AT SIX FORTY FIVE AM, JULY EIGHTH INSTANT,

[REDACTED] (PROTECT) ADVISED THE FBI, CHICAGO, THAT HE RECEIVED A CALL FROM AN UNIDENTIFIED MALE STATING THAT HE WAS GOING TO KILL MARTIN LUTHER KING. THIS INDIVIDUAL DID NOT INDICATE TIME, DATE, OR PLACE. [REDACTED] STATED CALLER INDICATED HE WAS CALLING FROM O'HARE FIELD, CHICAGO, AND IN [REDACTED] OPINION WAS INTOXICATED.

AT SEVEN THIRTEEN AM, JULY EIGHTH INSTANT, UNKNOWN MALE CALLED CHICAGO OFFICE OF FBI INQUIRING IF THE FBI IS GOING TO PROTECT MARTIN LUTHER KING AND ADDED NOT TO PUT WHITE MEN IN FRONT "BECAUSE WE DON'T WANT TO KILL WHITE MEN". CALLER INDICATED THEY INTEND TO KILL KING ABOUT THE TWENTY FOURTH OF JULY, WHEN HE IS IN CHICAGO.

b7(c) At the request of Congressman Martin to see an Agent, SA [redacted] called on Congressman Martin on July 1, 1965. The Congressman related he will be obtaining within the next day or two copies of a special Alabama Legislative Committee Report concerning various civil rights organizations which have been active in the state. This report, according to an article in the June 30, 1965, issue of "The Washington Post" (copy enclosed) contains allegations that various civil rights organizations are communist infiltrated or dominated.

b7(c) Congressman Martin declared he is aware of various reports to the effect that Martin Luther King has a communist background. He said he has talked with the President about this, urging the President to let the American people know the truth. He said the President was somewhat condescending in his attitude perhaps because the Congressman is both an Alabamian and a Republican. The Congressman stated he knows full well that as an Alabamian and a Republican he is not the proper person to expose Martin Luther King but as an American he sincerely feels the people of the Nation should know the truth about this man.

Congressman Martin wanted to know if he sent a copy of the Alabama Legislative Committee Report to the FBI would we confirm or deny the allegations contained in the Report. He was told that this would not be possible since information in FBI files is confidential. He then asked where he might obtain some authoritative guidance as to the validity of the Report. He was told that he might wish to consider forwarding the report to the Attorney General with the request that the Department of Justice advise him of its validity. He stated he would do this although he seriously doubted that his request would be honored.

RE: CONGRESSMAN AMES MARTIN

Congressman Martin declared he is genuinely concerned about the type of people who are involved in and heading the so-called civil rights movement. He said, however, he does not intend to make rash statements or charges which he cannot support with fact. He then commented that he has in his files information regarding immorality on the part of civil rights demonstrators. He stated on the day he called on the President at the White House there was a demonstration in progress wherein "beatniks" had been sleeping and sitting on the sidewalks in front of the White House for some time. As he left the White House he asked one of the guards present if there had been any immoral activities on the part of the demonstrators since he noted males and females were using the same blankets. He said the guard told him there certainly had been.

Congressman Martin said he wrote the chief of police asking about this and a month later received copies of numerous affidavits executed by all the police officers on duty around the White House during the demonstration. He said the gist of these affidavits was that numerous officers observed movement under the blankets but took no action since they were under instructions not to bother the demonstrators unless they started trouble.

Congressman Martin said he considers what obviously took place at the White House an utter disgrace.

# Report in Alabama Rips Rights Groups As Red-Dominated

MONTGOMERY, Ala., June 29 (AP)—A special legislative committee charged today that the Student Nonviolent Coordinating Committee (SNCC), a leading civil rights organization, is "extensively Communist dominated."

The Commission to Preserve the Peace also said in a written report to the Alabama Legislature that:

- The Congress of Racial Equality (CORE) is "an important arm of the pro-Communist conspiracy and a dedicated agent working toward the Sovietizing of America."

- The Southern Christian Leadership Conference (SCLC) headed by the Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. is "actively engaged in promoting the Communist line" and is "substantially under control of Communists."

Dr. King, the Committee report said, "is probably not a member of the Communist Party, USA, nor any identified Communist splinter party." But, it charged, "the 10-year history of his rise to prominence through advocating social revolution is part and parcel of the Communist operation in America during the same period."

The report said Dr. King "has amassed an amazing number of Communist 'fronts'" and "has been closely, even intimately, associated with persons who have been officially labeled under oath before congressional committees as Communists."

(In Atlanta, Dr. King said the Committee's charges were "another attempt to evade the fact that democracy does not exist in Alabama.")

(Julian Bond of Atlanta, public information director for SNCC and newly elected Georgia state representative, said: "It is a typical response from a typical Southern legislature that knows if the Negroes in Alabama could register to vote freely then they wouldn't be sitting in their seats today.")

(James Farmer, national director of CORE, said in Durham, N.C., where CORE is holding its national convention:

("The charges made today

... would be too ludicrous to answer if they were not so serious. The charge that CORE or its leadership is now pro-Communist or is heading in that direction is false, completely and entirely false.")

The five-man Committee was created by the Legislature in the wake of racial troubles in Birmingham two years ago to investigate individuals and groups "who may be engaged in activities of an unlawful nature against the sovereignty of the state . . . and which may be detrimental to the peace and dignity of the state . . ."

The chairman of the investigating Committee is State Rep. John Hawkins of Jefferson County. The other members are Reps. Hugh Locke of Jefferson and Alton Turner of Crenshaw County and Sens. Jimmy Clark of Barbour and E. O. Eddins of Marengo.

