By communication dated July 21, 1967, captioned as above, you were advised that Martin Luther King, Jr., President, Southern Christian Leadership Conference, was in conference with his principal adviser, Stanley Levison, concerning the racial disturbances occurring throughout the Nation.

During this conference, Levison suggested that King advocate a program with dramatic qualities similar to the Works Project Administration of the 1930's C

On July 24, 1967, Levison dictated a press release to King's secretary which King was to use the day.

At another conference on July 25, 1967, King's advisers urged him to issue a statement that would not condemn violence in the cities but would, in a sense, condone it. He was also urged to rebut the statements made by the President the night of July 24, 1967.

In his press conference at Atlanta, Georgia, en July 25, 1967, King announced he had sent a telegram to the President urging the creation of a national agency similar to the Works Project Administration. An examination of the telegram discloses that a large percentage was taken verbatim from the press release prepared by Levison, Enclosed is a copy of this telegram for your ready **REC 52** reference.

However, it is interesting to note that during. the press conference King stated he condemned the present rists and did not condone violence. He also supported the President's use of Federal troops to deal with the rioting

, advised Reverend MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR., President, Southern Christian Leadership Conference, held a press conference at 11 a.m. that date at the Ebenezer Baptist Church, Atlanta.

Reverend KING announced this conference related to his concern over the current racial strife throughout the nation. He said he had forwarded a telegram to President LYNDON B. JOHNSON expressing his thoughts and recommendations regarding this matter. Reverend KING then distributed to those present at the news conference copies of this telegram.

I LISTENED WITH GREAT ANTICIPATION TO YOUR STATEMENT OF LAST EVENING,
FOR I TOO HAVE LALORED WITH HEAVY HEART THROUGH THE TRAGIC EVENTS
OF THE PAST WEEKS. THE CHAOS AND DESTRUCTION WHICH NOW SPREADS
THROUGH OUR CITIES IS A BLIND REVOLT AGAINST THE REVOLTING
CONDITIONS WHICH YOU SO COURAGEOUSLY SET OUT TO REMEDY AS YOU
ENTERED OFFICE IN 1964. THE CONDITIONS HAVE NOT CHANGED, AND
THOUGH THE AIMLESS VIOLENCE AND DESTRUCTION MAY BE CONTAINED
THROUGH MILITARY MEANS, ONLY DRASTIC CHANGES IN THE LIFE OF
THE POOR WILL PROVIDE THE KIND OF ORDER AND STABILITY YOU DESIRE.

THERE IS NO QUESTION THAT THE VIOLENCE AND DESTRUCTION OF PROPERTY MUST BE HALTED, BUT CONGRESS HAS CONSISTENTLY REFUSED TO VOTE A HALT TO THE DESTRUCTION OF THE LIVES OF NEGROES IN THE GHETTO. FIRST THE RENT SUPPLEMENT BILL WAS KILLED THEN THE MODEL CITIES PROPOSAL WAS DRASTICALLY CUT AND FINALLY EVEN A BILL WITH NO POLITICAL OR FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS, BUT GREAT HUMANITARIAN ASPECTS WAS LAUGHED OUT OF THE HOUSE AND CONGRESS REJECTED A SIMPLE BILL TO PROTECT OUR CITIES AGAINST RATS. THE SUICIDAL AND IRRATIONAL ACTS WHICH PLAGUE OUR STREETS DAILY ARE BEING SOWED AND WATERED BY THE IRRATIONAL, IRRELEVANT AND EQUALLY SUICIDAL DEBATE AND DELAY IN CONGRESS.

THIS IS AN EXAMPLE OF MORAL DEGREDATION. THIS HYPOCRICY AND CONFUSION SEEPING THROUGH THE FABRIC OF OUR SOCIETY CAN ULTIMATELY DESTROY FROM WITHIN THE VERY POSITIVE VALUES OF OUR NATION WHICH NO ENEMY COULD DESTROY FROM WITHOUT.

I DO NOT THINK WE ARE HELPLESS; WE ARE ONLY ACTING HELPLESSLY.

I SHOULD LIKE TO OFFER A SINGLE PROPOSAL THAT I AM CONVINCED WILL BE
AS EFFECTIVE AS IT IS JUST.

EVERY SINGLE OUT-BREAK WITHOUT EXCEPTION HAS SUBSTANTIALLY
EEEN ASCRIBED TO GROSS UNEMPLOYMENT, PARTICULARLY AMONG YOUNG
PEOPLE. IN MOST CITIES UNEMPLOYMENT OF NEGRO YOUTH IS GREATER
THAN THE UNEMPLOYMENT LEVEL OF THE DEPRESSION 30's

LET US DO ONE SIMPLE DIRECT THING -- LET US END UNEMPLOYME:IT TOTALLY AND IMMEDIATELY. IN THE DEPRESSION DAYS THE NATION WAS CLOSE TO PROSTRATE ON THE BRINK OF BANKRUPTCY, YET IT CREATED THE WPA TO MAKE MILLIONS OF JOBS INSTANTLY AVAILABLE FOR ALL EXISTING LEVELS OF SKILL. THE JOBS WERE TAILORED TO THE MAN, NOT THE MAN TO THE JOB IN RECOGNITION OF THE EMERGENCY. TRAINING FOLLOWED EMPLOYMENT, IT DID NOT PRECEDE IT AND BECOME AN OBSTACLE TO IT.

