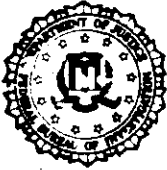

On February 2, 1967, a confidential source, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised that he had received information indicating that Stanley Levison was in contact with Dr. Kenneth Clark, a professor at the City College of New York on that date. Although the source was not positive that their contact was in regard to the SCLC, he knew that it concerned the Ford Foundation's decision to make a gift to a civil rights project with which Martin Luther King (President of the SCLC) is affiliated. The information which the source ascertained was as follows:

Levison wanted to know if Dr. Clark had heard anything new from the Ford Foundation. Clark related that he recently spent time at the headquarters of the Ford Foundation, and had learned that the Foundation had positively decided to make the grant. In fact, Clark commented that whether or not the Foundation acted before King returned to the United States from Jamaica, there would be funds on which to operate the organization. Levison was very jubilant after hearing this, and said the SCLC Board would be very happy to hear the news.

In response to an inquiry from Clark as to when King planned to return to the United States, Levison opined that it would be around February 10, 1967. Clark wanted to know this, since he wanted to write King to inform him of the decision of the Foundation. Levison furnished King's address as the Villa Le Geno, Ochorios, Jamaica

With regard to the projected gift from the Ford Foundation to the SCLC, the same source furnished information on October 11, 1966, that Stanley Levison was in contact with officials of the Ford Foundation concerning the possibilities of the SCLC obtaining a grant from this Foundation

Another confidential source, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised on October 19, 1966, that King had met with Mc George Bundy, Director of the Ford Foundation, at which time Bundy offered a grant of \$3,000,000.00 to the SCLC to help in many of its programs.

On January 10, 1967, a confidential source, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised that information had come to his attention which disclosed that a conference took place on that date between Martin Luther King (President of the Southern Christian Leadership Conference (SCLC)), Stanley Levison, Andrew Young (Executive Director of the SCLC) and Ralph Abernathy (Secretary-Treasurer of the SCLC). The conference, according to the information furnished by the source, was in regard to the following:

Levison was concerned about an article which appeared in newspapers several days ago in which Hosea Williams (Director of Special Projects, SCLC) claimed that Negroes in Chicago were not interested in registering to vote and, therefore, that was the reason the SCLC's drive in that city was not succeeding. It was Levison's feeling that Williams had breached a trust entrusted in him, and that he was trying to blame someone else for his failure. Levison reportedly had told Young that if he were King, he would fire Hosea Williams.

King was very upset over Williams' story, especially since the articles made it appear as though the drive in Chicago had failed and, therefore, he (King) should not have commenced the drive in the first place. It was King's suggestion to have Young and Abernathy calm Williams, but Levison was of the opinion that something more than calming him was involved. It was Levison's feeling that Williams was not competent to conduct the Chicago registration drive. The treatment to be given Williams, Levison felt, should be to have him stripped of his title as Director of the Chicago drive.

It was King's feeling that such drastic action advocated by Levison should not be taken without King having the opportunity to confront Williams in person. Although Levison agreed to abide by King's position, he instructed Abernathy to relate to Williams that he (Levison) wanted his title taken away or to dismiss him. Levison wanted to get across to Williams just how much he was upset over his conduct.

Levison reportedly commented that due to Williams' impulsiveness, the SCLC is always being embarrassed by some statement he makes off the top of his head. King agreed with Levison and said Williams alienates so many people wherever he goes and then looks for someone to blame for his own shortcomings.

It was agreed that with reference to the Williams statement, that Young and Abernathy should issue some statement repudiating the article attributed to Williams. King instructed Young to tell Williams just how upset he was over his statement and that it could not be taken lightly.

King, in digressing to another subject, said he was also upset over articles in magazines which inferred that his day was over and that he could no longer appeal to the people in the ghetto. It was his feeling that such articles contribute nothing positive.

Levison felt that in regard to the SCLC's efforts in Chicago, that a proper interpretation should be explained to reporters covering the scene. The approach which Williams took, Levison commented, was from a defensive standpoint. In order to rebut Williams, Levison said reporters should be told that problems in the Northern cities are quite different from those the SCLC experienced in its Southern drives.

Levison, the source advised, planned to go to Chicago on SCLC business, January 20, 1967, and would contact Williams upon his arrival.

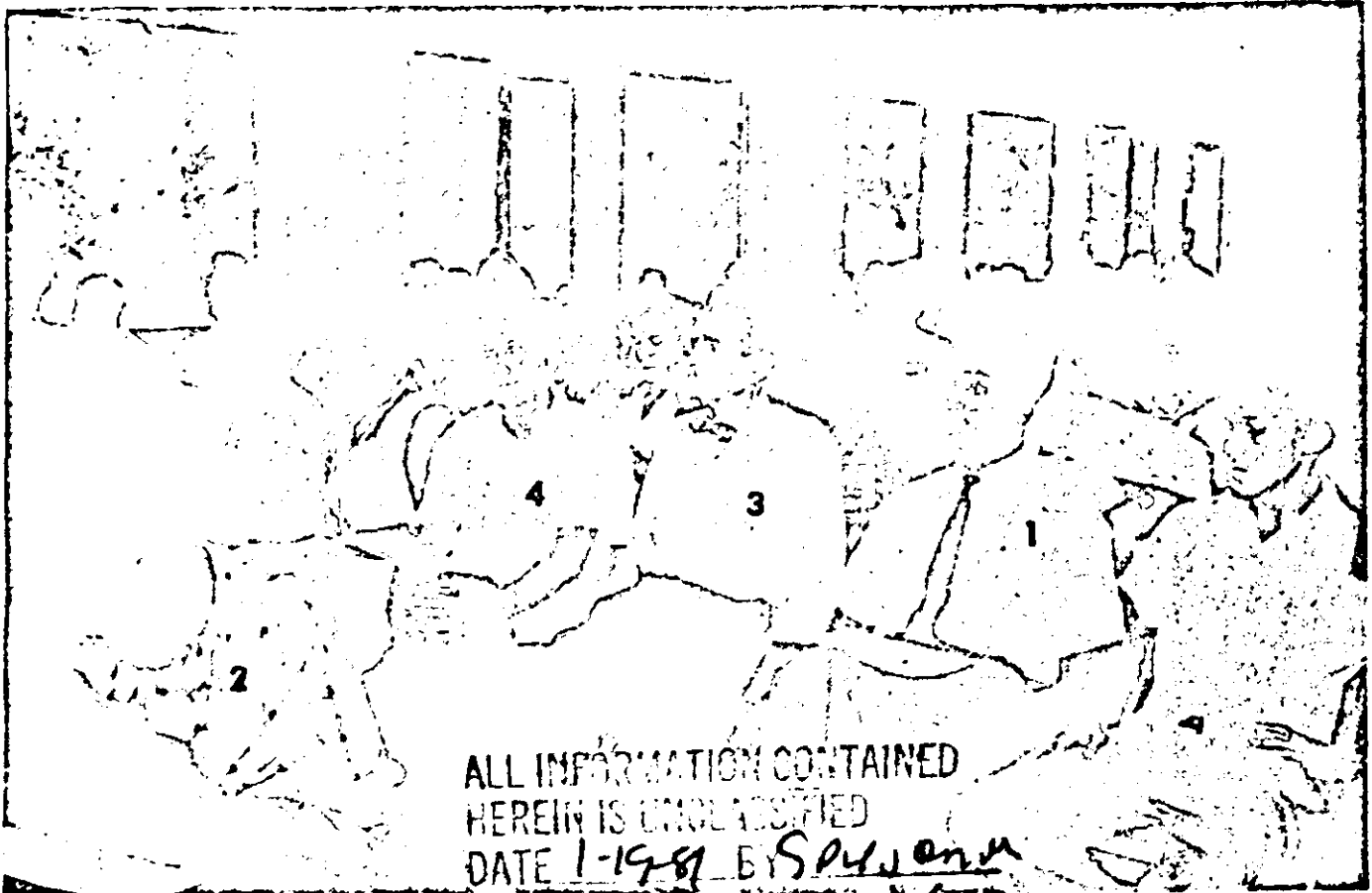

The above picture was made by an employee of the State of Georgia, at the Highlander Folk School in Monteagle, Tennessee during the Labor Day week-end of 1957. The photographer was sent to the Highlander Folk School by the Georgia Commission on Education. The Highlander Folk School was abolished by an act of the Legislature of the State of Tennessee at a later date because it was charged with being a subversive organization.

