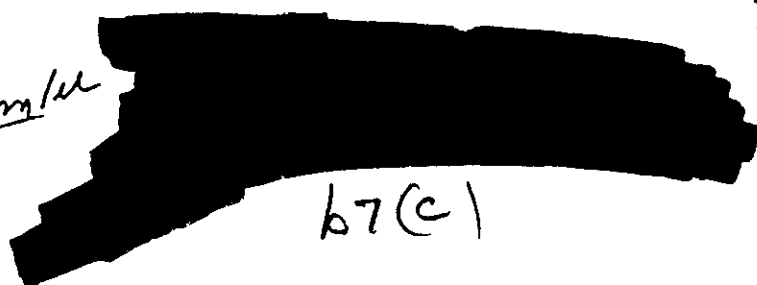

Bruce Solberg, Legislative Aide to Congressman Ashley, telephonically contacted Bureau Headquarters on 3-30-65 to speak with an Agent. SA [redacted] talked with him. He explained he has "a couple of inquiries" from constituents relating to a newspaper article which apparently indicated the FBI has information concerning the Reverend Martin Luther King, Jr., but has not made this information available to Senators and Congressmen. He said the article allegedly appeared in the "Toledo Blade" but he did not know the date. He was inquiring so that he would know how to reply to the constituents' questions relative to the FBI not providing Congressmen and Senators pertinent information concerning Dr. King. b7(c)

It was pointed out to Mr. Solberg that information in FBI files is confidential by Departmental order. He inquired as to the identity of this Departmental order pointing out that it would assist him in his response to the constituents if he could refer to the specific order. He was told that the order was Departmental Order #324-64, issued October 8, 1964.

Pages 5149-5164. Congressman Andrews, (D) Alabama, spoke concerning the situation in Selma, Alabama, pointing out that several weeks ago he offered a resolution asking for an impartial congressional committee be appointed to go to Selma and determine what the true facts are, what the people and business officials are doing and have been doing, and what outside agitators are doing and have been doing in recent weeks. He stated "My resolution has not received favorable action. The cunningly calculated torment of Selma and Dallas County is the biggest, cruelest, and most unjust publicity stunt staged in a long time. - - - In my opinion the presence of Dr. King in Alabama is solely responsible for the trouble we are having today. His record indicates that wherever he goes there is trouble. - - - Recently one of the greatest Americans of all times—a man who is knowledgeable about crimes of all types and about criminals of all stripes—Mr. J. Edgar Hoover, the able Director of the Federal Bureau of Investigation, stated publicly that Martin

Luther King is not one of—but 'the most notorious liar in the United States of America.' - - - Mr. Hoover has not retracted that statement, and I cannot for the life of me see how so many misguided people in America have followed and continue to follow a man with the reputation that King has." Several other Congressmen joined Mr. Andrews in his remarks. Miscellaneous newspaper articles, etc., were included with this discussion. Page 5158, Congressman Williams, (D) Mississippi, in joining in these remarks, stated "not only would I endorse Mr. J. Edgar Hoover's characterization of Martin Luther King as the 'most notorious liar in America,' but I would add that I consider him the most notorious gangster of our generation. Everywhere this man goes, trouble and violence follow, always accompanied by the sound of dollars dropping into his till as 'contributions' to his 'work.'" Congressman Dickinson, (R) Alabama, (page 5159) commented on the newspaper account in connection with the attempted march in Selma. He stated "The fact is, Mr. Speaker, that there were no whips—none used or even in existence and this was purely a lie and a fabrication by some reporters representing some of the news media. I have checked this fact with the Governor, with the local law enforcement officials there, and through other sources. The FBI was there and can substantiate my statement." He also made reference to Communist infiltration of the civil rights movement and stated "J. Edgar Hoover has testified before the House Appropriations Committee that Communists are infiltrating the civil rights movement and seeking to exploit its leaders, according to the Communists' own paper, the Worker." Congressman Waggoner, (D) Louisiana, joined the discussion and included an editorial from the U. S. News & World Report by David Lawrence entitled "The Wrong Way" and an editorial from the Shreveport (Louisiana) Times entitled "The Bloody Racial Picture." The last editorial makes reference to the removal of demonstrators from the White House and states "Why is it wrong for a Governor, a mayor, or a sheriff to do the same thing? After all, an FBI agent testified in an Alabama Federal court that use of gas on Highway 80 was in the interest of public safety."