With only two full time employees, a staff director and secretary, the Committee said it reached its findings from information gathered by the staff, by part time investigators, on hearings at which witnesses voluntarily appeared, and from contacts with law enforcement officers.

The 39-page report described SNCC as "an extremely dangerous, irresponsible group which tends to promote acts of violence to gain support for their own goals."

It said SNCC leadership "substantially follows the Communist Party line," and labeled the organization "an agent for the Communist conspiracy."

The Committee said SNCC constitutes "one of the most serious attempts by the Communists in America, with support of Red China, Cuba and Communist nations in Africa, to effect a violent overthrow of existing governments, state and Federal, in the United States."

The report added that "we are further faced with the growing attempt of Black Muslim groups to join hands with SNCC and other groups on the far left."

In its report on CORE, the Committee referred to "large number of Communist agents working under CORE banners."

The report said CORE "is moving even more into active Communist identification. The dozen top leaders . . . including the director, James Farmer, and its field secretary, James Peck, have impressive pro-Communist records."







(1) King's injection into the Vietnam situation; (2) Communist influences on King relative to Vietnam, including advice from such as Stanley Levison, the long-time communist; (3) The current Party line on Vietnam as seen through its directives and propaganda urging peace and attacking the U.S. policy; (4) Evidences of implementation of the Party line through a Party spokesman and a communist front; (5) Planned activities of the Student Non-Violent Coordinating Committee further illustrates the tie between the civil rights movement and Vietnam; and (6) Potential for Party exploitation of King's influence. (u)

It is noted that there has been no publicity to date in the newspapers or in the form of leaflets advertising a demonstration or work stoppage for July 9, 1965. It is also noted that the newspaper accounts set forth in attached LHM concerning KING's appearance in Los Angeles do not mention a demonstration or work stoppage. It is further noted that workers in heavy construction industry in Los Angeles have been on strike for some time and other construction workers have joined in the strike, but this is a legitimate labor dispute and has no relationship to the proposed work stoppage on July 9, 1965.

Reference is made to the letterhead memorandum dated June 4, 1965, at Los Angeles on captioned matter.

The "Los Angeles Times," a daily Los Angeles metropolitan newspaper, issue of June 20, 1965, page 15, carried an article captioned "King to Launch New Attack Here July 11." The article stated that Dr. Martin Luther King would speak in Los Angeles on July 11, 1965, as part of what has been termed a "major attack by the Southern Christian Leadership Conference against segregation in northern cities." The article stated that King would address the closing session of the Western Christian Leadership Conference convention in Los Angeles on the same day. The article quotes the Reverend Ralph Abernathy, the Vice-President of the Southern Christian Leadership Conference (SCLC) as stating that King's appearance will be an attack upon de facto segregation in public schools, discrimination in employment, and racial injustice, and that the movement would be taken to such cities as New York, Chicago, Detroit, Philadelphia, Los Angeles, and possibly Cleveland and Baltimore. The article further quoted Abernathy as stating that the SCLC would try to end segregation through negotiation but would resort to demonstrations if talks failed.

The "Los Angeles Sentinel," a weekly newspaper published and distributed in Los Angeles, California, issue of June 24, 1965, page A-9, carried an article stating that Dr. Martin Luther King would speak in Los Angeles on July 11, 1965, as part of his campaign to spotlight discrimination

and segregation in northern cities. The article then quoted the Reverend Ralph Abernathy along the same lines as those set forth in the article above from the "Los Angeles Times."

On June 30, 1965, a source, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised that Martin Luther King, Jr., is scheduled to speak on July 9, 1965, at the Victory Baptist Church, a Negro church, 4802 Mc Kinley Avenue, Los Angeles. This source had no further information concerning King's speech nor any information concerning a demonstration or work stoppage in the construction industry scheduled for July 9, 1965.

The Attorney General called. He stated he has been concerned about the Martin Luther King position on Vietnam and he wondered whether the Bureau could put together a memorandum on: 1. How King gets on this to this extent; and 2. has there been any hard Communist Party line tying together Vietnam and the civil rights movement. I stated we would get that together. The Attorney General stated he thought it would be helpful to have for the Secretary of State and the President something that would tie some of this together.

I stated there was no doubt in my mind from information we have had in the past few months that King, Levison and Jones in New York have been having these buddies together meeting at the Kennedy Airport motor inn. I stated, of course, Stanley Levison is a member of the Communist Party and Clarence Jones also. The Attorney General asked if we had any information independent of that that the Communist Party is trying to tie Vietnam and civil rights together. I stated I thought there was something along that line from informants in the Party that there is a definite tie in on that and we have had at various demonstrations over the last months, actual communists marching in the demonstrations. I referred briefly to the demonstrations on the Berkeley campus of the University of California. *(S)*

The Attorney General stated there is a fair identity with civil rights groups of a lot of people who have taken the liberal line on civil rights and on Vietnam and there has always been that identity of view, but he is more interested in the hard part of it because he spoke with Roy Wilkins, who is somewhat upset and thinks it is wrong, as did James Farmer. The Attorney General stated they are concerned with what King is doing and he, the Attorney General, thought maybe Bayard Rustin was in it but he is inclined to think it is not Rustin. I stated I thought it was Levison and Jones.



For record purposes, at 3:20 p. m. this afternoon Wick received a telephone call from [redacted] said that

[redacted] are making every effort to discredit Martin Luther King and his recent outburst on Vietnam. [redacted] said [redacted] has learned that Levison, whom he described as a New York attorney, is connected with the Communist Party in some way and advised Martin Luther King to come out against the Administration on Vietnam. [redacted] asked if there is anything of a public source nature that would discredit Levison either as a member of the Communist Party or as a member of a front group or signer of a petition concerning communism or the Soviets.

