The following observations are being submitted for the future guidance of the Miami Office in handling information concerning captioned subject.

As you are aware, the matter of the communist influence in the racial movement is of extreme importance to the Bureau and the subject of a continuing intensive investigation. The position of Martin Luther King, Jr., as a prime individual in the racial movement, coupled with known communist influences upon him, makes him also of prime investigative importance. His activities are closely followed and the Bureau desires prompt notification of all information pertaining to King.

Atlanta rad to Bureau and Miami 11/13/64 which reported that King and an associate were intending to go to Miami 11/18/64 and return 11/21/64, purpose of trip unknown, was the first information known by the Bureau of King's intentions to visit Miami. This radiogram prompted Datal of same date (11/13/64) to Atlanta and Miami soliciting further details. Subsequent teletypes from Miami (11/14/64) and Atlanta (two on 11/14/64) clarified the nature of King's trip and furnished sufficient specifics to enable the Bureau to be reasonably well informed.

Specific reference is now made to Miami airtel and letterhead memorandum (LHM), copy to Atlanta, 11/13/64 "Proposed Visit to Miami, Florida, and Miami by Martin Luther King - 11/13/64, Racial Matters," received at the Bureau 11/16/64. These communications contained sufficient information to inform the Bureau as to King's plans but because of their receipt not until 11/16/64, the use of several teletypes between the Bureau, Atlanta and Miami were necessary. Had the information obtained by Miami 11/13/64 been immediately given to the Bureau, there would have been a savings by all parties concerned.

Miami should insure that airtels leaving its Office are mailed on the same day as dated. Because King is the subject of a current Security Matter - C investigation, Atlanta

origin, communications principally concerning him should be captioned as above. Of course, if the matter pertains primarily to the communist influence in racial matters, it should be captioned CIRM. Note also that the LHM referred to above indicated that King's visit to Miami and Bimini was for rest and relaxation "and has nothing to do with any proposed civil rights or racial matters." The Miami airtel therefore should not have been submitted with a "Racial Matters" character.

The foregoing should be brought to the attention of Agent and supervisory personnel who are in the future to handle matters pertaining to King and CIRM.

ReAtlanta 11/16/64, copy to New York, above caption as well as concerning Martin Luther King, Jr. Enclosed was a letterhead memorandum bearing the same dual caption.

It was reported that on 11/12/64 one Theodore Brown, not further identified, contacted Dora McDonald, King's secretary. He told her that the resolutions that were proposed and discussed when King was in New York the previous week were being forwarded to King and that these proposals are then to be presented to President Johnson. Brown did not discuss what the proposals were. The reference to the resolutions being proposed and discussed when King was in New York are in obvious reference to King's meeting on 11/5/64 in New York City with his advisors which meeting concerned activities of the Southern Christian Leadership Conference (SCLC). Reairtel set out a lead for the New York Office to determine the identity of Brown and whether any information of a security nature is available concerning him.

In view of the intentions of parties concerned to present certain proposals to President Johnson, it is highly desirable that the nature of these proposals be determined so that such information may be passed on by the Bureau to interested parties. Recipient offices should be most alert to information being received through its usual sources for data which would serve to inform as to the nature of the proposals.

Inasmuch as it appears that Theodore Brown is an individual of some importance in this matter and possibly even a member of King's group of advisors, every possible effort should be made to fully identify this individual.

Appendix pages were not numbered. They should be numbered 6 and 7*. The Appendix characterization of the Maryland Committee for Democratic Rights is not the latest available. On page 7* change date of May 20, 1963, to May 28, 1964, thus bringing this characterization up to date. Also add a statement to page 7* that the confidential source furnishing the information has supplied reliable information in the past.

In connection with the Director's briefing of the women reporters yesterday, the Director has requested documentation on several matters including the ages of the individuals convicted in the McComb, Mississippi case; ⁹³¹⁰ and place of conviction of Bayard Rustin [REDACTED] and whether or not he has been or is in the Communist Party; the Albany, Georgia, statements by Martin Luther King; and the five Agents and their birthplaces at Albany, Georgia. b7(c)

DOCUMENTATION:

McComb, Mississippi, Case:

There follows the names and ages of the individuals sentenced in the McComb, Mississippi, bombing case:

Bayard Rustin:

Rustin was born 3-17-13 at West Chester, Pennsylvania, and was educated at Wilberforce University and the City College of New York. He was a member of the Young Communist League, a cited organization, from the late 1930's to the early 1940's. The July 11-18, 1964 issue of the Saturday Evening Post, in an article entitled "The Wolf of Civil Rights," points out that Rustin was "an organizer for the Young Communist League" who admits his membership in the American Student Union in 1939 (cited as a communist front by the House Committee on Un-American Activities) but claims he withdrew from the organization in 1940 to embrace the Quaker religion. Rustin has been referred to as an expert on "civil disobedience" and a leading exponent on pacifism. He has been active in numerous picket lines.

and demonstrations and has been an agitator against military conscription and racial segregation for which he has been arrested on several occasions. Since 1942, he has been field representative for the Fellowship of Reconciliation and has been Executive Secretary of the War Resisters League. He is considered an orator of national prominence. He has also been a secretary to Reverend Martin Luther King. Rustin has reportedly attended Communist Party conventions and was listed as an "impartial observer" at the Communist Party National Convention in 1957. He has traveled to Africa with pacifists to protest against hydrogen bomb tests by French authorities (1959) and accompanied American pacifists to England to protest production of nuclear weapons (1953).

Martin Luther King's Statement in Albany, Georgia:

Considerable publicity was given to statements made by Martin Luther King concerning the situation in Albany, Georgia, at the time he highly criticized the FBI. His statements were made on 11-18-62 during an interview in the Bobing Room of the Riverside Church in New York City where King had just preached a sermon. King was quoted as stating, "Because FBI Agents have sided with segregationists, they have not investigated beatings and other intimidations of Negroes who are fighting for equality in Albany, Georgia, and surrounding areas." Another statement of King's was, "One of the great problems we face with the FBI in the South is that the Agents are white southerners who have been influenced by the mores of the community." He is also quoted as stating, "Everytime I saw FBI men in Albany, they were with the local police force."

