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

Preface.

HE first book of the Parish Registers of Madron is a small folio volume of two hundred and eighteen pages: of these just two hundred are well filled with entries, ten are more or less written upon, and eight are blank. The leaves are of parchment, many of them being in a very dilapidated condition. A few of the entries are altogether illegible, others have been in part or entirely torn away, and some even ruthlessly cut off by the trimming knife of the bookbinder.

The early part of the Register of Baptisms is unfortunately lost—that is to say from the year 1577, at which date the Registers of Marriages and Burials commence, to the year 1592—and at various places throughout the book a leaf or more is wanting. The earliest entry is that of the burial of John, son of Richard Fynnie, dated 20th May, 1577. From this time to the year 1607 the entries that remain are neatly and clearly written in the same hand, and are evidently transcribed from older manuscript, according to Canon 70, of 1603, though damp has made sad havor with the first four pages. The fact that they are transcribed must be borne in mind, and will suggest the possibility of clerical errors, as well as account for certain minor inconsistencies. Judging from the manuscript and from the varying colour of the ink, it appears to have been the custom not to make the entries in the book one by one as they occurred, but to write in a large batch of a year or more at a time; and it is noticeable that when a new handwriting appears it is usually at the commencement of the year, old style. The date at which a certain handwriting ends, and the known date of the death of an incumbent, do not coincide. It is plain then that in those days the incumbent did not himself write the entries in the book in which they are now preserved, but he probably kept a rough register of Baptisms, Marriages, and Burials, which was periodically copied into the volume destined for its reception.

The following pages contain virtually a complete copy of the record that has been handed down to us,—
the oft-recurring "was baptized," "was married," with similar repetitions, being the only words omitted,
and these are here replaced by the heading lines. Wherever an entry or a page is missing, its absence
is indicated by a line of dots or asterisks. All names of persons and places have been scrupulously copied
letter by letter from the original, and the eccentricities and variations in spelling (which it seemed to me
very desirable to preserve) will form not the least interesting feature in the book. Erasures, interlineations,
or peculiarities, are for the most part noticed at the foot of each page on which they occur, but additional
scraps of information will in some cases be found under the date of the entries, in the notes which follow
the Appendix.

A person accustomed only to nineteenth century writing would probably not find it an easy matter to decipher the antiquated caligraphy of a past age, but it is the partial obliteration which has taken place that makes the interpretation so difficult in the present case. Those only who have been engaged upon a similar undertaking can form any estimate of the time and trouble involved in such a task. In reading the black-letter portion of the manuscript, there is the common difficulty in distinguishing n's from u's, between which there is absolutely no difference in appearance. Two m's are equally perplexing, for when

these letters occur together it is impossible to determine, except by the surroundings, whether they are m's, n's, or u's. Since three strokes stand for m, and two for n or u, so six strokes might represent two m's or nm, as well as the interchanges that can be produced with these three letters; but each of these combinations would be written thus nmu, and as u also frequently stands for v the complication may be carried further. With regard therefore to such manes as Saundry, Launder, Frauncis, etc., it is quite a matter for consideration whether they should be read Sanndry, Launder, and Francis, or as above; but having spelt these and like names as appears to me to be most probably correct, I here call attention to the subject so that others may form their own opinion. No great stress however need be laid on this difficulty as a source of error in the present instance, for after the black letter (which includes the transcribed portion) ceases, with the year 1607, the names mentioned will be found clearly written in both ways.

Among male Christian names there are few that are very strange or unusual, though there are many that to modern cars sound quaint and old-fashioned. Perhaps the most curious are Emmett (p. 7:). Halenight (which has its antithesis Loveday among the names of women, p. 12:), Madern (in every possible variety of spelling) and Morva (p. 41:) from the parishes so named, Rowan (p. 3.), and Udye (p. 45:). With regard to Christian names of women, free scope has been given to the imagination, and, besides being quite as quaint as those of the opposite sex, they are far more varied and fanciful. We find:— Addama (p. 24.), Anquite (p. 22:), Armanell (p. 28.), Duens (p. 10.), Earth (p. 16.), Ebbott (p. 8:), Eppow (p. 54:), Fortune (p. 44:), Gratiana (p. 22:), Jaquelinah (p. 24:), Jaquite (p. 22:), Jellyan (p. 33.), Jenefred (p. 37.) and Jenyfret (p. 35:), Lovedye (p. 27.) and Lowdy (p. 33.), Kay (p. 58:) and Key (p. 51:), Mellioner (p. 43.), Mildren (p. 19.), Milson (p. 32.), Norowe (p. 43.), Olsett (p. 29.), Pascus (p. 8.) and Pasques (p. 55.), Porthesia (p. 24:), Redigon (p. 8.), Richo (p. 5:), Syve (p. 48.), Tamer (p. 19.), Tammeris (p. 23:), Temperance (p. 31.), Tiberia (p. 7:), Wany (p. 5:), and many others. Sometimes too the names of men are used for those of women; thus-Nicholl (p. 13:) and Pascow (p. 31.) are frequently so used, though probably the latter was intended for Pascha, the feminine of Pascoe (which by the way is vulgarly prenounced Paska in this neighbourhood), signifying Easter child; and throughout, Philip is as frequently written for a woman's name as for a man's,—there is absolutely no means of distinguishing between the two except by the context; but where it is evident that the feminine name is intended, Philippa has been used in the Index. Certain names, now understood to be entirely distinct from each other, were formerly—as we find by these Registers—often written indiscriminately the one for the other. Such are Nicholas and Nicholls, Reginald and Reynold, Gerard and Garret, Pearce and Peres, Maurice and Morish, &c., with several different ways of spelling the same names.

Surnames too it appears were used in a vague and uncertain manner, and were sometimes assumed or given with an utter disregard to all hereditary nomenclature, which at the present day would be most inconvenient and unjustitiable. "The son of Nicholas, the joyner" (p. 43:), "one Richard, a poore man" (p. 45:), "Margarett, an Irishe woman" (p. 42:), and numerous others, have little for which to thank the scribe who carolled their names in the Parish Record. The unsettled state of surnames is further proved and exemplified by the following rather long list of aliases which occur in this book:—

Thanks to the imperfect but phonetic spelling of the period, it is easy to determine how the names of persons and places were then pronounced; and, since there is a tendency to disguise the sound of our Cornish names in such a manner that we do not know them with their foreign ring, it is well that we have some means of refreshing our memories with the original pronunciation. As a rule in all Cornish names the accent is laid on the second syllable in words of two syllables, and on the next to the last in words of more than two. There are some exceptions, but, for the most part, names, differently accentuated by the inhabitants of the more remote districts, are not essentially Cornish. Surely Lord Penzance does not take his title from the name of this little borough any more than Marazion is to be found on the shores of Mount's Bay; and can it be possible that young Tom Tresider (of the Guards) and Nugent Nankivell (of the Civil Service) are any relation to the true Cornish families of Tresider and Nankivell? The saints who have given their names to the parishes in this neighbourhood—St. Madern or Madron among them-were not of Cornish extraction. France sent holy men and women to the south coast, and Ireland supplied the west with prodigies of goodness and of prowess. A mere eccentricity of spelling would not be likely to mislead an expert, nor need a novice be disappointed if he fails at first to recognise the name he seeks. We know that it is possible to spell some words, correctly as to sound, without a single letter that rightly belongs to them, and, judging from what I have seen of Parish Registers, it would not be advisable to give up search until extremes have been reached.

From an historical point of view something may be indirectly learnt from these pages, though they are particularly barren in those quaint notes and pithy bits of information, which often add so much to the value and interest of such old books; still even here we can read the signs of the times and draw our inferences. That the custom of not solemnizing Marriages during Lent was, for the most part, strictly observed in this parish, is very evident. It is noteworthy too that there are no registers either of Baptisms, Marriages, or Burials for the year 1595, the year of the attack of a party of Spaniards upon Paul, Newlyn, and Penzance; but there is no allusion to the marauders, as in the Registers of Paul. The Commonwealth and Puritanical times have left their mark on these Registers, though happily they then escaped with less disturbance than those of many other parishes. Whether we must attribute the unsatis-

factory state of the record towards the end of the 17th century to the general laxity of post-restoration days, or to the troubled times of the greater revolution, is uncertain: more probably a non-resident vicar was to blame, for notwithstanding that Master Reginald Trenhayle may have busied himself about affairs of state—and his bones found a resting-place in Westminster Abbey—still the confused entries, written by many hands during the later years of his incumbency, tend to prove that he neglected his parochial duties. Immorality leaves but comparatively slight traces of its existence: there are in all about sixty entries of Baptism and Burial of illegitimate children, and previously to 1630 such entries are most frequently marked by the addition of the word spur, a contraction of spurius (p. 46.); sometimes, and more rarely, by a harder name. Nor have we any reason for supposing that there was any suppression of the truth, since it is plain that our predecessors did not hesitate to call a spade a spade. During the reign of the Merry Monarch the Register is peculiarly free from entries of this nature.

Probably the sanitary arrangements of the inhabitants of the parish, three and even two centuries ago, were not as complete as they might have been. There are indications that infectious diseases were somewhat prevalent at certain periods; the entry of burial of one member of a family being not unfrequently followed by other such entries of the same. Upon two occasions the locality was visited by a very fatal sickness or plague: it appeared first in 1578, and again in 1647, lasting about six months (from June to November) at each outbreak. The first visitation was the more fatal,—whole families seem to have been swept away; and at one time the number of burials reached as many as five a day. Not less than one hundred and fifty persons were buried within the time mentioned, whilst the average death-rate previously, and for some time after, did not exceed three per month. In the previous year the celebrated Black Assizes took place at Oxford—the gool fever having broken out on the seventh of July, 1577—though there could scarcely have been any connexion between the two, and it most probably was but a local epidemic of a very serious nature. The second visitation is mentioned more than once by "Alexander Paniel, of Largan," to whose manuscript I have so often referred in the notes. Besides speaking of the vicar of Madron, John Keat, who died at Nanceglos as was "supposed of ye plague," he says in the smaller volume of his manuscript, under July, 16-t7, "My daughtr, Jaquelina, sick of a feaver nere to death. She doubted lest if she had died then (the plague being at Pensance and in Maddren Parish) they would report that she died of e post, but I willd her to joine in prayer to God," etc. From this it appears that a certain amount of reproach was attached to the disease.

