King was impassive when present at a meeting in Philadelphia
with Cecil Moore, President of the Philadelphia Chapter of the
National Association for the Advancement of Colored People
(NAACP) and others at which time Moore indicated he was interested
in starting gang fights in several unspecified locations in
Philadelphia. The failure of this alleged leader (King) of the
non-violent movement to assert himself is perhaps another
indicator of the true nature of this opportunist.

So that the Bureau may consider possible exploitation
of the incident involved, Philadelphia is instructed to recontact
its original source, [redacted]
and obtain from him any further details available.

Please alert all personnel engaged in servicing this sensitive source relative to King and others handling information from such sources that matters pertaining to King's injection in the foreign policy of this country and concerning meetings with the President are of the utmost importance. Impress upon them a necessity for exercising the very best of judgment and taking prompt action where indicated. (u)

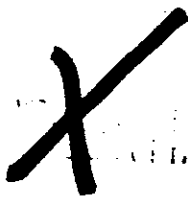



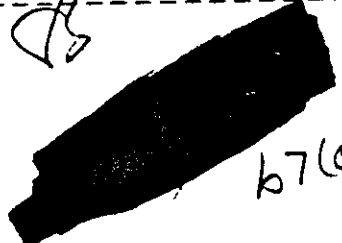

COMMUNIST INFLUENCE IN RACIAL MATTERS

On August 2, 1965, a telephone call was received at the Philadelphia Office of the FBI from an individual who refused to identify himself. This individual said he was one of a group who had come from Atlanta, Ga.; that another group from Virginia was also in Philadelphia; and that both groups were going to make an attempt on the life of Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING at the rally to be held at 5:30 p.m. on August 2, 1965, at 22nd and Diamond Streets, Philadelphia. When detailed information was sought, the caller terminated the call.

The above information was furnished to the Philadelphia Police Department on August 2, 1965.

On August 2, 1965, [REDACTED] advised Special Agent [REDACTED] that members of Dr. KING's party had cancelled a tentative appointment to meet with Philadelphia Mayor JAMES H. J. Philadelphia after he was warned of "unpleasant repercussions" in a telephone conversation with CECIL B. MOORE, President, Philadelphia Chapter, National Association For the Advancement of Colored People (NAACP). Doctor KING was reported to be willing to change his mind about the cancellation if the sponsors of his visit were persuasive enough. With this possibility in mind, some 80 members of the sponsoring group met in closed session at the Fellowship House, 1521 West Girard Avenue, most of the day on July 31, 1965, in an attempt to resolve the impasse. CECIL B. MOORE declared that the people who were sponsoring Doctor KING's visit to Philadelphia do not represent anybody. The Negro leaders of Philadelphia were not consulted about Doctor KING's planned visit and that he, MOORE, was not the only one who was ignored in this regard.

"The Philadelphia Inquirer," in a late edition on August 1, 1965, page one, section two, carried an article entitled, "KING Reschedules Trip to Phila., Will Greet Pickets at Girard Wall." This article stated that after a full day of secret, on-again off-again negotiations, it was reported shortly before midnight on July 31, 1965, that Doctor KING would visit Philadelphia on August 2, 3, 1965, as originally scheduled.

On August 1, 1965, a representative of the Philadelphia Police Department advised that Doctor KING arrived in Philadelphia at 9:07 p.m., this date, after which he and his party went to the Sheraton Hotel where they will stay during the tour.

Doctor KING's schedule for August 2, 1965, includes a breakfast meeting at Fellowship House at 8:30 a.m., a meeting with local clergy at 11 a.m., a meeting with Civil Rights leaders at 2:30 p.m., and two private fund raising meetings from 8 p.m. to 11 p.m.

[REDACTED] that one of the above fund raising meetings would be held at the home of OTTO GARDNER, Rydal, Pa. [REDACTED] also advised that in his opinion Doctor KING's visit had now become a joint venture, involving CECIL B. MOORE may not be happy with Doctor KING's visit to Philadelphia but he has accepted it. c [REDACTED] does not know what concessions Doctor KING may have made to MOORE to overcome MOORE's opposition. c [REDACTED] speculated that Doctor KING will probably support MOORE in seeking the admission of Negroes to Girard College on terms laid down by MOORE. Doctor KING will retain his non-violent philosophy in the matter. MOORE personally believes in non-violence but he cannot be moderate when addressing the Negro residents in the area of Girard College. b(1)

C [redacted] a letter from the "Philadelphia Committee for Martin Luther King's Tour," indicating Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR., and his staff would visit Philadelphia on the Southern Christian Leadership Conference (SCLC) - Northern City People-to-People Tour on August 2 and 3, 1965. b(1)

C [redacted] this proposed tour has caused several splits in the Negro community in Philadelphia. The Baptist Ministers, Reverend LEON SULLIVAN and CECIL B. MOORE, President of the Philadelphia Branch, National Association for the Advancement of Colored People (NAACP) all oppose Dr. KING's visit. In other cities in which the tour is to be made, it has been reported that the SCLC takes 85 per cent of the money raised, leaving 15 per cent for the local sponsors. In Philadelphia, the SCLC will take only 10 per cent of the money raised, leaving 90 per cent for the local sponsors. In addition, if there should be any financial loss on the tour, this will be absorbed by SCLC. b(1)

C [redacted] indicated that opposition to Dr. KING's tour of Philadelphia is based on rivalries for positions of leadership, on the loss of funds local civil rights groups would suffer to Dr. KING, and to the feeling of local civil rights leaders that their programs are progressing satisfactorily in Philadelphia and Dr. KING's visit will not enhance these programs at all. b(1)

C [redacted] advised there was opposition among Negro groups in Philadelphia to Dr. KING visiting Philadelphia on August 2 and 3, 1965. Some Negro leaders feel Dr. KING will draw from Philadelphia money which could be used by local civil rights groups and other leaders oppose the visit b(1)

This article indicated that CECIL B. MOORE, President, Philadelphia Chapter, NAACP, blasted the planned Philadelphia visit of Dr. KING as an attempt by "the egghead white power structure" to divide local Negroes. MOORE attacked both Dr. KING and the "appeasers, social climbers and whites who have contributed to the \$20,000 Dr. KING has taken out of Philadelphia without accounting."