Those numbered in the picture are:

1. Martin Luther King, Jr., of the Montgomery boycott and the Birmingham riots. Karl Prussion, a counterspy for the FBI for twenty-two years, charges that Martin Luther King belongs to sixty Communist-front organizations — more than any Communist in the United States. He is promoted and encouraged by the Kennedys.
2. Abner W. Berry of the Central Committee of the Communist Party.
3. Aubrey Williams, President of the Southern Conference Education Fund, Inc., The Transmission Belt in the South for the Communist Party.
4. Myles Horton, Director of Highlander Folk School for Communist Training, Monteagle, Tennessee.

These "Four Horsemen" of racial agitation have brought tension, disturbance, strife and violence in their advancement of the Communist doctrine of "racial nationalism."

The following information has been supplied by confidential sources of this Bureau who have furnished reliable information in the past.

On January 14, 1967, Martin Luther King, Jr., President, Southern Christian Leadership Conference, held a conference with civil rights leaders, A. Philip Randolph and Bayard Rustin. Also included in the conference were Stanley Levison, principal advisor to King, and two of King's aides, Ralph D. Abernathy and Andrew J. Young. At this conference, it was proposed that a meeting of leading Negro civil rights leaders be held in New York City on January 16, 1967. The purpose of the meeting would be to issue a joint statement by this Negro leadership indicating that they do not condone Congressman Adam Clayton Powell's misconduct and arrogance. Congressman Powell is a United States Representative from New York. This group feels that Powell should be seated in Congress because of constitutional provisions. This proposed statement would also back a rule change in Congress regarding the ethical conduct of members of Congress, providing the rule is applied impartially to all members.

This proposed meeting would be confined to Randolph, Rustin, and representatives of the Southern Christian Leadership Conference, National Association for the Advancement of Colored People, and Urban League.

Rustin advised that he wrote the statement adopted which took the general position that civil rights leaders did not support Powell in his outside activities, but they did object to his being unseated. This was denying him the due process of law and also was denying the people of New York State their right to representation in Congress. He said these groups do not advocate a double standard, but they want one standard applied uniformly.

During the early 1940's Bayard Rustin was a member of the Young Communist League, an organization which has been designated subversive pursuant to Executive Order 10450.

Rustin advised that he wrote the statement adopted which took the general position that civil rights leaders did not support Powell in his outside activities, but they did object to his being unseated. This was denying him his due process of law and also was denying the people of New York State their right to representation in Congress. He said these groups do not advocate a double standard, they want one standard applied uniformly.

On January 14, 1967, a confidential source, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised that he had learned that a conference between Martin Luther King, President of the Southern Christian Leadership Conference (SCLC), Bayard Rustin, Stanley Levison, A. Philip Randolph (President of the Brotherhood of Sleeping Car Porters), Andrew Young (Executive Director of the SCLC) and Ralph Abernathy (Secretary-Treasurer of the SCLC) took place on that date. It was further learned by the source that their conference was in regard to the controversy over Congressman Adam Clayton Powell and in particular, the refusal of Congress to seat Powell. According to the information received by the source, the following was, in substance, what transpired during their discussion:

First of all, Randolph announced that on Monday, January 16, 1967, he would hold a meeting at his office in New York City to discuss with civil rights leaders and other leaders in various walks of life, Congressman Powell's arrogance and misconduct and then issue a statement pointing out that the Negro leadership does not condone his conduct.

King announced that he would not be able to attend the meeting at Randolph's because he was going on vacation to Jamaica. However, he was glad to hear that some action was being planned since his organization needs a sense of direction on the matter.

The question arose as to what kind of organization Randolph has organized to handle those matters pertinent to Powell's difficulty with Congress. It was learned from Randolph that he had organized a committee called Justice and Congress which will be made up of civil rights leaders and some church leaders. This committee, according to Randolph, will be an Ad Hoc Committee until a meeting of rights leaders takes place in Washington in two weeks, at which time the committee will go out of existence.

It was Rustin's opinion that some decision must be reached on Monday to control Powell. He mentioned that Powell had been running around the country telling everyone that he had Randolph and that "stupid King" in his pocket. It was Rustin's conclusion that unless Powell is stopped, he will ruin the entire civil rights movement. Rustin, the source mentioned, has very little sympathy for Powell.

King pointed out that he had received numerous letters from people who were outraged because he supported Powell. These people, King mentioned, were disillusioned and felt that Negro leaders had been very dishonest in supporting Powell without pointing out that he was responsible for the treatment he is receiving. It was King's conclusion that in supporting Powell, it looked as if they (Negro leaders) were condoning immorality in terms of conduct when it comes to the money questions and all of the other things that finally came out concerning Powell. King admitted that he would not mind facing the criticism and loss of money that he would surely suffer as long as Powell appreciated it, but was of the opinion that he (Powell) did not appreciate the support.

Randolph agreed that many white people who have a very fine record on civil rights, feel that when the Negro leadership came out in support of Powell, that it had displayed a lack of civic righteousness. In order to offset this attitude, Randolph felt that it must be made clear that the Negro leadership has a Constitutional obligation to support Powell.

It was Rustin's feeling that what they (the Negro leadership) should say in any press release is that with regard to the tragic situation with Powell as with others, what we (the Negro leadership) now call for is the abolishment of the Rules Committee as it is now set up, and that an ethical standard be established on which all people could be judged.

It was Levison's position that no longer could the Negro leadership "pussyfoot" on the issue. He maintained that the Negro leadership was already in an unbalanced situation, in that the country believed that the Negro leadership had backed Powell on everything he had done. Levison enumerated two points which he said had to be gotten across to the public: one, the Constitutional and Congressional issues that are involved in the hope that they can understand; and the other, what the Negro leadership feels about Powell. In explaining what he meant, Levison was of the opinion that if Negro leaders could call Powell arrogant in private, they should also say the same in public.

Levison expressed confidence that if the most prominent Negro leaders were to make a statement that Powell's misconduct was misconduct, it would get a press play that would be big enough to wash out any preliminary or temporary confusion that he may have created.

The conference concluded on a note of agreement that on Monday, January 16, 1967, following the meeting at Randolph's office, a statement would be issued pointing out that the Negro leadership concludes that what is involved in this case are principles that are bigger than ordinary Congressional rules. But these rules, whatever they may be, have to be applied to everyone, the statement will include. The statement will also urge that Congress respect the Congressional District which elected Powell.

Rustin announced that Monday's noon meeting will be attended by Randolph, Rustin, representatives from the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People (NAACP), Whitney Young, Director of the Urban League, and representatives from the SCLC.

### KING OF HYPOCRISY

The famed civil rights leader, Martin Luther King, has two personal bodyguards who travel with him and at all times are ready to leap to the defense of their leader.

In addition, King has less obvious bodyguards in his entourage. A detail of FBI agents accompany the famous man almost everywhere. King's safety must mean much to some in the Administration.

At the same time, the FBI agents double in function by spying on his activities—and especially the secret comrades who furnish him with money, intelligence information about his enemies and even stolen cars.

A few months ago it was revealed in a few local southern papers that the King organization, the Southern Christian Leadership Conference, had established a regular market in stolen cars. When Dr. King wanted a new car for himself or a girl friend, he would simply have one stolen by Hosea Williams, who is aide-camp to Dr. King.

Said an anonymous Justice Department official in Georgia, as quoted by the March 18, 1966 Atlanta Journal:

"Today it is auto theft. Maybe tomorrow it will be murder. Don't let them (the Federal Government) tell you this isn't a cover up. They are covering up for civil rights groups which seem to be getting bigger and stronger than the United States Government."

The private life of King is filled with interesting incidents. FBI agents have a picture of him shaking hands with a top Soviet agent at the Kennedy International Airport in New York. And more potentially explosive still, is King's carryings-on with women.

King and his cohorts have staged wild parties in at least one Washington hotel.

King is brazen about his immoral conduct because he knows that he is immune from federal prosecution. J. Edgar Hoover has publicly called King, "the most notorious liar in America."

When the Senate Internal Security Subcommittee and the House Un-American Activities Committee sought to obtain a copy of the FBI case file on King, Attorney General Nicholas deB. Katzenbach invoked executive privilege. And when a direct appeal was made to President Johnson to make available to Congress the King report, for use in executive hearings, he declined, blandly explaining that it was not good policy to override his Cabinet officers.

Incidentally, United Auto Workers president, Walter Reuther, is helpfully contributing \$30,000 annually to the Reverend Dr. King out of the union's till.

## Socialism in Saskatchewan: A Fiasco

(From an address by the Hon. W. Ross Thatcher, premier of Saskatchewan, before the Edison Electric Institute in San Francisco, June 8.)

SASKATCHEWAN for 20 years—from 1944 to 1964—had a Socialist government—about the only one in North America, except Castro's.

