






#### INTRODUCTORY

Before commencing this report the
Director of Special Days and Events desires to make
very proper acknowledgment of the fact that the
results achieved through the activities of his
Department were rendered possible by the previous
establishment of certain wise policies and regulations
that owed their inception and adoption to the
foresight and practical judgment of the President of
the Exposition himself.


As the fundamental purpose of the Special Day celebrations and Special Event attractions was the stimulation of attendance, it seems both pertinent and permissible, therefore, to specify some of the vital features which so materially aided in the successful consumation of these activities. Chief among these factors were

- l) The merit system of placing direct responsibility upon the heads of Divisions and Departments by giving them the privilege of selecting their own employes, and then backing them up with generous encouragement and strong support in the performance of their duties.
- 2) The elimination of the "Pass" system which had proved such a detriment to gate receipts at previous Expositions, and the restriction of free admissions to those only who were actually entitled to this privilege as employes and participants or who were otherwise officially connected with the Exposition.
- 3) The sale of fifty thousand Season Coupon Admission Books at \$10 each, which prompted and induced several million more admissions from the local population upon which the Exposition necessarily depended for the bulk of its patronage.




- 4) The establishment of reasonable rates by the local hotels and rooming houses, and the widespread publicity given to this fact which induced the attendance of many thousands of visitors from points outside of San Francisco who would not otherwise have come here without this assurance.
- 5) The liberal and systematic entertainment of distinguished visitors which promoted an era of friendliness and appreciation both here and in the home States and Countries of those entertained, resulting in many more visitors and numerous reciprocal functions with a corresponding increase in the Exposition's revenue from gate and concessions receipts.
- 6) The inauguration of suitable ceremonies for each celebrant of a special day at the Exposition. These ceremonies were of a character and scope commensurate with the dignity and importance of the celebrant. Added gratification and interest was attached by the Exposition presenting the celebrant with a commemorative bronze plaque or medal or an engrossed testimonial, or by having the special representative of the celebrant plant a commemorative tree to mark the occasion.

instances of invaluable aid, initiated and made effective through the imagination and forcefulness of the President, the Department of Special Days and Events is much indebted for whatever success it may have achieved in the administration of its responsibilities.





# PANAMA-PACIFIC INTERNATIONAL EXPOSITION SAN FRANCISCO OFFICE OF THE PRESIDENT

December 20, 1915.

Mr. Charles C. Moore, President Panama-Pacific International Exposition, San Francisco, California.

Dear Sir:

I have the honor to submit the following report covering the organization and conduct of that branch of your administration known as "SPECIAL DAYS and EVENTS", which reported direct to the President of the Exposition. In compiling this report I have had in mind a two-fold purpose - - to make it not only a correct summary of the activities of this Department but also a practical record that will prove of service to the organizers and managers of similar undertakings in the future.

PRELIMINARY ORGANIZATION.

The preliminary arrangements for Special Events were commenced by me in 1912 but shortly after my appointment as Chief of the Department of Liberal Arts on January 1, 1913, I turned over all papers and records to the Director of Exploitation, Mr. George H. Perry.

( e e These data came back into my hands later in the year and were finally placed in possession of Mr. Hollis E. Cooley in February 1914, when he was appointed Chief of Special Events.


COMMITTEE ON SPECIAL EVENTS, MILITARY AFFAIRS AND ATHLETICS.

Board of Directors authorized and the President appointed a special committee called the "Committee on Special Events, Military Affairs and Athletics", of which Director Thornwell Mullally was the Chairman and sole member. His offices were located in the Administration Building and his principal assistants there were Mr. Hollis E. Cooley, Chief of Special Events and Mr. Louis Levy, Assistant Chief of Special Events, with an office staff of half a dozen other employes.

attention, under the auspices of this Committee, and with the assistance of Mr. Louis Levy and of the Division of Exploitation, to securing and scheduling on the Exposition Calendar a number of Special Day celebrations and Special Event attractions for the Exposition period.

PRE-EXPOSITION SPECIAL EVENTS.

During the pre-Exposition period a number of remunerative Special Events were arranged



and conducted on Sundays and holidays, chief among which were the following:

May 1, 1914 Ball of All Nations, in Machinery Palace; receipts over \$25,000.

July 4, 1914 Independence Day; paid attendance - - - - 8,897

September 9, 1914 Admission Day; paid attendance - - - - 8,344

October 12, 1914 Columbus Day; paid attendance - - - - 35,000





FORMAL RECOGNITION OF MOST IMPORTANT CO-OPERATING ELEMENTS.

In December 1914 the President
inaugurated the movement to give prompt and
suitable recognition to those elements which had
made the Exposition possible or had importantly
contributed towards its success. It was decided
that this end could be best served by inviting the
Foreign Countries, States of the Union, Counties
and Cities to dedicate their respective special



pavilions or buildings on the Exposition Grounds, with appropriate ceremonies, in which the Exposition management could join by providing such facilities as escorts of Exposition officials and Military, Music, Platforms, Seats and Decorations: also Directors to speak representing the Exposition and in its behalf present bronze Plaques commemorative of the occasion celebrated. With the aid of the Director of Works, Mr. H. D. H. Connick, and Mr. Lowell Hardy of the Exploitation Division, the President commenced this movement by sending a dozen Special Commissioners throughout California to interest the County officials. He also wrote strong letters to the Foreign Commissioners or their nations' diplomatic representatives in Washington, and to the Commissioners or Governors of the participating States, inviting them to arrange dates for these dedications. The response was both prompt and gratifying in every instance, assuring a most satisfactory measure of interest and attendance during that most uncertain of all periods - - the early days of an Exposition when weather conditions are usually unreliable and the public are generally waiting for more finished conditions before giving their fullest patronage.



ORGANIZATION OF THE SPECIAL DAYS DEPARTMENT.

National, State, Civic and Industrial celebrations planned by the President involved a far broader scope of operations than were attempted at any previous Exposition, and required close attention by the President himself or his office, the President assigned me to this work on February 10, 1915, as his personal representative, with instructions to sign all letters and other papers in my own name, followed by the words "For the President".

It was also understood that I should still remain Chief of Liberal Arts and exercise general supervision over that Department of the Exhibits Division, with Mr. H. W. Kerrigan as General Superintendent to represent me there.

DIRECTOR OF SPECIAL DAYS AND EVENTS.

On this basis throughout the entire


Exposition period 1 performed the duties of "Director

of Special Days and Events", which title was formally

conferred upon me by the President on November 13,1915.

COOPERATION BY OTHER DEPARTMENTS.

In view of the fact that I would have to rely upon the Division of Works to provide most of the physical requirements for Special Day




ceremonies in the way of platforms, seats,
decorations, illuminations, fireworks, guards,
music, etc., my offices were established in the
Service Building next to the Director of Works,
with whom I could freely and frequently consult.
This location was also particularly desirable
because in this Building were also housed the
Comptroller and Division of Concessions and
Admissions with whom my official activities were
likewise closely related.