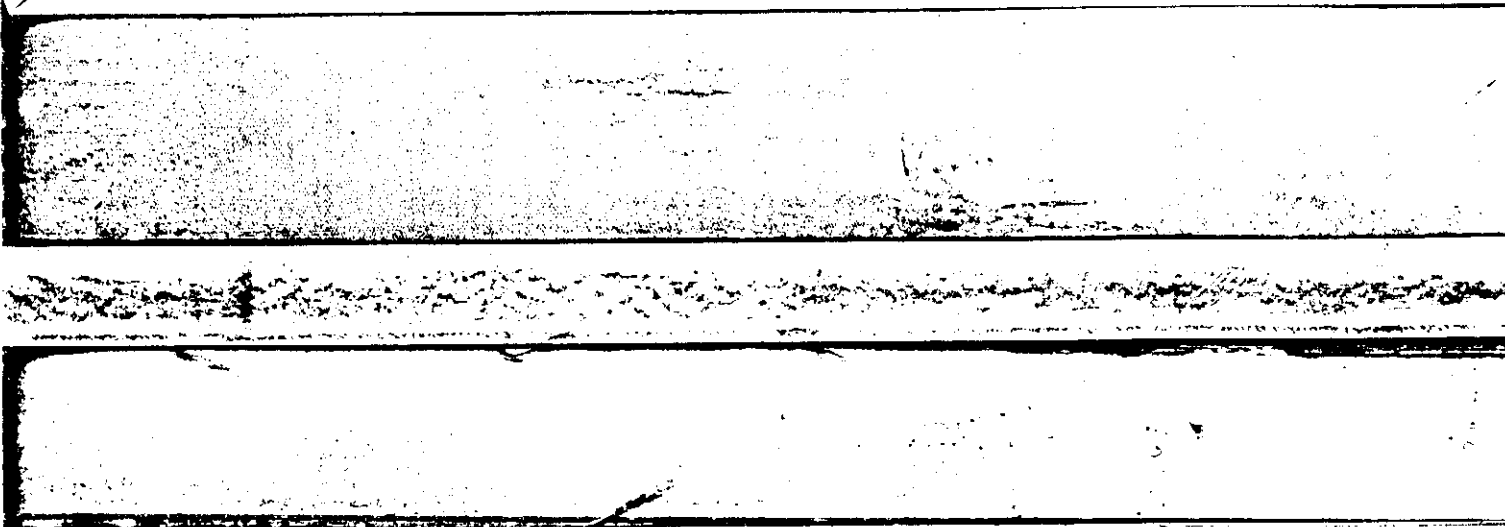

Pages 5986-5987. Senator Williams, (R) Delaware, placed in the Record an article written by Paul Hope entitled "Baker Case Party Girl Admits Being Ex-Red" and published in the Washington Sunday Star on March 28th. Williams stated "Mr. Hope's article is based upon information obtained by the investigators of the Rules Committee and the FBI concerning the manner in which party girls had been used by Mr. Baker and his associates. - - - It is most regrettable that this phase of the inquiry developed by the FBI was so noticeably ignored by both the committee and the Justice Department in their most recent report." The article comments on activities of Ellen Rometsch and states "Last December, the Justice Department showed some members and staff personnel of the Rules Committee an FBI file on Mrs. Rometsch. The committee incorporated a summary of the file in its minutes, but the Democrats voted against going any further into the matter. This portion of the committee's proceedings has not been made public and is not expected to be."

Pages 6011-6012. Senator Dodd, (D) Connecticut, spoke concerning the President's statement announcing arrest of four members of the Ku Klux Klan for the murder of Mrs. Viola Liuzzo. Dodd included the text of the President's statement and a brief statement he issued in support of the President's comments. Mr. Dodd stated "Appropriately, J. Edward Hoover was standing beside the President at that press conference and I say this because Mr. Hoover's outstanding agents in the field worked throughout the night to find the perpetrators of this outrage. And it was especially appropriate to have Mr. Hoover there, because what better reply could there have been to the charges that the FBI has not been zealous enough in protecting civil rights proponents and in fighting the Ku Klux Klan."

Page 6053. Congressman Gathings, (D) Arkansas, spoke concerning the economic boycott of Alabama suggested by Dr. Martin Luther King. Gathings stated "I implore Dr. King to please permit the schoolchildren of Alabama to participate in the school lunch program by the utilization of surplus food commodities, - - - -. At this point, Congressman Andrews, (D) Alabama, stated "I hope the gentleman will remember and that the Members of this House will remember that last December Mr. J. Edgar Hoover, one of the greatest Americans of all time, said that this Martin Luther King was the most notorious liar in this country, and Mr. Hoover until this day has not retracted that statement."

Pages 6055-6056. Congressman Gross, (R) Iowa, spoke concerning the Bobby Baker investigation. He included the article written by Paul Hope which was set forth with remarks of Senator Williams earlier in this memorandum.

Pages 6066-6067. Congressman Cleveland, (R) New Hampshire, spoke concerning use of certain materials in construction of public buildings, referring to the substitution of concrete for stone exteriors of new Federal buildings. He stated "Four structures which would have concrete exteriors have recently been authorized for construction in Washington, at a total cost of \$120 million. These four buildings are the Federal Office Building No. 5, the National Air and Space Museum of the Smithsonian Institution, the Federal Bureau of Investigation Building, and a new headquarters for the Housing and Home Finance Agency." Mr. Cleveland included a brochure entitled "Our Beautiful Capital, Will It Be Marred by the New Trend in Federal Building?" (It is to be noted the General Services Administration advised the architects have not yet presented their recommendations to the Fine Arts Commission as to the exterior treatment for our building.)

Page 6074. The House received a letter from the Attorney General transmitting a draft of proposed legislation entitled "A bill to amend section 4082 of title 18, United States Code, to facilitate the rehabilitation of persons convicted of offenses against the United States." This was referred to the Judiciary Committee.

As you know, United Press International (UPI) has quoted captioned individual as saying, on 3/27/65, that Mrs. Viola Liuzzo might not have been murdered if FBI Agents had advised local officers they had a carload of Ku Klux Klansmen under surveillance. According to a teletype from Selma, received in the Bureau at 1:11 a.m. today, Clark telephonically advised the Selma Resident Agency yesterday that he had had a conference with a newsman during the morning of 3/27/65. He said he told the newsman the FBI had never told him about the car bearing the Liuzzo murderers being in the Selma area. He stated he did not know anything about the car and, if he did by an outside chance, he might have picked them up. Clark further stated that he presumed the FBI had the vehicle under observation. He continued, "I've been getting so much heat from the newspapers on this I had to tell them something. I don't recall receiving any information about the car."

After consultation with Messrs. Belmont and Joseph A. Sullivan, and approval by Mr. Tolson, the attached statement was released at 9:45 p.m., 3/27/65, to Associated Press and UPI.

Since this statement was released, there have been several news reports alleging Sheriff Clark has issued a rebuttal. He has been quoted as saying this is not the first time the Department of Justice has called him a liar. Inspector Sullivan is checking these reports out to ascertain whether Clark has been talking to reporters again, and will report his findings to the Bureau later today. If Clark has been talking, however, I feel we should not attempt to answer any additional remarks he may make regarding this matter. To do so will only feed him more material with which to keep a "feud" going with the Bureau, and I believe we should discourage the development of such a situation, if at all possible.

