
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
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

Date June 22, 1969

Attached sets forth information received from highly sensitive New York source concerning contact between Stanley Levison and Harry Wachtel. Levison was advisor to Martin Luther King, Jr., and as late as 1964 identified as secret CP member. Harry Wachtel is New York attorney and advisor to Southern Christian Leadership Conference, organization founded by King.

Discussion between Levison and Wachtel relates to special coverage by the FBI including coverage of King. Wachtel mentioned he had talked to Clark (apparently former Attorney General Ramsey Clark) concerning this special coverage. Teletype indicates Levison to meet with James Wechsler, New York newspaper columnist.

Due to nature of source and material contained in teletype, no dissemination being made.



You will recall that captioned individual has bitterly attacked the Bureau relative to wire taps on Martin Luther King, Jr. In recent articles, Rowan has attempted to express indignation that King was in any way a national security risk and has painted King more or less as an heroic figure.

In this connection it is interesting to note that Rowan in an article entitled 'Martin Luther King's Tragic Decision" (Reader's Digest, September, 1967.) presents a different viewpoint relative to King. In this article Rowan is critical of King for King's decision to oppose American participation in the Vietnam War. Rowan summarizes the accomplishments of King in the civil rights field and is commendatory. Rowan said that he first met King in late 1955 and was cognizant of King's leadership in efforts to gain equal justice for Negroes. Why then did King link his civil rights feats with an attack on the Vietnam War?

Rowan, in a section of the article entitled "The Halo Slips," says:
"But, inexplicably, something began to happen after a while. King seemed to develop an exaggerated appraisal of how much he and his crisis techniques were responsible for the race-relations progress that had been made." Rowan states that Negroes had begun to grow uneasy about King. He no longer seemed to be a selfless leader. He dramatically had himself arrested and then was out of jail in two days. King rejected the advice of his civil rights friends. Some said it was a matter of ego, that he was convinced that he was the most influential Negro in the United States. Rowan now adds:

"Others revived a more sinister speculation that had been whispered around Capitol Hill and in the nation's newsrooms for more than two yearstalk of communists influencing the actions and words of the young minister. This talk disturbed other civil-rights leaders more than anything else.

"I report this not to endorse what King and many others will consider a 'guilt by association' smear, but because of the threat that these allegations represent to the civil-rights movement. When King was simply challenging

Jim Crow, murmurings that he was associating with, or influenced by, 'enemies of the United States' had only limited impact. Most Congressmen and editors knew that American Negroes did not need a communist to tell them that they disliked being herded into the rear of buses, the balconies of theaters, the back doors of restaurants or a ramshackle school across the briar patch. But now that King has become deeply involved in a conflict where the United States is in direct combat with communists, the murmurings are likely to produce powerfully hostile reactions. They cannot help but imperil chances of passage of the civilrights bill that would protect civil-rights workers in the South and make housing discrimination illegal."

Rowan concludes that it is a tragic irony that King, in his denunciation of the Vietnam War, would raise any doubt about the Negroes' loyalty to his country. Copy of article is attached.

Martin Luther King's Tragic Decision

BY CARL T. ROWAN

What has caused him to jeopardize, by his ill-advised pronouncements on Vietnam, the movement he has so ably served? Another distinguished Negro looks at the man and his motives.

April 4, the Rev. Martin Luther King stood in New York City's Riverside Church and delivered the most scathing denunciation of U.S. involvement in Vietnam ever made by so prominent an American. He labeled the United States "the greatest purveyor of violence in the world today" and accused it of "cruel manipulation of the poor." He said that the people of Vietnam "watch as we poison their water, as we kill a million acres of their crops."

He stated that U.S. troops "may

have killed a million South Vietnamese civilians—mostly children." He said that American soldiers "test out our latest weapons" on the peasants of South Vietnam "just as the Germans tested out new medicine and new tortures in the concentration camps of Europe." He accused President Johnson of lying about peace overtures from Hanoi, and jurged Americans to become "conscientious objectors."

Reaction across the nation and around the world was immediate and explosive. Radios Moscow and Peking picked up King's words and

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spread them to distant capitals. In the White House, a Presidential aide shouted, "My God, King has given a speech on Vietnam that goes light down the commic line!". The sidem Johnson, reading the wire the evace reports, this hed with ranger.

Civil-rights leaders wrung their hands and began to plan steps to take the already splintered movement for Negro condity out from under the onus of King's broadside. Such prominent Negroes as Roy Wilkins, executive director of the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People, Ralph Bunche, Nobel Prize-winning United Nations under-secretary, and Sen. Edward Brooke disagreed publicly with King. The directors of Freedom Flouse called the program that King advocated "demagogic and irresponsible in its attack on our government." The Washington Post, long a supporter of King, said, Dr. King has done a grave injury to the great struggle to remove ancient abuses from our public life. He has diminished his usefulness to his cause, to his country and to his people."

What sort of person is this man who has been awarded a Nobel

CARL T. Rowan, director of the U.S. Information Agency from February 1964 to September 1955, now writes a syndicated column for more than 100 newspapers in the United States and abroad. He is also a radio and TV commentator for the Westinghouse Broadcasting Co. As director of USIA, he was the first Negro to attend meetings of the National Security Council and of the President's cabinet.

Peace Prize and denounced as a knave, all within three years? What do Martin Luther King and his recent actions mean to the nation and to the scaring disputes that now rend the civil rights movement?

Sind by Fighters. To understand King's unique position in American life, we must go back to January 15, 1929, when Michael Luther King, Jr., was born in a comfortable 13-room house in Atlanta, Ga. His father and his maternal grandfather, the Rev. A. D. Williams, had become, via Ebenezer Baptist Church, two of the great preachers of the South.

* By the time "Little Mike" was six (when his father changed both their names to that of the leader of the Protestant Reformation), he was well aware of the racial struggle around him. Grandisther Williams had been an early leader of Georgia's chapter of the NAACP. His father fought for equal salaries for Negro teachers and to abolish the Jim Crow elevators in the Atlanta courthouse. And young Martin soon knew at firsthand the hurt and humiliation of discrimination. He has recalled as one of his angriest hours a bus ride from Macon to Atlanta, when a bus driver called him and his teacher "black sons of bitches" because they were slow in surrendering their seats to white passengers.

A bright, sensitive student, King entered Atlanta's Morehouse College at 15, toying with the notion of becoming a lawyer or doctor. There

he read Thoreau's "Essay on Civil Disobedience," and became convinced that he had to involve himself in social protest, and that only through the ministry could be function effectively. From Morchouse, King went to Crozer Theological Semmary, in Chester, Pan where a lecture on Mohandas Gandhi led him to devour every book and article written about India's great leader of non-violent protest.

The thinking of Gandhi and Thoreau was still burning inside King when I first met him, late in 1955. He was then involved in his first major test of nonviolence and civil disabedience in the Deep South, On December 1 of that year, a Negro seamstress, Mrs. Rosa Parks, had boarded

a bus in Montgom- The Rev. Martin Luther King, Jr. the grudging admiery, Ala., where King had recently become pastor of the Dexter Avenue Baptist Church. When the driver ordered Negroes to stand so that whites could sit, Mrs. Parks refused and was arrested. Within hours, Negroes had launched a 99-percent efrective boycott that threatened to ruin the bus line.

As a reporter for the Minneapolis Tribune, I went to Montgomery and was permitted to sit in on the strategy sessions of the Negro leaders. King's gift of articulatoness, his apparent lack of personal ambition, his willingness to stand up to toughitalking city officials made him the inatural leader of the movement. The city arrested 115 Negro religious and political leaders; a bomb exploded on King's from porch, But the boycott held firm for 382 tense days, and led to the U.S. Supreme Court decision outlawing bus segregation. The Negroes of Montgomery

had won a great victory, and Martin Luther King was world-famous.

"Breastplate of Righteousness." How did King rise to the pinnacle? He had charisma-a down-to-earth sincerity, an ability to wear the mantle of the church in such a way as to suggest a special closeness to God. He won

ration of white Americans and the support of millions of foreigners through his dignity, his willingness to take verbal abuse, to go to jail quietly—and to turn the other cheek in the process—in order to achieve his goals. He seemed impervious to provocation. He earned the reputation of a selfless leader whose devotion and wisdom were larger than

When a group of badgered, beaten Negroes in Gadsden, Ala., were on the verge of violence, King asked them to put down their arms. "Get the weapon of non-violence, the breastplate of righteousness, the armor of truth, and just keep marching," he pleaded. They did. And when the young minister said to whites, "We will match your capacity to inflict suffering with our capacity to endure suffering. We will not hate you, but we cannot in all good conscience obey your unjust laws," he disarmed many who held latent hostility toward the Negro.

