Volunteer community service CLUB

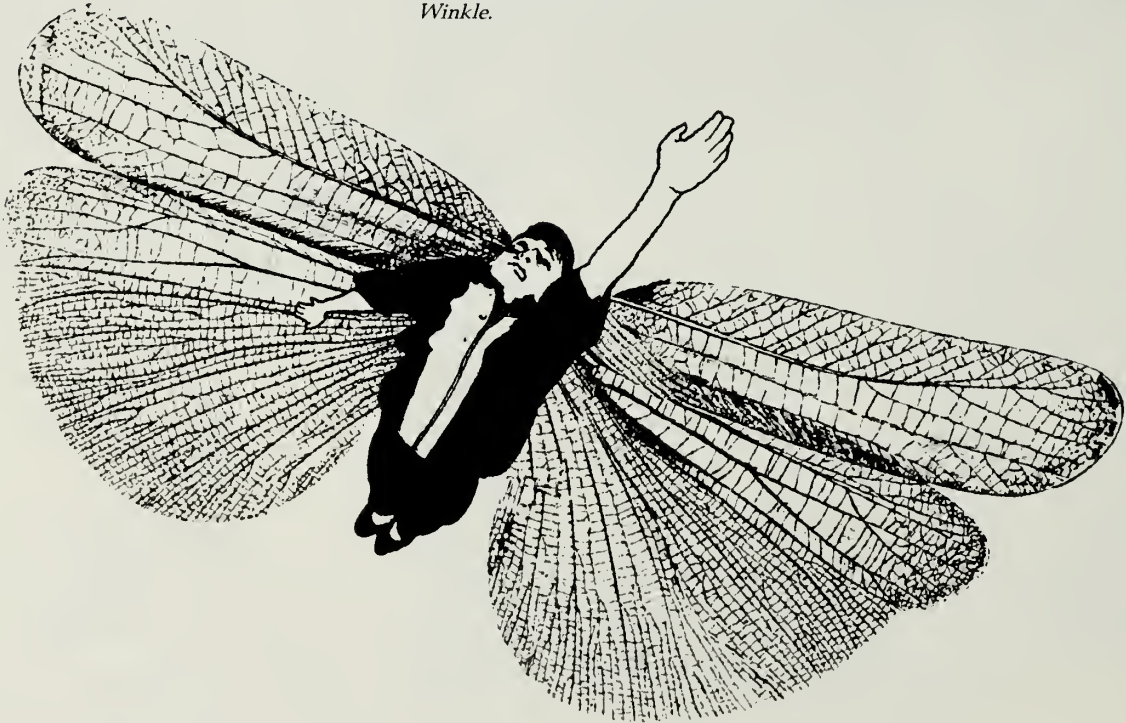

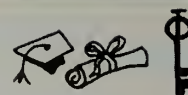