In 1944, the Socialists said they would solve the unemployment problems by building government factories. They promised to use the profit to build highways, schools, hospitals and to finance better social welfare measures generally. Over the years they set up 22 so-called crown corporations. I wish that time permitted me to tell you of the fiasco that followed.

By the time we had taken over the government, 24 months ago, 14 of the crown corporations had gone bankrupt or been disposed of. Other were kept operating by repeated and substantial government grants.

DURING the whole period the Socialists waged war against private business. The making of profits was condemned as an unforgivable sin. What was the result? Investors simply turned their backs on the Socialists. Dozens of oil companies pulled up stakes and moved out. Gas exploration ground to a complete halt. Prospecting in our vast north became almost non-existent.

During the period Canada was experiencing the greatest economic boom in her history, Saskatchewan received only a handful of new factories. After 18 years of socialism there were fewer jobs in manufacturing than existed in 1945—this despite the investment of \$500 million in crown corporations.

The Socialists promised a greatly expanded program of social welfare measures: there was to be "free" medical care, "free" hospitalization care "free" drugs and so on. The money to finance these projects was to come from the profits of the crown corporations. Of course, in the overall picture, there were no profits—rather there were colossal losses. Thus the welfare program had to be financed from taxation.

During the period more than 600 completely new taxes were introduced; 650 other taxes were increased. "Per capita" taxes in Saskatchewan were soon substantially out of line with our sister provinces—one more reason why industry located elsewhere.

TWENTY YEARS AGO the Socialists promised to make Saskatchewan a Mecca for the working man. Instead, we saw the greatest mass exodus of people out of an area since Moses led the Jews out of Egypt. Since the war, 270,000 of our citizens left Saskatchewan to find employment elsewhere.

Finally our people decided they had been the Canadian guinea pig for socialism long enough. They threw them out.

It is the task of our new government to prove in the next few years that the private enterprise system can do more for our people than socialism.

If there are any Americans who think that socialism is the answer, I wish they would come to Saskatchewan and study what has happened to our province.

"More and more British doctors are migrating to the United States, where they can make better money than at home and often work with better hospital equipment.

"Reason: British Socialist medicine is not proving out as long promised — even as most Socialist curealls and panaceas eventually backfire in the faces of nations that fall for them... Let's take the British misfortune as a warning to us... that our own super-medicare and Socialist-medicine fanatics, if we let them, can in time (and maybe not much time at that) pretty much ruin medical service in the U.S.A."

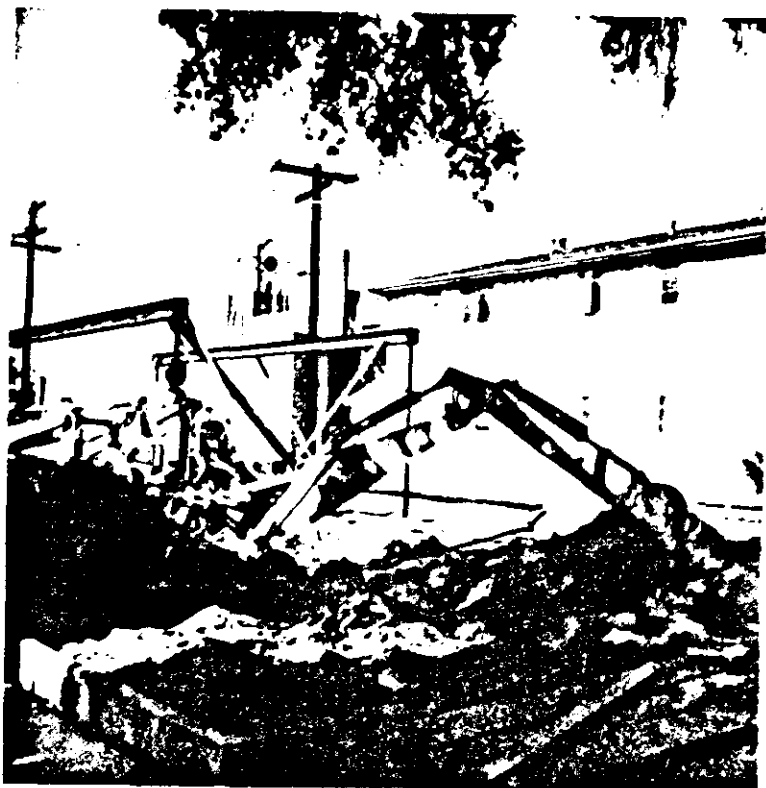

# 20,000 Soviet Youths Take Communist Oath

## Rally in Moscow's Red Square Climaxes Year-Long Drive to Instill Patriotism

MOSCOW (AP) — More than 20,000 young people marched through Red Square before top Soviet leaders Sunday and took an oath to build communism and struggle against "imperialism."

The colorful rally—displaying flags, portraits, banners, slogans, military bands, balloons and parade floats — climaxed a yearlong drive to instill patriotic feelings in Soviet youths.

As Sunday's rally closed a voice boomed out:

"This is Red Square speaking. Let the country and the world listen to the voice of Soviet Youth."

Perhaps 10 million youngsters throughout the country have taken part in marches to battle sites and monuments aimed at giving them a better understanding of the Soviet struggle in World War II.

Marchers included Pioneers, the organization for school children 9 to 14, and the Komsomol, the Communist league of teenagers and young adults.

# 3 BAPTISTS GET PRISON TERMS IN SOVIET UNION

MOSCOW, Nov. 22 (Reuters) — A court in Cheboksary, on the Volga, has sentenced three women to three years hard labor for running an illegal Baptist school, the newspaper Sovetskaya Rossiya reported here today.

The three belonged to a different Baptist sect which refuses to recognize the state-registered Baptist church and is proving a headache for Russia's rulers.

It is the fourth trial of its kind to be reported this year.

# 'Underground' School to Open

BERKELEY (UPI) — The Free University of Berkeley — which offers no exams, no homework and no credit—begins classes Monday in such subjects as astrology, draft-dodging, black power and political revolution.

# The Future Is Clouded

WASHINGTON—Year's end is the time for a look at the situation, particularly the international situation which is always a bit murky. Experts are few and frank statements are hard to come by; but here's a thumbnail summary on the Communist menace after talking with the best informed people in this town. There is no point in pretending that the outlook is very cheerful.

Russia. Alexei Kosygin is no improvement over his predecessors. He firmly believes communism will eventually sweep the world, not by conquest but by the so-called people's revolution. If you look at history you will see that the only Soviet concession of any consequence came at the point of a gun when Khrushchev forced President Kennedy to put up or shut up. JFK's reply was the very grim presence of U.S. warships (off Cuba) and the Soviet had to back down in a hurry. But the Russians have made no voluntary concessions in the interests of world peace. They are no more peaceful than they ever were—just more careful.



The Senate Internal Security Subcommittee of the Judiciary Committee will soon start very hush-hush hearings concerning former U.S. prisoners of war who defected to Red China. Several of the returned turncoats are espionage agents for Mao. And some of them have gone so far underground that their whereabouts are unknown even to investigative agencies.

# Havana Plans

By ROBERT S. ALLEN and PAUL SCOTT

WASHINGTON, Mar. 7. Security authorities are bracing for a world wide wave of terrorism and sabotage against U.S. government and private installations.

These clandestine operations, aimed at undermining U.S. influence and business overseas, are expected to be carried out by a new corps of Soviet-organized and trained agents operating from Communist Cuba.

WHILE OFFICIALS are un-

der White House orders not to talk publicly about this threat, President Johnson's advisers are studying warnings from intelligence sources that some of these saboteurs may be armed with a deadly new weapon — "atomic demolition munitions."

These one-man ADMs, as the nuclear weapons are called, have been in production in Russia since 1960, and are being turned out in several forms.

One design, capable of destroying large bridges, dams, tunnels, storage-tank complexes

and embassies, is a mine-type device approximately 18 inches in length and weighing around 70 pounds.

\* \* \*

THIS A-WEAPON packs an explosive power of .1 kiloton, and can be smuggled into a country in a suitcase.

Another ADM consists of two parts, each weighing approximately 80 pounds. This device, which can be assembled in a half hour by a trained saboteur, has an explosive yield of .5 kiloton, comparable to some 600 tons of TNT.

Both ADMs are specifically designed for guerrilla use, and reportedly were brought into Cuba, recently under Russian guard and stored in underground depots.

The visit to Los Angeles by King and Lee was not mentioned in the press or other news media and there had been no announcement of any contemplated public appearance by King.