Five Agents In Albany, Georgia:

In connection with Martin Luther King's criticism of the FBI taking sides with the segregationists in Albany, Georgia, and that the Agents are white southerners who have been influenced by the mores of the community, it is noted that four of the

BAYARD RUSTIN

In "The Saturday Evening Post", issue of July 11-18, 1964, page 76, BAYARD RUSTIN is the subject of a feature article captioned "The Lone Wolf of Civil Rights." In it, RUSTIN is said to have come to New York in 1938, as an organizer for the Young Communist League (YCL) and as such, he had the job of recruiting students for the "Party". Furthermore, the article reports that during his first years in New York, BAYARD RUSTIN gave most of his earnings to the "Party". He reportedly left the "Party" in 1941, the article states.

The YCL has been designated pursuant to Executive Order 10450.

The "Daily Worker", February 11, 1957, page 1, column 2, reported that BAYARD RUSTIN, Executive Secretary, War Resisters League, was an observer at the 16th National Convention of the Communist Party, United States of America (CP, USA), held in New York City, on February 9-12, 1957.

The "Daily Worker" was an east coast Communist publication until it ceased publication on January 13, 1958.

We are recommending dissemination to the White House, Secretary of State Rusk and the Acting Attorney General, information concerning plans which are under way by Martin Luther King, Jr., and his associates (men with communist backgrounds such as Bayard Rustin) for welcoming-back festivities when King returns to the U. S. from Norway where he is to receive the Nobel Peace Prize 12/10/64.

We have received information from our reliable sensitive sources in New York City regarding recent contacts between King, Rustin, Ralph Bunche of the United Nations (UN) and Harry Wachtel, the latter being another King advisor with a communist background. Such activities are in the planning stage as a fund-raising speech by King at Carnegie Hall; King being received at the UN with the possibility that others present at the UN will include Leonid I. Brezhnev, First Secretary, Communist Party Soviet Union, and Kwame Nkrumah, President of Ghana; and a possible ticker tape parade. Bunche is being considered as possible chairman of the committee honoring King and contact has already been made with White House aide Lee White to have President Johnson present in New York City although no commitment has yet been made by the White House. Efforts also being made to have King see English Prime Minister Harold Wilson in London and to have an affair in London honoring King which will raise funds for King's work in Mississippi.

Concerning King's possibly meeting Wilson in London, Rustin is scheduled to go to London 11/11/64 to work on this matter.* A separate memorandum from F. J. Baumgardner to W. C. Sullivan was prepared today (11/10/64) concerning the Wilson matter and recommending alerting the British to King's intentions and background.

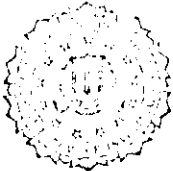

On November 7, 1964, a confidential source, who has furnished reliable information in the past, furnished information that Barry Wachtel contacted Bayard Rustin on that date. Wachtel mentioned that he arranged with the approval of Martin Luther King, Jr., (President of the Southern Christian Leadership Conference) (SCLC), for the man who ran the affair for Eleanor Roosevelt to run this affair (the affair at which Martin Luther King, Jr., will be honored upon his return from receiving the Nobel Peace Prize in Oslo, Norway, in December, 1964). Wachtel also mentioned that King was quite pleased in getting Misselson (phonetic) to handle this matter. Continuing, Wachtel remarked that this man (Misselson) will be in charge but will be assisted by Saul Mills. Wachtel made the comment that it will be worth it to have a professional in charge. Wachtel stated that he had contacted the White House and "the Kennedy front" on this. Wachtel suggested that he and Rustin meet with Saul Mills in order to discuss the matter. X (u)

Wachtel stated that he has Louis Martin (of the Democratic National Committee) "lined up", and believes the President will come, and Wachtel stated that he is still waiting to hear from Kennedy (Senator-elect Robert Kennedy of New York) on whether he plans to attend the affair. X (u)

Wachtel instructed Rustin to speak with Ralph Bunche (of the United Nations) and tell him that the United Nations luncheon for King would be better after King returns, but he told Rustin to leave the final decision to them. Wachtel said that December 4th would be better than the 17th because it is just after the opening of the General Assembly and that there will be more prominent people there. Wachtel suggested the possibility that Nkrumah (of Ghana) and Brezhnev will be there and that it might become a "real head of state deal". Wachtel asked, "Can you imagine Brezhnev embracing Martin like Khrushchev did Castro?" Rustin replied in the affirmative. X (u)

Rustin remarked that it might be necessary for him to make several calls to London, and he inquired of Wachtel how to pay for them. Wachtel stated that they should have an SCLC credit card for such things. Wachtel stated that he does not mind working for the SCLC "on the cuff but that the out of pocket expenses are killing" him. Wachtel instructed Rustin to speak with King or Andy (Andy Young, an assistant of Martin Luther King, Jr.) about it. X (u)

Rustin inquired about going to Oslo (with King), and Wachtel suggested Rustin do as he had done. Wachtel stated that he told King that he has "my resignation in your pocket" as far as going is concerned, and Wachtel further stated he would not feel bad if King thought his (Wachtel's) presence might cause King some embarrassment and cause King to accept the resignation. Wachtel said he told King that King and Bunche could go on one plane and the rest of the party could travel on a different plane. Wachtel also mentioned if volunteers (to go on the trip) are wanted Cleve (Cleveland Robinson, Secretary-Treasurer of District 65, Retail, Wholesale and Department Store Workers Union, American Federation of Labor-Congress of Industrial Organizations) (AFL-CIO) and Clarence (Clarence Jones) want to go. X (u)

Wachtel stated that Saul Mills and Nisselson will have suggestions and proposals which will be submitted for "our" approval. Wachtel stated that no plans will be made for a ticker tape parade (for King) until the answer is received from the President. According to Wachtel, Louis Martin should be given something to do even if it is just selling tickets. X (u)

