A confidential source, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised on May 9, 1965, that a conference of Martin Luther King, Jr. (President of the Southern Christian Leadership Conference, SCLC), and his advisors, including Andy Young (Executive Director of the SCLC), Harry Wachtel and Bayard Rustin, took place on that date. According to the source, the following transpired: (u)

It was agreed that King would decline the invitation to attend the rally at Madison Square Garden (on June 8, 1965), to be held under the auspices of the Committee for a Sane Nuclear Policy (SANE). His reason for declining will be attributed to pressing needs in Alabama in regard to the voting rights bill. (u)

Wachtel brought up the fact that the Hammermill Paper Company is having its annual meeting in Erie, Pennsylvania, on Tuesday (May 11, 1965), and in that regard, there is a movement underway to have a sit-in to protest segregated policies of the company in its Alabama mills. The sit-in, sponsored by college students, is being promoted by Esther Heifits (phonetic), according to Wachtel's son, who is a student at Oberlin College in Ohio. (u)

Another matter which was discussed was King's trip to New York, on Wednesday, May 12, 1965. In that regard, it was stated that he will arrive at Kennedy International Airport at 2:34 PM, and that all of those attending the conference will meet him. The purpose of the meeting, the source said, will be to go over plans for a summer project. X(u)

King's main purpose in coming to New York, the source said, is to speak on Long Island on Wednesday night, and at Queens College, Long Island, on Thursday afternoon. X(u)

The "Long Island Press", Saturday, May 8, 1965, reported that five Long Island communities will be visited by Martin Luther King on Wednesday before he is scheduled to speak at a voting rights rally in West Hempstead, at 8:00 PM, May 12, 1965.

Wachtel told King that he would handle all arrangements in connection with his visit on Long Island. He also said he wanted to introduce King to some millionaires on the Island on Thursday morning. X(u)

In "The Saturday Evening Post", issue of July 11-18, 1964, page 76, Bayard Rustin is the subject of a feature article captioned: "The Lone Wolf of Civil Rights". In it, Rustin is said to have come to New York in 1938, as an organizer for the Young Communist League (YCL), and as such, he had the job of recruiting students for the "Party". Furthermore, the article reports that during his first years in New York, Rustin gave most of his earnings to the "Party". He reportedly left the "Party" in 1941, the article states.

The YCL has been designated pursuant to Executive Order 10450.

The "Daily Worker", February 11, 1957, page 1 column 2, reported that Bayard Rustin, Executive Secretary, War Resisters League, was an observer at the 16th National Convention of the Communist Party, United States of America (CP, USA), held in New York City, on February 9-12, 1957.

The "Daily Worker" was an East Coast Communist publication until it ceased publication on January 13, 1958.

The "Guide to Subversive Organizations and Publications," revised and published as of December 1, 1961, prepared and released by the Committee on Un-American Activities, United States House of Representatives, Washington, D.C., contains the following concerning the National Lawyers Guild:

"National Lawyers Guild

- "1. Cited as a Communist front.
(Special Committee on Un-American Activities, House Report 1311 on the CIO Political Action Committee, March 29, 1944, p. 149.)
- "2. Cited as a Communist front which 'is the foremost legal bulwark of the Communist Party its front organizations, and controlled unions' and which 'since its inception has never failed to rally to the legal defense of the Communist Party and individual members thereof, including known espionage agents.'
(Committee on Un-American Activities, House Report 3123 on the National Lawyers Guild, September 21, 1950, originally related September 17, 1950.)
- "3. 'To defend the cases of Communist lawbreakers, fronts have been devised making special appeals in behalf of civil liberties and reaching out far beyond the confines of the Communist Party itself. Among these organizations are the * * * National Lawyers Guild. When the Communist Party itself is under fire these offer a bulwark of protection.'
(Internal Security Subcommittee of the Senate Judiciary Committee, Handbook for Americans, S. Doc. 117, April 23, 1956, p. 91.)"

It is noted that the original plan was for JONES to arrange with KING to meet with himself and LEVISON in Atlanta on either Sunday or Monday, May 2,3, 1965. NY instituted surveillance of JONES and placed him on the United Airlines Flight for Atlanta with HARRY BELAFONTE on the morning of 4/30/65. NY subsequently received information that JONES was returning to NY on Saturday, 5/1/65, which along with information that KING was going to Philadelphia, indicated that the conference between KING, LEVISON and JONES would not take place.

It also was felt that since JONES was going to Atlanta on Friday that he would be the person to bring KING the speech he requested for his Philadelphia speaking engagement.

When information was developed by Philadelphia that KING was coming to NY on Saturday evening, a surveillance was conducted on LEVISON to cover any meeting he might make with KING. As indicated by the attached LHM, LEVISON did not meet with KING in NY on the night of 5/1/65, and, in fact, as LEVISON stated there was a complete misunderstanding between the three of them and that JONES should arrange a new meeting now tentatively scheduled for May 10 or 11, 1965 in Atlanta.

A confidential source furnished the following information concerning contacts between Stanley Levison and Clarence Jones on May 2, 1965: ~~(u)~~

Levison told Jones that he saw the "person" in Philadelphia as he was being ushered into a meeting and this "person" told him that he would see Levison later. Levison said that he replied he would not be around. Jones stated that the only reason he would have stayed around would have been for the three of them getting together. Jones added that he was waiting to hear from either one of them as to whether he would go to Philadelphia. Levison commented that apparently there was a complete misunderstanding between the three of them and asked Jones to call Philadelphia and work out a meeting in the near future. ~~(u)~~

(It is noted that Martin Luther King was in Philadelphia over the weekend of May 1 and 2, where he was to address a bar association group). U

Subsequently, Clarence Jones contacted Martin Luther King who told Jones that things went well on May 1, 1965, and that Stan (Levison) brought the "statement". King added that he used the "thing" he worked up in New York because he did not have time to look at the material Stan brought him before going on stage. U

King mentioned that he would return to Atlanta and be there until May 12, when he would go to New York for a meeting. Jones told him that there are a couple of pressing matters, both relating to the New York Office (of the Southern Christian Leadership Conference) (SCLC) that needed to be discussed because "our friend" is going on a trip soon. They tentatively set a meeting for themselves and "our friend" for May 11, 1965 in Atlanta. (L)

The source has previously furnished information showing that when King and Jones discuss "our friend" they mean Stanley Levison. (L)

Jones also said that when King attends an Administrative Committee meeting (of SCLC) on May 6, 7, 1965, he hopes King will discuss the Summer Community Organization and Political Education Project because this is a problem between the SCLC and the Student Nonviolent Coordinating Committee. (L)

Jones and King also discussed the handling of the proceeds from the "Broadway Answers Selma" show (held in New York City on April 4, 1965). King said the group should check with Willie Branton (phonetic) about the money because he has handled gifts in the past. King wants the Anti-Defamation League to give the money directly to the Southern Regional Council since this league now has the money from the show. Jones agreed to discuss the matter with Branton (phonetic) who is now in Atlanta. (L)

Wiley Branton was chosen recently by Vice President Humphrey to be Executive Secretary of the President's Council on Equal Opportunity. (L)

Later, Levison was again in contact with Jones who said he had spoken to King. Jones stated that King said the first chance they can meet will be the nights of May 10 and 11 in Atlanta. Levison said that he could make it and Jones added that all that remained was to confirm the date with King. X (u)

Levison proposed that they meet before seeing King, stating this would give them a framework from which to work and Jones agreed. Levison said the two main things to be considered are, the organization of the SCLC to make it a real organization and the questions around King personally. X (u)