WHAT WE DID THREE DECADES AGO DURING AN ECONOMIC HOLOCAUST

CAN EASILY BE DONE TODAY IN THE COMFORT OF PROSPERITY.

I PROPOSE SPECIFICALLY THE CREATION OF A NATIONAL AGENCY THAT SHALL PROVIDE A JOB TO EVERY PERSON WHO NEEDS WORK YOUNG AND OLD, WHITE AND NEGRO. NOT ONE HUNDRED JOBS WHEN 10,000 ARE NEEDED. NOT SOME CHEAP WAY OUT.

NOT SOME FRUGAL DEVICE TO MAINTAIN A BALANCED BUDGET WITHIN AN UNBALANCED SOCIETY. I PROPOSE A JOB FOR EVERYONE, NOT A PROMISE TO SEE IF JOBS CAN BE FOUND.

THERE CANNOT BE SOCIAL PEACE WHEN A PEOPLE HAVE AWAKENED TO THEIR RIGHTS AND DIGNITY AND TO THE WRETCHEDNESS OF THEIR LIVES SIMULTANEOUSLY. IF OUR GOVERNMENT CANNOT CREATE JOBS, IT CANNOT GOVERN. IT CANNOT HAVE WHITE AFFLUENCE AMID BLACK POVERTY AND HAVE RACIAL HARMONY.

THE TURMOIL OF THE GHETTO IS THE EXTERNALIZATION OF THE NEGRO'S INNER TORMENT AND RAGE. IT HAS TURNED OUTWARD THE FRUSTRATION THAT FORMERLY WAS SUPPRESSED IN AGONY.

THE NEGRO KNOWS THAT A SOCIETY THAT IS ABLE TO PLAN INTERCONTINENTAL

WAR AND INTERPLANETARY TRAVEL IS ABLE TO PLAN A PLACE FOR HIM. IN

ITS CALLOUS REFUAL TO BE JUST THE CIVILIZED SOCIETY IS DRIVING A

WEDGE OF DESTRUCTIVE ALIENATION INTO THE HOPE OF HARMONY.

TRANQUILITY WILL NOT BE EVOKED BY PIOUS WORDS. TO DO TOO LITTLE IS AS INFLAMMATORY AS INCITING TO RIOT. DESPERATE MEN DO DESPERATE DEEDS. IT IS NOT THEY WHO ARE IRRATIONAL BUT THOSE WHO EXPECT INJUSTICE ETERNALLY TO BE ENDURED. I AM CONVINCED THAT A SINGLE DRAMATIC MASSIVE PROOF OF CONCERN THAT TOUCHES THE NEEDS OF ALL THE OPPRESSED WILL EASE RESENTMENTS AND HEAL ENOUGH ANGRY WOUNDS TO PERMIT CONSTRUCTIVE ATTITUDES TO EMERGE.

I REGRET THAT MY EXPRESSION MAY BE SHARP BUT I BELIEVE LITERALLY THAT THE LIFE OF OUR NATION IS AT STAKE HERE AT HOME. MEASURES TO PRESERVE IT NEED BE BOLDLY AND SWIFTLY APPLIED BEFORE THE PROCESS OF SOCIAL DISINTEGRATION ENGLIFS THE WHOLE OF SOCIETY.

MR. PRESIDENT, THIS IS AN EMERGENCY STATE AS SURELY AS WAS THE RECENT CRISIS IN THE RAILROADS OF OUR NATION. UNLESS CONGRESS CAN BE MOTIVATED TO ACT IMMEDIATELY UPON SOME CREATIVE AND MASSIVE PROGRAM TO END UNEMPLOYMENT, WE FACE THE POSSIBLE SPREAD OF THIS TRAGIC DESTRUCTION OF LIFE AND PROPERTY. I URGE YOU TO USE THE POWER OF YOUR OFFICE TO ESTABLISH JUSTICE IN OUR LAND BY ENACTING AND IMPLEMENTING LEGISLATION OF REASON AND VISION IN THE CONGRESS.

BE EASY TO GET CONCESSIONS FROM HIM.

THE SOURCE ADVISED THAT KING STATED THE WORST HAS NOT HAPPENED IN THIS COUNTRY CONCERNING RACIAL VIOLENCE PARTICULARLY IN SUCH PLACES AS CLEVELAND, OAKLAND AND PHILADELPHIA.

MARTIN LUTHER KING HELD HIS PRESS CONFERENCE AS SCHEDULED AT ELEVEN AM THIS DATE. HE ANNOUNCED THAT HE HAD SENT A TELEGRAM TO PRESIDENT JOHNSON CONCERNING THE RACIAL VIOLENCE. KING CHARGED THAT THE MAJOR CAUSE OF THE VIOLENCE WAS UNEMPLOYMENT AND THAT CONGRESS WAS GREATLY TO BLAME BECAUSE IT HAD KILLED LEGISLATION WHICH COULD HAVE RESOLVED SOME OF THE SOCIAL PROBLEMS INHERENT IN THE SITUATION. The following information has been supplied by confidential sources of this Bureau who have furnished reliable information in the past.

MRS On Suly 19, 1967, Stanley Levison, principal adviser to Martin Lather King, Jr., President, Southern Christian Leadership Conference, was in conference with Ann Jones, wife of Clarence Jones, another of King's advisers, concerning the recent racial disturbances. Mrs. Jones indicated that King is the best leader in the lphacivil rights movement and that the Negro masses will listen to him. Mrs. Jones stated that King should be informed of this.