After checking, Wick told [redacted] we could be of no help to him.

[redacted] at 3:40 p. m. today called Wick. He said [redacted] Wick told him we could be of no help to him whatsoever.

[redacted] said that under the circumstances, he believed [redacted] would make no mention of the alleged connection they have picked up between King and Levison. Wick asked him how he knows that Levison is advising King on the Vietnam matter. [redacted] said [redacted] obtained this from a friend in Atlanta, presumably at Southern Christian Leadership Conference Headquarters.

The "Boston Globe", a daily newspaper published at Boston, Massachusetts, in its issue of March 19, 1965, contained an article entitled, "Non-Violent Tactics Taught in Roxbury". According to this article, since the previous Monday the Southern Christian Leadership Conference (SCLC) had been given basic training in non-violent survival tactics at Roxbury (Boston) to 250 persons who plan to take part in the Selma-to-Montgomery, Alabama march. The article mentioned that Dr. Martin Luther King, leader of the SCLC, had called Rev. Virgil Wood, President of the Massachusetts Unit of the SCLC, and asked that training be given to all persons going to Alabama. Since then, at the Blue Hill Christian Center at 288 Blue Hill Avenue, Roxbury, training had been given. According to the article, instructors in connection with this training included James Reed, a community worker with the center, who had also been to Selma. The article further mentioned that James Reed gave some pointers on how to react to tear gas.

The "Record American", a daily newspaper published at Boston, in its issue of March 22, 1965, identified a group of Massachusetts residents who had been in Selma, Alabama during the previous week and were believed to have been among those who had been on the March to Montgomery. According to the article, all went to Alabama under the sponsorship of the SCLC and included in this list of names was that of James Reed, Boston.

[REDACTED], said that James Reed had served as a bodyguard for Rev. Martin Luther King, Jr. when he was last in Boston during April, 1965, but he had no knowledge that Reed had acted in this capacity in any other cities.

The records of the Boston Police Department contain a schedule which was drawn up in connection with the visit of Rev. King to Boston on April 22 and 23, 1965. This schedule was drawn up after a meeting was held in the Office of Superintendent Herbert F. Mulleney of the Boston Police Department on April 20, 1965. At this meeting there were representatives from the Boston Police Department, including Superintendent Mulleney, as well as representatives from the Massachusetts Unit of the SCLC, and among those representing that organization was the Rev. Virgil Weed, President.

It is set forth in the schedule that King, after his arrival at Boston on April 22, 1965, would include a visit on that day to the SCLC headquarters at 288 Blue Hill Avenue, Roxbury. On April 23, 1965 Rev. King would meet with the marchers at the Carter Playground, Columbus Avenue, Boston. Thereafter, Rev. King and the other marchers were going to march to the Boston Common where a rally would take place. Tentative plans had also been set up by the Rev. King to go to the City Hall at Boston and he would eventually depart from Boston on April 23, 1965, at 4:00 p.m.

This schedule mentioned that the "security contact" for the Rev. King was James Reed who would be in charge of forty or fifty special bodyguards for Rev. King. These men were to appear in advance of Rev. King at all places which he would visit. According to the schedule, James Reed could be contacted at 288 Blue Hill Avenue.

On Page 30-A of the June 27, 1965 issue of "The Miami Herald", Miami, Florida newspaper, there is an article captioned, "Baptist Shuns Civil Disobedience", written over the by-line of ADON TAFT, Herald Religion Editor. A portion of this article is as follows:

"An influential leader at the Baptist World Alliance here Saturday rejected civil disobedience to attain civil rights.

"Dr. Joseph H. Jackson also backed the movement to elect an African Negro as president of BWA.

"Jackson is president of the 5.5-million member National (Negro) Baptist Convention in the U.S.A. and a vice president of BWA.

"He said civil disobedience and economic boycotts are 'negative approaches which may call attention to problems but cannot solve them.'

"He called for a positive approach, citing the \$10 million educational foundation being set up by his own organization.

"'We must go from protest to production,' Jackson said.

"He added that education will put Negroes in a better economic and political position to gain full rights and accept full responsibilities.

"It was a familiar theme for Jackson. He has steadily refused to go along with Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., civil rights leader.

"King formerly was a member of Jackson's denomination but now is affiliated with the American Baptist Convention.

"He said the Negro churches, the NAACP and the Urban League had carried the brunt of the fight before King's appearance.

"(Jackson's presence on the BWA Executive Committee has been suggested by some observers as the reason King is not on the BWA congress program.)

"Jackson said the civil rights battle practically had been won before King's Southern Christian Leadership Conference and other such groups came on the scene.

"..... While Dr. Jackson was holding his press conference inside the convention hall where 12,000 delegates were listening to talks, a group of 46 sign-carrying representatives of the International Christian Youth were picketing the presence at the congress of five delegates from Russia.

"The signs called the Russians Communists. The protest group was ignored."

Also on Page 30-A of this issue of "The Miami Herald" was an article captioned, "King Says He's Only A Delegate", as follows:

"The Rev. Martin Luther King, one of the world's leading Baptists, arrived in Miami Saturday for the Baptist World Alliance-- without an invitation to speak.

RE: MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR.

"King, the 1964 winner of the Nobel Peace Prize, diplomatically brushed the matter aside.

"'I have spoken at many conventions', he said. 'I don't deem it necessary to be on the platform. I am here merely as a delegate.'

"Earlier Saturday, Dr. Joseph H. Jackson, Chicago Negro Clergyman, specifically criticized the King-styled civil disobedience movement as 'negative'.