Some four hundred times do we find the badge of gentility in one form or another in these pages. Just eighty-two names have "Mr." prefixed, whilst the greater part of the remainder are distinguished by having the word "gent" appended. There are but five esquires (the title occurring seven times only), and since they are so few it may be well to mention them. They are—Richard Lanyon (p. 7.), Richard Trevannyon (p. 30.), William Harris, of Kenegy (p. 38.), John Lanyon (pp. 45, 50; 51.), and Francis Jones (p. 56.). Twice, and twice only, do we find a higher title, and that in Sir John H (p. 37.), and Sir Thomas Fanshowe (p. 56:). The decaying page hinders our learning more of the former: the latter is not unknown in the chronicles of his country. He held the office of Remembrancer in the Court of Exchequer, and upon the death of his father, in 1665, inherited his title of Lord Viscount Fanshawe, of Donamore, in Ireland. His eldest half-sister married Sir Christopher Hatton, heir to the Lord Chancellor of that name. He was twice married: first to Catherine, daughter and heiress of Knighton Ferrers, Esq., of Bedford-bury, in Hertfordshire, and secondly to Sarah, daughter of John Evelyn, Esq., of West Dene, in Surrey, and widow of Sir John Wray, of Glentworth, in Lincolnshire. That he is the person referred to in the Register is evident from the Memoirs of Lady Fanshawe. She writes (at p. 57);-"I was at Penzance with my father, and in the same town was my brother Fanshawe and his lady and children. My father and that family embarked for Morlaix, in Brittany, with my father's new wife, which PREFACE. ix

he had married out of that family. My cousin Fanshawe, of Jenkins, and his eldest son being with them went also over, but being in a small vessel of that port and surprised with a great storm, they had all like to have been east away, which forced them to land in a little creek, two leagues from Morlaix, upon the 28th of March, 1646; and five days after the Prince* and all his council embarked themselves in a ship called the Phœnix, for the Isles of Scilly. They went from the Lands-end, and so did we; being accompanied with many gentlemen of that country, among whom was Sir Francis Basset, Governor of the Mount, an honest gentleman, and so were all his family; and in particular we received great civility from them."

With regard to the state of trade in this locality during the period comprised within this first book of the Registers, we have but slight particulars upon which to base an opinion. The terms merchant and smith occur just twenty and ten times respectively, but they refer more than once to the same individual; and it is hardly possible during all this time that there could have been but one cutler, one glover, one joiner, one shoemaker, or one coffin maker, yet no more are mentioned.

The old mode of registration ended with the year 1812. Books of a different character were then required by law, and it so happened that at Madron, when the change was made, a new book had lately been commenced, and was but little written in. Possibly, the numerous blank leaves of parchment suggested to the then incumbent a design, which he carried into effect. He prefaced his labour of love with the following note: -- "March 13, 1815. Finding the ancient Parish Register much decayed, worm-eaten, and perishing, I have this day begun to copy it herein. Wm. Tremenheere, A.B., Vicar." Whilst the work was in progress the old book seems to have been re-bound. (See note, p. 46). At this time probably occurred that shameful clipping of edges (already alluded to) and loss of leaves, besides a very considerable derangement of chronological order and pagination, not only by misplacing leaves, but, making the confusion greater, by binding several of them wrongside out. Mr. Tremenheere endeavoured to rectify these blunders as far as possible, and it is not uncommon to find such marginal notes as-"for page 143 turn over five leaves," "this leaf bound the wrong way," "for page 131 v. next page but three," and so on; but one or two of the reversed leaves escaped his notice, and the entries on such as copied by him are consequently wrongly dated. He concluded thus:-" Finished by intervals and at leisure, after many intermissions, interruptions, and delays, this Fourth Day of June, 1817. (Nulla dies sine linea. Evenings at home)." So commendable was his attempt to make a duplicate of this valuable record, thus threatened with destruction, that it is with regret I allude to the marring effect of his inaccuracy and omissions in copying it. It is necessary however, in self-defence, for me to mention the fact, since upon comparing the present work with Mr. Tremenheere's copy (which is kept in the parish chest, in the church at Madron, and being more easily read is perhaps more often referred to than the Register itself) many differences will be found. Reference to the original must decide between us. And here let me say, what many persons already well know, though there is oftentimes some misapprehension upon the subject, that in point of law certified extracts from the original Parish Register only are evidence. Of the six thousand entries set forth in the following pages not one would be received as proof of a Baptism, Marriage, or Burial in a court of law; but having by this means found a required entry we need have no difficulty in procuring a certified copy of the original from the proper authority—the vicar of the parish. The "Ancient Register" is still the real source of legal certificates, and its state of preservation and continued safe keeping become matters of paramount importance.

"Decayed, worm-caten, and perishing," such are the words of the vicar with regard to the Parish Register of Madron apwards of half a century ago. Add but the fair wear and tear—not to mention damp or neglect—of more than fifty years, and judge of its probable condition at the present time. Such a whole-

some horror have I of the word restoration in its conventional meaning, that I refrain from using it in connexion with my self-imposed task; but, with the consent of the vicar, it has been my endeavour to do something towards the preservation of the original manuscript, by carefully strengthening the broken leaves, re-uniting the tattered fragments, and re-arranging the pages in chronological order. It is almost unnecessary for me to say that no entry has been re-written or re-touched,—so unjustifiable and objectionable a practice serves, in my opinion at least, to throw more or less suspicion upon the genuineness of the entry. I have however ventured to re-number the pages in red, since the old numbering was but partial and imperfect.

Time, damp, and the bookbinder have each done something towards the destruction of the volume, yet the greater part remains—dating from three hundred years ago; and it is in the hope of adding permanency to so valuable a local record, and of facilitating reference to it, that the present work has been undertaken. With regard to the value of Parish Registers in general, of the best mode of directing attention to their wealth, and of the most effectual means of preserving them, it is useless for me to speak. So much has been already said upon the subject, and so little has been done for their protection, that one more protest from this westernmost corner of Cornwall will not avail. The administration of the law is lax; the destroyer in varied guise is for the most part ceaselessly at work; "everybody's business is nobody's business;" and the "title deeds of the people" are in danger.

In conclusion, I gladly take this opportunity of expressing my indebtedness to the clergymen of this neighbourhood, who, from time to time during the last ten years, have courteously allowed me free access to their Parish Registers, and to documents relating to their churches: especially to the Rev. Michael Nowell Peters, of Madron; the Rev. John Martyn Collyns, of Sancreed; the late Rev. John Ramsay Mc Dowell, formerly of St. Just-in-Penwith, and his successor, the Rev. Henry Stlart Fagan; the late Rev. Robert Francis Bute Rickards, formerly of Constantine; the late Rev. Thomas Pascoe, formerly of St. Hilary; the Rev. Joseph Sydney Tyacke, of Helston; the Rev. Richard Malone, formerly of Paul, now of Potton, Bedfordshire; the Rev. David John Harrison, of Ludgvan; the Rev. Thomas Boelase Coulson, of Buryan; the Rev. Edward Morris Pridmore, of Breage; the Rev. George Ley Woollcome, formerly of Sennen, now of St. Mewan; the Rev. William Writhesley Wingheld, of Gulval; and the Rev. Preferonary Hedgelland, of Penzance. I should be sadly remiss too did I fail to acknowledge the ready assistance I have received from the Rev. Charles William Boase, of Exeter College, Oxford; as well as, and particularly, from Dr. William, of Penzance.

And now it only remains for me to refer the reader to the Registers themselves, in the hope that hidden fact may be brought to light, or interest aroused—

"Go, search it there, where, to be born and die, Of Rich and Poor make all the History."





Rowe, Fran, I tevidently does not belong to the first book at all, and the same may be said of the few eighteenth century entries which cocur at the end of the Register of Baptisms. These, together with the above, are more over entered in the succeeding volume, which commences with the year 1700; but it is worthy of note that the dates do not in all cases coincide

It is greatly to be regretted that the old Registers of this Parish are partially deficient, not that they are more so however than those of many neighbouring Parishes. The Baptisns, though irregularly entered towards the latter part of the seventeenth century, are nevertheless comparatively complete at this time, but are missing before the year 1992; whilst the kegisters of Marriages and Burlak, which are sufficiently well kept in their arry portions, are altogether wanting as to their latter years, at a period corresponding with the time of the irregular cutries among the Baptisns. The entires in this volume therefore—except a charles the included elsewhere—expressed the whole of the Registers of the Larish of Macron that are extant from the regret 375 to the year 1990. are extant from the year 1577 to the year 1700.

Appendix.

The following entries relating to persons connected with the Parish of Madron, at a period corresponding to that comprised in the first book, will be found in the several Registers of the Parishes named. Undoubtedly much additional information might be obtained through such extracts from these and other Registers, since the entries here given are but a few which have been collected without any thorough search, showing how very materially the records of one Parish may help and clucidate those of another. In more than one case it will be noticed that a Marriage is registered in a neighbouring Parish as having taken place at Madron,—once at a time when the Madron Marriage Register is missing. Some few of these entries are here given merely on account of the similarity of names, and as a guide to the direction in which more may be found. Possibly there may have been no relationship between the persons mentioned in the Registers of Madron and those referred to below, but the occurrence of such combinations of names as Solomon Cock, Ephraim Weymouth, Isaac Newton, &c., seem to point to some probable connection.

With regard to the spelling of many names in the foregoing entries, the rule of copying the original, letter for letter, could not conveniently be observed. In some Parishes the Registers are written almost entirely in Latin,—in Gulval for instance; and, in passing, the idea suggests itself that it must have puzzled the brains of many a by-gone Clerk to Latinize some of the very extraordinary names in which the "old people" of this neighbourhood rejoiced.

The Registers of St. Mary's Chapel, Penzance, in 1693.

In the Parish Chest in Madron Church is a small folio volume—or rather the covers of one, with a few loose leaves—which dates from the year 1693. It was originally designed as a Register Book for the Chapel of St. Mary, in the Town of Penzance, lying within the same Parish, about two miles distant in a south-easterly direction from Madron Church; but unfortunately its contents are almost entirely gone, and this is the more to be regretted, since the earlier entries would have helped to fill up the blanks, which occur in the Registers of the mother Church at the latter part of the century. The entries on the few pages which are left, being of later date than the year 1700, have been embodied in the second book at Madron, and this practice of amalgamating the two Registers was long continued, there being no separate book kept at St. Mary's until a comparatively recent date. One interesting fragment however remains in the leaf which is affixed to the inside of the first cover, for on it is inscribed in a bold hand, with a highly flourished heading in black letter, the lines which are here set forth after the manner of the original:—

Monumental Inscriptions.

There are several interesting memorials of former inhabitants of the Parish in Madron Church, and, inasmuch as their inscriptions corroborate the entries in the Registers, or supply additional par-

ticulars, it will not be out of place to introduce them here.

The oldest and one of the most curious is that of John, son of John Maddern, gentleman. It is a large oblong slab of black marble or slate, upon which are carved in low relief two kneeling figures, in Elizabethan costume, a man and a woman, perhaps intended to represent the deceased and his wife, or possibly his disconsolate parents. To the right of the man, on a sort of table, is a large book with clasps, and above it is engraved "Aetatis sue 1595," and again, in another place, "Aetatis sue 23" appears near the head of the woman, who holds a closed book before her with both hands, whilst to her left is a massive pillar with a base and capital ornamented with roses, dividing the surface of the slab into two parts,—the one containing the carving mentioned, and the other the eulogistic verse. Three shields are conspicuous in the spaces between, and on either side of the heads of the figures: one is charged with the arms,—Ermine, a chevron...; the second bears,—...on a fesse between two chevrons...three escallops..., with a crescent for cadency in the first quarter; and the third,—...on a chevron between three stags...three mullets.. The colours are not shown, this rude specimen of heraldic engraving being older than the system of delineating blazon by lines. The first part of the inscription runs borderwise round the slab—a fleur de lys in one angle marking the spot where it commences and ends, whilst the versified remainder, together with the figures, arms, &c.—which are cut across the breadth, and not with the length-occupy the central space. This slab is now fixed near the chief door, against the south wall of the Church, showing its middle portion to advantage; but whether this is its original position seems very doubtful, since the lower part of the bordering inscription is upside down. It appears as if intended to have been placed horizontally, and probably once formed the top of an altar tomb; or it may have lain flush with the flooring, though the uneven surface presented by the rough sculpture would have been unsuitable for treading on,—moreover it does not seem to have suffered, severely at least, from such ill treatment. The inscription—the letters of which have been whitened—is as follows:—



Here lieth the Body of John, the sonne of John Maddern, Gentleman, who departed this life in the feare of God the XXth† day of August, Anno Domini 1621. Aetatis Sue 1595. Aetatis Sue 23.