"There is no arrogance about him, no intellectual posturing," reported the New York Times in 1961. "He voices no bitterness against the whites who have handled him roughly." If he became involved in crisis after crisis—the restaurant sit-in in Atlanta in 1960; demonstrations in Albany, Ga., in 1961; the explosive Birmingham protests of 1963; the Selma, Ala., march of 1954—it was because, as one of his aides said, "You've got to have a crisis to bargain with. To take a moderate approach, hoping to get white help, doesn't work."

The Halo Slips. But, inexplicably, something began to happen after a while. King seemed to develop an exaggerated appraisal of how much he and his crisis techniques were responsible for the race-relations progress that had been made.

He could, indeed, make a pretty convincing argument that it was the crisis he and his followers precipitated in Birmingham in 1963 that capped the Negrob revolution and

won the support necessary for the passage of the civil-rights laws of 1964 and 1965. But other Negro leaders, while not belittling demonstrations, argued that the Negro could never forgo a reliance on the law. They pointed out that Negroes might still be walking instead of riding buses in Montgomery had the lawyers not won their case in the Supreme Court. They said that the Negro had to continue to seek strong legislation and just court decisions. They argued that the cause required a shrewd, sometimes sophisticated wooing of public opinion.

Negroes had, in fact, begun to grow uneasy about King. He no longer seemed to be the selfiess leader of the 1950's. There was grumbling that his trips to jail looked like publicity stunts. When arrested in Albany, Ga., in 1961, he had declared dramatically that he would stay behind bars until the city desegregated public facilities. Two days later, he was out on bail. In St. Augustine, Fla., after getting Negroes fired up for massive demonstrations, he went to jail amid great fanfare. But two days later he was bailed out again, so he could receive an honorary degree at Yale University.

Sinister Murmurings. King really gave both critics and admirers serious cause for concern in 1965, when he began to talk about foreign policy. In July of that year, he told a Los Angeles group that the issues of racial injustice, poverty and war are "inextricably bound together."

When advisers expressed doubts about the wisdom of linking the three, he retorted: "One cannot be just concerned with civil rights. It is very nice to drink milk at an unsegregated lunch counter—but not when there is strontium 90 in it."

A month later, he announced that he intended to write President Ho Chi Minh of North Vietnam, and the leaders of South Vietnam, Russia and the United States in an effort to move the war to the conference table.

Then, in September 1965, he called on Arthur Goldberg, chief U.S. delegate to the United Nations, and urged the United States to press for a U.N. scat for Communist China. Also, he asked for a halt in American air strikes on North Vietnam, and he recommended negotiations with the Vietnong. At this point, even some of his strongest supporters began to demur.

The New York Herald Tribune said: "Dr. King is already committed to a massive, unfinished task in an area in which he has great influence. He can only dissipate that influence by venturing into fields that are strange to him." In a harsher comment, liberal columnist Max Freedman asked, "Is he casting about for a role in Vietnam because the civil-rights struggle is no longer adequate to his own estimate of his i talents?" NAACP leader Roy Wilkins, Whitney Young, executive director of the Urban League, Socialist leader Norman Thomas, and Bayard Rustin, a chief planner of the great civil-rights march on Washington in 1963 and himself a pacifist, all pleaded in vain with King not to wade into the Vietnam controversy.

Why did King reject the advice of his old civil-rights colleagues? Some say it was a matter of ego—that he was convinced that since he was the most influential Negro in the United States, President Johnson would have to listen to him and alter U.S. policy in Vietnam. Others revived a more sinister speculation that had been whispered around Capitol Hill and in the nation's newsrooms for more than two years—talk of communists influencing the actions and words of the young minister. This talk disturbed other civil-rights leaders more than anything else.

I report this not to endorse what King and many others will consider a "guilt by association" smear, but because of the threat that these allegations represent to the civilrights movement. When King was simply challenging Jim Crow, murmurings that he was associating with, or influenced by, "enemies of the United States" had only limited impact. Now Spring King answered his critics. He had become convinced,. he said in his April 4 speech at New York's Riverside Church, that America would never invest the necessary funds or energies in rehabilitation of its poor "so long as adventures like Victnam continue to draw men and skills and money like some demonic destructive suction tube." He told the Riverside audience that "We are taking black young men who have been crippled by our society and sending them 8000 miles away to guarantee liberties in Southeast Asia which they have not found in southwest Georgia and East Harlem."

The latter is an old cry that some Negroes have uttered in every American war. But in no conflict has a Negro with King's prestige urged Negroes to shun battle because they have nothing to fight for. King must have assumed that the "new Negro," full of frustration as he is, would be sympathetic to this argument. But a recent Harris survey showed that almost one of every two Negroes believes that King is wrong—and another 27 percent reserved judgment.

I find this opposition to King remarkable considering the amount of emotion and anger involved in the

Negro revolution. It suggests that most Negroes are proud of the integrated performance of colored GIs in Vietnam; that most Negroes still think of America as their country and do not want to seem unpatriotic.

Beyond doubt, King's speech at Riverside Church and his subsequent remarks have put a new strain and new burdens on the civil-rights movement. He has become persone non grata to Lyndon Johnson, a fact that he may consider of no conse-Jquence. It is also likely that his former friends in Congress will never again listen to or be moved by him the way they were in the past. This, too, may not bother King. But it can make the difference between poverty and well-being for millions of Negroes who cannot break the vicious circle of poverty and unpreparedness that imprisons them unless the President provides leadership and Congress provides the · circle-breaking programs and laws.

Martin Luther King has alienated many of the Negro's friends and armed the Negro's foes, in both parties, by creating the impression that the Negro is disloyal. By urging Negroes not to respond to the draft or to fight in Vietnam, he has taken a tack that many Americans of all races consider utterly irresponsible.

It is a tragic irony that there should be any doubt about the Negro's loyalty to his country—especially doubt created by Martin Luther King, who has helped as much as any one man to make America truly the Negro's country, too.

With regard to the technical surveillance and investigation of the late Martin Luther King. Ir., I note that copies of the material were sent to Carl T. Rowan, then Director of the United States Information Agency. I further note that the material, particularly the over-all summary memorandum of December 21, 1964, was widely distributed to representatives in the Government agencies. I think there should be greater discrimination relative to the dissemination of highly confidential material. Certainly Rowan, even though he was Director of the United States Information Agency, should never have been furnished with this material in view of his known racist activities. I note the same material was disseminated to Dr. Leland J. Hayworth of the National Science Foundation. I do not understand why he should have been included on the list for dissemination, as certainly King's activities did not fall within the area of his Foundation.

Please initiate immediately a re-evaluation of the dissemination of our highly sensitive and confidential information.

Wiretapping Dr. King

On page 27 of your June 5 issue is a report of testimony by an F.B.I. agent that Martin Luther King's telephone had been tapped for a number of years before his death. I may be naive, but I was shocked by the disclosure of continuing electronic surveillance of one of the country's greatest and most respected leaders. Entirely apart from the patent illegality of this wiretapping, it is deeply disturbing that someone like Dr. King, who himself could have been thought "subversive" only by the most fertile imaginings of bigoted minds, was subjected to systematic invasions of his privacy.

What reasons could there have been for this continued wiretapping? Do the same reasons apply to all controversial public figures? Who authorized this surveillance? It is still unclear, to my knowledge, whether Attorneys General Kennedy and Katzenbach gave such authorization. Ramsey Clark has said that no electronic surveillance of Dr. King was authorized during his term as Attorney General, and has called "out-rageous" any implication that spersons in the Department of Justice thought that Dr. King was a national security risk. If so, does the F.B.I. engage in such systematic incursions on its own initiative?

Should the surveillance prove to be, in fact, as outrageous as it appears on the limited information we now have, are there any institutional safeguards in the Justice Department to see that similar cases do not recur? If the public is to retain even a modicum of confidence in the willingness of the F.B.I. and the Justice Department to be responsive to the most elemental civil liberties, someone needs to provide an answer to these questions.

It is Time for J. Edgar Hoover to Go

A society is never in more perit than when the people lose the ability to identify a genuine threat to personal liberty.

This society is in a lot of peril if we may judge from the public reaction—or lack of it to couriroom admissions of a variety of illegal FBI wireless and buggings of homes and hotel rooms.