Source advised on January 10, 1967, that King and Lee left Los Angeles for New York City at 11:00 AM, Pacific Standard Time, via American Airlines Flight 26. 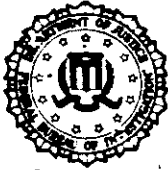

On January 5, 1967, a confidential source, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised that information had come to his attention which disclosed that Stanley Levison, Martin Luther King and Bernard Lee (assistant to King) were in contact on that date. The source said he learned that they discussed the following matters:

Levison related to King that Carey McWilliams, the Editor of "The Nation" magazine, had contacted him to see if King would be willing to participate in a conference on February 25, 1968, in California, which is being held by "The Nation". In describing the affair, Levison said it would be for the purpose of examining United States foreign policy as it concerns the Pacific, and in particular, as it concerns Vietnam. Among the participants will be Senators Eugene McCarthy of Minnesota and George McGovern of South Dakota.

King's presence on the panel, according to Levison, would be to talk on what he testified to during his presence before the Congressional Committee of Senator Abraham Ribicoff on December 15, 1966. In particular, Levison was of the opinion that King should say that the war in Vietnam is getting in the way of <sup>the</sup> civil rights movement in this country.

King mentioned that he would have to check on his schedule before giving Levison a reply. He was pleased to hear that he would receive a \$1,000.00 honorarium to appear.

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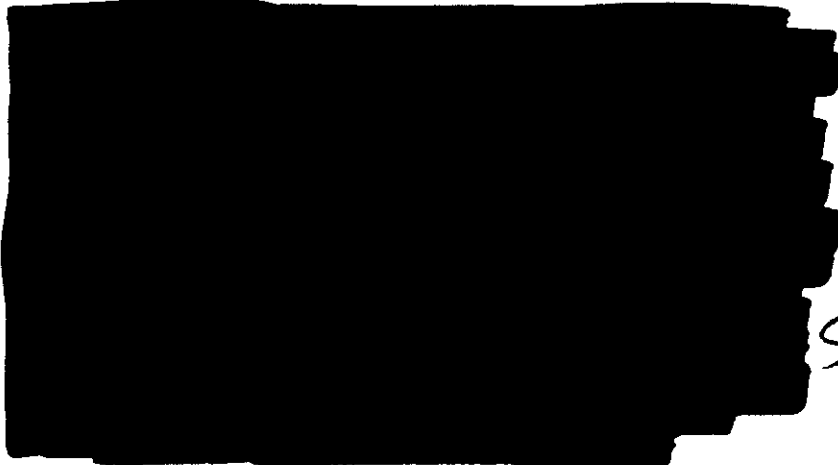

Another matter taken up by Levison and King was a request from Harry Wachtel that King meet with a group in New York City on Tuesday, January 10, 1967. It was Levison's opinion that the group, composed of Norman Thomas (leading National Socialist), William Corbin (Yale University Chaplain) and others, want to talk to King about the possibility of getting him to run for President of the United States in 1968.

King, after hearing this, said this (his candidacy) would admittedly be not with the idea of winning, confirming that it would be to give an alternative. King opined that such a meeting would be for the purpose of discussing politics, adding that he thought running would be an interesting idea.

Levison was of the opinion that in view of the way things are going, with the prospect that 1968 could be one of those frustrating situations for people, he thought some sober thought had to be given to King's candidacy.

The "Guide to Subversive Organizations and Publications," revised and published as of December 1, 1961, prepared and released by the Committee on Un-American Activities, United States House of Representatives, Washington, D.C., contains the following concerning the Emergency Civil Liberties Committee: u

"Emergency Civil Liberties Committee

"1. 'The Emergency Civil Liberties Committee is an organization with headquarters in New York, whose avowed purpose is to abolish the House Committee on Un-American Activities and discredit the FBI. \* \* \* The committee finds that the Emergency Civil Liberties Committee, established in 1951, although representing itself as a non-Communist group, actually operates as a front for the Communist Party. It has repeatedly assisted, by means of funds and legal aid, Communists involved in Smith Act violations and similar legal proceedings. One of its chief activities has been and still is the dissemination of voluminous Communist propaganda material.' u

'FRANK WILKINSON was called as a witness when he appeared in Atlanta as a representative of the Emergency Civil Liberties Committee to propagandize against the Committee on Un-American Activities and to protest its hearings. In 1956 WILKINSON was identified as a Communist Party member by a former FBI undercover agent within the Party. Summoned at that time to answer the allegation, his reply to all questions was, "I am answering no questions of this committee." This also became his stock reply to questions when he appeared during the Atlanta hearings. u  
\* \* \* WILKINSON has since been convicted of contempt of Congress and sentenced to one year in jail.

Reference is made to Chicago memorandum of January 3, 1967, under the above caption and that of "Proposed Demonstration by Englewood Action Committee (EAC), Englewood Area, Chicago, Illinois, Racial Matter".

Referenced memorandum made mention in part to a demonstration planned for Friday, January 6, 1967, by the CFM - SCLC forces at the offices of the Board of Election Commissioners, Chicago City Hall. The demonstration was to be over the issue of a voters registration campaign being held in Chicago by the SCLC.

In this connection an article appeared in the January 6, 1967, edition of the "Chicago Sun-Times", a daily Chicago newspaper. The article reflected that civil rights leaders in Chicago on the evening of January 5, 1967, had been present at a rally at the Liberty Baptist Church, 49th and South Park, Chicago. At this rally a drive had been launched to encourage greater participation by Negroes in the City's upcoming local elections. Prominent Negro leaders from outside Chicago had attended this rally inclusive of the following:

Robert Henry, first Negro Mayor of Springfield, Ohio

Williams was identified as head of the voters registration campaign being launched in Chicago by the SCLC. He stated that Ward organizations will be created to bring pressure on local committeemen and precinct captains to see that Negroes are registered, are informed about important issues, and encouraged to vote.

Williams had stated at this rally that registration goals had originally been set for 225,000 unregistered voters, but "We won't be able to register nearly that many." Such a number would not be possible because of a recent ruling by the Chicago Board of Election Commissioners which had rejected requests made by the CFM for additional Ward registration booths in predominantly Negro areas. Williams stated that the registration drive is expected to cost about \$30,000.00, which money is to be raised mostly through the SCLC and mass meetings and rallies, which will probably be scheduled in Chicago once or twice a week between the present time and the elections.

The "Chicago Tribune", a daily Chicago newspaper, edition of January 6, 1967, contained an article concerning a press conference held on January 5, 1967, at the Liberty Baptist Church. At this press conference Hosea Williams, Ralph Abernathy, and Representative Conyers had been present.

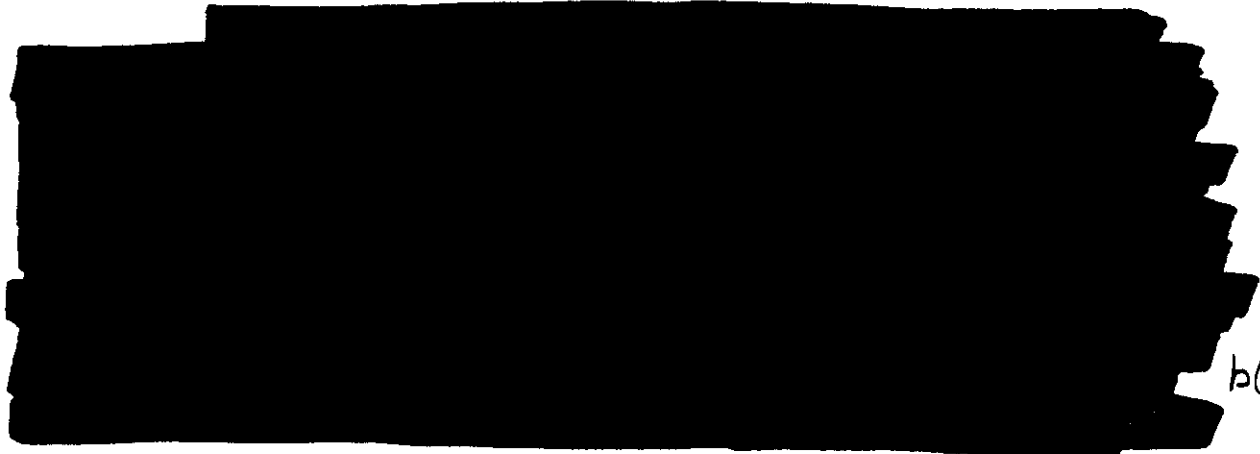

Williams stated at this conference that the refusal of the local Board of Election Commissioners to open registration centers in Negro Wards left "no recourse but to mass our people for demonstrations" in the offices of the Board at City Hall. Williams stated that these demonstrations probably will be held at least once a week for the next month.

The article continued that the Election Board had rejected a proposal by Williams to open these centers in predominantly Negro Wards, stating that the resulting expense, estimated at half a million dollars, would be too great. The Board had made a counter proposal to extend both weekday and Saturday hours of registration, however, this proposal was rejected by Williams.