Jones advised that King had placed top priority on a plan to find someone who could be what amounts to an executive vice president. King told Jones that if he knew anyone qualified he could hire him. Levison said he was glad King felt this way and that they would discuss it. Levison said he would like to suggest Larry Perkins of the United Negro College Fund. Jones remarked that he doubted that Perkins would be willing to go to Atlanta. X (u)

Levison further stated that they had to find someone who would work well with Jones and for this reason it is important that he and Jones find someone for this position. Jones commented that the problem is that there is a breakdown because there is nobody to take charge of things. Levison then added "in a certain sense it is what I do in New York in the New York Office. He never has any problems in connection with it because I make the decisions and then Adele (Kanter of the New York SCLC Office) just goes ahead and does it and that is what he needs in Atlanta on a far larger scale." X (u)

Levison and Jones agreed to discuss this at their next meeting. X (u)

HIGHLANDER RESEARCH AND EDUCATION CENTER

b7(D)

[REDACTED] advised that the Highlander Folk School was an institution located near Monteagle, Tennessee; that it was an institution with classes on a seminar basis supported primarily by donations from individuals and from labor unions in the form of payments for students who attend, and to some extent by the Farmers' Union. It offered courses of instruction in labor organization, official economics, parliamentary procedure, and the general field of labor education.

This source added that this school has had Communist Party members on its staff and as instructors, and has followed the practice of welcoming Communist Party

members as students, but to the source's knowledge the school has never offered courses of instruction in Communist matters nor has the Communist element ever completely controlled the institution. *W*

W advised that LOUIS BUDENZ, admitted former editor of the "Daily Worker", an East Coast Communist newspaper, and former official of the Communist Party, advised on November 21, 1952, that the Highlander Folk School was pro-Communist. BUDENZ did not give further details regarding this school. *W*

The October 8, 1961 issue of the Knoxville News-Sentinel, a local daily newspaper published at Knoxville, Tennessee, contained an article reflecting the Highlander Folk School had announced plans for a similar school at Knoxville to be located at 1625 Riverside Drive. The article identified MYLES HORTON as Director of Highlander.

The December 17, 1961 issue of the Knoxville News-Sentinel contained an article reflecting that on December 16, 1961, assets of Highlander Folk School, Monteagle, Tennessee, were auctioned by the State of Tennessee under a court decree after the school was convicted of violating three Tennessee laws and failed in appeals to the State and United States Supreme Courts.

The July 8, 1962 issue of the Knoxville News-Sentinel contained an article reflecting the land on which Highlander Folk School was formerly located had been sold at public auction under court decree. The article stated that MYLES HORTON, Director of Highlander, during its entire existence, has moved to Knoxville, Tennessee, and has been granted a State Charter for an organization called Highlander Research and Education Center.

UNITED KLANS OF AMERICA, INC.
KNIGHTS OF THE KU KLUX KLAN (UNITED KLANS)

Records of Superior Court of Fulton County, Georgia, show that this klan organization was granted a corporate charter on February 21, 1961, at Atlanta, Georgia, under the name United Klans, Knights of the Ku Klux Klan of America, Inc.

A source advised on February 27, 1961, that United Klans was formed as a result of a split in U. S. Klans, Knights of the Ku Klux Klan, Inc. According to the source, the split resulted from a leadership dispute and United Klans has the same aims and objectives as the parent group. These are the promotion of Americanism, white supremacy, and segregation of the races.

The first source and a second source advised in July, 1961, that United Klans, Knights of the Ku Klux Klan of America, Inc., merged with Alabama Knights, Knights of the Ku Klux Klan. The merged organization established headquarters in Suite 401, The Alston Building, Tuscaloosa, Alabama. The organization is directed by Robert Shelton, Imperial Wizard, and is the dominant klan group in the South with units in several southern states.

On August 14, 1961, the second source advised that the organization formerly known as United Klans, Knights of the Ku Klux Klan of America, Inc., would be known in the future as United Klans of America, Inc., Knights of the Ku Klux Klan. The second source said the name was changed by a resolution adopted at the National Klonvocation held July 8, 1961, at Indian Springs, Georgia.

Second source advised that at a meeting at Prattville, Alabama, on October 22, 1961, a majority of the klaverns of the U. S. Klans, Knights of the Ku Klux Klan merged with the United Klans of America, Inc., Knights of the Ku Klux Klan.

**UNITED KLANS OF AMERICA, INC.,
KNIGHTS OF THE KU KLUX KLAN
(Tennessee)**

On March 20, 1961, a source advised that a state meeting of the U. S. Klans, Knights of the Ku Klux Klan, Inc., was held at Harriman, Tennessee, on Sunday afternoon, March 19, 1961. GEORGE COMPTON, Grand Dragon, State of Tennessee, announced that the U. S. Klans, Knights of the Ku Klux Klan, Inc., was no longer in existence and Imperial Officer WESLEY MORGAN of Atlanta was present and announced the formation of a new organization, United Klans of America, Inc., Knights of the Ku Klux Klan. The Source stated that members present from the Maryville, Harriman, and Dayton, Tennessee, chapters of the U. S. Klans, KKKK, Inc., voted unanimously to affiliate with the United Klans of America, Inc., KKKK. The Source advised that the Dayton, Tennessee, Klavern was not holding regular meetings and that only the Maryville and Harriman Klaverns were holding regular meetings.

On July 20, 1964, Source stated that the only active chapters of this organization in Tennessee are at Maryville, Tennessee, Harriman, Tennessee, and that recently a chapter has been formed at Knoxville, Tennessee. These chapters hold regular meetings.

Enclosed is a memorandum of explanation submitted to me by SA [redacted] concerning his delay in preparing a letterhead memorandum for dissemination in the above captioned matter.

b7(c) SA [redacted] failure to act more promptly in this matter resulted from his determination that the complainant who furnished the original information was completely unreliable and had obviously furnished false information. The Agent handled this matter more or less as a routine impersonation matter rather than treating it as a legitimate threat against the life of MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR.

b7(c) I have discussed this matter at some length with SA [redacted] and strongly reprimanded him for his delay in disseminating the information. He now fully understands that any information pertaining to a threat against the life of MARTIN LUTHER KING is to be immediately disseminated regardless of the source of the information. He is a relatively new Agent in the service, who appears to have learned a valuable lesson from this incident.

RECOMMENDATION:

Although SA [REDACTED] ^{b7(c)} was derelict in not disseminating the information more promptly, I am confident he will handle such matters expeditiously in the future. Instructions to advise the Bureau of the above matter were given to this Agent on the afternoon of March 19, 1965.

b7(c) This Agent commenced working on the [REDACTED] investigation, March 21, 1965; and on March 23, 1965, was assigned to a bank robbery. On March 26, 1965, he was assigned to the arrest of [REDACTED] subject of a Civil Rights case, and subsequently appeared before Federal Grand Jury, April 5-6, 1965. This matter was dictated on April 7, 1965.

The complainant in this matter turned out to be completely unreliable, and the information he furnished was obviously without any basis in fact. Had there been any reason to put any credence at all in complainant's information, the above matter would have been considered as a security matter, and Atlanta and the Bureau would have been immediately advised on March 11, 1965. The letterhead memorandum was only furnished to confirm the telephonic contact of the local Bureau of Narcotics with their Washington, D.C., Office in this matter.

Since local authorities had been advised of the above, and in view of the complainant's complete unreliability, it was not felt that any further action was required.

In the future, any information received regarding a threat to MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR., will be immediately disseminated to the Bureau and Atlanta, regardless of the source of the information.