Later that same day, Levison was in contact with King and indicated he was concerned about King's failure to make any public statement concerning the racial disturbances in the Newark, New Jersey, area. ~

King informed Levison that he had been considering making a statement but did not merely want to condemn the riots but must condemn the conditions which lead to riots. King indicated he was also concerned there will be more riots this summer as the weather gets hotter and he is particularly concerned 5 about the Chicago area.

Levison suggested that King advocate a program with dramatic qualities similar to the Works Project Administration of the 1930's. This new program would be implemented by the Federal Government to employ the jobless youth. Levison continued that this program worked in a period when the United States was almost bankrupt and should work even better now the the country is almost sick with money.

Johnson was familiar with the Works Project Administration and would be interested in the idea.

King agreed that Levison's idea had merit and he would publicly call upon the Federal Government to do something along this line. Levison suggested King make this announcement on a television program.

King agreed to discuss this matter with Levison again on July 22, 1967, before he takes any action in this regard.



Mrs. Jones has been identified as a Communist Party club member at Barah Lawrence College between 1947 and 1950. In the early 1950's, she was active in the Labor Youth League, a group which has been cited by the Attorney General of the United States pursuant to Executive Order 10450. In April, 1955, she was observed by Special Agents of this Bureau as the driver of a station wagon which was used on that date to transport Communist Party underground leaders in connection with an official Communist Party meeting. In 1956, she was described by a self-admitted communist as a "hard-core communist."

BACKGROUND:

recently Stanley Levison According to and Clarence Jones were in conference concerning the current racial situation. Both men have subversive backgrounds and are principal advisors to Martin Luther King, Jr., President, Southern Christian Leadership Conference. Levison stated that King believes the racial situation is very tense and that Chicago, Illinois, may be the next trouble spot. Jones replied he believes New York, New York, is seething with resentment about the current racial situation.

Levison then suggested that King do something about the situation in Cleveland, Ohio. Levison proposed that King should lead a march of 10,000 Negroes, each one of them carrying a brick or a bottle. They should march to Cleveland City Hall and dump the debris on the lawn of City Hall as a oldsymbol of protest to the racial situation. Jones agreed with N' Levison's idea and thought King would lead such a march.

They both agreed that they should meet with King in the near future in Atlanta to discuss any statements that are to be made in public by King.

Further, they agreed that under no circumstances should King be permitted to say anything without their approving it. Jones advised that he feels King should not be permitted to think for himself. Levison stated that King is such a slow thinker that he is usually not prepared to make a statement by himself without help.

Levison and Jones agreed to meet again in the nea future to continue their discussion in this regard.





The Gandhi Society for Human Rights was formed for the purpose of developing a philosophy and technique of non-violent civil rights protests. It is a non-action organization and makes no attempt to influence legislation nor participate in demonstrations. The Society furnishes legal assistance in certain civil rights cases. The organization was incorporated June 14, 1962.





### SOUTHERN CONFERENCE EDUCATIONAL FUND, INC.

"The Southern Patriot," a monthly publication, shows that it is published by the Southern Conference Educational Fund, Inc. (SCEF).

"The Southern Patriot" was cited as an "organ" of the Southern Conference for Human Welfare (SCHW) by the Committee on Un-American Activities, House Report 592, June 12, 1947.

The SCHW was cited as a communist front by the Committee on Un-American Activities, House Report 592, June 12, 1947.

An amendment to the charter of the SCHW dated April 26, 1946, changed the name of that organization to the SCEF, and listed its purpose as being to improve the educational and cultural standards of the Southern people in accordance with the highest American democratic institutions, traditions and ideals.

The SCEF is self-described as having deep roots in the South where it began as the educational wing of the SCHW, organized in 1938 to work for economic and political reform. When the SCHW disbanded in the late 1940's, SCEF continued as an independent organization, rallying support for integration and democracy and helping to stimulate and nurture new movements of the early 1960's. The SCEF maintained headquarters in Louisiana for twenty years, but in 1966 moved its headquarters to Louisville, Kentucky.

A source advised on March 2, 1961, that CLAUDE LIGHTFOOT, a Communist Party functionary, stated at a meeting of the Communist Party in Baltimore, Maryland, on February 25, 1961, that the Communist Party is not connected with any progressive movement but indirectly they do have some influence in the SCEF.

A second source, who is familiar with some phases of Communist Party activity in the New Orleans area, advised on June 8, 1966, that during the time that the SCHW was in existence members of the Communist Party were members of and worked actively in the SCHW; however, since the formation of the SCEF, Communist Party members have not been encouraged to work in the SCEF. The source stated that the SCEF is a progressive, liberal organization, which he considers a Communist Party front organization because it has gone along with the Communist Party on certain issues, particularly on the racial issue.

CARL BRADEN and ANNE BRADEN, Director and Associate Director respectively of the SCEF, were identified by ALBERTA AHEARN, 2311 Payne, Louisville, Kentucky, a self-admitted former member of the Communist Party, on December 13, 1954, in her testimony in Jefferson County, Kentucky, Court in the prosecution of CARL BRADEN under a state sedition statute as members of the Communist Party in Louisville, Kentucky, From January, 1951, to December, 1954.