> If teares the dead againe to life could call, thou hadst not slept with in this earthly ball. If holy vertues could aransome bine, Soe sone corrupcion had not wrapt thee in. But thou were ripe for god, and god didst crave; Soe gavest agladsome wellcome to the grave. Assuring still that thou with god dost dwell; Thy end soe good; thy life was led soe well.

The next memorial, which also appears to have been originally intended for the horizontal position. is similar in style and material to the foregoing, but is more comprehensive in detail, the principal figures being shown at full length, and with the length of the stone. In its upper portion it displays the representations of Thomas Cock, of Bodmin, and Alice, his wife. Between them is a shield bearing the arms of Cock, Lozengy, arg. and gu., on a fesse of the first, three cocks of the second, § impaling . . . on a chevron between three garbs . . . five roundels . . . Lower down are the figures of Thomas Fleming, of Landithy, on whose right is a drawn sword (much too large for the sheath which hangs from his belt by the way), and his wife, Elizabeth, daughter and heiress of the said Thomas Cock, who, like the lady on the last slab, clasps a book to her breast. Another shield is

between them, on which are impaled the arms of Fleming,—Vairé, a chief checky or and gu., and Cock, as before. The dress of the last two figures has more ornamentation than that of the first two. At their feet their ten children are pourtrayed kneeling in two rows, one above the other; each of these—as well as the larger figures—have initials in close proximity to their heads, but instead of setting down these letters here it will be more desirable to give the names. There were three sons, Nicholas, Thomas, and John; and seven daughters, Frances, Grace, Anne, Elizabeth, Mary, Phillipa, and Jane; all of whom were living, with the exception of John, at the time of the Herald's visitation in 1620, when the pedigrae of the family was signed by the first-mentioned Thomas Fleming. This slab is placed against the east wall in the south aisle, and the borderlike inscription—the commencement and ending of which are marked by a rose of heraldic fashion—is as follows:—



Here lyeth ye Bodyes of Thomas Fleming, gent., who was buried ye 14th day of June, 1631, Thomas Cock, gent., was buried ye 9th day of December, 1601. Alice, his wife, was buried ye 5th day of January, 1610.

On a smaller slab near by, on the south wall, is the following epitaph, with the arms of Fleming engraved on a shield in the upper left-hand corner.

An epitaph to ye memorye of ye deceased Thomas Fleming, gent.

Fleming, ye avde to neighbours peore opprest. interred here beneath that tomb doth rest. His wydowes teres, nor Phisicks helpe could save. nor childrens cries, his body from ye grave. But that from greved hearts they sigh and saye, lamentinge oft, they wante their only stave. His sonnis and daughters and his wife withal. even syde by syde doe with one funerall. His neighbours, soldiers, kinsman, and ech one. doe deck hs. herse with sadnes mourneful mone; Sayinge, hees gon whome we must needs commend, a true peace maker, and a faithfull freind, Beloved of all, not hated once, whose pure and good report for ever shall endure. Concludinge thus, his soule to heaven did fly: that well did live, and ended gloriously.

A monumental brass, to the memory of an early Mayor of the Borough of Penzance, occupies a prominent place on the eastern extremity of the north wall. Inlaid upon an oblong slab of black marble are full length figures of John Clies and his wife. The first is attired in a long cloak turned out with fur, such as might be worn by an Alderman at the present day: and the second in a costume very similar to that of the ladies represented on the other monuments,—the hat and ruff being conspicuous in all, though this good dame's ruff is somewhat larger than the others. At their feet are the laudatory lines given below, and beneath these their only son is represented in a short cloak, a little apart from his five sisters who appear in a graduated row, whilst the following inscription on a narrow border of brass surrounds the whole.



Here lyeth buried the body of John Clies, Marchant, twice Maier of Penzance, who had to wife Blanch the onely daughter of Heugh Trevanion, Esq., by whome he had issue one sonne and five daughters, and left this life for a better upon ye 27th day of November, in ye yere of or. Lord God 1623; when he had lived to ye full age of 55 yeares.

Here underneath this marble stone doth rest, The corpes of him whom God in goodnes blest. In whose faire courses we may freely tind, The lively pattorne of a vertuons mind; As Penzour well approves when he was found Unto that towne a stay both sure and sound. Where he had place and creddit with the best; Till death him of his life had disposest. So Blanche his wife, this monument prepar'd. In love to him, for love to her declar'd. God hath his soule, her heart his love still keepes; The odds betwixt thim breath, thus all desh sleapes.

C. S. Gilbert, in his "Historical Survey of the County of Cornwall," published in the year 1820, after quoting the inscriptions of several monuments in the Church (vol. ii. p. 734), says:—"Another marble monument is inscribed as follows:—

"Here lyeth the body of Francis Arundell, of Trengwainton, who departed this life the 10th day of August, Anno Domini 1697; and was buried the 13th day of the same month; who married Dorothy the daughter of John Saffin, of Sutton, in the County of Devon, Esq., by whom he had one son and two daughters."

This monument however is not now to be seen in the Church, nor do the oldest inhabitants of the Parish remember its being there; but a dark marble slab inscribed to the memory of Francis Arundell is remembered in the Churchyard, on the south side, where it has long since been hidden by the mould, from the gradual accumulation of which, many tomb-stones lie buried almost as deeply as the persons whose memories they were intended to perpetuate. Moreover Mr. Gilbert speaks of "other small monuments in the Church," inscribed to Mary Jenkins, Martin Gubbs, William Rawles, &c., which are undoubtedly in the Churchyard.

On the south wall, over the Trereife pew, is a chaste monument, commemorating a distinguished member of an ancient family long resident at Trereife, in this Parish—a family which became extinct in the eldest line, just sixty years ago, in the person of William John Godolphin Nicholls, who died unmarried on the 9th of May, 1815. (The property then passed by marriage to another family, the mother of the last representative having become the wife of the Rev. Charles Valentine Le Grice, who was for several years perpetual Curate of St. Mary's, Penzance; and their son Day Perry Le Grice, Esq., M.A., is the present proprietor.) Black and white marble—the latter richly carved and relieved with gilding—are blended in a harmonious design, finished in detail and unobtrusive in effect. Slender columns of highly polished black marble support a handsome cornice, on which rests a shield—festooned with flowers, and flanked by two flaming urns—bearing the arms of Nicholls,— Arg. three pheons sa. An exquisite piece of Italian workmanship* is empannelled in the lower part of the monument; it is composed of rare and brilliantly coloured stones, lapis-lazuli, jasper, &c., inlaid so as to represent flowers and fruit, advantage having been taken of the natural tints to give force to the form and shading of the group. With such skill has this been done, that at a little distance it is difficult to believe the fact that the flowers and fruit are not in relief, so real and rounded do they appear. On the entablature, forming the middle of the monument, the following inscription is engraved.

Near this place, in the Grave of his Fathers, whom he Honour'd, lyes Inter'd the body of Jehn Nicholls, of Thereife, Esquire, Who being born in the Year of our Lord 1663, was sent to London in the Year 1680, and having served a laborious Clerkship, was in 1688 sworn one of the Clerks of the high Court of Chancery; And having with great Industry and Integrity increased the Paternal Estate of his Family, was in the Year 1705 call'd to the Bar by the Society of the Middle Temple, where having for some Years practiced with Success He retired to the Seat of his Ancestors, and having made many improvements, departed this Life the 3rd Day of August, 1714; in the 5jst Year of his Life, leaveing three Sons and one Daughter, of whom Jael, his

Daughter, and Samuel his youngest Son (by whose Order this Monument is erected) lye here likewise interr'd.

The most pretentious monument in the Church is that which commemorates the Rev. Duke Pearse and the Rev. Thomas Rowe, the latter having been nearly 16 years Vicar of this Parish: it is on the north wall of the chancel within the altar rails, which, by the way, were presented to the Church by Vicar Rowe, as is stated in the inscription. Two pillars of white marble with gilded capitals support an effective pediment, the central ornament being an urn—from the top of which flames issue—with figures of angels, one on either side. Coloured slabs enrich the entablature, and moulded scroll-work adds to the embellishment of the composition. On a base of black marble upheld by supports of polished porphyry, terminating in gilded fir cones, are two effigies, kneeling face to face, with a draped reading desk—on which are two open books—between them. The first, facing castward, is probably the representation of the Rev. Thomas Rowe; his hair is long, and lank when compared with the flowing wig of the opposite figure, which, judging from a portrait of him now in the possession of a member of his family, it may be presumed represents the Rev. Duke Pearse, who died at the early age of 27 years. Both these reverend gentlemen wear bands and surplices, and with uplifted faces raise their hands in an attitude of prayer. On the principal pannel, forming the centre of the monument, is the following inscription.

Juxta hic jacent corpora Reverendi Duke Pearse, qui obiit die decimo septimo Novembris, A.D. 1712; Ætatis suæ 34; necnon Reverendi Thome Rowe, hujns parochiæ annos prope sexdecem Vicarii qui hos Cancellos anno 1702, propriis sumptibus erexit; obiit Vigesimo octavo die mensis Augusti et tricesimo primo sepultus erat A.D. 1716; ætatis suæ 40. Elizabetha Rowe Vidua, in memoriam mariti et fratris hoc monnmentum morrens posuit A.D. 1720.

Siste pedem, lacrymisque solum perfunde Viator, Durius hoc saxo tu nisi pectus habes; Nobile par fratrum jacet heie ea terra recondit Quæ peperit Studiis ingenioque pares. Alter adhuc juvenis, Musas Veneratur amænå Quá, tu, Came Pater, litera lambis aquà. Nec mora; divulsum petit alter anhelus amicum Hospitioque ambos excipit una domus. Ast ubi promerità redimiti tempera Lauro, Visere jam patrios gestit Uterque Lares. Heic Utriusque sacros complectitur Infula crines Hic pueros monitis erudit, ille Viros; Heie magis ardenti tandem ferventia motu Pectora fraterno feedere junxit amor. Patria quos, eademque domus, quos cura, Venusque, Uniit, hos tumulus non Sinit esse duos.