Additional developments in the Liuzzo murder include a statement made by the Grand Wizard of the United Klans of America, Robert Shelton, that one of the subjects in this matter had been offered a bribe by the FBI for a confession. This bribe is supposed to consist of several hundred acres of land located in Minnesota. A telephonic contact at 11:35 a.m. today with J. L. McGovern, of the Inspection Division, who is in Birmingham, disclosed that absolutely no promises nor offers were made to any of the subjects. Mr. McGovern said this may have originated with the informant in this case since the latter is telling a variety of stories to his attorney, Matt Murphy, in an attempt to divert suspicion from himself.

Shelton has been making a number of wild claims to the press in the past few hours. He has called the President a "damned liar," and he has said that Reverend James J. Reeb was dying of cancer before he was clubbed to death in Selma. The latter has been labeled as "hokum" by John Sullivan, New England Chairman of the American Friends Service Committee, who said Mr. Reeb had undergone a physical examination shortly before joining the Committee on 9/1/64. This examination disclosed Reeb was "in the pink of health," according to Sullivan.

The Director has also received a telegram from Martin Luther King which reads as follows:

"Let me congratulate you and the FBI for this speedy arrest of the accused assassins of Mrs. Luizzo. The Agents assigned to Alabama have done an outstanding job of containing the tremendous violences and savagery which runs rampant under this surface of Alabama life. There is still much work to be done before Alabama is rid of the racist sickness which pollutes her body politic, I am sure that we can continue to count on four efficient services."

I do not believe this wire should be acknowledged because a reply would only help build up this character and a communication from Mr. Hoover, which King would undoubtedly publicize, will tie us in with him, and put us under an obligation to him. I likewise feel that King's telegram to the Director should not be released to the press for the same reasons. Mr. Belmont concurs in these recommendations.

RECOMMENDATION: *I suggest an "in absence" reply.*

MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR.

An article appeared in the Cleveland "Plain Dealer," March 24, 1965, edition, page 1, column 6 and page 11, column 5, captioned "Dr. King, in Cleveland, Tries Not To Limp" under the byline of WILLIAM C. TREON. This article reflected that at a press conference held in the Sheraton-Cleveland Hotel on March 23, 1965, BERNARD LEE, an aide to Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR., stated that on the night of March 22, 1965, Dr. KING was under doctor's care because of badly blistered feet. According to the article, Dr. KING developed the blisters on Sunday and Monday in leading the civil rights march from Selma to Montgomery, Alabama. The article quoted LEE as saying, "He (KING) walked seven miles the first day and 16 miles yesterday. Seventeen more miles face him when he joins the marchers tomorrow morning."

The article pointed out that KING arrived in Cleveland, Ohio, several hours late and his chartered jet plane was rerouted through Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, because of bad weather.

The article stated that Cleveland Police took extraordinary precautions to protect KING. Safety Director JOHN N. MC CORMICK said a squad was assigned to stay close to KING from his arrival at 4:00 PM until his departure for Selma at about 11:00 PM.

"One man--a 48-year-old West Side laborer--was arrested at Hotel Sheraton-Cleveland. He was identified as EDWARD A. SPELIC, 2948 Lorain Avenue. Police said SPELIC, who carried Confederate and American flags, told them he was a member of the National Association for the Advancement of White People. He was held for 'oral threats.'"

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"Dr. KING already was inside when they arrived."

An article appeared in the Cleveland "Plain Dealer," March 24, 1965, edition, page 11, columns 1 through 5, captioned "King Warns Oppression of Negro Can Destroy U. S." This article stated that Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR., 36-year-old Nobel Peace Prize winner, President of the Southern Leadership Conference, spoke at a testimonial dinner in his honor at the Hotel Sheraton-Cleveland, Cleveland, Ohio, on March 23, 1965. This article stated that KING in his address warned that the "seeds of the country's destruction lie in oppression of the Negro. He said that now more than ever before, the United States is challenged to maintain its strength through justice and brotherhood.

"More than 2,200 persons, who paid \$10 or \$25 a plate to hear Dr. KING, frequently interrupted him with spirited applause, especially when he alluded to the civil rights march from Selma, Alabama, to Montgomery.

"Money realized from the dinner will be used to finance civil rights activities such as the Alabama march, which, Dr. KING said, will have cost \$50,000 when it is completed tomorrow.

"Dr. KING's theme last night was 'The American Dream.'

"'America,' he said, is a dream unfulfilled. Now more than ever before, America is challenged to realize this dream...

"'We must act now before it is too late. We cannot afford not to live up to the American dream.'

"This can be accomplished, Dr. KING said, only through a realization that 'all men are heirs of the legacy of dignity and worth.'

"He said, 'the time has come when we all must learn to live together as brothers or all perish together as fools.'

"'Individuals cannot live alone,' he said. 'Neither can nations. All life is interrelated. I can never be what I ought to be until you are what you ought to be, and you can never be what you ought to be unless I am what I ought to be.'

"Dr. KING called for 'massive action' all over the nation to stamp out segregation. He urged his audience to flood Washington with mail in support of the voter registration bill proposed by President JOHNSON.

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"He called JOHNSON's speech asking for such legislation 'the most passionate, eloquent and unequivocal plea for justice ever made.'

"Dr. KING praised the 'ground crew' of the civil rights movement, such as the Alabama marchers.

"'They're the ones I accepted the (Nobel) prize for,' he said. In a real sense, they are the heroes of this struggle.

"Dr. KING was introduced by the Rev. O. M. HOOVER, chairman of the dinner. Both intend to join the Alabama marchers early today.

"Mayor RALPH S. LOCHER greeted Dr. KING. He had proclaimed yesterday as Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Day.

"Gov. JAMES A. RHODES spoke with Dr. KING over the telephone in the afternoon. The governor told him that a last-minute change advancing the dinner from tonight to last night made it impossible for him to attend.

"WILLIAM O. WALKER, publisher of the Call & Post, Negro weekly here, and state industrial relations director, presented Dr. KING with a \$100 check from Gov. RHODES.

"WALKER is a native of Selma. His parents formerly owned the cafe from which the Rev. JAMES J. REEB of Boston walked before he was beaten to death March 9.

"Dr. KING's flight to Cleveland yesterday was delayed by bad weather. When he arrived he looked tired. His voice was soft at an afternoon press conference, but was strong and clear last night.