During the course of the press conference, Reverend Abernathy was questioned concerning the current trip to Hanoi, North Viet Nam, by Mrs. Diane Bayel, wife of the Reverend James Bayel, another aide to Doctor Martin Luther King, Jr., in Chicago. Abernathy had stated, "She goes with my personal best wishes, and I think Doctor King would feel as I do about this."

A meeting of SCLC - CFM leaders was held the previous evening on Chicago's south side to discuss plans for the voters registration campaign then in progress. Hosea Williams was present, as were representatives of the Co-ordinating Council of Community Organizations (CCCO). The latter organization is the one which originally invited the SCLC to Chicago during the fall of 1965.

During this meeting Williams outlined plans to have voters registration efforts concentrated in certain political wards in the City where independent candidates have been announced or are expected to emerge. He stated that Monday, January 9, 1967, is to be a trial "freedom day" during which it is hoped that large numbers of persons will appear at the Board of Election Commissioners in Chicago's Loop area to register in such numbers that the Board will not be able to handle them. It is hoped that this will cause the Board to set up branch offices on Chicago's south side, which offices the CFM had originally requested from the Board. This voters registration drive is to take place during the week commencing January 9, 1967, with January 14, 1967, to be the day when it is hoped such large numbers of people will appear at the offices of the Election Board that traffic in the Loop area will be disrupted.

All civil rights organizations in the Chicago area are being asked to participate in this drive and those who agree to participate are to receive \$150.00 per week, provided by the

No demonstration activity of any kind had taken place during the day at the offices of the Board of Election Commissioners in Chicago. Two of these buses were from Chicago's south side and one from Chicago's west side. There had been no problems, incidents or disturbances during the day. It subsequently developed that of those persons who arrived at the Board offices by bus, only approximately twenty were actually registrants, the remainder were simply observers. 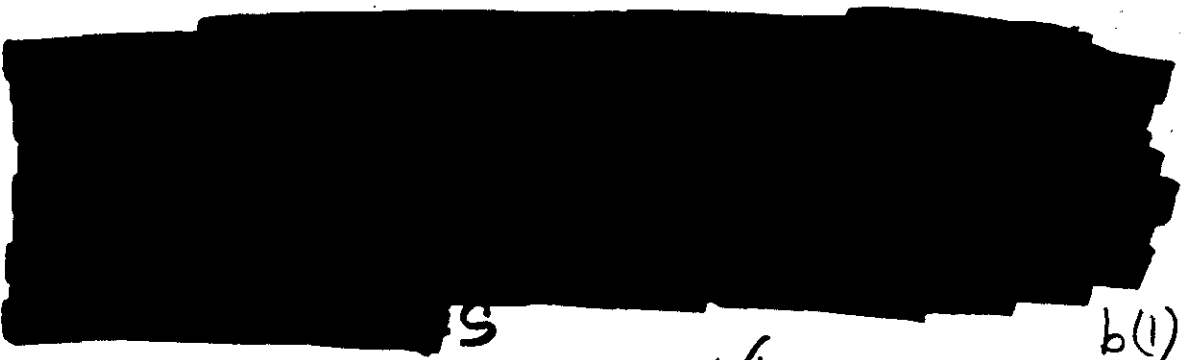

On January 3, 1967, a confidential source, who has furnished reliable information in the past, furnished information which indicated that Stanley Levison and Dr. Kenneth Clark, a Professor at City College, New York, New York, were in contact on that date. Their contact, according to the information received from the source, concerned a meeting which had been scheduled between Clark, Levison and Martin Luther King for Tuesday, January 3, 1967.

The meeting, as originally scheduled, was cancelled due to King's inability to be in New York City on Tuesday, January 3, 1967, and was re-scheduled for January 10, 1967 in New York.

The source was of the opinion that this meeting will concern King's new book, which is scheduled to be completed in early February, 1967.

The source mentioned above also furnished information on January 3, 1967, which disclosed that Stanley Levison and Carey Mc Williams, the Editor of "The Nation" magazine, were in contact on that date. The source said the information obtained by him revealed that their contact was in reference to a desire of "The Nation" to have Martin Luther King participate in a panel discussion during a conference in Los Angeles, California, on February 25, 1967. In describing the conference, Mc Williams said it would be sponsored by "The Nation" and would be held to examine certain aspects of American foreign policy in the Pacific.

Among the speakers who will participate in the discussion will be Senator George Mc Govern, Senator Eugene Mc Carthy and Mayor Jerome Cavanaugh of Detroit, Michigan. King's presence is desired so he can talk on what he testified to during his appearance before Senator Abraham Ribicoff's Committee in Washington, D. C., on December 15, 1966.

It was learned that Mc Williams agreed to pay King an honorarium of \$1,000.00 to participate in the conference, which pleased Levison very much. Levison, after learning of the offer, felt that King could use the engagement as an opportunity to take a vacation in California.

Mc Williams reiterated the desire of "The Nation" that King repeat what he said during his testimony on December 15, 1966, specifically that the war in Vietnam is getting in the way of the civil rights movement. Levison, the source remarked, concurred that King should so state, but said King did not want to get the reputation that he had left the civil rights movement and become a peace spokesman.

The conference ended with Levison agreeing to contact King and urge that he participate in the affair on February 25, 1967.

The "Guide to Subversive Organizations and Publications," revised and published as of December 1, 1961, prepared and released by the Committee on Un-American Activities, United States House of Representatives, Washington, D.C., contains the following concerning the Emergency Civil Liberties Committee:

"Emergency Civil Liberties Committee

"1. 'The Emergency Civil Liberties Committee is an organization with headquarters in New York, whose avowed purpose is to abolish the House Committee on Un-American Activities and discredit the FBI. \* \* \* The committee finds that the Emergency Civil Liberties Committee, established in 1951, although representing itself as a non-Communist group, actually operates as a front for the Communist Party. It has repeatedly assisted, by means of funds and legal aid, Communists involved in Smith Act violations and similar legal proceedings. One of its chief activities has been and still is the dissemination of voluminous Communist propoganda material.'

'FRANK WILKINSON was called as a witness when he appeared in Atlanta as a representative of the Emergency Civil Liberties Committee to propagandize against the Committee on Un-American Activities and to protest its hearings. In 1956 WILKINSON was identified as a Communist Party member by a former FBI undercover agent within the Party. Summoned at that time to answer the allegation, his reply to all questions was, "I am answering no questions of this committee." This also became his stock reply to questions when he appeared during the Atlanta hearings. \* \* \* WILKINSON has since been convicted of contempt of Congress and sentenced to one year in jail.

Reference has been made in the enclosed memorandum to DEMPSEY TRAVIS, identified as president of the Sivart Mortgage Company. As a matter of information, TRAVIS is a past president of the Chicago Branch, NAACP, 1960-61, and has served most recently as chairman of the Housing Committee, local branch of the NAACP. A Dun and Bradstreet confidential report on TRAVIS in February, 1966, reflected that he was president of the Travis Realty Company, 14 East 47th Street, Chicago, which company has annual billings of approximately three and a half million dollars. When interviewed by a Dun and Bradstreet representative in March, 1964, TRAVIS had stated that his realty company owned 12 buildings in the Chicago area and managed 240 others. The Sivart Corporation was incorporated in Illinois in 1953 with an authorized capital of \$500,000 and operates primarily as an FHA and VA mortgage banking institute, licensed to do business in both Illinois and Indiana. He is president of the Freeway Mortgage and Investment Company, Inc., as well as the Dempsey J. Travis Security and Investment Corporation. The Dun and Bradstreet report states that TRAVIS is well regarded locally, reflects that he was born in 1922, is married, served in the United States Army from 1942 to 1946, attended Roosevelt University in Chicago and is reported to have a masters degree in psychology.

Concerning JESS GILL, also mentioned in the enclosed memorandum, Chicago indices contain no pertinent identifiable information.

The article reflected generally that at this press conference King had outlined details of a program, federally sponsored, to rehabilitate slums in three Chicago neighborhoods. King and others had originally proposed such a program after the West Side racial disturbances in Chicago in July, 1966, and had sought the financial backing of the United States Department of Housing and Urban Developments (HUD). The continuing talks between Doctor King and HUD's Secretary, Robert C. Weaver, had resulted in the earmarking by HUD of four million dollars for a low interest, Federal Housing Administration (FHA) insured loan.

King described this venture as a pilot project during this press conference where he was flanked by project associates and the director of the Chicago Office of the FHA. King stated that the proposal was developed primarily by the Community Renewal Foundation, a private, not for profit, agency, engaged in neighborhood improvements. The mortgager for this project is the Sivart Mortgage Company, a Negro owned firm.

