On page two of the letterhead memorandum it is reported that Bayard Rustin told King that he wanted to bring one Robert Gilmore (phonetic) with Lim at the Thursday meeting in New York City. When King agreed to this, Rustin advised that he would tell Harry Wachtel that it was agreed that Gilmore could come. The meeting in question apparently refers to that of King's advisors or sometimes referred to as the "research committee." x

Bufiles contain a reference to one Robert Gilmore who was reportedly born 12/10/22, Proctor, Vermont, and who was the Secretary of the New York office of the American Friends Service Committee as of 6/61. This individual is possibly identical to the Robert Gilmore who is subject of New York file 105-8921.

New York should make effort to fully identify the Proert Gilmore who may be becoming a part of the advisor group to King and should his name again come up as a participant in any of the group's meetings, he should be appropriately characterized if adverse information concerning him is available.





Set out below is the translation of an article which appeared in the newspaper "L'Unita," issue of 9/22/64, an Italian language newspaper published in Rome, Italy.

London LUTHER KING: The Pope is Friend of the Negroes.

The Reverend Martin Luther King, presently in London for the launching of his last book dedicated to the racial problem entitled "Why We Cannot Wait," declared today that Great Britain also would have racial difficulties if the people do not exercise constant vigilance.

Recalling his recent audience with the Pope, King said that Pope Paul VI has never hidden his friendship for the Negroes. This meeting, added King, left him with the impression that, according to the Catholic Church, segregation is morally condemnable.

Concerning the United States, where he returns tomorrow, the Reverend King has declared that, after the approval of the civil rights law, the situation has considerably improved in the Southern States. The day is not far away, he concluded, when the barriers of segregation in the Southern States will collapse completely.

King said further that a victory by
Senator Goldwater in the Presidential election would
in America signify "one great and dark night
of social destruction." Such a victory, he
added, would signify an attempt to set back the
clock of history.



ROME, Sept. 18-The Rev. Martin ROME, Sept. 18—The Rev. Martin Luther King, one of the outstanding Negro leaders in the U.S. civil rights struggle, has high hopes that his private interview with Pope Paul VI Friday will lead to a re-emphasized stand by the Roman Catholic Church against racism against racism.

King, in an exclusive interview at his Rome hotel, stated that he did

not have a specific agenda for his papal interview other than explaining the status of the racial situation in the U.S. today but that he hoped they would be able to discuss it fully in relation to the Catholic Church Church.

"Of course, I hope that the Pope will see fit to release a statement about our talk," he explained cautiously. "The Roman Catholic Church has already let its opposition to racism be knewn and it has been of great help to us in our work. But I think if every individual Cathelia olic was made aware of the Church's stand by the Pope, it would be of great assistance to the civil rights movement in the future.

King said in an airport press conference before flying to Madrid that the Pope promised he would make a public declaration supporting non-violent means for advancing the cause of the Negro and of civil rights. The Pope did not say when

he would make it, however.
The Pontiff also asked King for some of his writings, and the American Negro pastor said he would send the Pope his two books, "Strength To Love," and "Why We Can't Wait."

King was in high spirits after the historic gathering. Earlier in the historic gathering. Earlier in St. Peter's Square talking to journalists he showed them a silver medal of the Ecumenical Council that the Pope had given him and quoted the Pontiff as saying. "I am a friend of the Negro people."



"The Southern Patriot" was cited as an "organ" of the SOUTHERN CONFERENCE FOR HUMAN WELFARE (SCHW) by the Committee on Un-American Activities, House Report 592, on the SCHW, June 12, 1947. U

The SCHW was cited as a communist front by the Committee on Un-American Activities, House Report 592, June 16, 1947.

An amendment to the charter of the SCHW changed the name of that organization to the SCEF, and listed its purpose as being to improve the educational and cultural standards of the Southern people in accordance with the highest American democratic institutions, traditions, and ideals. The amendment was dated April 26, 1946.

A source advised on March 2, 1961, that CIAUDE LIGHTFOOT, a Communist Party functionary, stated at a meeting of the Communist Party in Baltimore, Maryland, on February 25, 1961, that the Communist Party is not connected with any progressive movement but indirectly they do have some influence in the SCEF.

A second source, who is familiar with some phases of Communist Party activity in the New Orleans area, advised on May 27, 1963, that during the time the SCHW was in existence, Communist Party (CP) members were members of and worked actively in the SCHW. However, since the formation of the SCEF, rank and file CP members have not been encouraged to work in the SCEF. The source stated that the SCEF is a progressive, liberal organization, which he considers a CP front organization because it has gone along with the Communist Party on certain Issues, particularly on the racial question.