The article also stated that earlier in the day Representative ADAM CLAYTON POWELL of New York said he had advised Dr. KING that "he might have trouble in Philadelphia. CECIL MOORE has 30,000 members of the NAACP there."

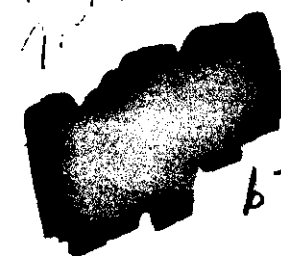

Dear Mr. Wachtel:

Your letter of June 1, 1965, reached me just before our Western Governors' Conference here in Oregon for which I was the host Governor, which accounts for my delay in replying.

You imply that I have misundertood Dr. Martin Luther King's views on civil disobedience. You forwarded his speech before the Bar of New York City on April 21, 1965, and cited certain specific passages. I have studied his speech, giving particular care to the parts you cite. I find that I am not laboring under any misunderstanding. Rather Dr. King and I seriously disagree. I am not alone in disagreeing with Dr. King. Many thoughtful and conscientious Americans, including the President of the American Bar Association, share my deep concern.

To understand our disagreement you must clearly comprehend the background and identity of views from which our divergent conclusions are reached. I have done everything in my power as a legislator and as a governor to promote the civil rights and liberties of all Americans, red, yellow, white and black. As a legislator, it was my privilege to co-sponsor civil rights legislation, and as Governor I have twice urged the passage of further extensions of Oregon's fine civil rights statutes. Moreover, I supported the repeal of the anti-miscegenation law in Oregon. I have supported and fully administered our laws prohibiting discrimination in housing. I believe I can say with humility that no Oregon Governor has done more for civil rights than I have and certainly no state has less discrimination than Oregon. Dr. King and I both believe in the same civil rights goals and both of us have worked hard and long in this cause. Furthermore, both of us are practicing, sincere Christians belonging to the same segment of protestant belief. You can see that little separates us other than the color of our skin, which both of us ignore as completely immaterial.

Yet I disagree with Dr. King's open advocacy and constant use of civil disobedience. I take the stand that, where we have legal processes for changing laws, we have no right to violate those laws. On the other hand, Dr. King said in his speech to the New York City Bar, in substance (p. 21), that even where all people have the actual right to vote, he thinks that "when-ever unjust laws exist people on the basis of conscience have the right to disobey those laws." He goes on to say (p. 24) that even where the voting rights are assured and the laws are just, the people have the right to disobey the law to call attention to extra-legal injustices. In effect, Dr. King says that, when directed by one's own conscience and one's subjective sense of justice, one has a right to disobey a law either to change the law or to protest other injustice, regardless of the availability of the democratic process for correcting the law or the injustice.

His stand is an open invitation to anarchy. If every person obeyed only those laws he thought were just, society and civilization would disappear in a holocaust of civil destruction. Believers in euthanasia would commit murder. Sincere believers in California's Proposition 14 principle would negate our Oregon civil rights laws. Our jails would overflow. Our courts would be swamped. Society, as we know it, would disappear.

Democracy can only succeed if the majority's conscience and sense of justice, as embodied in our laws, controls the acts of all citizens, assuming effective voting rights for all qualified voters. Only under this system can civil law and order be maintained. Only under this system can mayors and governors and presidents protect the rights of all citizens.

Dr. King has lived his life in the front line of a battle. I, too, have been in that front line, but I also have sat in the seat of authority and been charged with maintaining law, order, progress and prosperity for all citizens. If Dr. King could sit where I sit for only a short time, he would realize the impossibility of allowing individual conscience to control law observance. For instance, though I long have advocated the doing away with the death penalty, I refused to commute death sentences until the law was changed by our people. I did so because I believe that governors, perhaps above all others, are bound to support the law. I took an oath to that effect. Dr. King would see, as I do, the destruction of democracy and this great republic in the civil disobedience he espouses. He would also see how close civil disobedience is to riot, violence and slaughter.

By divine blessing, we Americans have been granted the sacred privilege of living in freedom in a functioning democratic republic. We always have available to us the orderly, peaceful, and protecting process of the law. Where local prejudice and a tradition of discrimination exist, and it is not possible to correct a wrong through a change of ordinance or by other governmental process, then the state processes can be used. If the same prejudice and practice prevent correction at the state level, then the Federal Government should and can act. When we need a new law enacted or an old law changed, the majority can accomplish the desired result peacefully at the ballot box. Until the change takes place, we must obey the present law, if constitutional. If it is not constitutional, we can have it done away with by our courts. If it is illegally enforced or ignored, we have peaceable recourse to our courts. Were this not so, all of us would be slaves of the few and powerful. Because it is so, we are free.

Civil disobedience weakens our system of law and order and thereby weakens our freedom. We strengthen our freedom by obeying the law, not by disobeying. We cannot strengthen a minority's rights by destroying the majority's rights and freedom. We have gained the negro nothing, if in obtaining his equality with white Americans we so injure our democracy that all Americans' freedom is destroyed.

Our government is not the despotism of Hitler's Germany, nor is it the absolutism of Nebuchadnezzar. Dr. King's analogies to Naziism or absolute monarchies do not apply to our great democratic republic where the courts are strong and independent, where all do, or by proper legal process can, obtain the right to vote, where the rights of all are obtainable because our people obey the law and the courts.