King had stated that the Chicago Freedom Movement will set up a development corporation with directors in this corporation representing the SCLC, the Coordinating Council of Community Organizations (CCCO), local businessmen and persons drawn from the three communities in which the rehabilitation will take place. He stated that \$100,000 in "seed capital" would be raised to charter the corporation. This corporation will seek to rehabilitate approximately 500 family-size units in apartment buildings located in the Lawndale, East Garfield Park and Kenwood-Oakland neighborhoods. The unique aspect of this project, according to King, was in the fact that the rehabilitated, low rent housing would then be turned over to co-operative organizations to be subsequently administered by the community co-ops themselves.

King stated that the corporation to be formed would seek approval from the Cook County Department of Public Aid so that welfare recipients could become members of the co-operatives

and have their rent allotments paid to the co-operatives.

The president of Sivart Mortgage Company, Mr. Dempsey Travis, was present at this press conference and stated that at least 125 buildings would be inspected for purchase during the next six weeks and initial contacts with some slum landlords had already indicated a willingness to sell slum properties to this new group.

The director of this project was to be a Jess Gill, a Chicagoan and former small loan specialist for the FHA. Gill was present at this press conference and stated that every effort would be made to employ Negro contractors and workers in the rehabilitation. He stated that it was his hope that the first application for purchase of a slum building, as to feasibility, could be presented to the local FHA office by February 1, 1967.

b7(D) [REDACTED] above, advised that information available to him reflected that subsequent to this press conference a meeting was held at the Liberty Baptist Church in Chicago. This was in the nature of a strategy meeting concerning the voter's registration campaign which is being sponsored in Chicago by the SCLC under the direction of Hosea Williams, the SCLC's Director of Voter's Registration. It was understood that an effort was to be made for representatives of the Chicago Freedom Movement, including the SCLC, to meet with the Board of Election Commissioners in Chicago later this afternoon, December 20, 1966, for the purpose of having voter's registration offices opened in predominantly Negro neighborhoods in Chicago, not only in the daytime hours but in the evening hours when it would be more convenient for many working people to visit them.

In this connection an article appeared in the December 21, 1966, edition of the "Chicago Daily News," captioned "Negro Vote Registration Plan Rejected." It reflected that a proposal aimed at making voter registration more convenient for Negroes was turned down Tuesday by the Chicago Board of Election Commissioners. AL RABY, Convener, CCCC, together with 14 other civil rights workers had met with Board Chairman Sydney T. Holzman.

They had requested that six polling places in each ward be kept open for voter registration from noon to 9:00 PM between January 3 and 28, 1966, rather than merely from 9:00 AM to 5:00 PM, January 31, 1966, as is normally the pre-election procedure. They maintained that many Negroes were employed in menial positions and were not able to register between 9:00 AM and 5:00 PM. RABY stated it was a "tremendous burden and inconvenience" for Negroes to register on other days at the Board's downtown offices.

HOLZMAN had denied the group's request, pointing out that previous attempts to maintain such branch offices over a period of several days had been ineffective. He noted that in 1962, 106 such centers had been opened for 12 days between 1:00 PM and 9:00 PM and had only registered some 22,000 new voters. HOLZMAN described this as a great waste of taxpayers' money.

After the meeting RABY stated he would submit a compromise proposal in writing to be considered at the next meeting of the Board.

During King's presence in Chicago there were no incidents or disturbances in connection with his activities here.

On December 20, 1968, a confidential source, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised that information had come to his attention that a conference between Stanley Levison and Thomas Offenberger of the SCLC Public Relations office took place on that date. Their conference, according to the source's information, disclosed the following:

Offenberger mentioned that the SCLC had received an inquiry from "The New York Times" and the "Washington Post" as to whether the SCLC desired to run an advertisement in the economic review section of these publications in January (1967). Levison instructed Offenberger to make certain that no advertisement appears, since to do so, would tend to give an impression to the public that the SCLC is well off financially.

Offenberger, according to the information from the source, related that on December 18, 1968, Martin Luther King (President of the SCLC) turned over the reins of the SCLC (while he takes time out to write his new book), and went to Chicago for a press conference concerning the housing project he plans to undertake in that city. But after the press conference, King was scheduled to take off for a while, Offenberger stated.

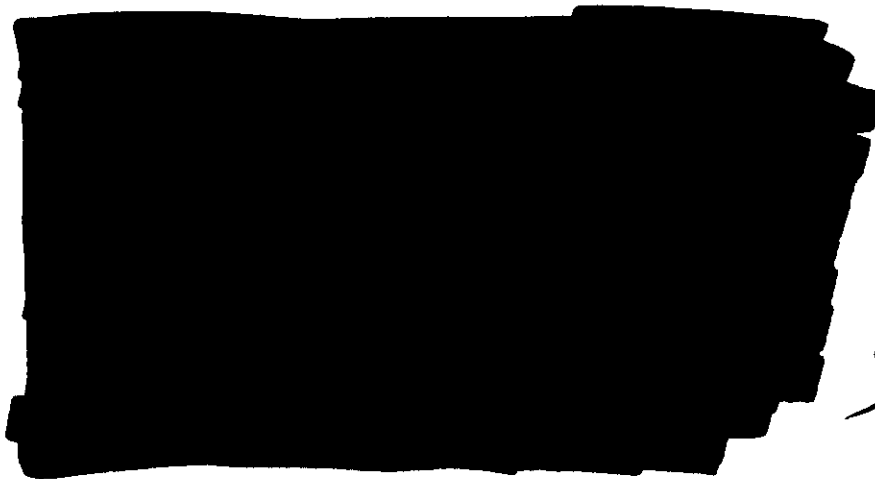

On December 19, 1966, a confidential source, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised that he had learned that Stanley Levison and Andrew Young (Executive Director of the Southern Christian Leadership Conference (SCLC) had conferred on that date. According to the information which the source was able to ascertain, Levison and Young talked about a testimonial for James Hoffa (President of the International Teamsters Union) which Hoffa's local in Detroit, Michigan was to have on December 20, 1966.

In that connection, Levison and Young discussed a telegram they were preparing for King which was to be read during the banquet. In essence, the greeting, as proposed for the telegram from King to Hoffa, would contain a statement that King would not make any effort to judge Hoffa (alluding to Hoffa's conviction and impending jail sentence) since he (King) had been confined on several occasions, therefore, could understand how a vigorous man would have real difficulties facing confinement.

The source said Levison thought the greeting to Hoffa should also make some mention of Hoffa's accomplishments in the field of civil rights, spelling out that the Teamsters Union has over one million members who are Negroes.

On December 13, 1966, a confidential source who has furnished reliable information in the past advised that it had come to his attention that Stanley Levison and Martin Luther King, the President of the SCLC had conferred on that date. The source learned that the following was discussed during their conference:

It was decided that King, Andrew Young (Executive Director of the SCLC) and Levison, would meet in King's hotel suite at the New York Hilton Hotel, New York City, on December 14, 1966, to go over King's testimony before the Senate Committee on urban matters on Thursday, December 15, 1966. At Levison's suggestion, King agreed that Michael Miller of the Ford Foundation, should also attend. Levison mentioned that he and Miller had been working on a memorandum which King would use during the hearing to present the program and view of the SCLC.

The source also advised on December 13, 1966 that Stanley Levison and Michael Miller of the Ford Foundation had conferred shortly after King and Levison concluded their conference. The source said he had learned that Miller and Levison had discussed the memorandum they were preparing for Martin Luther King's use when he testifies before Senator Abraham Ribicoff's Committee on Thursday, December 15, 1966. Levison, according to the source wanted Miller to accompany him to King's hotel suite at the New York Hilton Hotel on Wednesday, December 14, 1966 to confer about King's appearance.

On December 14, 1966, the source said he had ascertained that Stanley Levison and Michael Miller had agreed to meet that afternoon in Miller's office at the Ford Foundation, 477 Madison Avenue, New York City.

Later, on the same date, Stanley Levison and Clarence Jones were in contact, according to information received on December 14, 1966, from the same source. Their contact, to the best of source's information, was in regard to Martin Luther King's appearance before Senator Abraham Ribicoff's Committee on December 15, 1966. Actually, Levison wanted to get some figures concerning population figures which Jones had compiled. Jones' figures reflected that 78 of the larger cities in the United States now have a Negro population of 20 to 25 per cent and that by 1970, 25 of these cities will have a Negro population of over 50 per cent.

It was Jones' opinion that the financial and business communities in these cities, which control the national wealth, will not abandon the inner urban center to the happenstance of the ghetto, but will solve the problem of the ghetto rather than turn the city over to the black majority. Jones felt that the political structure will be dominated by the particular urban character of the population.