COIBINING OF SPECIAL DAYS AND SPECIAL EVENTS UNDER ONE HEAD.

until May I organized and conducted the numerous Special Day dedications and celebrations, ranging from four to twelve functions daily. When the necessity arose to cut down the Exposition's daily expense, the sub-Committee of the Executive Committee decided that in the interests of economy and coordination all the activities represented by Special Events should also be put under my charge. Therefore the Special Events force was reduced and moved to the Service Building and came under my direction May 21, 1915.

At the same time the offices of Mr. C. C. Henion, the Exposition's Cormissioner to State and Foreign Organizations, which formed the local auxiliaries for these elements in our



community, were also moved to my jurisdiction in the Service Building.

BENEFITS OF COMBINATION UNDER ONE HEAD.

These transfers were effected

without confusion or loss of time and the benefits

which promptly accrued demonstrated the wisdom of

concentrating the Special Days and Special Events

activities under one head and under one roof.

REDUCTION OF FORCES.

This change likewise enabled curtailment of the Special Days forces, so that a total of ten employes were cut off the payroll, leaving the new Department of Special Days and Events thirty employes (see attached list marked "A") against forty in the divided offices.


REORGANIZATION AND NEW BUDGET.

I am also attaching a list marked "B" which shows all the employes who worked in Special Days and Special Events, some of whose services were discontinued before the Exposition ended. In this connection I beg to quote the following letter:

"May 17, 1915.

To the President:

Pursuant to your direction, I have, after consultation with Director of Works Connick and Comptroller Durkee, regarding physical and financial requirements, re-organized the activities comprising Special Events and Special Days into a compact body that will render more effective and economical service to the Exposition.



This re-arrangement of these forces cuts the number of employes from 40 to 30 people and reduces the payroll from about \$8000 to approximately \$6000 per month.

For your information, I beg to advise that the Budget balance now available for Special Events and Special Days is \$250,000, which, for the purpose of most effective disposition, I have divided into seven practically equal periods commencing May 17 and ending December 4. These periods would consume about \$28,000 each, leaving a fund in reserve of \$50,000 for contingent or emergency purposes.

The Special Events offices, and those of Commissioner Henion, all in the Administration Building, will be moved over to the third floor of Service Building on May 20, and thereafter be under my immediate control and supervision.

In accordance with my understanding, I shall report direct to you, and, where these reports involve policies or expenditures, they will bear the endorsements of Messrs. Connick and Durkee as concurring therein.



TRANSFER OF MILITARY AFFAIRS AND ATHLETICS.

When Chairman Mullally's responsibilities ceased as an executive upon the consumation
of the foregoing arrangement, the management of
the Military Affairs work of his Committee was
continued by Captain Edward C. Carpenter, U.S.A.,
Commandant of the Exposition Guard, and the




Athletic features were vested in the Exposition
Athletic Committee, of which Mr. William F.
Humphrey, President of the Olympic Club of San
Francisco, was Chairman.

SCHEDULING OF CHLEBRATIONS AND ATTRACTIONS.

The aim of the Exposition management was to arrange as far as possible in advance of the opening a comprehensive schedule of special celebrations and attractions for the entire Exposition period. We endeavored to have these of a character that would not only awaken and maintain a keen and vigorous interest in every single day but also be thoroughly in keeping with the high educational and sentimental purpose of the Exposition. The policy followed was not to wait until necessity compelled heroic measures to remedy flagging attendance but to provide definitely far enough ahead of their occurence a suitable schedule of special days and events that could be exploited to the best possible advantage as inducements to stimulate attendance. The gratifying results achieved amply confirm the wisdom of this course.

CALENDAR OF SPECIAL DAYS AND EVENTS.

No printed Calendar of Special Days and Events was available until July 1, 1915, when a pocket size edition (83 inches by 4 inches) was issued in neat blue cover. A typewritten copy of



the complete Calendar covering the entire

Exposition period is attached (marked "C"). There

were 828 Special Day celebrations and approximately

966 Special Event attractions. This shows a total


of 1794 or an average of a little over six special

celebrations and attractions daily during the

Exposition period.

MUSIC.

The names of the Concert Bands and the Organ Recitals scheduled appear in this Calendar day by day, but as they operated under the Director of Music, Mr. George W. Stewart, further particulars regarding their activities, as well as all other musical matters, must be obtained from his reports. Director Stewart had charge of the superb Exposition Orchestra of eighty picked musicians which, under the leadership of the noted Max Bendix, Camille Saint Saens, Walter Damrosch, Auguste Bosc, Victor Herbert and other prominent conductors, gave splendid symphony concerts in Festival Hall and numerous popular concerts in Old Faithful Inn. Professor Edwin Lemare of London, considered the world's greatest living organist. gave a series of over one hundred daily organ recitals in Festival Hall under Mr. Stewart's direction. The famous Boston Symphony Orchestra also played a very successful two week's engagement



in Festival Hall.

Mr. Stewart also had under his charge the Official Band of forty one pieces, so ably directed by Charles H. Cassasa, which played at practically all the ceremonies and other official functions.

ATHLETICS, FIREWORKS, POLO, HORSE RACING, YACHT AND MOTOR BOAT RACES.

This same rule about reports applies to other features appearing in the Calendar and covering which specific information can doubtless be obtained from the following Committees or Departments conducting them:




The three stellar days of the Exposition were Opening Day, Sat. Beb. 20, attendance - - - 255,149

San Francisco Day, Tues. Nov. 2, attendance - 348,472

Closing Day, Sat. Dec. 4, attendance - - - 459,022.

OPENING DAY.


The Opening Day program on Saturday, February 20, was arranged and conducted by the Committee on Special Events, Filitary Affairs and Athletics, - - Director Thornwell fullally, Chairman, ably assisted by Chief of Special Events Cooley and Mr. Louis Levy, who was then Assistant Chief of Special Events. The official ceremonies commencing at 10.00 A.M. in the South Gardens, fronting the Tower of Jewels, were the principal feature of the day, as described and pictured in the attached copy of program and photographs marked "D". The principal other attractions were an organ recital by Professor Wallace A. Sabin, the Official Organist, at Noon in Festival Hall, outdoor concerts by the Creatore, Thaviu and Philippine Constabulary Bands, and a big display of fireworks on the harina. No attempt was made to provide other important entertainment because it was thought that the public would prefer to spend their remaining time viewing the numerous interesting displays in the great Exhibit Palaces




opened for the first time to their inspection. The public marched through the streets of the City to the Exposition Grounds, where they were admitted in parade formation through the big gates by badges specially prepared and sold for this purpose. There were one hundred thousand of these souvenir badges issued and sold to adults only for fifty cents each. They admitted the holders only once to the Exposition Grounds and were not good after 6.00 P.M. A photograph of this badge is attached (also marked "D"). There were no military or spectacular features in this parade. It was simply an outpouring of citizens headed by the Governor of California, Hon. Hiram W. Johnson, and the Mayor of San Francisco, Hon. James Rolph, Jr.

