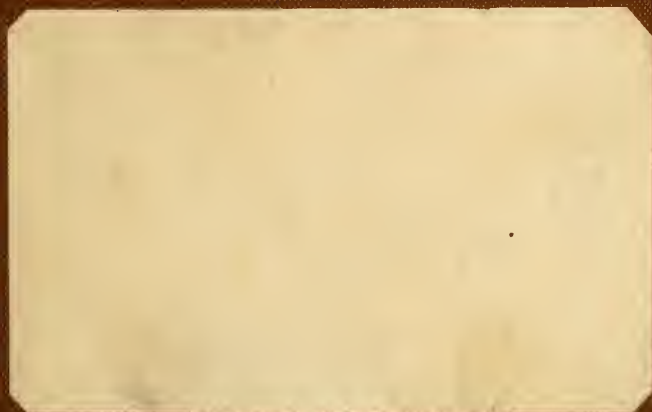

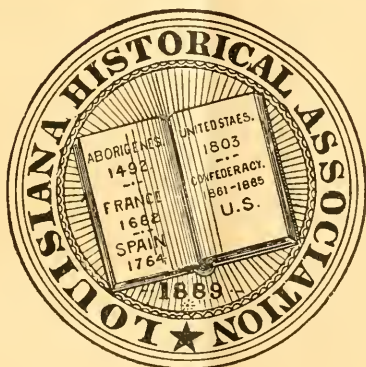

## CIRCULAR.

NEW ORLEANS, August 1, 1891.

*Dear Sir*—On the 11th day of April, 1889, the "Louisiana Historical Association" was chartered, under the provisions of the law of the State of Louisiana relative to the organization of corporations for literary, scientific, religious and charitable purposes, with its domicile in the city of New Orleans.

As set forth in its charter:

"The objects and purposes for which this corporation is formed are to collect such books, pamphlets, papers, documents, flags, maps, plans, charts, paintings, engravings, lithographs and other pictorial representations, manuscripts and other things appertaining to the history of the territory of Louisiana, both before and after its cession to the United States, and especially the collection and preservation of all papers, documents, relics, etc., relating to the war between the States from 1861 to 1865. And this corporation shall have the right to compile and publish, and to have compiled and published, books, plans, charts, and other papers and documents relating to the purposes for which it is organized and to apply for and hold copyrights and patents necessary to its protection.

"And the powers of this corporation shall be fully vested in and exercised by a board of governors to consist of twenty-five members, five of whom shall be selected from each of the following Confederate organizations, to-wit: The "Association of the Army of Tennessee," the "Association of the Army of Northern Virginia," the "Battalion of Washington Artillery," and the "Association of Veteran Confederate States Cavalry," and five members of the trustees of the "Howard Memorial Library Association;" and they shall hold their offices for a period of one year."

The first board of governors was composed as follows: From the Association of the Army of Tennessee—J. B. Wilkinson, Jr., Geo. H. Frost, R. S. Venables, J. K. Renaud and Wm. Preston Johnston; from the Association of the Army of Northern Virginia—John T. Purves, E. D. Willett, Peter Blake, T. S. Campbell and Thomas Higgins; from the Battalion Washington Artillery — W.

M. Owen, E. I. Kursheedt, C. L. C. Dupuy, Jos. H. Degrance and J. H. Duggan; from the Association of Veteran Confederate States Cavalry—J. Henry Behan, D. A. Given, T. E. Davis, S. S. Prentiss and W. R. Lyman, and from the board of trustees of the Howard Memorial Library Association—Frank T. Howard, G. T. Beauregard, J. N. Galleher, Robert Maxwell and Charles E. Fenner; with Frank T. Howard as president, W. R. Lyman as first vice-president, W. M. Owen as second vice-president, D. A. Given as secretary and treasurer, and Charles A. Nelson as custodian.

The following extract refers to membership:

“Membership in this Association shall consist of white persons of good moral character, who were in the service of the Southern Confederacy, and of their white descendants, and also of white persons of good moral character who were not in such service, but who have been citizens of Louisiana for more than five years previous to their application for membership herein.

“Honorary members may be elected at any regular meeting of the Board of Governors, by a two-thirds vote of those present at such meeting. They must be eligible to membership in this Association and shall be exempt from all fees, dues and service.

Applications for membership in this Association shall recite fully the name, residence and qualifications of the applicant, and shall be accompanied by the initiation fee of two dollars, which fee shall be returned to the applicant if he be rejected. This application shall be read at a regular meeting and shall be referred to the Executive Committee.