A third source advised on May 28, 1965, that GEORGE MEYERS, a Communist Party functionary, expressed great admiration for CARL and ANNE BRADEN and the SCEF, with which they are affiliated, and expressed the view that the SCEF is the best organization in the South as far as doing effective work is concerned and that they have a better idea of what they are doing, where they are heading, and influence other organizations for the better.

The second source also advised on June 8, 1966, that many people who are officials and supporters of the SCRF, while liberal in their views, are by no means Communists.





The LYL has been designated pursuant to Executive Order 10450.

Clarence Jones is presently the General Council of the Gandhi Society for Human Rights, Incorporated, 15 East 40th Street, W. New York, New York.

The first source stated that Clarence Jones said to Stanley Levison that he had heard that the National Rifle Association was trying to attach a rider to a pending "anti-riot bill" now before the United States Congress. This rider would prohibit for a certain period of time the sale of firearms in an area in which a riot had occurred. Jones stated he believes this rider was aimed specifically at the Negro and was another "example of right wing reaction to the current racial situation."

Stanley Levison then stated that Martin Luther King, Chairman of the Southern Leadership Conference believes the racial situation is very tense and that Chicago, Illinois, may be the next trouble spot.

The first source continued that Jones added that he believes that New York is according to what he hears, just seething with resentment about the current racial situation.

The first source stated that Stanley Levison then suggested to Jones that Martin Luther King should do something about the situation in Cleveland, Ohio. Levison suggested that King lead a march of 10,000 Negroes, each one of them to carry a brick or a bottle and march to the Cleveland City Hall and dump the bricks and bottles on the lawn of City Hall as a symbol of protest to the racial situation. Jones said he completely agrees with Levison's suggestion and thinks that King would lead such a march.

The first source advised that Clarence Jones and Stanley Levison agreed upon the fact that there should be a meeting between them and Martin Luther King in Atlanta in the near future to discuss any statements that are to be made in public by King.

Stanley Levison and Clarence Jones agreed that under no circumstances should King be permitted to say anything without them approving it. Jones advised that he feels King should not be permitted to think for himself and Levison stated that King is such a slow thinker that he is usually not prepared to make statements by himself without help.

The first source advised that Stanley Levison and Clarence Jones agreed to meet again in the near future to continue the discussion of the aforementioned matter.





In July 19, 1967 a first confidential source who has furnished reliable information in the past advised he had learned that a conference had taken place that date between Martin Luther King, Jr., President of the Southern Christian Leadership Conference (SCLC), Joan Daves, a literary agent in New York City who is Martin Luther King's publisher's representative and Stanley Levison.



The first source advised that during the course of the aforementioned conference King mentioned that he was left \$11,000 by a man from Baltimore, Maryland who had recently died. Levison and Daves both advised King not to put the \$11,000 into the SCLC treasury but to keep the money himself.



The first source continued that King stated he was not concerned about building a big personal bank account but he did worry about his family's well-being.

The first source then stated that Levison said that he had heard that Hermine Popper (who has edited books published under King's authorship) has been making statements to the effect that she wrote King's books and has also said publicly "Martin Luther King can't write you know".

The first source stated that King, Levison and Daves all agreed about Hermine Popper should no longer be allowed to edit King's books in the future.

Levison then indicated that he was concerned about King's failure to make any statements dealing with the racial & disturbances in the Newark, New Jersey area.

King stated he had been considering the aforementioned and that he believes there will be more situations similar to Newark, New Jersey this summer and maybe they will be even worse in the month of August because it is hotter then. King advised he is very worried about the situation in Chicago, Illinois, and has been considering making a major statement about riots in Chicago and what our country is to do about them.

The first source stated that King further advised he cannot make a statement merely condemning riots but must condemn the conditions which lead to riots and the fact that not enough is done to better these conditions.

Levison suggests that King advocate a program with dramatic qualities such as suggesting that a program similar to the Works Progress Administration (WPA) of the 1930's be implemented by the Federal Government to employ jobless youths.

The first source stated that Levison continued by saying that the WPA program worked in the period when the United States was almost bankrupt and should work even better now when the country is "almost sick with money".

King stated he believes Levison's idea has merit and that he will call upon the Federal Government to do something about it. The first source stated that then Levison reminded King that President Lyndon B. Johnson is familiar with the activities of the WPA and will be interested in the idea.

King suggests that he will make a public announcement on the foregoing at a press conference. Levison according to the first source suggested to King that King utilize television to make any public announcement concerning his ideas.

The first source continued that Levison and King agreed to discuss in more detail matters concerning racial disturbances in the immediate future.





On July 10, 1967, a confidential source, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised that Stanley Levison, advisor to Martin Luther King, Jr., was in contact with Andrew Young, Executive Director of the Southern Christian Leadership Conference (SCLC) on that date concerning an article which appeared on page 38 of the New York Times" edition of Sunday, July 9, 1967. This article appeared under the headline "New Left Convention Next Month Will Seek Strategy to Defeat Johnson" and was authored by Donald Janson. The article reads in part as follows:

"CHICAGO, July 8 -- About 200 peace, civil rights and New Left student organizations are being invited to a convention here next month to devise strategy aimed at defeating President Johnson for re- delection.

"The convention is being called by the National Conference for New Politics, a liberal antiwar group based in New York City. The five-day meeting will be held at the Palmer House beginning Aug. 31. The keynote speaker at a rally in the Coliseum that night will be the Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr.