"At the press conference, Dr. KING said he never allowed 'fears for my life to take possession of me...because I know that our cause is basically right, and it will be triumphant. It will be triumphant no matter what happens to me.'

"Last night's dinner was sponsored by a committee representing a cross-section of Greater Cleveland's community,

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civic and religious life. Councilman JOHN W. KELLOGG, R-18, was coordinator. Toastmaster was W. WILLARD BROWN, director of the University Circle Research Center."


An article appeared in the Cleveland "Plain Dealer," March 24, 1965, edition, page 6, column 1, captioned "Two Priests Here Join Alabama Rights March." This article reflected that the Reverend EDWARD J. GRIFFIN and the Reverend THOMAS J. GALLAGHER, two priests of the Cleveland Catholic Diocese, are joining the civil rights march in Selma, Alabama. According to the article these two priests left here last night aboard Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING's chartered jet. OHIO

The article stated "a spokesman for the diocesan chancery said the two had permission to join the march. This will be the first time a Cleveland priest has participated in a civil rights demonstration in the South, although several took part in the march in Washington in August, 1963.

"Father GRIFFIN, assistant pastor at Holy Family Church, Parma, is active in several community relations groups here. Father GALLAGHER is chaplain of the Catholic Interracial Council in Akron and an assistant at St. Hilary Church there."

Per prior arrangements Congressman Wyatt was introduced to the Director at 10:15 a. m. today by SA [redacted] Crime Research Section.

During a very cordial meeting, Congressman Wyatt stated that ever since his election he had wanted to meet the Director and advise him that he strongly supports the Director and the FBI and that he would be more than happy to render to the Bureau any assistance at any time on any matter that the Director may desire. He advised the Director and the Bureau had been the target of unjust and unfair criticism, particularly regarding Martin Luther King and civil rights, and he wanted the Director to be assured of his support. Wyatt related that he had received between 150 and 200 constituent letters regarding the King matter, all of which supported the Director; none supported King.

The Director briefed Wyatt on the details leading up to the public announcement that King was a liar, including the facts on which King was in error, and reviewed his subsequent meeting with King. Congressman Wyatt obviously holds no respect for King and his associates and stated he was glad the Director called King's hand. Mr. Wyatt said he felt King's power stemmed from the fact that no one in the Administration, except Mr. Hoover, had the courage to say "no."

Mr. Hoover then summarized portions of his testimony before the Warren Commission and pointed out the absurdity of some of Chief Justice Warren's statements relating to the Bureau's not arresting Oswald prior to the assassination. The Director emphasized the unfair criticism of the Bureau and the "Monday morning quarterbacking" by the Warren Commission.

RE: Representative Wendell Wyatt

The Director told the Congressman he felt many courts were taking the handcuffs off the criminal and placing them on law enforcement officers. Mr. Hoover felt this was due not only to "bleeding heart" theorists but also due to incompetent and unqualified individuals on the Bench. The Director cited as an example the case handled by Judge Leighton in Chicago concerning the attack on police officers by a thug with a broken bottle.

The Congressman mentioned that Oregon had, in November, 1964, abolished capital punishment. Mr. Hoover reiterated his position on capital punishment stating he would favor such punishment so long as criminals sentenced to life in prison could and would be released as early as seven years after sentencing. He pointed out the fallacy of stating capital punishment did not act as a deterrent to crime. Wyatt agreed with the Director's position.

Regarding Agent qualifications, the Director stated he had successfully resisted Robert Kennedy's efforts to have qualifications lowered merely to accept Negro applicants. Mr. Hoover stated the Bureau has 25 Negro Agents but all are well-qualified, and he would not lower the standards just to accept Negroes as long as he is Director.

Congressman Wyatt stated the Oregon State Board of Control had instituted a research study of 1,000 check writers to determine if added legislation or parole and probation changes were necessary. The Board had requested assistance from the Identification Division to research criminal records of the 1,000 individuals in this study and had been advised by letter that our work load would not permit us to be of assistance. The Director commented that it had been necessary for us to decline similar requests from 18 states as we simply do not have sufficient personnel to research such projects and still handle over 20,000 fingerprint cards each day. The Congressman stated he understood and appreciated the Bureau's position.

Mr. Wyatt apologized for taking so much of the Director's time and expressed his appreciation to the Director for the interview. A photograph was taken, and the Director told Mr. Wyatt his door was always open to him.

The following references in the file captioned "Bombings in Birmingham, Ala., 5/11/63," file #157-331, contain information concerning the bombings at the residence of Rev. A.D.A. King, brother of Rev. Martin Luther King, and at the Gaston Motel, Birmingham, Ala. On 5/16/63, Rev. King advised that although he had rooms rented at the Motel on the night of the bombings, he had not remained in Birmingham. Rev. King returned to Birmingham and addressed mass meetings on 5/12 and 13/63, despite efforts to discourage him by the Departmental attorney in Birmingham. King urged all participants at the meetings to refrain from acts of violence.