SAN FRANCISCO DAY.

on Tuesday, November 2 (a legal holiday) were planned and conducted by me and my very efficient staff in the Department of Special Days and Events. I am proud and happy to say that in proportion to population all Exposition attendance records were broken on San Francisco Day. This despite the fact that the day was foggy and overcast. A




program of unusually interesting and attractive features was provided commencing in the morning with a brilliant Pageant-Parade of decorated floats and automobiles participated in by the Foreign and State Commissioners, a thrilling sham battle on the Race Track in the afternoon between the several thousand Federal troops and naval forces stationed in and around the City, and winding up with a spectacular reproduction in the Bay at night of the famous battle between the Merrimac and Monitor, in conjunction with a resplendent display of fireworks which proved a fitting climax to a most successful celebration. One of the particularly attractive features of San Francisco Day was the free distribution of over thirty thousand gifts by the Exhibitors and the cash prizes given by the Exposition management to the holders of lucky numbers on coupons attached to the handsome souvenir tickets sold for admission on this occasion. Specimens of these tickets are attached (also marked "E"). Adults tickets sold for 50 cents and childrens tickets for 10 cents each, but entitled the holders to only one admission. There were no official ceremonies on San Francisco Day. The attached program and photographs (marked "E") show the



principal attractions for the day.


The attendance on San Francisco Day was greatly stimulated by the Governor of California, who promptly issued a proclamation declaring that date. (Tuesday, November 2) a legal holiday. Governor Johnson also requested the Governors of all the other Pacific Slope States to call the attention of their citizens to this celebration and bespeak their attendance in as large numbers as possible. Mayor Rolph of San Francisco appointed a Municipal Committee for San Francisco Day and issued a similar proclamation. He also wrote the Pavors of many other cities in California asking them to do likewise. President Moore called a meeting of the big Ways and Means Committee of the Exposition, from which a San Francisco Day General Committee was selected with Mr. Samuel G. Buckbee as its Chairman. This Committee in turn selected an Executive Committee of Seven, consisting of Ir. James Horsburgh, Jr., (Chairman), Fr. Gustave Brenner, 1r. John F. Davis, Mr. R. L. Hotaling, Ir. L. W. Harris, Ir. W. H. Leahy and Mrs. Henry Payot. This Executive Committee immediately appointed a number of sub-Committees among the businessmen, transportation companies, manufacturers, labor, fraternal and other organizations which



waged a vigorous and systematic campaign that materially aided in producing the desired results. The united and enthusiastic cooperation given the Exposition management by all of these elements resulted in an attendance on San Francisco Day equal to 70% of the City's population. This percentage broke all records by surpassing Chicago Day, which had only 51% at the World's Columbian Exposition in 1893 and St. Louis Day with 57% at the Louisiana Purchase Exposition in 1904.

CLOSING DAY.

was the biggest day of all. Seventeen distinct ceremonies marked the day, in fourteen of which President Moore personally took part. Photographs (marked "F") are attached. The program (copy attached also marked "F") was replete with many attractions, chief among which were the Midday Exercises embracing the reading by President Moore of President Woodrow Wilson's International Toast, epitomizing the Exposition's idealism and achievements, accompanied by beautiful allegorical features. The unique exercises attending the official closings of the Exhibit Palaces, participated in by the President, the Director of Exhibits and Chiefs of the respective Departments, as per



photographs attached (also marked "F") illustrating two of these particular functions, the popular concert in Festival Hall during the afternoon, the grand night Pageant of electrically illuminated floats, the greatest display of fireworks ever seen in the West, and the Midnight Ceremonies when President Moore extinguished the lights and declared the Exposition closed forever. Especial credit is due Mr. Lawrence W. Harris of San Francisco for the beautiful allegorical program planned and directed by him covering these Midday Exercises.

The weather was perfect - - bright and balmy, with a cloudless sky. It was a remarkable contrast to the heavy rain and wind of the previous day which undoubtedly prevented thousands of people in nearby cities and towns from making arrangements to attend. The scheduled Automobile Races also had to be abandoned because of the soft condition of the Race Track. Nevertheless, practically the entire population of San Francisco turned out to bid a fond farewell to their beloved City's greatest and most successful achievement - - the Universal Exposition of 1915. A photograph (also marked "F") of the souvenir badge used on this occasion is likewise attached. One hundred thousand of these were sold and



admitted the holder as many times as desired on Closing Day.

Owing to the very effective results

obtained by the San Francisco Day Committee its members


were prevailed upon to perform similar service which

PLAN AND SCOPE OF CHLEBRATIONS.

the numerous special day celebrations special day celebrations and ceremonies at this Exposition would be a well-nigh endless task. The same is true of the many special event attractions and free entertainment. These special day celebrations were conducted on a high plane - - commensurate with the dignity and importance of the Exposition and the great national achievement it celebrated. A summary, therefore, of the general plan and scope of these functions is about all that is practicable and should afford a reasonably fair idea of their character and importance. Specimen invitations attached (marked "H").

### DEDICATORY FEATURES.

The first series of functions on the Calendar were the dedications of the Foreign Pavilions and State Buildings, as well as the participation by Counties, Cities and large industrial or other organizations. Specimen programs are attached (marked "G") from which it




will be seen that the main feature of these ceremonies was the presentation by the Exposition mana, enent to the Country, State, County, City or organization of a suitably inscribed bronze plaque commemorative of the occasion. This presentation was usually made by the President, or some other member of the Exposition Directorate, at the Pavilions or Buildings dedicated, and accepted in behalf of the celebrant by an Ambassador, linister, Governor or other special envoy sent here for this purpose, and towards the end of the Exposition by its principal resident representative at the Exposition. The ceremonies generally included addresses of welcome and felicitation by the National Exposition Commissioner of the United States, the Governor of California, the Mayor of San Francisco, as well as a leading official of the local society or Exposition auxiliary of the celebrating Country or State.

MINETING AND ESCORTING DELEGATIONS.

and States, whose delegations usually assembled at that particular Foreign Pavilion or State

Building where the ceremonies were to be held, the delegations of all other celebrants were, in nearly every instance, met at one of the Exposition gates by a formally attired Committee of Exposition

Officials and escorted by them with military and music to a




place selected in advance and suitably prepared with seats, platform and decorations for the ceremonies. If a Foreign diplomatic representative, Governor of a State or other high dignitary came here for the celebration the Exposition arranged for a troop of Cavalry to escort him from his hotel to the Exposition grounds where the United States Marines saluted and acted as a guard of honor. These attentions and facilities were provided in each instance without cost to the celebrant, as the Exposition's contribution to the success of the celebration. Favorite places for these ceremonies were the Courts of the Universe and Abundance, Festival Hall and the beautiful ball room of the California Building, in which latter practically all of the California County celebrations were held as a matter of sentiment.

NATIONAL, STATE, COUNTY, CITY AND ORGANIZATIONS:

These dedications were followed by
the celebration of many special days by Foreign
Countries, States, Cities, Counties and organizations.
CONGRESSES AND CONVENTIONS CELEBRATIONS.

Aside from the many special day celebrations scheduled on the Exposition Calendar by direct application to the Department, a large number were also scheduled through communications



sent by Mr. James A. Barr, Director of Congresses, to the nine hundred organizations and societies (national and international, State and Civic, industrial and scientific) which were due to hold congresses and conventions under the Exposition's auspices at San Francisco in 1915.