I sincerely regret the delay in this instance, and assure you there will be no recurrence.

b7(c) By airtel April 26, 1965, Special Agent in Charge Ingram of the Birmingham Office submitted explanations of Special Agent [redacted] concerning his delay in preparing a letterhead memorandum for submission to the Bureau and recommended no additional administrative action as [redacted] had been orally reprimanded and made fully aware of the Bureau's responsibilities in matters of this type.

b7(c) Special Agent [redacted] in his explanation, a copy of which is attached, stated that the complainant who originally submitted the information, indicating that five individuals were planning to kill Martin Luther King, Jr., at Birmingham with a reward of \$15,000 being offered to the assassin, was completely unreliable and there was no reason to put any credence to information furnished. The information furnished was obviously without any basis in fact and, therefore, was not given expeditious handling. The information was submitted to the Bureau primarily to confirm telephonic contact of the Birmingham Bureau of Narcotics with their Headquarters at Washington, D.C. since the complainant alleged that he was "employed" by the Federal Narcotics Bureau in Washington, D.C.

b7(c) Special Agent [redacted] who received the information on March 11, 1965, did furnish information regarding the alleged threat to the United States Secret Service, the Federal Bureau of Narcotics and local law enforcement agencies on the same date the information was received. This action was all that was necessary with the exception of keeping the Bureau advised.

b7(c) A good portion of the delay during the period March 11, through April 8, 1965, was caused by Special Agent [redacted]'s assignment to expedite matters including the [redacted] a bank robbery and violations of the Civil Rights Act.

OBSERVATIONS:

b7(c) It appears that Special Agent [redacted] evaluation of the information received was correct. The necessary immediate action was also taken properly by Special Agent [redacted] which, of course, included notifying

Reurairtel and letterhead memorandum dated 5/4/65 which reported the details of a telephone call received by a Bureau Agent in your office the evening of 5/1/65. It is reported that "The caller stated 'I'm going to kill Martin Luther King, Monday.' This caller, who sounded as if he were white, male, age 20 to 25 years, seemingly reasonably well educated, abruptly hung up."

If all that was stated by the caller is that indicated in the single quotation above, it is difficult for the Bureau to understand how all of the descriptive data could be attached to the caller.

Under such circumstances it appears that too great a liberty is taken in the area of conclusion. On the other hand, if additional conversation was had with the caller, what he said should be reported so that the Bureau would be fully informed and so that there would at least be some basis for the description.

By return airtel advise the Bureau whether or not the caller made any statements other than that attributed to him. Resubmit letterhead memorandum in line with the foregoing observations.

This Bulet instructed that all information regarding threats to King should be furnished to the Atlanta Office, in order for Atlanta to inform local law authorities.

SAS of the FBI maintained an extremely discreet spot check at the Franklin Motor Inn in an effort to identify KING or any of his associates entering the motel. At approximately 7:20 p.m., SAS observed a 1961 or 1962 black Cadillac limousine, bearing Louisiana license 170B 052, pull up to the rear of the Franklin Motor Inn and the three male Negro occupants enter the motel through a side entrance. [REDACTED] advised that MARTIN LUTHER KING, President of the Southern Christian Leadership Conference (SCLC), participated on May 1, 1965, in a panel discussion which was part of a seminar under the general title "The Rule of Law in A Changing Society." The seminar commemorated Law Day U.S.A. According to [REDACTED] KING's speech was moderate and more or less conciliatory. b7(D)

The Philadelphia Inquirer on May 2, 1965, in reporting on the Law Day U.S.A. Seminar, quoted KING as saying "Justice at times proceeds with a halting gait and the law has often been slow to speak for the poor, the dispossessed and the disfranchised." KING told the group that "only a few years ago labor unions were conspiracies and Negroes were chattels in the eyes of the law." KING paid tribute to the legal profession for "its many contributions to the civil rights movement."

The Philadelphia Sunday Bulletin, in its edition May 2, 1965, contained an article on page 1, captioned "KING Chides Extremists at Law Day Rally." The article reflected that DR. MARTIN LUTHER KING, a featured speaker at a Law Day U.S.A. observance, warned that if white extremists have their way, the South will be reduced to anarchy. KING said that many Southerners claim his civil rights movement is as lawless as the deeds of segregationists. Denying the charge, he said that the really lawless are those who bomb churches, kill and beat demonstrators, then hide from authorities.

The end result of such tactics, which KING attributed to the Ku Klux Klan and white extremists, would

be anarchy because, he said, the guilty refuse to accept the legal penalty.

In contrast, KING asserted, his supporters demonstrate openly and willingly accept the penalties.

"We defy openly and willingly go to jail," the clergyman said. "Our aim is to persuade."

KING defended his plan for a boycott of goods produced in Alabama, comparing it to the action of the colonists against the British tea taxes and the boycott of British goods during THOMAS JEFFERSON's Administration in protest against the impressment of U. S. seamen.

KING called for more active involvement by Americans, warning that a "dangerous silence" now prevails over too large a section of the population.

"I have no despair about the future," he said. I am convinced that we Negroes will win our freedom all over America. Our destiny is tied up with the destiny of America."

The Evening Bulletin, in its edition of May 3, 1965, contained an article on page 14, captioned "KING Criticizes U. S. Churches for Failure To Provide Leadership in Civil Rights." The article reflected that Rev. Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR., on May 2, 1965, criticized the churches, including Negro churches, for failing to provide the leadership in such social causes as the civil rights movement.

DR. KING said the church is "the most segregated institution in America," and that 11 o'clock on Sunday morning is "the most segregated hour in America."

KING said too many ministers "hide behind their stained-glass windows" and he accused some churches of being too often the "tail lights instead of the headlights"

in the drive for social betterment.

DR. KING spoke in dedication ceremonies for the new \$1-million Bright Hope Baptist Church, 12th Street and Columbia Avenue. Nearly 3,500 attended.

There were some 1,800 persons in the church proper and another 1,700 in a lower auditorium and the gymnasium watching the proceedings on closed-circuit television.

KING said he thinks of himself as a Baptist minister first and in the tradition of Southern Baptist ministers gave a rousing sermon that left his audience standing and cheering.

DR. KING, who, with his father, is co-pastor of the Ebenezer Baptist Church in Atlanta, Ga., said he considers his civil rights work as only an extension of his ministry.

"Any religion that talks of the soul and not of the conditions that can corrupt and damn the soul is dried, dead, do-nothing religion," KING said.

DR. KING said that too often in recent history the church has "left men disappointed."

KING noted that the apartheid policy of racial separation in South Africa has the support of the Dutch Reformed Church.

But, KING said, many churches in the United States are equally guilty because they often ignore such problems as civil rights.

MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR.

"We suffer in this country," KING said, "not only from the violence of the bad people, but from the silence and indifference of the good people."

But, KING said, there are signs that the churches are waking up. He noted the large number of priests and nuns and ministers who joined the march from Selma to Montgomery, Ala.

DR. KING said many Negro churches suffer from either "freeze up" or "burn up."

Those that freeze up, KING said, are the ones that have become too dignified, who boast of the important people in their congregations and who are ashamed to sing the old songs of the Negro heritage.

The ones that burn up, KING said, are those "with more religion in their hands and feet than in their hearts" and where sermons are judged "by their volume and not their content."

On May 3, 1965, Source-2 advised that DR. MARTIN LUTHER KING attended a luncheon sponsored by the Locust Club, a private social organization composed of private businessmen, at which time he addressed approximately 70 attendees and received from \$7,000 to \$8,000 in contributions for his efforts in the South.

The Philadelphia Evening Bulletin, in its edition of May 4, 1965, in an article on page 3, captioned "Racial Frustration Breeds Violence, KING Warns Here," reflected that DR. MARTIN LUTHER KING addressed 600 civil rights and civic leaders attending the Golden Slipper Square Club banquet at the Bellevue-Stratford Hotel on the evening of May 3, 1965. The article reflected that DR. KING received the club's 1965 "Humanitarian Award" and a check for \$1,000 to support the program of the SCLC, which he heads.

MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR.

The article reflected that DR. KING warned that Negroes will listen to those advocating violence if non-violent demands for civil rights are not met.

KING said lack of retaliation by Negroes in the South for church bombings and brutality is proof that the theory of nonviolence is deepseated and catching on.

DR. KING said his warning of violent reprisal pertained to Negroes hit hardest by segregation.

"They feel they have nothing to lose," KING said.

Expressing appreciation on behalf of the "thousands and millions of people who have engaged in this struggle," the Nobel Peace Prize winner said:

"If democracy is to live, segregation must die. It's a new form of slavery. We must get rid of segregation, not only to get rid of the Communist challenge, but to improve our image abroad."

DR. KING said the Negro has come a long way in his stride toward freedom.

"But I must balance this by saying that we have a long, long way to go," KING said.

"Just 25 years ago a year hardly passed when Negroes in the South weren't lynched by brutal mobs. This has just about ceased today, but there are other things just as bad."

DR. KING cited church bombings, burnings, the death of civil rights workers, restrictive voting laws and economic reprisals.

KING said that more than 200 Negroes in Alabama were fired from their jobs last month because they wanted to register to vote.

MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR.

KING blamed the administration of Governor WALLACE for this and other "atrocities."

The Philadelphia Daily News, in its edition of May 4, 1965, contained an article concerning KING's speech at the Golden Slipper Square Club, and indicated that KING received a \$1,000 check and a miniature Torah, which contains the Hebrew text of the five books of Moses. The article stated that the \$1,000, plus \$7,000 which had been given to DR. KING earlier by 60 Jewish communal leaders at a Locust Club luncheon, will be used, he said, to aid the fight for Negro voting registration in Alabama and Mississippi.

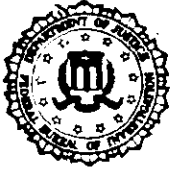

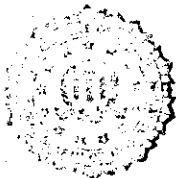

I participated in the final day (March 25, 1965) of the Selma-Montgomery march in Alabama. Both before and since the march, I have been carrying on some considerable correspondence with leading clergymen in Selma, Montgomery, and Birmingham.

In a letter dated April 24th, a leading minister in Birmingham, Alabama, challenges me to "get the facts" on the Reverend Doctor Martin Luther King, and he refers specifically to "whatever" may be in the F.B.I. files on Doctor King which would give rise to your charge that he is a "notorious liar", and to the "facts" underlying the frequent charge of Southern white people that Martin Luther King is a "Communist".

I fully recognize the confidential nature of F.B.I. files. On the other hand, we cannot allow a man's character to be defamed by false charges.

Therefore I will very greatly appreciate any statement, or statements, which you can give me concerning Doctor King, particularly on the two points mentioned above.

The source noted that TOM KAHN was listening in on the conference on RUSTIN's extension, but did not take part. (u)

It is noted that when RUSTIN was suggesting that an adult recruiter be sent to New York to oversee the recruiting for the SCOPE project, KING said they should send someone like a C. T. VIVIAN. RUSTIN noted that either ANDY YOUNG or VIVIAN would be great and that TOM KAHN and others "up here" could give this person an insight into how to proceed. (u)

A confidential source, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised on May 2, 1965, that on that date, a conference was held which involved Bayard Rustin, Harry Wachtel and Martin Luther King. The source furnished the following information concerning this conference: (u)

A discussion took place as to whether King should participate in two affairs scheduled for June, in New York City; one on June 3, 1965, at Madison Square Garden, where 64 Jewish organizations will hold an affair protesting anti-semitism in the Soviet Union, and one on June 8, 1965, at Madison Square Garden, sponsored by the Committee for a Sane Nuclear Policy (SANE). (u)

King was concerned about over exposure in a single community, stating that he would be in Long Island, New York, on June 12, 1965. Rustin said that was different and that King would not have to say much, but would just have to appear. King noted that he would be speaking at the Negro American Labor Council (NALC) Rally on May 28, 1965, and that these other things might be too much. (u)

Rustin commented that King has a responsibility to say something about war and peace, which is what the SANE rally is about. He added that Vice President Humphrey would be at the June 3rd affair, which would give King an opportunity to say what he has never said before and that is that he is opposed to injustice, wherever it appears. This, Rustin said, would defend King from attacks claiming King is a Communist. X (u)

Henry Wachtel counseled that he would not go that far but that it does connect King with more people in an image-making way. X (u)

King was concerned as to how they could fill Madison Square Garden twice and Rustin noted that the Jewish groups affair on June 3rd already had been sold out and that this is the most important thing. Rustin stated that most of labor's support is Jewish, which would put King in favor with these supporters. Wachtel felt that King should not make any statement concerning the SANE rally until after the voting bill (to enable Negroes to register to vote) had cleared the first hurdles. X (u)

However, Wachtel is interested in having King speak at the SANE rally if King accepts the invitation to appear at the anti-semitism affair. X (u)

They all agreed to a further discussion of whether King should appear at the June 3rd and 8th affairs, within the next 48 hours. X (u)

Rustin changed the discussion, stating that it is important to get a talented paid Southern Christian Leadership Conference (SCLC) worker to come to New York to oversee the recruitment and training of college students for the Summer Community Organization and Political Education (SCOPE) project in the South, which is under the direction of Hosea (Williams, Director of Voter Registration for the SCLC). Rustin said he is prepared to give full time to the training of these recruits through the A. Philip Randolph Institute, which is being set up, but only if Hosea asks for his help. X (u)

Rustin said that they should have a responsible adult come to New York to handle the recruiting and not a bunch of kids. He added that many volunteers could be enlisted to work under this person. He said they should not tell Hosea he is not doing a good job but should get it across to him that the East and New York are too important for kids. X (u)

Wachtel asked how the Student Nonviolent Coordinating Committee (SNCC) "thing" was. (The meeting between King and James Forman, Executive Secretary of SNCC, held on April 30, 1965, to settle differences between their organizations). King said it went well except for the Communist issue because they (SNCC) say openly that they do not mind Communists working with them. King added that there were things he wanted to say renouncing Communism in theory but they would not go along with it. "We" wanted to say that it was an alien philosophy contrary to "us", but they would not go along with it. X (u)

In "The Saturday Evening Post", issue of July 11-18, 1964, page 76, Bayard Rustin is the subject of a feature article captioned: "The Lone Wolf of Civil Rights". In it, Rustin is said to have come to New York in 1938, as an organizer for the Young Communist League (YCL), and as such, he had the job of recruiting students for the "Party". Furthermore, the article reports that during his first years in New York, Rustin gave most of his earnings to the "Party". He reportedly left the "Party" in 1941, the article states.

The YCL has been designated pursuant to Executive Order 10450.

The "Daily Worker", February 11, 1957, page 1 column 2, reported that Bayard Rustin, Executive Secretary, War Resisters League, was an observer at the 16th National Convention of the Communist Party, United States of America (CP, USA), held in New York City, on February 9-12, 1957.

The "Daily Worker" was an East Coast Communist publication until it ceased publication on January 13, 1958.