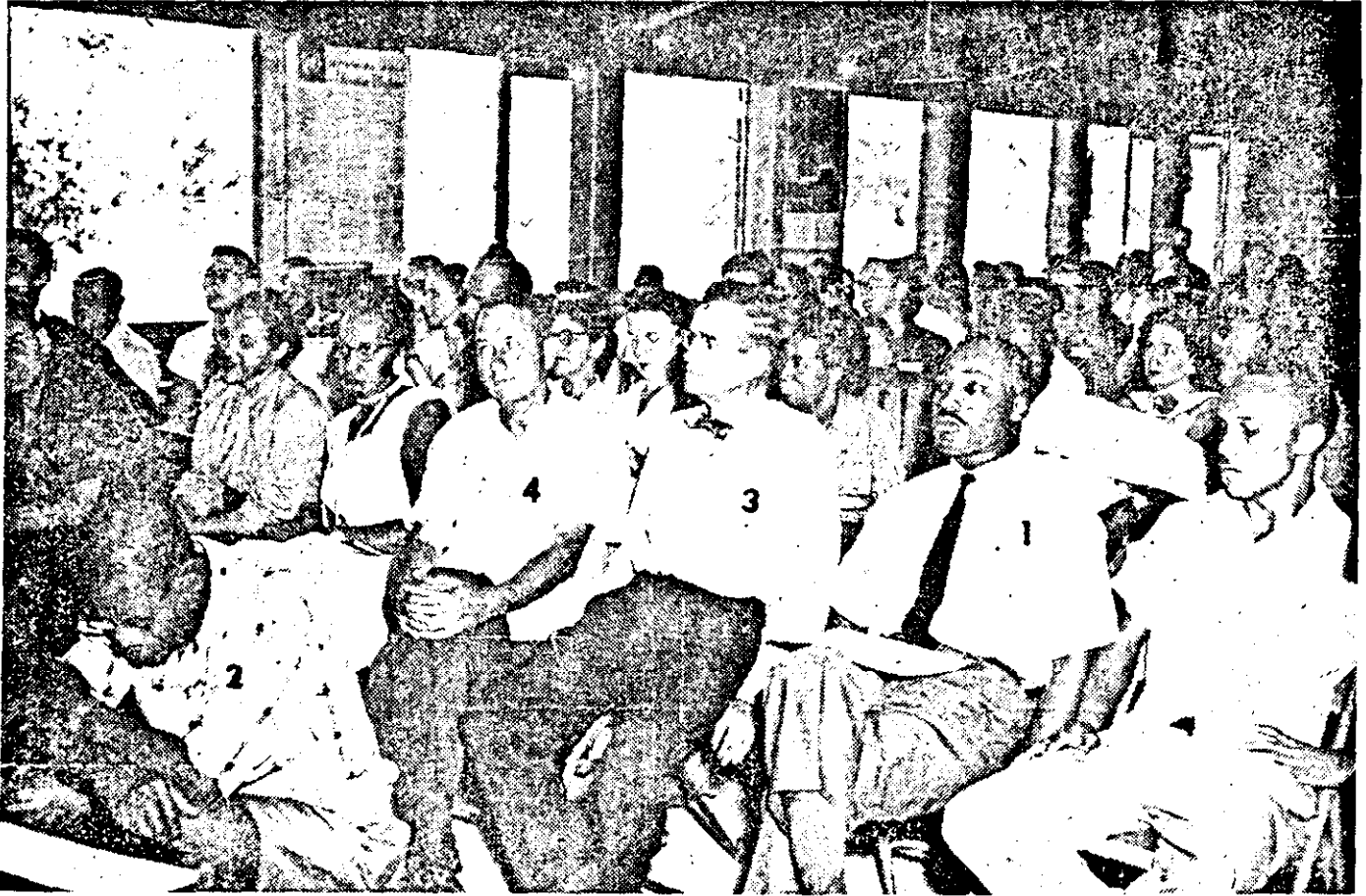

The above picture was made by an employee of the State of Georgia, at the Highlander Folk School in Monteagle, Tennessee during the Labor Day week-end of 1957. The photographer was sent to the Highlander Folk School by the Georgia Commission on Education. The Highlander Folk School was abolished by an act of the Legislature of the State of Tennessee at a later date because it was charged with being a subversive organization.

Those numbered in the picture are:

1. Martin Luther King, Jr., of the Montgomery boycott and the Birmingham riots. Karl Prussion, a counterspy for the FBI for twenty-two years, charges that Martin Luther King belongs to sixty Communist-front organizations — more than any Communist in the United States. He is promoted and encouraged by the Kennedys.
2. Abner W. Berry of the Central Committee of the Communist Party.
3. Aubrey Williams, President of the Southern Conference Education Fund, Inc., The Transmission Belt in the South for the Communist Party.
4. Myles Horton, Director of Highlander Folk School for Communist Training, Monteagle, Tennessee.

These "Four Horsemen" of racial agitation have brought tension, disturbance, strife and violence in their advancement of the Communist doctrine of "racial nationalism."

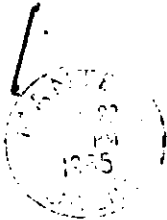

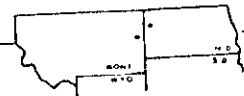

King received an inquiry from an unknown individual who inquired whether King expected to be questioned during the program concerning his meeting with the Director and whether there was any truth to the rumor that King had been intimidated during the meeting. One of King's representatives replied in substance that King's answer to such question would be that his relations with Mr. Hoover have always been cordial. King then commented himself that he was tired of hearing about his meeting with the Director.

New York will monitor the Meet the Press program and will submit a teletype. SA [redacted] of Mr. DeLoach's Office was telephonically advised of the above.

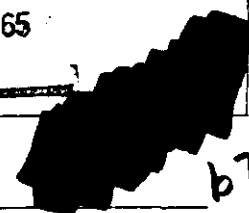

# Demo Chairman Sees Negro Chief Power

Bidwell Adam of Gulfport, chairman of the State Democratic Committee, Saturday expressed the view on the eve of the federally-protected Selma to Montgomery march, that Martin Luther King is the nation's most powerful political figure. King dominated both parties, Democratic and Republican, Adam lamented. His statement said:

"Martin Luther King is today's most powerful political figure on the soil of America. No one in the history of our country has ever wielded so much influence and control over so many men in high office and positions of trust and responsibility as this erratic and dangerous character.

"Governors, Congressmen, cabinet members, United States Senators, judges, teachers, preachers, rabbis and priests and Democratic and Republican 'big brass' bow and bend before the presence of this man King. In their quest for political alms and crumbs at his hands, the leaders of both major political parties in this country cringe and crawl.