A Justice Department official acknowledged in Federal District Court that Dr. Martin Listing King was under electronic surveillance in 1961 and 1965, and the FBI agent was purpervised this surveillance half the court "it was my understanding that it went on

King's phones were tapped, his hotel rooms bugged, and he was personally shadowed right up to the time he was slain in Memphis on April 4, 1963.

Another FBI agent, C. Barry Pickett, told the court in Houston, Texas, that for four solid years he had listened eight hours a day, five days a week, to the conversations of Elijah Minammud, kader of the Black Muslims. Pickett employed both a telephone wireland and a microphone planted in Muhammad's houst.

These cases of activate avesdropping, which violate both federal law and a presidential executive order, were discussed in a bearing on for-

mer heavyweight boxing champion Cassius Clay's effort to overturn a live-year prison sentence for his refusal to be drafted

These buggings, which caught some Clay conversations in their "net," are but a fraction of the illegal wiretaps that have moved this country for closer to a police state than most Americans realize.

Why the bland, indifferent reaction on the part of most Americans?

First, there is the general FBI justification for such tactics: "national security."

Former Attorney General Ramsey Clark, who states emphatically that the FBI had no authority to wiretap or bug Dr. King, asserts that "the implication that people thought Dr. King was a security threat is outrageous."

Still, that term "national security" is more powerful than "motherhood," for it evokes fear, and men still surrender more things — including liberty — out of fear than they do out of love.

The parting thing about Clark's simple ment is that he acts as though he is surprised to hear of the wiretapping and bugging of Dr. King. Could Clark possibly have been unaware that FEI officials were going before congressional committees and partly justifying larger appropriations by

tidilating some congressmen and feeding anti-King ammunition to Scutherners who despised the civil rights leader — all by way of revealing "tidbits" picked up through the wiretaps and buggings?

Was Clark unaware that certain FBI officials were roaming the country leaking to newspaper editors poisonous stories about Dr. King and what the buggings allegedly had revealed?

Everybody else in Washington of any consequence knew it, and many deplored it, but no one seemed to know how to go about making the FBI hend to the laws of the land.

There is a not-too-flippant assumption in Washington that J. Edgar Hoover has been FBI director for 45 years because all the recent Presidents have assumed that he knew too much about them to be replaced. So not only was he not replaced by any of the younger, very able FBI men in the normal course of things, but Presidents Johnson and Nixon have felt it wise or expedient to waive a law saying Hoover has reached the rocking-chair a S.

ALLEVer ought to be replaced as FBI director — immediately.

As Washington agency heads go, Hoover may have done better job than most. But the people of this country knew something when they limited the time one man might serve in the presidency. They saw personal fieldoms as inimical to the democracy, the personal freedom, that we have come to cherish.

If it is dangerous to have one man serve three full terms as President, it is far more dangerous to have one man take lifetime possession of a powerful police-investigative agency that produce the most prominent, most honored citizens and has the power to discredit, even destroy, almost anyone. The kind of abuse of and contempt for the law manifest in the King and Muhammad eavesdropping become almost inevitable when a man is left in a key job as long as Hoover has been.

Were Hoover a more thoughtful man, or as concerned about the preservation of democracy and liberty as his speeches suggest, he would have resigned long ago. He would not keep putting Presidents in the political bind of deciding to keep him or came him out.

It is clear Hoover has intention of resigning So when does the President muster the courage to say: "Well domn thou good and laithful servent. Goodbye."!

The assassination of the Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. has brought to light some important points to ponder regarding his life and death.

What was Martin Luther King's true role in the civil rights and interacial scene? His role may very well have been, unwittingly a transitional one — both peace and violence.

Martin Luther King attended the Highlander Folk School in 1957 at Monteagle, Tenn., a successor to the Communist-controlled Commonwealth College, which was co-founded by Don West, district director, of the Communist Party of North Carolina and Myles Norton, an activist with the Young Communist League. (See House Committee on Un-American Activities, Testimony of Paul Crouch, May 6, 1949, pp. 191, 193.)

Martin Luther King's close friends at the Highlander Folk School were Carl and Anne Braden, both identified Communists; Abner W. Berry of the central committee of the Communist Party; and James A. Dombrowsky, also an identified Communist.

Martin Luther King's chief advisors in the Southern Christian Leadership Conference (SCLC) are Rev. Ralph Abernathy, close friends and associates, now to be King's successor; the Rev. Andrew Young, SCLC program director; the Rev. Fred Shuttlesworth, an officer in SCLC; "Jack" Hunter Pitts O'Dell, twice aid in SCLC; and Bayard Rustin, a consultant and one-time "secretary to Dr. King."

Who is the Rev. Ralph Abernathy? The Rev. Ralph Abernathy received his training in civil rights agitation at the Highlander Folk School. He also signed a petition along with leading Communist on behalf of Carl Braden, an identified Communist who was convicted of contempt of Congress and received a one year jail sentence.

Who is the Rev. Andrew Young? Rev. Young, program director of SCLC, was the administrator of the Dorchester Center in Liberty County, Ga. Rev. Young was trained at the Highlander Folk School. Hunter Pitts O'Dell, an identified Communist did some work at Rev. Young's Dorchester Center. (See Atlanta Constitution, July 24, 1963, pp. 1, 7.)

Who is the Rev. Fred Shuttlesworth? Rev. Shuttlesworth, a vice president of the SCLC, is the president of the Southern Conference Education Fund which is the successor to the Southern Conference for Human Welfare, a cited Communist front. Who is Hunter Pitts O'Dell? Hunter Pitts O'Dell or "Jack" H. O'Dell was identified as the district director for the Communist Party in New Orleans, in hearings before the U.S. Senate Internal Security Subcommittee — (see New York Times, Sept. 15, 1956, p. 54.)

Who is Bayard Rustin? Bayard Rustin, King's "secretary", was an admitted member of the Young Communist League (YCL). (New York Times, Aug. 20, 1963, p. 2.) As a professed conscientious objector he, served 26 months in federal prisons. Rustin has worked closely with the War Resisters League, Liberation magazine, the Medical Air to Cuba Committee, the Committee for Non-Violent Action (CNVA) and other extreme leftist groups. In Sept., 1963, while in Richmond, Va., Rustin suggested "that more bloody Negro suffering should be encouraged so that squeamish Northern Negroes would be horrified into line . . " - Richmond News-Leader, Sept. 27, 1963.

Martin Luther King in addition to allowing Communist influence in his movement, attempted to couple the civil rights question with foreign policy issues especially Vietnam. Referring to our position in Vietnam King called the United States "The worst purveyor of violence in the world today." (An outright untruth that follows the Communist fondest dream. Note this does not free people, but enslaves.)

Martin Luther King and his wife since 1965 were active ir. headlining of mass peace demonstration — including the mass demonstration of April, 1967 in Central Park. There the American flag was burned, and at the United Nations. These demonstrations have been manipulated by the Communist Party and its front groups. At one time King planned to travel to North Vietnam as a self-appointed diplomat - a violation of the Logan Act, to seek so called "peace" (surrender, of South Vietnam - No. 1 Red tactic).

Martin Luther King assailed the 1964 airlift of a relief force to release hostage missionaries who were being burned and raped while being held by the Congolese rebels. (Why would a fellow Christian Minister assail such an act of mercy?)

Martin Luther King's "non-violence" and "civil disobedience" involved disruptions and breaking whatever laws the movement feels it is above. Law and order is subverted through draft resistance, tying up traffic, sit-ins and mass breaking of federal, state and city laws which have resulted in violence, arson and looting. (A main Red aim.)

What did the Memphis marches have to do with racial issues? Martin Luther King and his aides turned a senitation man's strike - a labor dispute - into a massive disruptive, destructive civil rights riots.

What may be in store for America? Ballots or bullets? If Martin Luther King's assassination marks a turning of the corner into open guerrilla warfare by certain extreme "black power" groups, the country will be in perilous times. Such guerrilla warfare oriented groups include the Student Non-Violent Coordinating Committee (SNCC) Revolution Action Movement (RAM), the Malcolm X. Society. You can also expect other groups to defend the above mentioned ones - such as, CORE, SANE, Womens Strike for Peace, International League for Peace and Freedom, W.E.B. DuBois Clubs, Non-Violent Coordinating Committee, Students for a Democratic Society and the Communist Party.

Is there real hope for lasting racial harmony? The different races in America are her strength and glory. There is no color bar for hatred. The issue in America is not of black power or white power but of whether we have the God power which unites rather than the hate-power which can divide and destroy. We were all meant to walk the earth as the daughters and the sons of God.