Rustin made mention of using an armory (in New York City in connection with King's return), and he stated that it would be necessary to contact the Governor (Governor Nelson Rockefeller of New York) who is vacationing in Spain. Wachtel indicated that this could be done later since there will be more ideas for the Governor's participation. Wachtel mentioned that the Mayor (Mayor Robert Wagner of New York City) will have the ticker tape parade, U. Thant (Secretary-General of the United Nations) can have the dinner, and the Governor can have the reception for King. X (u)

Rustin contacted Cleveland Robinson on November 7, 1964, and mentioned that Wachtel had gotten Saul Mills to help out with the affair (for King). Robinson stated that he did not remember Mills except from the "old progressive days" and that was all he knew about him. Rustin stated that was the same person, and Rustin suggested that he (Mills) could do some of the leg work but "they" do not want him out in front. Rustin made it known that they were not certain about the President's attendance at the affair and both agreed that the success of the affair depends on the President's attendance. X (u)

Bayard Rustin contacted Martin Luther King, Jr., on November 7, 1964, and Rustin brought up the question of whom King will have with him on the trip (to Oslo). Rustin suggested that King and two or three others go on the plane and the rest of the group follow. King agreed and stated he felt six could go with him and this would be a reasonable group. Rustin stated it was necessary to send a cable to Governor Rockefeller in Madrid, Spain, in order to obtain permission to use the armory for the meeting; King gave permission to do this. Rustin mentioned he is beginning the draft of the major speech which King will deliver and King can finish it. X (u)

The source advised that on November 7, 1964, Rustin was in contact with Peggy Duff of London, England, Executive Director of the Campaign for Nuclear Disarmament. He informed her that Martin Luther King would be in London. X (u)

on December 6 and 7, 1964, and inquired of Duff as to whether Prime Minister Wilson would be prepared to receive King on either of these dates. Duff said she would check into that. Rustin said it should not appear as though it was King's idea, and said it was preferred that Prime Minister Wilson announce he was inviting King to visit him. X (u)

Rustin inquired if there was a group of peace minded people in London who would work to raise money for "our" work in Mississippi, to which she replied in the affirmative. He explained that the reason for the fund raising was that "we" are some two million dollars in the hole in Mississippi business and there are about seventeen churches which have to be rebuilt. X (u)

In conclusion, Rustin suggested that Duff might make arrangements to have the London Embassy of some African Nation have a reception for King while he is in London. X (u)

The same confidential source advised on November 9, 1964, that Bayard Rustin and Andrew Young (Executive Director of the SCLC) were in conference during the night of that date. Their contact, the source said, was in regard to Rustin making a trip to London on Wednesday, November 11, 1964, for the purpose of clarifying some confusion existing over the fact that the Archbishop of Canterbury desired to meet with King but due to King's affiliation with the Baptist Church, there was opposition to his receiving King. X (u)

Furthermore, Rustin said his trip would also be for the purpose of ascertaining if King could meet with Prime Minister Wilson while in London. X (u)

Rustin told Young that he would secure his airline ticket for the trip on Wednesday and would charge it to the SCLC account. X (u)

In "The Saturday Evening Post", issue of July 11-18, 1964, page 76, Bayard Rustin is the subject of a feature article captioned: "The Lone Wolf of Civil Rights". In it, Rustin is said to have come to New York in 1938, as an organizer for the Young Communist League (YCL), and as such, he had the job of recruiting students for the "Party". Furthermore, the article reports that during his first years in New York, Rustin gave most of his earnings to the "Party". He reportedly left the "Party" in 1941, the article states.

The YCL has been designated pursuant to Executive Order 10450.

The "Daily Worker", February 11, 1957, page 1 column 2, reported that Bayard Rustin, Executive Secretary, War Resisters League, was an observer at the 16th National Convention of the Communist Party, United States of America (CP, USA), held in New York City, on February 9-12, 1957.

The "Daily Worker" was an East Coast Communist publication until it ceased publication on January 13, 1958.

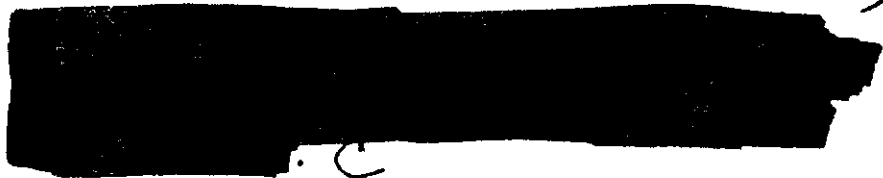

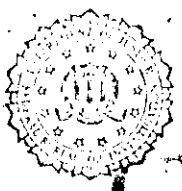

A confidential source, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised on November 11, 1964, that Bayard Rustin (Organizer of the March on Washington, D.C.) was in contact on that date with an unidentified woman. During their contact, Rustin was asked why he was not in London, England. He replied that he had planned to go to London on that date, but said he had waited too long to apply for his passport, and due to the holiday (Veterans Day), it was not processed. He said the passport office was closed but that "Frank Montero, who works for United Nations Ambassador Adlai Stevenson", arranged to get the office open (New York Passport Office) but nothing could be done since the Washington Passport Office was closed. He said he had tickets (airline) for tomorrow (November 12, 1964) and planned to go then. ~~X~~ (u)

The source said Rustin also conferred with Peggy Duff of London, England (Executive Director of the Campaign for Nuclear Disarmament) on November 11, 1964. Duff, according to the source, said there was nothing new on the Archbishop of Canterbury matter. Rustin asked if she thought he could take care of all the matters on Friday so that he would be able to return to New York on Friday night. Duff said she thought he could accomplish everything in one day. X (u)

On November 9, 1964, the same source advised that Bayard Rustin and Andrew Young (Executive Director of the Southern Christian Leadership Conference, SCLC) were in contact on that date, during which time they discussed the fact that confusion had arisen in London over Martin Luther King's trip to London in December, 1964. Rustin asked Montero if he did not think that "our people" (United States Embassy) in London should do something (apparently alluding to King's visit there). Montero replied in the affirmative, adding, however, that "we have a stuffy Ambassador there by the name of Bruce, but it may be possible". X (u)