On the north side of the middle aisle, over the Castle Horneck pew, is a handsome memorial inscribed to Lydia, wife of John Borlase, Esq., M.P. for St. Ives, the first of his family who took up his residence in this Parish, he having become the proprietor of Castle Horneck, but lived and died at Roseadgwell. His eldest son, Dr. Walter Borlase, who is mentioned hereafter, built the main portion of the present house at Castle Horneck, and there resided. A convex entablature—elliptical in shape—of veined and polished marble bears the inscription, and this is surrounded by carved drapery and seroll-work, with here and there a cherub. In the upper part of the design is an achievement displaying the arms of Borlase.—Ermine, a bend sa., charged with two arms, armed, issuing out of the clouds arg. (or rather proper), pulling asonder a horse show or, implied with those of Harris.—Sa., three crescents arg. within a bordure arg., with the crest.—A wanded wolf arg. regardade, bring with agong an arrow or fixed a his neck, blood proper dropping from the wound,—all being fully blazoned, though the artist has

not evinced that love of accuracy shown in the description of the arms and crest by Dr. Borlase, from whose MS, the foregoing exemplification is taken. Other portions of the ornamental sculpture are also enlivened with colour and gilding. The inscription is as follows:—

Memoriæ Saerum Lydia Borlase, Christoph. Harris de Hayne, Arm. Natæ, Johan. Borlase de Pendeen, Arm. Uxoris. Bis duos filios in Ecclesia de St. Just Sepultos posuit; Quinque tilii et quatuor filiæ Supersunt. Piissimam ejus et bene præparatam animam Mors non abripuit Sed Co-lo reddidit Julii 28. Anno Salutis 1725; Ætatis vero Suæ 54. Amaus, amabilis, amata tam formosissima quam dilectissima Sui generis Viduum reliquit, charissimum viventis, hic laborantem et Suam dissolutionem expectantem, nullo modo post mortem dividendum, sed voleute Deo, Sub hae Sede adjungendum cineribus Suis.

Animam fugientem curet Jesus.

A small marble tablet nearer the chancel, in the same aisle, is inscribed:

John Borlase, gent., son of John Borlase, of Pendeen, Esq., died in 1775; aged 71. Dorothy his wife, daughter of James Keigwyn, Esq., died in 1788; aged 86.

Our birth not mean, our age unsullied ebb'd; Content our bliss, eternity our care.

Te digna sequere.

Another marble monument on the south wall of the Church commemorates Dr. Walter Borlase, who for nearly half a century was Vicar of Madron. It is surmounted by a small shield bearing the arms of Borlase, with those of Pendarves,—Sa. a falcon rising between three mullets or, on an escutcheon of pretence. The following is the inscription.

Here lie the remains of Walter Borlase, LL.D., Vice-warden of the Stannaries of Cornwall, Justice of the Peace, and for upwards of fifty Years Vicar of this Parish, The Duties of which several Stations he discharged to the Close of a long-extended Life with unwearied Attention and approved Ability. A devout, upright, liberal Demeanour distinguished his whole Conduct, and rendered him a pattern worthy of the most reverent Observance. He died April 26th, 1776; aged 81 years and 6 Months. Here likewise lieth interred, his amiable and affectionate Wife, Margaret, only Daughter of Henry Pendarves, Vicar of Paul; She died April 8th, 1743; aged 42 years, leaving a very numerous, and for the most Part young Offspring, to lament the untimely Loss of a virtuous and accomplish'd mother.

There are many other monuments and tablets within the Church, as well as several memorial windows, but since they are of later date than the period comprised in the first book of the Registers, it will be unnecessary to consider them now.

In the Churchyard there are not many very old inscriptions. One of the most interesting is that of Alexander Daniel, of Lariggan, which, together with an imperfect representation of the arms of Daniel, has been re-cut upon a slate forming the upper surface of an altar tomb, standing south of the Church, between it and the school which his son endowed. It is as follows:—

Here lieth the body of Alexander Daniel, gent., who departed ys. life in the year of our Lord 1668.

Belgia me Birth, Britain me Breeding gave, Cornwall a Wife, ten Children, and a grave.

A grateful posterity unites in laudable remembrance of George Daniel, gent., the son of the above-mentioned Alexander. The adjoining free school and its liberal endowment witness his charity and reward. He was buried near this tomb May 4th, 1716.

Repaired. Uriah Tonkin, George Treweeke, Saml. Borlase, Thomas Robyns, William Borlase, Vicar. Trustees 1780.

Wm. Tremenheere, Vicar, John Borlase, M.D., Thos. Pascoe, Richd, Hichens, Richd, Oxnam, John Batten, Trustees 1813.

M. Nowell Peters, Vicar, Samuel Borlase, Day Perry Le Grice, John Batten, Edward Bolitho, E. H. Rodd, Trustees 1858.

An ancient looking grave-stone, formed by one large block of granite, is now built into the south wall of the Churchyard, between the lych gate and the school before mentioned. The inscription in large letters runs borderwise round the stone, the middle surface being blank. It is as follows:—

Mary · wife · of Jas · Jenkin · of Alverton · Gent · Buried · Sep · 25 · 1699.

The last figure of this date is doubtful; it has the appearance of a nine but is of a different style to that which immediately precedes it, and might possibly be a nought with a dash underneath. Mr. C. S. Gilbert—who however is not exact in the other part of the inscription—reads it as a seven.

A large slate, covering a grave somewhat south of the Daniel tomb, is inscribed much after the manner of the older slabs within the Church—the first part of the inscription forming a border to the remainder, which occupies the central space, headed in this case by an heraldic achievement, for the most part obliterated; but judging from the position, it might be supposed to have displayed the arms of Rawles, impaled with those of Honychurch, a crescent for cadency being visible where the two coats unite. The dexter coat, which has surely been engraved without due regard being paid to the rules of heraldry, appears to have been intended for Ermine (the surface of the shield being divided pilevise), a cherron... Of the second coat not a trace remains, and the mantling and helmet—which probably once supported a crest, no longer visible—are more or less indistinct. The following is inscribed:—

Heer lyeth the body of Elisabeth Honychurch, dau[ghter] of John Honychurch, who dyed the 8th day of July, 1713, aged 23 years.

Here lies the Body of Mary Rawles, daughter of John Honychurch, of Lerigon, in this Parish, who departed this life for a better April 16, 1751, in the 63rd year of her age.

Also of William Rawles, Surgeon, son of William Rawles, of the Town of Penzance, who departed this life for a better October 25, 1774, in the 21st year of his age.

He pleased God and was beloved of him, so that liveing amongst sinners, he was translated; yea speedily was he taken away, least that wickedness should alter his understanding, or deceit beguile his soul.

A slate very similar in style to the last is affixed to the south wall of the Church, having the following inscription.



Here lies the bodies of ye Family of Thos. Hosking, of Landithy, with in this Parish.

Our tears attend you to the shades below, Badge of our love and monuments of woe; Tears at your Tomb, deep flowing tears are paid, Yet fruitless all, since in the dust you'r laid. Alas! where is your youth and blooming years? Relentless Death would not be stay'd by tears. Your ripening years now fades in putrid dust, Then gentle Mother Earth receive thy trust. Within thy Bosom easy let them sleep; Their tender ashes unpoluted keep.

Mary his daughter was burd, the 30th of May, Λ nno Dom. 1726, in the first year of her age.

Christr. his son burd. Octr. 16, 1742, in the 20th year of his age.

Thos. Hosking, of Landithy, died 22nd April, 1769, aged 76.
Memento Mori.

Jane, his wife, Died July 10th, 1772, aged 75.

In the angle formed by the Church tower and the west wall of the south aisle is an altar tomb, beneath which rest the remains of several members of the family of Gubbs. The name appears early in the Registers; and one Anthony Gubbs was twice Mayor of Penzance, just two-and-a-quarter centuries ago. The inscription, which is engraved on a slate on the upper surface of the tomb, is comparatively modern,—the latter portion decidedly so; and except that it relates to an ancient and —in this neighbourhood at least—extinct family, which was formerly influential in Penzance, as the Borough records attest, it is of little interest. It is as follows:—

In Memory of the ancient family of Gubbs's of the Town of Penzance.

Here lieft the Body of Martin Gubbs, gentleman, who departed this life March 13th, 1770, aged 56 years. He was a very good Uncle: a Father to the Fatherless and surported the widow in all her distress. Also of his nephew George Mathews, who departed this life March 6th, 1795, aged 55 years.* * *

A block of granito which appears to have formed part of an ancient tomb, now entirely out of its proper position, protrudes itself cornerways from the soil, west of the south aisle. On it is inscribed in large well formed letters, A · CHIRGWIN·, though only the first part of the name is visible. A somewhat similar block, jutting out at a little distance from the other, is supposed to be a fragment of the same tomb.

Many of the oldest memorials in the Churchyard are without doubt deeply buried, and thus much information, interesting and perhaps valuable to particular persons, is lost.

St. Mary's Church, Penzance, formerly a Chapel of ease to Madron, has few monumental inscriptions of more than a hundred years old, and none of an earlier date than the commencement of the last century. Its oldest and most imposing monument is that erected to the memory of one of the Tremenheere family, which has been long and honourably connected with the town and neighbourhood. It occupies a somewhat elevated position on the south side of the chancel, and originally was placed over a pillar on the wall space between the arches, directly opposite the most eastern of the two southern doors in the south aisle of the old Chapel, the demolition of which was begun in July, 1832. It is composed of various sombre-hued marbles, well cut, and effectively ornamented with carving—the whole design bearing a general resemblance to that of Duke Pearse and Vicar Rowe, at Madron, though it is less pretentious and upon a smaller scale. In the upper part an achievement appears displaying the arms of Tremenheere, Sa. three columns (menhirs) arg., impaled with those of Worth, here shown as,—Ary. a two-headed eagle displayed sa.* A helmet with mantling supports the crest,—A man's head and shoulders couped, proper. In the lower part, between the brackets which support the base, is carved a winged Death's head crowned with laurel, the leaves being gilded, as are the crest and accessories to the shield above mentioned. The inscription, engraved upon a central panel of black veined-marble, is as follows:-

Messrs. Lysons give as the arms of "Worth of Tremough in Mabe," near Penryn, "Erm., an eagle displayed with two necks Sable, ar med Gules."
 Moyna Britannia, vol. iii., p. clxini.

Near this Place Lyes the Body of Mr. John Tremenheere, Merchant, who Exchanged this life for A Better the 23rd of July, 1701, in the 51st year of his Age, Being the son of Mr. John Tremenheere, of Penzance, the only Person that Endowed this Chappell, and an affectionate Hnsband of Sybella, Paughter of Thomas Worth, of Penryn, Gent. She in respect to his Memory hath caused this Monument to be erected.

On the north wall of the present Church is a tablet in memory of a descendant of the above-named John Tremenheere, and since the inscription alludes to the foregoing (the persons commemorated too being also connected with two Vicars of Madron), it will scarcely be out of place here, though it is more modern than others already described. It is composed of pure white marble on a darker background, shaped after the manner of a sarcophagus, on the upper surface of which rests a partly unrolled scroll with a pen lying across it, whilst branches of cypress droop over either side; above all are placed the arms and crest of Tremenheere. On the sarcophagus is engraved:—

In the vault of his Ancestors, in the middle aisle of this Church, lies interred William Trementhere, Esquire, an eminent Attorney, a friendly father and an affectionate husband, who died on the 14th day of June, A: D: 1780, aged 48 years, a lineal descendant of the gentleman who alone endowed the ancient Chapel (here built) of this town, (which about this time was called Buriton). Also with him Catherine, his wife, a most anniable woman, a kind mother and an affectionate wife, who died on the 12th day of October, A: D: 1812, aged 79 years, a daughter of the Revd. Walter Borlase, L: L: D: of Castle Horneck. This tablet to the memory of his parents, as a tribute of filial respect, regard, and affection, is dedicated by their eldest son William, A: M. and Vicar of Madron.