"The Communists are constantly encouraging class struggle, trying to increase social, economic, and political tensions. To them class struggle is an agency for promoting communism" J. Edgar Hoover "Masters of Deceit", p. 317. Could it be true what J. Edgar Hoover reiterates, that Martin Luther King is the most notorious liar in this country?





The information set forth in the Washington Post of June 8, 1969, concerning the testimony of FBI Agent Robert Nichols is erroneous. The Post article indicated that "confirmation that Dr. King's home phone was tapped" from 1964 until around the time of his assassination April 4, 1968, came from FBI Agent Robert Nichols. Asked if the tap continued until the assassination date. Nichols nodded."

Special Agent Nichols stated that he answered all questions orally, and that he never nodded his head in response to a question by the defense. According to Agent Nichols, he was asked by the defense if the surveillance of Dr. King was running up to April, 1968, to which Special Agent Nichols responded that he did not know the exact date the surveillance was discontinued because he was not on the case after May, 1965.

According to Assistant Special Agent in Charge (ASAC) Hetherington, the United States Attorney and the Assistant United States Attorney, both of whom were present in the court, stated Special Agent Nichols did not answer any question by nodding his head.

As is known, disclosures were made in the court case involving Cassius Clay in Houston, Texas, to the effect that the FBI had wiretaps on Martin Luther King and Elijah Muhammad of the Black Muslims which were monitored by FBI Agents.

As a result of these disclosures, Bishop's office received a very large number of inquiries late on Thursday, 6/5/69, and all day Friday, 6/6/69, from news media concerning this matter. They wished to know if these wiretaps were authorized by the Director's superior, the Attorney General, how long they continued, etc. Bishop's office has maintained a policy of not commenting in answer to these inquiries but has referred newsmen to testimony of the Director before the House Subcommittee on Appropriations, going back to 3/4/65 and continuing through his testimony on 2/23/68. On each occasion in his testimony Mr. Hoover has stated the number of wiretaps then being operated by the FBI, has pointed out that each is authorized in writing by the Attorney General, and that each of them is in the internal security field. By referring the newsmen to this testimony, the point is made crystal clear that none of the wiretaps are done on the Director's authority but are all approved by the Attorney General then in office.

It is also noted that on the evening of 6/7/69 a spokesman for the Department of Justice, in referring to the matter discussed in Mr. Hoover's testimony, as stated above, has made the statement that "Mr. Hoover's testimony is accurate in every respect," thus confirming Mr. Hoover's testimony.

RECOMMENDATION:

Bishop's office will continue a policy of no comment on this matter but will continue to refer inquirers to Mr. Hoover's testimony as set out above.

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

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SUBJECT: MARTIN LUTHER KING'S BIRTHDAY

BACKGROUND:

Today, March 18th, Congressman John M. Ashbrook (R-Ohio) who is a member of the House Committee on Internal Security advised Mr. DeLoach that 30 bills have been introduced into Congress to declare a holiday on Martin Luther King's birthday, January 15th. Ashbrook further advised that a bill concerning this matter will soon be voted out of the Subcommittee on the Judiciary. In this connection he advised that Congressman Charles E. Wiggins (R-California) and Byron G. Rogers (D-Colorado), members of the Subcommittee, will be contacting the Bureau in the near future to request an "off the record" briefing concerning King. They are in a position to keep any such bill from being reported out of committee--if, as stated by Congressman Ashbrook, they realize that King was a scoundrel.

Byron G. Rogers

Rogers was born in Texas in 1900. He was U.S. Attorney for the District of Colorado 1934-36, and thereafter was Attorney General of the State of Colorado. He was elected to the 82nd Congress in 1950 and has been reelected to subsequent Congresses.

The Bureau investigated Rogers in 1933 and 1934 in connection with his appointment as U.S. Attorney for the District of Colorado and the investigation was favorable. We have had cordial relations with him since he has been in Congress.

Charles E. Wiggins

Wiggins is from El Monte, California, and was elected to Congress in 1966. We have had cordial relations with him and he met the Director and had a picture taken on 6/26/68. On 12/9/68 Wiggins presented a plaque to the Director in behalf of Rosemead, California, and he was cordially thanked.

My conclusions, drawn after nine years of work within the framework of the Communist conspiracy, and twenty years of deep study in the Reds' conspiratorial methods and techniques are:



Mr. HAGAN, Mr. Speaker, I want to call to the attention of my colleagues an article that appeared in the Waynesboro, Ga., newspaper, the True Citizen, on June 11 regarding a lady who celebrated her 99th birthday, Mrs. Mary Savannah Barrett Cohen.

Although there is no doubt that having reached one's 99th year would be reason enough to be the subject of much thought and prose, in my case I feel espocially fortunate to have a grand lady of this caliber residing in the First District of Georgia. Mrs. Cohen's senior years seem to enhance her charms, her keen interest in things happening around her, and her delight in reflecting back over her years from childhood to adulthood and remembering the vast changes in her hometowns of Waynesboro and Augusta.

I am indeed proud to be able to call Mrs. Cohen a neighbor and constituent, and I certainly hope that she will enjoy her 99th year in the same spirit and with the same zest for living as she has exhibited in all the wonderful years past.

The article follows:

HER MEMORIES SPAN A CENTURY (By Joyce Odom)

Mai / Savannal, Barrett Cohen was 99 years old last week.

That in itself is a remarkable thing, but Mrs. Cohen reads three newspapers every day, can remember the ages of her great-grandchildren and writes letters in a graceful, flowing hand.

Bright blue eyes sparkle when she talks about her memories which apan a century. She's confined to a wheelchair now at Keysville Nursing Home, and for the first time in her life is a bit less than completely independent.

She was born in Augusta June 2, 1870, and spent her early years in Waynesboro in a house where a service station is now on the town's main street, Liberty.

She remembers that during her childhood her father, Jim Barrett, and an uncle bought "an old broken down paper mill in Bath, S.C., that you had to get to uphill through sand beds." Mrs. Cohen said the mill first made paper from rags which came baled up and in all colors. Workers had to pick out the white ones to use for paper. Then "a man from Massachusetts" came and taught the Barretts to make paper from wood. "Papa took us down to the mill and we watched them grind up the wood; it looked like mush."

"I know they sold the paper made from

wood to some newspapers to print on, but they must not have got much for it because the mil! went broke," she laughed.

The family also had a plantation here where they planted indigo. She remembers an overseer named Hodges who had a peg

The family moved to Augusta when "Vannah," as she was always called, was seven and lived in a House on Carnes Road, now 15th Street. Her father was "in the cotton busi-She lived there until she married Russell Cohen, the son of John J. Cohen of Augusta. Her children were born and went through elementary school in Augusta (a son, Russell, 75, who lives in Waynesboro, and a daughter who died 25 years ago).

Mrs. Colien's son Russell attended Vanderbilt and became a football star there. After the children were grown, Mr. and Mrs. Cohen moved back to Augustr., and finally back to Waynesboro.

Mr. Cohen died 20 years ago, and since that time until just a few months ago, Mrs. Cohen has lived alone, driven her own car, cooked her meals and kept house. "I'm not sick or anything now. I just can't walk," she said.

She fell and broke her leg recently.

Mrs. Cohen remembers Waynesboro when the downtown area consisted of one block of

stores, the streets and sidewalks were un-paved and "every grocery store sold liquor."
"Young girls were not allowed to go to town on Saturday night," she said. Most of the stores were just shantles, she said, with the exception of those owned by the Fulchers and the Gravs.

In answer to the inevitable question asked the very old, Mrs. Cohen said, in her honest, straightforward way, "I don't know why I've lived so long; my family members usually don't, but I did have an aunt who lived until she was 90."

She sees well and reads everything she can get her hands on including the Atlanta and Augusta daily newspapers and The True Citizen.

Mrs. Cohen's mother, Sophie Settagast, came from Germany and took her children there when "Vannah" was nine for a ten months visit. "Mama wanted us to learn to speak German, but we used to tell her, 'Nobody talks like that'.

Mary Savannah Barrett Cohen has a fond memory of Augusta which she esepcially likes to tell about; She remembers riding horseback to a drug store on Broad Street, in the now-traffic-jammed metropolis.

MARTIN LUTHER KING-THE TRUTH CAN NO LONGER BE HIDDEN

Mr. RARICK. Mr. Speaker, for the fourth time in 14 days I rise to call on the administration to make public information in its possession concerning the illegal, immoral, and subversive activities of the late Martin Luther King.