Dr. King attempts to justify his acts by citing the crimes of lawless southerners, in the killing of Mrs. Liuzzo and the massacre of Reverend Reeb. These are crimes, legally as much as morally, and must be punished. But these wrongs, these crimes, do not justify another crime. Murder does not justify civil disobedience. Nor does a riotous tea party in Boston Harbor two centuries ago to protest a voiceless tyranny justify a crime in 1965 in a land as free as ours.

No, if civil disobedience prompted by individual conscience becomes the accepted means of changing the law in this country instead of the due and deliberate actions of the legally constituted representative assemblies of our government, then, our freedom will disappear in the destruction of our properly enacted laws and our properly constituted civil authorities. The freedom, the equality, and the opportunity which Dr. King seeks for his people will be a hollow shell, a valueless goal, submerged in the lost freedom and

the denied rights of all Americans.

I will continue to fight for the civil rights and equal opportunity of all people. But I shall do so within the framework of our democratic form of government, legally and without stint, ever conscious that I must preserve at the same time the freedom of all Americans or the negroes' rights will become an equality in slavery.

Washington, D. C. newspaper accounts of subject's ⁶⁰²⁶ visit with the President 8/5/65, revealed the following:

King said that the President invited him to the White House to get his thoughts on an autumn civil rights conference to be called "To Fulfill These Rights." King said that he will submit a report to the President outlining problems the Negro now faces and that it would draw on the "studies and experiences we have had on our Northern tour." King also said that he would recommend either legislation or expanded Executive Order on housing.

As recipient offices are aware, much of King's writings and many of his ideas are generated by others, including individuals with present and former subversive backgrounds. Recipient offices should be extremely alert to information available through established sources which would indicate assistance by these subversives given to King relative to the report he is to prepare for the President and for any other material or items which he will use at the forthcoming autumn civil rights conference.

The Bureau should be kept promptly advised of all pertinent information developed and that which may be disseminated, should be submitted in an appropriate form.

During the afternoon of July 25, 1965, King participated in six neighborhood rallies which were each attended by from 1,000 to 1,500 individuals. At the above churches and rallies King called for support of the July 26, 1965, civil rights demonstration to be held in Chicago, Illinois. u

In January, 1957, a source advised ELIJAH MUHAMMAD has described his organization on a nationwide basis as the "Nation of Islam" and "Muhammad's Temples of Islam." u

On May 8, 1964, a second source advised ELIJAH MUHAMMAD is the national leader of the Nation of Islam (NOI); Muhammad's Temple of Islam No. 2, 5335 South Greenwood Avenue, Chicago, Illinois, is the national headquarters of the NOI; and in mid-1960 MUHAMMAD and other NOI officials, when referring to MUHAMMAD's organization on a nationwide basis, commenced using either "Mosque" or "Temple" when mentioning one of "Muhammad's Temples of Islam." u

The NOI is an all-Negro organization which was originally organized in 1930 in Detroit, Michigan. MUHAMMAD claims to have been selected by Allah, the Supreme Being, to lead the so-called Negro race out of slavery in the wilderness of North America by establishing an independent black nation in the United States. Members following MUHAMMAD's teachings and his interpretation of the "Koran" believe there is no such thing as a Negro; that the so-called Negroes are slaves of the white race, referred to as "white devils," in the United States; and that the white race, because of its exploitation of the so-called Negroes, must and will be destroyed in the approaching "War of Armageddon." u

In the past, officials and members of the NOI, including MUHAMMAD, have refused to register under the provisions of the Selective Service Act and have declared that members owe no allegiance to the United States. u

On May 5, 1958, the first source advised MUHAMMAD had, upon advice of legal counsel, tempered his personal statements and instructions to his minister concerning the principles of his organization in order to avoid possible prosecution by the United States Government; however, he did not indicate any fundamental changes in the teachings of his organization. u

On May 7, 1964, a third source advised MUHAMMAD had, early in July, 1958, decided to de-emphasize the religious aspects of the teachings of Islam and to stress the economic benefits to be derived by those Negroes who joined the NOI. This policy change, according to MUHAMMAD, would help him acquire additional followers and create more interest in his programs. u

Dear Mr. Hoover:

Allow me to indentify myself. I am a minister of the Presbyterian Church in the United States, presently serving in the capacity indicated on the letterhead, formerly having had pastorates in New Orleans, Oklahoma City, Atlanta, Miami, and having served seven years as president of [redacted] College in [redacted]. The father of one of your agents, [redacted], was a professor [redacted] on my faculty there. I served for three years as a chaplain in the U.S.A.A.F. Presently, I am a member of our denomination [redacted] in Richmond, Va.

One section of the administration of our board is known as the Division of Christian Action. This division operates as a part of the total structure, having its own secretary, [redacted], who serves under the executive secretary of the Board, [redacted]

Some degree of latitude is granted the divisions within the total administrative structure, and a great deal of latitude is granted the total administrative structure, by the Board. This is common administrative practice, as you know. The Board meets only three times per year. The General Assembly elects the Board members ordinarily for terms of nine years each (three terms of three years)

The Division of Christian Action invited Martin Luther King to speak in August 1965 at our conference ground, Montreat, N. C. This was apparently an idea of the staff. In any case, the staff of this division made the decision. Now a great cry has gone up throughout our denomination, the Montreat conferences generally are being poorly attended and those conferences having any connection with the Board of Christian Education, even though unrelated to this particular action, are suffering most. My own judgment in the matter is that a mistake of vast proportions has been made and that

the cause of peaceable race relations has been critically damaged. The General Assembly was asked to reprimand the Board by withdrawing the invitation, in April, but the motion lost.

My purpose in writing you is to ask whether you can give me any information concerning Martin Luther King that is not bound by the ethics and procedure of your office. I am aware that you have much classified knowledge that is not available to me; but if you have information that can be used to indicate the general untrustworthiness of this man, I shall appreciate your sending it to me. It will be my purpose to present it to our Board of Christian Education at the October meeting, and it may very well be used by some of our church papers.