## COOPERATION BY EXPOSITION.

The Exposition gave the same cooperation to these as at the dedications. The form of ceremonies was very similar but in the great majority of cases a commemorative bronze medal was given to the celebrants instead of the plaque that was given during the first few months. When Foreign Countries and States sent high diplomatic representatives, Governors or other important special envoys to represent them at these National and State day celebrations, a commemorative tree was planted on the Foreign or State site by him and he was presented with a small casket of gems from the Tower of Jewels by the President or a Director of the Exposition. Otherwise the ranking Commissioner at the ceremonies received from the Exposition an Engrossed Testimonial for his Country or State and no tree was planted or jewels given.

## SPECIALN PROGRAMS.

Specimen programs (marked "H") are attached, showing the general character and scope of these ceremonies, in the arrangement of which valuable service was rendered by Mr. C. C. Henion,



the Exposition's Commissioner to State and Foreign Organizations.

ENTERTAINMENT OF CELEBRANTS.

The majority of these dedication
ceremonies and National or State Day celebrations were
preceded by a luncheon of thirty to one hundred covers
given by the President of the Exposition in the
Administration Building to the principal representative
of the celebrant. The President likewise gave
receptions and balls in the California Building in
honor of many of these celebrants who were also
frequently complimented by the Woman's Board with
dinners preceding these evening functions. Specimen
invitations attached (marked "H").


Altogether the Exposition presented





#### STOCKHOLDERS DAY.

Stockholders Day (Tuesday,

February 23) was the first celebration after Opening Day. This was held in honor of the fourteen thousand private subscribers, large and small, to the Exposition corporation's fund of \$7.500.000. This delegation was met at the Scott street entrance by President Moore and Directors of the Exposition, and escorted with music and military to Festival Hall where simple yet appropriate ceremonies were held. Mr. Stanley W. Morshead opening the proceedings as Temporary Chairman and introduced the permanent Chairman, Mr. Andrew Carrigan. President Moore stated that the purpose of the meeting was to give the Exposition's first official recognition after the opening to the stockholders whose prompt, generous and public-spirited subscriptions had made the holding of the Exposition possible. Mr. William J. Dutton, one of the five Voting Trustees of the Stockholders, made the response in their behalf.



JAPAN DEDICATION (First Foreign Celebration) .

Japan Dedication Day immediately followed on Wednesday, February 24, and was the first celebration by a Foreign Country. The morning opened with semi-religious ceremonies of typically Japanese character at Japan's National Pavilion, in which Commissioner Jiro Harada and the President's daughter Miss Josephine Moore, took the leading parts. Imposing exercises were held in Festival Hall during the afternoon, at which President Moore and Commissioner-General Haruki Yamawaki were the central figures. At the conclusion of these exercises the entire assemblage, escorted by military and music, rarched down to the Exposition Race Track where Japanese games, daylight fireworks and other forms of attractive entertainment were provided.

NEW YORK STATE DEDICATION.

New York State Dedication Day was scheduled for the first State Dedication on February 23 but was postponed until March 19 because of the inability of Hon. Seth Low, the Governor's special representative, to arrive before that date.

OHIO DEDICATION. (First State Celebration)

Ohio's dedication occurred on Thursday, February 25, and was therefore the first State
Building dedicated.


Recognition was also promptly


### DEDICATION OF THE EXPOSITION.

The Exposition was formally dedicated on Wednesday, March 24 by the Vice-President of the United States, Hon. Thomas R. Marshall, acting for President Woodrow Wilson whose urgent official duties prevented him from leaving Washington as planned for this important dedication. These ceremonies, presided over by President Moore, took place in the Court of the Universe and emphasized our Federal Government's acceptance and approval of the Exposition as this Country's national celebration of the opening of the Panama Canal. A vast throng was present among which were many distinguished personages, including the Foreign and State Commissioners to the Exposition, Secretary of the Interior Franklin K. Lane, Assistant Secretary of State William Phillips. Assistant Secretary of the Navy Franklin D. Roosevelt and other United States Government officials, prominent officers of the Army and Navy, California State and San Francisco City officials. Directors and officials of the Exposition.

#### EXPOSITION BUILDERS DAY.

Early and well merited recognition was given to the following contractors who built the Exhibit Palaces, etc.:


Their loyal and efficient employes were similarly recognized. This occasion was called Exposition Builders Day which was celebrated on Saturday, April 10, by exercises in the Court of the Universe. President Moore presented each of these contractors with commemorative silver medals and contractor Ralph McLeran responded in behalf of the recipients. The President likewise presented each of the workmen with a commemorative bronze lapel button and shook hands with them while doing so.

### ILLUMINATION NIGHT.

Similar recognition was accorded to Mr. Walter D'Arcy Ryan, Chief of the Department of Illumination, for his conspicuously important contributions to the illuminating effects at the Exposition. For this purpose Illumination Night was celebrated with several unique electrical features and an unusually brilliant display of fireworks in the evening of Tuesday, April 13. Appropriate ceremonies were held in the Court of the Universe at which President Moore recited Mr. Ryan's splendid service to the Exposition and in its behalf presented him with a commemorative bronze plaque.



Although repeated efforts had been made to induce President Woodrow Wilson to visit the Exposition, none were successful. President invariably expressed his keenest regret but felt that the unfortunate foreign situation would not permit of his being at such a great distance from his post in Washington. He nevertheless hoped until the last that developments would yet enable him to come and promised to make the trip if conditions permitted. In view of this uncertainty the Exposition determined to celebrate a special day in honor of the man - - Woodrow Wilson - - for his manifestly sterling qualities as a citizen of whom all Americans could well be proud without regard to party affiliations - - and trust to an opportunity being afforded later to do fitting honor to him as Chief Executive of the nation. With the cooperation of the Daily News of San Francisco and the Scripps-McRae Service Thursday, July 1, was therefore scheduled and celebrated as Woodrow Wilson Day at the Exposition. Mayor Rolph presided at the ceremonies in the Court of the Universe where laudatory addresses were also made by President Moore, Governor Johnson and Senator Phelan. Other interesting features on this




occasion were the pressing of a Western Union
Telegraph key in the White House by President
Wilson which unfurled the Stars and Stripes on
the platform at the Exposition where massed bands
led by John Philip Sousa at the same time played
the Historic Scenes Symphony. The entire celebration
was a fitting tribute to the nation's first citizen
and was joined in enthusiastically by the vast throng
present. Program attached (marked "J").

### INDEPENDENCE DAY.

Independence Day was most successfully celebrated on Monday, July 5, with appropriate ceremonies in the South Gardens, fronting the Tower of Jewels, at which Hon. William Jennings Bryan, former Secretary of State, was the orator of the day. Program attached (marked "K").