Just outside the north-east door of St. Mary's Church are two fine old slabs of limestone—locally known as Plymonth marble—precisely alike in size and style, which are now laid down end to end as pavement. They are somewhat injured, yet still present a tolerably perfect appearance; and are remembered to have been formerly affixed to the east wall of the extension of the old Chapel, on the outside beneath the windows, but probably were originally laid in the flooring within the building, being evidently intended for the horizontal position. The inscriptions run border-fashion round the stones: that of the first, the most southern of the two, encroaches a little upon the central space, and is as follows:—

Here lie the bod[ies] of Christopher Pendar, who died the 12th Xber, 1709, and Anne Pendar, who died the 7th of January after, Son and Daughter of Mr. Christopher Pendar, of Penzance.

May one so bloomy, years thus nipt enga[g]e Early Repentance to ye future age.

The other slab is inscribed:-

Here lieth ye Body of John Pellowe, Jun., of this town, Mc[rchant w]ho died ye.... March, 1713, In ye 36th year of his age: he married Mary, ye Daughr, of Francis Newman, of this Town, Gent.

No other older inscriptions are known to be in the Churchyard, though there can be but little doubt that the sod hides many an old memorial stone.

Before leaving the subject of monuments and grave-stones altogether it is almost necessary to say that the eccentricities of spelling, and other apparent inaccuracies, which will be noticed in the foregoing transcripts, are not printers' errors, but are faithfully copied from the original inscriptions; though with regard to pointing and accentuation, which for the most part remain unaltered, it has not been thought objectionable to introduce stops or accents whenever the sense might have otherwise become ambiguous through the want of them.

APPENDIX.

A Vist of the Incumbents of the Parish of Madron.

THOMAS DE CHIMELLY, Rector Ecclesiæ Sci. Maderni de Rydwori, 1st June, 1203.

There is no record of this Incumbent in the Exeter Registers, which commence A.D. 1257.

'In the Charter Rolls in the Tower will be found a charter of King John, dated 1st June, 1203, granting Ecclesiam Sci. Maderni de Rydwori, to Thomas de Chimelly for life'.—Rotuli Chartarum, fol. 163. There is also a record dated 9th March, 1203, which says that it had been determined by the oath of twelve men of the neighbourhood of Runery, in Cornwall, that the Church Sci Maderi de Runeri, about which there had been a dispute between the King and the Knights Hospitallers, belonged to the latter, having been given them by the predecessor of the then Henry de l'omeroy, and the King therefore declared that the rights of the Knights of S. John should not be disputed after the death of Thomas de Chimelly, because Thomas had been admitted to that Church on the King's presentation, at a time when the land of Runeri and other lands of Henry de Pomeroy were in the King's hands.'*

In the Rotuli de Liberate of John, fol. 52, it is said that John had named Robert de Clifford, but yielded to the claim of the Knights of S. John in the year 1203. Madron was not finally appropriated to S. John of Jerusalem until the 30th October, 1336, and in a grant, dated as recently as the 24th March, 1612, from James I. to Francis Morris and Francis Philips, Esquires, the Rectory and Tithes of S. Madernus and Penzance are mentioned as being late the property of the Prior and Convent of S. John of Jerusalem. Thomas de Chimelly was perhaps related to William de Chymeleis, Bishop of Avranches. 1196—8, and he may have become connected with this neighbourhood through the Priory at S. Michael's Mount,—the Norman Abbey of that name being in the diocese of Avranches.

The Manor of Alverton, which included Penzance and a large district around, was held successively by Alward, (temp. Edward the Confessor); Robert, Earl of Moretain; Pomeroy; Richard, Earl of Cornwall; Henry le Tyes, (who in the early part of the 13th century endowed the Chapel of "our Ladye," at Penzance, "dystaunte from the parishe churche ij myles and halff");† De Lisle; Berkeley; the Crown; Whitmore and others; Keigwin; and Veale, of Trevaylor. It has since been held by Tonkin, of Lelant, and Halse, of St. Ives; the latter being followed by Ley, who was succeeded by Bolitho, of Trewidden.

Gyrardus, Rector Ecclesiæ S. Maderni, 8th Sept., 1276. There is no record of the institution of Gyrardus, but Bronescombe's Register, fol. 74, contains a copy of a testimonial by the Bishop to the effect that he was capable of discharging the duty of residence,' from which it is presumed that he was aged or infirm. The Bishop further testifies inter alia that Gyrardus "bona gaudebut prosperitate in festo nativitatis beata virginis anno gratia 1276."

John de Metingham, 'admitted by Bishop Bronescombe 5th June, 1278, Vicar ad Ecclesium Sci. Maderni in Cornubia ad presentationem fratris Josep de Chauncy, Prioris Hospitalis Jerusalem, in Anglia.'—Bronescombe's Reg., fol. 87.

NICHOLAS ARTHUR DE TYNTAGEL, 'instituted 3rd November, 1309, on the Presentation of Prior William de Tottehale.'—Stapleton's Reg., fol. 45. 'This Vicar was to be allowed all the globe with its manse thereon, and all the small tithes of the Parish, excepta decima Piscaria: but was under an engagement to afford lodging to the Prior, or his brethren, or Procurator, when they visited the Parish, but who were maintained at their own costs. This arrangement proving inconvenient to the Vicar, it was agreed, 1st July, 1336, with the Prior Philip de Tame, that an angle of the globe; of sixty-two feet square, and looking to the south and west should be given up, Pro horree et alics necessaries dombbus construendis cum libero ingressu et egressu ad portam suam, ac ducendi temporibus debitis Biyam vel plaustrum facultate.'—Grandison's Reg., vol. ii., fol. 12. "Alwarton cum capella" forfeited in 1322.— Inquisitiones Post Mortem, vol. ii., p. 301.

During the incumbency of Nicholas Arthur de Tyntagel the Church was dedicated to S. Madernus on the 10th July, 1336.—*Grandison's Reg.*, vol. ii., fol. 12. "About this time namely 1338 the great tithes of this Parish were valued at 44 marks, equal to £29·6·8 and the glebe at 9d. per annum."

WILLIAM OF YORK. His institution is not recorded, but he exchanged for the Rectory of Redruth with the next Incumbent 20th September, 1344.

STEPHEN DE RESWALSTES, instituted 20th September, 1344; Patron, Prior Philip de Thame.— Grandison's Reg., vol. iii., fol. 52. He resigned, and was succeeded by

RALPH ROSKASTEL, instituted 16th June, 1349; Patron, Prior Philip de Tame. *Grandison's Reg.*, vol. iii., fol. 82. He probably was a native of, or came from, the village of Rosekestal, in St. Levan. He also resigned, and was succeeded by

HENRY REDON, admitted 31st July, 1363; Patron, Prior John Pavely. *Grandison's Reg.*, vol. iii., fol. 149. He was probably of a Buryan family; the name of John Reddon, of Buryan, occurs in November, 1328.—Oliver's Monasticon, p. 11.

ROGER MELEDER. No information as to the institution of this Incumbent is to be found in the Bishops' Registers, but at his death he is mentioned in the record of the institution of his successor.

Lawrence Trewythory, instituted 7th February, 1391-2, on the Presentation of Prior Hildebrand Juge.—Brantingham's Reg., vol. ii., fol. 129. During his incumbency the Chapel of S. Mary, at Penzance (where a chantry had been founded with a salary of £4 by Sir Henry le Tyes, Lord of the Manor of Alverton before the year 1223), was licensed by Bishop Stafford, 15th June, 1397.—Oliver's Monasticon, pp. 441, 490. On his death he was succeeded by

John Burder, instituted 17th January, 1407, on the Presentation of Prior Walter Grendon.— Stafford's Rey., vol. ii., fol. 99. During his incumbency the Chapel of S. Morwetha, in the neigbour-hood of Penzanee, was licensed by Bishop Stafford, 17th April, 1409; as well as the Chapel of S. Gabriel and S. Raphael, at Penzanee, by Bishop Lacy, 12th August, 1429, who also licensed that of S. Bridget, at Mousehole, 28th October, 1437.—Oliver's Monasticon, p. 441.

RICHARD ACTON, alias BECHAMP, admitted September, 1431; Patron. Prior William Hullys.—Lacy's Reg., vol. ii., fols. 106, 191. On the 11th August, 1440, he exchanged for S. Matthews' Church, "Friday-strete, Civitatis Londoniensis," with its Rector.—Lacy's Reg., vol. iii., fol. 206. Friday Street is in Cheapside, and S. Matthews' Church is still in existence.

RALPH Drew, instituted 11th August, 1440; Patron, Prior William Halls.*—Lacy's Reg., vol. ii., fol. 191; vol. iii., fol. 206.

Robert Paschow or Paslew. There is no record of the institution of this Incumbent, but in that of the Vicar who, upon his death, succeeded him, he is called "Paslew."

Benedict Tregoos or Tregose, admitted 21st November, 1498; Patron, Prior John Kendall.— Redmayne's Reg., fol. 6. He was also Vicar of St. Just, Penwith, being admitted 15th May, 1492. He was succeeded by

John Jackes of Jakys, instituted 19th November, 1534; 'Patron, pro hac vice John Arundell, Esq., of Treriee, by a grant of the Prior and his brethren.'—Voysey's Reg., vol. i., fol. 76. On his death he was succeeded by

Thomas Markesfon, LL.D., instituted 22nd March, 1536; Patron, the Prior.—Voysey's Reg., vol. i., fol. 80. This Vicar resigned on a peusion from the living of £16:13:4 (the living being then rated at £50 per annum), and was succeeded by

[.] Halls and Hullys-the Prior last mamed-are probably the same, but the names are thus written in the Register.

John Sandre, instituted 2nd October, 1540; Patron, hae vice, Richard Roberd de Althorpe, Gent., of the County of Lincoln, 'by the grant of Richard Layton, Archdeaeon of Bucks, who had acquired the right of the next presentation from the Prior by deed dated 30th May, 1536.'—Voysey's Rey., vol. i. ful. 102. The name Sandry, or Saundry, appears frequently in the Parish Register.

EDMUND POWTON, 'a student at Oxford, was admitted by William Alley, Bishop of Exeter, ad vicariam legitimé vacantem 18th February, 1567;' Patroness, Queen Elizabeth.—Alley's Reg., fol. 21. Among the Communion plate at Madron is a silver chalice which bears the date 1576.

Anthony Whiterowe, instituted by Bishop Bradbridge 20th August, 1577, ad vicariam perpetuam de Madderne cum capella de Morva; Patroness, Queen Elizabeth.—Bradbridge's Reg., fol. 39. He was succeeded by

RALPH HARBERTE (i.e. HERBERT) instituted by Bishop Woolton, 14th January, 1583-4; Petroness, Queen Elizabeth.—Reg. of Woolton and others, vol. xxi., fol. 14. He was buried at Madron on the 2nd February, 1600-1.

George Hutchins, M.A., instituted 12th June, 1601.—Reg. of Woollon and others, vol. xxi., fol. 72. He was also Rector of Ludgvan. During his incumbency a transcript of the old Registers of the Parish of Madron was made, according to the Act of Parliament, 2 James I. "Mr. George Hutchins, Parson of Ludgvan and Vicar of Maddeine, Prevcher of God's Worde," was buried at Ludgvan on the 27th May, 1627.