"Invitations to attend the convention were mailed this week to scores of national and local organizations. The call will be announced at a news conference here Monday.

"Advocates of a party headed by Dr. King and Dr. Benjamin Spock, the pediatrician who has been a leader of the peace movement, believe it would attract enought Negro and liberal votes to deny the President the electoral votes of some states in a close election".

Lewison advised Young that he had prepared a statement for release by Martin Luther King, Jr. commenting on this article. The text of the release as prepared by Lewison is as follows:

"In the Sunday Times of July 9th, a news story under a headline, "New Left Convention Next Month Will seek Strategy to Defeat Johnson', reports that I am to be the keynote speaker of its rally. The story also declares that one of the questions before the Convention will be whether to start a third party with myself as its Presidential Candidate. The article gives an unmistakable impression of my close association with the Convention and its deliberations. It would be extremely misleading and a distortion of my relationship to fail to correct



these impressions. I am solely related to the convention merely as a guest speaker at its mass rally. My presence there is not an endorsement of any decisions made by the Convention; in none of which shall I be participating. In addition to having no relationship to the general policy or strategy of the organization, I am specifically not involved with any plans to start a third party with myself as a Presidential Candidate. I excluded any such possibility last April and that decision remains unaltered. It would not be possible for the Convention to make plans concerning me since I am in no way subject to its decisions".

Young contended-that this statement went too far in that it appears to denounce the Convention. Lewison is of the opinion that separation not denunciation, is the theme and reitereated that a close association of King and this Convention will cause problems for King. Young agreed to furnish this statement to Donald Janson, the author of the original article and requested Janson to have the statement published in the "New York Times".

On July 11, 1967, a confidential source, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised that Martin Luther King, Jr. was in Conference with Chauncey Eskridge, Chicago attorney and advisor to the Southern Christian Leadership Conference and Stanley Levison, principal advisor to King, on

King asked Levison's advice concerning a proposed boxing match between Cassius Clay (Muhammad Ali), admitted Minister of the Nation of Islam (NOI) and former heavyweight boxing champion, and Jerry Quarry, a heavyweight boxer. match would be held in California and the proceeds would be donated to the SCLC according to a proposal made by Clay to Eskridge on July 11, 1967.

Levison advised King that this would be acceptable He pointed out that Clay is a Negro who is strongly opposed to the war in Vietnam and that in the public mind this would be the basis of their relationship. Levison pointed out that this was much more acceptable than King's decision to address a "New Left" Convention, since King could not be pictured in the press as a Black Muslim but will be pictured as being part of the New Left. King indicated he would accept Clay's offer.



Levison praised a book review of Kings book which appeared in the Washington Post and which impressed him greatly. King was gratified by this and indicated that the same review was in a Detroit newspaper and that he was acquainted with the review.

The same source advised that Stanley Levison was in conference with Harry Wachtel, New York advisor to King, later the same day concerning King and the SCLC. Wachtel was quite upset about the announcement that King was to be the keynote speaker at the "New Left" Convention in Chicago on August 31, 1967, and asked how this situation arose. Levison felt that the slanting of the release was the work of Donald Janson, "The New York Times" reporter whom Levison characterized as vicious. Levison stated that King was persuaded to speak at the convention by the husband of Ann Farnsworth since Ann Farnsworth has contributed \$100,000.00 to King and King was scheduled to be in Chicago at the time of the convention. Levison feels that King sold himself because of Farnsworth's contributions, but the Andrew Young, Executive Director of the SCLC, was also to blame.

Wachtel advised that Allen Boretz would be collecting for King this August at Fire Island, Long Island and at Greate Neck, Long Island in September.

The "Guide to Subversive Organizations and Publications," revised and published as of December 1, 1961, prepared and released by the Committee on Un-American Activities, United States House of Representatives, Washington, D.C., contained the following concerning the National Lawyers Guild:

Cited as a Communist front which 'is the foremost legal bulwark of the Communist Party, its front organizations, and controlled unions' and which 'since 'its inception has never failed to rally to the legal defense of the Communist Party and individual members thereof, including known espionage agents.'
  (Committee on Un-American Activities, House Report 3123 on the National Lawyers Guild, September 21, 1950, originally related September 17, 1950.)

# APPENDIX

### NATION OF ISLAM

In January, 1957, a source advised that ELIJAH MUHAMMAD has described his organization on a nationwide basis as the "Nation of Islam" and "Muhammad's Temples of Islam."

On April 29, 1966, a second source advised that, ELIJAH MUHAMMAD is the national leader of the Nation of Islam (NOI); Muhammad's Temple of Islam No. 2, 5335 South Greenwood Avenue, Chicago, Illinois, is the national headquarters of the NOI; and in mid-1960, MUHAMMAD and other NOI officials, when referring to MUHAMMAD's organization on a nationwide basis, commenced using either "Mosque" or "Temple" when mentioning one of "Muhammad's Temples of Islam."

The NOI is an all-Negro organization which was originally organized in 1930 in Detroit, Michigan.
MUHAMMAD claims to have been selected by ALIAH, the Supreme Being, to lead the so-called Negro race out of slavery in the wilderness of North America by establishing an independent black nation in the United States.

Members following MUHAMMAD's teachings and his interpretation of the "Koran" believe there is no such thing as a Negro, that the so-called Negroes are slaves of the white race, referred to as "white devils," in the United States; and that the white race, because of its exploitation of the so-called Negroes, must and will be destroyed in the approaching "War of Armageddon."