"Dr. Jackson is on the executive committee of the World Alliance.

"'I consider Dr. Jackson a Christian brother', said King, arriving here after an eight-day lecture tour of Jamaica. 'But most Negroes don't agree with him. I certainly believe the program of non-violence is necessary.'

"King noted that Negroes have picketed Dr. Jackson's church in Chicago and that NAACP delegates once 'booed him down.' 'But I don't want to get into a public debate', he said.'

The June 27, 1965 issue of "The Miami News", Miami, Florida newspaper contained an article captioned "Rev. King Raps The Pickets", over the by-line of LOUISE BLANCHARD, Reporter of "The Miami News", as follows:

"'Picketing of the Baptist World Alliance convention by a rightist anti-Communist group is unfortunate,' Dr. Martin Luther King said here yesterday.

"'It's fine that Christianity is still alive in Russia, in spite of the attempt of atheistic communism to do away with the church', he said.

RE: MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR.

"I'm glad that we can have fellowship with our Russian brethren. It may be that those Russian Baptists will be able to inject a new spiritual dimension into the vein of Russian society", said Dr. King, Negro civil rights leader who won the Nobel Peace Prize.

"An organization called Christian Witnesses Against Communism picketed Miami Beach Convention Hall briefly in protest against the presence of Russian Baptists at the convention of the worldwide BWA.

"Dr. King, president of the Southern Christian Leadership Conference, met reporters when he arrived to attend the BWA convention as a delegate and a Baptist minister.

"Asked why he wasn't making a speech, Dr. King smiled and said, 'It isn't necessary for me to speak at every Baptist gathering.'

"The Southern Christian Leadership Conference does not plan to concentrate civil rights demonstrations this summer on any one community, Dr. King said. But it will work to double the number of Negro registered voters in the South.

"We will do some work in northern cities', he said. 'There are many big future problems in the ghettos of the major cities of the North.

"Mississippi inevitably will be a testing ground', he added. 'It's the worst state in the country, a reign of terror.'

"He predicted that civil rights non-violent demonstrators 'will have to do a great deal of work in Mississippi to bring the issue before the conscience of the nation.'

RE: MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR.

"Civil rights workers might return to St. Augustine, scene of riots last summer," Dr. King said.

"I've been disturbed by some recent developments in St. Augustine", he said. "We are always on call. If necessary, we certainly will go back to St. Augustine."

"He said economic barriers to racial equality 'are certainly the most difficult and agonizing problem we face. If the Negro cannot enter into the mainstream of economic life, other accomplishments are meaningless. It's not much good to be allowed to enter a restaurant if you don't have money for a hamburger.'"

The June 29, 1965 issue of "The Miami Herald" contained an article captioned "Rev. King's 'Stirs Row'", over the by-line of ADON TAIN, Religion Editor, as follows:

"An undercurrent of resentment over the absence of Martin Luther King from the opening of the Baptist World Alliance Congress spilled into the open here Monday.

"A young Negro pastor from Houston, in his absence 'the indictment of the Baptist World Alliance' in an address to a special session for pastors. Applause, by both Negroes and whites, from most of the 2,000 at the Miami Beach Auditorium interrupted the speech.

"The Rev. William A. Lawson was speaking on 'Race and Human Rights'. He said that the fact that race should be an issue at the meeting of 17,000 delegates from some 80 countries ranges 'from embarrassing to clumsy'.

RE: MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR.

"He went on to talk about the need for prophets in this field. 'The person who should be here,' Rev. Lawson said, 'is a prophet who would have been vetoed by the program committee--the Nobel Peace Prize winner who ever now is on the grounds (a reference to King, who attended the conference Sunday, but who was to return to Atlanta Monday).

"Dr. Theodore Adams, chairman of the program committee, explained that King was not deliberately excluded from the program, but was just not selected in the process of sifting more than 1,000 names to pick 233 speakers from 52 countries to address the congress.

"King declined in invitation to be on the program in Rio de Janeiro in 1960, did appear on the program of last year's tri-annual meeting of the European Baptist Confederation and cancelled out of the 1963 program of the Baptist World Youth Conference in Beirut, Lebanon', said Dr. Adams, a member of the Southern Baptist Convention and former president of the Baptist World Alliance.

"Many observers at the conference have suggested that the presence of Dr. Joseph H. Jackson, president of the National Baptist Convention in the U.S.A., Inc., from which King has broken, on the administrative committee of the alliance, is the reason King was not on the program here."

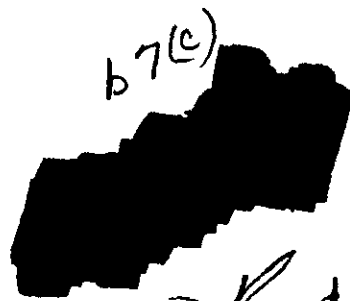

# MARTIN LUTHER KING.... AT COMMUNIST TRAINING SCHOOL



The above picture was made by an employee of the State of Georgia, at the Highlander Folk School in Monteagle, Tennessee during the Labor Day week-end of 1957. The photographer was sent to the Highlander Folk School by the Georgia Commission on Education. The Highlander Folk School was abolished by an act of the Legislature of the State of Tennessee at a later date because it was charged with being a subversive organization.

Those numbered in the picture are:

1. Martin Luther King, Jr., of the Montgomery boycott and the Birmingham riots. Karl Prussion, a counterspy for the FBI for twenty-two years, charges that Martin Luther King belongs to sixty Communist-front organizations — more than any Communist in the United States.
2. Abner W. Berry of the Central Committee of the Communist Party.
3. Aubrey Williams, President of the Southern Conference Education Fund, Inc., The Transmission Belt in the South for the Communist Party.
4. Myles Horton, Director of Highlander Folk School for Communist Training, Monteagle, Tennessee.