YOUNG SOCIALIST LEAGUE (YSL)

The March 1, 1954, issue of the "Young Socialist Challenge," published as page three of "Labor Action," an official publication of the Independent Socialist League (ISL), contained an article concerning the creation of the YSL, which pointed out that at a unity conference occurring February 12-14, 1954, at Labor Action Hall, New York, New York, a merger occurred between the Young People's Socialist League (YPSL) and the Socialist Youth League (SYL). The new organization was named the YSL. ()

A confidential informant on June 15, 1954, made available the minutes of the YSL's National Action Committee meeting of April 13, 1954, which reflected that one S. SITLEMAN, "Chairman of SP (Socialist Party) Youth Committee," had objected to a statement appearing in "Commerce," a New York University journal, which indicated that the YPSL merged with the SYL to form the YSL. He explained that the YPSL did not merge with anyone, that it continued to exist as the youth section of the Socialist Party. He explained that a small group of the YPSL was dropped, expelled, or suspended from that organization and joined the SYL, which he characterized as the youth group of the "Trotskyite ISL." He explained that after these few former members of the YPSL joined the SYL, the SYL then proceeded to change its name for its own purposes. ()

On April 9, 1956, another confidential informant advised as follows: ()

The YSL has frequently worked in close sympathetic cooperation with the ISL toward similar objectives, although each major issue given mutual consideration is decided upon by these organizations individually. The YSL serves as an apprenticeship for the ISL, but ISL selection of members from YSL ranks is made on an individual and personal basis. In many instances YSL members are also members of the ISL. ()

YOUNG SOCIALIST LEAGUE (YSL) CONT'D.

The YSL and ISL utilize the same printing house in New York City and the YSL publication is printed as an insert in "Labor Action." Frequently, lecturers before the YSL are ISL members. ()

The September 22, 1958, issue of "Young Socialist Challenge," which appeared as page five of "Labor Action," contained an undated statement from the National Action Committee of the YSL which indicated that the YSL had been dissolved. The statement appeared under the caption "Join the Young Peoples Socialist League." ()

The YPSL is publicly known as the youth affiliate of the Socialist Party-Social Democratic Federation. ()

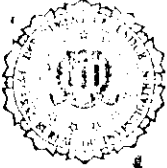

On November 12, 1964, a source, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised that the Reverend MARTIN LUTHER KING, Jr. arrived at Oberlin College, Oberlin, Ohio, at approximately noon on October 22, 1964. He addressed the student body shortly after his arrival, had luncheon with the college faculty, held a press conference, and then a forum for students and left Oberlin at approximately 4:30 PM on October 22, 1964 for Cleveland, Ohio. The source stated there were no incidents or demonstrations during Reverend KING's stay in Oberlin.

An article in the "Oberlin Review", Oberlin College student newspaper, issue of October 23, 1964, reflected that Reverend MARTIN LUTHER KING, Jr. in his appearance at Oberlin on October 22, 1964, elaborated on his opposition to the Republican Presidential nominee, Senator BARRY GOLDWATER. The article quoted Reverend KING as stating, "GOLDWATER is not a racist himself, but his ideas unfortunately support those who are."

The article reflected that Reverend KING emphasized the long road ahead in achieving full rights for Negroes. He condemned the riots in Northern cities last summer and stated they were not connected with the organized movement for Negro rights.

Commenting on specific actions in the Negro quest for equality, Dr. KING praised the Mississippi Freedom Democratic Party as "one of the most creative ideas which has come out of the movement." He expressed admiration of the courage of students who go into the South to participate in such projects.

The article further reflected that when asked whether he prefers preferential treatment for Negroes, KING said, "I wouldn't like to see Negroes putting white men out of their

"jobs, but after 300 years of segregation, we need special programs to help us close the national gap."

Confidential sources of this Bureau who have furnished reliable information in the past have supplied the following information concerning plans being made by Martin Luther King, Jr., and his associates concerning King's receipt of the Nobel Peace Prize which is to take place December 10, 1964, at Oslo, Norway.

On November 3, 1964, Bayard Rustin contacted the secretary of Dr. Ralph Bunche, Undersecretary for Special Political Affairs, United Nations (UN). Rustin stated that he was speaking on behalf of Martin Luther King, Jr., and requested to see Bunche regarding the receipt of the Nobel Peace Prize by King. (u)

Subsequently on November 3, 1964, Rustin conferred with Bunche and told him that upon King's return to New York City, after receiving the Nobel Prize, there is to be a welcoming affair at either a large dinner at a hotel or an activity at Carnegie Hall. Rustin told Bunche that King wanted to know whether Bunche would be prepared to be chairman of the welcoming committee which will include civil rights leaders and "a number of key liberals." Bunche said that he would be glad to be chairman, but that he would have to be informed as to the others who will be on the committee since there are some people with whom he will not work. Bunche told Rustin that he had sent a letter to King advising King that the Secretary General of the UN was hoping that King would visit the UN upon his return. Rustin told Bunche that he would personally meet with Bunche later and go over the details relative to King visiting the UN. Rustin also told Bunche that an invitation had been extended by the President of Brazil to have King visit Brazil on his way back to the United States. Rustin stated that he felt that this was not wise due to certain aspects of the regime in power in Brazil and inquired as to what Bunche's thoughts were on this matter. Bunche agreed that it was not a very good idea for King to visit Brazil at this time. (u)

On November 3, 1964, Rustin was in contact with Harry Wachtel concerning King's return to the United States from Norway. Rustin stated that King is considering making a speech at Carnegie Hall and selling tickets for the affair, the minimum price to be \$100. Wachtel said that King has inquired about the possibility that President Lyndon B. Johnson might attend such an affair, but that the President would not give an answer until after the election. According to Wachtel, Lee White, a White House aide, has stated relative to the President's attendance "the answer is not no." White has indicated that if the President could not attend, the President would send the Vice President in his place. Rustin indicated that a cocktail party would be held before the Carnegie Hall address by King. (u)