In the past, officials and members of the NOI, including MUHAMMAD, have refused to register under the provisions of the Selective Service Acts and have declared that members owe no allegiance to the United States.

# NATION OF ISLAM (CONT'D)

On May 5, 1958, the first source advised that MUHAMMAD had, upon advice of legal counsel, tempered his personal statements and instructions to his ministers concerning the principles of his organization in order to avoid possible prosecution by the United States Government, however, he did not indicate any fundamental changes in the teachings of his organization.

On May 2, 1966, a third source advised that MUHAMMAD had, early in July, 1958, decided to de-emphasize the religious aspects of the teachings of Islam and to stress the economic benefits to be derived by those Negroes who joined the NOI. This policy change according to MUHAMMAD, would help him acquire additional followers and create more interest in his programs.

The most notable contrast on the program was the differences shown between the views of Martin Luther King and such militant Negroes as Stokely Carmichael, head of the Student Non-Violent Coordinating Committee (SNCC) and Daniel Watts, publisher of the Negro magazine "Liberator."

King spoke out against "minority Negroes" who advocated violence and black power, and stated that while he expected the various protests to continue, he hoped they would not become violent. Watts denounced liberal whites who proposed integration and the "house niggers" such as King, Roy Wilkins and Whitney Young. He termed King as a new form of black entertainment for white people. Congressman Adam Clayton Powell (D-New York) declared King was going through an agonizing reappraisal, that King did not understand black power - did not know its meaning. Daniel P. Moynihan, author of the Moynihan Report on Negroes, described King as much closer to the Negro people than any other Negro leader.

According to the article, Clark, defeated Sheriff of Dallas County, Ala., blamed his defeat on Martin Luther King, Jr. and Stokely Carmichael, who according to Clark "showed up in Selma last month for the purposing of defeating me." Clark also stated, "The whole plan was drawn up by the Central Committee of the Communist Party...."





On June 23, 1967, advised a representative of the Federal Bureau of Investigation that Dr. Martin Luther King, President, Southern Christian Leadership Conference (SCLC), and Al Raby, Convener, Coordinating Council of Community Organizations (CCCQ), arrived at approximately 3:30 p.m. on such date at the scene of the civil rights tent-in demonstrations being staged at Warrenville, recalled that SCIC and CCCO, who together compose the Chicago Freedom Movement, are currently staging the tent-in demonstration at Warrenville, Illinois, in protest of the proposed construction of an atomic accelerator by the Atomic Energy Commission (ABC), at Weston, Illinois, two miles from Warrenville, since the failure of the Illinois State Legislature to pass a state-wide open occupancy law.

According to Dr. King arrived on the scene by helicopter and remained at the tent-in site for approximately 15 to 20 minutes. Dr. King addressed the approximately 30 persons assembled at the tent-in and lent his moral support to the demonstrators.

The Chicago Sun Times Four Star Final, June 24, 1967, carried an article on page 46 entitled Tr. King Visits Weston: Tent-In; Sees Rights Legislation Brosion. The article relates that Dr. King during a visit to the site of the tent-in demonstration at Warrenville, Illinois, on June 23, 1967, declared that the Federal Government is allowing inroads on existing civil rights legislation. He also deplored at such time the failure of the Illinois State Legislature to pass fair housing legislation, He encouraged the demonstrators to continue their protest and said they were protesting "a grave injustice the Federal Government could rectify." If the Federal Government approves the Weston nuclear installation without a Federal - State Housing Bill, "it will further emasculate the 1964 Civil Rights Act. We feel absolutely that Weston should not be chosen for the site because the state has not passed a fair housing bill. We are very disappointed with the callousness of the State Legislature in dealing with the problem of open occupancy."



On June 24, 1967, advised that hope and seed that hope and seed that hope approximately 175 demonstrators had gathered at the tent-in site preparatory to marching to Weston, Illinois, to protest the lack of open housing legislation in Illinois. Al Raby, Convener, CCCO, Reverend Emery Davis, Evanston, Illinois, and Father William Hogan, Chicago, all known local civil rights advocates, were in attendance. Dr. Martin Luther King, who had visited the site of the tent-in on June 23, 1967, was not present.

The protest march, which had been scheduled, ended at approximately 4:30 p.m., after marching the two miles from the tent-in site in Warrenville, Illinois, to Weston, Illinois.

A brief rally was held at the proposed AEC atomic accelerator site with various civil rights leaders voicing critisms of Illinois' failure to pass open housing legislation. The marchers then returned to the tent-in area at approximately 6:30 p.m. with the majority disbanding at the site.

advised on June 24, 1967, that there had been no incidents, arrests, or disturbances connected with the civil rights activities on that date and that the area was calm without any indication of potential violence. declared, however, that he overheard one of the demonstrators urging news media representatives on the scene to state that in excess of 800 marchers participated in the rally. An unidentified news representative stated he would go no higher than 350.

further related at such time that following the march and demonstration at Weston, Illinois, by civil rights advocates, Weston Mayor, Arthur Theriault, held a press conference at which time he criticized the demonstration as unnecessary, pointing out Weston has local fair housing ordinances and observing that marching was no way to obtain the desired results.

advised that the demonstration at weston, Illinois, was continuing with approximately 12 persons encamped at Warrenville, Illinois, in four tents. The area continues to be quiet and peaceful with no disturbances anticipated by local authorities at the present time.

