ACADEMIES OF THE FACULTY OF MEDICINE

The Academies of the Faculty of Medicine, approved by Faculty Council in November, require the approval of Academic Board before implementation. Academies will be considered by the Academic Board P. & P. (Planning and Priorities) Committee on February 23 and by the A.P. & P. (Academic Policy and Programs) Committee on March 3. On March 25, the recommendations of these committees will be taken to the full Academic Board.

In preparation for the presentations to Academic Board and the actual implementation of Academies, the Undergraduate Medical Curriculum Committee is developing guidelines for the composition of the search committees for Academy Directors and criteria for the assessment of academy proposals. An Academies subcommittee of UMCC drafted recommendations on these matters for consideration by the UMCC on February 3. This subcommittee is chaired by Rick Frecker (Department of Biomedical Engineering). Members are: Pat Brubaker (Department of Physiology), Heather Maclean (Department of Nutritional Sciences), Stuart McCluskey (Medical Society), Peeter Poldre (Department of Medicine), John Ross (Department of Medicine), Harvey Skinner (Department of Behavioral Science), Larry Spero (Department of Pharmacology) and Bill Tucker (Department of Surgery). The Academies subcommittee of UMCC will remain active and will have primary responsibility for the review of proposals for academies.

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UPDATE ON STRATEGIC PLANNING COMMITTEE The Strategic Planning Committee has begun a series of meetings to develop a strategic plan for our Facul-A strategic plan is necessary to develop our Faculty's vision and to ensure that Faculty activities and resources are focused on areas of greatest relevance to this vision. The plan will also be a vehicle for communication of the priorities and directions of our Faculty. The plan will be the starting point for further departmental planning and will be useful for the evaluation of performance in the medium and long term. Broad consultation is planned in all stages of production of the plan. There will be open forums, meetings with Faculty committees and other interested groups, working groups on selected issues, circulation of draft documents, and the encouragement of written submissions. Consultation will be through both Departments and Faculty Council. Two planning retreats are planned. Regular reports on the progress of the planning process will appear in FAXulty OF MEDICINE.

For a consultative planning process to work in an organization as complex and diverse as our Faculty, a framework for effective interaction must be established. To assist with creating this framework and to ensure that we have a workable plan in place as soon as possible, the Strategic Planning Committee determined that a facilitator would be required. After interviewing eight individuals and receiving six written proposals, Neil Stuart of Price Waterhouse has been retained to act as the facilitator for the Strategic Planning Process. Neil has a Ph.D. in health policy from Brandeis University. He has facilitated a number of strategic planning exercises and other assignments in the health field for such clients as University of Ottawa, Medical Research Council, Ontario Cancer Institute, and the Toronto Academic Health Sciences Council. 1993 AIKINS AWARDS NOMINATIONS

All teachers in the undergraduate medical program are eligible for the W.T. Aikins Awards, named after William Thomas Aikins, the first Dean of the University of Toronto Medical School (1887-1893).

Up to two Awards may be given annually in each of three categories: 1) individual teaching performance; 2) development and use of innovative instructional methods; 3) course development and coordination. Each nomination requires the signatures of five faculty members and/or students. In addition, full documentation, appropriate for each category of nomination, must be available to the Teaching Awards Subcommittee.
