A confidential source who has furnished reliable information in the past advised the Chicago Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) Office on July 13, 1966, that during the day of July 12, and July 13, 1966, various persons affiliated with the CFM - SCLC Program in Chicago have visited a number of realty offices in the Gage Park area on Chicago's southwest side. The plan being utilized in these visits was to send groups of white persons and Negroes separately into various real estate offices, determining if there were conflicts in information given each group by the various real estate concerns regarding housing availability in the area.

Note that the Gage Park neighborhood is located on Chicago's southwest side, generally bordered on the north by 47th Street, on the south by 55th Street, on the east by Western Avenue (2400 West) and on the west by Pulaski Road (4000 West). According to the above source, this area has long had the reputation of being hostile to Negroes.

The source continued that on July 14, 1966, demonstrations are to be held in the Gage Park area principally under the auspices of the SCLC, however, the exact details of these demonstrations as to specific nature and location were not known. The source believed these demonstrations would take the form of visits by mixed groups of whites and Negroes to parks, playgrounds, and shopping centers in the area with possible sit-in or picketing demonstrations at certain of the real estate offices visited. These tactics are among those suggested by persons affiliated with the CFM Gage Park effort. Additionally, on July 16, 1966, a picnic is to be sponsored in Gage Park at a centrally located park area within the general Gage Park neighborhood.

The "Chicago American", a daily Chicago newspaper, edition of July 13, 1966, contained an article reflecting that Doctor Martin Luther King, Jr., President, SCLC, was then in Chicago, but had planned to depart for Atlanta, Georgia, during the evening of July 13, 1966. The article continued, however, that King was expected to return to Chicago during the evening of July 14, 1966, to participate in a possible meeting being held here subsequent to the Gage Park demonstrations.

On December 4, 1965, a confidential source, who has furnished reliable information in the past, furnished information which disclosed that Stanley Levison and Martin Luther King (President of the Southern Christian Leadership Conference, SCLC), were in contact on that date concerning a speech King was to make before the Synagogue Council of America on December 5, 1965, at the Waldorf Astoria Hotel, New York City. (S)

Levison, in advising King what he should say, told him to make some remarks about his accomplishments since the movement (King's) started in Montgomery, Alabama, about ten years ago. King, Levison advised, should say that major Federal legislation dealing with civil rights was written because of the actions in Birmingham and Selma, Alabama. (S)

King and Levison also discussed the statement of the National Council of Churches regarding United States efforts in Vietnam. In that regard, King and Levison had nothing but praise for the statement, and Levison advised King to use the part about the use of United States power to kill Asians. Levison said he thought King should associate himself with it. King agreed to get a copy of "The New York Times" and see what he could use from the article. (S)

"The New York Times", Saturday, December 4, 1965, on page 1, column 8, carried an article reporting a proposal by the National Council of Churches on December 3, 1965, urging the United States to stop bombing North Vietnam to create a more favorable climate for peace negotiations. The Council statement suggested that the present course generates distrust and hatred of the United States throughout much of the World because the country is seen as a predominantly white nation using overwhelming military strength to kill more and more Asians. (u)

In continuing their discussion, King and Levison made reference to a recent episode in Boston, Massachusetts, whereby the American Legion withdrew an award to a Rabbi named Gittelsohn (phonetic). The award, according to King and Levison, was withdrawn because Gittelsohn was a sponsor of the March on Washington For Peace in Vietnam on November 27, 1965. King was advised by Levison to stress in his speech before the Synagogue Council that the award was withdrawn because of Gittelsohn's outspoken defense of Peace. Additionally, King was told to pose the question "whether free speech has not become one of the casualties of the war". (u)

According to the source, King and Levison ended their discussion on a note by Levison that in regard to Vietnam, Johnson and Kennedy have stated sensible policies but "we" were not implementing them. Levison said the big question was just who is actually running the country. (u)

The "New York Herald Tribune", December 6, 1965, page 16, column 5, contains an article reflecting that Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., spoke at the annual dinner of the Synagogue Council of America at the Waldorf-Astoria in New York City, on the night of December 5, 1965, at which time he received the group's Judaism and World Peace Award. (u)

According to the article, King, in his speech, made the following comments: (u)