## LIBERTY BELL DAY.

Liberty Bell Day (Saturday, July 17)
to celebrate the arrival and installation of this
historic relic in the Pennsylvania Building at the
Exposition, also proved a wonderful magnet. Hon.
Champ Clark, Speaker of the United States House of
Representatives, delivered the principal address
at the ceremonies in front of the Fountain of
Energy. The Liberty Bell Escort, a Committee of
leading officials and citizens of Philadelphia.



likewise took a prominent part in the ceremonies,
which are depicted in the attached photographs - marked "L". The Bell reached San Francisco on
Friday evening and was escorted to the Exposition
grounds in a big military and naval parade on
Saturday, reaching the ceremonial platform at noon.
A pretty feature of the attached program (marked "L")
was the climax to the ceremonies when the Liberty Bell
was undraped and forty eight children, costumed to
represent the States of the Union, each placed a
wreath upon this beloved emblem of our freedom.

ROOSEVELT DAY.

Roosevelt Day was celebrated on
Wednesday, July 21. Colonel Theodore Roosevelt
was escorted with full military honors by United
States Cavalry from the Hotel St. Francis to the
Scott Street gate of the Exposition. There he
was met and saluted by the United States Marine
Corps Battalion who escorted him to the grounds
of the Enlisted Mens Club House, where he was
introducted by California State Commissioner Arthur
Arlett, planted a commemorative tree and addressed
the assembled troops. From the Enlisted Mens
Club House Colonel Roosevelt was escorted to the
Court of the Universe, where an enormous crowd
had congregated to hear his principal address on
War and Peace. President hoore presided and



Governor Johnson introduced the speaker, who was received and listened to with the greatest possible enthusiasm and attention. Program attached (marked "M").

TAFT DAY.


Taft Day (Thursday, September 2) served as a medium for a very hearty welcome to the man who, when President of the United States, gave the Exposition to California's metropolis because he believed and said that "San Francisco Knows How". Hon. William Howard Taft was escorted by a troop of United States Cavalry from the Palace Hotel to the Exposition Grounds. He planted a tree, amidst appropriate ceremonies presided over by Vice-President William H. Crocker, in the Garden separating the Chinese and the Argentine national pavilions. The second function of the day took place in the Court of the Universe where President Moore presided. Vice-President Reuben B. Hale presented Nr. Taft with a handsome silver loving cup from the Exposition in grateful remembrance of his well demonstrated friendship for the people of San Francisco. The ex-President responded in feeling terms and delivered a masterly address on "Preparedness". Program attached (marked "N").



Another particularly happy and significant occasion was the celebration of Out-of-Debt Day on Friday, September 3, as per copy of program and photographs attached (marked "0"). This important celebration marked the Exposition's emergence from the million dollar indebtedness which it had opened with on February 20 and proved an occasion of the greatest possible satisfaction and rejoicing to not only the citizens of San Francisco but to the people of the whole State of California as well. The principal features of this program were the presentation of the necessary certified check by President Moore to Vice-President James J. Fagan, of the San Francisco Clearing House, representing the holders of the Fortgage, and the very appropriate burning of this cancelled Vortgage by Hon. William Howard Taft, who when President of the United States awarded to San Francisco the privilege of holding the Exposition. The beautiful allegorical features of this ceremony were also arranged and conducted by Mr. Lawrence W. Harris of San Francisco to whom is due the fullest measure of credit for the success of this celebration.

#### GOETHALS DAY.


Goethals Day was scheduled on Tuesday, September 7, in honor of the Builder of the Panama Canal - Major General George W. Goethals, U.S. Army,



who was escorted from his hotel to the Exposition by a troop of United States Cavalry. The celebration comprised two functions, - - the first being the planting of a commemorative tree by the General in the Garden between the national pavilions of Argentina and China, and the second the ceremonies in the Court of the Universe where President Moore presented him with a box of Tower Jewels and General Goethals delivered a highly interesting and important address on the construction and maintenance of the great Panama Canal. ## EXPOSITION ENGINEERS DAY.

Engineers were deferred until September to permit
the attendance of the delegates to the great
International Engineering Congress which convened
at San Francisco during that month. Exposition
Engineers Day was therefore celebrated on Friday,
September 24, with exercises, in the Court of
Abundance, presided over by Vice-President William
H. Crocker, Chairman of the Buildings and Grounds
Committee. President Moore then presented special
bronze tablets to Nr. Harris D. H. Connick, the
Director of Works, and his eight principal assistants,
in recognition of the highly valuable service
rendered the Exposition by them. The Exposition



### EXPOSITION LANDSCAPE DAY.

The beautiful landscape gardening on the Exposition grounds which has delighted so many thousands of visitors was also properly recognized on Exposition Landscape Day at the Exposition, Saturday, October 9. Director James McNab, Vice-Chairman of the Buildings and Grounds Committee, was Chairman of the ceremonies in the South Garden at the East end of the Palace of Horticulture. Surrounded by an immense assemblage, Mr. John . McLaren, Chief of the Exposition Landscape Department, was presented with a large silver Loving Cup contributed by his many friends and admirers through subscriptions raised by the San Francisco Call and Post. This presentation was made by Mayor James Rolph, Jr., in behalf of these subscribers, and Chief McLaren was at the same time presented with a floral wreath by a little girl as a tribute of the affectionate regard in which he is held by the children of San Francisco. This was also the occasion for recognition of the



excellent service performed for the Exposition by
his son, Donald McLaren, Assistant Chief of the
Landscape Department, whom the Exposition honored
with a commemorative bronze plaque similar to the
one presented Chief John L. McLaren on Designers' Day.
UNITED STATES TREASURY DEPARTMENT DAY.

The presence of Hon. William G.

McAdoo, Secretary of the Treasury, was the feature
of United States Treasury Department Day at the
Exposition on Wednesday, October 20. The entire
ceremonies on this occasion took place in the
Garden between Argentina and China, where
Vice-President I. W. Hellman, Jr. presided,
The Secretary planted a commemorative tree and
received a box of Tower Jewels from President
Moore. Program attached (marked "Q").

### EDISON DAY.

No man in the world could have had cause for more pride and gratification than Mr.

Thomas A. Edison at the very enthusiastic and generous reception given him at the Exposition.

Wherever he went a crowd of admirers followed and applauded. It was a continual ovation and tribute to the great inventor and his modest, wholesome personality. Thursday, October 21, was set aside as Edison Day. The ceremonies were held in Festival Hall, with Director John A. Britton presiding.



President Moore presented Mr. Edison with a commemorative bronze medal. An eloquent response was made in his behalf by Mr. Samuel Insull, President of the Commonwealth Edison Company of Chicago, a life-long friend and business associate of Mr. Edison. As Festival Hall was filled to its capacity of four thousand people and its doors had to be closed to many other thousands clamoring for admittance, Mr. Tdison was taken to the Court of the Universe where the immense overflow assembled simply to have a glimpse at this great man whose inventions had accomplished so much for the comfort, convenience and enjoyment of humanity. One of the most touching incidents of his stay here was the splendid tribute of respect and affection baid him by the schoolchildren of San Francisco and the surrounding Counties. Over thirty thousand of these children assembled in the Court of the Universe on Monday afternoon, October 25, and gave him a whole-hearted, truly California reception. No speeches were made. Mr. Edison simply stood in the bandstand with bared head, his good wife at the left and the "plant wizard" - - Luther Burbank - - on the right, while the Official Band played and the children sang patriotic airs under the direction of Miss Estelle Carpenter, Supervisor of Music in the public schools.



vice-President Hale was the Exposition's representative and the schools were represented by Mr. George E. Gallagher, President of the Board of Education and Superintendent Alfred Roncovieri. School officials from the outside Counties were also present. The very happy suggestion for this public reception was made by Congressman Julius Kahn of San Francisco, with a view of not only affording the thousands of children here an opportunity to see Mr. Edison themselves but to enable them to tell their offspring that they had enjoyed the privilege of seeing this wonderful man whose name and achievements will undoubtedly form one of the brightest chapters in the world's history of inventions.

