he turns up a Club. If the next card is a Club, you can keep teasing him. When the card following a Club is not a Club, that's his!