This information is known to exist. Some of it has already been destroyed.

Unless prompt action is taken, I have reason to believe that more will be destroyed or concealed.

The appropriate committees of the Congress should be given immediate access to what is left of these files before the whitewash is complete.

King's apologists no longer bother to deny his involvement—his close, continued cooperation-with well-known leaders of the Communist conspiracy, both here and abroad.

The American people have learned, a little at a time, of his close association with such identified subversives as Abner W. Berry, Myles Horton, James Dombrowski, Bayard Rustin, Jack H. O'Dell, Carl and Anne Braden, Herbert Aptheker, Elizabeth Gurley Flynn, Gus Hall, Dorothy Ray Healy, Mike Zagarell, John Abt, Daniel Rubin, and Arnold Johnson,

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all functionaries and officials of the Communist Party and all close "advisors," "aides," and "assistants" of King.

The close ties between King and such latter-day subversives as James and Dianne Bevel, Stokeley Carmichael, Paul Booth, John Hulett, James Forman, Rap Brown, Jerry Rubin, Fred Shuttlesworth. and Michael Wood are no longer denied. King's close association with known sex perverts Bayard Rustin and Ralph Abernathy is not even denied by his frantic defenders.

These facts are now too well known to the American people. The truth will not go away.

Instead, following the adage that the best defense is a good offense, the left has launched a vitriolic attack on the FRI in general and on J. Edgar Hoover in particular.

Mr. Hoover's monumental record of a lifetime of devoted service to his country needs no defense. History will recall him as one of the great Americans of all time. His meticulous care in the protection of the privacy of the individual while conducting the investigations vital to the security of the community has charted a course which is an invaluable addition to our way of life.

Americans, armed with the facts, have no trouble deciding the question of credibility between this man and his detractors. The latest coyote to join the yapping is Carl T. Rowan, whose column published in the Washington Star yesterday. I insert it at this point in my remarks:

IT IS TIME FOR J. EDGAR HOOVER TO GO. (By Carl T. Rowan)

A society is never in more peril then when the people lose the ability to identify a genuine threat to personal liberty.

This society is in a lot of peril if we may judge from the public reaction—or lack of it—to courtroom admissions of a variety of illegal FBI wiretaps and buggings of homes and hotel rooms.

A justice department official acknowledged in Federal District Court that Dr. Martin Luther King was under electronic surveillance in 1964 and 1965, and the FBI agent who supervised this surveillance told the court "it was my understanding that it went on after that."

The whole truth is that Dr. King's phones were tapped, his hotel rooms bugged, and he was personally shadowed right up to the time he was slain in Memphis on April 4, 1968.

Another FBI agent, C. Barry Pickett, told the court in Houston, Texas, that for foursolid years he had listened eight hours a day, five days a week to the conversations of Elijah Muhammad, leader of the Black Muslims. Pickett employed both a telephone wiretap and a microphone planted in Muhammad's home.

These cases of electronic eavesdropping. which violate both federal law and a presidential executive order, were disclosed in a hearing on former heavyweight boxing champion Cassius Clay's effort to overturn a fiveyear prison sentence for his refusal to be drafted.

These buggings, which caught some Clay conversations in their "net," are but a frac-tion of the illegal wiretape that have moved this country far closer to a police state than most Americans realize.

Why the bland, indifferent reaction on the part of most Americans?

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First, there is the general FBI justification for such tacties; "national socurity."

Former Attorney General Ramsey Clark. who states emphatically that the FBI had no authority to wiretap or bug Dr. King, asserts that "the implication that people thought Dr. King was a security threat is outrageous," Still that term "National security" is more

powerful than "motherhood," for it evokes fear, and men still surrender more thingsincluding liberty-out of fear than they do out of love

The punding thing about Clark's statement is that he acts as though he is surprised to hear of the wiretopping and bugpites of Dr. King Could Clark possibly have been unlikened that PAI officials were going between catenal committees and partly justifying that for appropriations by titillating some congressmen and feeding anti-King animum.tion to Southerners who despised the civil rights leader—all by way of revealing "timedes" picked up through the wiretaps and buzzings"

Was Clark unaware that certain FBI officials were rounting the country leaking to non-paper editors poisonous stories about Dr. King and what the buggings allegedly had revenued?

Everybody else in Washington of any consequence knew it, and many deplored it, but no one seemed to know how to go about making the FBI bend to the laws of the land.

There is a not-too-flippant assumption in Washington that J. Edgar Hoover has been FBI director for 45 years because all the recent Presidents have assumed that he knew too much about them to be replaced. So not only was he not replaced by any of the younger, very able FBI men in the normal course of things, but Presidents Johnson and Nixon have felt it wise or expedient to waive a law saying Hoover has reached the rockingchair ar

Hoover ought to be replaced as FBI director-immediately.

As Washington agency heads go, Hoover may have done a better job than most. But the people of this country knew something when they limited the time one man might serve in the presidency. The saw personal fieldoms as inimical to the democracy, the personal freedom, that we have come to cherish.

If it is dangerous to have one man serve three full terms as President, it is far more dungerous to have one man take lifetime possession of a powerful police-investigative agency that proof into the deepest secrets of the most prominent, most honored citizens and has the power to discredit, even destroy, almost anyone. The kind of abuse of and contempt for the law manifest in the King and Muhammad eavesdropping become almost inevitable when a man is left in a key job as long as Hoover has been.

Were Hoover a more thoughtful man, or as concerned about the preservation of democrucy and liberty as his speeches suggest, he would have resigned long ago. He would not keep stating Presidents in the political bind of deciding to keep him or ease him out.

It is clear Hoover has no intention of resigning. So when does the President muster the courage to say: "Well done, thou good and faithful servant. Goodbye,"?

Mr. Speaker, this column sheds little light on King, except to suggest that which cannot be denied-much is known about his unsavory character and conduct. Rowan's intemperate attack on security surveillance and his personal attack on J. Edgar Hoover shed a great deal of light on the author and the clouding operation, however. Over the past 30 years the Communist Party had conducted the same attack Rowan has paraphrased without apology the party line. For comparison with his attack today, I

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insert at this point in my remarks a summary of this Communist Party line, according to its official organs, prepared and released by a committee of this House nearly 20 years ago:

An article in the Daily Worker indicated that the FBI had gone beyond the scope of its authority in conducting general intelligence investigations. Reference was made to the increase in the FBI's appropriation over a period of years, and it was alleged that because of its Director's "absorbing interest in investigating alleged subversive activities' the FBI was falling behind in its regular job of dealing with other types of specific Federal violations (Daily Worker, March 25, 1940).

The Nazi Gestapo is Hoover's Model of Conduct for FBI (Daily Worker, December 19, 1940, p. 5, columns 5, 6, and 7).

Federal Bureau of Investigation Director J. Edgar Hoover was referred to as "Chief of the national thought police * * *" (Edi-torial, Political Affairs, January 1948, p. 10). It seem that the PBI * * * is worried that

the American people may get wise to its real function-which is thought control on the Gestapo and Japanese police model (Editorial, The Worker, June 6, 1948, p. 6).

The FBI and the Department of Justice have developed into a secret political police which exists outside the law and beyond the U.S. Constitution. * * * An aroused nation must stop the FBI effort to replace the American Constitution by the reign of the political spy (Editorial, Daily Worker, June 13, 1949,

Continuation of * * * protests can turn the rumors about J. Edgar Hoover's resignation into actual and heartening fact (Editorial, Daily People's World, June 16, 1949,

The FBI's "undercover network" is a menace to the internal security of the nation

* * The American people must rid the nation of this "undercover network." which serves not the nation but a class, the minority of the financial-industrial cliques. The Bill of Rights and the FBl's "undercover network" are incompatable. One or the other must go. We have no doubt which the people will choose (Editorial, Daily Worker, June 21, 1949, p. 8).

Surely the American people must see the FBI with new eyes today. The time has come to investigate its methods, its scandalmongering lists, its blackmailing data, its misuse of public funds, its usurpation of power, its tentacles gripping all parts of our country and its people (Daily Worker, p. 10, June 29, 1949, written by Elizabeth Gurley Flynn).

Mr. Speaker, to make an intelligent judgment as to the credibility of two men whose testimony conflicts, it is necessary to know something of each of the men and of their motivation.

Athough J. Edgar Hoover, who called Martin Luther King "one of the most notorious liars in the country" is well known to our colleagues, and his accomplishments are known and respected throughout the world, it is otherwise with Carl T. Rowan who attacks him.