### PORTOLA DAY

the potent influence exercises by the Portola


Festival of 1909 upon the people of San Francisco,
which confirmed their confidence in their ability
to successfully organize and conduct a great world's
exposition and emphasized the fact that the people
of this community were thoroughly equipped and
fully capable of properly entertaining the Foreign
Nations and States, the Exposition designated
Saturday, October 23 as Portola Day. A very
attractive program was prepared by the Committee
on Arrangements - - Nr. Paul T. Carroll (Chairman),



Mr. James Woods and Mr. J. Frank Moroney. The celebration opened with a Barbecue in the 101 Ranch on the Zone, at which President Moore extolled the achievements of the Portola Festival Committee and presented its Executive Committee with a commemorative bronze medal which was received by the Chairman. Mr. Philip T. Clay - also a Director of the Exposition. President Moore referred with pride and satisfaction to the fact that he likewise was a member of the Portola Executive Committee. He also expressed the hope that the celebration of Portola Day at the Exposition would help serve to keep alive the splendid "Portola spirit" which is such a valuable asset to San Francisco. An address of felicitation was likewise delivered by Mayor Rolph and the exercises were brought to a close with humorous remarks by Mr. "Larry" W. Harris. The Barbecue was followed by an attractive parade of decorated automobiles and floats through the Exposition grounds and the celebration was concluded by a fancy dress ball in the Motor Transportation Building that night.

# WOMAN'S BOARD DAY.

A special day was celebrated in honor of the Woman's Board on Friday, October 29, with exercises in the Court of Abundance, presided over



Women's Affairs Committee. President Moore presented an Engrossed Testimonial of appreciation to the Woman's Board which was accepted by the Honorary President, Mrs.

Phoebe A. Hearst and responded to by its President Mrs. Frederick C. Sanborn. Felicitating addresses were likewise delivered by Mayor Rolph, California State Commissioner Arlett, and Hon.

John F. Davis representing the Travelers Aid Society of California which had cooperated so closely and effectively with the Woman's Board for the protection and care particularly of visiting young girls during the Exposition.

### LIBURTY BELL FAREWELL DAY.

in the Pennsylvania Building from July 17 until
November 10. Tributes of respectful admiration
and patriotic love were paid to this great relic
daily by thousands of visitors at the Exposition,
and it is conceded on all sides that no single
object of display here was viewed with so much
reverence and sincere affection. On Wednesday,
November 10, the Bell was placed upon a handsomely
decorated float and escorted to the Fountain of
Energy where the Liberty Bell Farewell Day
ceremonies were held. Program and photographs




attached (marked "R"). The official party from Philadelphia, known as the "Liberty Bell Escort", was present, headed by United States Senator Boies Penrose, who was the orator of the day. A beautiful feature of these ceremonies was the placing of floral wreaths upon the Bell by the Foreign and State Commissioners as a mark of their respect and esteem. At the conclusion the float was placed under the arch of the Tower of Jewels where it remained under guard with a searchlight playing upon it until the following morning when it was escorted to the Van Ness gate by the President and Exposition officials and from there to the depot by the Liberty Bell Escort and a large procession of military and naval forces under command of Major General Arthur Murray and Rear Admiral W. F. Fullam.

### CALIFORNIA DAY.

Saturday, November 20, with appropriate ceremonies in the garden fronting the East end of the California Building. Hon. Matt I. Sullivan, President of the California State Commission, presided and the other members were present in the persons of Messrs. Chester W. Rowell, Arthur Arlett and Marshall Stimson; also Secretary

F. J. O'Brien, Executive Secretary Harry H. Cosgriff




Testimonials were presented to Mr. W. D. Egilbert,
Commissioner of the California Building, and to the
various Counties by Vice-President Reuben K. Hale,
Chairman of the Exposition Board's Committee on
Exhibits. A response in behalf of the Counties

Angeles. The principal feature of these ceremonies,
however, was the planting of a commemorative
California Redwood tree by Governor Hiram W. Johnson,

Many other notable special days were celebrated with appropriate ceremonies, attractive processions and uniformed drills, elaborate entertainment and varied amusements. Chief among these celebrations were St. Patricks Day, Examiner Day, May Day, Zone Day, Decoration Day, Exhibit Departments Days, Newspapermen's Day, Call and Post Day, Labor Day, Insurance Days, Masonic Days, Shriners Day, Elks Day, Eagles Day, Odd Fellows Day, Pythian Day, Admission Day, and Thanksgiving Day. Mayor John Purroy Mitchell of New York, Nayor William Hale Thompson of Chicago and




the Mayors of other Cities were present at
the celebration of special days in honor of
their municipalities. These Cities were
presented by the Exposition with commemorative
bronze medals which were usually received by their
Mayors. The City Administration of San Francisco
was similarly honored and the medal was accepted

appropriate ceremonies in the reception room of

NOTABLE CITIZENS DAYS.

invited by the President of the Exposition to appoint Committees to select the most notable citizen in their respective commonwealths as living exhibits of man's development and progress in scientific, industrial and humanitarian lines. This distinction was conferred by eleven States upon the notable citizens in whose honor special days were designated and appropriate ceremonies held on the Exposition grounds when they came here for this purpose. These ceremonies included the presentation of a commemorative bronze medal and were preceded by a luncheon tendered by the

t t  President in the Administration Building.

- By Alabama, Hon. Oscar W. Underwood, United States Senator, special day celebrated October 18.
- By Arizona, Dr. L. D. Ricketts, capitalist and mining expert; special day celebrated
- By Idaho, Hon. James H. Hawley, ex-Governor of Idaho; visited Exposition before appointed "Notable Citizen" and was unable to come again.
- By Mississippi, Hon. John Sharp Williams, United States Senator; unable to come.
- By Missouri, Hon. Champ Clark, Speaker of the United States House of Representatives; visited Exposition before appointed "Notable Citizen" and was unable to come again.
- By North Dakota, Hon. E. F. Ladd, National Food Expert; unable to come.
- By Rhode Island, Dr. William Herbert Perry Faunce, Educator and Scientist; unable to come.
- By Wisconsin, Hon. W. D. Hoard, ex-Governor; unable to come.