Let me thank you for your stalwart leadership in these days of astonishingly sophisticated intrigue. Our nation owes more to you than anyone realizes. We frequently pray for you in our midweek prayer service, and Christians all over our country thank God for you.

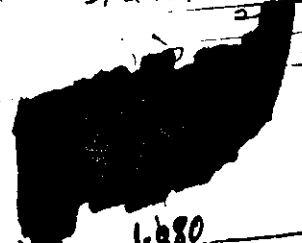

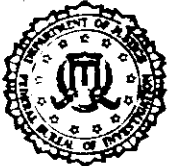

As set forth in Cleveland memoranda dated July 16, 1965, and July 23, 1965, Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR., scheduled a visit to Cleveland, Ohio, on July 27 and 28, 1965, to help in the voter registration drive currently in progress in predominately Negro areas of Cleveland.

An article in "The Plain Dealer," daily Cleveland newspaper, issue of July 28, 1965, stated that Dr. KING arrived in Cleveland by airlines from Chicago during the late afternoon of July 27, 1965. He held a brief press conference and proceeded to a public rally at the Alexander Hamilton Recreation Center in Cleveland. The newspaper estimated 1,500 persons attended. After the rally, Dr. KING met with representatives of local civil rights organizations.

The article stated that Dr. KING's appearances in Cleveland were being sponsored by the Special Project Committee for Voter Registration and Citizenship Education. The National Council of Churches had provided \$20,000 for the work of this committee.

According to the article, Dr. KING came to Cleveland to support the voter registration campaign and pledged the support of the Southern Christian Leadership Conference (SCLC) in this drive. The article stated that the purpose of the voter registration drive is to remove, by ballots, all city officials and Cleveland Board of Education members considered unfriendly by the civil rights movement.

An article in the "Call and Post, Cleveland weekly Negro newspaper, issue of July 31, 1965, stated that Dr. KING is

activities on July 28, 1965, began with a breakfast with local clergymen scheduled for 7:30 AM. However, Dr. KING did not appear until 9:00 AM. The article noted that Dr. KING was visibly fatigued and filled with medication and turned many of the speaking duties over to Reverend RALPH ABERNATHY, described as his top assistant. The article also noted that 12 top officers of the SCLC accompanied Dr. KING to Cleveland.

The article reflected that Dr. KING made appearances at five street corner rallies during the day on July 28, 1965. Four of these appearances were in predominately Negro areas and the speakers appealed to the residents in the area to register to vote and to make sure that they did vote in the fall election.

The other street corner appearance by Dr. KING was on the grounds of the Heights Christian Church, Shaker Heights, Ohio, an exclusive Cleveland suburb. An estimated 250 persons gathered for this meeting. Approximately 20 pickets sponsored by the National Association for the Advancement of White People (NAAWP) marched on the sidewalk bordering the church grounds during Dr. KING's appearance. They carried placards alleging communist affiliations on the part of KING and misconduct by demonstrators during SCLC marches in the South.

[REDACTED] advised on July 28, 1965, that there were no incidents or arrests in connection with the above picketing. b7(D)

Dr. KING's public appearances in Cleveland ended with a public rally at the Cleveland Arena on the evening of July 28, 1965.

[REDACTED] stated that he had learned that the National Council of Churches had paid \$1,000.00 for the rental of the Arena and that a capacity crowd of approximately 10,000 persons was expected. b7(D)

The above meeting was scheduled to begin at 8:00 PM, but Dr. KING and the SCLC personnel accompanying him on the tour, did not arrive until about 9:20 PM. [REDACTED] estimated that the Arena was no more than one third filled for the above meeting. b7(D)

An estimated 45 pickets sponsored by the NAAWP marched on the sidewalk outside the Arena from 7:30 PM until 8:30 PM. JOHN EARLIC, who identified himself as acting head of the NAAWP stated that some of the pickets also represented local groups known as the White Citizens Council and the American Conservative Society. *J. Hand*

[redacted] stated that actually most of the pickets belonged to all three of the above groups. He stated that the activity of these groups is restricted to periodic picketing and the passing out of literature and there have never been any disturbances created by pickets from these organizations. [redacted] stated that the picketing on July 28, 1965, resulted in no arrests and the only incident occurred when a Negro took a NAAWP picket sign from a 10 year old white boy and threw it to the ground.

A source advised on February 16, 1962, that GERALD QUINN, a member of the Workers World Party (WWP) from New York, was sent to Cleveland, Ohio, in October, 1961, by the Monroe Defense Committee (MDC) of New York to organize an MDC in Cleveland, and that QUINN, with the aid of TED and FRANCES DOSTAL, members of the WWP, and WILLIE MAE MALLORY, organized an MDC in Cleveland, with headquarters at 1289 East 115th Street.

On May 29, 1963, source related that the purpose of the MDC in Cleveland is to aid in the support of WILLIE MAE MALLORY in her fight against extradition to Monroe, North Carolina.

On August 31, 1961, two true bills of indictment were returned against WILLIE MAE MALLORY by a Grand Jury in Superior Court, Union County, Monroe, North Carolina, charging MALLORY with two counts of kidnapping of Mr. G. BRUCE STEGALL and MAYBELL STEGALL on August 27, 1961.

A second source on May 26, 1963, related that the headquarters of the MDC in Cleveland is located at 10517 Superior Avenue, with CLARENCE SENIORS as Chairman.

A third source in November, 1962, related that CLARENCE SENIORS is a member of the WWP.





The Attorney General called me at 9:15 p. m. last night, 7/28/65. He stated that the White House telephone operators had been attempting to find Dr. Martin Luther King for him without success. He advised that he desperately needed to find King in order to get support for that "damned bill" which would be up before the Congress tomorrow. The Attorney General stated that he thought King was in Cleveland; however, he was not sure of this fact. He asked that we assist him in finding out King's whereabouts so that a phone call could be put into him.