On May 27, 1963, the second source advised that in the past he has considered JAMES DOMBROWSKI, the Executive Director of the SCEF, to be a Communist, if not an actual Communist Party member, because he followed 25/71- --- 19803 AADDA

A confidential source, who has furnished reliable information in the past, adviced on September 25, 1954, that Bayard Rustin (the organizer of the March on Washington, August, 1963) was in contact on that date with an unidentified woman. According to the source, they discussed a youth conference which was recently held in Washington, D.C. Rustin said the conference went off very well.

Rustin told the woman that he also had a meeting at the A. Philip Randolph Institute (A. Philip Randolph, President of the Brotherhood of Sleeping Car Porters, American Federation of Labor - Congress of Industrial Organizations, AFL-CIO). In that regard, he said he spoke with two man from the office of George Meany (President, AFL-CIO), who were very interested in the A. Philip Randolph Institute (Washington, D.C.). In view of Meany's interest, and the fact that he (Meany) was prepared to say that the AFL-CIO was willing to give \$10,000, many other unions would fall into line, Rustin said.

Continuing, Rustin said "they" wanted him to proceed vigorously to try to get the tax exemption (for the A. Philip Randolph Institute) because "they" said at the "present time"

Rustin was very high on both President Johnson's and Humphrey's list as a result of his work at Atlantic City, (during the National Democratic Convention). In view of that, Rustin said, he spoke to Joseph Raut (Vice President of the Americans for Democratic Action, ADA, and General Counsel to the United Auto Workers, AFL-CIO), who said he was prepared to push the tax exemption through the Department of Justice.

The same confidential source advised on September 25, 1964, that Bayard Rustin was in contact with Martin Luther King, Jr. (President, Southern Christian Leadership Conference, SCLC), on that date. Among the matters considered was a speaking engagement to which King is committed for Sunday, November 11, 1964, in Newark, New Jersey. In that regard, King acid Don Newcombe (ex-major league baseball player) had contacted him about the engagement. He said he did not desire that his appear at the affair be a major speach because he had to speak in Brooklyn, New York, on the same date.

Rustin told King of a request he had received from Leon Davis (President, Local 1199, Drug and Hospital Employees Union, Retail, Wholesale and Department Store Union, RVDSU, AFL-CIO), that King also speak in Newark on the same day. This speech, Rustin said, would be in behalf of hospital workers in Newark who Rustin said were having a hard time with an organizing drive.

Rustin said that in addition to King's speech, that he (Rustin), A. Philip Randolph and others would be speaking as well. XV

According to the source, King got an assurance from Rustin that he would not be speaking before a political gathering, but the affair would be concerned solely with the Negro struggle. Rustin promised to furnish King with additional details when he "arrived down there next week" (to attend the SCLC conference in Savannah, beginning on September 29, 1964).

On September 26, 1964, the same source advised that Rustin was in contact with an unidentified woman on that date. Rustin related that he had recently talked with Dr. Logan (Dr. Arthur Logan, Chairman of the Board of Directors of the Haryou-Act), who informed him that he (Rustin) was being considered for an appointment to the Board of Directors of Haryou-Act.

It should be noted that Haryou-Act is a combination of Harlem Youth Opportunities Unlimited and Associated Community Teams, whose purpose is to fight juvenile delinquency in Harlem.

The same source advised on September 27, 1964, that Bayard Rustin was in contact with an unidentified male on that date. Pustin said he was leaving New York City, on Tuesday, September 29, 1964, and would be gone for four days. But before he leaves the city, Rustin said he would write a statement endorsing Johnson (President Lyndon B. Johnson), which King would use under his own name.

Rustin then talked about the A. Philip Randolph Institute, and in this regard, listed the names of the following, who he said would be advisors: Roy Wilkins (Executive Secretary, National Association for the Advancement of Colored People, NAACP); Martin Luther King, Jr. (President of the SCLC); Whitney Young (Executive Secretary, National Urban League), as well as othersat Rustin said it was very important that the public see/ tipse civil rights leaders were aligned with the Institute.

In continuing his concern for the Institute, Rustin said he was going to open an office in Harlem to handle the affairs of the Institute. He said the office would be opened in his name, not in the name of the Institute.

During their contact, Rustin told of his recent appearance before a youth conference in Washington, D.C. He said he had learned in that regard that he had made were favorable impression on representatives of the Labor Department. (apparently referring to representatives attending the conference).




In "The Saturday Evening Post", issue of July 11-18, 1964, page 76, Bayard Rustin is the subject of a feature article captioned: "The Lone Wolf of Civil Rights". In it, Rustin is said to have come to New York in 1938, as an organizer for the Young Communist League (YCL), and as such, he had the job of recruiting students for the "Party". Furthermore, the article reports that during his first years in New York, Rustin gave most of his carnings to the "Party". He reportedly left the "Party" in 1941, the article states.

The YCL has been designated purshant to Executive Order 10450.