These "Four Horsemen" of racial agitation have brought tension, disturbance, strife and violence in their advancement of the Communist doctrine of "racial nationalism."

# Communist Revealed As Rev. King's Aid

## National Red Leader Directing Negro Drive in Southern States

By a Globe-Democrat Special Writer

WASHINGTON.—A Communist has infiltrated to the top administrative post in the Rev. Martin Luther King's Southern Christian Leadership Conference.

He is Jack H. O'Dell, acting executive director of conference activities in southeastern states, including Georgia, Alabama, Mississippi and Louisiana.

From his birth in Detroit in 1923 until as late as 1958 he was known as Hunter Pitts O'Dell. This Mr. O'Dell, by whatever name, operates as a concealed member of the national committee of the Communist Party, USA, according to a highly authoritative source.

Until a few weeks ago, O'Dell was the regional consultant to the conference staff, which has headquarters in Atlanta. He became acting director recently. Main functions of the staff are to set up voter registration schools, "work shops," for promotion of civil rights activities and public meetings.

After attending school in New Orleans, La., O'Dell sailed for several years as a sailor in the Merchant Marine. In July, 1950, however, he was expelled from the National Maritime Union at Galveston, Tex. The union took exception to his circulation of pro-Soviet peace petitions attacking the government of the United States.

On April 12, 1956, identifying himself as Hunter Pitts O'Dell, a New Orleans waiter, he testified before the Senate Internal Security Subcommittee. He invoked the Fifth Amendment and refused to say whether he was a southern district organizer for the Communist Party.

Robert Morris, counsel for the subcommittee, said information had been received that O'Dell was, in fact, a district organizer for the Communist Party in New Orleans; that O'Dell gave "directions to the professional group" in that city, and that he operated under three different names—the two other names being John Vesey and Ben Jones.

### KEY POSITION

It was learned that documents seized at O'Dell's residence by New Orleans police clearly established his key position in the Communist movement in the South.

On July 30, 1958, identifying himself as Hunter Pitts O'Dell, a Montgomery, Ala., insurance man, he appeared before the House Committee on Un-American Activities in an Atlanta hearing. An Associated Press story reported that O'Dell "tried unsuccessfully to turn the hearing into a discussion of mistreatment of Negroes in the South."

O'Dell invoked the First and Fifth Amendments and declined to answer committee questions about his Communist activities.

In recent years, it was learned, O'Dell has tried to remain in the background in carrying out his Communist Party assignments.

Officers of the Southern Christian Leadership Conference are the Rev. King, president; the Rev. E. L. Shuttlesworth, formerly of Birmingham, Ala., secretary; and the Rev. Ralph Abernethy, formerly of Montgomery, Ala., treasurer.

# Cincinnati Pastor Named As Head Of 'Red Front'

To help its readers keep on guard against propaganda, the Cincinnati Enquirer brings you this authoritative weekly report.

### BY JACK LOTTO

One of the top leaders of the integration movement in the South has been named head of a big pro-Communist front.

He is the Rev. Fred L. Shuttlesworth, 965 Dana Ave., pastor of the Revelation Baptist Church, 1556 John St.

The post he was elected to is President of the "Southern Conference Educational Fund," with headquarters in New Orleans, and active in 17 southern states.

Both the Senate internal security subcommittee and the House Committee on Un-American Activities have described the SCEF as an organization set up to

"promote Communism" throughout the South.

This group has a long history of activity in the South. It originally was known as the "Southern Conference for Human Welfare." One of its founders was a veteran Communist, the late Louis E. Burnham.

When the SCHW was cited as a Communist front in 1947 by the House committee, it ostensibly went out of business.

It quickly reopened at the same New Orleans address, under the new name and with the same telephone number.

According to the Senate subcommittee, the Southern Conference Educational Fund was "operating with substantially the same leadership and purposes" of its predecessor.

Said the House report on the SCHW:

"It seeks to attract southern liberals on the basis of its seeming interest in the

problems of the South. Its professed interest in southern welfare is simply an expedient for larger aims serving the Soviet Union and its subservient Communist party in the U. S."

The field secretary for the SCEF, and editor of its publication, "The Southern Patriot," is Carl Braden, of Louisville, Ky. Braden, identified in sworn testimony as a member of the Communist party, recently finished serving a one-year prison term for contempt of Congress.

New additions to the Board of the Southern Conference Educational Fund included the Rev. James A. Zellner, Methodist minister in Panama, City, Fla. He is the father of Bob Zellner, the "freedom-walker" active in the "student non-violence committee," and now serving a jail term in Alabama.

ANOTHER BOARD member is Mrs. Diane Bevel, of Cleveland, Miss., active in Nashville student demonstrations, and currently working in Alabama and Mississippi.

She is jailed in Gadsden, Ala., for taking part with Zellner in a pro-integration march, following in the steps of William Moore, the postman shot and killed during a one-man protest march.

Communists are prominent in the South, involving friction between whites and Negroes. On the scene is James E. Jackson, member of the four-man ruling secretariat of the U. S. Communist party.

Jackson, who is propaganda boss in the U. S. for the Reds, is also the party secretary for southern Negro affairs—a polite term for chief racial troublemaker.

This Moscow-trained Negro has been in the forefront of Communist organizational and agitation work in the South for years.

In 1959, he went to Russia as the representative of the U. S. Communist Party at the 21st World Congress of Communist parties. There, he hailed the Soviet Union and denounced the United States.

