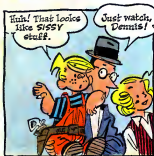


FIRST, THEY WILL DO THE ROUND DANCE, VERY MUCH LIKE OUR PRESENT-DAY FOLK-DANCING.



Huh! That looks like Sissy stuff.

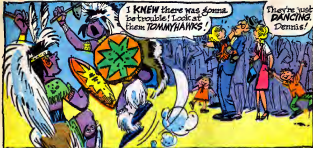

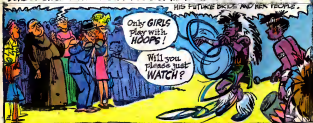




I **KNEW** there was gonna be trouble! Look at them **TOMMYHAWKS!**

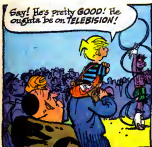
They're just **DANCING**, Dennis!

Yeah?



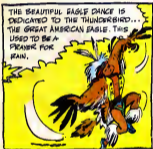