The "Daily Worker", February 11, 1957, page 1 column 2, reported that Rayard Mustin, Executive Secretary, War Resisters League, was an observer at the 16th National Convention of the Communist Party, United States of America (CP, USA), held in New York City, on February 9-12, 1957.

The "Daily Worker" was an East Coast Communist publication until it ceased publication on January 13, 1958.



A confidential source, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised in January, 1961, that Thomas D vid Kahn admitted being a member of the Young People's Socialist League (YPSL) from 1957 to 1961 and a member of the National Elecutive Committee of the YPSL during the same period. For characterization of (YPSL), see attached characterization of Young Socialist League. In "The Saturday Evening Post", issue of July 11 - 18, 1954, page 76, Bayard Rustin is the subject of a feature article captioned "The Lone Wolf of Civil Rights". In it, Rustin is said to have come to New York in 1930, as an organizer for Young Communist League (YCL) and as such, he had the job of recruiting students for the Party . Furthermore, the article reports that during his first years in New York, Rustin gave most of his earnings to the "party". He reportedly left the Party in 1941, the article states. 4



YOUNG SOCIALIST LEAGUE (YSL)

The March 1, 1954, issue of the "Young Socialist Challenge," published as page three of "Labor Action," an official publication of the Independent Socialist League (ISL), contained an article concerning the creation of the YSL, which pointed out that at a unity conference occurring February 12-14, 1954, at Labor Action Hall, New York, New York, a merger occurred between the Young People's Socialist League (YPSL) and the Socialist Youth League (SYL). The new organization was mamed the YSL. M

A confidential informant on June 15, 1954, made available the minutes of the YSL's National Action Committee meeting of April 13, 1954, which reflected that one S. SITEMAN, "Chairman of SP (Socialist Party) Youth Committee," had objected to a statement appearing in "Commerce," a New York University journal, which indicated that the YPSL merged with the SYL to form the YSL. He explained that the YPSL did not merge with anyone, that it continued to exist as the youth section of the Socialist Party. He explained that a small group of the YPSL was dropped, expelled, or suspended from that organization and joined the SYL, which he characterized as the youth group of the "Trotskyite ISL." He explained that after these few former members of the YPSL joined the SYL, the SYL them proceeded to change its name for its own purposes. Ly

On April 9, 1956, another confidential informant advised as follows: χ_{ℓ}

The YSL has frequently worked in close sympathetic cooperation with the ISL toward similar objectives, although each major issue given mutual consideration is decided upon by these organizations individually. The YSL serves as an apprenticeship for the ISL, but ISL selection of members from YSL ranks is made on an individual and personal basis. In many instances YSL members are also members of the ISL, (



We have just obtained details of his itinerary for travel abroad which reveals that he will leave the United States either 9/11 or 12/64 and not return until 9/22/64. Included in his itinerary is a visit to Rome, Italy. He is to go there from Madrid, Spain, 9/18/64, and remain in Rome until the morning of 9/20/64 when he will go to London, England. We have not as yet obtained any information indicating the purpose of his visit to Rome, but it is entirely likely that he may seek and be given an audience with the Pope. This likelihood is clearly evident when one considers that King is receiving more and more acclaim as a leader of the Negro people in this country, plus the fact that he is a clergyman. Further, King we know is being considered for the Nobel Peace Prize and his receiving an audience with the Pope would likely receive considerable publicity, especially in Europe, further enhancing his chances for the Prize. It would be shocking indeed for such an unscrupulous characte as King to receive an audience with the Pope. It is believed that if a plan to see the Pope is in the making, it ought to be nipped in the bud. We have considered different possibilities for meeting this problem and believe that the best one would be to have Assistant Director Malone of the New York Office personally contact; and on a highly confidential basis (1) the fact that King is to visit Rome and the likelihood of his receiving an audience with the Pope and (2) the unsavory nature of King's character, both from a subversive and Malone should be able to impress upon likely embarrassment that may result to the Pope should he grant King an audience and King is later discredited. In this light it would hardly even be necessary for Malone to "suggest" what should do to forestall any possible audience. It was reported that Martin Luther King, Jr., and some of his associates are in the process of preparing an article which is to be submitted to "The Saturday Evening Post" for possible publication. While it is indicated that the article will deal with certain matters such as the the the certain matters such as the the certain Poverty Bill, elections, riots and the so-called "backlash" there is no definite indication as to the line which the article will follow or the stands which King will take in the article. It is King's intention to have the article published before the forthcoming national elections.

Receiving offices should be extremely alert to obtain all available information concerning the article in question and specifically what its contents will be. Keep the Bureau promptly advised so that interested Government agencies and officials may be apprised.

It is noted that King is considering having a meeting with some of his advisors in New York City. 9/22/64 concerning the article. New York should consider necessary coverage for the purpose of identifying the persons with whom King will meet. Be alert to information which will be available through your established sensitive sources just subsequent to such meeting as the sources are! likely to divulge contents of the article.