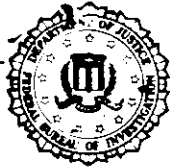

Our Boston Office confidentially obtained proof sheets for captioned book which is due to be published 7/4/65 by Western Islands Publishers, Belmont, Massachusetts. Bureau indices negative re author and publisher.

The Author:

Bureau Library sources checked revealed that Stang wrote an article entitled "Communist Terror in the Streets" which appeared in the September, 1964, issue of "American Opinion," a magazine edited and published by Robert Welch of the John Birch Society. Stang also wrote an article entitled "Separatists - Communist Revolution in Canada" in the April, 1965, issue of "American Opinion." Stang is described in this magazine as a former business editor for Prentice - Hall, Inc. ; a television writer, producer and consultant; and a resident of New York City. Check of New York Office indices and established sources revealed no information re Stang. Significantly, it is to be noted that the address for Western Islands, the publisher of Stang's book, is 395 Concord Avenue, Belmont, Massachusetts, which is the same address for Robert Welch, Inc., publishers of "American Opinion."

"It's Very Simple" is an attempt to rationalize today's civil rights movement in this country as primarily a communist operation. The author describes communist take overs in various countries and then attempts to draw parallels between demonstrations and riots in the United States (such as the New York City difficulties in July, 1964) with riots and revolutions throughout the world. Stang covers a wide spectrum of civil rights activities from those of legitimate racial organizations to the Black Nationalist Groups. Practically all his documentation is to public source material and there is no significant information in the book which appears to be new and previously unknown to the Bureau. Stang makes frequent use of literary license and importantly fails to include documentation for key passages (examples appear on pages 101 and 185). An

entire chapter (14) is devoted to an attack on civil rights legislation and the book, in general, is critical of all Administration and other efforts aimed at improving the lot of the Negro. Although there are references to the FBI, they are not derogatory to the Bureau or the Director. Pages 71 and 209 contain quotations of the Director relative to the communist influence in the racial movement.

Stang's last chapter contains such strong conclusions that their full impact can best be felt by the following exact quotations of some excerpts:

"....America's 'race problem' and the 'civil rights movement' supposed to end it, have both been planned by the Communists....built up by the Communists,....."

"....the 'civil rights movement' is for the most part a Communist operation..."

"....there is a real problem between the races in this country today, and that it has been caused almost in its entirety by the Communists..."

"....growing hopelessness and despair among Negro Americans today....is largely the work of the Communists..."

"....growing hostility between black and white Americans... is for the most part the work of the Communists..."

"I accuse the Rev. Dr. King of being in effect one of the country's most influential workers for communism and against the Negroes. I accuse President Kennedy and President Johnson of knowing this but nevertheless not only closing their eyes to it, but lending a hand. I therefore accuse them both of having betrayed their oath of office."

OBSERVATIONS:

The details of the book do not support the strong conclusions reached by the author. We have had available to us all the material which Stang has plus considerable additional data from our investigations and we could not arrive at such conclusions. The impression is received that Stang may have well started with his conclusions and then developed the information and manner of presentation which he hoped would prove his point. This work must be viewed in the light of the author's apparent close connections with Robert Welch and the John Birch Society.

Attached for all recipients except New Orleans is one copy each of the most recent photo available in the Bureau's Identification Division. It is noted that this photo was taken in 1953.

The Bureau has not had any prior information concerning Reed serving as a "security officer" or bodyguard on behalf of King. Neither has there been any indication that King has had anyone serving as an armed bodyguard. The Bureau desires to determine whether or not there is any basis in fact for the allegations contained in referenced communications.

All recipients except New Orleans, which offices cover areas in which King has traveled considerably in the past 1-2 years, should advise whether or not there has been any indication that King has been accompanied by an armed bodyguard and whether or not Reed has been seen in his company. It is suggested that the photograph of Reed be displayed to Agents who have observed King and to cooperative law enforcement officers who would be in a position to know whether or not Reed has been accompanying King.

Investigation should be given expeditious attention and replies promptly submitted to the Bureau and Atlanta, origin, by airtel.

New Orleans take note that its LHM spelled the individual's family name as Reeds the first time listed and as Reed the second time. Identification record has no spelling Reeds. It is assumed the "s" was inadvertently included in the spelling. Reairtel stated that inasmuch as the information was confidentially furnished, no local dissemination was being made. This is not considered a justification for not making local dissemination if such dissemination was merited. If it was merited, it should have been made and the LHM appropriately classified. Further, it was incorrect reporting procedure to state in an LHM merely that "information was received." There must be an attribution to a source and, if necessary, that source concealed.

New Orleans should promptly resubmit an appropriate LHM so that the Bureau may make dissemination. All recipients should include positive information in LHMs so that if dissemination is indicated it may be made by the Bureau. All offices will note that a variation in spelling of Reed's last name is Reid as appearing on the attached photograph.

NOTE:

The foregoing investigation being made to determine the veracity of the allegation concerning King having an armed bodyguard as this may be pertinent in connection with Bureau interests concerning King. In addition, if it develops that King does have an armed bodyguard with such a disreputable record as is indicated, there may be some counterintelligence possibilities for the Bureau to exploit.

Reference is made to memoranda captioned as above dated May 4, 1965 and May 14, 1965 at Charlotte, North Carolina.

Sources familiar with activities of the United Klans of America, Inc., Knights of the Ku Klux Klan, were contacted and advised that no information had been received regarding a plot to assassinate MARTIN LUTHER KING at Wilson, North Carolina or any other place in the United States.