I conferred with you and Mr. Belmont, and Mr. Belmont called back at 9:55 p. m. to advise that King at that particular moment was in the Cleveland, Ohio, arena making a speech. The telephone number was 216-361-3700. This information was passed to the Attorney General. The duty Agent called at approximately 10:30 p. m. and advised me that following King's speech, he could be located in Suite 9-B of the Sheraton-Cleveland Hotel. I also advised the Attorney General of this information.

An article in "The Plain Dealer," Cleveland daily newspaper, issue of July 25, 1965, stated that a vanguard of 12 men, who will assist Dr. KING in his voter registration drive, arrived in Cleveland on the evening of July 24, 1965. The advance group of four whites and eight Negroes are planning street rallies, door-knocking and other ways to mobilize citizens of Cleveland to vote. According to the article, they plan to help both whites and Negroes. ~~ANDREW MARRISETT~~, who was identified as the leader of the group, stated that they would try to contact as many people as possible before Dr. KING arrives here on July 27, 1965, from Chicago. U

The article further stated that ~~JOHN BARBIC~~, identified as president of the Cleveland National Association for the Advancement of White People, announced that his group, with support from the White Citizens Council and the National Christian Conservative Society, will picket two of Dr. KING's public appearances in Cleveland. BARBIC announced that picketing would be at the Heights Christian Church, 17300 Van Aken Boulevard, Shaker Heights, where Dr. KING is scheduled to make an outdoor address on July 28, 1965, and outside the Cleveland Arena where a public rally will be held that same evening. Pages 16352-16366. Senator Thurmond, (R) South Carolina, spoke concerning Communist influence in the civil rights movement. He stated "In closing my brief remarks today, I invite the attention of Senators to the testimony presented by FBI Director J. Edgar Hoover before the House Appropriations Committee on March 4, 1965. There are some very pertinent comments by Mr. Hoover which I ask unanimous consent to have printed in the Record at the conclusion of my remarks. These remarks were not set forth in the Record. Mr. Thurmond advised that he was including with his remarks an article from the New York Times of July 3, 1963, showing how Dr. King and others in the civil rights groups are indeed peddling the Communist line in America. He also included a portion of the recently released report by the Alabama Legislative Commission To Preserve the Peace. The report comments on the employment of Jack O'Dell by King pointing out that at the time O'Dell was hired he was publicly identified as a member of the Communist Party. King stated he had fired O'Dell, however, a year later it was revealed that he was still employed by King. The report states "This deliberate falsehood on King's part was in keeping with J. Edgar Hoover's statement a few months ago that King was a 'notorious liar'." The report goes on to state "Karl Prussias, former Communist Party member and secret FBI informant in the party, made an affidavit in 1963 that King was set forth at Communist Party meetings as an individual the Communists should rally around in the Communist struggle on many racial issues. - - - J. Edgar Hoover said in his report to Congress last year that many of the persons in clerical garb who took part in the march on Washington were identified by the FBI as Communist Party members.

Hoover also reported that the Reds are working hard, and with some success, to infiltrate and take over the Negro protest movement." (Per the Domestic Intelligence Division, Karl Prussias is a former informant.)

DR. KING ASSAILS POLICY AT GIRARD

Likens Wall at Philadelphia School to Berlin Wall

PHILADELPHIA, Pa., Aug. 3

The Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. led 5,000 chanting and singing demonstrators tonight to protest the segregated policies of Girard College.

Standing on a flatbed truck near the main gate of the college, which is an elementary and boarding school, Dr. King pointed to the school's 10-foot-high stone wall and said vehemently:

"At this stage of the 20th century in the city that has been known as the cradle of liberty, the Girard College wall is like the Berlin wall.

"This wall, this school, is symbolic of a cancer in the body politic that must be removed before there will be freedom and democracy in this country."

Arrives With Moore

Dr. King attended the outdoor rally with Cecil B. Moore, president of the local chapter of the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People. The rally was held about 30 yards from the school's entrance.

Arriving at 6:20 P.M., the civil rights leaders were greeted with thunderous applause by the predominately Negro crowd.

"I cannot preach the doctrine of violence to you," Dr. King declared. "I have seen too much violence. I am tired of it."

And then, in apparent reference to the war in Vietnam, Dr. King said:

"War is obsolete. No nation today can win a war. It is no longer a choice between violence and nonviolence. It is a choice between violence and nonexistence."

The crowd, mostly in shirt-sleeves, continuously interrupted Dr. King with applause and shouts.

Calls Protests Essential

For three months Mr. Moore has directed picketing at the 117-year-old North Philadelphia institution. Enrollment there is limited to "poor, white male orphans" under terms of the will of Stephen Girard, Philadelphia financier who died in 1831.

Dr. King, the head of the Southern Christian Leadership Conference, agreed with Mr. Moore's decision to continue picketing at the school despite a plea by Gov. William W. Scranton that it be stopped while legal efforts are being made to integrate the school.

The Atlanta clergyman predicted that the "walls of segregation will come tumbling down" and said the protest demonstrations were necessary to keep the issue before the public. Similar requests, he noted, have often been made by authorities in the South, without any concessions made to the demonstrators.

Following the Girard College demonstration, the last of four street corner rallies today, Dr. King led a mile-long march from 22nd Street and Columbia Avenue, the center of last summer's rioting and looting, to a mass meeting at Grace Baptist Temple, Broad and Berks streets.

Urges Vietnam Settlement

During his two-day visit to Philadelphia, the third stop on his tour of 14 Northern cities with civil rights problems, Dr. King called for an end to the war in Vietnam through a "negotiated settlement."

The Nobel Peace-Prize winner declared that he was "not prepared to say that either side is wholly right or wholly wrong."

Dr. King also advised Negroes not to attempt to dodge the draft as a means of protesting racial injustice, a proposal that had been made in a newsletter of the Freedom Democratic party in Mississippi.