He stated that during the week of May 16-23, 1965, Evangelist ORAL ROBERTS is scheduled to appear in Wilson, North Carolina. During this same period a Negro Singing is to be held in the baseball park at Wilson. Thousands of Negroes are expected to be in attendance and these two events are expected to be covered by radio and television. Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING is scheduled to be in attendance at the singing and reportedly has already reserved rooms at the Holiday Inn Motel in Wilson and the Holiday Inn Motel in Rocky Mount, North Carolina. This source stated that a bounty has been placed on the life of Dr. KING, and \$100,000.00 is to be paid to his killer. This alleged killer is reported to be from Green Pond, a community in Nash County, North Carolina. This

A confidential source advised on April 7, 1965, that information was received that MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR., leader of the Southern Christian Leadership Conference, will make an appearance some place in North Carolina during the month of May 1965. This information was not specific as to when or where KING would appear, but the United Klans of America, Knights of the Ku Klux Klan, Inc., (UKA), will be on hand at the time of KING's arrival if this date and time can be established. (UNITED KLANS)

On August 17, 1964, a source advised that the North Carolina organization of United Klans of America, Inc., Knights of the Ku Klux Klan, became affiliated with the national organization of the same group in the Spring of 1961. The State Headquarters are at the residence of North Carolina Grand Dragon JAMES ROBERTSON JONES, Granite Quarry, North Carolina, who is subordinate to the national organization with headquarters at Tuscaloosa, Alabama.

The organization in North Carolina has the same aims and objectives as the parent group; that is, advocacy of segregation of the races and white supremacy.

UNITED KLANS OF AMERICA, INT.
KNIGHTS OF THE KU KLUX KLAN (UNITED KLANS)

Records of Superior Court of Fulton County, Georgia, show that this Klan organization was granted a corporate charter on February 21, 1961, at Atlanta, Georgia, under the name United Klans, Knights of the Ku Klux Klan of America, Inc.

A source advised on February 27, 1961, that United Klans was formed as a result of a split in U. S. Klans, Knights of the Ku Klux Klan, Inc. According to the source, the split resulted from a leadership dispute, and United Klans has the same aims and objectives as the parent group. These are the promotion of Americanism, white supremacy, and segregation of the races.

The first source and second source advised in July 1961, that United Klans, Knights of the Ku Klux Klan of America, Inc., merged with Alabama Knights, Knights of the Ku Klux Klan. The merged organization established headquarters in Suite 401, The Alston Building, Tuscaloosa, Alabama. The organization is directed by ROBERT SHELTON, Imperial Wizard, and is the dominant Klan group in the South with units in several southern states.

On August 14, 1961, the second source advised that the organization formerly known as United Klans, Knights of the Ku Klux Klan of America, Inc., would be known in the future as United Klans of America, Inc., Knights of the Ku Klux Klan. The second source said the name was changed by a resolution adopted at the National Klonvocation held July 8, 1961, at Indian Springs, Georgia.

Second source advised that at a meeting at Prattville, Alabama, on October 22, 1961, a majority of the Klaverns of the U. S. Klans, Knights of the Ku Klux Klan, merged with the United Klans of America, Inc., Knights of the Ku Klux Klan.

On March 30, 1965, an Agent of the Denver Office of the Federal Bureau of Investigation contacted [REDACTED] at his place of employment, [REDACTED], Denver, Colorado, at [REDACTED] request.

At this time, [REDACTED] who is [REDACTED] advised that he has corresponded numerous times with Senator "Bobby" Kennedy of New York and Martin Luther King concerning the well-being of King. [REDACTED] then furnished a copy of a letter dated March 26, 1965, which he wrote, and the original was apparently mailed to Senator Kennedy. This letter reads as follows:

"Dear Bobby,

"I believe that Dr. Martin Luther King and Vice President Humphrey are well guarded during these critical times but, I still fear for their lives because their violent death at the hands of southern racists would cause so much discredit to our beloved America.

"/s/ [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] then stated that his main purpose in "taking to the FBI" is that he is desirous of expressing his fear and opinion to J. Edgar Hoover that Dr. Martin Luther King, due to his demanding attitude and his unawareness of communist infiltration and use of racial unrest and violence, is in danger of being assassinated by "racists, communists or Black Muslims." [REDACTED] stated that this is merely his opinion and he knows of no threat to the life of Martin Luther King.

A confidential source advised on April 28, 1965, that on that date, Dora McDonald, Secretary to Martin Luther King, instructed that the following message be given to Clarence Jones:

King is to speak in Philadelphia on Saturday (May 1, 1965) before the Bar Association, and felt he could use the speech he gave before the Association of the Bar of the City of New York (on April 21, 1965) in its entirety. However, after examining the Philadelphia program, King has discovered that it is a little different and he cannot use the entire New York speech. He will send Jones the outline of the Philadelphia program so Jones can confer with "our friend" and come up with one or two additional points for King to make in his Philadelphia talk.

This source has, in the past, furnished information that "our friend" is Stanley Levison.

Another confidential source advised on April 29, 1965, that Clarence Jones told Levison he wanted to meet with him at about 5:00 PM that day. However, this was not convenient for Levison. Jones said he would be talking to Levison later that day and asked Levison to call him at a meeting which he, Jones, would be attending that afternoon. Jones stated he could meet Levison "uptown." 



By letter dated 4/16/65 Congressman William L. Dickinson, Republican from Alabama, elected to Congress in November, 1964, requested that the Director send him whatever information the FBI has in its files on Dr. Martin Luther King and particularly any information pertaining to Dr. King's affiliations with communists and communist-front groups. Also, he desires data on the Southern Christian Leadership Conference and the Southern Conference Education Fund. Also he indicates he would be very much interested in seeing the reports of FBI Agents which concern the demonstrations and the march from Selma to Montgomery. He states that Alabama papers stated there were about 100 FBI Agents in Alabama in this connection. Also he refers to his recent speech on the Floor of the House of Representatives on the connection between recent civil rights demonstrations in Alabama and the Communist Party.

A copy of the remarks by Congressman Dickinson on the Floor of the House of Representatives on 3-30-65 is attached.

Briefly, Congressman Dickinson spoke concerning the march from Selma to Montgomery, Alabama, and alleged that the press failed to report immoral activities engaged in by the marchers. He called attention to communist sympathizers associated with the march and identified them as Carl Braden, Abner Berry, James Peck, Bayard Rustin and Martin Luther King. He also referred to others who have a security-risk background. In this regard he stated that the U. S. Government knows all these facts; that the FBI has a file on "King Martin Luther," and on the others he mentioned and said "the Government helped promote the occurrences in Alabama." He alleged that Government officials participated in such activities and that the Justice Department assisted in their promotion, all with the knowledge and consent of the President. Also included is an affidavit of Karl Prussion, signed 9-28-63, which sets forth information regarding communist activities in connection with the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People. (NAACP) Prussion is a former San Francisco informant who assisted the FBI in security matters.

Congressman Dickinson, aged 39 at the time of his election to Congress, is a former railway executive and former circuit judge in Montgomery, Alabama. In

line with the Director's policy of having new members of Congress contacted where advisable, Special Hobson H. Adcock of your (Mr. DeLoach) office visited Congressman Dickinson on 2-24-65. Dickinson was very cordial, was most appreciative of the contact, indicated he knew very little about FBI jurisdiction and asked a number of questions in connection with FBI responsibilities in civil rights. He indicated he would be most willing to cooperate with the Bureau in matters of mutual interest and that he was most grateful for the contact. ■

OBSERVATIONS:

Martin Luther King, of course, has had his name linked with numerous communist-front groups and the Southern Christian Leadership Conference, as well as the Southern Conference Education Fund. The Southern Christian Leadership Conference (SCLC) is headed by Martin Luther King, Jr. It is currently under investigation to determine the extent of its communist infiltration, domination and control. The Southern Conference Educational Fund (SCEF) is the successor organization to the Southern Conference for Human Welfare, cited in the "Guide to Subversive Organizations and Publications" as a communist front by the HCUA in 1947. The SCEF is the subject of a current Bureau security investigation.