JOHN KEATE or KEATT. There is no entry as to the institution of this Incumbent in the Bishops' Registers, but in the records of the Episcopal Visitations, held 15th March, 1630-1, and 27th August, 1638, he is mentioned as the then Vicar of Madron. Isaac Nuton is also mentioned as being Curate of Morvah, and this name occurs in the Registers of Madron and Gulval: in the latter there is an entry, "Isaac Nuton, Buried 17th January, 1675-6." In the year 1645 John Keate collected and paid to the agents of Charles I. £2:5:6 for Madron, £2:5:6 for Penzance, and £0:10:4 for Morvah.—Calendar of Clarendon State Papers in the Bodleian Library, edited by Macray, vol. i., p. 293, No. 2.067. (N.B. Henry Keet, Vicar of Gulval, collected £2:4:6.) He died at Nanceglos, as was supposed of the plague, 16th October, 1647.—Daniel MSS., (Brief Chronological Observations, p. 10),—and was buried at Mad on, as appears by the Parish Register, on the 17th October, 1647.*

SYMON LAND, intruded in 1647 by the Puritans. His institution is not recorded in the Bishops' Registers, but in the record of the Episcopal Visitation, held 21st November, 1662, his name appears thus:—"Simo: Land abest."

The following, from another source, relates to him:—"Lew Symon, Madern V. (unless I misread it for Land, and he be the same person with Mi. Land, of Penzance, and so lost two Livings. Quacre.)" He was likewise Robb'd of his Horse, which at that time was his All, and threatned with Imprisonment, which oblig'd him to confine himself to his own House. He had no other Title than that of the Times; because he came not to this Living till 1647.† I think he lived to be Restored."—Walker's Sufferings of the Clergy, p. 291. He resigned the living in the year 1662, and was succeeded by

REGINALD TRENHAYLE, instituted 22nd November, 1662, 'to S. Maddern, with its annexed Chapels of Penzance and Morva, on the presentation of John Cowling, gent., of Trengwainton.'—Registers, rol. i., New Series, fol. 42. At the Episcopal Visitation, held on the 23rd July, 1665, John Zackrey is mentioned as Curate, and in the year 1693 Mr. Thomas Bellott was Curate of Penzance, as appears by the fragment of the St. Mary's Chapel Register. Vicar Trenhayle signed the terrier 19th April, 1680. It will be observed that the name Trenhayle, spelt in a variety of ways, appears early and not unfrequently in the Parish Registers of Madron: the name occurs also in the Registers of St. Erth and Constantine, and a Reginald Trenhaile was Vicar of Newlyn East in 1697,—possibly the same person. If he were a pluralist it would in some measure account for, though it would in nowise excuse, his neglect of the Parish Registers, which during the latter part of his incumbency were most irregularly kept, or not kept at all. He died in London in the year 1699 or in the early part of 1700, as is stated on a fly-leaf (page 93) in the fourth book of Registers at Madron, and was succeeded by

In consequence of the leaf on which this entry is written having been accidentally bound wrong side out, this date has been erroneously given in Lake's History of Conwalt, before mentioned. The day too is clearly the 17th, and not the 19th.
 A burther corroboration of the statement with regard to the date of the last Vicar's death.

Thomas Rowe, instituted 16th March, 1700-1, on the presentation of Faith Rowe, widow and executix of Thomas Rowe, of Breage,—Reg., rol. iv., N. S., fol. 60. He in the year 1702 presented to the Church the handsome and substantial communion rails, which are composed of polished teak or some other hard wood having the appearance of mahogany; and erected the oak pulpit and sounding board,—there being carved and gilded round the latter the words, "Blessed are they which hear the Word of God and keep it. Thos. Rowe, Vicar." He died on the 28th August, 1716, aged 40 years, and was buried on the 31st of the same month in the chancel at Madron, where a fine monument to his memory—with effigies of himself and his brother-in-law, the Rev. Duke Pearse, also commenorated—was set up by his widow.—Ante., p. 78. John Keigwin was Curate at Madron in the years 1716-17.

George Williams, instituted 15th April, 1717; Patron, Thomas Fleming, Gent., of Landithy.—Reg, vol. v., N. S., fol. 106. He resigned the living in favour of the next Incumbent.

Walter Borlase, I.L.D., instituted 27th September, 1720; Patron, John Borlase, Esq., of Pendeen.—Reg., vol. v., N. S., fol. 133. This Vica—the elder brother of Dr. Borlase, the Antiquary—eventually became Patron of Madron, and was also Vicar of Kenwyn, a Prebendary of Exeter, and Vice-warden of the Stannaries. He was baptised on the 5th November, 1694, and dying on the 26th April, 1776, aged 81 years and six months, was buried in the chancel at Madron, where a monument is creeted to his memory.—Ante., p. 79. By his last Will and Testament he gave the next presentation to his third son, William, who had acted as his Curate from the year 1765. Previously, 1754—56, Nicholas Carkeet had been Curato.

WILLIAM BORLASE, M.A., instituted 19th July, 1776; Patrons, Henry Penneck and Joseph Hankey, trustees and devisees of the Will of the last Vicar.—Reg., vol. ix., N. 8., fol. 121. 'At this time the reputed value of the benefice, including the Chapels of Penzance and Morvah, was £200.' This Incombent, who was also Vicar of Zennor, died on the 15th November, 1812, aged 71 years. Thomas Medell Hawker was Curate hero in the early part of this century.

WILLIAM TREMENHEERE, M.A., instituted 25th November, 1812.—Reg., vol. xi., N. 8., fol. 49. So say the Records at Exeter, yet the following, written with his own hand, will be found at Madron. "His nucle, the said William Borlase, dying 15th November, 1812, when he the said William Tremenheere was instituted conformably to the last Will and Testament of his grandfather. Walter Borlase, into the next presentation, at Exeter, 18th November, A.D. 1812; inducted 21st November, and read himself in 22nd November, in the same year."—See fly-leaf (page 93) in the footh book of Registers. Patron, Henry Penneck, M.D., of Penzanee, acting under the provisions of the said Will. This Vicar died on the 26th June, 1838, aged 81 years, as is stated on the fly-leaf just mentioned, and was buried at Madron on the 4th July following.—See Registers. But a tablet with the following characteristic inscription—a blank being left for the date of his death, which curiously enough has been incorrectly filled in. Id. being engraved instead of Kal.—had place near the south side of the chancel before his decease:—

During his incumbency the following were Curates at Madron:—James Carne, 1818—20; George Treweck, 1820—22; Henry Tonkin Coulson, 1822—28; Francis Gregory, 1828—31; J. S. Cox, 1834—36; and George Pinnock, 1836—38.

MICHAEL Nowell Peters, M.A., instituted on his own petition 25th September, 1838.—Reg., vol. xii., N. S., fol. 143.—He married Anne, only daughter and heiress of the late Rev. William Borlase, Vicar of Madron, and in her was vested the right of presentation. The following have been Curates of Madron during the present incumbency:—J. A. Wood, 1842-3; John R. Bishop, 1843—45; William Wood, 1845—48; V. R. Vade, 1849—54; Michael Morgan Humble, 1851-2; Frederick William Poland, 1852-3; Edward Norman Coles, 1853-4; Philip Hedgeland, 1851—40; George Richard Scobell, 1860—67; John Jones, 1867-8; E. M. Griffiths, 1868-9; Jevon James Muschamp Perry, 1869—72; John Smith, 1872—74; Charles Holt Ensell, 1874—76.

hereinbefore granted bargained and sold or intended so to be do arise from the Bounty of her late Majesty Queen Anne and have been purchased with the sum of four hundred pounds arising from such Bounty Now the said Governors by virtue and in pursuance of the last Clause in an Act of Parliament passed in the first year of the reign of his late Majesty King George the first entitled an act for making more effectual her late Majesty's Gracious intentions for augmenting the maintenance of the poor Clergy do hereby allott and apply to the Church or Chappel of Buriton or Penzance aforesaid All and singular the said messuage or dwelling house closes or parcels of Land heredits, and premises with their appurts, and do hereby declare that the same shall for ever hereafter be annexed to the said Church or Chappel of Buriton or Penzanee and shall be from henceforth held and enjoyed and go in succession with such Church or Chappel for ever In witness whereof the said Governors have caused Certain inaccuracies, due to the original writer or to the transcriber, which it is almost impossible to avoid and seemed unadvisable to interfere with, will be noticed.

Notes.

Register of Baptisms.

- 1592. [? Sept.] "Bossaverne." Surnames were commonly assumed in this part of the County, until a comparatively recent period, from the name of the place at which the persons resided. This James or his fathers most probably lived at Bosavern, in the adjoining Parish of St. Just, and when he took up his abode in Madron was still known by the name of his old home. Numerous names of this class will be found in these Registers. Occasionally two surnames occur, as Edwards, alias Porteare, James, alias Mulfra, &c.
 - Sept. 24. "Raw, Spur." Raw the vulgar pronunciation of Rowe at the present day; Rowe being probably derived from Raph. Spur. This abbreviation is that most frequently used whenever it is intended to mark illegitimacy. In one place it is written in full, Spurius (See Burials, 1588, July 22), and occasionally it is represented by an S only.—See Baptisms, 1606, Feb. 9.
 - Nov. 30. "Jermyn," or German, a favourite christian and surname throughout this book, probably introduced by some one from Germany.
 - Dec. 17. "RAWE DAVYE." Possibly in this case Rawe is an abbreviation for Rowan.—See Baptisms, 1601, Sept. 3.
- 1592-3. Jan. 21. "Maderne," a surname derived after the manner above mentioned from the Parish of Madron, which formerly was, and vulgarly is still, so pronounced. As might have been expected perhaps no surname is of more frequent occurrence in the Registers than this.
 - Feb. 17. "Hext." This is probably John Hext, of Kerris, in Paul.
 - Feb. . . . "Bennet" appears to be an abbreviation of Benedict. Some of the contracted or altered forms of names are curious, such as Bendigo—from Abeduego, and Arclas—from Hercules. These are favourite names in West Cornwall, and Bendigo, in Australia, was so called after a Cornishman who settled there in the present century.
- 1593. April 22. "Buskeyning." There are two estates of this name in the Parish, Higher and Lower Boskenning.
 - June 3. "John James Tremethack." Here is an instance of two christian names at a time when such a thing was very uncommon, but does it not rather mean John James, of Tremethack? He is evidently not the same person as John Tremethack, whose uame occurs in the same year (Nov. 25); and perhaps the third name in the first case was used to distinguish the one from the other.
 - Aug. 12. Very frequently, as in this case, a blank has been left. Probably the transcriber was unable to decipher the ancient Registers from which the present were copied, down to about the year 1607.
 - Sept. 2. "William Treve," i.e. William Nicholls, of Trereife. Trereife is usually pronounced, as here spelt, Treve.
 - Sept. 2. "John, the Roper." Survames appear to have been scarcely settled even at this time, and seem often to have been assumed in allusion to trade or calling, or from some personal peculiarity, as well as from residence.