The Chicago Tribune Three Star Final Edition, June 25, 1967, carried an article on page 10, Section 1, entitled, "Negro Ministers Plan Talks on Job Program. The article related that SCIC had announced on June 24, 1967, that it called a national conference of Negro ministers to meet in Chicago, July 10 through 12 to plan a nation-wide program similar to Operation Bread Basket. Operation Bread Basket, according to this article, is an SCIC program which pressures employers to hire more Negroes.



The delegation visited 15 representatives, Senator John O. Pastore, Democrat. Rhode Island, Vice-President Hubert H. Humphrey and the AEC. Finley declared upon returning to Chicago on June 27, 1967, that the delegation may return to Washington, D. C. at some future date in order to continue their lobby against approval of funds for planning the atom smasher.



The "Los Angeles Times", a daily newspaper published in Los Angeles, California, in its issue of June 26, 1967 on page I-2 quoted Dr. King as saying that the Los Angeles police were "unnecessarily brutal" to anti-Vietnam war protestors during President Johnson's visit to the Century Plaza Hotel in Los Angeles on June 23, 1967. Although Dr. King said that he did not know enought to "comment intelligently" he added that the police showed a "kind of vindictivness".



The chicago Freedom Movement (CFM), which consists of the Southern Christian Leadership Conference (SCLC) and the CCCO, had previously announced plans to stage a tent-in in the Weston, Illinois, area to protest the selection of such site by the Atomic Energy Commission (AEC) as the location for the AEC's new atomic accelerator. Albert Raby, Convenor of CCCO, acted as spokesman for the CFM in announcing such tent-in protesting the failure of the Illinois State Legislature to pass a state-wide open housing law which would insure equal housing opportunities for Negroes who might be employed at the new AEC site.

The CCCO is an amalgamation of approximately 30 Chicago area civil rights organizations and has been active in staging civil rights demonstrations in the past in the Chicago area.

SCLC, which together with CCCO comprises the CFM, is the Atlanta based civil rights organization headed by Dr. Martin Luther King, the well-known civil rights advocate and Negro leader.

declared that, according to information b7(D) available to him, Al Raby indicated he would attempt to obtain a new site for the propsed tent-in in view of the decision by the Sisters of Cenacle to rescind their previously given permission.

On June 22. 1967.

advised that the Sisters of Cenacle had reconsidered their decision withdrawing approval bof the use of land adjacent to their retreat house in Warrenville, Illinois, for use by the CFM in its proposed tent-in and had now given final permission for the utilization of their land for the tent-in demonstration.

declared that the decision to permit the CFM to use the land owned by the Sisters of Cenacle was reached after a meeting between Albert Raby and Monsignor F. R. Stenger, a dean of the Joliet diocese, in the offices of the Catholic Interracial Council, 21 West Superior, Chicago, Illinois.





approval of the site." Raby then announced that on Thursday, June 22, 1967, a small group of Negros and whites will travel to the Weston area and conduct a "tent-in" to dramatize the failure of the legislature to pass a law guaranteeing open housing opportunities for everyone.


Raby revealed that the tent-in will be held on land owned by the Sisters of the Cenacle Convent in Warrenville, Illinois, with the approval of the convent. On June 24, 1967, at 2:30 p.m. the CCCO will hold a rally at the designated plant site, which rally according to Raby will be addressed by Reverend Martin Luther King, President, SCLC. Dr. King is scheduled to join the demonstration after the tent-in begins on June 22, 1967.

Additionally, Raby declared the CCCO intends to send a large delegation of civil rights workers and religious and civic leaders to Washington, D. C., in order to encourage Senator John O. Pastore, Democrate Rhode Island, a selfacknowledged opponent of the Weston site, in his fight against final approval of such location.

On June 21, 1967.

advised that sources available to him indicated that although Raby had announced a tent-in demonstration in the Weston area protesting the lack of an Illinois open housing law, it was unlikely that there would be any mass participation by Chicago area civil rights organizations in such demonstration. He declared that very little organizational effort had been conducted by Raby in order to secure mass participation in the demonstration; and estimated that probably less than 25 individuals, both Negro and white, would participate in the demonstration.

further stated that he knew no information indicating that there would be any violence connected with such demonstration.

Additionally, at the press conference on June 20, 1967, Al Raby stated he had been in touch at 3:00 a.m. on such morning with Dr. Martin Luther King, President of SCLC, by telephone and intended to recontact him later in the day. Raby revealed the purpose of the contact was to propose direct action against High-Low Food Stores if an injunction prohibiting picketing at High-Low

Stores were issued by the courts. Raby declared that the picketing of the High-Low Stores was related to SCLC's "Operation Breadbasket", which seeks to obtain jobs for qualified Negroes.

Reference is made to memorandum dated April 20, 1967, concerning Reverend Mitchell and memorandum dated April 27, 1967, concerning Operation Crescent.

On June 20, 1967, a source advised that the officers of the North Star United Missionary Workers of America (NSUMWA) and officers of Operation Crescent (OC) held a press conference at the Sherman House Hotel, Room 114, Chicago, Illinois, on June 20, 1967.