Dr. King said that the housing and educational needs of the Negro in Philadelphia were far less critical than their need for jobs.

"If you don't have this economic undergirding, the Negro cannot participate in the new opportunities when they are

open to him," he said. "For what does it profit a man if he has a choice of housing but cannot afford to buy a house?"

Nineteen pickets were arrested at Girard College last night for blocking an emergency entrance near the main gate. They were the first mass arrests at the school since a group of pickets were taken into custody when they attempted to scale the wall six weeks ago.

I thought you would be interested in the latest information indicating the continuing association of Stanley David Levison, the long-time communist, with King and his organization, the Southern Christian Leadership Conference.

We learned over this past weekend that Levison flew down to Atlanta from New York City on 7/11/65. He is registered in the Downtown Holiday Inn under his true name and was scheduled to attend an important staff meeting of the Southern Christian Leadership Conference at noon today, 7/12/65, at an Atlanta restaurant.

King has been out in Los Angeles the last few days but was scheduled to return to Atlanta sometime this morning, 7/12/65.

Available information to date indicates that Levison has proposed a fund-raising program of which King approves and that King plans to present it to the Executive Committee of the Southern Christian Leadership Conference 7/19/65. Levison has expressed the opinion that Ralph Abernathy, one of King's closest aides who is also Treasurer of the Conference, will oppose his program inasmuch as it requires an initial expenditure of money. Levison feels that Abernathy will not want to spend the money even though eventually it will make more money for them. Levison planned to see Abernathy upon his arrival in Atlanta to present the proposal.

Our Atlanta and New York Offices are affording appropriate coverage through established sources and discreet surveillances in an effort to obtain other details concerning Levison's visit to Atlanta. We will make careful analysis of the intelligence gathered to determine what further influence Levison is upon King and his organization and will, of course, make dissemination to the Department and the intelligence community.

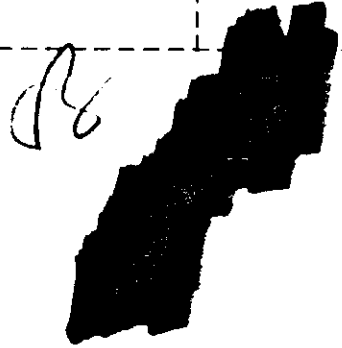

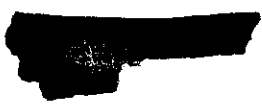

A confidential source, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised on July 14, 1965, that on that date, Stanley Levison was in contact with Clarence Jones. They discussed a recent trip made by Levison to Atlanta, Georgia. Levison stated that the primary purpose of the trip was to take one Wally Albertson there and that this was excellent all around.

Jones inquired about the proceeds of the "Broadway Answers Selma" benefit (held on April 4, 1965, New York City, with the Voter Education project of the Southern Christian Leadership Conference (SCLC) as one of the beneficiaries) and if Martin Luther King's father knew of the proceeds. Levison stated that he asked him to tell Jones that they have received nothing. Jones commented that his files show that a check for \$8,000.00 was sent and that the net amount the church would get is \$17,000.00. Levison suggested that Jones contact King, Sr., and make sure the money was not received and to then contact the Anti-Defamation League (of B'nai B'rith).

Jones brought up the status of the convention (probably of the SCLC) and Levison said this was one of the things discussed. He said they are still trying to get speakers whom he considered a feeble lot of the same old speakers and that he suggested Robert F. Kennedy (Senator from New York) who has a relationship with SCLC. Levison stated that they agreed to ask Kennedy and one Keekle (ph) (probably Senator Thomas Kuchel of California).

Levison commented that the question of draft resolutions came up and that he feels there should be drafts this year which he and Jones should work on. He said he explained that drafts have to be prepared in advance and that "he" (Martin Luther King) left it up to him. Levison said there should be a resolution on Viet Nam and that King received a statement from Linus Pauling which generally follows the suggestions of U Thant, a cease fire and a settlement on the basis of the Geneva Conference. He said this has been signed by every living Nobel Peace Prize winner except Ralph Bunche, and that he felt the convention could appropriately endorse this statement which would dispose of the matter very nicely. X

Levison also stated that he felt there will have to be a trip to Atlanta to discuss the draft resolutions with King. He added that he told them that a staff member should be involved in preparing the draft resolutions and that Andy (Andrew Young, Executive Director of the SCLC) was selected.

Jones asked if the Research Committee (made up of King and his top advisors) had been abandoned for the summer. Levison commented that at a dinner at King's home, he, Levison, said that he insists that until Ralph Helstein "picks it up" as he said he would, nothing will happen. Levison said that at the next meeting of the Research Committee, the subject of

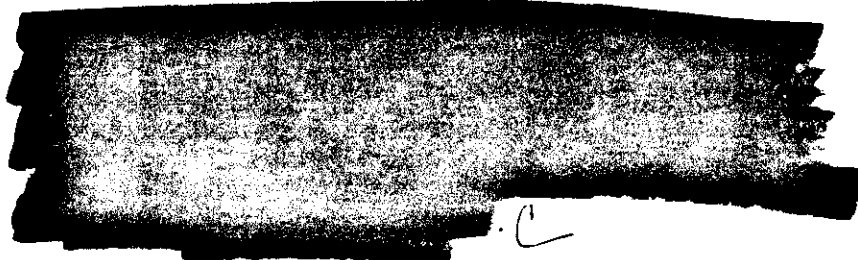

Labor - Negro alliance should be taken up and Helstein should be present. He said that King agreed, but did not indicate it would not take place until the fall.

Jones asked if there is any information about (Harry) Wachtel and Washington, and Levison said there is none except that King now jokes openly about Wachtel's unpopularity. Levison added that Chauncey (Chauncey Eskridge, Legal Counsel of the SCLC) greeted him warmly, stating that he hasn't seen him in a long time. According to Levison, King was coming by and said "Well, he sure doesn't love Harry Wachtel that way" and that everyone laughed. Levison stated "It got to be kind of an open joke."

