We would like to thank the thousands of readers who entered this contest.

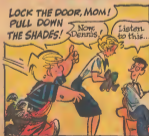


*Hank Ketcham (right) creator of "Dennis" looks through some of the thousands of drawings with his public relations assistant, Fred Toole.*

Are George Washington was their **FATHER**, huh?

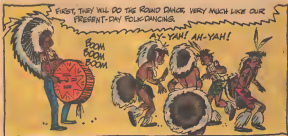

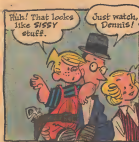


FIRST, THEY WILL DO THE ROUND DANCE, VERY MUCH LIKE OUR PRESENT-DAY FOLK-DANCING.

Yeah?





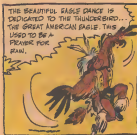

Oh Margaret oughta see this! She thinks she's so good with her JUMP ROPE!



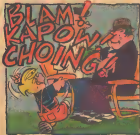
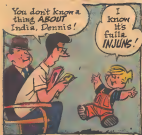
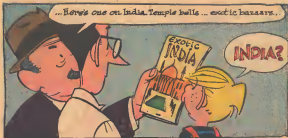