Jones, at Levison's insistence, agreed to send these population figures to King's hotel suite at the New York Hilton Hotel.

On December 8, 1966, a confidential source, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised that Martin Luther King (President of the SCLC), while in New York, New York, on that date, conducted the following business for the SCLC:

He met with Michael Miller of the Ford Foundation and Harry Wachtel in Wachtel's law office at 598 Madison Avenue, New York City, to discuss a grant the Ford Foundation plans to give to the SCLC. The source said King presented the SCLC's program to justify the grant.

Following the meeting at Wachtel's office, King met with representatives of the Stern Foundation (a foundation which has been working with Wachtel on a grant they plan to give to the SCLC). The place of the meeting was unknown to source.

The same source mentioned above also advised on December 8, 1966, that Stanley Levison and Dora McDonald (King's personal secretary) conferred on that date about the desire of King to meet with Levison later during the day. Levison said he would meet with King at King's hotel (the New York Hilton) after 6:00 p.m., December 8, 1966.

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On December 12, 1966, the forementioned source advised that Martin Luther King and Stanley Levison were in contact on that date. The following is in substance what transpired:

King said his contact was in reference to his testimony for Thursday (King's testimony before the Senate Committee headed by Senator Abraham Ribicoff which is considering urban matters). Levison told King that he would confer that night (December 12, 1966) with Michael Miller (Ford Foundation representative) concerning King's appearance. Levison said he and Miller would complete their work on Tuesday night, and would then submit their work for King's comments and observations.

King said he was still thinking about what he should say to the Committee since he did not want to repeat what other civil rights leaders have said. Levison agreed that it was a problem, but said material coming from academic people (apparently alluding to the people who are working with Miller and Levison), which makes mention to the inequality of the distribution of income, would be something new. The guaranteed income which King will testify about will be new, Levison said. Continuing, Levison said that despite all the prosperity in the country, the problems of the cities are not being solved, therefore, the guaranteed income would be something positive to help.

King said that somehow he must reiterate during his testimony that the war in Vietnam is standing in the way of the implementation of any of the things he urges be done. He said he must be strong on this point; that this is an open invitation to confusion, chaos, disruptions and riots. Levison said King's testimony would have to be analytical and passionate at the same time. They agreed that something could be done with the guaranteed annual income, giving facts and figures to support their position.

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The conference between King and Levison ended with King informing Levison that he would probably be in New York on Wednesday night (December 14, 1966) to confer with Levison before going on to Washington, D. C. on Thursday.

On December 6, 1966, a confidential source, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised that Stanley Levison conferred with Martin Luther King (President of the SCLC) on that date. The following, according to the source, transpired:

Levison said he wanted to get King's observations about a paper Michael Miller of the Ford Foundation is preparing for King's use when he testifies before Senator Abraham Ribicoff's Committee on December 15, 1966. Levison said he would meet with Miller that night (December 6, 1966) during which time he and Dick Russell (Richard Russell of Hartford, Connecticut) would present their views as to what should be included in the paper.

Levison then mentioned the four million dollar mortgage commitment approved by the Federal Housing Administration for the SCLC's benefit. He said in reference to a need for twenty five thousand dollars, to get the slum project underway, (the project for which the money is to be used) that he (Levison) had taken fifteen thousand dollars of his own money, and had received ten thousand from Dick Russell.

In connection with the slum rehabilitation program planned in Chicago, for which the four million dollar Federal Housing Administration (FHA) loan will be used, King said his testimony next week before Congress should point out the need for getting the cities to solve the "high density open housing". But also, King said, there must be a recognition of a need to make the ghetto more liveable because no matter how much open housing becomes available, "you" would not get all the poor people out of the ghettos immediately. Therefore, he said, life in the ghetto must become more liveable and one way to do this is to make the ghetto more attractive.

Levison agreed with King that he must discuss housing in conjunction with urban problems when he testifies. He cautioned King against making any statement that the ghettos should be made more liveable but <sup>instead</sup> should include such a statement in a book or paper. Levison said he was afraid the press would misconstrue what King might say. King agreed with Levison's apprehension and agreed not to broach the issue.

Levison, in continuing his suggestions as to what King might say, said he thought King should testify to the need for an association of slum dwellers. In explaining, Levison said farmers are organized and have a powerful lobby to protect their interests; therefore, he thought slum inhabitants should also organize and have powerful lobby to protect their interests. King agreed with Levison and said he would make this suggestion.

King inquired of Levison if he thought the time was ripe to take up the guaranteed income issue. Levison said he thought so, as it pertains to the cities and pointed out that since the cities contain the mass of people who live on lower than starvation wages, they should be guaranteed an income. Levison said that in supporting this position, King could point out that in the cities "you have the very rich who live in beautiful apartment houses and you have the very poor who do service work".

On the issue of rehabilitation of slums, Levison asked King if he would recommend that private industry be encouraged to do the work or a non-profit corporation. King said he thought it should be a combination, and he could not see any way to do rehabilitation work without the Government putting millions into it. Private agencies also have a great responsibility in this matter, King remarked.

Levison, in trying to think of other ways to help solve the slum conditions in the big cities, made reference to the Office of Price Administration (OPA) during and shortly after the second World War. He said the OPA froze the rents on apartments, a system which required all apartments to be registered and every tenancy; so therefore, he saw no reason why that system should not be reinstated. In so doing, Levison said, when an apartment became available, instead of the landlord having the right to pick his tenant, which would mean a white tenant, the Government agency could select the tenant who applied first. Levison said under such a system a Negro would have to be accepted if he applied before the white man; this would automatically make for a dispersion of the slums because a Negro would have the right to be accepted if he made the first application.

In summing up what King's testimony should include, Levison said his proposals would be broken down into three basic parts: housing, education and jobs. Under housing the open housing question would be considered; under the education part, King would deal with what he considered necessary; under jobs, poverty and the guaranteed annual wage would be considered.

Levison and King also discussed getting a grant from the Ford Foundation. Levison said they (the SCLC) must take a serious approach to getting this grant, and said he was convinced that the Foundation is willing to give them one, but said it was important for the SCLC to lay its plans before the Foundation. He then inquired of King what he had planned for the remainder of the time he was to be in New York, as he (Levison) wanted King to meet with Michael Miller. King said he had to meet with Joan Daves (publishers representative) on Wednesday December 7, 1966, to

discuss his new book; on Thursday he said he would meet with representatives of the Stern Firm (Stern Foundation). Levison said Michael Miller would attend the meeting with the Stern Firm, so therefore, King could probably talk with him after that meeting. Levison suggested that they try to meet with Miller on Wednesday before they met with Daves. King agreed to this.

With regard to King's meeting with the Stern Firm (Stern Foundation), King said the meeting would start at 2:00 p.m. on Thursday (December 8, 1966) and would last for approximately four hours. King said Harry (Harry Wachtel) had arranged the meeting with Bess Myerson (former Miss America and television personality).

Levison and King ended their conference with Levison agreeing to meet King in his hotel suite at the New York Hilton Hotel, New York, New York, at 1:30 p.m., Wednesday. King told Levison he was staying in suite 2511-2513.

On December 7, 1966, at 1:20 p.m., Special Agents of the Federal Bureau of Investigation observed Stanley Levison enter the elevator in the New York Hilton Hotel, New York, New York, which goes to the 24-33rd floors. u

Re Norfolk airtel to the Director, 10/27/66, which requested the Richmond Office to review its indices and furnish background information concerning Dr. MILTON A. REID.

The files of the Richmond Office reflect the following references to Dr. MILTON A. REID:

Richmond file 157-160 captioned "RACIAL DEMONSTRATIONS, Danville, Va., June 1963, RM", reflects numerous references identifying Dr. MILTON A. REID of Petersburg, Va., Regional Director, Southern Christian Leadership Conference (SCLC) as one of the leaders participating in the demonstrations. Dr. REID was arrested and indicted by the City of Danville for participation in unlawful demonstration. It should be noted these cases are still pending.

Richmond file 56-51 captioned "UNKNOWN SUBJECTS; ALLEGED VOTING IRREGULARITIES, 11/5/63, ELECTION FOR STATE SENATOR, PETERSBURG, VA., EL", reflects a letterhead memorandum submitted to the Director, 11/16/63 which reflects that [redacted] advised [redacted] that Rev. MILTON REID, SCLC, Petersburg, Va., was considering protesting the 11/5/63 State Election in which he was an unsuccessful candidate for State Senator on the grounds that irregularities in voting procedures prohibited some Negroes in his district from voting. [redacted] advised that "TIME" magazine has completed work on a story regarding the allegation, and it will appear in the next issued which is due on the newsstands on 11/19/63.