"King will write both platforms for the next Democratic and Republican National Conventions. He will dictate, without interruption, his terms before these political leaders have ever assembled and their portfolios will hold his instructions saying, before either Democratic or Republican National Conventions can nominate their respective candidates, those candidates before either Democratic or Republican National Conventions can nominate their respective candidates, those candidates must pass the scrutinizing eyes of this man, who claims to be a Preacher, Martin Luther King.

men will soon become beggars in the field of politics instead of leaders from their states. In the mad scramble of both Democratic and Republican leadership in Washington to support the Martin Luther King Civil Rights Bill proposed by the President, they will discover too late that they have voted themselves out of office by following the leadership of King.

"I fear that it is too late for these men who have fallen under the hypnotic spell of this new dictator to now retreat to a position of political safety. They have already bought their

own burial plot and paid for their crepe-covered caskets. The political gravediggers will soon be at work. It is to be regretted that the tail now wags the dog in the United States."

"He will be in absolute control of both Conventions and no delegation from any State in the American Union can be seated until their credentials meet with his approval. The 'Big Brass' of Democratic and Republican organizations are today working overtime trying to please this man King and not one of them has the guts to deny this statement. They tremble in his presence and shake like a leaf that is blown by the winds of a hurricane with tornadic intensity. He will sit in on every major national conference.

"The vast and overwhelming membership of the American Congress has capitulated and surrendered themselves to him. He dictates and stand ready to follow his instructions. The address of President Lyndon Johnson on Monday night crowned Martin Luther King with more power in America than Napoleon ever enjoyed while Emperor of France. Hitler, who was in full sway over Germany, could not influence or control his subjects as much as Martin Luther King does the authorities that exercise control over our country.

"Those Congressmen and Senators who applauded the President the loudest Monday night as he spoke, will soon find out that Martin Luther King has already picked from his cabinet their successors to occupy their seats in the House of Representatives and the United States Senate. The

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



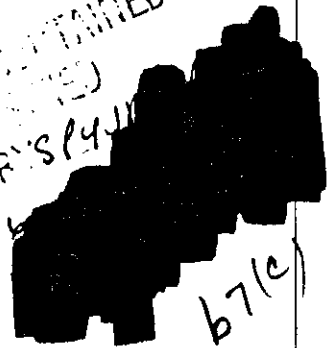

On March 16, 1965, a confidential source, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised that Bayard Rustin (organizer of the March on Washington) and Harry Wachtel were in contact on that date. They discussed the speech of President Johnson before Congress on the night of March 15, 1965, which concerned a voting bill insuring the right of all Americans to vote. Wachtel said it covered every part of the "battlefront." Both agreed that the speech was the most forthright ever made by a President, but agreed that compliments should wait until they saw what the bill contained. *X (u)*

In considering what they should do in light of President Johnson's willingness to "go all out" for the Negro, Wachtel suggested that Rustin seek permission to speak before one of the Congressional Committees that will consider the voting bill. In that regard, Rustin said the battle has shifted from Selma, Alabama, to Washington, D.C., therefore, they need to get a group of Senators and Representatives to meet with Martin Luther King (President of the Southern Christian Leadership Conference, SCLC) in one of the caucus rooms. Wachtel answered that it could be arranged very easily. *X (u)*

Inspector Sullivan called 11:40 a.m., Eastern Standard Time (EST) and advised that the night at the campsite of the marchers was uneventful. Military security and Agent observation were maintained throughout the night. At about 6 a.m., Central Standard Time (CST) the camp began to stir and food was brought in by truck and the campers prepared to make breakfast. Reverend Martin Luther King and Mr. Ralph Abernathy had breakfast brought into them and they ate in a late model, green Cadillac owned by Dr. Sullivan Jackson. King, Abernathy and Reverends Young and Bevel of Southern Christian Leadership Conference and James Lewis of Student Non-Violent Coordinating Committee spent the night at the camp.

The marchers formed and moved out onto the highway at approximately 8 a.m. CST. They were still marching on the four lane highway on lanes which had been closed to traffic. About 300 started out from the camp and the number has since increased by about 100 who have come from Selma and Montgomery to join the marchers. Ninety-five per cent of the campers were young people in their late teens, about 75 per cent were Negro. As the march got underway, they were preceded by Avis rental trucks with newsmen a medical unit and latrine trucks at the head of the column. The leading marchers carried an American and a United Nations flag. Army staff cars and jeeps were also at the head of the column.

Late last night and early this morning, the marchers complained of a lack of military coverage. Military authorities explained that the troops had been ordered to be unobtrusive and had moved back out of sight of the camp and formed a sealed perimeter. The campers complained that they would like to see the soldiers present as it made them feel more comfortable.

As of 10:45 a.m. CST a piper cub airplane flew over the marchers dropping leaflets which fell in the woods near the marching column. The leaflet was directed to the white citizens of Alabama and promoted selective hiring, firing, buying and selling and stated that unemployed agitator ceases to agitate. It was sponsored by the White Citizens for Action Committee. This is the same leaflet that was dropped on demonstrators in Selma on March 13, 1965. It was determined that the White Citizens for Action Committee is a defunct segregationist organization headed by James L. Frazier of Tuscaloosa who is considered as a "publicity seeking local nut."

As of 11:45 a.m. EST, 10:45 a.m. CST, the march was moving along fairly rapidly and in an orderly fashion. The marchers had progressed more than four miles from the campsite at that time.

Dear Mr. Hoover--

I have been concerned regarding this Negro situation, mass demonstrations, and marchings. If they find they can get what they want by this method of doing it, I fear there may spring up further agitation by Red Facist groups or Communists throughout U. S.

I, for one, dislike Martin Luther King's appearance and I mistrust him moreso because I read where he had attended Madalyn E. Murrays' School or sessions where she was teaching her atheistic stuff.

Then too, just recently, Karl Prussian, former member of the Communist party in U. S. , spoke at C. U. , Boulder, Colo. Also at Colo. State University, at Fort Collins, Colo. He had also been undercover agent for the F. B. I. and star witness at San Francisco hearings on Un-American activities concerning student riots. The Young Americans for Freedom group sponsored him. Karl Prussian's spokesmen said that in his talks he would charge that Martin Luther King belongs to 60 Communist front organizations, more than any party member in U. S. If this be true, then why is he allowed by our Government to head and stage these marches stirring up mob violences, hatred, and bloodshed? I certainly believe every American citizen should have the right to vote. They are required to help fight our wars, although I have heard of the ill feeling of our boys against the Negroes in Camps because of their behavior.