At the suggestion of the President of the Exposition a number of the Foreign and State Commissions established the very welcome custom of weekly. bi-weekly or monthly At Home Days in their respective pavilions and buildings where, assisted by their local National and State auxiliaries, the Commissioners would formally receive and entertain their countrymen and former countrymen, previous residents of their States and other guests. In like manner they also held Home Weeks for the congregation or assembling of their home-folk. All of these functions materially aided in forming pleasant acquaintanceships and cementing the bonds of mutual interest and goodwill among the visitors to the Exposition. In this connection the Department of Special Days and Events gave considerable assistance by furnishing to the various Commissions at its expense a specially compiled nativity list containing the names and addresses of approximately eighty thousand natives of the States and of Foreign Countries who are now residents of San Francisco and the nine Counties within a hundred mile radius of this City.

DIRECTORS AT CEREMONIES.

In addition to the President of the Exposition the following members of the Board of



Directors agreed to represent the Exposition and speak at official ceremonies as often as their other engagements permitted:



Aside from the President those most active in speaking at the various ceremonies were Vice-Presidents Hale and de Young and Director Brown. Vice-President Rolph spoke on a great many occasions but nearly always as Mayor of San Francisco; when unable to be present himself he was represented by his able Secretary, Mr. Edward R. Rainey. The remaining Directors were uncertain, declined to commit themselves in this connection or were not otherwise available.

In view of the limited list of Directors available for this service, especially during the last half of the Exposition period, it became necessary to utilize the services of Commissioner Charles A.Vogelsang and the Chief of Domestic Exploitation, Mr. Colvin B. Brown, both of whom rendered frequent and splendid service in this connection. On some occasions the Directors of Divisions as well as the Director of Congresses, the Director of Music, and the Chiefs of Departments officiated in this capacity.

UNITED STATES NATIONAL EXPOSITION COMMISSION.

Hon. William Bailey Lamar, resident member of the National Exposition Commission for




the United States spoke in behalf of the Federal Government at nearly all of the Foreign and State dedications and National or State days. The other two members of the Commission were Hon. William Phillips, Third Assistant Secretary of State and Hon. Franklin D. Roosevelt, Assistant Secretary of the Navy, who were present at the Exposition only during Vice-President Marshall's visit.

### CALIFORNIA STATE COMMISSION.

The State of California was ably represented at the majority of these official functions by Hon. Chester H. Rowell and Hon. Arthur Arlett, members of the California State Commission to the Exposition. Occasionally Hon. Matt I. Sullivan, President of this Commission, and Hon. Marshall Stimson, the remaining member, were present and spoke for the State.

#### ARMY'S COOPERATION.

Major General Arthur Murray for the invaluable assistance so often rendered it in escorting distinguished guests of the Exposition to the Exposition grounds, and for the indispensable part his troops always took in the numerous parades, drills, sham battles and other formal functions held under our auspices. The Exposition publicly testified its appreciation of this valued cooperation by celebrating United States Army Day with appropriate ceremonies on Monday, November 29. On this occasion the United States Army was presented with a commemorative bronze medal which was received



by Major General Lurray and forwarded by him to the War Department at Washington.

NAVY'S COOPERATION.


We are likewise indebted to Rear-Admirals C. F. Pond and W. F. Fullam, and Captain Philip Andrews of the Naval Training Station here for their highly valued cooperation in firing salutes from the warships and the participation of the forces under their command in the various parades, shambattles and other exercises and events at the Exposition. The Navy was also very properly honored with a special day on Friday, Hovember 26, which was designated United States Navy Day. A commemorative bronze medal was presented by the Exposition to the United States Navy and received in its behalf by Rear Admiral Fullar who likewise forwarded this medal to Washington for the Navy Department's archives.

#### MARINES! COOPERATION

The United States Marine Corps

Battalion camped on the Exposition grounds played an important part in the life of the Exposition.

The Commandant, Lieutenant-Colonel John F. Tyers and his staff were at all times ready and willing to assist this Department with companies of larines in receiving and escorting distinguished



Exposition grounds, taking part in the numerous

Foreign and State ceremonies, and otherwise
helping us to successfully conduct many of the
important functions connected with particularly
large special day celebrations. This Marine Battalion
likewise gave several drills weekly which proved a
source of great interest and admiration. The
unexpected departure of this splendid body of men
for martial duty in Mexico shortly before the closing
of the Exposition was a source of the keenest regret
to their friends and admirers who were legion.

EXPOSITION GUARD'S COOPERATION.

Last but not least is the debt

of gratitude the Department of Special Events is

under to the Exposition Guard. The Commandant,

Captain Edward Carpenter, and his efficient staff

always cheerfully responded to the frequent calls

made upon them for members of the Guard to do

escort duty, aid in policing and ushering at

systematic and harmonious conduct of the hundreds



# SPECIAL EVENTS:

#### AUTOMOBILE RACES

The immense attendance at the famous Grand Prix race on Saturday, February 27 and at the Vanderbilt Cup race on Saturday,


March 6 conclusively proved that the public are as fond as ever of high speed automobile racing.

Practically all of the world's available crack drivers participated. Dario De Resta won both classics, whose courses each covered a circle of four miles within the Exposition grounds - around the Race Track and the main group of Exhibit Palaces. The contenders were:

#### AEROPLANE FLIGHTS.

The many up-to-date Aeroplane flights were unquestionably the most spectacular and remunerative of the Exposition's Special Event attractions. These commenced with the remarkable tri-weekly Aeroplane flights by Aviator Lincoln Beachy. These started Sunday, February 21 and Sunday, continued until Saturday, March 14 when they were brought to an untimely end by the collapsing of the



wings of Beachey's new Biplane, resulting in his sudden death that afternoon. This sad occurrence seemed to lead to the conclusion that it would be the end of fancy Aeroplane exhibitions at the Exposition, but the shock of the unfortunate accident had scarcely passed away before the dead aviator was most worthily succeeded by little "Art" Smith (photograph attached marked "V") whose daring flights, modesty and lovable personality quickly won him an enviable place in public favor. He soon became a "popular idol" and the greatest drawing card at the Exposition, thousands upon thousands gathering at the Marina to see him fly and watching his remarkable flights with breathless admiration. "Art" was given a splendid ovation when his ten weeks' contract ended on August 8 and he left to fill engagements in the East. He was given another great ovation upon his return November 7 to fly during the last four weeks of the Exposition. He had an exclusive contract to make two daylight flights and two illuminated night flights weekly. Soon after Smith's departure Aviators Charles F. Niles (known as "Do-Anything-Niles") and the celebrated Uruguayan Aviator, Silvio Petirossi, began their engagements - - August 29. Both used biplanes and each gave four thrilling exhibitions every



week - - two in the daytime and two night

flights. Petirossi's engagement ended October

23 and Niles finished November 6. The very

remarkable work done by these wonderful "birdmen"

demonstrated the fact that more sustained interest

was created by aviation than any other single

feature of the Exposition. A new and extremely

difficult standard of flying was established and

the Marina was invariably crowded every time these

intrepid men went aloft.

CHILDREN'S DANCING EXHIBITIONS AND GAMES.