It is believed, in accordance with existing policy, that it would be advisable to inform the Congressman that the confidential nature of FBI files pursuant to regulations of the Department of Justice precludes the Director's responding favorably to the request of Congressman Dickinson.

RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that the attached letter advising the Congressman of the confidential nature of FBI files be approved and thereafter ~~personally~~ delivered by special messenger.

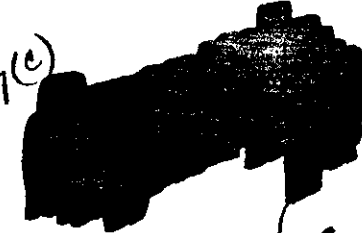

Straight Talk

By TOM ANDERSON

MONTGOMERY, Ala. — The Civil Rioters I have witnessed here and in Selma are strangely reminiscent of the scum I saw carrying Kennedy banners at the 1960 Democrat convention. Dirty, bearded beatniks, interspersed with a few bona fide but misguided ministers. But certainly not all who posed as men of the cloth were ministers. (Ministers don't become Communists but Communists do become ministers). Ministers don't get drunk and neither do nuns. But "ministers were taking a straight from the bottle here and the sheriff in Selma told me that four "nuns" were drunk on the Selma Courthouse steps.

As anybody with walking around sense should know, our leading "newsmagazines," "newspapers" and networks have distorted and lied about what is going on here. This Communist-promoted prelude to civil war has virtually no connection with right-to-vote. In Selma for several months the Sheriff's office has been urging qualified negroes to register to vote. When asked why more negroes didn't register, the negroes replied that they were waiting for Dr. Martin Luther King to lead them to the polls. Any negro who can read and write can register to vote. Reliable sources here have reported to me that an ambulance carrying a woman to a hospital was stopped and blocked by marchers. Police asked them to disperse. They refused. Mounted police moved in to disperse them and were attacked with switchblade knives. Eight horses were cut badly. Mac Butler, Sheriff of Montgomery County, was hit on the back of the neck by a brick and cut on the leg. Demonstrators were

A priest from Hamilton, Ontario, went to the Sheriff and apologized for having come down here. It wasn't what he thought it was. But even if it was what he thought it was, what business was it of this foreigner's?

There was much sex activity in evidence, some involving blacks and whites under blankets on the streets, in churches and in open fields.

Montgomery airport was loaded with chartered planes, such as one used by Americans For Democratic Action, for which they paid a round trip fare of \$5,800.

Alabama's great governor, George Wallace, received a letter from the north saying: "You've got our Episcopal priest down there. How about keeping him?"

C. C. Hunter, negro Methodist preacher in Selma, told me he has never heard a white person in Selma say that a negro shouldn't vote. Hunter, an original backer of Martin Luther King, has lost faith in King.

238 reporters have been in Selma. Strange how little truth got out. . . although local negroes were treated and intimidated in order to force them to march, the Sheriff's office in Selma reports that they could identify only seven local negroes in the march. . . "Nazi" Lincoln Rockwell was here. He seems to follow King everywhere. If King can't cause trouble, Rockwell can. . . the movie stars who fell on Alabama are the same immoral gang of perverts, prostitutes and comrats who have promoted countless other Communists projects.

President Johnson came on TV in a white fury because a woman who should have been a Detroit taking care of her three children was brutally murdered while violating the laws of the formerly sovereign state of Alabama. The President was strangely silent when Mississippi police officer, trying to enforce the law in Mississippi, was murdered by a negro.

Hired Marchers *what about this?*

We have been led to believe that all the demonstrations, sit-ins, marches and riots involving the "racial question" were spontaneous. Nothing much has been said in any of the news-media about how these things have been organized and promoted, but they certainly have been, and in many cases the marchers, sit-inners and rioters are, and have been, paid. "wages and expenses," including fines when imposed.

In the bickering among the marchers on Montgomery, Alabama, it came to light that hundreds of the marchers were drawing \$12 to \$14 per day and four. Naturally, they protested when out-of-staters hogged the show and some of them were "thrown out of work" when the number of marchers was limited by the width of the highway.

Those northerners, white or colored, who traveled far at their own expense to have a part in the mass demonstration may have been sincere, but we doubt their common sense. Having your own citizens involved in protest meetings or marches is somewhat different from having strangers coming in by the hundreds to take part in them and bringing dissension in their wake.

We deplore violence wherever it raises its ugly head, and we join with others in expressing sorrow and sympathy to the families of those who lost their lives because of the violence created largely by the federal government for its giving a "green light" for what were in Alabama unlawful actions. We wondered why so many ministers of many denominations became involved in the racial strife. A few idealists were to be expected, but it seems there were droves of preachers among the marching hordes.

A new light was shed recently by an Amarillo newspaper columnist, who wrote: "An Amarillo man received a letter yesterday from a friend in Montgomery, Alabama, an official of an organization of church laymen. The writer penned this P.S.: 'Pray for us. The next ten days will be the most dangerous. Those posing as clergy in rented uniforms are the epitome of anti-Christ! You should see some of them first hand.'"

So it turns out that the huge mass spontaneous demonstration was, to a great degree, phony, with hired marchers and hired preachers in rented "cloth."

It has also come out that many of the marchers of Washington last year were being paid. And the demonstration against the House Committee on Un-American Activities in San Francisco was pulled off mostly by hirelings—of whom? Who is paying for all these riots, sit-ins and marches? Well, who is expecting to "divide and conquer" America?

Nation's Press

(National Review)

The French have a word for it -- for that sort of hopped-up, obsessive frenzy that seizes a community and drives it to irrational excesses, of both thought and conduct: the condition, for example, of much of the South Vietnamese public in the months prior to Diem's assassination, when even self-immolation became routine. The French have come to call it, simply, "intoxication"; and they have noted that, though this spiritual intoxication seems often to set in spontaneously, it can be induced or heightened by those whose interest it serves.

One begins to wonder whether we Americans may not be near the edge of an intoxication brought on by this heady brew of Freedom Now. If we had a drunk test for the spirit, what would it show of a community that accepts lie-downs, by uncouth and grimy provocateurs, along the corridors and gateways of the home and headquarters of the head of state? That sees no absurdity when a mixed band of idealists, slobs, fanatics and nihilists, whose avowed program is civil disobedience, demands an escort of soldiers? That presents to its legislature, with the peremptory order for immediate enactment, a law whose open violation of Constitution and tradition is matched by its break with common sense and reality?

In the delirium of this monstrously misnamed "civil rights movement," everything is permitted. Schools emptied. Children become the advance guard of mobs that throw themselves on the ground, block highways and bridges, chain themselves to lamp posts, lie down in the offices of magistrates. Students leave their campuses to picket banks for lending money, newspapers for printing the news, officials for enforcing the law. Respectable old ladies journey a thousand miles to seek imprisonment in causes of which they understand, and seek to understand, nothing. Audiences crowd the theaters to drink deep of curses and obscenities hurled from the stage at their country, race and religion.

A Detroit woman is shot in Alabama, and four men are shortly thereafter arrested by the FBI, nominally as violators of her civil rights, in substance as her murderers. Within minutes the President, assuming their guilt, has broadcast to the country a ferocious denunciation, not of these four individuals, but of an organization to which they allegedly belong, and has called for still more laws to proscribe that organization. No one seems to think it odd that these men are judged guilty without trial, and that the Klan is judged with them though no evidence has appeared to indicate that the Klan, as an organization, is in any way involved. "Everyone already knows all that it is necessary to know about the Klan," comments the New York Times, adding a typically drunken kind of gratuitous insult to the House Committee on Un-American Activities, which proposes, in order to distinguish gossip from fact, to investigate the Klan: "The committee, with its staff bloated by over-paid time-savers, has never demonstrated any investigating competence." Sitting before the TV cameras on "Meet the Press," with the usually relentless interrogators transformed into acolytes, the Rev. Martin Luther King lays down his decrees with more Johnsonian "I's" and "We's": there will be demonstrations and civil disobedience until our will is done; there must be a total economic boycott of Alabama. And even for that last senseless, as well as impossible proposal, there is solemn discussion instead of laughter.