Rustin and Wachtel then discussed who might assist in the arrangements. Wachtel stated that Saul Mills had handled the arrangements for a concert for "us" and had made \$45,000 for "us." According to Wachtel, Mills is interested in the King affair and has submitted a memorandum of ideas on the subject. Rustin and Wachtel agreed to meet with Mills to discuss the matter. Wachtel stated that he would send Rustin a copy of the memorandum by Mills and in reference thereto Wachtel said that he thought the plans in the memorandum were too ambitious for they included an address by King before Congress and a ticker tape parade. (u)

Wachtel told Rustin that he is handling the details concerning King's trip to Norway and has spoken to the Norwegian Ambassador. (u)

Rustin then informed Wachtel that King desires to have Dr. Bunche and some white person to act as cochairmen of the affair welcoming King back to the United States, but that Bunche will not accept until he knows who the white person will be. Rustin indicated that he had considered having Senators Robert Kennedy and Jacob Javits as cochairmen so that there would be a nonpartisan element present. Rustin stated that after due consideration he thought it would probably be best to just have Bunche as chairman and have a subcommittee assisting him. Wachtel agreed with this idea. Rustin also informed Wachtel that King had been invited by the President of Brazil to visit that country, but that King (u)

should tell the Brazilian President that while he would like to visit that country, he will be unable to do so on his return trip from Norway and would be unable to visit Brazil until after the beginning of the new year. (u)

On November 7, 1964, Wachtel contacted Rustin concerning the plans for welcoming King back to the United States and Wachtel stated that he had spoken to the White House and "the Kennedy front" regarding this matter. Wachtel said that he has Louis Martin of the Democratic National Committee "lined up." It is Wachtel's belief that President Johnson will come to New York City. Wachtel stated that he is waiting to hear from Senator Robert Kennedy in this matter as well. (u)

Wachtel instructed Rustin to speak with Dr. Bunche and tell him that if the UN gave a luncheon for King, it would be better if held after King's return to the United States, but that the final decision is being left to the UN people. Wachtel suggested that if the UN affair was held before King's departure for Norway, December 4, 1964, would be a good date because it is just after the opening of the General Assembly at the UN and there will be many prominent people there. Wachtel noted the possibility of Leonid I. Brezhnev, First Secretary, Communist Party of the Soviet Union and Kwame Nkrumah, President of Ghana, being at the UN. Wachtel asked "Can you imagine Brezhnev embracing Martin like Khrushchev did Castro?" Rustin replied in the affirmative. (u)

Wachtel stated that no plans will be made for a ticker tape parade for King until an answer is received from President Johnson. According to Wachtel, Louis Martin of the Democratic National Committee should be given something to do "even if it is just selling tickets." Rustin mentioned the possible use of an armory and stated it would be necessary to contact Governor Nelson Rockefeller of New York who is vacationing in Spain. Wachtel indicated that this could be done later by telephone since there will be additional ideas for the Governor's participation. Summarizing, Wachtel mentioned that Mayor Robert Wagner of New York City could have the ticker tape parade; U Thant, Secretary General, UN, could have the dinner for King; and Governor Rockefeller could have the reception for King. (u)

On November 7, 1964, Rustin was in contact with King and mentioned that he is beginning the draft of the major speech which King is to deliver and that King can complete it. On November 7, 1964, Rustin also contacted Peggy Daff, a resident of London, England, who is Executive Director of the Campaign for Nuclear Disarmament. Rustin told her that King will be in London on December 6 and 7, 1964, and that Rustin wanted to know if Harold Wilson, Prime Minister of England, would be prepared to receive King. Daff indicated that she would check into this. Rustin said that it should not appear as though this was King's idea and that it was preferred that Wilson announce that he is inviting King to visit him. Rustin inquired of Daff as to whether there is a group of "peace-minded people" in London who would work to raise money for "our work in Mississippi." Daff replied in the affirmative and Rustin explained that the reason for raising funds is that "we" are some \$2,000,000 "in the hole on the Mississippi business" and that there are about 17 churches which have to be rebuilt. Rustin suggested that arrangements might be made to have the London Embassy of some African nation have a reception for King while he is there. (u)

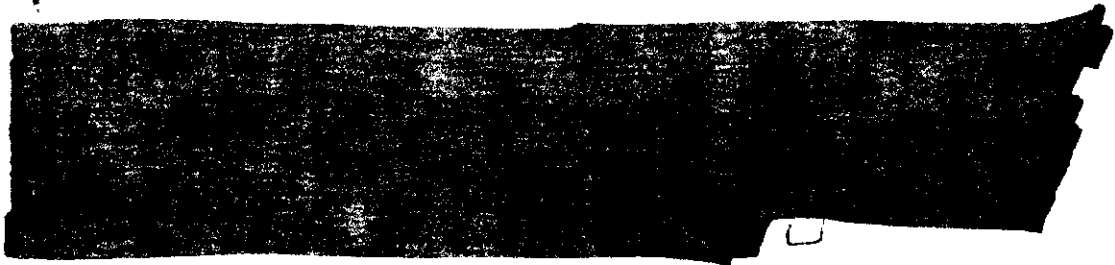
On November 9, 1964, Rustin told an associate that he was departing for London on November 11, 1964, for the purpose of clarifying a confusion which has developed surrounding King's trip to Europe in December, 1964. The confusion arises from the fact that the Archbishop of Canterbury desires to receive King, but has been opposed by certain elements since King is a Baptist. Rustin also indicated that while in London he is going to determine whether or not King will be able to meet with Prime Minister Wilson. (u)

Bayard Rustin is a frequent advisor to King and is a former member of the Young Communist League, an organization which has been designated as subversive pursuant to Executive Order 10450. U

Harry Wachtel, also a frequent advisor to King, is the Executive Vice President of the Gandhi Society for Human Rights, a fund-raising adjunct of the Southern Christian Leadership Conference, which Conference is headed by King. [REDACTED]

of key liberals". In response to this, Bunche said he would be glad to be Chairman, but he said that he would have to be informed of the others who will be on the committee since there are some people with whom he will not work. Rustin told him that they would discuss this matter.