At this point in my remarks, I insert from the recently published Biographical Dictionary of the Left, by eminent his-

torian Dr. Francis X. Gannon, the most recent biographical sketch of Rowan:

BIOGRAPHICAL DICTIONARY OF THE LEFT

(By Prancis X. Gannon)

Carl Rowan was born on August 11, 1925 in Ravenscroft, Tennessee, son of Johnnie Bradford and Thomas Rowan. He married Vivien Murphy. He attended Tenne see State University and Washburn College. He is an alumnus of Oberlin College (A.B., 1947, and the University of Minnesota (M.A., 1942). He is the author of South of Freedom (1953). The Piliful and the Froud (1956; Go South to Sorrow (1957), Wait till Next Year (1960), and No Need for Hunger (1964)

From 1948 until 1961, Rowson was with the Minneapolis Tribune as a copywriter (1948-1950) and as a staff writer (1950-1961).

From 1961 until 1963, Rowan was a deputy assistant secretary of state for public affairs. In that position, he was used as a speech writer and traveling companion for Vice President Lyndon B. Johnson. His major achievement for the State Department, however, was to serve as the Kennedy Administration's efficient hatchetman against Moise Tshombe of the Congo's Katanga Province. When Tshombe's anti-Communist regime seceded from the rest of the chaotic Congo, Rowan branded Tshombe as an "international Uncle Tom" who was nothing more than a hand-picked stooge for Belgian businessmen.

In 1963 and 1964, Rowan was U.S. Ambassador to Finland. In 1964 and 1965, he was Edward R. Murrow's successor as director of the United States Information Agency. While in that position, he travelled to Europe, promoting Lyndon Johnson's "bridge building" between the United States and the Communist bloc of eastern Europe. He went out of his way to assure Communist leaders that the United States government had placed its permanent seal of approval on Europe's Communist regimes. To an audience in Belgrade, Yugoslavia, Rowan said that Americans were acutely aware of revolutionary changes sweeping the world, He elab-"We emphasize that we believe in orated: change because we were born of it, we have lived by it, we prospered and grew great by it. So the status quo has never been our god and we ask no one else to bow down before 11."

In 1965, Rowan resigned his directorship and became a columnist for the Chicago Daily News and Publishers Newspaper Syndi-He is also a regular contributor to Reader's Digest magazine and a radio and television commentator for the Westinghouse Broadcasting System.

Throughout his several careers, Rowan has demonstrated that he is a liberal and has been recognized as such by his peers. He has received the Sidney Hillman award for news reporting, the Contributions to American Democracy award from Roosevelt University. the Golden Ruler award from the Philadel-phia, Fellowship Commission, the Liberty Bell award from Howard University, the Communications Award in Human Relations from the Anti-Defamation League, and the National Brotherhood award from the National Conference of Christians and Jews. These tributes are almost invariably reserved for those who are actively promoting leftistliberal causes.

When the Kennedy Dynasty discovered the value of Negroes' votes and began to place Negroes in high government positions, Rowan was one of the show pieces. In 1962, an application for membership to the famous Cosmos Club of Washington, D.C. was submitted on behalf of Rowan. The application was rejected. Within a few days, leading figures in the Kennedy Administration-many of them longtime members of the Cosmos Club-suddenly became color conscious and resigned their membership.

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Alexander Jones, executive editor of the Spidouse Herales American, rushed to the de-fense of the Cosmos Ciub officers: "I say this incloses a planned political effort in which the Kennedy forces are trying to make Negro capital, using Rowan as a sort of Freedom Raicr in the National Capital on the club

"I have been a member of the fine old Cosmos Club for more than 20 years and I believe I can speak with some slight knowledge of how it operates.

"I say that there are people who think Carl Rowan is a bumptious, self-enamored and thateless fellow.

"And that estimate completely discounts the color of his skin. He could be platinum blond and the people I am thinking about would still turn thumbs down on him.

Many men have been blackballed in applaction for membership by the Cosmos Club committee, as they have in most private c. 20s.

The only one I have ever heard of who ever made a public issue of it is this same

Carl Rowen, who is giving every indication of becoming a professional racist."

Rowen has the normal prejudices of a modern hereal. He detests political conservatives and anti-Communist investigations. He is a standeh admirer of the United Nations and his Red hetrarchy. He fancies himself an expert on foreign affairs but in reality he is no more than a parrotting applogist for the appearement-toward-Communism policy that has prevailed for so long in the White House and the State Department

In 1966, Rowan was convinced, or at least let his readers think he was convinced, that the Soviet Union's leaders were trying very hard to effect a peaceful settlement of the Vietnam War.

Rowan has long championed the idea that the Urified State should make friendly overtures to Red China-something which would have been done a long time ago, he contends, if only the "purges and inquisitions of the late Sen. Joseph McCarthy" had not had a suffing effect on public debate of U.S. policy toward Red China. (When and where this alleged stifling took place, Rowan

has never mentioned.)
One curious facet of Rowan's work remains unexplained. On radio and television and in his writings, he is a persistent and dedicated defender of the Central Intelligence Agencyso much so that it is not unreasonable to suspect that he is or has been a CIA agent.

THE VALUE REVOLUTION

Mr. RIEGLE, Mr. Speaker, one of the most important tasks facing both the individual citizen and all levels of government is coming to grips with the problem of student unrest and campus disorder. We must go far beyond merely reacting to the outward manifestation of this problem, that is, with restoring order to a riot situation and punishing those who destroy property. It is more important that we understand the fundamental questions these students are asking about our value system and the direction in which our country is heading.

I have recently read an article by Stewart Udall, former Secretary of the Interior, which I think really gets to the heart of the transition we are in and to the underlying issues of the campus turmoil. Because I agree with Mr. Udall's perception of this value revolution and the need for channeling this concern in a constructive way, I insert Mr. Udall's remarks at this point in the Record: [From the New York Times, June 7, 1969]

THE VALUE REVOLUTION

(By Stewart L. Udall)

There is a deepening awareness that today's domestic turbulence is in reality a funda-mental questioning of the value system of

American society.

The protest of the blacks against the personal affronts and indignities of daily life is also a more general protest against the false and frequently inhuman values of our total social system. The widespread student an-tagonism toward the standards of "the establishment" represents an even broader disagreement with conventional values.

SOCIAL RENEWAL

I believe this pervasive and pointed questioning of values may bring about a shift in those ideas and attitudes that ultimately shape the nation. In fact, we may already be engaged in the most vital sorting out of values since 1776. Even our search for the roots of failure at the time of the Depression was more a questioning of the workability of the economic system than a radical search for the elements of thorough-going social renewal.

Our contemporary turmoil concerns human relationships: between the privileged and the impoverished, between black and white, between parents and children,

If we honestly believe, as I do, that the present young generation is not only the best educated, but also the most aware and idealistic in our history, we must be responsive to its causes and complaints. anger of the young blacks against the built-in inequalities and hypocrisies of "the system" legitimately challenges the moral basis of the old order.

If a large proportion of the superior university graduates turn their backs on corporate careerism, if many of our most creative minds are turned off by conventional opportunities, we should question the in-centives and concepts that make the system For there is no doubt that the desire to to merely affluent is yielding to the impulse lo live in an environment that is life-giving and creative.

If most of our cities and countrysides are increasingly unclean and ugly we should begin to reconsider the policies that have made them a disordered mess. If technology is to continue its thrust, then it must be influenced by social considerations and aspirations—in short, technology must be civilized.

The thing that appalls the new generation the most, I believe, is the waste endemic in American life: the waste of young tal-ent; the waste of the contributions the unmelted minorities could make if we gave them a chance; the waste of the beauty and bounty of a magnificent continent. The student protest against the Vietnam policy was and is a moralistic protest against waste.

EXCESSES OF WAR

With the benefit of hindsight we now realize it is a judgment wiser than Washington's-a judgment that the lives and wealth expended were excessive and misdirected, and thus demeaned us before mankind.

We will always need in this country all the idealism we can get, particularly from our youth, for the idealist is more sensitive to crucial moral issues, more attuned to the nonmaterialistic opportunities. Who, indeed will pierce our old frauds and follies unless fresh minds question the habits and attitudes of the past?

The value revolution is upon us. It may transform our lives. Those preoccupied with the scifish scramble for easy wealth, un-

The complete process of the contract of the co

merited advantage and personal case should become accustomed to the well-aimed arrows of these who have contempt for there

aspects of American life.