Buried on page 58 of the March 28 New York Times there was a tiny dispatch from Hattiesburg, Miss., noting that Cloudies Shinall, a 20-year-old Negro, had signed a statement admitting that the previous night, while driving with three other Negroes, he had shot and killed Constable Frederick L. Humphrey, 28 years old, and white. No relation, we gather, of the Vice President, who was not expected at the funeral.

The Communist Connections Of Martin Luther King

*Can you explain this to the American people?
And me?*

The following excerpt from a pamphlet published by THE INDEPENDENT AMERICAN in 1963 reveals the background of Martin Luther King, leader of the Negro mass march from Selma to Montgomery, Alabama, which began on March 21.

REV. MARTIN LUTHER KING

An article appearing in the March, 1935, booklet entitled PARTY ORGANIZER, issued by the Central Committee of the Communist Party, U.S.A., stated:

"In the United States there are five million of the Negro population organized in fraternal organizations, ten million in churches . . . We must systematically study how to penetrate among the millions of organized Negro workers."

In INTERNATIONAL OF YOUTH, published under the authority of the Young Communist International, headquarters in Moscow, March, 1935, appears the following:

" . . . In the South, especially for the Negro youth, the church is the center of all cultural and social activity. It is here that we must work. By building our units in the church organizations, we can improve our work . . . In Alabama there are certain places in which we can in a short while take over the church organizations of youth under our leadership, and these can become legal covers for our work in the South."

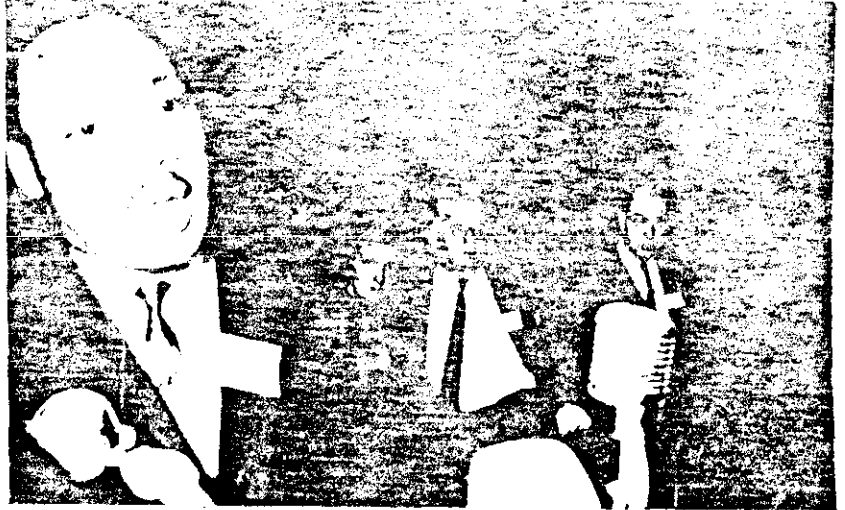
By a strange coincidence, the leader of the riots in Birmingham, Ala., in April, 1963, was a Negro minister by the name of Rev. Martin Luther King. According to an article appearing in the New Bedford, Mass., STANDARD-TIMES:

"Mr. King was quoted as telling a Chicago assembly last year, 'it (the Montgomery, Ala., boycott, in which there was much violence) is a part of something that is happening all over the world. The oppressed people are rising up. They are revolting against colonialism and imperialism and all other systems of oppression.'"

When Martin Luther King draws a parallel between the situation of the American Negro and "oppressed people's" rights against "colonialism" and "imperialism" he is following exactly, to the word, the Communist line.

The Negro ex-Communist, Manning Johnson, appearing before the Joint Legislative Committee of the State of Louisiana on March 8, 1957, testified regarding Communist infiltration of Negro churches in the South, stating:

"They (the Communists) had two-fold purposes . . . First, to be

Fred L. Shuttlesworth. An article in the June, 1963, issue of the CINCINNATI ENQUIRER identified Shuttlesworth as also the new president of the Southern Conference Educational Fund. According to the article, both the Senate Internal Security Subcommittee and the House Committee on Un-American Activities have described the SCEF as an organization set up to promote Communism throughout the South. The field secretary of the SCEF is an identified Communist by the name of Carl Braden, of Louisville, Kentucky.

HUNTER PITTS O'DELL

Rev. Martin Luther King has a facility of attracting to his ranks men with highly questionable backgrounds. One of these is Jack H.

hired O'Dell. However, it soon became known that O'Dell was again in King's employ and, at a press conference in Atlanta on July 25, 1963, Rev. King admitted that on June 26 O'Dell had, "by mutual agreement," left the Southern Christian Leadership Conference for a second time. King gave as the reason his concern that O'Dell's affiliation with the integration movement would be used against it by "segregationists and race baiters."

In other words, according to Rev. King, anyone who brings out the fact that a man with Communist affiliations is associated in a prominent position with the civil rights movement is a "race baiter."

BAYARD RUSTIN

... of the church to participate in various church activities... The idea was to give a coat of protection and responsibility to the Communists operating in the South. For example, in a number of the States, the police officials were constantly after the Communists. Well, the best place for hiding was in the church. So they cloaked themselves in religion, becoming active members in the church."

Again, it is no coincidence that with increasing frequency Negro churches are becoming the assembling areas for mobilizing the Negro masses to pour into the streets in Negro demonstrations.

The activities of Martin Luther King have met with beaming approval by members of the Communist Party, U.S.A. In the pamphlet entitled TURNING POINT IN FREEDOM ROAD published in 1962, the Negro Communist Claude Lightfoot praises Rev. King by describing his activities as "the healthiest sign in the whole Negro struggle."

THE STRANGE ASSOCIATES OF MARTIN LUTHER KING

King conducts most of his racial agitation activities in his capacity as president of the Southern Christian Leadership Conference. The national secretary of King's organization is a Negro by the name of Rev.

ST. LOUIS GLOBE-DEMOCRAT of October 25, 1962, stated:

"A Communist has infiltrated to the top administrative post in the Rev. Martin Luther King's Southern Christian Leadership Conference. He is Jack H. O'Dell, acting executive director of Conference activities in southeastern states... From his birth in Detroit in 1923 until as late as 1958, he was known as Hunter Pitts O'Dell. This O'Dell, by whatever name, operates as a concealed member of the national committee of the Communist Party, U.S.A., according to a highly authoritative source."

On April 12, 1956, Hunter Pitts O'Dell invoked the Fifth Amendment when testifying before the Senate Internal Security Subcommittee. However, Robert Morris, counsel for the subcommittee, said information had been received that O'Dell was, in fact, district organizer for the Communist Party in New Orleans. Hundreds of documents seized at O'Dell's home substantiated his position in the Communist conspiracy.

Shortly after the above-mentioned article appeared in the ST. LOUIS GLOBE-DEMOCRAT and in other newspapers throughout the country, King accepted O'Dell's resignation. When public attention was no longer focused on King and his relationship with O'Dell, King quietly re-

Another strange former associate of Rev. Martin Luther King is Bayard Rustin, a Pennsylvania-born Negro with a British accent. One of Rustin's activities during the period of five years that he served as secretary to Rev. Martin Luther King, was to organize King's 1958 march on Washington which the Communist publication THE WORKER called "a Communist project."

