1492—Colombus' Sponish Flog This is the flag that Columbus raised in the New World in 1492, on the island of San Salvador, The Spanish flag continued to fly over Texas and California until the 12000.



the Jomestown and Plymouth Colonies
The English flag fiew over the Colony of Jamestown, in Virginia, and the Plymouth Colony, in Massachasetts, until our insiependence from England was you.



1775-Bedford Flog
This was the flag carried by the
Minutemen of Bedford, Mass., in
the battles of Lexington and Concord that began the War of Independence. The words "Vince aut
Motive" men "Consure on Die."



1774—The Tounton Flog
So called because it was first raised at Tausten, Mars. in 1774, it was one of the first stage raide by the American colonies. It was a British flog hot with the words "Liberty and Union" added.



1775-Culpapper Fing
The Minutemen of Culpapper Coonty, Virginia, carried this flar into battle in 1775. The ratilesance was a warning to the British:
"Deer Trace (Step) on Me."



1775—Pine-Tree Flag
The pine tree was the aymkel of t
Massachusetts Coëny, and this fi
was flown by the ships of the new
created United States Navy in Ne
Bosland waters.



1775-Novy Jack
This was one of the first of our flags to use thirteen stripes (for the original thirteen colonies), which we still use on our flag today. It was used by the orderial was



1775—Continental Flag
This version of the Pine-Tree flag
may also have been carried at
Bunker Hill, since it is shown in a
fatroous painting of that hattle.



1775—Bunker Hill Fleg
This British flar was changed by
adding the Massachusetts pine tree
symbol. It was carried by American
troops at the battle of Bunker Hill.



1775—Grand Union Flog
This was the first flag used by all
the colonies in the War for Independence. It was first used by John
Paul Jenes on his ship, and then by
George Washington at his headounters.



1776-Liberty Tree Flag
Adopted by the Massachusetta
Council. The real Liberty Tree was
a big elm tree in Boston. Many