“The initiation fee of this Association shall be two dollars, and the dues shall be one dollar per annum, all payable in advance.” \* \* \* \* \*

The Association is now in the third year of its existence, and the results are highly encouraging.

Domiciled in a fire-proof building (an annex to the Howard Memorial Library), built expressly for the Association by F. T. Howard, Esq. It has collected over 4,000 valuable manuscripts, books and papers, including those of President Jefferson Davis

General Braxton Bragg, and Commodore Wm. Wallace Hunter, besides portraits of distinguished men, arms, uniforms, regimental flags, etc.

It is the object and purpose of the Association, as recited above, to collect, within its walls, all documents relating to the history of Louisiana and the war between the States; and it would earnestly urge upon everyone having papers or relics in their possession, to place them in its charge, that they may be listed, and preserved, from fire and moth for all time to come; and where the searcher after truth can explore a mine of wealth, and the old soldiers of the Confederacy, can find their deeds of valor carefully and religiously recorded and enshrined, to be studied by generations yet unborn.

The membership of the Association is growing daily, and it has been thought proper to issue this pamphlet so as to convey information of its existence to absent comrades, and to solicit their encouragement, their papers and their relics, so that they may aid us in our work by becoming members of the Association, and contributors.

RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE LOUISIANA  
HISTORICAL ASSOCIATION

---

ADOPTED, JANUARY 1, 1891.

---

- SEC. II. The books and archives collected, shall be under the immediate charge and control of the custodian, who shall also have general custody of the building and police of same.
- III. None but members of the association shall have access to the books and papers of the association, and then only upon application to the custodian.
- IV. Membership can be conferred by the Board of Governors with the approval of the Executive Committee, upon proper application, and the necessary blanks can be obtained from the Custodian, Secretary or Sergeant-at-arms.
- V. No books, relics or papers shall be allowed to be removed from the Hall under any circumstances.
- VI. The Hall will be open for Visitors daily, from 10 A. M. until 5 P. M. Children must be accompanied by grown persons.
- VII. No smoking will be permitted.
- VIII. No one will be permitted to remove any article from its place, especially chairs or other furniture, for the purpose of climbing thereon to better view relics exposed and their inscriptions.
- IX. Strict order and decorum must be preserved; loud and boisterous conversation is not permitted. Any one violating these rules will be liable to expulsion from the Hall.

X. By notifying the Sergeant-at-arms the day previous to their regular and committee meetings, the Veteran Associations of the Army of Northern Va., Army of Tenn., the Washington Artillery, the Veteran Cavalry and their Junior Associations can have the Hall opened and lighted for their use, after 6 P. M.

Unless under peculiar circumstances the Hall should be closed at 10 P. M. The Hall is for only such meetings, and not for entertainments, unless express authority is given by the Board of Governors at their regular meeting.

XI. The Sergeant-at-arms will be in full charge of the building at all times; he will see that proper decorum is observed, and will be obeyed and respected accordingly.

XII. Any information desired will be cheerfully given by the Sergeant-at-arms upon application.

XIII. Any infringement of these rules will be reported by the Sergeant-at-arms to the Custodian, who will report same, at his discretion, to the Board of Governors.

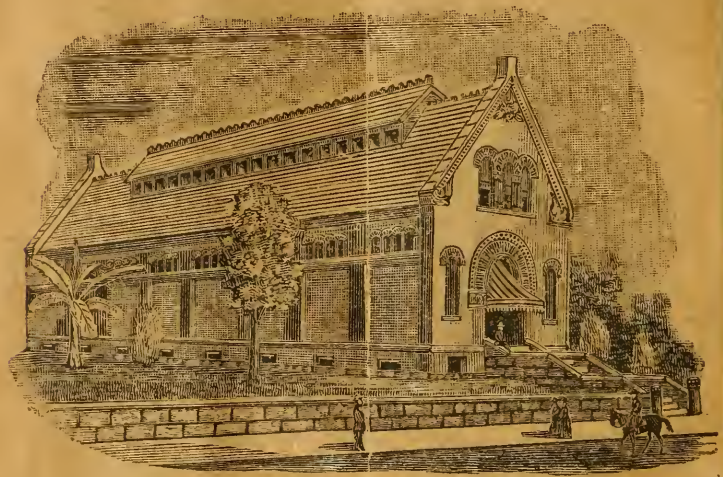