Bunche told Rustin that he had sent a letter to King advising him that the Secretary General of the United Nations was hoping that King could visit the United Nations upon his return. Rustin stated that this was being planned and the matter would be worked out at the meeting on Thursday. Rustin advised that he would personally meet with Bunche and go over the details to be sure that everything is satisfactory.

Rustin told Bunche that an invitation had been extended by the President of Brazil to have King visit Brazil on his way back to the United States. Rustin stated he felt that this was not due to certain aspects of the regime in power. Rustin inquired as to what Bunche's thoughts were on this matter, and Bunche stated that he agreed that it was not a very good idea to go at this time.

In response to Bunche's question regarding the length of King's visit to New York City, Rustin said that King would be in town only one day and would be leaving on Thursday evening.

The same confidential source furnished information that Rustin contacted Harry Wachtel on that date. They discussed the meeting (to be held on November 5, 1964, in New York City), and Wachtel mentioned that Larry Redden would attend the meeting but would not be there until the evening. Wachtel stated that King felt that he (Wachtel) would not be interested in the structural arrangements anyway.

Wachtel mentioned that he had conferred with King and Andy (Andy Young, Assistant to King) on Saturday (October 30, 1964), night. Wachtel said that the reason for

the conference was to discuss some pamphlets which were issued by a man named Clayborn (phonetic) of the Republican National Committee urging Negroes to write in King's name for the Presidency. Wachtel mentioned that in regard to this, the Democratic National Committee wanted King to do certain things which King was reluctant to do. It was finally agreed that four things should be done: X

1. To warn radio and television about taking advertisements from unidentified groups in violation of the Federal Communication Commission.
2. To have a press conference for King.
3. To give the matter wide coverage.
4. To have Andy prepare a statement on the affair on the theme "Waste Your Vote". X

Rustin remarked that Andy is not very clear on political questions. Rustin said that in Detroit, a group of Conrad Lynn's "crowd" had prepared signs that King was supporting the Freedom Now Party, and he said that "we" had to argue with Andy for an hour to convince him he should "smack that down". Rustin stated that Andy just did not understand it. Wachtel indicated that he was glad to know this and that he would watch Andy. X

Rustin mentioned that King is giving consideration (with regard to his returning after receiving the Nobel Peace Prize) to his making a speech at Carnegie Hall and selling tickets for this affair which would start at \$100.00. He stated that King would be directing this toward the wealthy crowd. Rustin mentioned King was thinking about doing this instead of having a dinner. Wachtel said that the wealthy people do not like to go to Carnegie Hall. According to Wachtel, he has inquired about the possibility that the President might attend, but he said that he had learned the President would not give an answer until after the election. X

Wachtel remarked that Leo White told him that "the answer is not no" and indicated that if the President could not come he would send the Vice President. Both Rustin and Wachtel agreed that the Carnegie Hall idea would be more simple than a dinner. Rustin said a cocktail party would be held before the speech for "the \$100.00 people" from 7:00 to 8:30. X

Rustin stated that Wachtel had mentioned two people who might be interested in the thing and he wanted to know what they had said. Wachtel stated that Saul Mills, who handled the concert for "us" and made \$45,000 for "us" is interested and has submitted a memorandum of ideas on the subject, but Wachtel added that "you" will have to make the decision. At Rustin's suggestion, both men agree to meet with Mills to discuss the matter. Wachtel said that he would send Rustin a copy of the memorandum by Mills. In referring to the memorandum Wachtel said that it is too ambitious and includes an address to Congress and a ticker tape parade. Rustin made the comment that they would cut him down to size. X

According to Rustin, he will be in Oslo during the preparations. Wachtel said there will be three events in Oslo: a presentation of prizes at 1:00 PM, on the afternoon of the 10th, at which King will make a five minute speech; a formal dinner-ball that evening; and the Nobel Lecture at 45 to 50 minutes the next evening at the university. Wachtel said he is handling the details of the trip and has spoken to the Norwegian Ambassador. According to Wachtel, King will have to be in Oslo by the 9th (of December), at the latest. X

Rustin informed Wachtel that King wants to have Ralph Bunche and some white person to act as co-chairman of the affair (to welcome King home) but that Bunche will not accept until he knows who the white person will be. Rustin indicated that he had considered having (Robert) Kennedy and Javits (Senator Jacob Javits) as co-chairman to be non-partisan or to have Theodore Kheel (former President of the Gandhi X

Society for Human Rights) since he has access to a lot of money. Wachtel remarked that Kheel does not have access to a lot of money. Rustin suggested that it would be the easiest way to just have Bunch as chairman and then have a sub-committee, and Wachtel agreed with this position. X

Wachtel informed Rustin that he has been raising some funds for the trip expenses. It was agreed that King would have to be there on the 9th and would not be able to leave before the 15th. Rustin remarked that he felt King should be home by the 17th (of December). X

Rustin informed Wachtel that King had been invited by the President of Brazil to stop there on his way back to the United States from Oslo. Rustin said that King should tell Brazil that he would like to come but cannot on his way home from Oslo and cannot until after New Year's. Wachtel agreed and said he would not like for King to be associated with the "crowd" in Brazil since he (Wachtel) does not like that regime. X

In referring again to the reception (for King upon his return), Wachtel said that he has gotten some dates at various hotels which could be used for the reception and the speech. He stated that the Americana is all right for the 17th (of December) and the Waldorf is free for the 15th. Both men agreed that the affair should be held before the 18th of December. X

It is to be noted that Lee White is a Special White House Assistant.

In "The Saturday Evening Post", issue of July 11-18, 1964, page 76, Bayard Rustin is the subject of a feature article captioned: "The Lone Wolf of Civil Rights". In it, Rustin is said to have come to New York in 1938, as an organizer for the Young Communist League (YCL), and as such, he had the job of recruiting students for the "Party". Furthermore, the article reports that during his first years in New York, Rustin gave most of his earnings to the "Party". He reportedly left the "Party" in 1941, the article states.

The YCL has been designated pursuant to Executive Order 10450.