- 1594. April 7. "Lanvon," or Lanion, signifying John's enclosure. Lan more or less relates to the Church, and this property probably formerly belonged to the Knights of St. John of Jerusalem, who had an establishment at Landithy, in this Parish, near the Church, which had been appropriated to them. The correct pronunciation of this name is Lanion or Lanine, but it is often when used as a surname pronounced, as most usually written, Lanyon; the y being sounded as in beyond. It has sometimes been called Lan John also, and this would seem to add force to the supposition that this place appertained to the Knights Hospitallers.
- 1597. Sept. 1. "Cowlinge." A family of this name resided at Trengwainton.
- 1598-9. Mar. 11. "Andrillier," or Andryllier. Query, Audry, Clerk; possibly an error of the transcriber.—See Marriages, 1587, Nov. 19. Awdry occurs as a christian name.—See Baptisms, 1601, Sept. 15.
 - Mar. 18. "Rowan." This name occurs frequently, spelt in a variety of ways, both as a christian and surname. Rohan is not unknown in Brittany.
- 1599. July 22. "Suddow." This name (which the Rev. William Tremenheere persistently writes Gudgeon) frequently occurs in these Registers. It was not extinct in the neighbourhood at the latter part of the last century. A person of the name—from whom by the way the late Rev. Henry Penneck received the first rudiments of his education—lived and died in Penzance.
- 1600. July 15. "Peres," a distinct name from Pearce, and formerly known in Gulval.
- 1601. Sept. 3. "Roan."—See Baptisms, 1592, Dec. 17.
- 1601-2. Feb. 21. "BAUDE." Possibly this name may be Band which occurs in the Gulval Registers, but as the bearer of it usually figures here under the same circumstances perhaps the more objectionable appellation is the most suitable.—See Baptisms, 1609-10, Jan. 7.
- 1602. April 5. "Charells," a not unfrequent vulgar pronunciation of Charles at the present day.
- 1602. Sept. 5. "FYNNIE" appears to have been sounded as Feeny. The family was influential in Penzance in the 17th century.
- 1602-3. Jan. 6. "Dawbin," a contraction of St. Aubyn-sometimes further reduced to Dobbin.
- 1603. Aug. 28. "TREF," i.e. Treriefe, alias Nicholls.
- 1604. Dec. 12. "EDWARDE," or Edwardes.—See Baptisms, 1609, April 14.
- 1605. July 6. "Penzane," an early instance of the name being spelt with a z.
- 1605-6. Feb. 23. "Dodo," (or Dadowe—See Marriages, 1587, June 12), a curious surname, but one very similarly sounded was not unknown in Penzauce about the commencement of the present century.—See Le Grice's Petition of an old uninhabited house in Penzauce.
- 1606. Sept. 21. "Alce." This might almost be supposed to be a distinct name from Alice, or perhaps is only a variation of it. Possibly this pronunciation of it may not have died out even yet, but in the last century there was a poor foolish girl at the Quay, Penzance, who was fond of talking of "John * * * * and Alice, Tom, Hugh, and Alce (sounded Ailsey), Titzy, Mannny, and I."
- 1606-7. Jan. 25. "Jeeles," a very clear exemplification of the ancient prenunciation of Giles, confirming the supposition that i was most frequently sounded as in this neighbourhood.—See Baptisms, 1610-11, March 3.
- 1607-8. Feb. 7. "Treeeife," i.e. Nicholls, of Trereife.—See Baptisms, 1628, June 15, and Appendix to Marriages, 1627, Aug. 6.
- 1608-9. Jan. 13. "Mr. John Clies," twice Mayor of Penzance.—See Monumental Inscriptions, p. 76.
- 1609-10. Jan. 7. See Baptisms, 1601-2, Feb. 21.
- 1610. July 13. "Laxyon, Esq." Esquires are remarkably rare in this book.

- 1610-11. Jan. 1. "Lavelis," or Levelis, then of Castle Horneck, afterwards of Trewoof, Buryan.
 - Jan. 20. "Otes," whether here intended as a christian or a surname is uncertain.
 - March 3. See Baptisms, 1606-7, Jan. 25.
- 1611. Oct. 13. "Booden." The o is probably doubled to intensify its sound, and not to represent oo as in fool; so this name would be pronounced Bowden. Similar instances occur in the older part of the Register—as Loose for Loase, Nooal for Nowell, Portear, Feeny, &c.
 - Nov. 28. "Phillip" is frequently used as a woman's name as well as a man's.
- 1617. July 20. "Noseworthye." In the MSS of Alexander Daniel, of Lariggan, written about the middle of this century, this name frequently occurs, and always written Norsworthy.
- 1625. Dec. 30. "Anthony Gubbs," twice Mayor of Penzance. He is frequently mentioned in the Daniel MSS., and issued a farthing token in Penzance in 1667.
- 1628. May 18. "Sissell," i.e. Cecil.
 - June 15. "Nicholls," of Trereife.—See Baptisms, 1607-8, Feb. 9; Appendix to Marriages, 1627, Aug. 6.
- 1631. Dec. 7. "JICHOLAS." Query a fanciful name or a slip of the pen.
- 1632-3. Jan. 22. "Eliassafii Daniell," born on the 10th of the same month.—See Daniel MSS.
- 1634. Sept. 12. "John, my sixth son, was born in Nove's house, at Penzance, about sun rising, being ye Lord's day, 1634." "Aug. 19. My son John dyed at Larigan circa three a clock afternoon, and was buried 21st in Madr. Chur. 1661."—Daniel MSS.
- 1635. May 2. "Kete."—See p. 85.
- 1636-7. Feb. 18. "Tollaw." This name probably was originated by the occupation of a Toller or Bounder, one whose duty it is to renew Bounds of Tin Works.
- 1637. June 3. "Agnis." This is the first time the name of the wife is given in the Register of Baptisms.
 - June 7. "Halenight," a man's name: its antithesis, "Loveday," occurs as a woman's.
 - Aug. 6. "Aug. 1, George, mine eighth son, was born at Penzanee, in Noyo's house circ, two a clock after midnight, Thesday, 1637.—Daniel MSS. He was the founder, in 1704, of the Free School at Madron for poor children of that Parish, and of its Chapelries of Morva and Penzanee.
- 1637-8. Mar. 18. "Kerrowe," signifying in the Cornish language a plough, an old form of Carer; though in this Register the name occurs early spelt as at present.—See Marriages, 1587, June 5.

- 1644-5. Feb. 7. "Primmore." Persons of this name lived in Newlyn, near Penzance, as lately as at the commencement of the present century; and the fine old house, the present residence of the Misses Leah, at Newlyn, was formerly the seat of the Primroses.
- 1647. April 25. "Nicholl." This name, spelt in a variety of ways, occurs as a female christian name.
 - Aug. 29. "Blazeris." Query a corruption of Lazarus.
 - Dec. 26. "Emet." (Emmet=ant.) Query a male or female name.
- 1648-9. Mar. 20. "Gilbert Ficks." This is undoubtedly the same as Gilbert Thick, whose name occurs several times at later dates.

- 1649-50. Jan. 5. "Fosse." This name, which still exists in this neighbourhood, was familiar to Penzance people in the first half of the present century through an artist—"little Tom Foss."
- 1679. June 27. "Hercules Pedwell." This name occurs also in the old Parish Register of St. Hilary.
- 1681. Mar. 27. "Covn Maker." The Rev. William Tremenheere reads this comb maker.
- 1686. Dec. 12. "ADDAMA, daughter of Solomon Cock, of Golval."—See Appendix to Baptisms, 1686, Dec. 7. It would appear from this that the same child had been twice baptised—at Gulval on the 7th Dec., and then at Madron on the 12th; but the first may have been private baptism.
- 1674. Nov. 3. See Appendix to Marriages, 1671, Aug. 26.
- 1682-3. Mar. 11. "Fenne," i.e. Fynny.—See Burials, 1577, May 20, and Baptisms, 1600, May 15.
- 1699-1700. N.B. The entries after this date have been as already mentioned chiefly embodied in the second book of the Registers, but certain variations and additions will be found there which are here noted.
- 1699-1700. Mar. 11. "Ann," daughter of James Harry, alias Penreeth, baptised April 1.—See second book.
- 1700. Sept. 19. This is probably the date of birth. According to the second book baptism took place on the 18th Oct.
- 1700-1. Feb. 26. Baptised March 8.—See second book.
- 1701. April 7. Baptised April 21.—See second book.
 - June 7. Agrees with entry in second book.
 - Aug. 1. This entry not found in second book.
 - Oct. 17. Not found in second book.
 - Oct. 24. Agrees with entry in second book.
 - Nov. 20. Probably date of birth. Baptised Dec. 1.—See second book.
- 1702. April 21. Entered as baptised on the 20th April in the second book, and Hamond is there written Hamen.
 - July 24. This date agrees with that in second book, but, instead of Row, Chepy is entered, and this name has been re-written or re-touched.—See Note to Baptisms, 1705, July 7.
 - Aug. 10. In the second book the date of baptism is Aug. 2, and John Davye is entered as of Penzance.
 - Nov. 28. Agrees with entry in second book, in which Robart Harry, Jun., is entered as of Madron.
- 1703. May 24. Baptised June 3.-See second book.
 - May 24. The entry in the second book is as follows:—"Ann, a base child of Magdalene Freind, of Scilly, baptised May 24, 1703."
 - June 17. Baptised July 2; and Christopher Williams is entered as of Penzance.—See second book.
 - Aug. 21. Dato agrees. "Thomas James," the tanner, of Penzance.—See second book.
 - Sept. 13. Date agrees. Hamond is entered as "Hamon, of Penzance," in the second book.
 - Nov. 25. Baptised Nov. 29.—See second book.
 - Nov. 30. This entry not found in second book.

- 1704. Aug. 8. Agrees with entry in second book.
- 1704-5. Feb. 2. "ROBART HARRYE, JUN.," of Madron.—See second book.

1705. July 7. "William Row," alias Chepy.—See second book.

Aug. 28. The date of birth. Baptised Sept. 17.—See second book.

Nov. 5. This entry not found in second book.

1705-6. Feb. 16. Agrees with entry in second book.

1707. Dec. 28. Probably the date of birth. Baptised Dec. 29. "Matthew Hall" is entered as of Madron.—See second book.

1724-5. Jan. 20. This entry not found in second book.

1726. July 18. This entry not found in second book.

Register of Marringes.

The letters which appear in a somewhat puzzling arrangement on either side of the title page to the Marriages in the original, form the following:—

- 1578. Aug. 4. "Dove." Query Done, i.e. Dunn.
 - Aug. 10. "Weymowthe," certainly intended for Weymouth; but it is almost impossible to be exact in representing such a word as this, for the strokes of m, n, and u being all alike, and without any division between the letters, it might be read in several ways. Perhaps the design was to have written Weymmowthe, but one of the strokes of the double letter was omitted.
- 1581. April 10. "Neale." Clearly so written but perhaps intended for Noall, i.e. Nowell.
 - Nov. 5. "Rowan." Query a christian or surname.—See Baptisms, 1598-9, March 18.
- 1584. Oct. 11. "Siselle." The Rev. William Tremenheere in his MS. copy of the Register frequently writes this name "Grislie," and Miss Yonge in her work on Christian Names quotes this as a curious name, evidently having referred to the copy of the Register mentioned.
- 1587. June 5. "CAREW."—Sec Baptisms, 1638, March 18.
 - Jnne 12. "Dadowe."—See Baptisms, 1605-6, Feb. 23.
 - Nov. 19. "OLERE." This is undoubtedly Clere, and does not stand for Clericus.—See Burials, 1585, June 28, and 1604, June 2.
- 1588. Oct. 19. "John Cowlinge," or Cowlin, of Trengwainton, and Alice, daughter of John "Parmere" (Query Palmer), of "Sunner," i.e. Zennor, his second wife.—See Visitation of Cornwall, 1620.—See Marriages, 1605, June 10.
- 1598-9. Jan. 22. "Syse," pronounced Seese.—See Marriages, 1608, March 28.
- 1600. Nov. 23. "Geles," i.e. Giles.—See Baptisms, 1606-7, Jan. 25.
- 1601-2. Feb. 16. " + + " The reason for these crosses being on either side of this entry does not appear.
- 1602. May 25. "Anbrose," or Ambrose. N and m are frequently interchanged in such names, as Anbone, &c.
- 1605. June 10. "Gaetered," i.e. Gertrude, daughter of John Cowlinge, or Cowlin, before mentioned, of Trengwainton, by Christian, daughter of Robert "Rosetor, of Kestenton," i.e. Constantine, his first wife.—See Visitation of Cornwall, 1620.—See Marriages, 1588, Oct. 19.