Briefly, here is the sordid background of Rev. King's former personal secretary:

On January 21, 1953, Bayard Rustin pleaded guilty in Pasadena, Calif., to a charge of sex perversion and was sentenced to 60 days. Earlier, as a student at the College of the City of New York, in 1936, Rustin joined the Young Communist League. In World War II he served 26 months in Federal prisons as a conscientious objector.

When A. Philip Randolph, chairman of the August 28, 1963, march on Washington, was confronted with the background facts on the march's deputy director, Rustin, and was asked if such a record would cause the replacement of Rustin, Randolph replied "No, he's Mister March himself! We couldn't do without him."

It is not surprising that Martin Luther King associates himself with characters tagged with Communist-front labels when King's own views are coming nearer and nearer to those of the Communist Party itself. In addressing the march on Washington participants in August, 1963, Rev. King promised that there would be "neither rest nor tranquillity in America" and that "the winds of revolt will continue to shake the foundations of our nation" until his aims are met.

The "revolt" or "revolution" which was so frequently referred to by the speakers in Washington is not really one for so-called Negro "rights," but is, instead, a revolution to seize political power in this nation in order to first hoist the flag of Socialism -- and ultimately, Communism -- over the United States of America.

The April 28, 1965 issue of the "Los Angeles Times", a daily Los Angeles metropolitan newspaper, Section 1, Page 3, carried an article entitled "200 Selma Negroes Lose Jobs, Dr. King Charges." The article dealt with a speech delivered by Dr. Martin Luther King on Tuesday, April 27, 1965 on the campus of the University of California, Los Angeles (UCLA). The article quoted Dr. King as stating that 200 Negroes had been fired from their jobs in Selma, Alabama because they registered to vote. Dr. King called for a "Domestic Freedom Corps" of 2,000 students from northern and western universities to work this summer in 120 counties of the Deep South to help get Negroes to register to vote.

The article stated that Dr. King spoke under the auspices of a UCLA speakers program series and was paid \$2,500.00 for the appearance. He was introduced by UCLA Chancellor Franklin D. Murphy. The article stated that King was "whisked under heavy guard" to the platform where he spoke to the audience.

A source, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised on April 28, 1965 that Dr. Martin Luther King, accompanied by his aide, Bernard Lee, departed Los Angeles on April 28, 1965 at approximately 8:40 AM via Trans World Airlines, Flight 174Y for St. Louis, Missouri, where they were due to arrive at 1:42 PM St. Louis time. Dr. King indicated that he might go on to Atlanta, Georgia from St. Louis before making any other stops.

SUBJECT: REFERRAL BY CONGRESSMAN JOHN J. GILLIGAN, OHIO,
OF POST CARD DEPICTING MARTIN LUTHER KING
AND OTHERS AT COMMUNIST TRAINING SCHOOL

By communication dated 4/26/65, captioned congressman, Democrat, who was elected 11/64 and for whom no derogatory information appears in Bufiles, forwarded a post card depicting Martin Luther King and others at an alleged communist training school. Gilligan asked the names of the three people sitting near Dr. King and that this post card be returned to him. On the reverse side of the post card the names were set forth and a description as to where they appeared. This photograph is readily recognized as one widely being circulated by individuals attempting to point out the true nature of King's activities. A circular received by this Bureau frequently as reprinted from the "Augusta Courier" on 7/8/63 shows the photograph from which the post card picture was cropped. Actually the post card cropped Abner W. Berry and the description on the reverse side would tend to indicate that Berry was the person known to the Bureau as Myles Horton, Director of the Highlander Folk School.

According to Bufiles the individuals depicted in the circular are properly identified. All of these individuals are well known to the Bureau for their communist-front activities and connections.

OBSERVATIONS:

It would be difficult to put in writing the description of the true photograph from which the post card was cropped; however, a personal contact could deliver the circular and the congressman could be apprised of the proper names to be utilized in connection with his request.

RECOMMENDATION:

That someone from your (Mr. DeLoach's) office make the appropriate contact with Congressman Gilligan or his Administrative Assistant and tactfully refer to the confidential nature of data appearing in our files. At this time the attached post card can be returned to him along with the attached circular from the "Augusta Courier" and the "cropping" of Berry can be explained orally. Naturally we cannot verify nor disclaim the characterizations of these men.

The above picture was made by an employee of the State of Georgia, at the Highlander Folk School in Monteagle, Tennessee during the Labor Day week-end of 1957. The photographer was sent to the Highlander Folk School by the Georgia Commission on Education. The Highlander Folk School was abolished by an act of the Legislature of the State of Tennessee at a later date because it was charged with being a subversive organization.

Those numbered in the picture are:

1. Martin Luther King, Jr., of the Montgomery boycott and the Birmingham riots. Karl Prussion, a counterspy for the FBI for twenty-two years, charges that Martin Luther King belongs to sixty Communist-front organizations — more than any Communist in the United States. He is promoted and encouraged by the Kennedys.
2. Abner W. Berry of the Central Committee of the Communist Party.
3. Aubrey Williams, President of the Southern Conference Education Fund, Inc., The Transmission Belt in the South for the Communist Party.
4. Myles Horton, Director of Highlander Folk School for Communist Training, Monteagle, Tennessee.

These "Four Horsemen" of racial agitation have brought tension, disturbance, strife and violence in their advancement of the Communist doctrine of "racial nationalism."

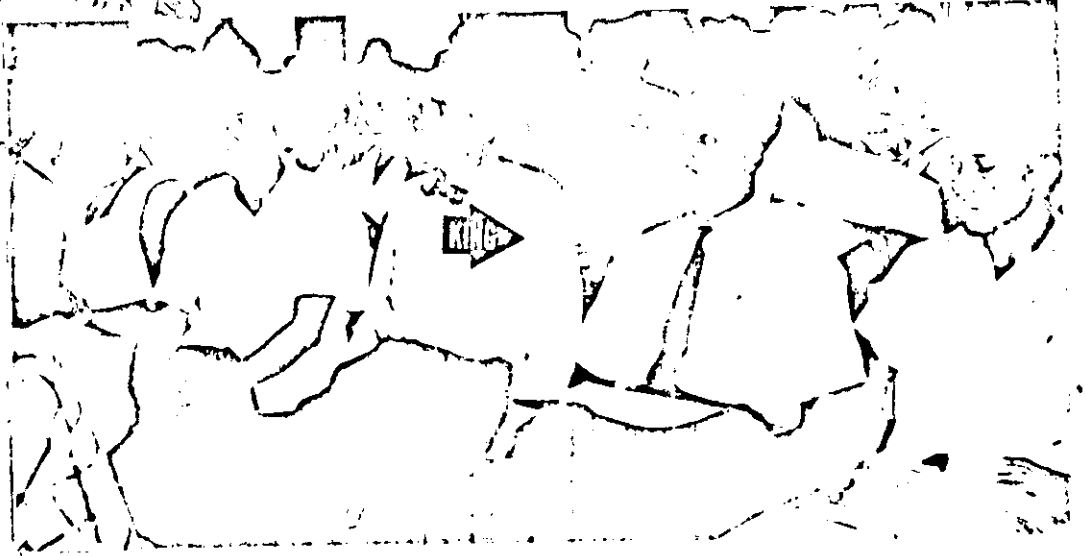

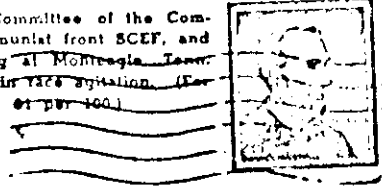