Norfolk letter to the Director, 5/13/63, captioned "SOUTHERN CONFERENCE EDUCATIONAL FUND, INC., IS - C, ISA - 1950", sets forth information concerning a conference captioned "TIME FOR ACTION IN THE MID-SOUTH", which was held at Virginia State College, 4/26 - 27/63, on page 8 sets forth information concerning the announcement of this conference and lists the names of "Resource People" and included in these names was Dr. MILTON A. REID, Petersburg, Va.

On 3/15/66, the "Richmond Times-Dispatch", a daily newspaper, Richmond, Va., reported that a memorial service was held in Virginia in honor of Rev. JAMES REEB, a white Boston minister fatally beaten during racial unrest in Selma, Alabama. According to the article at the Petersburg, Va., service, Rev. Dr. MILTON REID, Petersburg Baptist Minister, led the group in a prayer. The article stated that Dr. REID had returned home last week from Selma, Alabama, and plans to return there again this week.

A confidential source, who has furnished reliable information in the past, furnished information on December 1, 1966, indicating that a conference between Stanley Levison, Andrew Young (Executive Director of the Southern Christian Leadership Conference, SCLC) and Dora McDonald (personal secretary to Martin Luther King) took place on that date. The conference, according to the source, was in regard to King's contemplated tour of Israel, and in this connection, the following transpired:

Young mentioned that he had just returned from Israel, and after reporting to King, he (Young) was told to confer with Levison and to discuss his (King's) forthcoming trip. Levison then inquired of Young as to what he learned concerning the official invitation (from Israel) and Young replied that he met with officials from the Ministry of Foreign Affairs in Israel, and with the Foreign Minister of Jordan, and that both of them were very anxious for King to visit their countries.

Young said he assured representatives of both countries that "we" (King and party) would discuss with them anything that King would say about the present situation (the hostilities between Israel and the Arab countries), and that his (King's) primary purpose was not political in terms of engaging in their political situation, but Young said he made no promise that King would not speak on the situation.

Young said the representatives did not appear concerned about that. However, in the event open warfare should begin, it would jeopardize the whole plan, Young opined.

Levison said he had to confess that he was very surprised that Israel wanted the tour. Young said both Israel and Jordan were scared to death about the hostilities, because they get their biggest income from tourists. Young said he was of the opinion that the travel agents abroad who are handling the tour are big time operators. Young said, however, that he thought the tour would be handled efficiently although he had to worry about the problem of over commercializing it. Levison said he thought Young could take an additional safeguard by having King contact Doctor Ralph Bunche, and get his opinion as to how the tour should be handled in order to avoid antagonizing Israel and the Arab countries.

The problems in connection with the tour, according to Young, are in the United States rather than in Israel. In the event the promotional work in this country is successful, there should be a pilgrimage of two or three thousand people, a factor which could prevent a war, Young remarked. In explaining, Young said such a large number of people would be such a boom to the economy of the countries in question, that they could not afford to have a war.

Levison, in trying to clearly express his feelings on the matter of war between Israel and the Arab countries said, "This" (the present hostilities) is a part of the cold war picture; that it's not merely that the Arabs don't want the Jews and that the Jews are determined to stay; and it's not on a level of mere prejudice; that, one could even deal with it if it were". But instead, according to Levison, "one has the Arab world, meaning Egypt, Syria and Iraq, with one political orientation right now, Israel with another, and Jordan, with a third". Therefore, when one talks about a project in Jordan, the project, itself, might be scuttled by Arabs because there is an intra-Arab conflict, Levison said. Due to this, Levison said he despaired of King finding some position to take, because one really has to be a genius in

this situation. Young agreed, adding, however, that due to King's position as a Nobel prize winner, he could be influential. Levison disagreed, cautioning that King's stature as a Nobel prize winner was not a very important factor in this dispute.

In reverting to the matter of funds to be derived from the tour, Levison was of the opinion that a full time person should be appointed by King, to supervise and work with Concreta Tours, the agency handling the tour in this country. Levison said this was necessary since a very substantial amount comes in just as deposits. Concreta Tours, Levison said, should pay the salary of the person appointed. It was agreed between Levison and Young that a female with some experience in the travel business, would be engaged to work as a supervisor to insure that the SCLC gets all the funds to which it is entitled.

Another point which was discussed during the conference was the aid which the SCLC expects to get from the Ford Foundation. In this regard, Levison mentioned that he recently talked with Michael Miller of the Foundation who indicated the willingness of the Foundation to give money to the SCLC. In fact, Miller, Levison commented, expressed a willingness to support the SCLC's "Operation Breadbasket" (a project in Chicago). Young was of the opinion that this project has an element of boycott in it. Levison agreed, but said it could be played down; that the SCLC had never resorted to boycotts and that it could be presented as something in which negotiation is the main element and which has been used to win all their victories. Levison said it was analogous to organizing a union; that one does not say that strikes are inevitable. Levison said he thought "Operation breadbasket" should be given special emphasis because "they" (SCLC) are very interested in creating jobs in the ghettos and that this project does this.

Dora McDonald interjected to tell Levison that the SCLC office in Atlanta, Georgia, had received two letters in the last few days; one from a man in Phoenix, Arizona, and one from a man in Manhattan, Kansas, referring to a film entitled,

"Anarchy U.S.A.", that is being shown by the John Birch Society. McDonald said it was quite obvious that the films were anti-Martin Luther King. She explained her inability to answer the writers of the letters, and thought she should get Levison's advice. She said one of the writers is a minister, who desires that King respond to it. In reading a portion of his letter, McDonald pointed out that the minister is very much distressed to see the film depict King as a revolutionary leader for America, supposedly using the same tactics used by the Communists in Cuba, Algeria and China; that although the film does not call King a Communist it implies it. Levison said he thought it would be easy to frame an answer since the charge was so stupid, as the revolutionaries mentioned just happened to be the ones that carried on armed revolt. He instructed McDonald to get the letters for him and he would answer them.

Before concluding the conference in question, Levison told McDonald that he finished the speech he was to prepare for King to deliver to a Jewish group in Chicago, Illinois. He said King would actually telephone the group on December 11, 1966, during which time he would read the speech.

WASHINGTON--A NEWLY FORMED TEACHER-STUDENT FEDERATION TODAY SAID IT WILL ENTER SEN. ROBERT F. KENNEDY, D-N.Y., IN THE 1968 PRESIDENTIAL PRIMARIES IF HE BREAKS WITH PRESIDENT JOHNSON'S VIETNAM POLICY.

THE STEERING PANEL OF THE NEW CAMPUS POLITICAL ACTION COMMITTEE RELAYED THE OFFER TO KENNEDY THROUGH AN AIDE AND HOPED TO MEET WITH THE NEW YORK SENATOR IN PERSON.

GERALD M. SCHAFLANDER, A PROFESSOR AT BROOKLYN COLLEGE, SAID THE COMMITTEE WAS FORMED "TO DEVELOP A REAL BROAD OPPOSITION TO THE GENOCIDAL WAR IN VIETNAM."

SCHAFLANDER SAID THE COMMITTEE ALSO WAS CONCERNED BY THE BREAKDOWN IN THE WAR ON POVERTY AND WOULD ALSO CONCERN ITSELF WITH CIVIL RIGHTS, CIVIL LIBERTIES, THE PLIGHT OF THE CITIES, AND THE NEED FOR A NEW INVESTIGATION INTO THE KENNEDY ASSASSINATION.

THE BROOKLYN COLLEGE PROFESSOR SAID THAT IF KENNEDY WOULD SUPPORT THE VIETNAM PROPOSALS OF SECRETARY GENERAL U THANT THE COMMITTEE WOULD ENTER HIM AGAINST JOHNSON IN EVERY DEMOCRATIC PRIMARY IN 1968. HE MENTIONED DR. MARTIN LUTHER KING AS A POSSIBLE RUNNING MATE.

SCHAFLANDER SAID THAT THE COMMITTEE HAS ALREADY RAISED \$100,000 AND PLANS TO BUILD UP A KITTY OF \$2 MILLION BY SEEKING \$1 CONTRIBUTIONS FROM EVERY STUDENT IN THE COUNTRY.

IN THE EVENT THAT KENNEDY REFUSES TO BREAK WITH JOHNSON OVER VIETNAM, SCHAFLANDER SAID THAT THE COMMITTEE WOULD RUN A TEACHER OR POSSIBLY A STUDENT IN THE PRIMARIES AGAINST JOHNSON.

HE CALLED THE ADMINISTRATION'S VIETNAM POLICY "INSANE, IRRATIONAL AND PARANOID."