- July 5. "Mr. Roger Polkinhorne," of Penzance, and Grace, daughter of John Cossen, alias Maddern, of Penzance, 30 years of age in 1620.—See Herald's Visitation of Cornwall, 1620.
 - July 6. "Mr. John Clies," of Penzance, who is commemorated on a brass in Madron Church.—See p. 76. A branch of the Trevanion family resided in this Parish, and Hugh Trevanion, Esq., is mentioned in the Charter of Penzance, dated 1614, as is also Mr. John Clies. The Trevanions had probably intermarried with the Madderns since their arms (arg. on a fesse between two chevrons gu. three escallops or), though without blazon, appear on the monument of the latter family.—See p. 75.
- 1608. Mar. 28. "Seese."-See Marriages, 1598-9, Jan. 22.
- 1615. Sept. 25. "Francis." In the Herald's Visitation of Cornwall, 1620, Christian and Alice are given as the names of the wives of John Cowlinge, whose son John by the second wife was then 20 years of age.—See Marriages, 1604, May 16; 1605, June 10; and 1628-9, Jun. 5.
- 1624. Sept. 25. "Madrex Champex," or Champion.—See Baptisms, 1598, Feb. 12. Chestex, daughter of Sampson Nove and Jane.—See Marriages, 1587, July 22; Baptisms, 1600, Dec. 24, and 1626, June 21.
- 1628-9. Jan. 5. See Marriages, 1615, Sept. 25; and Marriages, 1605, June 10.
- 1646. Nov. 30. "Grace," daughter of Thomas Fleming.—See Baptisms, 1602, Dec. 7.
- 1649. Nov. 17. "Jaquilina," daughter of Alexander Daniel, of Lariggan. "1649, Nov. 17, my daughter Jaquilina was married to Wm. Paynter, ye son of Richd. and Honor P. his wife."—See Daniel MSS.
- 1650. It will be noticed that Marriages are fewer in proportion during the time of the Common-wealth. This is to be accounted for in a great measure by the fact that Marriage was then regarded more especially as a civil contract, and could be legally celebrated elsewhere than in the Parish Church.
- 1653. By an Act of the Commons, passed 24th Angust, 1653, Marriages were solemnized by Justices of the Peace. In Parish Registers at this time it is not uncommon to find such an entry as the following, which occurs in the first book of those of the Parish mentioned:—

This was in consequence of an Act passed during the administration of Cromwell, directing that Parish Registers should be placed in better hands than those of the Clergy; and frequently they were given over to some village tradesman whose chief recommendation to the office was perhaps the zeal he had shown in the destruction of the ancient registers.*

It does not appear, however, that the Register Book at Madron changed hands: there is no such entry as the above, nor does the writing during the time of the Commonwealth differ from that which immediately precedes and follows. The only alteration is that the date of Birth is registered instead of the date of Baptism.

1653. Dec. 17. "John Blunt." A farthing token was issued in Penzauce by a person of this name. It bore on the obverse IOHN * BLVNT three lions rampant regardant, 2 and 1; on the reverse IN * PENZANCE * 1665 * I * I * B *

**1665. Dec. 7. My son Eliasaph was married to Jane Penrose, ve daughter of J. Penrose, Esq., at Maddren."—See Paniel M88. It does not appear that this marriage was ever registered; there happens to be a blank about this time, no entries having been made in the Register after the 25th June, 1665, until the early part of the following year.

Register of Burials.

- 1577. May 20. "FYNNY, FYNNIE." In this, the earliest entry in the Madron Register, occurs an instance of a surname being differently spelt in the same line; not a very unusual circumstance, by the way, nor perhaps in all cases accidental, since it was formerly common, especially among the wealthier classes, to spell a surname in as many different ways as possible in the same document.
- 1578. June 7. A plague or fatal sickness appears to have commenced about this time, and prevailed during several months. It will be noticed that whole families seem to have been swept away in some instances.
 - July 7. "ELIZABETH, quædam, morbo convitiali laborans." Does this simply mean that the deceased laboured under a disease of reproach? Do these words in any way refer to the plague which had just commenced, or did some priest, with more wit than reverence for Parish Registers—finding the line unfinished—complete it with the words in italies, inferring that the deceased Elizabeth had been a scold, and was suffering at the time of her death from the scolding disease instead of the "morbus comitialis;" but was there such a disease as "morbus convitialis?"—See Notes & Queries, vol. iii., p. 128, fifth series.
- 1585. June 28. "HARRYE, alias CLEARE." This explains other entries.—See Marriages, 1587, Nov. 19, and Burials, 1604, June 2. The extreme north-west of Penzance is known as St. Clare, or Chapel St. Clare; a chapel dedicated to that saint having formerly stood near the high road to Madron where it crosses the borough boundary.—See p. 87.
- 1595. July 23. It is worthy of note that through the Spaniards on this unlucky day an ancient Cornish prophecy became fulfilled. It was—

"Ewra teyre a war meane Merlyn Ara Lesky Pawle, Pensanz, ha Newlyn;"

which may be translated-

"There shall land on the rock of Merlyn
Those that shall burn Paul, Penzance, and Newlyn."

Possibly the gap which occurs in the Parish Registers of Madron at this time is more or less due to the marauding invaders; at least the fact of there being no Registers of Baptisms, Marriages, or Burials for the year 1595 is suggestive. That the Spaniards destroyed much valuable property in this neighbourhood is certain: they set fire to many houses on the day mentioned, and returned to their galleys intending to land again on the following day, but were prevented from doing so; for the old prophecy having been fulfilled, they were driven from these shores by the inhabitants. The first book of the Registers of the Parish of Paul commences with the following:—

"Pawle Register.

Jesu spes et Salus nra.

1595.

"A Register of the names of all those that were Baptized, Married, or Buried in the Prish of St. Pawle, in the Countie of Cornwall, from the 23rd days of Julie, in the years of our Lord God 1595, on the wh. daie the Church Towre, Bells, and all other things pertaining to the same, together with the houses and goods, was burn'd and spoil'd by the Spaniards in the saide Prish, beinge Wensdaie, the daie aforesaide, in the 37th years of the reign of our Sovereigne Ladie Elizabeth, by the grace of God of England, France, and Ireland, Queen, Defender of the Faith, &c.

"Per me Johnem Tremearne, Vicarium ejus."

In the same book, the first entry in the Register of Burials is-

"Jenken Keigwin, of Mowsholl, being kild by the Spaniards, was buried the 24th July, 1595."

- 1600-1. Feb. 1. "RAPHE HARBERTE."—See р. 85.
- 1601. July 20. "Blauxche."—See Baptisms, 1594, Aug. 27. The christian names are clearly different, but it must be remembered that this portion of the Register is a transcript, and inaccuracies as to a letter or so might easily creep in.
 - Dec. 9. "Cox," or Cock.—See Fleming monument, p. 76.
- 1602. April 4. "Jenye My Frinde." Query Anhey.—See Burials, 1597-8, Feb. 27.
- 1604. June 2. "Clere."-See Baptisms, 1587, Nov. 19; Marriages, 1587, Nov. 19.
- 1605. Dec. 10. "Cozex." This surname, variously spelt, occurs several times in these Registers. A family named Cossen, alias Maddern, resided at Penzance at the time of the Herald's Visitation, 1620.
- 1610-11. Jan. 5. "MISTRIS ALSE COCKE."—See Fleming monument, p. 76.
- 1614. Oct. 6. "LAUNCE," i.e. Launcelot.
- 1623. Nov. 29. "John Clies, Gent." One of those chiefly instrumental in procuring the Charter for Penzance in 1614, a member of the original Corporation, and an early Mayor of that Town.—See Marriages, 1607, July 6; Clies monument, p. 76.
- 1632. Nov. 18. "Jacob Daniell." "Nov. 5. My son Jacob died at Penzance, in K. Colan's house, aged 3 y. and almost a 1/4, buried in Madr. Chur. 1632."—See Daniel MSS.
- 1641. April 5. "John Trellil." Possibly this is the person to whom Bishop Hall, of Exeter, alludes in his Devotional Works, vol. vi., p. 465. Speaking of the invisible world and the insensible helps of good spirits, he says, "Of this kind was that no less than miraculous cure which, at St. Maderne's, in Cornwall, was wrought upon a peor cripple (one John Trelill); whereof, besides the attestation of many hundreds of the neighbours, I took a strict and personal examination, in that last Visitation (at Whitsuntide) which I either did or ever shall hold. This man, that for sixteen years together was fain to walk upon his hands, by reason of the close contraction of the sinews of his legs, was, upon three monitions in his dream to wash in that well, suddenly so restored to his limbs that I saw him able both to walk and get his own maintenance. I found here was neither art nor collusion: the thing done, the author invisible."
- 1642. June 28. "Isack Newton, Clerke," Curate of Morvah.—See p. 85.
- 1647. Oct. 17. "Mr. John Kete, Vicar."—See p. 85.
- 1660-1, Jan. 28. "Frances."—See Marriages, 1615, Sept. 25, and 1628-9, Jan. 5,
- 1661. Aug. 21. "John Danielt," son of Alexander Daniel, of Lariggan, died 19th Aug. See p. 95.
- 1674. Sept. 15. "Mrs. Blanch Bonthan." Among the communion plate at St. Mary's Church, Penzance, there is "one chalice of silver, weighing twelve ounces and half and half quarter, with this inscription:—Ex dono Blanchic Bonithon Vidue Sacelle Penzantiensi Cellato 1670;" and "two salvers of silver, weighing nine ounces and half and half quarter,—one of them marked with the letters B. B."—See Terrier for the Parish of Madron, Moryah, and Penzance, dated 1st May, 1746.
- 1677. July 9. "Mr. REGINALD TRENHAYLE, VICAR."—See p. 85. In the Westminster Abbey Registers, Harleian Society's Publications, 1876, p. 247, the following will be found:— "Burials, 1700, Sept. 23, Mr. Reginald Trenhayle, in the south cloister, near the west end thereof."
- 1677-8. Feb. 8. "Mrs. Grace Daniell," widow of Alexander Daniel, of Lariggan. She appears to have died on the same day according to an entry in a different hand in the Daniel MSS., Brief Chronological Observations, which is—"Feb. 8. My mother Grace Daniell departed this life 1677."