Many exhibitions of "folk-dances"
and other national and fancy dancing in costume
were given, generally outdoors on the Marina or
in the Music Concourse, by children especially
adept in this form of entertainment. The pupils
of Miss Ida Wyatt of San Francisco were most
prominent and won the warmest admiration and
praise for the charm and grace of their exhibitions.
These sometimes played an important part in the
Children's games held on the Marina which afforded
unbounded delight and amusement to the many
thousands of young ones who participated.

FIREWORKS DISPLAYS AND SCINTILLATOR DRILLS.

Fireworks and Scintillator Drills
were given usually three times weekly, a full
description of which will doubtless be found




in the reports of the Chief Mechanical and
Electrical Engineer and the Chief of Illumination.

PAGEANT-PLAYS AND PARADES.

A number of brilliant pageants and plays were given, the most notable of which were The Landing of Junipero Serra, Fire, The Pageant of the Padres. The Pageant of lonterey, in the Court of the Universe: and A Night in Hawaii, The Birth of the Poppy, and The Pageant of Elaine by La Loie Fuller and her company, on the front of Sculpture Hall and the Fine Arts Palace lagoon. The pageant-parade of decorated automobiles and floats entered by the Foreign Nations and States on San Francisco Day, and the grand night parade of electrically illuminated floats on Closing Day were most attractive. Big delegations from California Counties and other celebrating organizations marched through the streets of the City and the Exposition grounds with music and handsomely decorated floats on their special days, and there were frequent large and brilliant military parades by the Army and Naval forces stationed in and around San Francisco.

FREE CONCERTS AND SHOWS.

There were many free concerts, indoors and outdoors, including massed bands with Sousa and Conway leading, vocal and other instrumental



offerings by prominent artists, and choral work by the great Exposition Chorus of three hundred finely trained male and female voices; also the Baby Show, Doll Day, La Gai performances, Fall of Babylon and Siege of Troy spectacles, Fashion Shows, Lawn Fetes, Fire Drills, Life Saving Drills by the United States Coast Guard. illuminated water carnivals and many other attractive forms of entertainment provided without cost to Exposition visitors. These events were mostly planned and nanaged by Chief of Special Days Louis Levy to whose enthusiasm, resourcefulness and untiring energy their success is largely due. In this connection mention must be made of the popular daily free dansants and musicales conducted by the Woman's Board in the beautiful Ball and Reception rooms of the California Building.

# MARILIBA BAND.

The Marimba Band, brought here for the first time by the Guatemala Commission, speedily became one of the sensations of the Exposition and was accordingly listed by us as a special event attraction. The instrument itself is over twelve feet long and has wooden "keys" arranged as in the xylophone. It is played similar to the latter but, unlike the xylophone, each key of the Marimba is equipped with a novel "resonator" - - a triangular


The state of the s ( ( wooden tube that reverbrates with tremendous sonority as the key is struck. The effects produced by the half dozen or more players are fairly startling and its melodious tones simply delight the listener beyond expression. Marimba concerts were given frequently at the Guatemalan National Pavilion and this entertaining music was much in demand also at banquets, dances and receptions elsewhere on the Exposition grounds.

SPECIAL PUBLICITY AND PROMOTION OF SPECIAL DAYS AND EVENTS.

Under the able and energetic management of Ar. Lowell Hardy, and his principal assistant Mr. Guy R. Kinsley, the Bureau of Publicity for Special Days and Special Events was established at the beginning of the Exposition period.

In December 1914, two months previous to Opening Day, the work of the Promotion of Special City and County Days for California and the Western States was inaugurated, and with the opening of the Exposition, these two Departments were consolidated.


The promotion work was done by a staff of twelve experienced Field Commissioners. among whom the Counties of the State were distributed. These Commissioners went at once into their various territories where their operations consisted of



having meetings called, and getting definite dates set for City and County celebrations at the Exposition.

These dates were purposely set for the early Spring, when the attendance would be normally light. The value of this work was demonstrated by the results, due largely to the energetic and tactful labors of Commissioners Fred R. Reed, Carey S. Hill and Rossiter Mikel whose services were accordingly retained to the end of the Exposition.

Between February 20 and the middle of May, special County and City celebrations representing every County in the State of California, all of the principal Cities, and many of the other adjoining States were successfully held. These special days brought many thousands of people from all sections of the State, materially increasing the attendance, and spreading a most desirable knowledge of the Exposition throughout a wide territory. So well impressed were the people of the Counties throughout the State with the beneficial result of these excursions, centering largely in the extensive and valuable publicity given their section through the operations of the Bureau of Special Publicity, that not once, but in some cases four and five times during the Exposition period, the same Counties held additional special days, featuring their various products.



The Special Publicity Department
of this Bureau was headed by Mr. Guy R. Kinsley,
with a force of four additional writers, acting
under the direction of Mr. Lowell Hardy and it is
due to the close cooperation between the subdivisions
of the Bureau of Special Publicity and Promotion that
the great success achieved was accomplished.

To the press of California in general, and the San Francisco dailies in particular, is due the greatest possible praise and credit for their public-spirited attitude towards the Exposition and especially for the exceedingly liberal manner in which they treated the advance news celebrations.

During the nine and a half months

of the Exposition period, there appeared in the

local papers of San Francisco, coming from this

Bureau, about 12,500 columns of reading matter,

approximating 225,000 inches, all bearing on the


Special Pays and Special Events at the Exposition.

The larger portion of this enormous local publicity

was advance matter operating to stimulate interest

and attendance on these particular days.


In addition to this, all of the principal papers on the Pacific Coast were furnished with special publicity matter bearing on events of special interest to their respective



communities. No accurate record of the publicity thus attained is available. Great credit is due to Manager Lowell Hardy and his staff for the enterprising and vigorous manner in which his special publicity campaign was planned and conducted. He was at all times "on the job" and not only never missed an opportunity to spread the gospel of Special Days and Events but sought and created many openings from which valuable publicity was obtained both in the San Francisco dailies and in the press throughout California.

## ADVERTISING SPECIAL DAYS AND EVENTS.


Extensive advertising by billposting, display cards, hangers and similar outdoor and indoor methods was done to call the public's attention to the numerous interesting celebrations and attractive special event features at the Exposition. The results speak for themselves in the remarkable patronage the Exposition began to enjoy when this policy was adopted soon after the Special Events activites were consolidated with the Special Days management in the latter part of May. This character of advertising was planned and handled by Chief of Special Events Cooley who deserves great credit for the painstaking and intelligent manner in which he performed this important work as well as his conduct of the Aeroplane flights and



Automobile races at the Exposition. A very material help in this connection was the small display ads the Exposition ran daily in the columns of the local newspapers. Responsibility and credit for the attractive form in which these advertisements appeared devolved upon Fr. Guy R. Kinsley, Assistant Fanager of Publicity for Special Days and Events.

I also take this occasion to express


my sincere appreciation of the wise and sympathetic

Department of the Exposition with whom my Department


had any business, for their unfailing and cheerful

Helen Lane, Secretary of this Department, from the beginning to the end of the Exposition. She displayed rare intelligence, tact and executive



believe that all who have engaged in the great undertaking this Exposition represents have realized the full truth of the maxim that