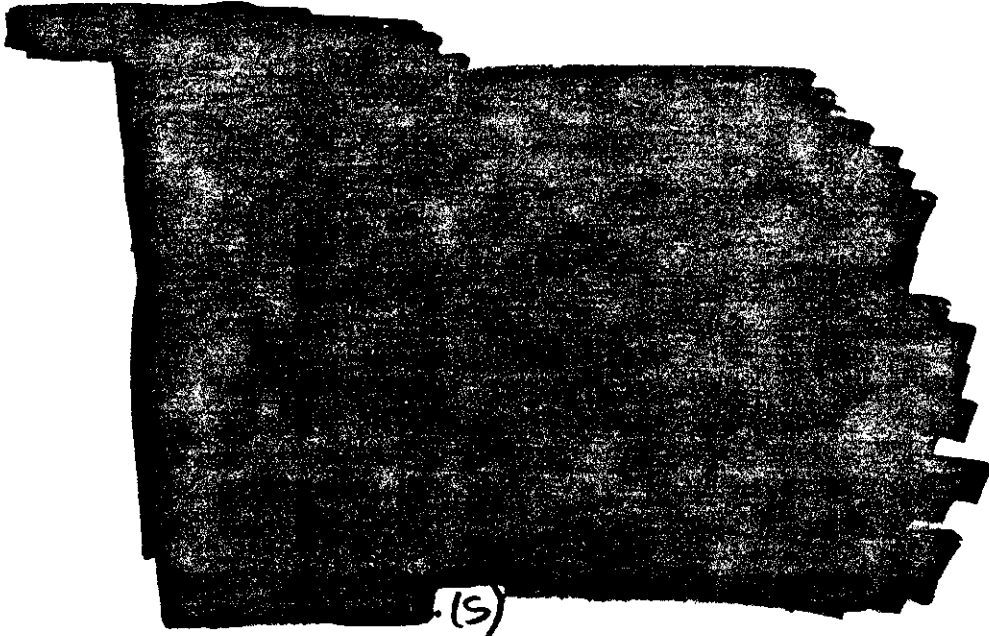

The prospects for peace in Vietnam are growing dimmer because of a war policy in this country. The danger of the United States going deeper into the Vietnam conflict is on the increase "because those who would question it are being subjected to intensified attack". Such attacks take the form of "an ugly regressive sentiment to silence peace seekers". It is "assuming a shape which depicts advocates of immediate negotiation under terms of the Geneva Agreement as quasi-traitors, fools, or venal enemies of our soldiers and institutions". (u)

Dear Mr. Hoover:

We recently ran in our paper a couple of short news items relative to some activities of Rev. Martin Luther King. We had two objections registered to this, both suggesting that Mr. King was not the kind of man that we should be quoting, or in any way holding up even to seeming honor and respect. One lady has written stating the following:

"When clerics in positions of high authority project the name of M. L. King as one who speaks for the church, and who is honored by the church, the Christians of the world are being misled and deceived by pharisaical hypocrisy as evil and devastating as that which existed in the time of Christ"

"The personal life of Martin Luther King is so scandalous that it is being kept under wraps in the secret files of the F.B.I....His Executive Secretary's record is in police courts for homosexuality, and it is a matter of photostatic evidence."

These are unpleasant and serious charges. The other correspondent suggested that Mr. King was backed by Communists. You will, of course, know whether there is anything about Mr. King which you can share with me, either in confidential manner or for publication - the latter is what I should prefer. If the charges made by my correspondent are completely foundless, I should like to be able to say so on your authority if possible. On the other hand if there are some grounds for these serious charges, I should, if possible, know, even if the information is something which cannot be publicized. My reason for wishing to know, is clearly that I might govern myself to some respect in such publicity as I give to Mr. King.

Any information which you may be in a position to share with me would be very much appreciated.

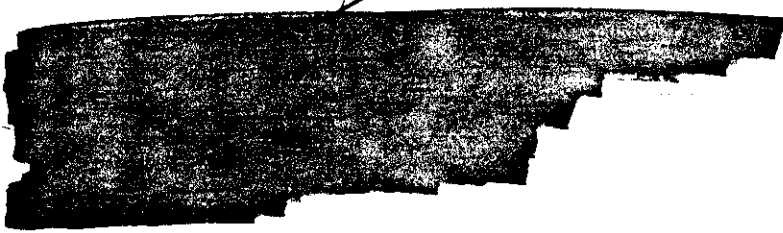

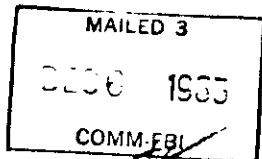

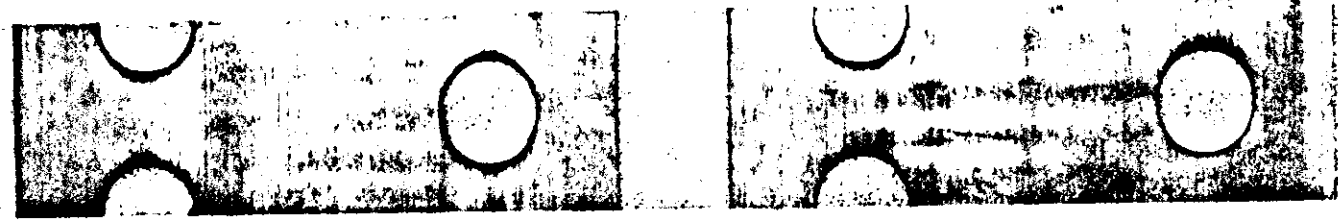

You will recall that we had received second-hand information that [redacted] had stated that according to her brother, a banker [redacted] Martin Luther King, Jr., has a numbered account with a balance of over one million dollars where this banker is employed. It has been previously recommended, and the Director approved, that we initiate a discreet investigation to attempt to corroborate this allegation, after which we could consider further action to discredit King either through counterintelligence channels or by turning the information over to the Internal Revenue Service for possible criminal prosecution.

We were unable to find any trace of a banker [redacted] named [redacted] but have now developed information identifying the banker [redacted]

If [redacted] is cooperative (and we have no reason to believe otherwise) and with our assurance of anonymity, we should be able to obtain the information we desire first hand. We believe that at this time a direct approach to [redacted] is the best course of action open to us as he is no longer affiliated [redacted] bank, which fact should encourage his cooperation, and because he is the individual who originally made the allegation concerning King.

RECOMMENDATION:

Attached for approval is an airtel to New Orleans containing background information on this matter and instructing that [redacted] be promptly interviewed by experienced, mature Agents and under discreet circumstances, along the lines indicated above.