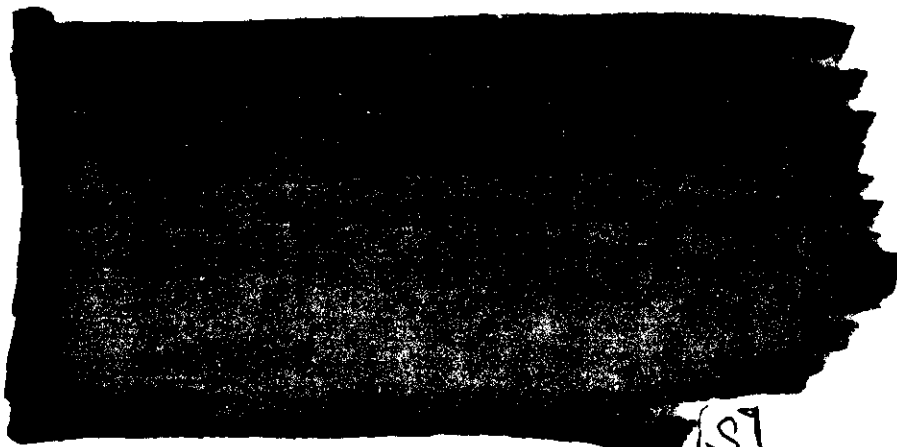

On December 23, 1952, according to a "United Press" dispatch, dated December 24, 1952, from Washington, D.C., Louis F. Budenz, a former functionary of the CPUSA, testified before a Special House Committee in Washington, D.C. At that time he stated Linus Pauling had been a "concealed" member of the CPUSA, who had no card or other vestige of membership, but who had made contributions to the CPUSA. He added that Pauling was a member of the Advisory Board that selected fellowship recipients for the Guggenheim Foundation.

In response to the above, Pauling, in an "Associated Press" dispatch, dated December 24, 1952, from Washington, D.C., denied the above allegation and was quoted as saying, "this statement is a lie. I have never been a member of the CP, and I have sworn to this fact."

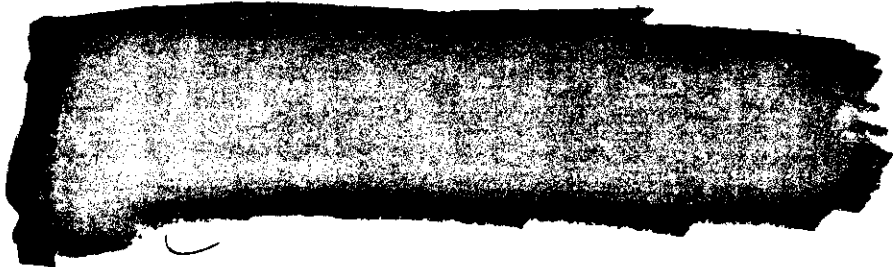

"Time," a weekly news magazine, in its issue of April 21, 1958, page 13, column 3, characterized Dr. Linus Carl Pauling as a "long time supporter of Communist line fronts."

To substantiate this characterization, "Time" quoted a House Committee on Un-American Activities report in 1951, as follows:

"Professor Pauling", it stated, "has not deviated a hairbreath from this pattern of loyalty to the Communist cause since 1946."

The "Guide to Subversive Organizations and Publications," revised and published as of December 1, 1961, prepared and released by the Committee on Un-American Activities, United States House of Representatives, Washington, D.C., contains the following concerning the National Lawyers Guild:

"National Lawyers Guild

- "1. Cited as a Communist front.
(Special Committee on Un-American Activities, House Report 1311 on the CIO Political Action Committee, March 29, 1944, p. 149.)
- "2. Cited as a Communist front which 'is the foremost legal bulwark of the Communist Party its front organizations, and controlled unions' and which 'since its inception has never failed to rally to the legal defense of the Communist Party and individual members thereof, including known espionage agents.'
(Committee on Un-American Activities, House Report 3123 on the National Lawyers Guild, September 21, 1950, originally related September 17, 1950.)
- "3. 'To defend the cases of Communist lawbreakers, fronts have been devised making special appeals in behalf of civil liberties and reaching out far beyond the confines of the Communist Party itself. Among these organizations are the * * * National Lawyers Guild. When the Communist Party itself is under fire these offer a bulwark of protection.'

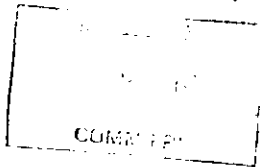

On the evening of July 2, 1965, Reverend Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. addressed a mass rally of individuals attending the state convention of Southern Christian Leadership Conference (SCLC), which was held at Roger's Stadium, Virginia State College, Ettrick, Virginia. It is noted that this rally was open to the public and newspaper figures "an approximate attendance of somewhere between 2,000 and 2,500".

The "Richmond Times-Dispatch", a daily newspaper published at Richmond, Virginia, in an article captioned "Dr. King Calls for End To War in Viet Nam" carried the following news item on July 3, 1965, concerning the speech made by Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. on July 2, 1965:

"The Rev. Martin Luther King Jr. called for a negotiated settlement of the war in Viet Nam at a civil rights rally here Friday night.

"The Nobel peace prize winner said, 'There must be a settlement' even if it means direct negotiations with the Communist Viet Cong. He told an audience of some 2,000 persons attending a state convention of the Southern Christian Leadership Conference (SCLC) that 'the long night of war must be ended.'

"He suggested that civil rights workers should become active in the movement to end the war in Viet Nam.

"He told newsmen after his speech that details of such a program haven't been worked out, but he said one approach would be for civil rights workers to participate in teach-ins on the war.