On April 19, 1967, Reverend Henry Mitchell held a Chicago press conference at which time he stated that he was the president of the NSUMWA and declared his missionary workers are encouraging low income and relief families to "take it easy this summer." At the press conference Reverend Henry Mitchell condemned Martin Luther King and described King as "an outsider who does not know the problems of Chicago. I suggest Dr. King get the hell out of here."

Source advised Thomas Simon Sutton is the President of Operation Crescent, whose avowed purposes are to oppose Open Housing and Open Occupancy in Chicago and Western suburbs of Chicago, Illinois. Source stated Sutton claims OC represents some 20 home owners associations in Chicago.

Source advised that press conference held by NSUMWA and OC on June 20, 1967, was for the purpose of advising the press of the installation of a "Hot Line."

Source stated the "Hot Line" as described at the press conference is a system of notification to call various individuals in Chicago and nearby suburbs who are interested in the fight against Open Housing and Open Occupancy. According to source the "Hot Line" will permit prompt notification to all interested sindividuals of any contemplated civil rights marches or demonstrations in Chicago and Western suburbs by civil rights workers or organizations.

Source advised on June 20, 1967, that Reverend' Henry Mitchell of NSUMWA and Thomas Simon Sutton of OC would be connected with the "Hot Line."

Source further advised that John Pelligrini, President, Citizens for Cicero-Berwyn (CCB) and Steve Telow also an officer of the CCB would with Matt Luparlo, representing Murray Park Home Owners Association (MPHOA) also have access to the "Hot Line."

Source advised that the "Hot Line" would connect the following areas of Chicago and Western suburbs:

Source advised the above suburbs of Chicago, Illinois, included the areas of racial tension during the summer and fall of 1966. Source stated the areas covered by the "Hot Line" were subjected to demonstrations in the summer and fall of 1966, which were sponsored by the SCLC directed by Reverend Martin Luther King.

Source stated that Sutton and Mitchell indicated at the press conference on June 20, 1967, that the "Hot Line" system would be extended and employed to bring to prompt stiention of both colored and white factions immediate problems arising from racial disturbances and demonstrations. Sutton and Mitchell advised at press conference that it was their hope that installation of "Hot Line" would serve to permit responsible leaders of both colored and white factions an opportunity to discuss problems and avoid violence and demonstrations.

Source indicated that Reverend Henry Mitchell who is of the colored race has publicly asserted his belief that civil rights marches in white areas of Chicago and suburbs of Chicago are destructive and precipitate hats.

Source further advised that Pelligrini and Telow have worked with Sutton in opposing Open Occupancy in Illinois, and specifically in Chicago and Western suburbs of Chicago.

The Two Star edition of the "Chicago Tribune" published Wednesday, June 21, 1967, at Chicago, Illinois, Section 2, Page 11, contains a news article captioned "Critic Of King Joins Unit To Prevent Riots."

Article indicated Reverend Henry Mitchell, President of the MSUMWA, which he said represents more than 60 Negro churches and 50,000 persons throughout the State, advised that he has joined forces with OC, a white organization, in an effort to prevent racial violence.

News article indicated the "Not Line" was described by Sutton, President of OC, as a means of allowing white and Negro leaders to inform each other when tensions form and demonstrations and riots are a possibility.

According to news article Sutton stated that upon receiving such information an emergency meeting will be called of specific leaders of the area concerned to take steps at ence to forestall or limit the trouble by joint action.

News article indicated that Reverend Mitchell stated that last year "we lost much more than we gained from demonstrations, rioting, vandalism, looting and arsen."

#### Communist Influence in Racial Matters

On June 22, 1967, a confidential source, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised that Stanley Levison, advisor to Martin Luther King, Jr., was in contact on that date with Mike Miller of the Ford Foundation concerning civil rights matters.

Miller noted that he was optimistic concerning the Ford Foundation grant to the Congress of Racial Equality (CORE) to sponsor the operations of CORE in Cleveland, Ohio. This grant will amount to \$300,000.00 spread out over two years. Miller was happy over the recent civil rights summit meeting and mentioned that Whitney Young, Executive Director of the Urban League, had warned King and Floyd McKissick, Director of CORE, not to make any anti-Johnson Administration speeches while in Cleveland, Ohio, noting that Young was very close to the Johnson Administration.

Levison assured Miller that there would be no friction between the Cleveland ministers who have been working with King and the people from CORE in Cleveland. Levison was also of the opinion that the reports of a plot to assassinate Whitney Young and Roy Wilkins, Executive Secretary of the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People (NAACP), by Negro extremists would not increase the white back-lash since the actions of that group was beyond the understanding of rational people.

A confidential source, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised on June 19, 1967, that Joan Daves, publisher's representative for Martin Luther King's latest book, "Where Do We Go From Here?", and Stanley Levison, King's principal advisor, were in contact on that date concerning the book. Daves wanted to apprise Levison of a reception planned for that afternoon at 5:45 p.m. at the New York Hilton Hotel, New York, New York, the purpose being to afford King an opportunity to meet representatives of Harper Publishers, the publishers of his book. Although only eight people were to astend, Daves invited Levison to the reception. She said Harry would also be there.

According to Daves, following the reception, King and Belafonte were scheduled to appear on the Merv Griffin television show, a Metromedia production on Channel 5 in 🏖 New York.

"The New York Times", Tuesday, June 20, 1967, on page 25, an article captioned "Dr. King Deplores 'Long Cold Winter' on the Rights Front" appeared. 