Further, they have all stated that no information had been received concerning any plan of the United Klans of America to appropriate any money to be paid to the killer of MARTIN LUTHER KING.

UNITED KLANS OF AMERICA, INC.  
KNIGHTS OF THE KU KLUX KLAN (UNITED KLANS)

Records of Superior Court of Fulton County, Georgia, show that this Klan organization was granted a corporate charter on February 21, 1961, at Atlanta, Georgia, under the name United Klans, Knights of the Ku Klux Klan of America, Inc.

A source advised on February 27, 1961, that United Klans was formed as a result of a split in U. S. Klans, Knights of the Ku Klux Klan, Inc. According to the source, the split resulted from a leadership dispute, and United Klans has the same aims and objectives as the parent group. These are the promotion of Americanism, white supremacy, and segregation of the races.

The first source and second source advised in July, 1961, that United Klans, Knights of the Ku Klux Klan of America, Inc., merged with Alabama Knights, Knights of the Ku Klux Klan. The merged organization established headquarters in Suite 401, The Alston Building, Tuscaloosa, Alabama. The organization is directed by ROBERT SHELTON, Imperial Wizard, and is the dominant Klan group in the South with units in several southern states.

On August 14, 1961, the second source advised that the organization formerly known as United Klans, Knights of the Ku Klux Klan of America, Inc., would be known in the future as United Klans of America, Inc., Knights of the Ku Klux Klan. The second source said the name was changed by a resolution adopted at the National Klonvocation held July 8, 1961, at Indian Springs, Georgia.

Second source advised that at a meeting at Prattville, Alabama, on October 22, 1961, a majority of the Klaverns of the U. S. Klans, Knights of the Ku Klux Klan, merged with the United Klans of America, Inc., Knights of the Ku Klux Klan.

KNIGHTS OF THE KU KLUX KLAN (NORTH CAROLINA)  
(UNITED KLANS)

On August 17, 1964, a source advised that the North Carolina organization of United Klans of America, Inc., Knights of the Ku Klux Klan, became affiliated with the national organization of the same group in the Spring of 1961. The State Headquarters are at the residence of North Carolina Grand Dragon JAMES ROBERTSON JONES, Granite Quarry, North Carolina, who is subordinate to the national organization with headquarters in Tuscaloosa, Alabama.

The organization in North Carolina has the same aims and objectives as the parent group; that is, advocacy of segregation of the races and white supremacy.

Dear Mr. Hoover,

It is all but impossible to get the whole truth from Newspapers and News Magazines concerning the situation as to what extent the Negro revolt in America is instigated and fed by Communists. Since, I was reared in the belief that we are all God's children with a free choice, some having accepted Christ and endeavoring to live as He taught and others having not accepted Him live by their own desires, I try very hard not to be bigoted or prejudiced.

Somehow, during the past few months I have begun to question the motives of Dr. Martin Luther King in the light of Christian truth as I see it. Knowingly, I would never do anything to hamper the establishment of The Kingdom of God in the hearts of men, by virtue of this fact, I could never do anything to foster Communism in America or in any other part of the world. In August Dr. King is to speak at Montreat, N. C., which is the summer conference grounds of the Presbyterian Church, U. S. (Southern) of which I am a member. I have been told by many that I owe it to myself and to Dr. King to hear what he has to say. I am confused. Not being one to necessarily stand with the crowd, I don't mind standing alone, if I am sure I am right. However, I am not sure if he has any connections with the communist party, consequently I am asking for help from your department. I have just read from the Congressional Record the report of Mr. Dickinson of Alabama on the March on Montgomery and I am more confused.

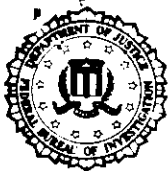

Reference is made to communication dated June 3, 1965, captioned "Proposed Activities By National Knights Of The Ku Klux Klan Upon Martin Luther King, Jr.'s Visit to Antioch College, Yellow Springs, Ohio, June 19, 1965."

On June 18, 1965, a source who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised that as of this date there is no information the Ku Klux Klan plans to protest or conduct activities at Antioch College while Martin Luther King, Jr. is in the Yellow Springs, Ohio, area.

On the same date, another source who has not furnished enough information in the past to determine extent of reliability, determined that the Klan could not "muster" enough people to burn crosses in the vicinity of Yellow Springs and do not plan to conduct activities in or near Yellow Springs, Ohio, June 18 or 19, 1965.

During the time King was in Yellow Springs, Ohio, no Klan activities took place, and no incidents relating to King's visit were brought to the attention of his office.

NATIONAL KNIGHTS OF THE KU KLUX KLAN, INC, (NKKKK)

A source advised that on May 22, 1960, the National Grand Council of the Knights of the Ku Klux Klan met at Atlanta, Georgia, to discuss consolidation of the Klan's unity of effort and activities to establish a National Fund, and a National Secretary, and to design a new flag. The meeting was attended by representatives of the Federation of Ku Klux Klan, Alabama; Association of Arkansas Klans, Arkansas; Florida Knights of the Ku Klux Klan, Florida; Southern Knights of the Ku Klux Klan, Florida; Association of Georgia Klans, Georgia; Knights of the Ku Klux Klan, North Carolina; Association of South Carolina Klans, South Carolina; Dixie Knights of the Ku Klux Klan, Tennessee; and Hyksos Klan, Texas.

This source advised that at a consolidation meeting at Atlanta, Georgia, September 2-5, 1960, at which the North Carolina and Texas Klans were not represented, it was resolved and passed that their name be changed to National Ku Klux Klan.

A second source advised in March, 1964, that several meetings of Klan groups were held during the period 1960 to 1963 in an effort to unite the Klan groups under a single leadership.