The "Daily Worker", February 12, 1957, page 1 column 2, reported that Bayard Rustin, Executive Secretary, War Resisters League, was an observer at the 10th National Convention of the Communist Party, United States of America (CP, USA), held in New York City, on February 9-12, 1957.

The "Daily Worker" was an East Coast Communist publication until it ceased publication on January 13, 1958.

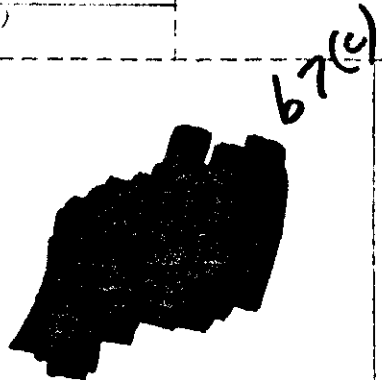

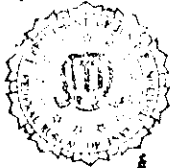

A story in the Louisville Times, Louisville, Kentucky, a newspaper of general circulation, on November 3, 1964, reports as follows:

Posters and handbills urging Negroes to vote by write-in for Dr. Martin Luther King for Presidency of the United States in the current election have been distributed statewide. These posters and handbills carried the name of the "Committee for Negroes in Government", Louisville, Kentucky, as the sponsoring organization.

The Attorney General of the State of New Jersey Arthur J. Sills reportedly announced that 1.4 million of the handbills were ordered by Clay Claborne, identified as an aide of the Republican National Committee, who furnished a copy and told the printer to bill the "Committee for Negroes in Government", 1905 Cedar, Louisville, Kentucky. Claborne was further identified as a former Atlantic City, New Jersey newspaperman who had been on the staff of the Republican National Committee since 1962 and who had been a featured speaker in September of 1964, at the Louisville convention of the National Federation of Republican Women.

Sills reportedly said that although the printer was told to bill the "Committee" in Louisville, Kentucky, an unidentified man came to the printing plant and paid \$2,500 cash.

The case originated in Louisville, Kentucky, a newspaper of general circulation on November 3, 1964, in a story regarding these activities identified the printer as Frank Keller, Atlantic City, New Jersey. This article also quoted allegations that the "Committee for Negroes in Government" was a "political committee and was not registered with the House of Representatives as a bona fide campaign organization as required by law."

Nathan Jacobs, Chicago, Illinois, president of Hazel and Jacobs, an advertising agency, said that his agency was hired to place spot radio announcements by the "Committee". Jacobs identified Thomas D. Frazier, 1905 Cedar, Louisville, Kentucky, as chairman of the "Committee" and Oliver Miles, 1533 West Kismet, as secretary. Jacobs said that his firm paid \$10,000 for the cost of the radio spots to be broadcast in eleven cities.

Two of the spot announcements were critical of President Johnson's civil rights and a third was devoted to the critical campaign for Dr. King. The announcements were halted after Reverend King denounced them.

Thomas D. Frazier, identified as chairman of the "Committee for Negroes in Government" is a Republican voter captain in the 23rd Precinct of the 20th Ward and was working at a polling place at 1926 West Kismet, Louisville, Kentucky, on November 3, 1964. Frazier refused to comment concerning the "Committee" or the organization mentioned in the story said. A reporter who went to talk to Frazier was ejected from the polling place.

Miles, about forty years old, was identified in the story as a Republican worker at a polling place at 428 South 16th Street, Louisville (23rd Precinct, 10th Ward). Miles reportedly refused to comment concerning the "Committee". The story noted that a "Vote For King" placard was posted on a utility pole near the polling place where Miles was working.

The story indicated that Frazier and Miles were employees of the City of Louisville in the Works and Sanitation Departments, respectively.

In connection with the story there appeared a photograph of Earl Stroad, also identified as a City employee, as he contemplated a poster urging Negroes to vote for Dr. Martin Luther King. Stroad reportedly had a number of the posters in his car and indicated that Frazier had given him the posters with instructions to put them up at polling places.

Denunciations of the "write-in" campaign by Dr. Martin Luther King and denials by local and national Republican sources of knowledge of the campaign were reported.

A confidential source of this Bureau who has furnished reliable information in the past supplied the following information concerning a contact between Martin Luther King, Jr., and Clarence Jones on November 4, 1964. *L*

Jones said that now that the election is over they should think about what form "of struggle they should use," adding that he had been discussing it with "our friend." Jones said that he had heard rumors from responsible Democratic people in New York that King may be offered an official role in the Administration. Jones told King that King should think about this and that King must translate his moral influence into political power. King replied that he would think about the matter, taking into consideration "the movement and my personal goal." Jones also told King that King should think about what role "our friend" can play in this period, commenting that "our friend" had been helpful and has abided by the "decisions." Jones expressed the belief that "our friend" should be given some role inasmuch as "we're not in the same situation as we were with the Kennedy Administration." Jones also referred to the fact that the Civil Rights Bill is now the law. King replied "Good, after the election it would be a new situation." *L*

Jones is a frequent advisor to King and in the mid-1950's held a position of leadership in the Labor Youth League, an organization which has been designated as subversive pursuant to Executive Order 10450. According to confidential sources of this Bureau who have furnished reliable information *L*

[REDACTED] furnished the following information concerning the visit of Martin Luther King, Jr., President of the Southern Christian Leadership Conference, Atlanta, Georgia, to Detroit, on October 30, 1954.

Martin Luther King arrived from Chicago, Illinois, via chartered airplane at 11:50 a.m. at the Detroit City Airport. He traveled in a motorcade comprised of nine cars throughout Detroit, and was accompanied by local politicians and clergymen. During the course of the speeches, he advocated non-violence and stated he was not in favor of an all Negro party. He stated he was opposed to the "Freedom Now Party".

A characterization of the "Freedom Now Party" appears in the appendix hereto.

He stated he would not endorse either presidential candidate, however, he said he was not going to vote for Barry Goldwater for President. He then urged all the people he talked to to vote for the candidate who would serve them best.

Martin Luther King, Jr. spoke at the following locations during the above-mentioned visit to Detroit:

CME, St. John's Church, Brent's Restaurant, Northern High School, Congress On Racial Equality Headquarters, Jefferies Housing Project, Brewster Housing Project.