"'Even President Johnson has said there is room for debate,' Mr. King said in response to a question concerning

"why he has taken a position different from that of the administration.

"'There is no reason why there can't be peace rallies like we have freedom rallies,' Dr. King declared.

"In his speech Dr. King said, 'If life is worth living...We must find an alternative to war and violence.'

"He said 'I certainly am as concerned about seeing the defeat of communism as anybody else, but we won't defeat communism by guns, bombs or gases, but by making democracy work.'

"Then he made the flat statement that 'the war in Viet Nam must be stopped.'

"In discussing civil rights Dr. King said, 'The system of segregation is on its deathbed - the only question now is when it will be totally buried.'

"But he quickly added that Negroes 'are getting a big dose of tokenism.' Negroes are getting just enough integration so that militancy is being replaced by complacency, he explained.

"He said the civil rights movement must now be concentrated on the economic plight of Negroes. He noted that it doesn't mean much for a Negro to be able to go to an integrated restaurant 'if he hasn't the money to take his wife to dinner.'

"There are too many loopholes in the fair employment provisions of the 1964 Civil Rights Act, Dr. King said. 'We must make it clear to business and industry that if they don't respect our persons they won't get our dollars.'

"Turning to the ballot, Dr. King said Negro registration in many Southern communities could easily be doubled. By 'going all out' in this endeavor Virginians may see the day when there will be 10 or 15 Negroes in the State Legislature,' he declared.

"Just before he was introduced Dr. King was presented with a proclamation designating July 2 as Nobel peace prize day in Virginia.

"Governor Harrison refused to issue such an announcement on the grounds that proclamations are reserved for days having historic and patriotic significance.

"The audience - considerably smaller than the 10,000 that had been predicted - burst into applause when Dr. Milton A. Reid SCLC regional representative, said 'If the governor won't recognize a nobel peace prize winner we can all be happy that his term of office is just about over.'

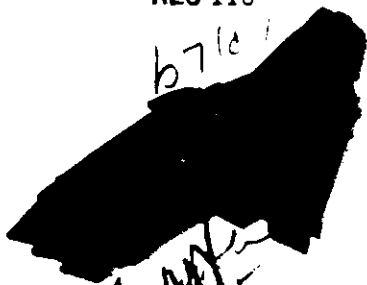
"In responding Dr. King said he was 'grateful for the proclamation' from 'Governor' Reid."

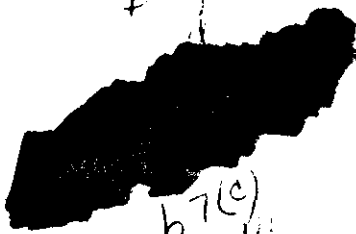

**LIEUT. GILLIGAN SUES
DR. KING FOR MILLION**

ATLANTA, July 14 — A \$1.5 million slander suit was filed against Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. today by attorneys for Lieut. Thomas R. Gilligan of the New York Police Department.

The suite, filed in United States District Court here, charges that Dr. King maliciously defamed the lieutenant by accusing him of having murdered a Negro teen-ager in New York.

Lieutenant Gilligan shot and killed James Powell last summer. He said the youth had attacked him. A grand jury and departmental investigation later cleared him of accusations that he had fired hastily and without justification.

The case was mentioned frequently during racial unrest last summer in several Northeastern cities.

The suit filed on Lieutenant Gilligan's behalf asserts that Dr. King said publicly last July 27: "Murder has been committed. The shooting of Gilligan was murder."

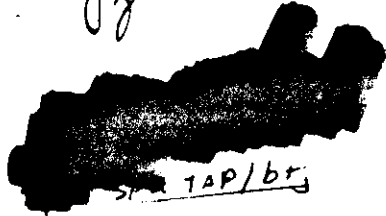

As set forth in Cleveland memoranda, dated July 16, 1965, captioned Communist Infiltration of the Southern Leadership Conference, Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR., is scheduled to be in Cleveland, Ohio, on July 27 and 28, 1965, to help in the voter registration drive currently in progress in predominantly Negro areas of Cleveland. u

An article in the "Call and Post", Cleveland weekly Negro newspaper, issue of July 24, 1965, stated that Dr. KING will attempt to get the Negroes of Cleveland to stop complaining in private and to use the power of the vote to stem the wave of racial indignities being suffered by Negro residents. The article stated that Dr. KING is expected to speak out about the "shameful disinterest of Negroes" in participating in the Special Voter Registration and Education campaign in Cleveland, which has as its goal the registering of 60,000 unregistered potential voters. u

The article listed the following as Dr. KING's itinerary during his Cleveland visit: u

Tuesday, July 27, 1965

- 5:00 P. M. - Press conference after arrival at Cleveland airport
6:30 P. M. - First of a series of street corner rallies in Negro residential areas
7:45 P. M. - Dinner at Sheraton-Cleveland Hotel with civic and civil rights leaders

- 7:30 A. M. - Breakfast at Sheraton Hotel with clergymen

The article stated that Dr. KING is coming to Cleveland after a three-day visit in Chicago. He will leave Cleveland for Philadelphia, New York and Detroit, where he will conclude his northern tour, according to the article. U

An article in "The Plain Dealer", daily Cleveland newspaper, issue of July 23, 1965, stated that ten representatives of Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING will arrive in Cleveland on July 23, 1965, to assist in the voter registration drive. They also plan to meet with civil rights leaders here to try to analyze problems confronting the city. They will discuss these with Dr. KING when he arrives here July 27, 1965, for a two-day stay. The article stated that at the mass meeting on July 28, 1965, it is expected that Dr. KING will announce a plan of action to be undertaken in Cleveland based on the special report compiled by the advance group. U

On July 23, 1965, [REDACTED] City of Cleveland, advised that the Police Department is aware of Dr. KING's itinerary and the Police Department will make the necessary arrangements to see the caravans into the various neighborhoods and the street corner meetings are conducted in an orderly fashion.