The organization was granted a charter in DeKalb County, Georgia, November 1, 1963, under the name National Knights of the Ku Klux Klan, Inc., as a "patriotic, secret, social, and benevolent order."

A third source advised in December, 1963, that the organization had issued a statement of its program which indicated the organization to be anti-Negro, anti-Jewish, anti-Catholic, and anti-foreign born.

The third source advised in August, 1964, that the organization has a headquarters in Tucker, Georgia, and the day-to-day operations are under the direction of James R. Venable, Chairman.

NATIONAL KNIGHTS OF THE KU KLUX KLAN  
OF OHIO, INC. (NKKKK)

On October 8, 1964, Karen Crabtree, Clerk, Secretary of State's Office, Columbus, State of Ohio, advised public records from this office indicate a charter was granted the NKKKK of Ohio on October 5, 1964, by the State of Ohio. The charter was filed under Certificate Number 10194, and the Corporation Number is 334111.

The purpose of the corporation is to operate as a realm organization within the State of Ohio and in accordance with the Constitution and laws of the National Knights of the Ku Klux Klan, Inc., Atlanta, Georgia. Second, to promote patriotism toward the civil government, honorable peace among men and nations, love among ourselves, liberty, justice and patriotic association for the mutual benefit of all mankind.

The incorporation papers were signed by Flynn R. Harvey, Grand Dragon. Flynn R. Harvey, 418 Josephine Drive, Columbus, Ohio; William K. Smith, 3482 Maple Grove Drive, Grove City, Ohio; and Bobby J. Stephens, 2973 Reaver Avenue, Grove City, Ohio, are the corporation trustees.

On October 23, 1964, Frederick W. Lentz, Corporation Counsel, State House, Secretary of State's Office, State of Ohio, advised that the National Knights of the Ku Klux Klan of Ohio, Inc.'s charter granted October 5, 1964, was revoked October 22, 1964, for the official reason that the National Knights of the Ku Klux Klan Organization was on the U. S. Attorney General's subversive list. Mr. Lentz said the actual purpose for revocation of the charter was not because the National Knights of the Ku Klux Klan is on the U. S. Attorney General's subversive list, but because it was felt the existence of a state granted charter would encourage the Klan to make the claim it was "state sanctioned" and therefore entirely legitimate.

In actuality the Ku Klux Klan and not the National Knights of the Ku Klux Klan has been designated by the U. S. Attorney General pursuant to Executive Order 10450.

A confidential source, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised on June 16, 1965, that on that date, Stanley Levison was in contact with Clarence Jones. Jones commented that he had heard that Adam (Clayton Powell, United States Congressman from New York City) wants to get together with Martin (Luther King) to have a lengthy conference in depth with no publicity. According to Jones, Adam said Martin knows his, Adams', opinion of Bayard Rustin and some other people he has around him. Adam thinks that he and Martin have a lot of things of mutual interest, and, Jones continued, it will be assured that there will be no publicity. (X)(u)

Levison inquired if Jones had heard anything from Harry (Wachtel). Jones said he had, that Harry told him that Jones, Wachtel, and Levison are authorized to do something which Jones could not recall. Levison felt it might be in connection with a conference in the fall, getting some ideas, and Jones thought that might be it. (X)(u)

Jones stated that he told Wachtel that Levison will be a constructive addition to the Research Committee (Martin Luther King and his advisors). Jones also told Levison that the thing on Sunday (King's speech at the graduation exercises of Hofstra University on Sunday, June 13, 1965) was a complete bust. He said he received complaints from Saul Mills and several other friends that King was an hour and a half late at the Hofstra commencement exercises and kept everyone waiting. Jones added that King was booed by right wing people and the faculty was "up in arms". He said King arrived when they were getting ready to have someone substitute for him. (S) (u)

On June 29, 1950, the confidential source advised that during the 1940s up until 1945, he knew Saul Mills personally as a member of the CP. ~~(S)~~ (u)

On May 28, 1956, a confidential source, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised that she knew Saul Mills as a member of the CP all through the period 1938-1947. The source stated that Mills had been one of the most important persons in the CP and could be considered on the level with William Z. Foster (who was Chairman of the CP, USA during this period). The source further advised that she attended literally hundreds of meetings of the CP, at which Saul Mills was present, as well as hundreds of Trade Union meetings run by the CP. In respect to Saul Mills' knowledge of the CP nature of these meetings, the source stated that there is no question but that Mills was cognizant at the time they were official meetings of the CP. The source stated that she observed Saul Mills in 1944, at a meeting called by the National Committee of the CP, and observed him at a meeting of top functionaries of the CP, held following the 1944 convention, at which time Mills delivered a speech. ~~(S)~~ (u)

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## Communist Influence In Racial Matters

In "The Saturday Evening Post", issue of July 11-18, 1964, page 76, Bayard Rustin is the subject of a feature article captioned: "The Lone Wolf of Civil Rights". In it, Rustin is said to have come to New York in 1938, as an organizer for the Young Communist League (YCL), and as such, he had the job of recruiting students for the "Party". Furthermore, the article reports that during his first years in New York, Rustin gave most of his earnings to the "Party". He reportedly left the "Party" in 1941, the article states.

The YCL has been designated pursuant to Executive Order 10450.

The "Daily Worker", February 11, 1957, page 1 column 2, reported that Bayard Rustin, Executive Secretary, War Resisters League, was an observer at the 16th National Convention of the Communist Party, United States of America (CP, USA), held in New York City, on February 9-12, 1957.

The "Daily Worker" was an East Coast Communist publication until it ceased publication on January 13, 1958.