COMMUNIST INFLUENCE IN RACIAL MATTERS

The October 27, 1964, edition of the "Baltimore Afro-American," a newspaper published twice weekly, reflected that the Reverend Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING will speak in Baltimore at a Saturday afternoon "Get-Out-To-Vote" rally on October 31, 1964. This announcement was made by the Reverend A. J. FAYNE, Chairman of a ministers' committee planning the arrangements and the Reverend SIDNEY DANIELS, Co-Chairman. U

News sources in the Baltimore area on October 31, 1964, and November 1, 1964, reflected that Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING arrived at the Baltimore Friendship International Airport on the evening of October 30, 1964. On Saturday, October 31, 1964, Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING travelled in a motorcade from the Lord Baltimore Hotel to Gay and Aisquith Streets in Baltimore. At this point Dr. KING briefly addressed a large crowd from the back of a truck after being introduced by BAYARD RUSTIN. A confidential source of this Bureau who has furnished reliable information in the past supplied the following information concerning a contact between Martin Luther King, Jr., and Clarence Jones on November 4, 1964.

Jones said that now that the election is over they should think about what form "of struggle they should use," adding that he had been discussing it with "our friend." Jones said that he had heard rumors from responsible Democratic people in New York that King may be offered an official role in the Administration. Jones told King that King should think about this and that King must translate his moral influence into political power. King replied that he would think about the matter, taking into consideration "the movement and my personal goal." Jones also told King that King should think about what role "our friend" can play in this period, commenting that "our friend" had been helpful and has abided by the "decisions." Jones expressed the belief that "our friend" should be given some role inasmuch as "we're not in the same situation as we were with the Kennedy Administration." Jones also referred to the fact that the Civil Rights Bill is now the law. King replied "Good, after the election it would be a new situation."

Jones is a frequent advisor to King and in the mid-1950's held a position of leadership in the Labor Youth League, an organization which has been designated as subversive pursuant to Executive Order 10450. According to confidential sources of this Bureau who have furnished reliable information in the past King and Jones frequently refer to Stanley David Levison by the term "our friend" and Jones frequently serves as an intermediary between King and Levison. As of July, 1960, Levison was a secret member of the Communist Party, USA.

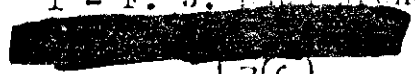

Recently, a number of King's associates, including attorneys representing him, have been negotiating with the "Post" in an effort to have a portion of the article which had been submitted for publication changed. The "Post," however, has indicated a reluctance to make the requested change. It is reported that the article contains some criticism of other civil rights groups and leaders and that inasmuch as King recently received the Nobel Peace Prize, the article should not be critical, but instead should try to unite all civil rights movements. It has also been indicated that King does not want to go too far in the article in condemning civil disobedience because if Senator Barry Goldwater is elected President, King may call for sit-ins and other forms of protest. There is concern in the King camp that the article, if published as originally submitted, would cause certain difficulties in the civil rights movement. ()

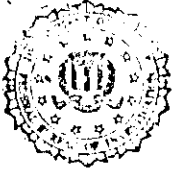

[REDACTED] furnished the following information concerning the visit of Martin Luther King, Jr., President of the Southern Christian Leadership Conference, Atlanta, Georgia, to Detroit on October 30, 1964. Martin Luther King arrived from Chicago, Illinois, via chartered airplane at 11:50 AM at the Detroit City Airport. He traveled in a motorcade comprised of nine cars throughout Detroit and was accompanied by local politicians and clergymen. During the course of his speeches, he advocated non-violence and stated he was not in favor of an all-Negro party. He stated he was opposed to the Freedom Now Party.

"The New York Times", August 24, 1963, page one, carried an article entitled, "An All-Negro Party for 1964 is Formed". The article related that a national all-Negro political party was being organized. It hoped to run its own slate in the congressional and local elections in 1964. A tentative national committee had obtained offices at 81 East 125th Street, New York City.

A leaflet entitled, "A Call for a Freedom Now Party" was publicly circulated in the summer of 1963 and called for the formation of a Freedom Now Party "with an all-Black slate and a platform for liberation".

Martin Luther King, Jr., stated he would not endorse either presidential candidate, however, he was not going to vote for Barry Goldwater for president. 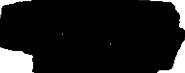

Bearing in mind the extreme importance of gathering factual information concerning the King-Levison relationship, recipient offices should be extremely alert to all available information concerning any forthcoming meeting between King and Jones which might also be attended by Levison. New York should initiate appropriate discreet spot checks of Jones and Levison for the next few weekends and for a day or two preceding the weekends.

The Bureau should be kept promptly advised of all pertinent developments in this matter.

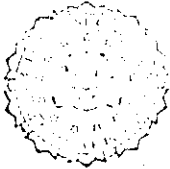

On October 20, 1964, a source who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised that Reverend MARTIN LUTHER KING, Jr., would spend the day of October 23, 1964, in Cleveland, Ohio, under the sponsorship of the National Council of Churches.

On October 21, 1964, the above source furnished the following time schedule for the Reverend KING's visit:

- "9:30 A.M. Clergy delegation meets Dr. KING at Sheraton Cleveland Hotel to escort him to Olivet Institutional Baptist Church, 8714 Quincey Ave. Travel to Olivet Church by shortest and fastest route. No stops or efforts to attract attention at this point.
- 10:00 A.M. Dr. KING speaks to clergy breakfast in Olivet Institutional Baptist Church
- 12:00 Noon Dr. KING leaves Olivet Church and travels by shortest, fastest route to outdoor meeting at corner of East Boulevard and Superior Avenue.
- 12:30 P.M. Dr. KING speaks to outdoor meeting at East Boulevard and Superior Ave.
- 1:30 P.M. Motorcade leaves East Boulevard-Superior heading for intersection of Hough and Crawford Rd.
- 1:45 P.M. Brief stop at Hough-Crawford intersection for speech via sound truck and greetings to crowd.