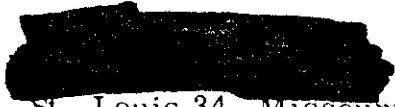

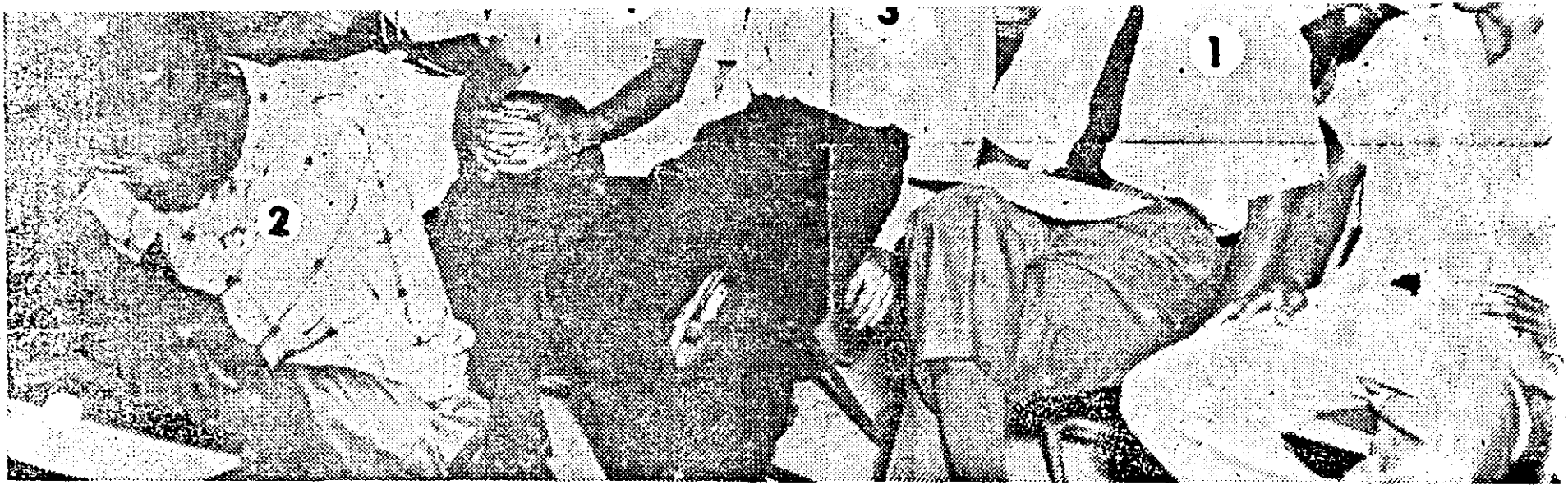

It is only through violence and strife that Martin Luther King can gather from suckers of the Nation around a million dollars a year to finance his activities.