The value doubters will continue to scorn our efforts to define the national well-being solely by Gross National Product, freightcar loadings, auto production, or the suffi-ciency of military preparedness. They want to assess (and they are entitled to raise the issue) what that product is, what the freight cars contain, what the relevance of individual wheels is to our mass transportation needs, how humanism fits into what can never again be a simple logistical measure of preparedness.

The time has come to recognize the worth of the value revolution and to encourage it toward constructive channels. It can have a profound and beneficial influence on our future if it causes us to renew our lives, revise our institutions, and reassess our directions and purposes.

Mr. HOSMER. Mr. Speaker, Representative John B. Anderson and myself had the pleasure of speaking this morning to the 52d anniversary convention of the National Coal Association. Our respective speeches follow:

NEEDED: A PEACE TREATY FOR THE ENERGY COMMUNITY

(Remarks by the Honorable John B. Anderson, Member, Joint Committee on Atomic Energy, Before the National Coel Association, Mayflower Hotel, Washington, D.C. June 16, 1963)

Good morning, ladies and gentlemen. I hope it isn't too early in the day to speak to you about a serious subject,

I refer to the increasing public opposition, not a little of it wholly unreasoning, to the construction of all electric power plants. The fact that the preponderance of this opposition has of late been concentrated on nuclear power plants should not be of comfort to you. There are those who have made efforts to trade upon the visceral public anxietics associated with the atom, and to a certain extent they have succeeded. But their temporary success, if you can call it that, has had cancerous effects. Unless these efforts are stopped, objective dialogue will give way to unrestrained charge and countercharge, with effects that are inimical to all in the power business. Portraying nuclear plants as bad and electric utility executives as irresponsible individuals intent upon destroying the wonders of nature impairs public confidence in the mo-tivation and integrity of these men in a way that is harmful to more than nuclear

As a result, coal and other fossil-fueled plants, hydroelectric projects and pumped storage facilities also have encountered significant and growing public opposition. I regret to say that the situation will probably continue to deteriorate before it begins to improve.

It seems that what should be a genuine. legitimate and quite understandable con-cern about the effects on the environment of large power plants has been transformed in many instances into an insistence on pristine purity that refuse to recognize the preed

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

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

In Memory A-101

There are impressive arguments to support a bill introduced by Congressman John Conyers Jr. and 23 associates which would make the birthday of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. on Jan. 15 a legal public holiday. The tidal wave of mail which has come to Congress in support of this proposal leaves no doubt whatever that it would be regarded by Negroes all over the United States as a long-desired and deserved recognition of the rich contribution of their race to American life. That it would gratify Negroes is reason enough in itself to assure the proposal thoughtful consideration. And apart from this, Dr. King holds an indubitable place among the great American martyr heroes to whom all Americans owe gratitude.

The trouble with making Dr. King's birthday a legal holiday lies in the fact that, to whatever extent it might find endorsement among the states. it would add to the rather considerable roster of days on which offices, banks, stores, schools and governmental functions are already suspended. Congress itself has power to establish a legal holiday only in the District of Columbia and for Federal employes everywhere. The individual states determine for themselves whether the holiday should be observed within their boundaries. Legal holidays have been suggested to commemorate the birthdays of a number of noted Americans—Jefferson. Madison, Jackson, Lincoln and Franklin Roosevelt among them; but only George Washington's birthday has actually been established as a legal holiday. If similar status were accorded all of them, industry, commerce, education and public services would be pretty seriously impaired.

Perhaps a better and more realistic way of paying tribute to the memory of Dr. King has been proposed in the Senate by Senator Brooke and in the House by Congressman Farbstein. They advocate a joint resolution urging the President annually to declare Jan. 15 Martin Luther King Day—to be observed, as Abraham Lincoln's birthday is widely observed, by appropriate voluntary exercises in schools and at public meetings. Certainly it would be a more appropriate tribute to Dr. King to have students talk about him and his ideas in open schools than to have the schools shut down. The aim is a memorial, not merely a holiday.



Pursuant to your request on February 28, 1969, a copy of a Top Secret document regarding Martin Luther King, Jr., was delivered on that date to Mr. Bryce N. Harlow, Special Assistant to the President, at the White House.

This document was a duplicate copy of the same document forwarded to the President and the Attorney General on January 23, 1969.

NOTE: Deputy Attorney General Kleindienst called Inspector Sterling B. Donahoe at 5:50 p.m., 2/28/69. He referred to continuing efforts that are being made to declare King's birthday a national holiday. He asked that a summary be prepared concerning the background of King, including his immoral behavior, and delivered to Bryce Harlow at the White House by Noon, 3/1/69.

We had already prepared such a document at the Instructions of the Director and copies had been sent the President and Attorney General. After checking with the Director, Kleindienst was reminded of the prior dissemination and of the Top Secret nature of the material. He said he would emphasize the classification to Harlow and asked that a copy be delivered directly to Harlow. This was done at 6:30 p.m., 2/28/69, by



KING STATUE IS PLANNED & AT CATHEDRAL

A statue of the Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King Jr., the stain Negro civil rights leader, will be placed in the nave of Washington Cathedral alongside some 30 others in a series of "great Christians."

The Very Rev. Francis B. Sayre Jr., dean of the cathedral, said in his announcement that the carved likeness will be 30 inches tall and will cost about \$2,500. The statue will be the first of a Negro to be included in the series. About a dozen statues already are in place, including reformers John Calvin and Martin Luther.

A cathedral spokesman said the decision to create the statue came in response to a request by the Southern Christian Leadership Conference that King's 40th birthday, which would have been Wednesday, be bonored by the nation's churches. King preached his last formal sermon in the cathedral the week before his death last April 4.

The stone carving will be fashioned from a plaster cast to be designed by col. Carl Bush, cathedral sculptor-in-residence. The work will begin when donations to cover the cost have been received, the spokesman said.

I'm now retired from the City of New York Police Department since Sept. 1961, of which I was a member for a period of thirty five years, and during that whole time was assigned to the 23th Precinct, West 123rd Street Station House, located in Black Harlem and during that period of time had come in contact and observed the whole method of operation there, including many phonies only to mention a few, Marcus Garvey, Julian the "Black Eagle", Madam St. Clair, Father Devine and Daddy Grace. But also ned the pleasure of doing business with some good black people, there also only to mention a few.

Bill "Bojangles" Loinson, (dancer), Dr. Marsh il Ross, M.D., Dr. Louis Wright, M.D., Dr. Dash, DDF. Congressmen Adam Clayton Powell, Jr., Father who during them times was the head of the Abyssinia Baptist Church, Nina Mae McKenney, (dancer & singer) and her Mother & Father, Mr. Handy, (song writer), Mr. Randolph, Pres., sleeping pulman porters union, Mr. Madison, Father Devines lawyer and Sugar Ray Robinson. There was also some good times at the Old Lafayette Theatre, 7th Ave., & 132nd St., Rockland Palace formerly Manhattan Casino, 8th Ave. & 155th, St., Eddie Smalls Old Paradise 7th Ave.& 135th, St., Renaissance Casino & Savoy Ballroom, Old Cotton Club on Lenox Ave., Commonwealth S.C., Tilly&s Kitchen on Lenox Ave., and the Old Polo Grounds, 8th Ave. & 155th St.

One of our greatest Presidents namely Theodore Roosevelt, his philosophy was "Speak softly and carry a big stick". And one of our greatest Police Commissioners namely Brover Whelan, his philosophy was "The law is at the end of the Night-stick".

So if you would be so kind to forgive me blowing my top as a result of the incidents mentioned above, I would greatly appreciate any literature relative to Mr. King if it is available.



When you were here I mentioned a post card that had a rather strange group of individuals pictured thereon. I was able to get one for your personal scrutiny. Here it is.







I can not come to see so I will mak you to read this to your students who wish to create a "memorial" to Martin Luther King.

If you, your faculty, and (by seepage) your students have become possessed of the curious idea that Martin Luther King believed in, or practiced a single one of the classic and notle traditions of this nation, or even lived by a single Christian moral and ethical law, then you are the cruel victims of a deliberate delusion fostered by the liberal press, the liberal communication media, and the liberals in politics.

Martin Luther King was a tool of the Communists in this country! He was trained by them in the revolutionary tactics of Communist infiltration, street fighting, and the open use of violence, hatred and defiance of law, along with other Communists and other negroes selected for this task. He was schooled in the evil and subtle tactics of deceit, the bold use of the dynamic lie and the constant employment of cold, bitter racial hatred. He was trained to use all these tools, under the guise of "non-violence" and of the Ghandi style of "passive rest. "Tee."