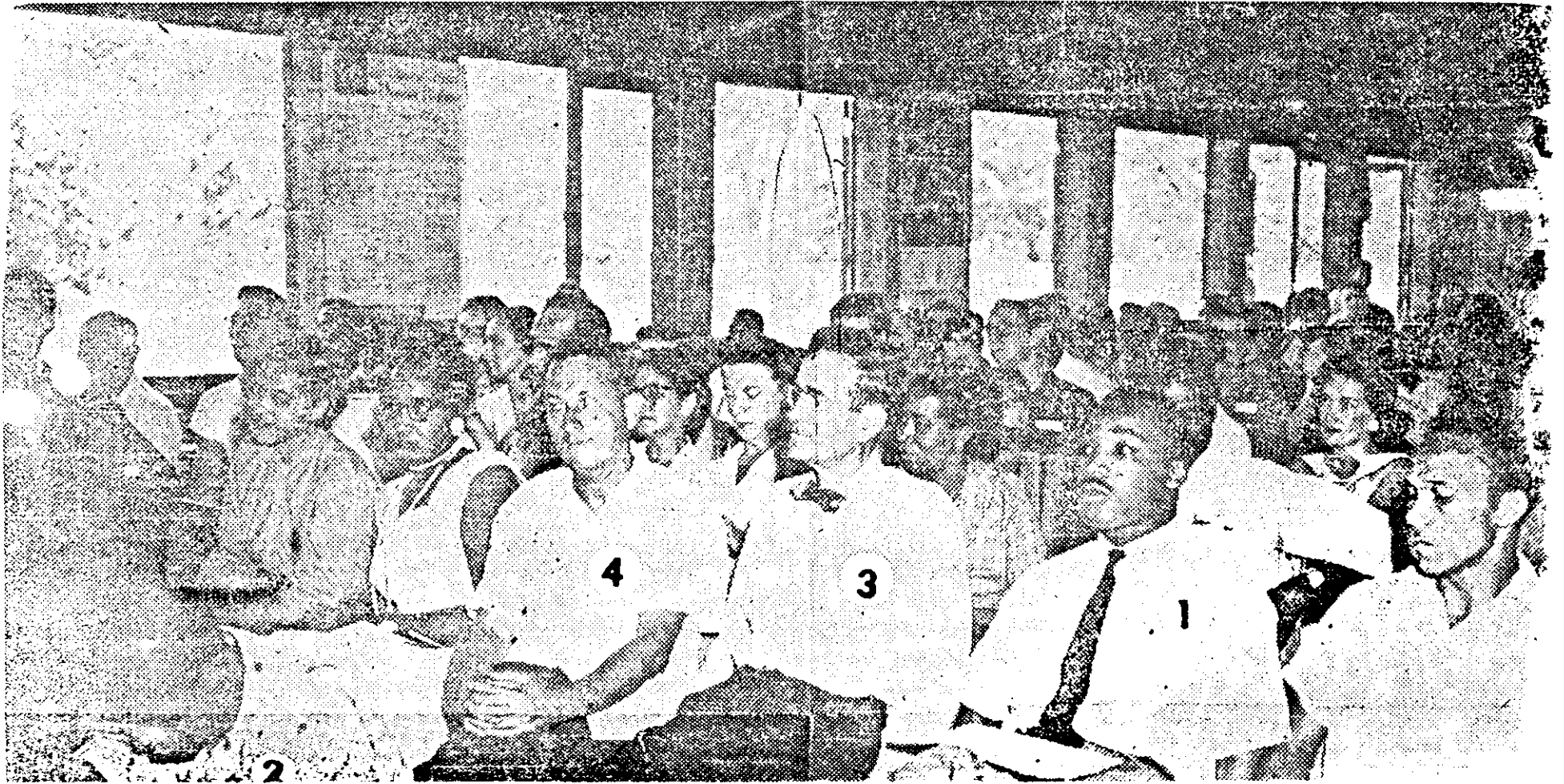

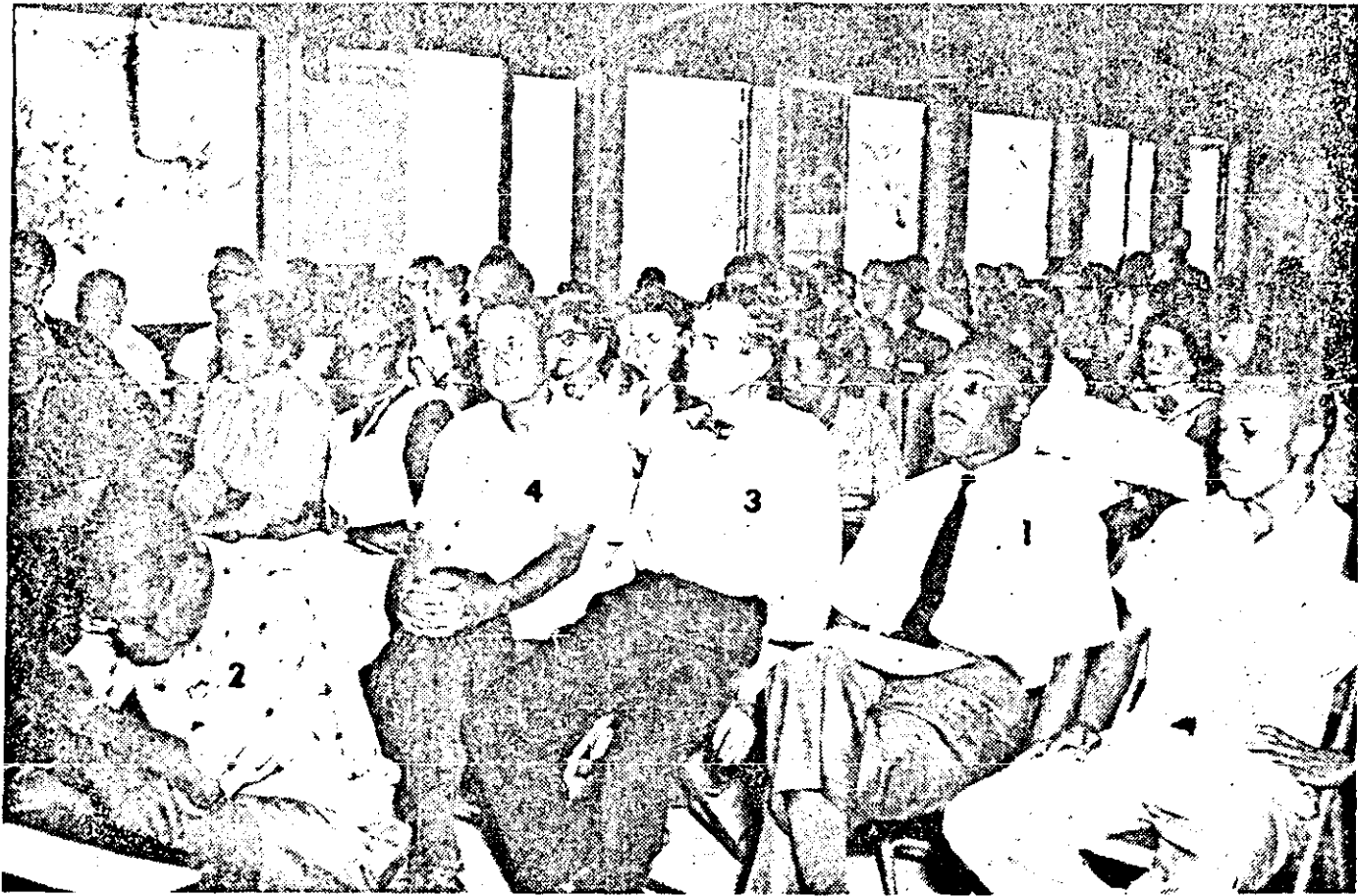

The above picture was made by an employee of the State of Georgia, at the Highlander Folk School in Monteagle, Tennessee during the Labor Day week-end of 1957. The photographer was sent to the Highlander Folk School by the Georgia Commission on Education. The Highlander Folk School was abolished by an act of the Legislature of the State of Tennessee at a later date because it was charged with being a subversive organization.

Those numbered in the picture are:

1. Martin Luther King, Jr., of the Montgomery boycott and the Birmingham riots. Karl Prussion, a counterspy for the FBI for twenty-two years, charges that Martin Luther King belongs to sixty Communist-front organizations — more than any Communist in the United States. He is promoted and encouraged by the Kennedys.
2. Abner W. Berry of the Central Committee of the Communist Party.
3. Aubrey Williams, President of the Southern Conference Education Fund, Inc., The Transmission Belt in the South for the Communist Party.
4. Myles Horton, Director of Highlander Folk School for Communist Training, Monteagle, Tennessee.

These "Four Horsemen" of racial agitation have brought tension, disturbance, strife and violence in their advancement of the Communist doctrine of "racial nationalism."