These are facts, documented and available in print and are published by the Government Printing Office in Washington as the evidence exposed and collated by the investigating committees of the Congress of the United States, an elected and desocratic representational body upon which our government rests. They are further revealed in the periodic reports of the FBI under J. Edgar Hoover who indicted hing as a liar and was never challenged. They are, as well, set forth in the many books by reputable scholars and writers.

The incontrovertible fact that all these data exist, and are apparently kept from your students, who are allowed, in their callow innoceance, to indulge in cilly sentimentalism and cickly adoration of Martin Lather King, is an indictment not just of you and your faculty but of education in general. And this adoration gets more mandlin every day. It is a shame to leave these young men, entrusted to your care and paid for the same by parents, in this ignorance and in this delusion. It is shocking not to tell them the truth, because, fed by the mushy pablum of sticky adoration of the wrong Gods, they will not be in very good shape to assess moral and ethical values when they get to college. And, the ability to assess such values used to be the basis of all education. How can your students know what such values are, when they are gllowed to reach for and memorialize a deity who destroyed all such values in his own lifetime.

And, beyond the personal relationship of these young men with society, there is a greater duty. It is the duty of every citizen who inherited these ideals to work for the ideals upon which this nation was founded, and with all other loyal Americans to strengthen this Republic in its time of trial. The unique wisdom of the founding fathers in creating a Constitution that has survived many trials in our history, resulted in Constitutional government which was based on the workable and sensible notion of defining and separating the relationships amongst the citizens, the state, and the federal government. The feeling that the freedoms now unique in the world, which this constitutional government created and which patriotic Americans have won, is a feeling every good American ought to support.

When men arise whose actions are aimed to rend asunder this great tradition and to shatter this constitutional strength, then such men are the enemies of our country. Such men should be taken from society and kept from further demolishing that which the rest of us have fought for and still cherish. Such a man was Martin Luther King. History, me we hope it may soon be written by objective scholars, will reveal and document more and more the disaster he let loose upon this nation.

To memorialize a man like this, is to memorialize the enemies of our freedoms, the traitors to our cause, and the defectors from our ideals and traditions. King was all these things and more, and as such, he should have been dealt with as are other anti-Americans who practice treachery and promote anarchy.

- Your suggestion that, because King was "assasinated", the student's adoration and the tribute is justified and is excusable. In the first place, King was killed by an unknown hand, who might, when proved (which has not yet happened) turn out to

be a Communist the same as Oswald. Further I would warn you that the word "assasination" is not used for the murder of rabble-rousers and demagogues; it is only appropriate for the murder of heads of state. King was not the head of anything except the negro revolutionary bent on the destruction of our state. Regardless of your beliefs, you should at least adher to semanties.

To say that if one objects to King's actions one advocates his murder in to repeat the colossal non-sequitar of our time.

No one condones murder, not even of King. I am, as are all loyal Americans, against this murder and all murdem. By the same token I am (as should you be) against the murders that King's revolution instigated, just as I am against the destruction of law and order by the megro imsurrection led, inspired and planned by King.

It is your duty as an adult as well as the headmaster of a school, to explain to your charges that these two things must be separated. There is no relation (except one you choose to make) between the injustice done to King by his still unknown surderer, and the shooking, mational, senseless injustice done to the millions of leyal law-abiding, peace-loving Americans by Martin Luther King and his followers.

I condemn both as you should.

I condemn King's muder but I also condemnKing as a traiter to his mation, a man who advocated dealing with our enemy, the Communists, who are killing thousands of Americans in Viet Nam. I condemn King as the chief mover, of a revolution, a bloody destructive and evil revolution, against his own mation and of overt violence of law and order as a matter of planned policy.

I condemn Kartin Luther King who was responsible for the millions of dollars worth of property destroyed, burned and looted by megroes, and of lives snuffed out by mobs frenzied by the doctrines and ideas that King kept spouting.

If blind hatred, as I know you liberals believe, was the cause of King's murder (this has not been proved), then why condone blind hatred set up by King and loosened on our people in the violence that has been the undeniable order of the day since King started it. Blind hatred begets more hatred. All this ends as Communists planned it to end, in uttermarchy.

I should think the irony of all this would appeal to you. How ironic can you get when the man who created more trouble, conflict and civil war in this nation than any other individual in our history, could be along with other Communists, awarded the Nobel "Feace" Frize.

While it is ironic or witness the death of a man by he sword who has lived by the sword, the real irony lies in the fact that Martin Luther King, regardless of what he said he was doing, did incite others to violence. And, he did use the threat of more violence, as a sordid and flagrant blackmail upon your representatives and mine, in the Congress, to pass more "civil rights" laws alleged to be for the benefit of the negroes...who were lecting, burning and killing regardless of the fact that these laws had removed all legal barriers to negro advancement! History will reveal King and record him for what he was. If he had believed in mon-violence (as he said he did) he would have (as he could have) stopped the violence that always resulted from his presence.

Not only did King fail to prevent a single incident of violence or frementation of law, but even when he planned and knew ahead of time where violence would erupt, he did not stop the planning nor the subsequent results. As in the case of the Memphis riots, King knew they would happen and never lifted his finger or his voice to stop them or to warm the authorities that they would happen. He knew ahead of time and helped to plan the invasion of Washington by the black hoodlums, gangsters and criminals and the black anarchy that was its end product.

Every year during Kings activities, crime in the United States increased materially. The majority of crime was committed by megroes and this included murder, looting, burg lary, mugging, rape and arson in which from five to ten times more negroes committed such crimes than whites. Also, the majority of illegimate children in this country are black and ower 80% of all persons in the urban areas on relief, well unto the second or third generation, are black. The millions of dollars for aid to dependent children is largely spent on black people. All this resulted from King's "ministry". And, there is no record that Mr. King was ever ordained as a Christian minister.

These are facts.

Even his own race condemned him and his influence! George Schulyer, the most distinguished negro newsman and cdumnist (in an editorial after King's death) said that however tragic and unfortunate King's murder was, "it was largely a matter of his own doing."

He who lives by the sword will die by the sword.

Congressmen A. W. Watson, investigating King's actions and incendiary talk, declared that King was the brains behind the riots that resulted in 118 decths in the year 1967. And, he said that King's danger lay in the fact that he, King, was sly and clever enough to convince away good Americans that he was "harmless and respectable" while he was actually "aiding and abetting the Communist conspiracy against this nation."

After meeting in Washington with the two of the most vialent leaders of black anarchy and violence (I refer to Carmichael and Rap Brown who said they would kill and burn)...King made a statement sugging: "We seek to say to the nation in our easpaign that if you don't straighten up, then you're writing your own obituary."

These were the mad threats of your hero Martin Lather King. This was typical of the blackmail he employed to sow wenal politicians into submission. King was not only associated with known activistic Communists (all trained to destroy our government), but he hired as secretaries two of the worst criminals the negro race has ever produced: 1. Bayard Rustin, a convicted sodomist and sexual pervert,
2. Jack O'Dell (alias Hunter Pitts), who was exposed as a Communist by the U. S. Senate, and who was a Communist organizer in New Orleans. When the heat on these two Communists became too hot, Hing resorted to the deceitful strateges of "firing" them as his secretaries. He then get them jobs in another part of his organization.

Is this the saint to be adored and held in high esteem by nice normal young American boys in your school? If you are going to have a memorial to King, let such a memorial tell the truth.

But King's work as a illegal instigator of violence and the shattering of law and order, was not his most destructive contribution to the civil war in our land. He was the author of the new morality...which is no morality. He was the inventor of "flexible morals"...the cult and system by which any person who does not like the laws can break them with impunity. And, what is worse, the philosophy that any and all means, however, false, however illegal, however immoral, are perfectly correct; and good if the end is conceived, by the person committing these crimes to be good! Evil means beget evil ends. King believed that good ends justify evil means. This is why our crime rate has risen out of all proportion during King's activities!

In this he has left his black and awful mark upon our times. If you condone a memorial to him, I think you should know the facts about King. Before you use any soney given you by parents for the proper education of their sons, I think you should ask the parents if they condone such a memorial. But before you ask them, I suggest you send them a copy of this letter and let them see the other side, the real side, the true side, that has been kept from their naive sons.

If you don't want ti do this, I will be glad to send them copies.

Then, take a wote and see what the parents say.

This, I think, you are obligated to do.

You have no right to delude these boys without their parents consent.




